High Point University head coach **Tooey Loy** dubbed the 2006-2007 season "A Season of Firsts," and that was certainly the case. The Panthers made their first pre-season WNIT appearance, their first post-season appearance since moving to Division I status in 1999, their first regular season Big South title, but that was a year ago before HPU graduated three of its starting five and lost one to injury in the offseason.

While HPU could be viewed as having a rebuilding year, don't count the Panthers out just yet. With one starter returning in senior **Amber Manuel** and a solid group of young players, High Point has the talent to make noise in the Big South this season.

"We will have a very talented team with very little experience," said Loy, "returning only one starter and our lone senior. Our young players will have to learn quickly."

Loy will again be joined on the sideline this season by assistant coaches, **Karen Curtis McConico**, **Katie O'Dell** and **David Kim**. This is McConico's fourth season, Kim's third and O'Dell's second.

"Returning the same staff for two years in a row will be a benefit both to our team and to myself. They already know and understand the system and know and understand what I want done."

BACKCOURT

Running the offense on the court will be junior **Ayonna Thompson** who replaces three year starting guard Katie Ralls in the position. Thompson saw valuable time her first two seasons with the Panthers and averaged 19 minutes per game during her sophomore year. Thompson will be called upon to play a bigger role in the coming season.

"Ayonna will be asked to take a big role this year as one of the few guard with experience who is returning. She has the ability to be as good as any guard in the league, and really needs to focus on her defense and on running the team."

In the other guard position will be junior **Jennifer Long** who has been a strong defensive presence for the Panthers coming off the bench the past two years but will be looking to make an impact on the offensive side of the ball this season. Long led the team in free throw percentage last season with .761 in all games and improved to .781 in league play.

"With the ability to score in a number of ways, I think Jennifer is really ready to step up and be an impact player for this team. She is already strong defensively and really has the potential to be one of the best defenders in the Big South."

Joining Thompson and Long in the back court are returners **Amy Will**, **Linda Rambert** and **Lisa Judkins**.

After redshirting her freshman year Will is ready to get back on the court and log some valuable minutes. She will be called upon to provide help in the three position.

"Already possessing an excellent outside shot, Amy has worked hard this summer, getting stronger and quicker defensively."

Rambert and Judkins both saw time in several games for the Panthers last season, scoring their first collegiate points against Gardner-Webb early in the season. Both will be asked to provide valuable relief minutes again this season.

"Linda has also worked hard this summer on getting quicker and on her strength, but needs to continue to work in these areas to use her great passing ability. Lisa is a good athlete and has the ability to get to the basket and finish; she needs to continue to improve on her defense and outside shot as the season progresses."

New faces will be joining the backcourt as well this season as the team adds **Jurica Hargraves**, **LaTeisha Dean**, **Amy Dodd**, **Francis Fields** and **Whitney Tarver**.

Hargraves, a guard out of Chapel Hill High School (Chapel Hill, N.C.), averaged 21 points during her senior year. She graduated as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,844 points. The Pac-Six Player of the Year was nominated for the McDonald's All-America team.

"Jurica can play both the one and two spots. She has the ability to score in a variety of ways and is a very smart player on the floor who will be looked to fill a number of roles for this year's team."

A guard out of Green Run High School (Virginia Beach, Va.), Dean scored over 1,000 points during her high school career. She was a first team all-district selection.

"She is a great athlete who can really score with the ball and as LaTeisha learns to play in our system I think she can be a great scorer in the Big South."

Dodd comes to HPU from Apex High School (Apex, N.C.) where she was the Tri-7 Player of the Year and a four time recipient of all-conference honors. Her team finished second in the North Carolina 4A State Tournament.

"A very strong physical guard who can score from three and also take it to the basket or post up low, Amy has a high basketball IQ and I think will fit into the system right away in the three spot."

A graduate of Sumter High School (Sumter, S.C.), Fields was a two time all-region selection she averaged 13 points and 5.2 assists.

"Francis is an extremely athletic point guard with the ability to get to the basket and play great defense. She needs to continue to work on her outside shot to be an all around player."

Tarver is the final new face in the backcourt. After serving last season as a manager, Tarver's work in the off season paid off and earned her a spot on the team in 2007. Coming out of St. Anne's-Belfield High School (Charlottesville, Va.), Tarver

earned a spot on the Virginia State All-Tournament team and helped her team to back-to-back League of Independent Schools State Championships in 2005 and 2006.

"Whitney is a very smart player with a nice outside shot. She is a great team player and really brings a lot of chemistry to the program."

FRONTCOURT

Manuel is the only returning starter and the lone senior on this year's team. She led the team in rebounding in 2006-2007 with 7.2 per game and is the top returning scorer, averaging 8.3 points per game. Manuel was fifth in the Big South in rebounding and ranked fourth in field goal percentage (.510). As an experienced senior Manuel is ready to step up and take on a leadership role in 2007-08.

"Amber will not only be asked to lead the team, but to also give us great inside presence not only in scoring but in rebounding as well. She had an excellent junior season, but we will ask her to be even better during her senior year."

Junior **Caitlin Thys** was a major contributor during both her freshman and sophomore seasons, starting in the frontcourt for the Panthers both years. Unfortunately Thys has been sidelined for the 2007-2008 season due to an injury sustained in the off season.

"We will miss Caitlin this season, but look forward to her return in 2008-2009."

Sophomore **Ashlee Samuels** is poised to make an impact for High Point this season after having a solid performance during conference play a year ago. Samuels scored a career high 15 points and pulled down seven rebounds against Charleston Southern in her first season.

"Ashlee showed a lot of improvement during her freshman year. She has all the tools to be a great Big South post player. I really look for her to make an impact this year in the conference in both scoring and rebounding."

Andrea Tucker also returns to the Panther frontcourt this season. She averaged the most minutes as freshman last year with 10.8 per game. Tucker recorded three games last season pulling down a career best eight rebounds.

"As our most improved returning sophomore, I really look for Andrea to have a great season this year. She has really worked this summer on her game and her conditioning."

The final player returning in the frontcourt is **April Benson**. Last season Benson logged her first career start against Radford and pulled down a career high seven rebounds in that game. Benson will be expected to contribute valuable minutes on the court this season.

"April is very similar to Ashlee in having all the skills to be a great Big South post player. She has showed signs in the pre-season of really stepping up this year after a disappointing freshman year."

Only one new face joins the frontcourt this season and that is

Mackenzie Maier. A graduate of Charleston Catholic High School (Charleston W.Va.), Maier was named the 2007 West Virginia Girls Basketball State Player of the Year and was the 2007 Gatorade Player of the Year. Maier is a four time all-state selection and the all-time leading scorer at Charleston Catholic with 2,189 points.

"Mackenzie can play the three, four, or five position. She can step out and shoot the three, take the ball to the basket or post up. She will give us a lot of versatility inside and I think will allow our team to score much easier."

THE SCHEDULE

High Point once again has a tough schedule with non-conference matches scheduled with Southern Conference's Davidson, Conference USA opponent East Carolina, Virginia Tech from the ACC and the Big 12's Oklahoma State.

Over the Christmas break the Panthers will again participate in a holiday tournament, traveling to Jersey City, N.J. for the St. Peters Invitational. High Point will face Eastern Kentucky in the first round. In addition to the host team Pennsylvania is the fourth participant.

The Panthers will open an always tough Big South schedule on Jan. 19 at defending conference champion UNC Asheville.

"Once again we have a tough schedule, but should prepare us for a very tough Big South Conference. Our teams leading up to this season have set a high standard which I think this group can keep pace with."

SUMMARY

With one returning starter and a strong nucleus of young talent, High Point enter the 2007-2008 season with excitement; the excitement of seeing what young players can do and the excitement of seeing how far a team can go after losing four starters.

The Panthers are a different team from a year ago, but despite having new faces, HPU is still a very talented team and the young players are ready to uphold the tradition of past teams and make a push for the conference title in 2008.

"I'm very excited about this season. It has already been a fun team to be around and coach. There is a little bit of uncertainty with so many new players and players with very little experience, but I think the talent is there to have another great year in the Big South. Our goal this year will be the same as every year, winning the Big South and making post season play."





Tooey Loy

Head Coach
Seventh Season
High Point, 1994

Tooey Loy was promoted to head coach of the High Point University Women's Basketball Team in the spring of 2001 after serving as an assistant for six seasons.

In six years at HPU, Loy has compiled a 100-75 mark, which includes a trip to the finals of both the 2006 and 2003 Advance Auto Parts Big South Tournaments and a trip to the pre-season WNIT (2006). The Panthers were also the 2007 Big South Regular Season Champions earning the conference's automatic bid to the WNIT. Loy is a two time Big South Coach of the Year award winner, earning the honor in 2005 and 2007.

In the same span, 15 Panthers have earned All-Big South first team, second team or All-Freshman team honors, and in 2006 Katie O'Dell was named the Big South Player of the Year. During Loy's tenure he has also coached two time CoSIDA Academic All-America honoree, Leslie Cook, who picked up third team honors in 2006 before earning a spot on the first team in 2007.

Loy has been involved in HPU basketball since 1990, when he came to the school as a sophomore after beginning his career at UNC Greensboro. He played three seasons for head coach Jerry Steele, starting all three years and averaging 8.9 points, 2.5 rebounds and 3.3 assists during his career. He earned his undergraduate degree from HPU in 1994.

Following graduation, Loy became an assistant for the women's program under Dr. Joe Ellenburg. During his tenure on the bench, High Point made the jump from NAIA to NCAA Division II and eventually Division I competition.

As an assistant under Ellenburg, Loy was in charge of recruiting for the program, preparation of scouting reports, individual and team instruction, and overseeing the academic progress of team members.

The Panthers won at least 22 games in four of Loy's six seasons as an assistant, including 26 in 1996-97, which was the most in school history since HPU's 1978-79 AIAW Division II national championship.

He resides in High Point.

Karen Curtis McConico returned to High Point as an assistant women's basketball coach on June 1, 2004.

McConico is the all-time leading scorer in HPU basketball history (men's or women's) with 2,616 points in the books from 1994-98. In addition she is the all-time assists leader with 645 and ranks fourth on the rebounding list with 904. McConico still holds several spots in the national Division II record book. She is fourth all-time in career points scored and 10th in scoring average.

Averaging 22.7 points and 7.2 rebounds per game, McConico was a two-time Kodak All-American at HPU (1996-98) and a three-time Carolinas-Virginia Athletic Conference Tournament Most Valuable Player. In her four seasons, the Panthers compiled a 93-21 mark.

A native of Apex, N.C., McConico graduated from HPU with a bachelor's degree in Human Relations in 1998. She played professionally in Switzerland and returns to HPU after coaching three seasons at Cary High School in Cary, N.C. – including the final two as head coach.

McConico is also well-connected within the AAU ranks, having coached the Cary Cardinals 15 & under team and the Triangle Knights 18 & under squad.

Karen married Calvin McConico in Fall 2007 and the couple reside in High Point.

Katie O'Dell joined the women's basketball coaching staff in July 2006.

O'Dell is a 2006 graduate of High Point University and was the 2006 Big South Player of the Year. She led the league in scoring during her senior year, averaging 14.3 points per game. O'Dell was a three time First Team All-Conference Selection (2004, 2005, 2006) and led the team in scoring her sophomore, junior and senior seasons.

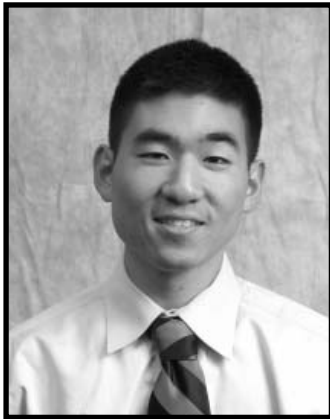
During her senior campaign, O'Dell reached the 1,000 point-500 rebound mark. She finished her career with 1,323 points and 690 rebounds. She finished ninth in points and seventh in rebounds on HPU's All-Time Career Leaders list and 18th and 19th on the Big South's All-Time Career Leaders list in points and rebounds, respectively.

The Bristol, Tenn. native served as a team captain during both her junior and senior years. Off the court She was a member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and served as a resident advisor. O'Dell, a physical education major, was a Millis Scholar Athlete and a member of the Big South Presidential Honor Roll.

She resides in High Point.
