Head coach Doc Holliday

On Defense: "Early on in the second half, we made some mistakes. Our players challenge each other."

"What a great football team will do is go out and take care of business, and that's what we did.

On Opponent: "If you don't have a mature football team, if you go out there and sleepwalk, you can go out there and have trouble with teams like that."

"I'm a little disappointed with that first half, but we came out in the second half and performed well."

Representing the Herd especially in this game on the 50th anniversary will be surreal. I can tell you that this team is already looking forward to that game."

Xavier Gaines

On his one-handed touchdown catch

"I thought Devin [Miller] was going to get it, he's usually the one who gets the ball in that formation. The defense shifted over to him so around 10 yards I stepped inside and

went out to the corner and I didn't even think I was going to get it, I thought it was too far to be honest. I just stuck my hand out. Grant [Wells] made a great throw and I had to make a play."

On his versatility
