A complete computerized statistical package will be available following the conclusion of the game.

Media credentials can be obtained by contacting Assistant Sports Information Director **April Goode**. Requests must be made in writing and received 24 hours before tip-off. The Millis Center's working facilities are for accredited media only. Spouses, dates, non-workers and children are strictly prohibited in any media area. In accordance with NCAA regulations, no cheering for either team will be tolerated on press row.

Matt Chazanow is in his first year as the play-by-play commentator for the HPU women's basketball team. In addition to doing play-by-play, Chazanow will handle some on-site engineering and production for the High Point Panthers Radio Network.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Dr. Nido Qubein University President



DR. NIDO QUBEIN believes in creating significance – both in his own life and in the lives he touches. He is a man of diverse interests and talents, and uses the life God has given him to create a legacy that reaches far and wide.

Appointed president of High Point University in January 2005, Qubein continues a life-long investment in education and improving the lives of young people. Having graduated from High Point University in 1970, it is poetic that he would be pursued as its 7th president. High Point University is an accredited undergraduate and graduate

institution with 3,000 students from 50 countries, and provides the backdrop for a life of significance that has evolved from little more than sheer determination.

Qubein came to the United States as a teenager with little knowledge of English, no contacts and only \$50 in his pocket, yet ended up a mega success story.

In addition to the presidency of High Point University, he remains involved in a wide variety of professional, civic and personal endeavors, and is counted among the country's leading motivational speakers.

He is chairman of an international consulting firm and recipient of the highest awards given for professional speakers including the Cavett (known as the Oscar of professional speaking), the Speakers Hall of Fame, and Sales and Marketing International's Ambassador of Free Enterprise. Toastmasters International named him the Top Business and Commerce Speaker and awarded him the Golden Gavel Medal. He served as president of the National Speakers Association which has a membership of 4,000 professionals and is the founder of the National Speakers Association Foundation where the highest award for Philanthropy is named for him. He has been the recipient of many honors including the Ellis Island Medal of Honor, a Doctorate of Laws degree, and induction into Beta Gamma Sigma, the honor society for business leadership.

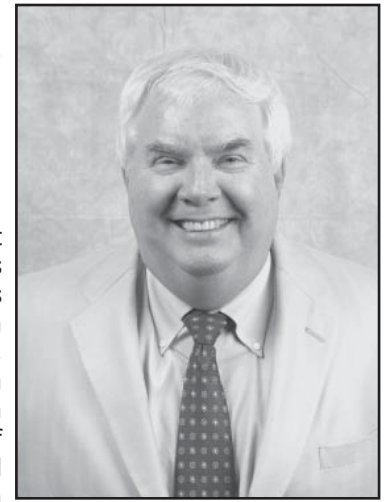
Qubein's business savvy led him to help start a bank in 1986 and today he serves on the board and executive committee of a Fortune 500 financial corporation with 103 billion-dollars in assets and 30,000 employees. He is also chairman of a national public relations company, chairman of Great Harvest Bread Company with 210 stores in 39 states, and chairman of Business Life, Inc. He serves on the boards of several national organizations including the YMCA of the USA which oversees 2,600 YMCA's across the country.

He has written numerous books and recorded scores of audio and video learning programs, which have been translated into a dozen languages and distributed worldwide.

His foundation provides scholarships to scores of deserving young people each year. To date, the Qubein Foundation has granted more than 600 scholarships, worth over three million dollars.

Qubein's commitment to the success of Panther Athletics is most evident in his recently announced vision for High Point University's athletic park which includes the Steele Center, a soccer stadium renovation, new track and redesigned fields, which will meet intercollegiate athletic and intramural sports needs. The total project cost for facilities exceeds \$7 million.

Dr. Woody Gibson Director of Athletics



DR. WOODY GIBSON was appointed to the position of Director of Athletics at High Point in June 1998 after serving in many capacities in the athletics department since 1974.

The 1975 High Point graduate began his term as AD by overseeing High Point's transition and reclassification to NCAA Division I status, which became effective in September 1999. After an extensive institutional self study, High Point received full Division I certification in the spring of 2005.

Gibson completed a four-year term as a member of the NCAA

Committee on Sportsmanship and Ethical Conduct, serving as chair for two years. In May 2004 he was appointed to serve on the NCAA's Sports Wagering Task Force. He also has completed a three-year membership on the Division I Men's Soccer South Region Committee.

As HPU's Director of Athletics, Gibson manages the 16-sport intercollegiate athletics program at High Point and directs the planning, growth and development of that program. Because of his various past responsibilities in athletics, he brings a unique perspective to the position.

Gibson served as men's soccer coach from 1978-1998, started the women's intercollegiate soccer team in 1992 and served as head coach for three seasons, was the golf coach from 1975-1992 and the University's Sports Information Director from 1975-1993.

In addition to his athletics duties, Gibson is an associate professor in the Department of Exercise Science and Sports Studies. In 1995 he initiated a bachelor of science program in sport management and served as the program director until 2001. He currently teaches in the University's graduate program.

HIGH POINT UNIVERSITY

High Point enters the 2006-2007 season coming off of its best season since moving to Division I status in 1999. The Panthers posted a 20-10 overall record, was 9-5 in the conference and finished the regular season ranked second in the Big South. High Point put together a solid run in the Big South Tournament before falling just short in the championship game, 53-50, to 10 time champion, Liberty.

The season was highlighted with a sweep of the first half of the conference schedule, going 7-0 which was part of a mid-season 13-1 record with the team's only loss during that stretch coming at the hands of ACC power, Virginia Tech.

HPU returns four starters and eight players overall to the team this season including 2006 Big South Second Team honoree, **Katie Ralls** and 2006 Pre-Season All-Conference Team member, **Leslie Cook**.

"We have some very good senior leadership this season," says head coach **Tooy Loy**. "Our guard players are very experienced and they should be some of the best in the league this season. Inside we're young and very inexperienced with three freshman, a sophomore and a junior. Our inside game will have to play up to the level of competition for us to be competitive all year long. I think that we have a chance to make another run at the conference championship and have another successful season."

Loy will be joined again on the sideline this season by assistant coach **Karen Curtis**, but a new face has joined the coaching staff as well. The 2006 Big South Player of the Year, **Katie O'Dell** was named as the second assistant coach over the summer.

"I'm very excited about this year's coaching staff. Katie and Karen both know what I expect from the team and how I want to do things. It says a lot about our program, having three alumni and three former basketball players on our staff. Just with that there is already great chemistry among the coaching staff."

BACKCOURT

Leading the team on the court this season will be Ralls at the point guard position. The senior was the team's general on the floor last season and finished the season ranked third in the conference in assists with 106. She enters the season eighth on HPU's All-Time Assist Leaders list and is poised to move up on that list as the season progresses.

"I think that Katie can be the best point guard in our league," Loy says. "She knows what I want on the court and she has gotten stronger in the off season and that should help on both ends of the court."

Playing back-up for Ralls this season will be sophomore **Ayonna Thompson**. Thompson recorded solid minutes in the back-up point guard position during the 2005-2006 season and came on strong toward the end of last season.

"Ayonna is a tough match for other teams because of her quickness and her long range shooting capabilities. Ayonna should have a big impact this season both as a scorer and a playmaker."

In the two guard position will be seniors Cook and **Candyce Sellars**.

Cook is a proven long-range shooter and is ready to make big contributions from outside the arc. She was the second leading scorer on the team averaging 12.4 points per game last season and led the team in three pointers made after sitting out the first semester due to transfer status. Cook also saw success off the

court last season in being named to the third team Academic All-America and the Big South Women's Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

"Leslie is a potential player of the year candidate and most teams will place a lot of their focus on her every game which means that we need to find ways to get her open. She had an excellent conference tournament last year and is capable of scoring in the twenties on any night."

Sellars is a solid player on both ends of the court. She is a tough match defensively and offensively with her quickness. was third on the team in scoring during the 2005-2006 season and recorded the highest single game scoring output in the conference with 31 against Longwood. She was second on the team in assists and fifth in the conference with 94. Sellars was fourth in the conference in steals with 62 (2.07 spg).

"Candyce has really worked in the offseason and has expanded her offensive game. I feel that this is the year for Candyce to really take off both offensively and defensively."

Playing in the back up guard positions will be senior **Erica Brockmyer** and sophomore **Jennifer Long**.

Brockmyer is a team player who does the little things that help to win games. Last season she started in six games and was 15th in the Big South in offensive rebounds for conference play.

"Erica makes the team better everyday through hard work in practice and in games. She helps to build chemistry throughout the team. Look for Erica to play at the three and even the four position this year. She has really worked in the offseason at getting stronger and more experienced in the one-on-one."

Long was a freshman who came on strong at the end of last season, posting a career high 14 points in one of the final games of the regular season. She sets ready to build upon that going into the 2006-2007 season.

"From last year to this year, Jennifer has definitely been our most improved player. She is one of the best athletes on the team and is capable of scoring both inside and out. Look for her to get more playing time this season."

Freshman **Amy Will** will join the team in the backcourt this season after a successful career at North Wilkes High School. Will finished her career with over 1,000 points and is ready to be a solid contributor for the Panthers throughout the season.

"Amy had an exceptional career at North Wilkes. She is a good athlete that can both shoot the three and take it hard to the basket. She will be a very good Big South guard while at HPU."

Linda Rambert is another new face joining the backcourt staff this season. Rambert joins the team from Durham Academy where she holds the assist record.

"Linda is a guard with great court vision and excellent passing skills. She will need to adjust to the speed of the college game in order to use her skills, but because of the experience of getting to go up against some of the best Big South guards everyday in practice she should get better quickly and help us down the road."

Also joining the team in the backcourt is **Lisa Judkins**, a walk-on from Glenn High School. Judkins is a hard worker and will be called upon to provide valuable relief minutes off the bench.

"She is a very good athlete who has worked hard everyday to make the team this season. She hasn't played organized basketball in two years, so she's learning everyday. It should be fun to watch Lisa's improvement over the course of the season."

FRONTCOURT

Sophomore **Caitlin Thys** will lead the Panthers in the front court after a solid rookie year with the team in 2005-2006. She was second on the team last season in rebounds and seventh in the conference in blocked shots. With the experience gained last season, Thys is ready to step-up and have another great year in 2006-2007.

"She had a very good freshman year even though she had to play out of position for most of the year. Caitlin is a face-the-basket type of forward who we had to play in the post due to injuries. Facing the basket Caitlin looks ready to have a great sophomore season."

Amber Manuel is the only other returning inside player for the Panthers. The junior forward was 12th in the Big South in blocked shots last season. Manuel has worked hard in the offseason and is ready to be a power player in the upcoming season.

"Amber is right up there with Jennifer Long as one of the most improved players on the team. She is a very strong, very physical low post player that has the ability to score in a number of ways. Amber's increased confidence from last year to this year is tremendous and should help in building and continuing to improve her game over the course of the season."

Joining the frontcourt this season is freshman **Ashlee Samuels** who was a strong high school player. Samuels recorded over 1,000 points and over 980 rebounds during her four years at George Wythe High School.

"Ashlee will be one of the best athletes and one of the best rebounders in the Big South during her career. She will have to pick-up defensive schemes and learn a variety of post moves to reach her potential this year."

Also joining the frontcourt is **Andrea Tucker**, an All-Conference honoree from Concord High School. Tucker was also recognized in the North Carolina East-West All-Star game.

"Another great athlete, Andrea can really rebound and run the floor. She is an undersized post who is going to have to use her quickness to play bigger, stronger players, but she is a tough match for other teams with her speed."

April Benson is the final newcomer to the team and will join the frontcourt staff. She scored over 1,300 points at North Stanley High School and was a two time All-Conference honoree.

"April is a big, strong post player with a variety of skills. When April believes that she can be one of the best post players in the conference, she will be. She is capable of making immediate impact in the Big South."

THE CAPTAINS

Serving as captains for this year's team will be seniors, Leslie Cook, Katie Ralls, Candyce Sellars and Erica Brockmyer. The four captains bring both knowledge and experience to the team and will be instrumental in helping the younger members of the team grow into strong collegiate players.

"All four of these players have been in every situation at HPU. They are all great student-athletes both on and off the court. They

really set the example for our freshmen on how to become great collegiate basketball players and great student-athletes."

THE SCHEDULE

Highlighting the schedule for the team this season is HPU's first trip to the Preseason WNIT Tournament. The Panthers will face N.C. State for the season opener in the opening round of the WNIT.

High Point will play a very tough non-conference schedule this season. The Panthers will once again face SEC power, South Carolina along with three ACC teams: N.C. State, Wake Forest and Florida State.

The Panthers will also travel to Boca Raton, Fla. over the Christmas break to play in a tournament hosted by Florida Atlantic. In addition to the host team, also participating in the tournament are Campbell and Mid-American conference team, Ohio University.

"This is easily the toughest non-conference schedule that we have ever had since moving to Division I status. We will need to learn from every experience in order to get better heading into the conference portion of the schedule."

SUMMARY

With strong leadership, talent, depth and experience, the Panthers enter the 2006-2007 season poised to make another run at the Big South title. The road through the conference is never an easy one as all the teams come ready to play every night.

High Point's on the court leadership in the guard positions will be a valued asset as the Panthers make a run for the 2007 conference championship and the team's first ever birth to the NCAA Tournament.

"Last season our team took another giant step toward being a great Division I basketball team. Getting 20 wins, coming so close to the NCAA Tournament, being invited to the WNIT has all come together to take us to another level. This year's team is looking to improve upon that success."

Tooley Loy will enter his sixth season as High Point's head women's basketball coach in 2006-07. Loy was promoted to head coach of the Panther program in the spring of 2001 after serving as an assistant for six seasons.

In five years at HPU, Loy has compiled a 82-63 mark, which includes a trip to the finals of both the 2006 and 2003 Advance Auto Parts Big South Tournaments. In the same span, 13 Panthers have earned All-Big South first-team, second-team or All-Freshman team honors. In 2006 Loy coached Big South Player of the Year Katie O'Dell and Third Team Academic All-America honoree, Leslie Cook. In 2005 Loy was named the Big South Coach of the Year.

Loy has been involved in HPU basketball since 1990, when he came to the school as a sophomore after beginning his career at UNC Greensboro. He played three seasons for head coach Jerry Steele, starting all three years and averaging 8.9 points, 2.5 rebounds and 3.3 assists during his career. He earned his undergraduate degree from HPU in 1994.

Following graduation, Loy became an assistant for the women's program under Dr. Joe Ellenburg. During his tenure on the bench, High Point made the jump from NAIA to NCAA Division II and eventually Division I competition.

As an assistant under Ellenburg, Loy was in charge of recruiting for the program, preparation of scouting reports, individual and team instruction, and overseeing the academic progress of team members.

The Panthers won at least 22 games in four of Loy's six seasons as an assistant, including 26 in 1996-97, which was the most in school history since HPU's 1978-79 AIAW Division II national championship.

Karen Curtis returned to High Point as an assistant women's basketball coach on June 1, 2004. Curtis serves as the recruiting coordinator for the women's basketball team.

Curtis is the all-time leading scorer in HPU basketball history (men's or women's) with 2,612 points in the books from 1994-98. She was a two-time Kodak All-American at HPU (1996-98). In her four seasons, the Panthers compiled a 93-21 mark.

Curtis averaged 22.7 points and 7.2 rebounds per game, and was a three-time Carolinas-Virginia Athletic Conference Tournament Most Valuable Player. She is also the only HPU women's basketball player to have her jersey (No. 15) retired.

A native of Apex, N.C., Curtis graduated from HPU with a bachelor's degree in Human Relations in 1998. She played professionally in Switzerland and returns to HPU after coaching three seasons at Cary High School in Cary, N.C. – including the final two as head coach.

Curtis is also well-connected within the AAU ranks, having coached the Cary Cardinals 15 & under team and the Triangle Knights 18 & under squad.

Katie O'Dell joined the women's basketball coaching staff in July 2006.

O'Dell is a 2006 graduate of High Point University and was the 2006 Big South Player of the Year. She led the league in scoring during her senior year, averaging 14.3 points per game. O'Dell was a three time First Team All-Conference Selection (2004, 2005, 2006) and led the team in scoring her sophomore, junior and senior seasons.

During her senior campaign, O'Dell reached the 1,000 point-500 rebound mark. She finished her career with 1,323 points and 690 rebounds. She finished ninth in points and seventh in rebounds on HPU's All-Time Career Leaders list and 18th and 19th on the Big South's All-Time Career Leaders list in points and rebounds, respectively.

The Bristol, Tenn. native served as a team captain during both her junior and senior years. Off the court She was a member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and served as a resident advisor. O'Dell, a physical education major, was a Millis Scholar Athlete and a member of the Big South Presidential Honor Roll.

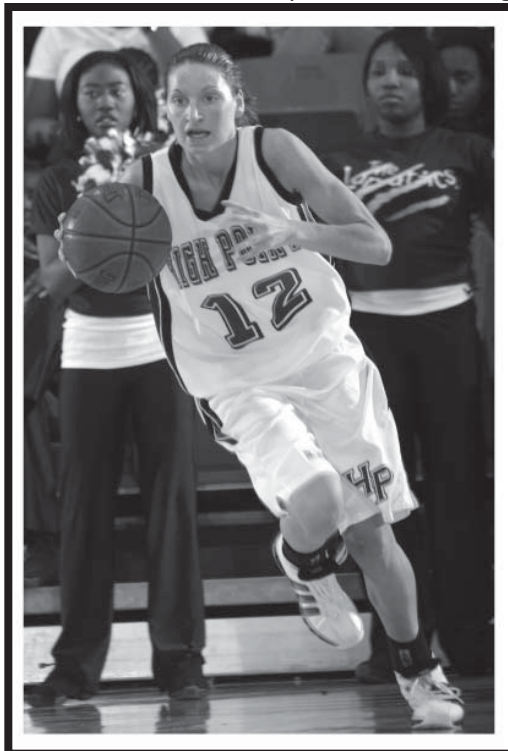

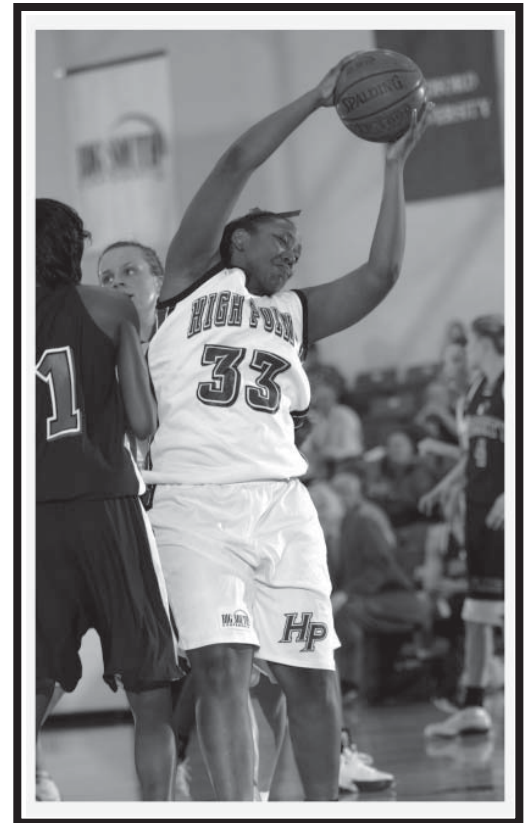

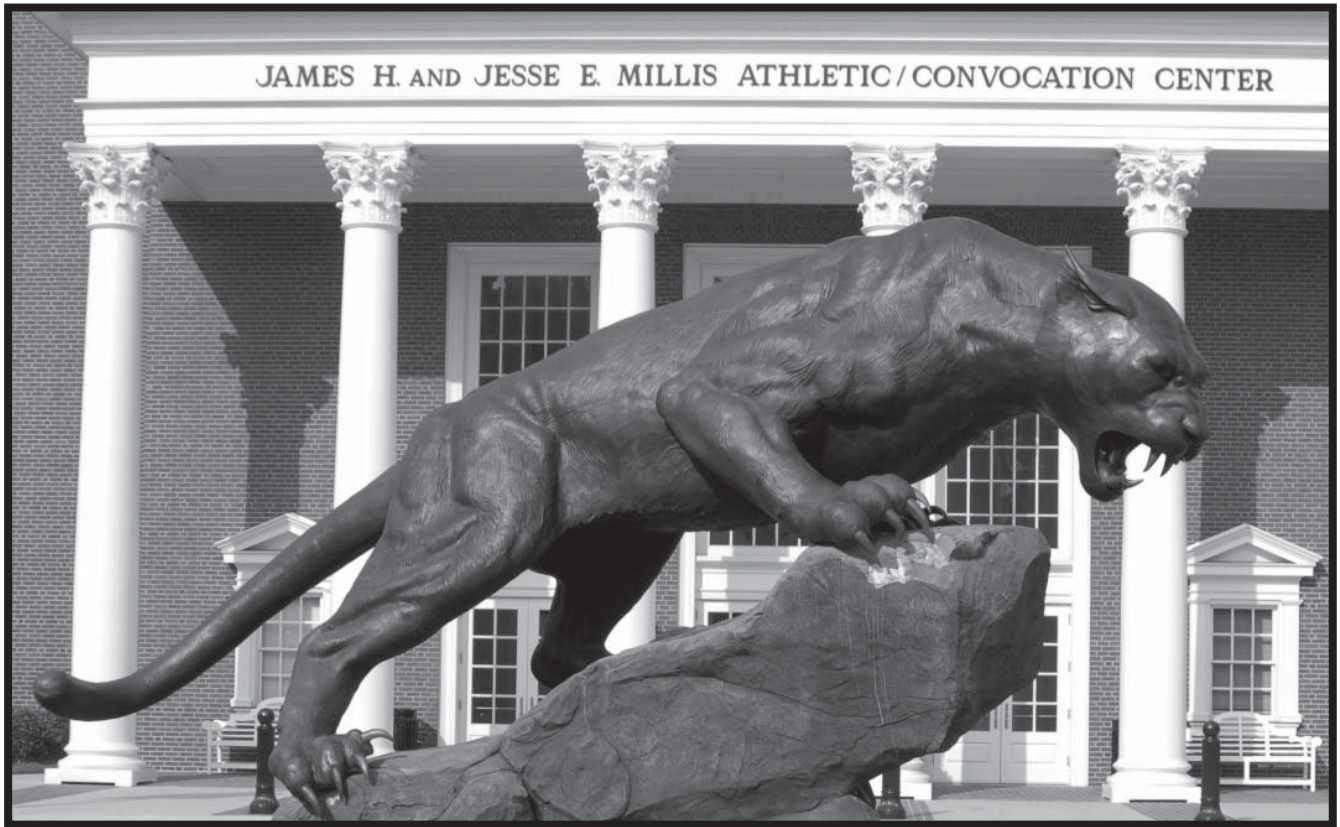

High Point University President **Dr. Nido Qubein** gathered community leaders, university friends and family this last fall to reveal his vision for the university's future, which now calls for \$72 million to be invested over the next two years.

"We are embarking on an incredible journey, together," said Qubein. "Thanks to our generous friends, High Point University is initiating a major transformation. Our vision is clear, our purpose evident and our goals in place. With your help, we can create a nationally recognized university with top-notch facilities, exceptional educational opportunities and superior student experiences."

To achieve his ambitious goal, Qubein announced his two-year plan on how the first \$60 million will be invested: \$12 million on academic buildings and programs, \$15 million on residential facilities, \$9 million on the outdoor athletic complex, \$9 million on student life and a student center, \$5 million on renovations

and furnishings, \$5 million on student aid, and \$5 million on communications.

The Panthers and High Point Athletics are especially looking forward to the completion of the \$3.5 million Jerry & Kitty Steele Sports Center. This facility will be located adjacent to both the baseball and track/soccer stadiums and will be the new home of High Point University's Division I athletic department.

The Sports Center will be a two-story, 24,000 square foot facility and will feature an athletic training and weight room, locker rooms for several HPU programs, an academic services room, a hospitality and conference room, an indoor practice area, along with offices for various athletic administrators and coaches. Other projects included in the athletic complex include additions to Coy O Williard Stadium/Erath Field (baseball) and the building of the Richard F. Vert Track and Soccer Stadium and the Irwin Belk Track.

For more than 20 years, the Big South Conference has been a progressive, NCAA Division I athletic Conference reflecting the energy and growth of the Southeastern United States. Founded in 1983, the Big South has matured into a competitive leader in college athletics, actively pursuing excellence both on the field of play and in the classroom. Based in Charlotte, N.C., the Big South Conference's growing presence as an NCAA Division I athletic league is evident by competitive success on the national stage, innovative marketing and media partnerships, increased football and basketball television packages, the enhancement of the quality of the student-athlete experience, and strategic planning that has carried the Big South through the first decade of the 21st century.

Now in its 23rd year of existence, the Big South Conference continues to emerge, providing quality athletic competition while intentionally fostering the academic, personal, social, athletic and leadership development of each student-athlete. The League consists of nine member institutions: Birmingham-Southern College, Charleston Southern University, Coastal Carolina University, High Point University, Liberty University, UNC Asheville, Radford University, Virginia Military Institute and Winthrop University, while its geographic breakdown features Alabama (1 member), North Carolina (2), South Carolina (3), and Virginia (3). Two new members will join the Big South in 2008-2009. Gardner-Webb University, an associate member in football, will become a full member, joining Presbyterian College, which is beginning its transition to Division I athletics in 2006.

In the Fall of 2002, the Big South welcomed the addition of football as a Conference sport, bringing the number of Division I championship programs the big South sponsors to 18. The League sponsors nine championship sports for men: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, indoor/outdoor track, and tennis as well as nine for women: basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, indoor/outdoor track and volleyball. Again this year, Big South champions in men's and women's basketball, men's and women's soccer, volleyball, men's and women's golf, baseball, softball, men's and women's tennis and men's and women's track & field will receive automatic bids to NCAA Championships.

The Big South continued its growing achievements in 2005-06, as the League experienced Top 15 rankings in the national RPI in baseball, softball and women's basketball as well as Top 20 rankings in men's basketball and volleyball. Big South members defeated the No. 1 football and baseball team in the nation (Coastal Carolina vs. James Madison and Withrop baseball vs. North Carolina); the Big South had its first-ever national finalist for NCAA Woman of the Year (Winthrop's Janiva Willis); Liberty's Josh McDougal became the first Big South athlete to receive All-America honors in three running sports in the same season (cross country, indoor

track and outdoor track); the Big South placed two teams in the NCAA Baseball Regionals for the fifth time in six seasons; the Conference went 2-1 in its first-ever participation in the ESPN BracketBusters men's basketball event; Coastal Carolina men's golf reached the NCAA Championship for the second-straight year; the Big South had more than 20 All-Americans, including six first-team selections.

Last year's academic success mirrored the on-field achievements. A total of 32 Big South student-athletes were named Academic All-District, four of which earned Academic All-America accolades. In football, Charleston Southern's Adam DeGraffenreid was tabbed the I-AA Athletic Directors National Scholar-Athlete of the Year, the second time in three years the award was bestowed upon a Big South football player.

In celebrating its 20th anniversary in 2003-2004, the Big South inducted its inaugural Hall of Fame class, which included 11 former student-athletes and administrators who were an integral part in the Big South's early development and vitality. The Hall of Fame now stands at 25 members, as five more individuals were inducted in the Spring of 2006. In addition to the Big South's athletic accomplishments, the League also recognizes and honors academic excellence. Each year, the Presidential Honor Roll and the George A. Christenberry Awards honor student-athletes' outstanding work in the classroom. The Christenberry Award recognizes student-athletes graduating with a 4.0 grade point average. Additionally, the Conference's Sports Information Directors annually select a Scholar-Athlete in each conference sport, plus a male and female Scholar-Athlete of the Year. In 2006, the Big South awarded its first-ever Graduate Fellowships to one graduating male and female student-athlete attending graduate school the following fall. The League's outreach program includes a community day, at which select student-athletes help a local charity, such as Habitat for Humanity.

The Conference was formed on August 21, 1983, when Charleston Southern (then Baptist College) Athletic Director Howard Bagwell and Augusta President George Christenberry initially began recruiting members into the Big South. One month later, Dr. Edward M. Singleton was selected as the League's first Commissioner and continued to solicit new members. The League's seven charter members were Armstrong State, Augusta, Campbell, Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina, Radford and Winthrop. In 1989, George F. "Buddy" Sasser replaced the retiring Dr. Singleton as Commissioner. Under Sasser's leadership, the Conference implemented its public relations and compliance programs, and introduced its first-ever men's basketball television package, featuring the Big South competing among some of the finest teams in the nation. Sasser was so integral to the growth and foundation of the League that in 2000, the Commissioner's cup - the annual award given to the institution with the most

successful athletic year - was renamed the George F. Sasser Cup.

In August 1996, Kyle B. Kallander replaced Sasser, who would continue to serve the League as Director of Athletics at Coastal Carolina until his retirement in 1999. In his 10 years at the helm of the Big South, Kallander has been instrumental in aggressively promoting the Conference, including the development of the Big South Marketing Group, which has resulted in increased revenues and exposure for the Conference and its members. He also brought television coverage to Big South women's basketball and baseball for the first in-Conference history, created the Big South Television Network in 2001 which boasts a League-high 18 affiliates, and was the driving force behind the formation of the Big South Hall of Fame. Under Kallander's leadership, the Big South developed and initiated its first long-range strategic plan, re-affirming the League's vision as a distinctive athletic Conference committed to the quality of institutional life through athletic competition. In addition, Kallander has solidified membership with the addition of High Point in 1999, VMI in 2003, and future members Gardner-Webb and Presbyterian in 2008. Kallander's long range vision has also included technological advancements, as the Conference introduced its first live event video streaming last year, and plans are in the works to video stream every home women's basketball game in 2006-2007. Kallander has also successfully integrated the conference's profile with the member institutions' general student body, notably through the development of the Big South Academic Consortium, which sponsored the first annual Academic College Bowl among League members last February, and will feature an Undergraduate Research Symposium in the Spring of 2007.

The Big South continues to secure aggressive and unique television packages, making the Conference one of the leaders among all Division I Leagues in television exposure for its student-athletes. During the 2005-2006 season, the Conference's football TV packages produced four thrilling, last second outcomes, including three overtime contests; men's basketball received additional national exposure on ESPN2, baseball was televised for the second straight year, and the women's basketball tournament semifinals and finals again aired regionally and nationally. Entering this season, the 2007 Advance Auto Parts Men's Basketball Championship game will once again air on ESPN2 as part of the network's "Championship Week" programming. The Conference also boasts relationships with FSN South, Comcast, SportsNet (CSN), Comcast Sports Southeast (CSS), College Sports Television (CSTV), Fox College Sports (FCS), and ESPN2. In addition, the Big South Television Network (BSTN) will again air football and basketball games to local affiliates throughout the region.
