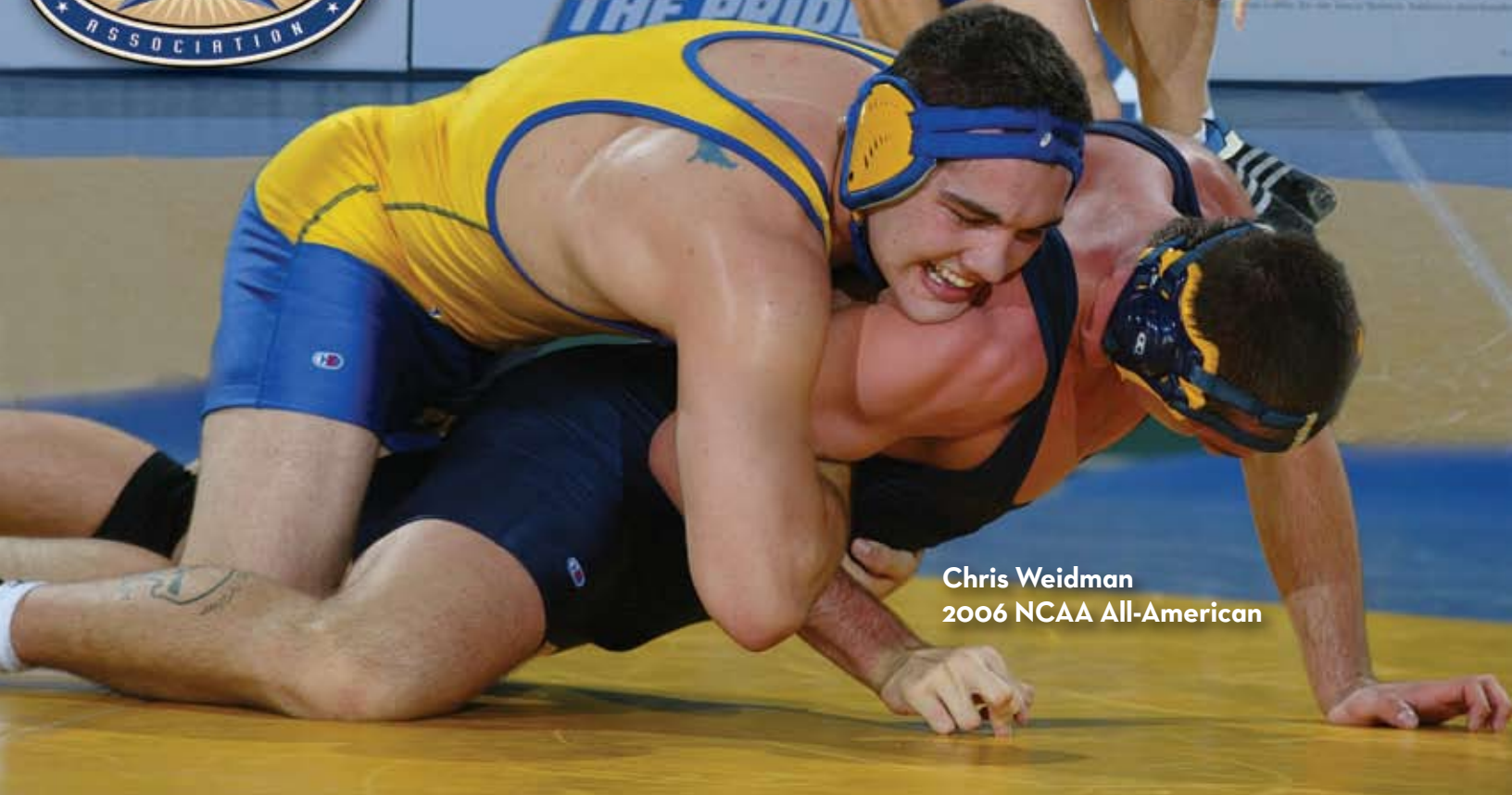

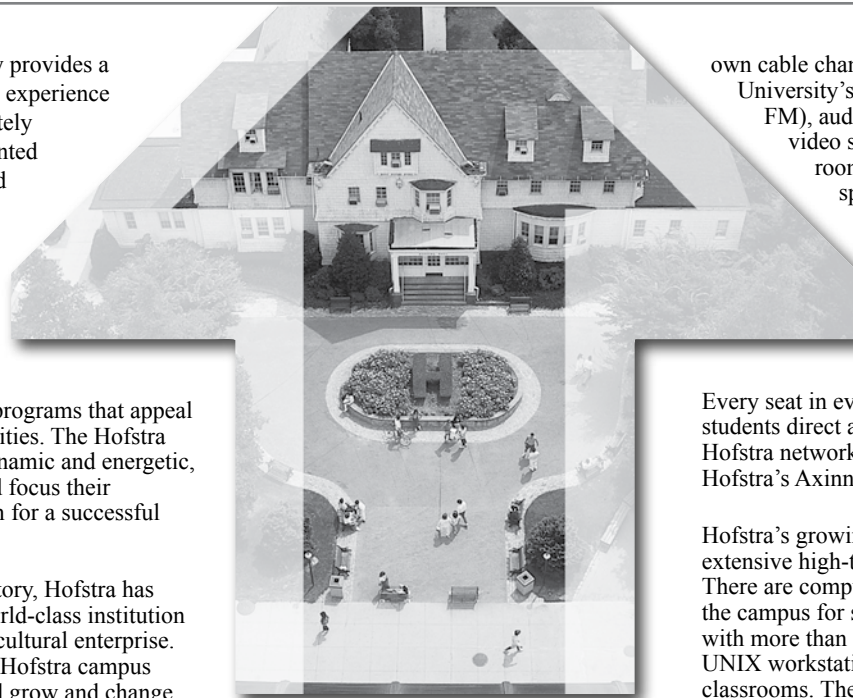
Hofstra University provides a dynamic college experience tailored for innately ambitious, outcome-oriented individuals. Students find their edge at Hofstra, through small classes, a faculty whose primary concern is teaching, cutting edge technology, extensive library resources, internships, and special educational programs that appeal to their interests and abilities. The Hofstra community is driven, dynamic and energetic, helping students find and focus their strengths to prepare them for a successful future.

In its relatively short history, Hofstra has established itself as a world-class institution of higher education and cultural enterprise. Each academic year, the Hofstra campus and the programs offered grow and change to meet the demands of our students and our community.

Hofstra opened in 1935 as a commuter school with all classes and offices housed in one building. Since those early days, Hofstra has evolved into an international institution with a student body hailing from 45 states and 61 countries around the world. The beautiful campus is an accredited arboretum with 113 buildings on 240 acres. There are approximately 4,200 students living on campus, and Hofstra offers them and all students an extensive array of academic and social activities. Additionally, Hofstra's close proximity to Manhattan means that students have easy access to the wondrous cultural, social and career offerings of the city.

What has remained consistent throughout the years, however, is the sense of community on campus, the eagerness of our students to learn and the commitment of the Hofstra faculty and administration to provide a challenging education that encourages the pursuit of lifelong learning.

The Colleges and Schools of the University are: Hofstra College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Frank G. Zarb School of Business, New College of Hofstra, School of Communication, School of Education and Allied Human Services, School of Law, School for University Studies, University College for Continuing Education, Honors College and Saturday College. Bachelor's degrees are offered in 140 areas of study. Graduate degrees are offered, including Ph.D., Ed.D., Psy.D., Au.D. and J.D. degrees, advanced certificates and professional diplomas, in more than 150 programs of study.



own cable channels. Also located here is the University's radio station (WRHU/88.7-FM), audio production studios, a film/video screening room, film editing rooms, a computer laboratory, a speech performance studio and a large dance studio.

Hofstra's C.V. Starr Hall offers academic facilities that are among the most technologically advanced in the nation.

Every seat in every classroom allows students direct access to the Internet and Hofstra network, including the resources of Hofstra's Axinn Library.

Hofstra's growing computer facilities offer extensive high-tech training opportunities. There are computer terminals throughout the campus for student and faculty use, with more than 750 PC, Macintosh and UNIX workstations available in labs and classrooms. The University was ranked 14th in *Forbes'* list of Most Connected Campuses in 2004, up from 18 in 2003.

Hofstra hosts more than 500 cultural events annually, bringing thousands of scholars, dignitaries and other participants to campus. More than 200 musical and dramatic performances take place on campus each year.

The Hofstra Museum, which houses one of the largest art collections in the metropolitan area, coordinates approximately 12 exhibitions annually and offers exhibition areas and an extensive outdoor sculpture

Recently, the University celebrated the opening of Hagedorn Hall, the new home of our School of Education and Allied Human Services. In 2001 Hofstra University Honors College welcomed its first class. This new division of the University proved to be an immediate success, not only with University faculty and administrators, but among the 93 inaugural students. Every fall since, the number of entering freshmen has increased substantially.

Hofstra's School of Communication is one of the largest, most advanced non-commercial television facilities in the East. Students take classes and work in Dempster Hall, a sophisticated television production/post-production facility with two broadcast-quality studios and control rooms; two advanced online video edit suites; two Avid non-linear digital editing systems and several cuts-only video work stations. Two satellite dishes are available with one dish providing special news feeds for the broadcast journalism room, which also has access to *Associated Press*, *Lexis-Nexis* and *Dow Jones* services. In addition, the facility is capable of broadcasting student-produced programming to the entire campus on our



collection, with more than 65 pieces. The Hofstra Museum is accredited by the American Association of Museums – one of only 94 universities in the nation and one of six in New York to hold that distinction.



Hofstra also has seven theaters, a student newspaper, a lively student center, a recreation center and numerous athletic facilities, including the 15,000-seat James M. Shuart Stadium and the 5,124-seat David S. Mack Sports and Exhibition Complex. Hofstra also has an indoor, Olympic-sized (eight lane, 50-meter) swimming pool, one of the largest such facilities in the New York metropolitan area.

The Hofstra athletic program competes on the NCAA Division I level and is a member of the Colonial Athletic Association and the Atlantic 10 Football Conference. The University sponsors 18 intercollegiate programs – nine men’s sports and nine women’s sports. Hofstra has men’s teams in basketball, football, baseball, lacrosse, golf, tennis, wrestling, soccer and cross country. Women’s sports include basketball, volleyball, softball, tennis, soccer, field hockey, lacrosse, cross country and golf. The 18 men’s and women’s intercollegiate athletic teams compete in more than 150 home contests annually.

Hofstra’s academic programs are accredited by numerous national agencies and the University is one of only 270 schools, out of more than 3,600 colleges and universities nationwide, with a chapter of the national honor society Phi Beta Kappa. Of Hofstra’s 1,246 faculty members, 527 are full time and 91 percent hold the highest degree in their fields. The average undergraduate class size is 25 students, while student-faculty ratio is 14-to-1.

HEAD WRESTLING COACH-TOM SHIFFLET

Tom Shifflet, a four-time NCAA Championships qualifier and a three-time All-American as a student-athlete at Edinboro University, and most recently the head wrestling coach at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, became the 10th head wrestling coach in Hofstra University's storied 58-year wrestling history on May 17, 2006.

"An All-American collegiate wrestler, a top-notch recruiter and an outstanding coach, Tom Shifflet has all the qualities that we were looking for to continue the winning tradition of Hofstra Wrestling," Hofstra Director of Athletics Jack Hayes said. "He has been a winner at every level, knows what it takes to get to the top, and shares our vision and passion to make the Pride program the best that it can be."

Shifflet came to Hofstra after four seasons as head wrestling coach at UNC Greensboro, where he was directly responsible for all aspects of the Spartans program including instruction, recruiting, scheduling, academic counseling and community relations. His tenure at UNCG was marked by annual improvements in recruiting, recognition and success. He also created and organized the annual 35-team Southern Scuffle wrestling tournament, which is one of the largest and more competitive Division I regular season tournaments in the country. During his four seasons at UNC Greensboro, Shifflet recorded a 32-32 dual meet record and had nine wrestlers qualify for the NCAA Championships.

A three-time All-American and a four-time national qualifier as a student-athlete at national powerhouse Edinboro from 1992 through 1995, Shifflet began his coaching career as an assistant at Georgia State University in 1995, helping the Panthers post back-to-back winning seasons, and developed three conference champions and four NCAA qualifiers.

In 1997 Shifflet left Georgia State to begin a five-year tenure as an assistant coach at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York. During his time with the Big Red, Shifflet coached 24 NCAA qualifiers, three NCAA All-Americans and helped Head Coach Rob Koll to a pair of Ivy League championships in 1999 and 2001. More importantly, Cornell was also consistently ranked among the nation's top-15 programs. The final Big Red recruiting class that he was involved with placed fifth at the 2006 NCAA Championships in Oklahoma City.

After five seasons at Cornell, the Amherst, New York, native was named the head wrestling coach at UNC Greensboro on May 17, 2002. After a typical transitional season in his first year at UNCG, Shifflet managed to sign one of the top recruiting classes in the nation in 2003. That class, which included one high school All-American, four honorable mention high school All-Americans and seven state champions, received an honorable mention based on InterMat's 2003 final rankings.



In 2003-04 the Spartans claimed their first winning season since 1998-99, posting a 9-6 overall record with the nine victories ranking as the third most in the program's 12-year history. In addition, two of his recruits – Kevin Artis (141 lbs.) and Daren Burns (197 lbs.) – captured conference championships in their respective weight classes with Burns being named the Southern Conference Freshman of the Year.

Shifflet guided UNCG to the most wins in school history during the 2004-05 season as the Spartans recorded a 12-5 overall record, 4-1 in the Southern Conference. He produced the Southern Conference Freshman of the Year for the second consecutive year as Joe Kemmerer earned the award following a 31-7 season. Kemmerer, along with teammates Burns and Joe Lowe, each won their respective

weight classes at the Southern Conference Mat Jam and qualified for the NCAA Tournament.

In 2005-06 UNCG tied a school-record by sending four wrestlers to the NCAA Division I Championships in Oklahoma City and the Spartans finished tied for 31st with Harvard in the final Championship standings. The Spartans finished the season with an 11-6 dual match record and a 4-1 mark in the Southern Conference and had two wrestlers miss out on all-American honors by one victory.

"I am excited about continuing the tradition that Hofstra University has in wrestling," Shifflet said. "It is a great opportunity for me to move the program along, like Tom Ryan did, without missing a beat. I look forward to setting lofty goals and working with a great group of student-athletes to achieve them. I want to move the Hofstra Wrestling program into the top 10 and top five in the nation. We certainly have that opportunity at Hofstra, which was big reason why I took this position. I eagerly await the chance to work with the alumni and the friends of Hofstra wrestling to keep our program moving forward."

Shifflet graduated from Edinboro University in 1995 with a Bachelor of Science degree in health and physical education. As a wrestler, he registered 118 wins for the Edinboro Fighting Scots and was coached by the legendary Bruce Baumgartner. Competing at 142 pounds, Shifflet finished seventh at nationals as a freshman, sixth as a sophomore and third as a senior. He is one of four three-time All-Americans in school history. Shifflet also received the Eastern Wrestling League Freshman of the Year Award in 1992 and the EWL Wrestler of the Year Award in 1995. He was inducted into both the Edinboro University and the EWL Halls of Fame in 2006. In 1996 Shifflet placed seventh in the final U.S. Olympic Trials in freestyle wrestling at 149.5 pounds. One year later he placed sixth in both the World Team Freestyle Trials and the U.S. Open.

Shifflet is married to the former Alice Faron of East Setauket, New York.

ASSISTANT COACHES/STAFF



ROB ANSPACH
Assistant Coach

Rob Anspach, a two-time NCAA

Wrestling Championships participant, is his sixth season as an assistant coach on the Pride wrestling staff in 2006-07.

Anspach compiled a record of 69-51 and made two trips to the NCAA Tournament during his five-year career at Hofstra. In 2000-01 Anspach posted an 11-11 record and finished second at the ECWA Championship, earning a wild card selection to the 2001 NCAA Championships. That season he also won his weight class at the Bearcat Open, compiling a perfect 4-0 record.

In the 1999-00 season, Anspach had a 20-15 record on his way to an ECWA individual championship and an NCAA berth. Anspach also placed first at the Congressional Cup and was the runner-up at the New York State Championships in 1999-00.

Anspach, a resident of Hauppauge, New York, is a 2001 graduate of Hofstra University with a degree in American studies.

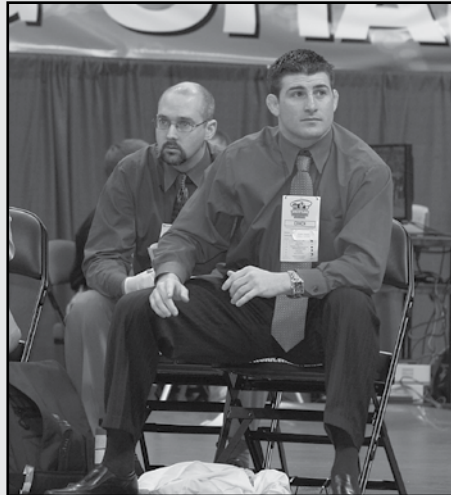


JOE DUBUQUE
Assistant Coach

Two-time NCAA Division I national champion

Joe Dubuque is in his first season as an assistant coach at Hofstra University. Dubuque, a three-time NCAA All-American who captured national titles at 125 pounds in 2005 and 2006, posted an overall record of 114-18 including a 69-6 dual mark and a 19-6 Big Ten record in four years at Indiana University.

Dubuque, a native of Bloomfield, New Jersey, was a scholastic national champion as a senior and a two-time state champion at Glenn Ridge High School. After red-shirting the 2001-02 season at Indiana, he tallied a 23-5 overall record and a 15-3 mark in duals and ranked as high as 12th as a freshman but



missed the Big 10 championship due to an injury.

A year later, Dubuque qualified for his first NCAA appearance with a fourth place finish at the Big 10 Championships and then went on to earn All-America honors with an eighth-place showing at the NCAA Championships. He finished the year with a 34-9 overall record and a 21-2 dual mark, and captured the 125-pound title at the Northern Iowa Open.

In 2004-05 Dubuque placed third in the Big 10 Championships and then defeated three ranked opponents on his march to claim the 125-pound title at the national championships. He became the first Hoosier to appear in a NCAA final since Roger Chandler did so in 1997, and the first IU grappler to claim a national championship since Brian Dolph captured the 150-pound title in 1990. He finished the year with a 29-3 overall record, an 18-1 slate in duals, a 6-1 mark in the Big Ten and a 12-2 mark against ranked opponents.

As a senior during the 2005-06 season, he recorded a 28-1 mark, including a 7-1 record against ranked opponents, and defeated three ranked opponents at the NCAA Championships en route to the 125-pound crown. Dubuque became just the second Hoosier in Indiana history to capture two national titles and the first Hoosier to register back-to-back NCAA crowns. Only the fourth wrestler in Indiana history to earn three All-American awards, he helped lead IU to an 18th-place finish at the 2006 NCAA Championships.

Dubuque, who earned a bachelor's degree in recreation sports management from Indiana, resides in Hauppauge, New York.



JOE MAKOVEC
Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach

Joe Makovec is in his second year as assistant strength and conditioning coach at Hofstra University. Makovec is primarily responsible for designing and implementing the flexibility, nutritional, speed, strength and conditioning protocols for 14 of the University's Olympic sports, as well as assisting Strength and Conditioning Director Ryan Martin with other sports. He also performs periodic body composition and nutritional assessments for student-athletes, as well as assisting in implementing rehabilitation programs for injured student-athletes in conjunction with Hofstra's sports medicine team.

Prior to coming to Hofstra, Makovec was the strength and conditioning coach for the Hamburg Sea Devils of NFL Europe during the 2005 season. Prior to that he was an intern with the National Football League's Indianapolis Colts. He served as an intern from March of 2002 until March of 2003, and was the first strength and conditioning intern to be invited to stay on for a full season by the Colts. He has also had high school football coaching experience at his alma mater, Riverdale High School, where he handled strength and conditioning as well as positional coaching – working with linebackers and running backs during the 2004 and 2005 seasons.

Makovec is a 2002 graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point with degree in health promotion and wellness. While at Stevens Point, Makovec was a linebacker on the football team and was a part of three conference championship winning teams in the WIAC, as well as two NCAA Division III playoff appearances.

Joe is certified by the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA) as a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS). He is single and resides in Mineola, New York.

When former Hofstra Wrestling Coach Tom Ryan left Long Island for Ohio State last April after 11 seasons and building the Pride program into a budding national power with an 11th place finish at the NCAA Championships, the Hofstra Administration sought out a coach who would not only continue the winning tradition of the program, but bring it to the next level.

On May 17, 2006, Tom Shifflet, a four-time NCAA qualifier and a three-time All-American as a student-athlete at Edinboro University in the early 1990s, a proven recruiter while an assistant coach at Cornell University and Georgia State, and a successful head coach at UNC Greensboro, became the 10th head wrestling coach in Hofstra history.

The affable 36-year old comes into a situation with 11 returning lettermen, six starters, six NCAA qualifiers, five Colonial Athletic Association champions and two All-Americans from last year's squad that wrestled its way into the Top 10 for most of the NCAA Championships before finishing 11th, one point out of a ninth-place tie.

While Shifflet has seen "what is", he can also see "what can be". After retaining Assistant Coach Rob Anspach, who helped create Hofstra's rise in his previous five seasons, and hiring 2006 national champion Joe Dubuque as a second assistant coach, Shifflet turned his attention to the team that surprised many people last March. "As I came to Hofstra, I knew that this team has a great deal of talent," Shifflet stated. "But I think I am really surprised at how good the team's work ethic is, and the great attitude they have toward winning. They are all very talented and they all want to win and be better. It is motivating for a coach to have a group of successful wrestlers who are either All-Americans or are about to turn the corner and become an All-American."

While Ryan left the talent cupboard far from bare, he did create a concern for Shifflet when two wrestlers and two recruits followed him to the Buckeye state. "While we do have a lot of talent, depth will be a concern throughout our line-up," Shifflet comments. "We

lost several wrestlers during the coaching transition and that created an issue for us."

The hands-on coach will be looking at both on-the-mat and off-the-mat practices to improve and protect each individual this season. "It's a long season, we'll be in shape and we'll be looking to improve every day," Shifflet stated. "We will look at the way we train and monitor the wrestlers. We will evaluate everything – the mental, physical, and athletic aspects of the sport – and adjust accordingly to reach our goals. But we can't afford to have many injuries."

With the talent on the team, achieving many of the goals will be tied directly into the general health of the squad. "I think we have the talent and potential to be a top 10 team, maybe even top 5 program, in the country," Shifflet said. "We have numerous guys who are ranked in the top 20 in the country entering the season so we should be setting our goals pretty high. One of our goals this year is, that by the time the CAA Championships roll around that we have our 10 best wrestlers healthy, and competing for a shot at the NCAA Championships. If you can do that, the sky is the limit and you have a great opportunity to finish very high. If we get banged up it could take us out of a dual meet, out of winning the conference title, or doing well as the national championships."

125

The 125-pound weight class is one of several weights in which injuries could take a major toll. Two-time NCAA Championship qualifier, Dave Tomasette (Sewell, NJ) returns to his starting role but he is all alone in this division. The 2006 Colonial Athletic Association champion posted a 14-8 record as a sophomore and enters the new season ranked 20th in the nation in the *InterMat* preseason poll, and number one in the CAA preseason rankings. Tomasette, who has struggled with injuries his first two seasons, will benefit from the

arrival of Assistant Coach Joe Dubuque. "Dave is very tough and has a strong work ethic," Coach Shifflet says. "He has a great deal of talent but the main issue for him to be successful is to stay healthy. He will benefit greatly from the coaching of 2006 national champion Joe Dubuque. The two met on the mat at nationals last March with Dubuque posting a 4-2 victory in what he called his toughest match of the Championships."

133

The 133-pound weight class was a major problem last season as the Pride was forced to forfeit or throw a young and undersized wrestler into the fray. The Pride will depend on high school senior national champion Lou Ruggirello (Walden, NY) to fill the spot. The freshman, who was a three-time New York State champion and helped his Valley Central High School team to the New York State Championship in 2006, was also a second team ASICS All-American selection as a senior. "Lou is a guy who is going to surprise many people this year," Shifflet says. "Some may think he is undersized or not strong enough, and I can tell you that is definitely not the case. He is very talented and is going to do well this year." Backing up Ruggirello are sophomore Craig Kennedy (Parsippany, NY), an all-area and all-country selection as a senior, and a district champion both as a freshman and senior at Parsippany High School, and red-shirt freshman Mark Fontana (Palisades Park, NJ), a 2005 transfer to Hofstra from Dominican College who did not wrestle last season.

141

The 141-pound weight class is one of the few divisions in which Hofstra has some depth. Junior Charles Griffin (Reading, PA), a two-time Colonial Athletic Association champion and NCAA Championships qualifier, returns after a 27-8 season in 2005-06. Griffin, who captured a conference title at 133 in 2005 and at 141 last season, enters the season ranked 14th in the country, and second in the CAA. "Charles is focused and had a great preseason," Shifflet commented. "I think he is going to have a tremendous year." Challenging Griffin will be senior John Manarte (Farmingville, NY), a CAA finalist and NCAA Championship qualifier as a freshman in 2004. Manarte, who wrestled behind Griffin last season and posted a 14-5 record, will be looking to upset the junior in preseason wrestle-

offs and get the starting nod. "John is a senior who has been working hard to see action," Shifflet said. "He has a unique, unconventional wrestling style that creates problems for opponents." Freshman Ryan Brown (Cherry Hill, NJ), a two-time all-district selection who finished eighth in the state as a senior at Camden Catholic High School, will also be looking for match action. "Ryan is a hard-worker, who gives us some depth at both 141 and 149," Shifflet commented. "He will benefit from being around Griffin and Manarte this year."

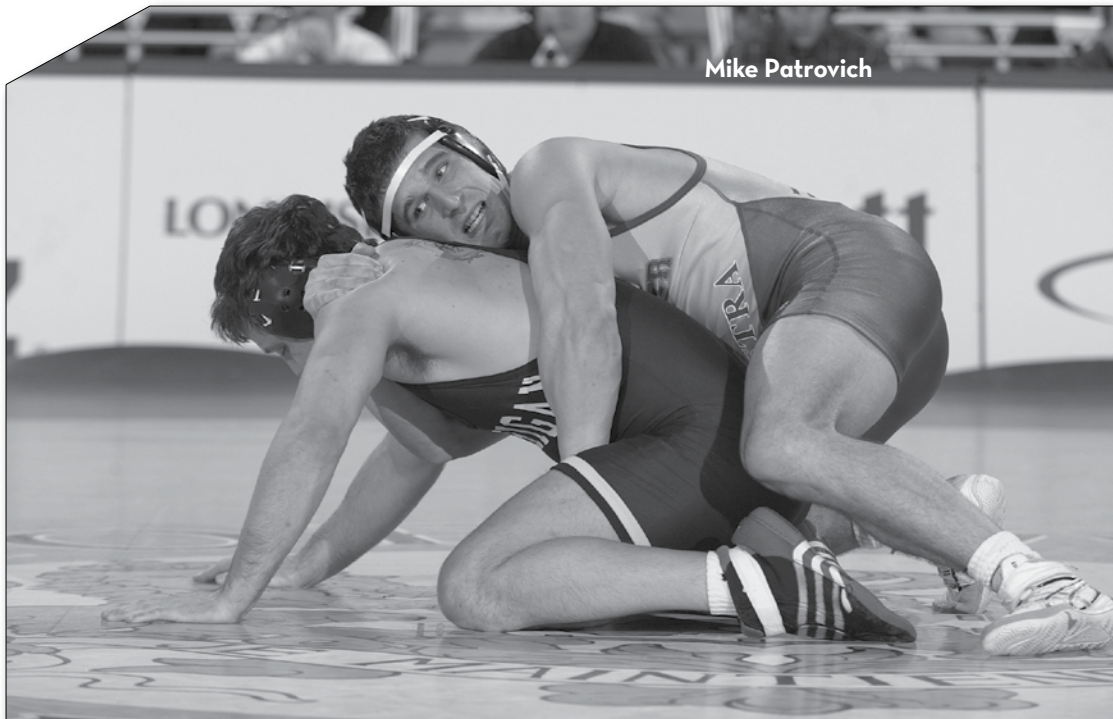
149

The 149-pound weight class, along with 141, will be the most competitive divisions in preseason drills. Red-shirt freshman Mitch Smith (Sandyville, WV), a three-time West Virginia AAA state champion, and a state finalist as a junior, returns and will be looking to take over the spot that three-time All-American Jon Masa vacated due to graduation. Smith posted a 12-3 mark in open tournaments last year, and finished second at the Penn State Open. Battling Smith will be senior Mike Parziale (Woburn, MA), who red-shirted last season after transferring from Franklin & Marshall in 2005. Parziale, who posted an 83-26 record at F&M over his three-year career, was 11-5 record in open tournaments last season, and placed second at the East Stroudsburg Open. "This weight class will be interesting with Mitch, who is very talented and tough to wrestle, and Mike, who is coming down from 157 to 149, and has solid technique," Shifflet said. "Both are athletic and strong, and give us a solid 1-2 punch."

157

Senior James Strouse (Levittown, NY), a three-time NCAA Championship qualifier and a two-time Colonial Athletic Association champion, returns to his starting role and will be looking to join the All-American parade in March. Strouse, who enters the season

ranked 11th by the *Amateur Wrestling News*, 12th by *InterMat*, and first in the CAA preseason poll, posted a 29-12 mark as a junior, placed fourth at the East Stroudsburg Open and seventh at the Cliff Keen/Las Vegas Invitational. "James, who is strong and technically solid, has set some high goals this year," Shifflet stated. "He is a proven wrestler who we will work with to alter some things to get him on the podium at the end of the season." Backing up Strouse is freshman Rich Muzikar (North Caldwell, NJ), an all-county selection, a two-time all-conference pick and the New Jersey Prep state champion at Montclair Kimberly Academy.

165

The Pride lost an All-American at 174 pounds but picked up one at 165 pounds, and he is the same person. Returning All-American, senior Mike Patrovich (Islip, NY) was given an NCAA waiver in September to compete during the 2006-07 and that made Coach Shifflet quite happy. "Getting Mike back this year is a big boost for us," Shifflet exclaimed. "After working with him, it is easy to see that he is a very driven individual, with a strong work ethic. He, too, has some high goals this year. We will work hard with him to attain those goals. Mike is obviously the proven team leader and we will be looking for him to guide the squad toward some very high team goals as well." Patrovich, who placed fourth in the NCAA Championships last year at 174 to earn his first All-American honor, made his third nationals appearance and captured his second Colonial Athletic Association title. He posted a 34-5 record and enters the new season ranked third by both *InterMat* and the *Amateur Wrestling News* at 165. Sophomore Jesse Koproski (Wilton, CT), who posted a 74-23 record and was a two-time team Most Valuable Wrestler at Wilton High School, will back up Patrovich.

174

Sophomore Alton Lucas (West Babylon, NY), a former high school All-American and a finalist at the senior nationals in 2005 who Coach Shifflet says "enters the season a little bit under the national radar," steps into the starting role at 174 in 2006-07. Lucas, a former member of the Hofstra Football team, got caught up in the two-sport shuffle last year, was bounced from 165 to 174, and needed more time to get into wrestling shape. With football out of the picture this season, Lucas, who was

10-6 overall at 165, 174 and 184 last year, went through preseason wrestling drills and conditioning and is ready to go. "Alton has grown into the complete 174 pound wrestler this year," Shifflet says. "He is very strong and athletic and I think opponents are going to have a difficult time with him this year."

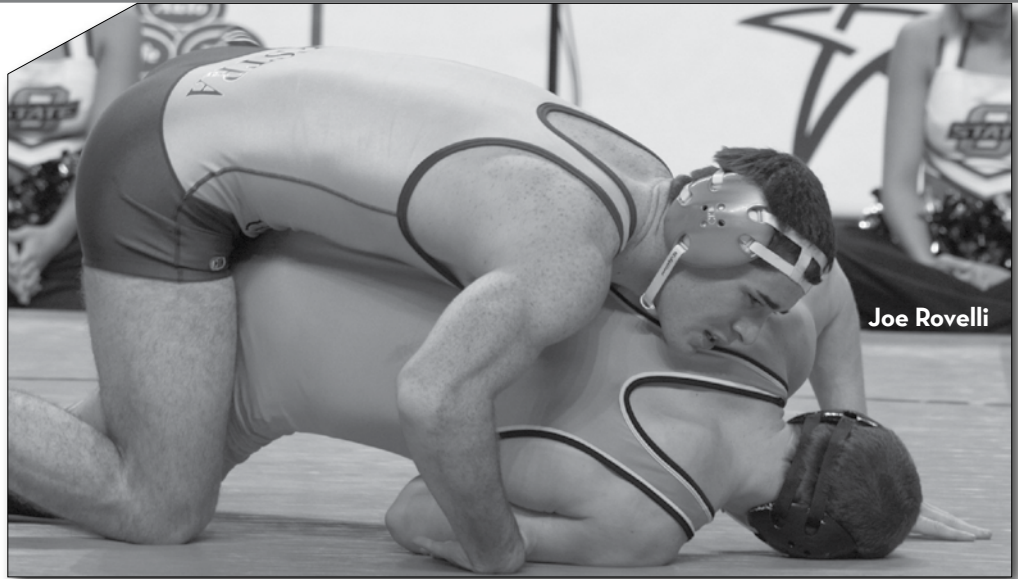

Junior Joe Rovelli (Wilkes-Barre, PA), a two-time NCAA Championships qualifier and Colonial Athletic Association champion, returns to defend his conference title and take the next step on the national stage. Rovelli, who captured the East Stroudsburg Open title and placed sixth at the Cliff Keen/Las Vegas Invitational last year, posted a 28-13 record and was a win away from the All-American podium last year. He enters the season ranked fifth by *InterMat*, eighth by both the *Amateur Wrestling News* and *W.I.N. Magazine*, and is the top-ranked wrestler in the CAA at 184. "Joe is another guy with a successful, unconventional wrestling style," Shifflet commented. "He is bigger and stronger and is having a great preseason. With some refinement, All-American honors are definitely within his reach."

197

Returning All-American, senior Chris Weidman (Baldwin, NY) was the surprise wrestler of the NCAA Championships last March. Entering the championships with a 15-11 mark, the unseeded Weidman, who placed second in the Colonial Athletic Association Championships, captured his first three matches, including upsets of

number one seed Wynn Michelak from Central Michigan, and eighth-seed Ryan Bader from Arizona State, and placed sixth at 197 pounds. Weidman, who lost a month with an injury early in the season, was named to the NWCA's All-Effort Team for his NCAA Championships performances. "Chris had a great run at the end of last season and it has motivated him and made him believe how good of a wrestler he really is," Shifflet said. "He enters the new season confident that he can return to the podium in the challenging, but wide open, 197-pound division."



285

The Pride have struggled at 285 in recent years and it is Shifflet's hope that Cornell University transfer Matt Pollock (Fulton, NY) will end that slide this year. A three-year All-Ivy League nose guard, Pollock, who is working on a master's degree at Hofstra, will be returning to the mat full-time for the first time since high school. A former All-New York State first team selection at Bodley High School, who helped lead his team to two sectional titles and a fifth-place team finish at the 2001 state championship, Pollock wrestled briefly for the Big Red of Cornell after the football season last year. "Matt is strong and athletic and has a solid background in wrestling," Shifflet said. "He was heavily recruited in wrestling coming out of high school but decided to play football. The key to his success is getting back in wrestling shape, getting the dust off of him and getting some more

mat exposure. He is focused and has a great work ethic and I have a lot of confidence in him." Backing up Pollock will be sophomore Gus Del Vecchio (West Caldwell, NJ). Del Vecchio wrestled in three open tournaments last year, posting a 2-4 mark. "Gus is very talented, aggressive and wrestles hard for seven minutes," Shifflet says. "He will challenge Pollock for the starting role."

The Schedule

The Pride will face at least eight teams that are ranked in the NWCA Preseason Top 25 in 2006-07. Ranked opponents include fourth-ranked Oklahoma, seventh-ranked Michigan, 12th-ranked Central Michigan and 14th-ranked Pennsylvania on the road, and eighth-ranked Penn State, ninth-ranked Cornell and 21st-ranked Lehigh in the metropolitan area and top-ranked Minnesota at the Journeymen/Brute Northeast Collegiate Duals in Albany over Thanksgiving weekend. In addition, the Pride could meet other ranked teams at the NWCA National Duals at the University of Northern Iowa in January. The Pride will wrestle two of their five home matches, January 28 against Lehigh and February 3 against Cornell, at the New York Athletic Club in Manhattan. "We have a difficult schedule against some of the best teams in the country," Shifflet says. "We'll see some of the best wrestlers in the country in those matches, the National Duals and at the Las Vegas Invitational. It's the best way to prepare for the NCAA Championships. This will give us what we need to be exposed to when we get to March."



2006-07 HOFSTRA WRESTLING NOTEBOOK

NEW COACH, NEW SEASON: This is Hofstra's 59th season of intercollegiate wrestling. The Pride has had 10 coaches direct the wrestling program, beginning with Walter "Brick" Stone in 1947 and currently with Tom Shifflet, who is in his first season with the Pride. Shifflet, who took over for Tom Ryan after his departure to Ohio State last spring, was a three-time All-American and a four-time NCAA Championship qualifier as a student-athlete at Edinboro University in the early 1990s. He comes to Long Island after four successful seasons at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

HOFSTRA'S 2006-07 SCHEDULE: Hofstra's 2006-07 schedule may be one of the best in school history. The Pride will face at least eight teams that are ranked in the NWCA Preseason Top 25. Ranked opponents this season include top-ranked Minnesota, fourth-ranked Oklahoma, seventh-ranked Michigan, 12th-ranked Central Michigan and 14th-ranked Pennsylvania on the road, and eighth-ranked Penn State, ninth-ranked Cornell and 21st-ranked Lehigh in the metropolitan area. In addition, the Pride could meet several other ranked teams at the NWCA National Duals in January.

MANHATTAN MANIA: The Pride will wrestle two of their five home matches at the New York Athletic Club (NYAC) in New York City. The January 28 match against 21st-ranked Lehigh, and the February 3 contest against number nine Cornell. The NYAC was founded in 1868 with a singular commitment to the growth and development of amateur sport in the United States. Suffice it to say that the Club holds a unique place in the sporting pantheon, a position it bolsters with each passing year. Thirty-nine NYAC athletes competed at the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece.

PRIDE RETURNEES: Hofstra returns 11 lettermen, six starters, six NCAA qualifiers, five conference champions and two All-Americans from last year's squad that placed 11th at the NCAA Division I Championships.

RETURNING ALL-AMERICANS: Seniors Mike Patrovich and Chris Weidman are Hofstra's returning All-Americans in 2006-07. Patrovich, who earned a fourth place finish at 174 pounds at the NCAA Championships last March, will drop down to 165 pounds this year. Weidman, who placed sixth at 197 pounds last March, earned All-Effort Team honors by the NWCA for his finish at the Championships.

CONFERENCE UNDEFEATED STREAK NOW AT 47: Hofstra enters its 2006-07 CAA regular season with a conference dual match undefeated streak of 47 (46-0-1). The Pride has won 44 consecutive conference dual matches. Hofstra, which lost its last conference dual match in 1998-99, was 6-0-1 in 1999-2000, 6-0-0 in 2000-01 and 2004-05, 6-0-0 in 2001-02, 7-0-0 in 2002-03, 8-0-0 in 2003-04 and 6-0 in 2005-06. The last time Hofstra dropped a conference dual match was on February 17, 1999 when the Broncs of Rider beat the Pride, 28-10 in an East Coast Wrestling Association (ECWA) match.

PRIDE RANKED 11TH IN THE USA TODAY/NWCA/INTERMAT PRESEASON POLL: The Hofstra Pride Wrestling Team is ranked 11th in the country in the 2006-07 *USA Today/Intermat*/National Wrestling Coaches Association (NWCA) Preseason Division I Coaches Poll. The Golden Gophers of Minnesota, who finished second at the NCAA Championships last year, take the top spot in the preseason poll, followed by defending national champion



Oklahoma State, Missouri, Oklahoma and Iowa. Individually for Hofstra, six Pride members are ranked in the preseason Top 20 in their respective weight classes. Senior Mike Patrovich (Islip, NY), who posted a 34-5 record and earned All-American honors with a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships last March, will drop down to 165 pounds this year and is ranked third in the preseason poll. Junior Joe Rovelli (Wilkes-Barre, PA), a two-time Colonial Athletic Association champion, posted a 28-13 record last year and is ranked fifth at 184 pounds this year. Senior Chris Weidman (Baldwin, NY), who earned All-American honors with a sixth-place finish at 197 pounds last year, is ranked sixth in the preseason poll. Senior James Strouse (Levittown, NY), another two-time CAA champion who posted a 29-12 mark last year, is ranked 12th at 157 pounds. STUART RABINOWITZ

Stuart Rabinowitz was chosen by the Hofstra University Board of Trustees to serve as the eighth president of the University on December 20, 2000. Prior to his appointment, he served as dean of Hofstra University School of Law from September 1989 through June 2001. He joined the faculty of the School of Law in 1972. President Rabinowitz currently holds the Andrew M. Boas and Mark L. Claster Distinguished Professorship in Civil Procedure.

President Rabinowitz holds positions with a number of important government and community organizations, including the Judicial Advisory Council of the State of New York Unified Court System - County of Nassau, the Nassau County Health and Welfare Council. He serves on the Board of Directors for the Fair Media Council and the Long Island Technology Network. President Rabinowitz is a former member of the Nassau County Blue Ribbon Financial Review Panel, former Chair of the Nassau County Local Advisory Board, a former trustee of the Commission on Independent Colleges and Universities, and a former member of the Board of Directors of the Long Island Association. Additionally, President

Rabinowitz served as a member of the Nassau County Commission on Government Revision, which was charged with drafting a new charter and a new form of government for the County. He is the recipient of the Martin Luther King Living the Dream Award, EOC; Distinguished Service in the Cause of Justice, Legal Aid Society; UJA Federation Leadership Award; the Bar Association of Nassau County Proclamation for Outstanding Service to both the Legal Profession and the Community; the Community Service Award from the Conference of Jewish Organizations of Nassau County; and the Alumni Association of the City College of New York 2005 Townsend Harris Medal.

President Rabinowitz received a juris doctor, magna cum laude, from Columbia University School of Law, where he was a member of the board of editors of the *Columbia Law Review* and a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar. He graduated from City College of New York with honors, and is a member of Phi Beta Kappa and the American Law Institute.

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS—JACK HAYES

Jack Hayes is in his third year as director of athletics at Hofstra University in 2006-07. Hayes was appointed by Hofstra President Stuart Rabinowitz as the University's new director of athletics on October 4, 2004. Hayes came to Hofstra after serving as an associate director of athletics at the University of Connecticut for three years.

Hayes, the eighth director of athletics at Hofstra, oversees Hofstra's 18 Division I teams, an athletic administration of more than 70 professional staff, and 430 student-athletes. He also serves on the NCAA Division I Lacrosse committee.

Hayes' proven expertise in enhancing academic and athletic success of student-athletes, strategic planning, fundraising, marketing, university relations, facility enhancement, budgetary management, and NCAA compliance will complement Hofstra University's athletic department in its quest to further enhance its athletic program, and assist Hofstra's student-athletes both on and off the field.

2005-06 was a banner year for Hofstra Athletics as the Pride won Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) championships in men's soccer, women's soccer, wrestling, softball and men's lacrosse and competed in NCAA Tournaments in each sport. In addition, the men and women's basketball teams were selected to play in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT). In his first year (2004-05) as Hofstra's athletics director, the Pride captured three CAA championships and advanced to postseason play in four sports – men's soccer, wrestling and softball took part in the NCAA Tournament, while men's basketball participated in the NIT.

Hayes has placed a significant emphasis on fundraising during his first two years. Pride Club membership reached all-time highs, both in terms of the number of contributors and funds raised. Resources generated through fundraising efforts have been used to enhance programs and facilities



available to student-athletes. Recent initiatives include the renovation of the study lab in Margiotta Hall and a new academic study area in the Physical Fitness Center.

Hayes came to Hofstra University with more than 14 years of athletic administration experience, including management positions at four Division I institutions. The three years prior to taking his current position were highlighted by leading the University of Connecticut Division of Athletics fund-raising efforts, where his responsibilities included managing the operations of the UConn Athletic Development Fund, implementing

policies and procedures for the annual giving program, assisting with the cultivation and solicitation of major gift prospects, coordinating capital project campaigns, overseeing special events, and managing the athletic ticketing operation. While at UConn, he served as a senior staff member for a \$40 million program that supports 24 sports and 650 student-athletes.

From 1998 to 2001 Hayes served as director of athletic administration at Fordham University, where he was responsible for the comprehensive internal operations of the athletic department, including fiscal management, facilities management, staff training and development, ticket operations, and NCAA compliance initiatives.

Prior to his tenure at Fordham, Hayes served as assistant director of athletics at St. John's University, where he managed the fiscal operations of the athletic department and supervised the business office. Hayes began his professional career in college athletics at Fairfield University, where he served as assistant director of athletics. He oversaw the addition of four sports programs at Fairfield – football, women's rowing, women's lacrosse and women's golf.

Hayes received a master's degree in education in 1992 with a concentration in sport management from the University of Connecticut. He holds a bachelor's degree (1989) from Providence College, where he was a member of Providence's lacrosse team. He was also awarded a certificate of completion in 2001 from the Sports Management Institute, Consortium of the Universities of Michigan and Texas.

A native of Providence, Rhode Island, Hayes graduated from the Providence Country Day School where he lettered in football, basketball and lacrosse. He was inducted, as a member of his high school basketball team, into the Providence Country Day Athletic Hall of Fame in October 2004. He resides in East Northport, New York, with his wife Bridget, daughter Katie (4) and son Matt (1).

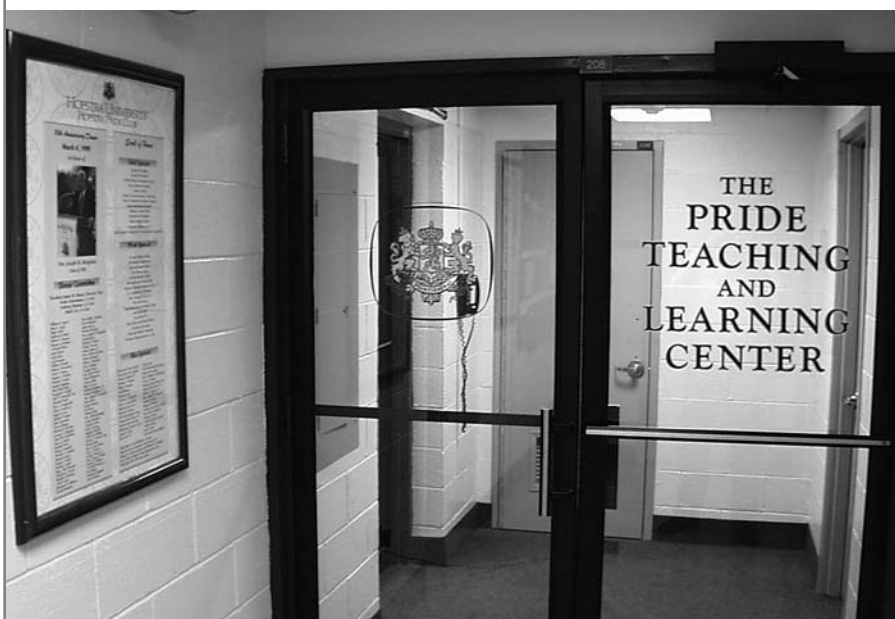

ACADEMIC SUPPORT



Hofstra University is committed to the pursuit of academic and athletic excellence. The University views participation in intercollegiate athletics as benefiting the student-athlete in an educationally enhancing experience beyond any other opportunity available. Hofstra also realizes the time commitment made by student-athletes and has committed the facilities and resources to support all students.

The University Tutorial Program (UTP) provides free tutoring in every subject area to any Hofstra student. Students are able to obtain up to 1 1/2 hours of individual tutorial assistance per week for each subject. They are also able to utilize the various help labs on campus, which specialize in providing assistance in writing, business and QM, and biology and chemistry. In addition to this service, student-athletes are assigned an academic advisor who helps address the various needs of student-athletes. The academic advisor emphasizes four areas in their efforts to ensure the academic success of Hofstra's student-athletes.

Area one is academic counseling. Services are provided in the areas of academic planning, career planning, personal counseling, and campus and community referrals.

The counselor also meets with prospective student-athletes, at the coach's request, to share the many benefits of a Hofstra University education.

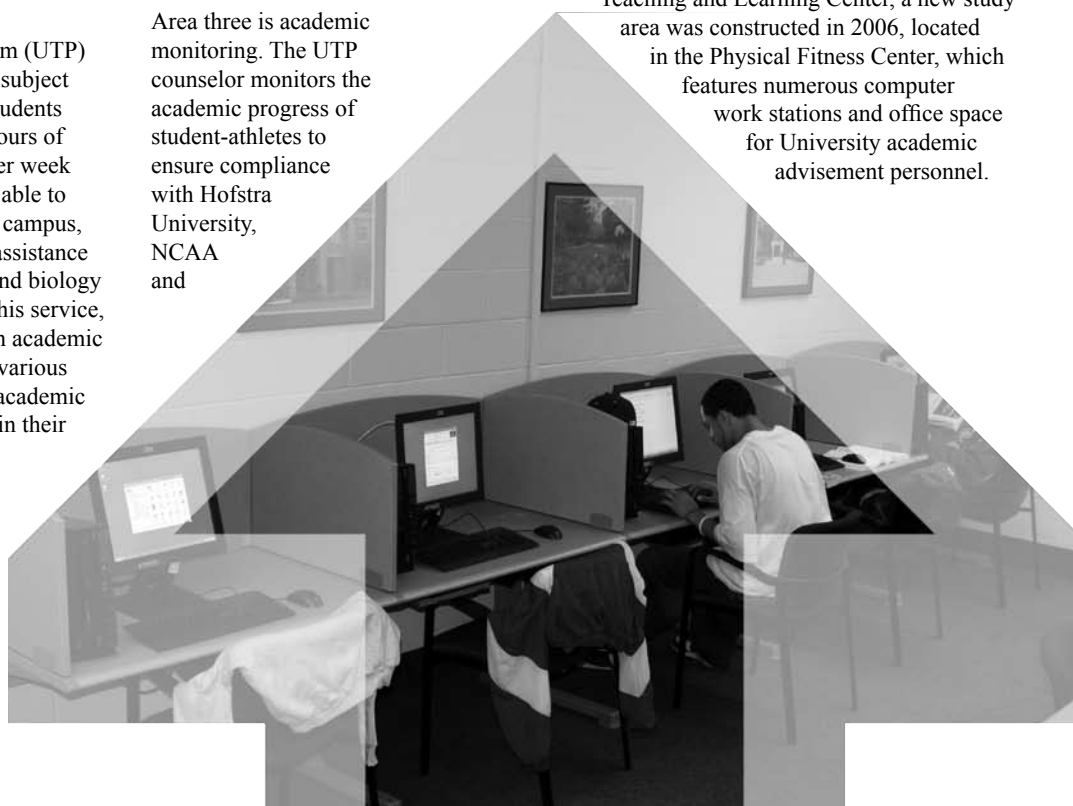
Area two is academic advising. In an effort to ease the demand on the Office of Advisement, the academic advisor also advises first-year and undecided student-athletes.

Area three is academic monitoring. The UTP counselor monitors the academic progress of student-athletes to ensure compliance with Hofstra University, NCAA and

conference regulations. The counselor's regular communication with the faculty and coaches provide an opportunity for early intervention should academic difficulties arise.

Area four is study halls. The University Tutorial Program provides all athletic study halls with tutors in various subjects and assesses the needs of individual student-athletes to provide the most effective study environment. The assessment tool administered by the UTP is also used to provide various enrichment seminars for the student-athletes such as time management, writing skills, campus resources, and surviving the college transition.

In the fall of 1999, the Pride Teaching and Learning Center opened on the second floor of Margiotta Hall. Funded in part by proceeds from the Joe Gardi Golf Open, the state-of-the-art computer lab and learning center features a projection system and 18 computer workstations, which are connected to the University network for easy research access to the Internet. The Pride Teaching and Learning Center was refurbished in 2005 with new furniture and computers. In addition to the Teaching and Learning Center, a new study area was constructed in 2006, located in the Physical Fitness Center, which features numerous computer work stations and office space for University academic advisement personnel.



SPORTS MEDICINE/ATHLETIC TRAINING

Through a comprehensive athletic training program, Hofstra University student-athletes are provided excellent health care during their attendance at the University. A coordinated effort between the University Health and Wellness Center, the Athletic Department and outside health care providers ensures every student-athlete the best medical attention possible.

University student-athletes have direct access to a myriad of health care services. Managing the coverage of every practice and competition event is Hofstra University's athletic training staff, which is led by third-year Head Athletic Trainer Evan Malings and features nine full-time athletic trainers and numerous student athletic trainers. The athletic trainers provide injury management, rehabilitation and treatment to the entire Athletic program. Utilizing three state-of-the-art athletic training rooms, these professionals work tirelessly to ensure the safe participation of Hofstra's student-athletes and to return injured athletes to play quickly and safely.

Supporting the athletic trainers is team physician Dr. Damion Martins. Dr. Martins, a physician with Pro Health Care, Inc. in Lake Success, New York, is in his fourth year on Hofstra's medical team. Martins experience in the sports medicine field includes serving as team physician for the University of Maryland, University of Maryland-Baltimore County and Coppin State athletic departments. He was also on the medical staff of the National Football League's Baltimore Ravens.

Hofstra University sponsors a fully accredited, highly competitive undergraduate degree program for athletic training majors, in which Hofstra student athletic trainers participate in all aspects of the health care system.

HOFSTRA SYMBOLS AND HERITAGE

The Symbols of Hofstra University

The Shield Logo

In 2005 Hofstra introduced a new logo as part of a University-wide re-imaging. Both the University's logo as well as the Pride logo were designed by advertising agency Powell New York, a full-service branding and marketing agency, noted as one of the ten firms to watch in 2005 in Advertising Age.

The new University logo features an "H" within a shield design. Hofstra University has always been known for both a tradition of academic excellence and a willingness to evolve to meet the needs of students and the greater society. This shield represents the University's commitment to our heritage and a tradition of academic excellence, while the dynamic representation of the H within the shield embodies the evolutionary, changing nature of the University. Hofstra University has both honored its traditions and heritage while embracing changing disciplines, using new technology and remaining relevant to scholarly pursuits and the demands of industry.

The Seal

The Hofstra seal was designed from the royal Dutch emblem by art instructor Constant Van de Wall. The seal is modeled on the coat of arms of the House of Orange-Nassau. The round seal includes the coat of arms, flanked by lions on either side. A lion also stands in the center of the coat of arms, holding a sword in its right claw and a bundle of seven arrows, which represent the seven provinces of Holland, in its left. The seal also carries the motto of the House of Orange-Nassau in Old French: "Je maintiendray" (I stand steadfast). In 1988 one of the two lions on the seal was officially replaced with a lioness. The Hofstra seal is still in use today, though not as a logo. The seal will be affixed to formal documents, and used for official purposes such as commencement, convocations, and official University functions.

The Pride

As of July 1, 2005, our athletic teams are officially known as the Pride, providing our teams with a strong, consistent image that resonates with the Hofstra community. The new Hofstra Athletics logo consists of a graphic mark of a male and female lion in powerful, synchronized motion with the word mark of the Hofstra Pride or the specific sports team. This logo will be the only one used by Hofstra Athletics.

The Hofstra Pride refers to a pack of lions, male and female, which work together towards a common goal and symbolize determination and strength. The Pride conveys both the teamwork and togetherness that is a trait of lions living in prides, who have a close bond and work together for the good of the entire group. The teamwork evident in prides are traits of Hofstra's student-athletes, who support each other in furtherance of a common goal, while working tirelessly to represent their teams and, in turn, the University. Lions also possess speed, tenacity, and agility, and are relentless in their pursuit of a goal, which are traits our student-athletes demonstrate both on and off the field.

The first consistent use of the word "Pride" relating to athletics was in 1989 when the University's athletic booster club was founded and called itself The Pride Club, which at the time simply referred to the pride that alumni and fans had for our teams. The Pride identity has progressed over the past decade in a more specific fashion than just the expression of a feeling. After one lion on the Hofstra seal was changed into a lioness to symbolize gender equity, the University mascots -- Kate and Willie Pride, a lioness and lion -- were introduced.

Hofstra's Dutch Heritage

Ties to Dutch heritage and the Netherlands began with William S. Hofstra, after whom the school is named and on whose property the University was started. William Hofstra died in 1932 and when his wife, Kate, died 16 months later, her will provided that their house, 15-acre estate, and bulk of her inheritance were to be used for a "public, charitable, benevolent, or scientific purpose" as a memorial to her husband.

The idea for a college came from Truesdel Peck Calkins, former Hempstead superintendent of schools, who was then with New York University. He suggested that NYU might offer extension courses on the Hofstra property. Hofstra opened in September 1935, as a two-year extension branch of NYU; its official name was "Nassau College -- Hofstra Memorial of New York University at Hempstead, Long Island." When the doors opened, the sole building on campus was Hofstra's mansion, which he had affectionately named the Netherlands after his homeland, and all classes were held there. The mansion, which houses administrative offices, is now the center of Hofstra's 240-acre campus, and has been renamed Hofstra Hall.

David S. Mack Sports and Exhibition Complex Home of Hofstra Wrestling

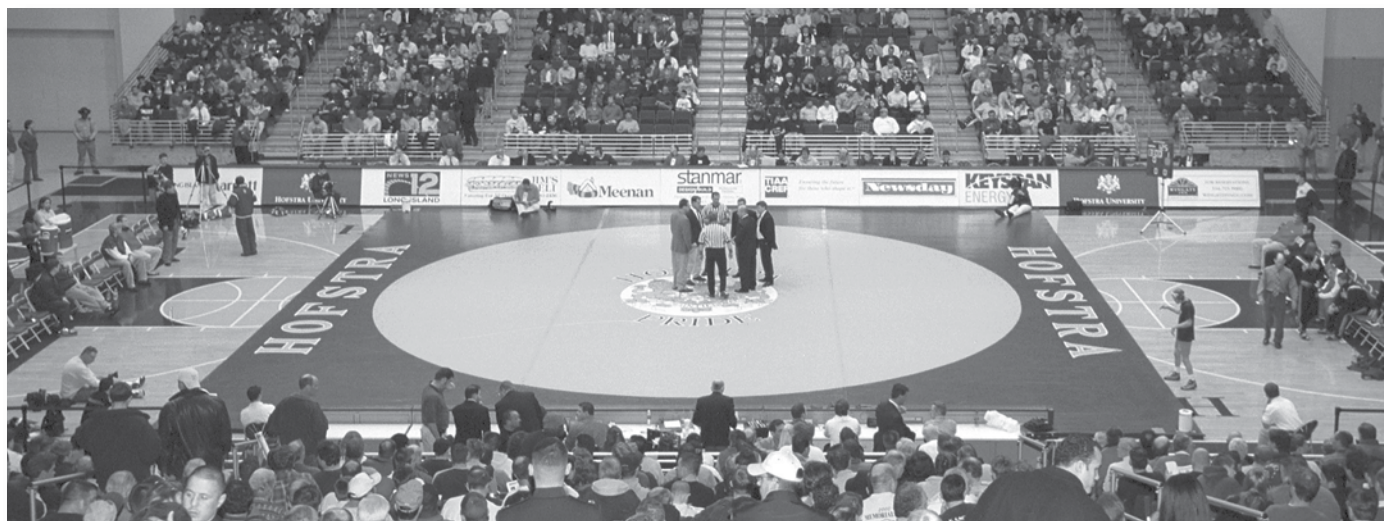
The Pride will begin play in their eighth season at the David S. Mack Sports and Exhibition Complex. The \$15 million, 93,000 square-foot facility, formerly known as Hofstra University Arena, was renamed in August 2006 following a gift from Hofstra Trustee David S. Mack, a senior partner of the real estate development firm The Mack Company.

“Mr. Mack has been extremely generous to Hofstra over the years, and the David S. Mack arena will serve as just the latest reminder on our campus of that generosity,” said Hofstra University President Stuart Rabinowitz, referring to the David S. and Sondra Mack Student Center and Mack Hall, which houses the University Club.

Construction of the Mack Sports Complex began in the fall of 1998 and was completed in December 1999. The Mack Sports Complex also hosts commencements, exhibitions, trade shows, concerts and other special events.

The David S. Mack Sports and Exhibition Complex features full chair back seating for spectators in an arena configuration. The air-conditioned facility is equipped with a state-of-the-art electronic scoreboard, men’s and women’s locker rooms, a training room, a large weight room, dressing rooms for stage events, four concession stands, five ticket windows, six luxury boxes, a Hofstra Pride Club lounge and offices for Hofstra’s Men’s and Women’s Basketball programs.

The Pride have hosted some of the biggest names in collegiate wrestling at Hofstra Arena, welcoming Oklahoma State, Michigan, Michigan State, Nebraska, Oregon State, Iowa and Iowa State in recent years.

Hofstra Wrestling Room

Located in the Physical Fitness Center, the Hofstra Wrestling Room provides the Pride with a year-round practice and training facility that is available to the wrestlers to work out on their own time, as well as scheduled practice times. The 40x80 room contains double floor mats and wall mats. The walls of the room are adorned with plaques commemorating Hofstra's Wrestling All-Americans and poster size photos of current members of the Pride.

2005-06 CAA Year in Review

HOFSTRA CAPTURES FIFTH CONSECUTIVE CAA TITLE; MASA NAMED CAA CHAMPIONSHIP OUTSTANDING WRESTLER

Seven of the eight Hofstra wrestlers who earned berths in the 2006 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships in Oklahoma City from March 16-18 went as Colonial Athletic Association champions after the Pride captured its fifth consecutive CAA Championship at Drexel University's Daskalakis Athletic Center on March 4.



for the second straight year, this time in the 174-pound final defeating Doug Umbehauer from Rider, 7-3. Patrovich, made his third NCAA Championship appearance. Junior James Strouse defended his 2005 CAA title at 157-pounds with a 7-3 title match decision over Ryan Hluschak from Drexel. Like Patrovich, Strouse made his third NCAA Championship appearance. Sophomore Joe

With seven individual champions, one second-place finisher and a fourth-place finish from its nine competitors in the 2006 conference tournament, the Pride posted their second most points in a conference championship in school history on the way to a sixth consecutive conference title. Hofstra captured the East Coast Wrestling Association Championship in 2001 before the league merged with the CAA. The Pride also equaled the school record, set in 2005, with seven individual champions.

Two-time All-American senior Jon Masa became just the second wrestler in Hofstra history to capture four conference titles with a pin of Drexel's Chris Renninger at the 2:42 mark of the 149-pound championship match. Masa joins Jason DeBruin (1999-2002) as the only four-time league titlists. Masa, who would go on to earn his third All-American honor, was named the CAA Championship Most Outstanding Performer. At the CAAs, he won by a major decision, a tech fall in the semi-finals and with a pin in the finals.

Four Hofstra wrestlers earned their second conference titles. Senior Mike Patrovich, who was named the CAA Wrestler of the Year, won

Rovelli also defended his 2005 CAA title at 184-pounds with a 6-0 decision over Joe Maroney from Rider. Rovelli made his second trip to the NCAA Championships. Sophomore Charles Griffin earned his second CAA title at a new weight, defeating Chris Davis from Sacred Heart, 7-3, in the 141-pound final. Griffin captured the 2005 CAA Rookie of the Year award and the 133-pound championship.

Sophomore Dave Tomasette also made his second NCAA Championship appearance, but this time, he went as the CAA champion after defeating Bryan Lashomb from Old Dominion, 8-7, in the 125-pound title match. Tomasette was a CAA finalist in 2005. Senior Chris Vondruska earned his first trip to the NCAA Championships with a CAA championship at 165-pounds. He defeated Steven Tisdell from George Mason in the title match.

Junior Chris Weidman made his first NCAA Championship appearance after earning a place in the CAA finals at 197-pounds. Weidman, who lost in the final by fall in 2:54 to Adam Wright of Old Dominion, went on to earn a sixth place finish and All-America honors. Junior heavyweight Jon Andriac placed fourth in the CAA Championship

PATROVICH NAMED CAA WRESTLER OF THE YEAR

Hofstra University wrestler Mike Patrovich was selected the 2006 Colonial Athletic Association Wrestler of the Year in a vote by conference coaches. Patrovich's award marks the fourth straight year that a Pride wrestler has been named the CAA Wrestler of the Year following Chris Skretkowicz in 2003 and 2004, and Jon Masa in 2005.

Patrovich, a native of Islip, New York, earned his first All-America honor by placing fourth at 174 pounds at the NCAA Championships in Oklahoma City in March. He advanced to the championship semifinals before losing to eventual national champion Ben Askren from Missouri. In the consolation semifinals, Patrovich defeated Penn's Matt Herrington, 9-4, before dropping an 11-2 decision to Iowa's third-seeded Mark Perry in the third place match. He finished the season with a 34-5 record.

A three-time NCAA qualifier, Patrovich is a three-time CAA Championship finalist and a two-time champion, capturing titles at 165 pounds in 2005 and 174 pounds in 2006.

In other awards presented, former Hofstra coach Tom Ryan was named the CAA Wrestling Coach of the Year, and Steve Mytych of Drexel University was named the CAA Rookie of the Year. Ryan led Hofstra to an 11th place finish at Nationals with a school-record 52.5 points, after winning a fifth consecutive CAA title this season. The 11th-year mentor of the Pride, who left Long Island to accept a similar position at Ohio State in April, received his seventh straight conference Coach of the Year award including his fifth in the CAA.

Mytych, a freshman 125 from Wyoming, PA (Northampton), placed third in the CAA Championships and advanced to Nationals. Mytych was 26-12 overall this year, including 19-8 in duals and 8-1 in the CAA.

THE COLONIAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

Coming off one of the most successful seasons in its 21-year history, the Colonial Athletic Association continues to enhance its reputation as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences.

With a geographic footprint that stretches from Boston to Atlanta, the CAA encompasses five of the nation's nine largest metropolitan areas. On the playing field, the conference has produced 16 national team champions in five different sports, 33 individual national champions, 12 national players of the year, 11 national coaches of the year and 12 Honda Award winners. Even more impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 19 NCAA post-graduate scholars. In 2005-06, the CAA had 11 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans and more than 1,500 of our 4,000 student-athletes posted at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport and received the CAA Commissioner's Academic Award.

The landscape of the conference stretches along the majority of the East Coast, and includes six of the nation's top 25 media markets – New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Boston (5), Washington, D.C. (8), Atlanta (9) and Baltimore (23). The number of television homes in the CAA market exceeds 19 million.

The CAA conducts championships in 21 sports. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and wrestling. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. The CAA will also begin sponsorship of a 12-team Division I-AA football league in the fall of 2007.

The conference made its presence known nationally in men's basketball, with four teams advancing to post-season play for the second year in a row. George Mason became the first mid-major program since 1979 to reach the Final Four, knocking off powerhouses Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and Connecticut along the way. The Patriots were ranked

#8 in the final ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll, which was the highest ever for a CAA team. UNC Wilmington claimed its third league title in the past five years before dropping an overtime decision in the NCAA Tournament. Old Dominion became the first conference team to reach the final four of the NIT, defeating league member Hofstra in the quarterfinals. Drexel was the first CAA squad to make the final four of the NIT Pre-Season Tip-Off Tournament, where it dropped close decisions to national powers Duke and UCLA. The CAA was ranked eighth out of 31 conferences in the final RPI with six teams among the top 88 in the country.

In women's basketball, the CAA had a league-record four teams earn post-season berths and was ranked #8 in the final RPI. Perennial power Old Dominion, which claimed its 15th consecutive conference title, has a storied history that includes three national championships (1979, 1980, 1985) and a national runner-up finish in 1997. Delaware, James Madison and Hofstra received berths in the 2006 WNIT.

The conference also excels in many other sports. CAA squads have won 10 field hockey national titles since the championship began in 1981 and Old Dominion advanced to the national semifinals in 2005. In baseball, James Madison's Kellen Kulbacki was chosen as the Co-National Player of the Year and the league had 28 players chosen in the 2006 Major League Baseball draft. The CAA is annually ranked among the nation's top 10 conferences in men's and women's soccer, and traditionally sends multiple teams to the NCAA Tournament. Hofstra's men's lacrosse team was ranked #2 in the nation last season and tied an NCAA record with 17 victories while CAA women's tennis players Megan Moulton-Levy of William & Mary and Tatsiana Uvarova of VCU both earned All-America honors after facing off in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championship. In 2005-06, 21 league teams earned NCAA Tournament berths in 16 sports. There were 37 CAA student-athletes who earned All-America honors.

CAA member institutions are committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a goal of expanding their partnership

to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Among the programs already established are an undergraduate research conference, coordination of study abroad programs and granting visiting academic status to student-athletes traveling to an away contest so that they have access to libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs.

In 2002, two faculty members from CAA institutions were awarded academia's most coveted distinction – the Nobel Prize. John B. Fenn, a research professor in the Department of Chemistry at Virginia Commonwealth University, received the Nobel Prize for chemistry, and Vernon Smith, a professor of economics and law at George Mason University, shared the Nobel Prize in economic sciences.

Commissioner Thomas E. Yeager has guided the CAA since its inception. Long-time members George Mason University, James Madison University, the University of North Carolina at Wilmington, Old Dominion University, Virginia Commonwealth University and the College of William & Mary were joined by the University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Georgia State University and Northeastern University became members of the conference on July 1, 2005.

The CAA traces its roots back to 1983 when three of its current members – George Mason, James Madison, and William and Mary – were aligned with East Carolina University, the United States Naval Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11 sports, acquired two new members (UNC Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new association. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985. Old Dominion became a member of the CAA in 1991-92 and VCU joined the conference prior to the 1995-96 season.

From all-star athletes to Nobel Prize winning faculty, the CAA takes great pride in producing performers who stand out both on the playing field and in the classroom.

THE HISTORY OF HOFSTRA WRESTLING

The history of Hofstra Wrestling dates back almost 60 years. The program, which began as a club team in 1946, grew quickly and became nationally recognized within two decades.

The first season of Hofstra Wrestling saw Walter "Brick" Stone as the team's head coach. In its first season as a club team, Hofstra went undefeated in six matches. Home matches were held at Hempstead High School. Three members who helped initiate the first team were Dick Bemson, Frank Fusco and Jim Geiger.

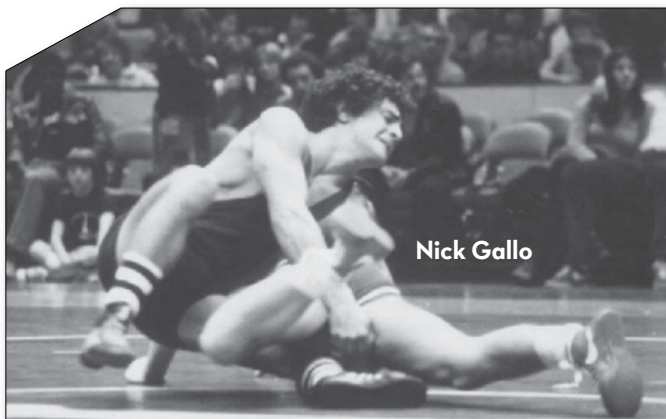
Wrestling became a varsity sport during the 1947-48 season. That year Hofstra entered the NCAA Championships held at Lehigh University after compiling a 5-2-1 record.

Under Stone's direction, the wrestlers set a school record of 16 straight victories during the early '50s. The 1951-52 squad suffered only two losses en route to a 10-2 season. One of the early program's outstanding wrestlers was Art Strunk.

The next Hofstra wrestlers to enter the national spotlight were Dan Notine and Pete Damone. In 1956 Notine became the first Hofstra wrestler to capture a coveted Middle Atlantic Conference Championship. Damone replaced Stone as the team's coach in 1960.

The early tradition of success continued during Damone's six-year reign as head coach. Damone produced several fine wrestlers, including Don Hannon ('60), Tom Haseman ('61), Dick Snyder ('63) and Ken Robinson ('64). The 1965-66 squad won the Metropolitan Intercollegiate Championship and crowned its first Metro title winner, Art Rudolph.

In 1966 Bob Getchell became the program's third coach. Getchell's first squad produced two Metro Conference winners, Butch Jemmott and Ken Robinson. His second team won the Metro title with Jemmott, Dave Berman and Marty Willigan all taking individual titles, and wrestlers such as Steve Molello offering great contributions to the team. Willigan was named the 1968 Tournament's Outstanding Wrestler. He then went on to the NCAA Championships where he took fourth place, becoming Hofstra's first All-American.



In 1969 the team finished third in the Metropolitan and Middle Atlantic Conference Championships. Willigan captured second place in the NCAA Championships, losing in the final round to Iowa State's legendary Dan Gable, the top wrestler in the United States. Gable would later coach Hofstra's current head coach, Tom Ryan, while he attended Iowa.

The wrestling program continued to develop under Getchell's direction. Joel Kislin became Hofstra's second All-American when he placed third at the NCAA Championships in 1973. In 1972-73, Hofstra hosted the Middle Atlantic Conference Championships and placed second.

In the mid-1970s, standouts Nick Gallo, a 126-pounder, and Don Mayorga, a heavyweight, began to make their presence felt. They powered Hofstra to three East Coast Conference Championships. (The Middle Atlantic Conference formed the East Coast Conference during this time.) Gallo went on to become an alternate for the United States team in the 1976 Olympic Games. In 1977 he captured the NCAA Championship at 126 pounds. He also earned the Tournament's Outstanding Wrestler Award.

Bob Getchell then left the coaching ranks to become Hofstra's Director of Athletics. Al Bevilacqua replaced him and continued the winning tradition. Hofstra won six straight ECC Championships from 1975 through 1980. After missing a year at the top in 1981, Hofstra captured two more titles in 1982 and 1983.

Hofstra standout Nick Gallo returned to his alma mater in 1979 to direct the program. In his four years at Hofstra, the team posted a

48-16 record and captured three ECC championships. As head coach, Gallo sent 11 wrestlers to the NCAA Championships. Among these 11, Ed Pidgeon, a 1981 All-American, finished fourth nationally while Peter Capone, a two-time All-American, finished seventh and second at the NAAs.

Joe Bavaro took over the reigns as head coach from 1983 through 1987, posting a 23-36 record, and leading the Dutchmen to another ECC Championship in 1983.

Under Bavaro's leadership, Capone, a 167-pounder, was named the ECC Tournament's Outstanding Wrestler. Mike Arena, a 150-pounder and three-time conference champion, was also named the ECC Tournament's Outstanding Wrestler under Bavaro.

In 1987 former Hofstra wrestler and three-time conference champion Tony Arena replaced Joe Bavaro as head of the Hofstra Wrestling program. In his two years at Hofstra, Arena led the team to a 15-17-1 record.

Javier Armengau returned to his alma mater in 1989 to take over the Flying Dutchmen program. Armengau wrestled under Gallo and Bavaro and was a three-time captain. As coach at Hofstra, Armengau guided wrestlers such as Ralph Tubello to outstanding careers. The 1992-93 season saw Tubello break 100 career wins and freshman Jason Wartinger become Hofstra's second first team freshman All-American. (The first was Mike Hogan in 1977.)

Tom Ryan, a Long Island native and a two-time All-American at Iowa, took over the reigns of the program in 1995. Ryan has brought in fine recruiting classes since his arrival and in 1997 was able to coach three wrestlers, Joe Catalanotto, Ryan Edmundson and Mike Quaglio, to NCAA Tournament berths. Catalanotto won an automatic berth by winning the 126-pound title at the ECWA Championships, while Quaglio and Edmundson were at-large selections. In 1998 the Dutchmen were again well represented at the NCAA Championships. Sophomore Eric Schmiesing and senior Russell Jones both received at-large bids, while junior James Hieronymous and senior Mike Quaglio received automatic bids as ECWA Champions. Hofstra finished the year ranked

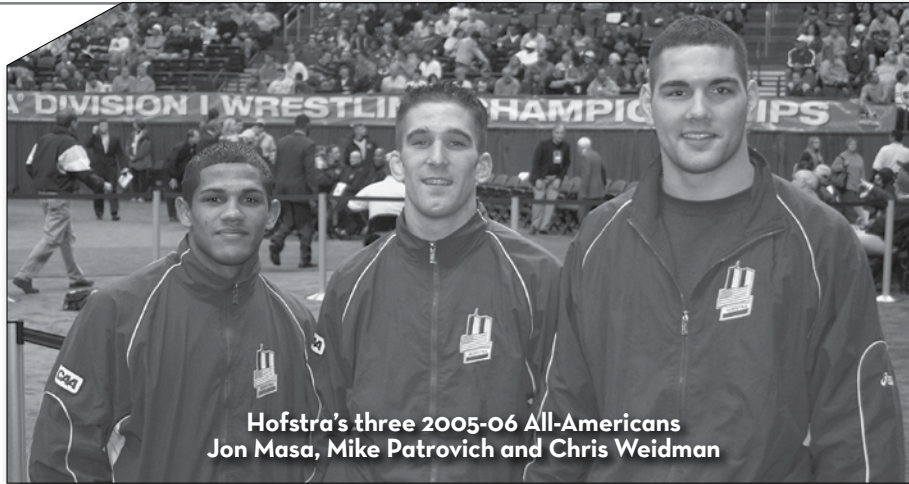
24th in the NCAA dual meet rankings.

In 1999 Hofstra Wrestling reached new heights. Hofstra placed second at the ECWA Championships and crowned five individual champions who would represent the conference at the NCAA Championships.

Roman Fleszar, Jason DeBruin, Eric Schmiesing and Zach Miller won four out of the first five weight classes, and a victory by Russell Jones gave the Flying Dutchmen their five champions. Roman Fleszar and Eric Schmiesing advanced to the quarterfinals at the NCAA Championships, lifting the Flying Dutchmen to a 26th-place finish out of the 79 competing institutions. Jason DeBruin was also named New York State Freshman of the Year after compiling a 43-8 record.

Hofstra met and surpassed its 1999 accomplishments in 2000. The Pride crowned four ECWA Champions, Fleszar, Schmiesing, DeBruin and Rob Anspach, and sent six wrestlers to the NCAA Tournament. Fleszar and Schmiesing each placed at their respective weight classes, becoming Hofstra's first All-American wrestlers since 1985. As a team, Hofstra placed 21 out of 73 teams. The Pride also won the New York State Championship for the second time in three years.

2001 saw Hofstra win its ninth ECWA Championship and first since 1983, and sent a then school-record seven wrestlers (Tom Noto, Roman Fleszar, Eric Schmiesing, Dennis Papadatos, Jason DeBruin, Noel Thompson and Rob Anspach) to the NCAA Tournament. Fleszar and Schmiesing repeated as All-Americans and the team placed 22nd overall at the NCAA. On the year, Hofstra finished ranked 15th in the nation. Tom Ryan was named ECWA Coach of the Year for the second straight year. The 2000-01 season also marked the final season of the ECWA, as the league merged with the Colonial Athletic Association beginning with the 2001-02 season. The Pride won the Colonial Athletic Association title in 2002 and sent seven wrestlers (Tom Noto,

Jon Masa, Jason DeBruin, Paul Siemon, John Garriques, Ralph Everett and Chris Skretkovicz) to the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. Noto, Masa and DeBruin each won individual championships at the CAA Tournament with DeBruin, the tournament's most outstanding wrestler, becoming Hofstra's first four-time conference champion. Skretkovicz was named the CAA Rookie of the Year, while Tom Ryan was the CAA Co-Coach of the Year.

The 2002-03 season once again saw Hofstra surpass the achievements of the last season as the team won the Colonial Athletic Association Championship for the second straight year, sent a school-record eight wrestlers (Pat Flynn, Ricky LaForge, Jon Masa, Mike Patrovich, Noel Thompson, Ralph Everett, Brad Christie and Chris Skretkovicz) to the NCAA Championships, and saw Masa and Skretkovicz come home All-Americans. In addition, LaForge was the CAA Championships co-Most Outstanding Wrestler and Tom Ryan won his fourth consecutive conference coach of the year award.

In 2003-04 the Pride continued their winning ways with a 15-5 record in duals, extended their conference match winning streak to 34 by posting an 8-0 conference dual record, captured their third consecutive CAA Championship and in the process had four champions and tied the school mark by sending eight wrestlers (Tom Noto, John Manarte, James Strouse, Paul Siemon, Ralph Everett, Noel Thompson, Brad Christie, and Chris Skretkovicz) to the NCAA Championships in St. Louis. Skretkovicz, who was the CAA Wrestler of the Year, placed fifth to capture his second All-American award as Hofstra finished 20th in the final NCAA Championship standings.

Coach Tom Ryan added his fifth straight conference Coach of the Year award to his trophy case.

2004-05 saw the Pride repeat as CAA champions, break the school-record with nine NCAA qualifiers (Dave Tomasette, Charles Griffin, Ricky LaForge, Jon Masa, James Strouse, Mike Patrovich, Paul Siemon, Joe

Rovelli, Chris Skretkovicz), place 17th at the NCAA's as a team and compile a 13-5 dual meet record. Masa, who was named the CAA Wrestler of the Year, placed third at the NCAA Championship to earn All-America honors for the second time in his career. Hofstra swept the CAA awards as in addition to Masa, Griffin was named the CAA Rookie of the Year and Coach Ryan took home his sixth straight (four CAA and two ECWA) conference Coach of the Year Award.

Last year the Pride took a giant leap toward the top 10 and actually finished in 11th place at the NCAA Championships, just one point out of a tie for ninth place. Hofstra, which prepared for the Championships with a challenging schedule all season long as its 11-9 dual meet record indicates, extended its conference match undefeated streak to 47, and captured its fifth consecutive CAA title winning seven individual titles and qualifying eight wrestlers for nationals. In addition, the Pride, for the first time in school history, had three All-Americans in Jon Masa, Mike Patrovich and Chris Weidman, and recorded the highest team finish (11th) and most points (52.3) at nationals. Patrovich, who finished fourth at the NCAA Championships, would earn CAA Wrestler of the Year honors, Masa was named the CAA Championship Most Outstanding Wrestler, and Tom Ryan was named the CAA Coach of the Year.

THE RAY DOWNEY, SR. MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AND WRESTLING FUND



The Hofstra University wrestling program is proud to honor the memory of an American hero FDNY Deputy Chief Ray Downey with the Ray Downey Memorial Scholarship. Chief Downey, who served as Chief of Special Operations Command, lost his life heroically during the terrorist attacks at the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001.

Ray Downey was appointed to the FDNY on April 7, 1962. In August 2001, he was placed in charge of all SOC (Special Operations Command) operations - Rescue, Squad, Haz Mat and Marine - and promoted to Deputy Chief. Chief Downey's phenomenal 39-year career with the FDNY was built upon success after success and rescue after rescue. One of the most - if not *the* most decorated men in the Department, Chief Downey received five individual medals for valor and 16 unit citations.

A devoted family man who lived in Deer Park, New York, with his wife, Rosalie; father of five married children, Joseph, Marie, Chuck, Ray Jr. and Kathy; and adored grandfather of nine, Chief Downey was an avid fan of the sport of wrestling and supporter of the Hofstra wrestling program, where his sons Joe and Ray Jr. were outstanding athletes. Chief Downey loved wrestling, and he always attended their matches. He continued to support the Hofstra wrestling program long after his sons graduated.

After his passing, the Downey family, longtime supporters of Hofstra University and the Pride wrestling program, created a scholarship fund to honor Chief Downey's memory. Funds contributed are used to endow scholarships in Chief Downey's name and will provide financial assistance to the Hofstra University wrestling program. Chief Downey's sons, Joseph, Chuck and Ray Jr., were successful athletes at Deer Park High School, and earned bachelor's degrees from respected universities through athletic scholarship opportunities. Recipients of these funds will demonstrate the integrity, work ethic, discipline and courage that Deputy Chief Raymond Downey exemplified throughout his life. The 2006 recipients of the Ray Downey Scholarship Award are seniors Mike Patrovich, from Islip, New York, and James Strouse, from Levittown, New York.

The Ray Downey Sr. Memorial Scholarship Fund Night, which is scheduled for Wednesday, November 15 against Army, is a unique opportunity to honor Chief Downey's memory as well as to support student-athletes. About Your Host: Jim Sheehan is in his 27th year in the sports public relations profession and in his 19th year in charge of Hofstra University's athletic publicity. In November 1999, he was promoted to associate director of athletics at the University. Sheehan came to Hofstra in 1988 after serving as assistant commissioner of the I-AA Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference in St. Louis, Missouri, from 1985 through 1988. Prior to his Gateway stint, he served as coordinator of media relations for the Houston Gamblers of the United States Football League in 1984-85. Sheehan has also served as director of sports information at the University of Tampa from 1982 through 1984; assistant to the commissioner/information director of the Sunshine State Conference from 1980 through 1984 and director of sports information at his alma mater, Biscayne College in 1981-82. Jim and his wife Maureen have a daughter, Jillian (14). The Sheehan family resides in Middle Village, New York.

Press Row: The David S. Mack Sports and Exhibition Complex press row, located on the south side of the Complex, is intended for working media. All press row guests must have a pass, issued by the Hofstra Office of Athletic Communications. Spouses, dates and non-workers are not permitted on press row.

Credentials: All members of the press should contact the **Office of Athletic Communications** at least 48 hours before each match for press row space and credentials. Press passes will be left at the Will Call window at the Mack Sports Complex ticket office.

Photographers: Photographers who intend to shoot from matside should request a mat photo pass. Only accredited press and staff photographers will be allowed at matside.

Press Parking: Media parking passes should be requested at the same time press row/photo passes are requested. The Reserved-Media parking lot is located on the north side of the Mack Sports Complex in front of the main entrance. Parking is limited and on a first-come, first-serve basis in the Reserved-Media lot. Once that lot is filled, media will be directed to the general public parking areas around the Mack Sports Complex.

Game Services: Match information and releases can be found in the media room which is located in the southeast corner of the Mack Sports Complex.

Telephones: Hofstra University provides numerous telephones for use by the media on press row. Please indicate your telephone need when you request your credentials.

Radio: The Hofstra Office of Athletic Communications will provide a touch-tone digital phone line for the opponent's commercial and student radio stations. Visiting teams will need to give the Athletic Communications Office two weeks notice of their intention to broadcast. An ISDN line is also available for a rental charge of \$200.00. All calls must be made collect or direct dial from the radio station to the Mack Sports Complex.

Post-Match Interviews: Hofstra wrestlers will be available for post-match interviews, upon request, after a 10-minute cooling off period. Contact Jim Sheehan with your request.

Wrestler Interviews: All requests for student-athlete interviews during the week should be made at least one day in advance with the Office of Athletic Communications. If you are requesting a phone interview, we will have the student-athlete return your call at a mutually convenient time. **Player home phone numbers will not be distributed.** In-person interviews may be conducted in a number of locations around the Pride's training facility in the Hofstra Physical Fitness Center. However, interviews may not be conducted in the wrestling room, in the locker room, or the training room.
