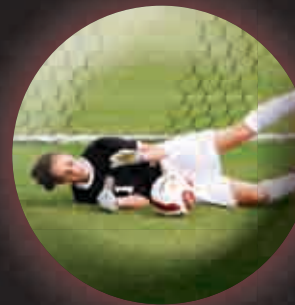

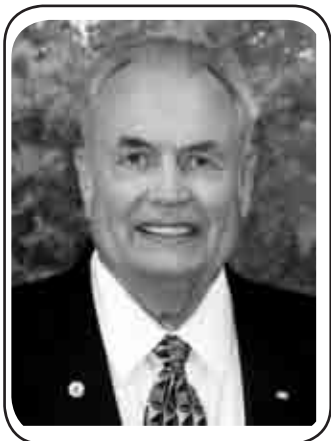

# MACJC

MISSISSIPPI ASSOCIATION OF COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES

The **Mississippi Association of Community and Junior Colleges** boasts one of the best, if not the best, athletic conferences in the nation.

The MACJC had its beginnings in the late 1920s. Throughout those 70-plus years, it has grown to 15 member schools with sports including football, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, golf and track.

Just about every community college in Mississippi has had its day in the sun with championship seasons as well as national tournaments. You name the sport and the MACJC has been recognized year in and year out in national competition.

As with many community college programs throughout the nation, student athletes have chosen the two-year college to achieve a solid foundation in the classroom. The success of this foundation is evidenced by the successful recruitment of the student athlete to the senior college. The MACJC has always been a hotbed for senior colleges across the nation in recruiting student athletes from the various programs across the state. In some cases as much as 80 percent of the sophomore classes has been offered senior scholarships.

Even on the professional level many of our Mississippi schools have contributed to this elite group. Presently, Hinds Community College football is ranked number one in the nation with the highest number of active players in the National Football League.

Looking at the make-up of our rules and regulations and the limits on both scholarships and out-of-state athletes, it is truly astonishing for the conference to be so competitive. Other state conferences across the nation have much less stringent limitations with their scholarship quotas and even some eligibility rules. What a tribute to our coaches and players this is when you compare the Mississippi conference against the national scene.

The outlook for the future is bright for this association, which has withstood numerous challenges over its history.

# Tom Shepherd Field

The Hinds soccer field was dedicated to Tom Shepherd Oct. 19, 2002. Coach Shepherd started the soccer program at Hinds in 1980 as a club sport. In 1988 soccer became a varsity sport at Hinds, and Coach Shepherd started the winning tradition. He guided the men's soccer team to six National Junior College Athletic Association Region XXIII Championships and five Runner-Up finishes. Coach Shepherd was awarded the Region XXIII Coach of the Year title in 1997 and 1999. He also received the Mississippi Association of Community and Junior Colleges Coach of the Year Award in 1999 after winning the MACJC Championship.

Tom Shepherd Field has become one of the most imposing home fields in the MACJC. One of only three lighted fields in Mississippi Community College soccer, Tom Shepherd Field is one of the premier facilities in the MACJC. The facility has seen much championship play, as Hinds hosted the MACJC Tournament in 1999, 2001, 2003, 2005 and 2007. The Eagles also hosted the Mid-Southwest District Tournament in 2003 and 2005.





# Hinds Soccer Camp

Boys and Girls • Ages 7 to 14

Kori Babb, women's soccer coach, and Doug Williams, men's soccer coach, host a soccer camp each year for area girls and boys.

This camp focuses on three major aspects of the game of soccer. It promotes a love for the game, teaches proper technique and teaches the athletes how to use the appropriate tactics.

One of the most important factors in youth soccer development is that the young athletes fall in love with the game of soccer. We at Hinds believe that there is only one reason that young children play soccer, and that is because soccer is fun. If this theme of having fun can be nurtured throughout the development of skills and tactics, these athletes will work harder and enjoy the game to its fullest potential.



We will also put a major emphasis on technique training. One of the major differences between professional and amateur athletes is technique. We teach technique by playing games that require the athletes to focus on particular skills.

These games are self-motivating and much more productive than standing in lines doing drills. Throughout the week, we demonstrate to the athletes how to productively work on their skills at home.

Finally, we focus on tactics. Tactics are the decisions the athletes make during the game. Tactical training requires a high work rate to properly reproduce realistic game situations. Therefore, most of the tactical training is done either indoors or outdoors early in the morning.

We truly believe that if in one week we can foster a love for the game, teach proper technique and teach the tactics of attack, defense and transition we have hosted a very successful camp.

Babb comes to Hinds from Vicksburg where she was the Head Softball Coach at Vicksburg High School and a certified physical education teacher at South Park Elementary School. She was named Teacher of the Year in 2006 for the Vicksburg Warren School District. Babb volunteered as assistant soccer coach for Vicksburg High School during the 2004-2005 season, and served as the Head Women's Soccer Coach at All-Saints' Episcopal school in 2002.

Coach Babb is a 2002 honor graduate of the University of Southern Mississippi where she received a Bachelor of Science in Coaching and Sports Administration. At USM Babb was a member of the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society and involved in intramural sports.

In 2000 Babb graduated with honors from Hinds Community College with an Associates of Art Degree. While at Hinds Community College she played soccer and softball. In soccer she received Hinds Impact Player (1998), Most Valuable Offensive Player (1999), was selected to the NJCAA All-Region XXIII team (1998, 1999), and named NJCAA All-American (1999). Babb currently holds the record for most assists in a career with 31. In softball she was named to the All-Tournament team in the NJCAA National Tournament in 1998 where the Lady Eagles placed 3rd, won the MACJC State Championship, and won the NJCAA Region XXIII Championship. Academically Babb was named All-American Collegiate Scholar and selected to Who's Who Among American Community and Junior Colleges.

Away from the soccer field, Babb teaches HPR classes and serves as HCC Pool Coordinator. She is a member of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and the Mississippi Association of Coaches. Babb is actively involved in coaching an ODP soccer team and plays with a women's tournament slow pitch softball team.
