

Game notes – Ohio at Marshall – September 14, 2019

The game captains were senior offensive lineman Levi Brown and sophomore running back Brenden Knox on offense, and senior defensive lineman Marquis Couch and senior linebacker Omari Cobb on defense.

Even with the loss, Ohio leads the all-time series with Marshall 33-21-6. The Herd is now 32-11-3 in Huntington.

True freshman Broc Thompson and redshirt freshman Corey Gammage received their first career starts at wide receiver. Marshall started three freshmen receivers for the first time this season.

Marshall won its 11th consecutive game when winning the turnover battle. The Herd was plus-one in turnover vs. Ohio.

Junior tight end Xavier Gaines lined up at quarterback for one play in the first quarter, and raced 26 yards for a touchdown to open scoring. The run was Gaines' longest of his career. Gaines finished with a career-high 52 rushing yards and a season-high 53 receiving yards.

Sophomore tight end Devin Miller caught his first collegiate touchdown pass. The 22-yard reception is also the longest of his college career.

Sophomore running back Brenden Knox eclipsed 100 rushing yards for the fourth time in his career.

Knox scored a rushing touchdown for the fifth consecutive game.

Sophomore running back Sheldon Evans set a new career-high with 77 rushing yards.

Senior tight end Armani Levias tied a career-high with five receptions.

Sophomore quarterback Isaiah Green finished with 50 rushing yards, a career best.

Senior linebacker Tyler Brown finished with seven tackles, his best single-game total in his collegiate career. He entered Saturday with seven career tackles.
