Game Notes – WKU at Marshall – November 27, 2021

After Saturday's loss, Marshall leads the all-time series with WKU, 8-5. The Hilltoppers snapped a four-game winning streak by Marshall.

Senior Will Ulmer made his 56th career start for Marshall, which ties the program's all-time record for career starts. Chris Deaton (1990-93) and Aaron Ferguson (1993-96) also made 56 starts in their career.

Thundering Herd tight end Devin Miller caught a 3-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter, his first score since Oct. 12, 2019 and his third career receiving touchdown.

Quarterback Grant Wells scored on a 1-yard rush in the first quarter, his seventh rushing touchdown this season. Wells is now tied with Michael Payton (1990) for the fourth-most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback in a single season.

Freshman running back Rasheen Ali set the school's all-time record for rushing yards by a freshman. Ali broke the record set by current football staff member Doug Chapman, who rushed for 1,238 yards as a freshman in 1996.

Kicker Shane Ciucci has made 74 consecutive extra points.

Punter Robert LeFevre moved into fourth on the all-time punts list at Marshall with 213.

Tight end Xavier Gaines had three receptions, tying Mike Bartrum for No. 4 on the career list with 109 catches by a tight end.

Corey Gammage caught seven passes, moving him into the top 20 all-time for career receptions at Marshall.

Defensive back Nazeeh Johnson had three solo tackles, moving him into the top 20 all-time at Marshall in career solo tackles.
