

Game Notes – Florida Atlantic at No. 22 Marshall – October 24, 2020

The game captains for Marshall were senior offensive lineman Alex Mollette, junior running back Brenden Knox, junior running back Sheldon Evans, senior linebacker Tavante Beckett and junior defensive lineman Koby Cumberlander. Beckett has been a captain all five games this season. This is Knox's first time as a game captain in 2020, but he has been a captain a team-leading 13 times in his career.

Marshall now leads the all-time series with Florida Atlantic, 7-1. The Thundering Herd has won three consecutive games in the series, and is 4-0 against the Owls in Huntington.

Marshall extended its home winning streak to six games. The Herd has a seven-game home winning streak against Conference USA teams.

The Herd snapped FAU's eight-game win streak, which spanned one year and six days when Marshall defeated the Owls, 36-31, on Oct. 18, 2019 in Boca Raton, Florida.

Marshall junior running back Brenden Knox reached another career milestone: 2,500 career rushing yards. Knox reached the milestone on a 3-yard run in the fourth quarter, becoming the eighth player in Herd program history.

The 58-yard touchdown reception by Knox is the longest reception of his career. The touchdown reception was the first of his career, and extended his overall touchdown streak to five games.

Knox has four consecutive 100-yard rushing games and 14 for his career.

Senior receiver Artie Henry received his first career start.

Henry caught a touchdown pass for the second consecutive week and now has four career touchdown receptions. Henry also set a new single game career high for receptions with five (previous best: three – three times).

Sophomore kicker Shane Ciucci's third quarter field goal from 35 yards out is a career long.

Junior defensive end Darius Hodge has at least one sack in four of five games this season.

Junior defensive end Koby Cumberlander has recorded a sack in consecutive weeks.

Sophomore receiver Corey Gammage established a new single game career high for receptions with six.

Junior cornerback Joshua Bowers set a single game career-high with 11 tackles.

The Marshall defense extended its streak of not allowing an individual 100-yard rusher to six games. The Herd has not allow a team to rush for 100 yards this season.
