THE KICKOFF

- The West Virginia University men's soccer team hits the road for an in-state showdown at Marshall on Friday night in Huntington, W.Va.
- Friday marks the 24th meeting between the Mountaineers and Thundering Herd. The two schools are set to battle for the third straight season after not playing from 2005-18.
- In the most recent Mountain State Derby, WVU topped MU, 1-0, on March 24, 2021, in Morgantown.
- West Virginia is making its first regular-season trip to Huntington since 2003. The squad last played at Marshall in 2019 for the NCAA Tournament Second Round.
- Friday also marks the first of two Conference USA opponents for the Mountaineers this fall. WVU is set to join C-USA in 2022.
- The Mountaineers are 26-11-5 against current members of C-USA.
- WVU is coming off a 1-0 win over Ohio State on Sept. 10, in front of 2,443 fans at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium. It marked the second-largest men's soccer crowd in DBSS history.
- West Virginia checks in at No. 4 in this week's United Soccer Coaches poll, the program's highest ranking since Oct. 31, 2006 (No. 4).
- WVU also was slotted No. 6 in this week's College Soccer News poll and No. 10 by TopDrawerSoccer.
- The Mountaineers are 2-0 against ranked opponents this season. The club is attempting to win multiple games over top-10 foes in the same season for the first time since 2007.
- West Virginia is 108-42-20 at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium since the facility opened in 2004, including 3-0-1 this season.
- So far in 2021, eight different Mountaineers have scored the club's eight goals.
- The Mountaineers return 10 of 11 starters from the 2020-21 campaign, as well as 15 total lettermen. WVU also returns all seven of its goal scorers from a year ago.
- For the first time in program history, West Virginia was voted No. 1 in the 2021 MAC Men's Soccer Preseason Poll.
- Five players earned All-MAC honors last spring, led by first-team selections MF Luke McCormick, F Ike Swiger and GK Steven Tekesky. Additionally, MF Pau Jimenez Albelda and D Kevin Morris were named to the league's second team.
- West Virginia has won 35 of its last 37 games when scoring two or more goals.
- WVU has outscored its opponents, 8-2, to begin the new campaign.
- West Virginia has fired at least 10 shots in 39 of its last 56 matches. The squad has only been held without a goal in five of its last 30 fixtures.
- Dan Stratford is in his second season at the helm in Morgantown. The 10th coach in program history, he has an overall career record of 71-7-7, including 10-3-2 with the Mountaineers. Stratford led Charleston (W.Va.) to a pair of NCAA Division II National Championships in 2017 and 2019.
- Stratford is 6-0-1 in nonleague contests during his head-coaching tenure in Morgantown.

SCOUTING THE THUNDERING HERD

- Marshall is led by fifth-year coach Chris Grassie, who is 48-25-11 at the helm in Huntington.
- Grassie and WVU coach Dan Stratford coached together at Charleston (W.Va.) from 2014-16.
- The Thundering Herd enter Friday's game with a 3-1-1 overall mark. The squad was placed at No. 6 in this week's United Soccer Coaches poll.
- Last time out, Marshall went on the road to top Bowling Green, 1-0, on Sept. 11.
- MU, which won the 2020-21 National Championship, finished 13-2-3 last season.
- Vinicius Fernandes is off to a fast start in 2021, posting four goals and three assists in five matches. Vitor Dias (3G, 3A) was named to the MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List last month.

Beating the Best

- Annually playing one of the toughest schedules in the nation, WVU has earned a win over a top-25 opponent in 14 of the last 16 seasons, including once in 2021.
- What's more, the squad also has 16 top-15 wins in the last 15 years, including 12 top-10 victories, most recently on Aug. 30, 2021, vs. No. 3 Pitt.
- Nine of the squad's 16 top-15 victories since 2006 have come in Morgantown.

Two is Enough

- The Mountaineers have found a winning combination in scoring multiple goals in a match. The squad has won 35 of its last 37 contests when finding the back of the net twice or more.
- Since 2000, WVU is 128-17-7 when scoring 2+ in a match, including 3-0 this season.
- Prior to a 3-2 (OT) loss at Akron on April 7, 2021, the Mountaineers hadn't lost a match when scoring two or more goals since a 4-2 setback against Northern Illinois on Oct. 18, 2019. Before that, WVU had won every multi-goal match it played since Nov. 13, 2015 (3-2 vs. Akron).

Defend the Net

- Since the start of the 2019 season, the Mountaineers have done their part in limiting opponents' chances in the final third. WVU has allowed five shots on goal or fewer 30 times out of 36 matches, good for 83.3%. That includes nine of 10 matches in 2020-21, and all five contests so far this fall.
- What's more, West Virginia has conceded just three shots on goal or fewer 20 times since 2017, including four times this season.
- The last time WVU held an opponent without a single shot on goal was on Sept. 3, 2016, against Princeton.
- Along with limiting opponent scoring opportunities, the Mountaineers have earned three clean sheets in five matches in 2021.

Veteran Presence

- Seventeen Mountaineers have earned the starting nod in at least one career match at WVU.
- WVU features two players who have started at least 60 career matches, three who have started at least 30 matches, five who have started at least 20 matches and nine players who have started at least 10 matches.

- Among those beginning their time in Morgantown are freshmen D Frederik Jorgensen (Denmark), D Simon Kalinauskas (Australia), GK Lorenzo Nunez (Bloomington, N.Y.), MF Otto Ollikainen (Finland), D George Pitsillides (Cyprus) and MF Max Tretheway (Charleston, W.Va.), junior MF Kasimir Lauber (Lincoln Memorial) and senior F Adam Burchell (Charleston) and F Yoran Popovic (Netherlands).

In the Polls

- This week, the Mountaineers jumped up one spot to No. 4 in the United Soccer Coaches poll.
- It marks the program's highest ranking by the organization since Oct. 31, 2006 (No. 4).
- West Virginia began the season unranked in the United Soccer Coaches' poll, received votes after Week 1 and was ranked No. 5 last week.
- Additionally, West Virginia appears at No. 6 in this week's College Soccer News poll, up three spots from last week, as well as No. 10 by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

Together Again

The Mountaineer coaching staff - head coach Dan Stratford, associate head coach Andy Wright and assistant coach Nick Noble - has a unique connection with the WVU men's soccer program. The trio played together at WVU, as Noble started in goal for the Mountaineers from 2003-06, while Stratford and Wright were mainstays of the Mountaineer lineup from 2004-07. All three went on to play professionally.

- During their time as players in the program, they led West Virginia to a Big East regular-season championship in 2006, as well as three NCAA Tournament appearances.
- What's more, Stratford, Wright and Noble have made their mark on the WVU record book, as Stratford ranks No. 1 all-time in four different categories, including matches played (85) and game-winning points (31), Wright ranks inside the top three in eight categories and Noble tops the leaderboard in a variety of goalkeeping stats, including wins (45).

On the Move

- On June 14, 2021, Conference USA announced the addition of WVU as an affiliate member for the sport of men's soccer. The Mountaineers will begin play in C-USA in 2022.
- West Virginia has been a member of the Mid-American Conference since 2012, winning the league's regular-season championship in 2018, and the MAC Tournament title in 2019.
- The addition of West Virginia in 2022 will bring Conference USA to 10 men's soccer members with Charlotte, FIU, Florida Atlantic, Marshall, Old Dominion and UAB and affiliate members Coastal Carolina (starting in fall 2021), Kentucky and South Carolina.

Non-Con Conquerors

- Since the start of the 2018 season, WVU is 20-8-3 against nonconference opponents. That includes 4-0-1 in 2021, 2-0 in 2020-21, 6-4-1 in 2019 and 8-4-1 in 2018.
- In that time, the Mountaineers are 13-3-2 in nonconference matchups at home.
- Coach Dan Stratford is 6-0-1 against non-MAC opponents in his head-coaching tenure at WVU.

What a Week

- Junior midfielder Luke McCormick received plenty of recognition for his highly productive week from Aug. 30-Sept. 3.
- After opening the scoring with a 21st-minute goal in a 2-1 win over then-No. 3 Pitt on Aug. 30, and tallying the first assist of the night in WVU's 3-1 victory over then-No. 17 Penn State on Sept. 3, the Derby, England, native was named the United Soccer Coaches Men's Division I Player of the Week (Sept. 8) and the TopDrawerSoccer.com Player of the Week (Sept. 7). He also was featured on TDS' Men's Team of the Week.
- Additionally, he took home the MAC Player of the Week (Sept. 6) honor, as well as WVU Student-Athlete of the Week (Sept. 7) accolades.
- McCormick became the first Mountaineer men's player to earn a national weekly honor by United Soccer Coaches since Jarrod Smith on Sept. 11, 2006.

Morris Collects CoSIDA Honors

- Fifth-year senior defender Kevin Morris was named a 2020-21 CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team selection in July 2021.
- Morris became the squad's first Academic All-American since Jack Elliott garnered the award in three consecutive years from 2014-16.
- In all, West Virginia has had eight Academic All-Americans, including four first-team honorees.
- Morris, who earned his bachelor's degree in mathematics with a 3.90 GPA in December 2020, has been named a CoSIDA Academic All-District performer in each of the last two seasons.

- The Mountaineers have enjoyed continued success at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium since the opening of the facility in 2004, boasting a 108-42-20 record in Morgantown.
- WVU has finished with a winning record at home in 13 of its 17 seasons during the Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium era.
- The Mountaineers won their 100th match at DDSS in the squad's 2019 home opener on Sept. 7. WVU topped Wright State, 2-1, in front of 1,512 fans.
- More than 2,000 fans have packed Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium for a match five times, including a program-record 2,938 on Sept. 4, 2009, against then-No. 16 UC Santa Barbara.
- This season, WVU earned a 1-0 win over Ohio State on Sept. 10, in front of 2,443 fans, good for the second-largest crowd in men's soccer history at DDSS.
- In all, WVU is 11-3 all-time in matches played at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium with an attendance of more than 1,500 fans.
- Mountaineer coaches Dan Stratford, Andy Wright and Nick Noble all played in the inaugural contest at DDSS on Sept. 5, 2004, against Mount St. Mary's. Stratford was credited for the first-ever assist in the new stadium, while Noble earned the win in goal.

Last Time Out

- West Virginia capped its four-match homestand with a 1-0 win over Ohio State on Sept. 10, at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.
- Fifth-year senior defender Kevin Morris scored the game-winning goal in the third minute. The Mt. Airy, Maryland, native found the back of the net off a header during a Mountaineer corner kick. It marked the co-captain's third career GWG.
- Freshman defender Frederik Jorgensen was credited with the assist on Morris' tally.

- The match was played in front of 2,443 fans, good for the second-largest crowd in men's soccer history at DDSS.

Spreading the Wealth

- What's more, 13 players already have recorded at least one point in the first five matches of the season.
- Seven of West Virginia's eight goals in 2021 have been assisted.

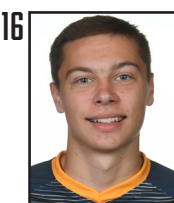
