WHAT TO KNOW...

- Marshall women's tennis begins its home slate Saturday afternoon and evening with a doubleheader against Wright State and West Virginia State.
- This is the third straight season that Marshall and West Virginia State will meet. Every match has been played in Huntington.
- This is the second match of a five-match homestand for the Thundering Herd.
- Head coach John Mercer is Marshall's all-time leader in wins (246) and is entering his 17th season as the head coach of the Thundering Herd.
- Marshall is seeking its fourth consecutive win over West Virginia State. The Thundering Herd has never lost to the Yellow Jackets.
- This is the fourth consecutive season that Marshall will play in a doubleheader. All four doubleheaders have included at least one home match with three of them, including this one, having both matches at home.
- Marshall's opponent is no stranger to the Thundering Herd. West Virginia State returns seven players from its 2018 roster that was blanked by the Thundering Herd last season.

FALL 2018 HIGHLIGHTS

- Marshall's roster is the youngest in Conference USA in terms of experience. The Herd had no seniors or juniors on its fall roster and just one sophomore.
- Marshall entered the season as the only school in Conference USA with no juniors or seniors on its roster.
- Head coach John Mercer signed three freshmen for the 2018-19 season: Madi Ballow (Dallas, Texas), Liz Stefancic (Aurora, Ill.) and Victoria Walter (Vienna, Austria).
- Victoria Walter tied the Marshall freshman record for most singles wins during a fall season with nine (Rachael Morales, 2013).
- Each of Marshall's three newcomers won at least six singles matches over the course of the fall season, marking the first time since 2011 that three freshmen had five or more singles wins in a fall season at Marshall (Kai Broomfield, Ellie Ball, Maria Voscekova).
- Walter and Liz Stefancic each qualified for the main draw of the ITA Atlantic Regional after winning two qualifying rounds.
- Walter reached the second round of the regional tournament.
- Walter reached the finals of her singles bracket at the Hokie Fall Invite.
- Stefancic finished in third place in her singles bracket at the Hokie Fall Invite.
- Anna Smith won the consolation bracket of her singles flight at the Hokie Fall Invite.
- Marshall defeated a total of six opponents from schools in the Power Five conferences: three from West Virginia, two from Penn State and one from Iowa State.
- Marshall added two players for the spring season: Daniela Dankanych (Uzhgorod, Ukraine) and Matilde Mulatero (Givoletto, Italy).

TEAM NOTES: WHAT TO KNOW

HAVE YOU HERD?

- Marshall and West Virginia State are meeting for the third consecutive season, with each match being part of a doubleheader.
- Marshall is seeking its fourth consecutive win over its in-state foe from Institute, W.Va. The Thundering Herd has never lost to West Virginia State.
- West Virginia State returns seven players from its 2017-18 team that was blanked by Marshall.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENT: WEST VIRGINIA STATE

- West Virginia State is the defending Mountain East Conference champion. The Yellow Jackets reached the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Division II Tournament before bowing out to Central Oklahoma.
- Head coach John Simms has been a model of consistency for WVSU, turning around a once-dormant program into a perennial D-II power.
- The Yellow Jackets made their furthest run in an NCAA Tournament a year ago. WVSU was the first current/former HBCU to reach the round of 16 in an NCAA women's tennis tournament.
- West Virginia State has won six consecutive conference championships and have made 11 consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament.
- The Yellow Jackets return seven players who faced the Thundering Herd in Huntington last season, including all-conference standouts Laura Isbey and Kierstin Hensley.
- Simms was the Mountain East Coach of the Year for the fifth consecutive year. The Yellow Jackets have won the title every year since the conference formed.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

- Marshall entered the fall season as the only team in Conference USA to not have a junior or senior on its roster. While that stat has changed, the Herd still boasts the youngest roster in Conference USA in terms of experience, as four of its six players are freshmen, while the Herd returns just one player from its 2017-18 team.
- Marshall's three freshmen who played in the fall each made an impact on the court and etched their names into the record books. Victoria Walter tied Rachael Morales' mark for most singles wins by a freshman in a fall season with nine, while Liz Stefancic and Madi Ballow won six matches apiece, which is tied for ninth in school history for wins in a fall season by a freshman. Walter and Stefancic each made it through qualifiers at the ITA Atlantic Regional, with Walter reaching the second round of the tournament.
- Anna Smith, the Herd's lone returning player from the 2017-18 team, continued her development from last season to this season with seven singles wins, a five-win improvement from her win total during the fall 2017 season.

WELCOME BACK

- A familiar face has returned to the courts in Huntington, as Daniela Dankanych will make her Marshall return Wednesday after missing the last two semesters for the Herd.
- Dankanych won six singles matches in each of her first three semesters at Marshall and has a combined 36 wins in her career (18 singles, 18 doubles).

MAKING HISTORY

- Matilde Mulatero made school history last week against (RV) Kentucky as the first Italian to ever play for the Herd. Mulatero is from Givoletto, which is about 15 miles northwest of Turin. Mulatero will also become the first freshman to join the team mid-season since Derya Turhan did so prior to the 2014 spring season.

Marshall head tennis coach John Mercer's run at the school can be described as nothing short of remarkable. Mercer, now in his 17th season at the helm of the Thundering Herd, is the school's all-time leader in wins with 246 and has posted a record of at least .500 in 15 of his first 16 seasons.

Mercer took Marshall to the NCAA Tournament in each of his first three seasons as head coach, also a first for the program, and has coached 54 all-conference selections during his tenure, including 45 during Marshall's current tenure in Conference USA. Prior to Mercer's arrival, Marshall had just one NCAA Tournament appearance and 19 all-conference selections.

Following three consecutive Mid-American Conference regular season and tournament championships, Marshall moved to Conference USA prior to the 2005-06 season. In Marshall's first 13 seasons in the conference, Mercer has led the Thundering Herd to 186 wins, an average of more than 14 wins per season. The Herd has garnered a spot in the ITA's final rankings six times during that span and has reached the finals of the conference tournament four times, while reaching at least the quarterfinals in 12 of the 13 seasons.

During Mercer's tenure at Marshall, the Thundering Herd has found profound success on the court against opponents from Power Five conferences. Marshall has defeated the likes of Pitt, Louisville, Virginia Tech and Virginia from the ACC, Penn State, Ohio State, Michigan State, Wisconsin and Minnesota from the Big Ten, West Virginia, TCU and Iowa State from the Big 12, Washington State from the Pac 12 and Kentucky from the SEC.

Mercer's tenure has also resulted in five conference players of the year, one freshman of the year and one newcomer of the year.

Mercer, the 2005 ITA East Region Coach of the Year, sits just four wins shy of becoming the first coach in school history to reach 250 wins.
