THIS IS HOFSTRA UNIVERSITY

In its relatively short history, Hofstra has established itself as a world-class institution of higher education and cultural enterprise. Each academic year, the Hofstra campus and the programs offered grow and change to meet the demands of our students and our community.

Hofstra opened in 1935 as a commuter school with all classes and offices housed in one building. Since those early days, Hofstra has evolved into an international institution with a student body hailing from 49 states and 66 countries around the world. The beautiful campus is an accredited arboretum with

Human Services, School of Law, School for University Studies, University College for Continuing Education, Honors College and Saturday College. Bachelor's degrees are offered in 130 areas of study. There are also more than 140 graduate programs, including Ph.D., Ed.D., Psy.D., and J.D. degrees, advanced certificates and professional diplomas.

Recently, the University celebrated the opening of Hagedorn Hall, the new home of our School of Education and



Hall, a sophisticated television production/post-production facility with two broadcast-quality studios and control rooms; two advanced online video edit suites; two Avid non-linear digital editing systems and several cuts-only video work stations. Two satellite dishes are available with one dish providing special news feeds for the broadcast journalism room, which also has access to *Associated Press*, *Lexis-Nexis* and *Dow Jones* services. In addition, the facility is capable of broadcasting student-produced programming to the entire campus on our own cable channels. Also located here is the University's radio station (WRHU/88.7-FM), audio production studios, a film/video screening room, film editing rooms, a computer laboratory, a speech performance studio and a large dance studio.

113 buildings on 240 acres. There are approximately 4,200 students living on campus, and Hofstra offers them and all students an extensive array of academic and social activities. Additionally, Hofstra's close proximity to Manhattan means that students have easy access to the wondrous cultural, social and career offerings of the city.

What has remained consistent throughout the years, however, is the sense of community on campus, the eagerness of our students to learn and the commitment of the Hofstra faculty and administration to provide a challenging education that encourages the pursuit of lifelong learning.

The Colleges and Schools of the University are: Hofstra College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Frank G. Zarb School of Business, New College, School of Communication, School of Education and Allied

Allied Human Services. In 2001 Hofstra University Honors College welcomed its first class. This new division of the University proved to be an immediate success, not only with University faculty and administrators, but among the 93 inaugural students. Every fall since, the number of entering freshmen has increased substantially. Hofstra's School of Communication is one of the largest, most advanced non-commercial television facilities in the East. Students take classes and work in Dempster





Hofstra's C.V. Starr Hall offers academic facilities that are among the most technologically advanced in the nation. Every seat in every classroom allows students direct access to the Internet and Hofstra network, including the resources of Hofstra's Axinn Library.

Hofstra's growing computer facilities offer extensive high-tech training opportunities. There are computer terminals throughout the campus for student and faculty use, with more than 750 PC, Macintosh and UNIX workstations available in labs and classrooms. The University was ranked 14th in *Forbes'* list of Most Connected Campuses in 2004, up from 18 in 2003.

The fully computerized Hofstra Libraries contain 1.2 million volumes for student use. Only about 5 percent of American colleges have collections as extensive, and 85 percent have fewer than half that number.

Hofstra hosts more than 500 cultural events annually, bringing thousands of scholars, dignitaries and other



participants to campus. More than 200 musical and dramatic performances take place on campus each year.

The Hofstra Museum, which houses one of the largest art collections in the metropolitan area, coordinates approximately 12 exhibitions annually and offers exhibition areas and an extensive outdoor sculpture collection, with more than 65 pieces. The Hofstra Museum is accredited by the American Association of Museums – one of only 94 universities in the nation and one of six in New York to hold that distinction.

Hofstra also has seven theaters, a student newspaper, a lively student center, a recreation center and numerous athletic facilities, including the 15,000-seat James M. Shuart Stadium and the 5,124-seat Hofstra University Arena. Hofstra

also has an indoor, Olympic-sized (eight lane, 50-meter) swimming pool, one of the largest such facilities in the New York metropolitan area.

The Hofstra athletic program competes on the NCAA Division I level and is a member of the Colonial Athletic Association and the Atlantic 10 Football Conference. The University sponsors 18 intercollegiate programs – nine men's sports and nine women's sports. Hofstra has men's teams in basketball, football, baseball,

lacrosse, golf, tennis, wrestling, soccer and cross country. Women's sports include basketball, volleyball, softball, tennis, soccer, field hockey, lacrosse, cross country and golf. The 18 men's and women's intercollegiate athletic teams compete in more than 150 home contests annually.

Hofstra's academic programs are accredited by numerous national agencies and the University is one of only 270 schools, out of more than 3,600 colleges and universities nationwide, with a chapter of the national honor society Phi Beta Kappa. Of Hofstra's 1,256 faculty members, 518 are full time and 90 percent hold the highest degree in their fields. The student-faculty ratio is 14-to-1.

Hofstra University is 100-percent program accessible to persons with disabilities, and has been cited as a national model for this achievement.

TOM RYAN HEAD WRESTLING COACH



Tom Ryan is in his 11th season at the helm of the Hofstra Wrestling program in 2005-06. A six-time conference Coach of the Year, Ryan is the ninth head wrestling coach in the 56-year history of Hofstra Wrestling. In his 10 seasons, Ryan has guided his team to a 98-74-1 dual meet record and has won five straight conference championships including four in the

Colonial Athletic Association. In addition, the Pride will enter the 2005-06 season riding a 41-conference dual match undefeated streak dating back to 1999.

Ryan, who has sent 57 Hofstra wrestlers to the NCAA Championships, has coached four All-Americans (Roman Fleszar, Eric Schmiesing, Jon Masa and Chris Skretkowitz) and two honorable mention All-Americans (Ralph Everett and Noel Thompson). He has also seen his charges win 20 Colonial Athletic Association individual championships, claim three CAA Tournament Most Outstanding Wrestler Awards, two CAA Wrestler of the Year Awards and one CAA Rookie of the Year Award. Before joining the Colonial Athletic Association in 2001, Ryan coached 17 East Coast Wrestling Association champions and one ECWA Most Outstanding Wrestler.

In addition, Ryan has coached 13 New York State individual champions, won team championships in 1998 and 2000, and has seen three wrestlers earn National Wrestling Coaches Association All-Academic honors. He has also been a two-time New York State Coach of the Year (1998 and 2001).

In 2004-05 the Pride posted a 13-5 overall dual record and a 6-0 mark in the CAA, captured their fourth consecutive CAA Championship and their fifth straight conference title, finished third at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational in December, saw a school-record seven wrestlers capture conference championships, and sent a school-record nine wrestlers to the NCAA Championships.

The 2003-04 season saw the Pride continue their winning ways in conference action with an 8-0 record and their fourth consecutive conference title, including the third in the Colonial Athletic Association. Hofstra was 15-5 overall and finished the season ranked 12th by InterMat. The Pride also equaled the then-school record for sending the most wrestlers to the NCAA Championships with eight. 2003-04 may seem like a blur to Ryan, his wife Lynette, and the Ryan family who suffered the worse tragedy any family could face. On February 16, 2004 at the Ryan home on Long Island, five-year old Teague Ryan, Tom and Lynette's third of four children, suddenly collapsed and passed away. Unbeknownst to the Ryan family, Teague, who was an integral member of the Hofstra wrestling team with his humor, spirit and friendship, suffered

from a heart disorder. Even though the tremendous pain of their loss is still fresh, the Ryan family, Tom, Lynette and children Jordan (12), Jake (9) and Mackenzie (4) have already taken steps to become American Heart Association (AHA) advocates to better educate and inform the public about Long Q-T Syndrome and other children's heart defects.

In 2002-03, the Pride went 13-7 overall, were a perfect 7-0 in the Colonial Athletic Association and finished the season ranked 18th by InterMat. The team handily won the CAA Team Championship, crowning six individual champions. The Pride sent a school-record eight wrestlers, the most of any conference school for the fifth straight year, to the NCAA Championships and Masa and Skretkowitz placed seventh and sixth, respectively, to earn All-America accolades. Everett and Thompson did not place, but were named honorable mention All-Americans. As a team Hofstra came in 21st, which is Hofstra best-ever finish at the NCAA Championships. For his efforts Ryan received CAA Coach of the Year honors, marking the fourth straight year that Ryan has won or shared coach of the year accolades.

2001-02 saw Ryan coach his squad to a 12-6 dual record, including a perfect 6-0 in the Colonial Athletic Association, and a #21 national ranking. The Pride won the CAA Tournament, its second conference championship in as many years, with three champions and two runners-up, and sent seven wrestlers to the NCAA Division I Championship where the team placed 38th. The seven wrestlers were the most of any school in the conference for the fourth straight season. Ryan was named the CAA Co-Coach of the Year for his efforts. The recognition marked the third straight season that Ryan received at least a share of the conference coach of the year award. Ryan also coached the Pride to a second place finish at the New York State Championships and the prestigious Virginia Duals.

The Pride was equally successful in 2000-01, compiling an 8-7 dual meet record and a #15 national ranking. More importantly, the team won its first ECWA Championship since 1983 and sent a then school-record seven wrestlers to the NCAA Tournament.





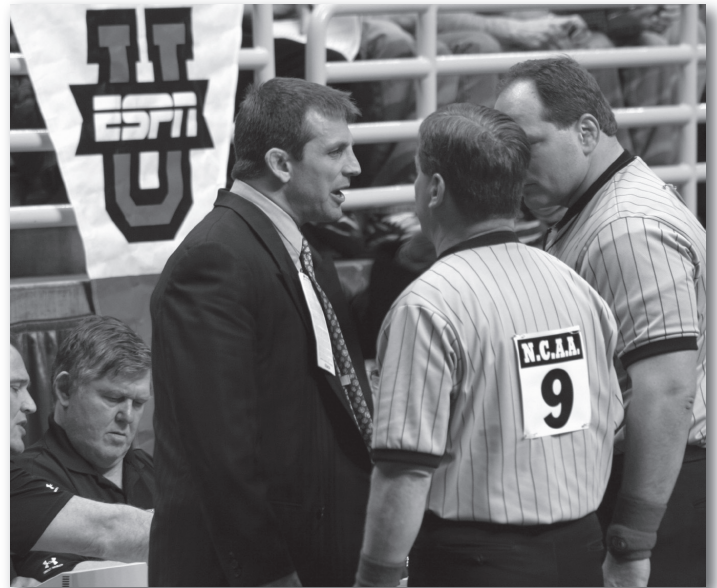
The seven wrestlers were the most of any school in the conference for the third straight season. Eric Schmiesing and Roman Fleszar repeated as All-Americans and helped the team to a 22nd-place finish. Ryan was rewarded for his coaching ability with his second straight ECWA Coach of the Year award.

Ryan coached his team to an 8-8-1 record and a #25 regular season national ranking in 1999-00, placing second at the ECWA Championships and first at the New York State Championships. The Pride continued to impress at the ECWA Championships, winning four individual championships and two runners-up. The four champions were the most of any school for the second straight season. Each champion and both runners-up advanced to the NCAA Championships, with Roman Fleszar and Eric Schmiesing earning All-American status. The team also won the New York State Championship for the second time in three years. For his efforts Ryan was named ECWA Coach of the Year.

Ryan led the team to an 11-5 record in 1998-99, placing second at the ECWA Championships. The 11-5 mark gave the Dutchmen back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1982-83. Hofstra also had another impressive showing at the ECWA Championships, winning five individual championships. The five champions, each of whom advanced to the NCAA Championships, were the most of any ECWA team. Two of those wrestlers, Eric Schmiesing and Roman Fleszar, advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals at their respective weight classes. The Dutchmen followed up their 1998 New York State Championship by placing second in 1999. Roman Fleszar (133), Jason DeBruin (141) and Russell Jones (184) each won individual championships and Russell Jones became the first Hofstra wrestler to be named the New York State Tournament Most Outstanding Wrestler.

The 1997-98 season was the year that Ryan put Hofstra Wrestling back on the national scene, leading the team to an 11-6 dual meet record, including a 7-1 mark in ECWA action and a #24 national ranking. The 11 wins represented the most since the 1982-83 squad had 13. It was also the first winning season since an 8-6 record in 1993-94. Ryan coached his charges to a second-place finish at the ECWA Championships and sent four to the NCAA Championships. For his efforts Ryan was named the ECWA Co-Coach of the Year. In addition to the team's success in the ECWA, Hofstra placed first at the New York State Tournament for the first time, winning two individual championships. Ryan earned 1998 New York State Coach of the Year accolades following the season.

Ryan, a native of Wantagh, New York, was a two-time NCAA Division I All-American and a member of the University of Iowa's national championship teams, under coach Dan Gable, in 1991 and 1992. A two-time Big Ten Conference champion at Iowa, Ryan wrestled for two years at Iowa after transferring from Syracuse University. At Syracuse Ryan captured an Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association (EIWA) championship in 1989.



Following graduation from Iowa in 1992, Ryan served as an assistant coach at the University of Indiana for two seasons. His responsibilities included daily training for all middleweight wrestlers, weight training and recruiting. In 1994-95, he worked at the University of Iowa with coach Dan Gable as he prepared to compete for a position on the 1995 United States World Team.

Ryan, who has been very active on the wrestling camp circuit over the years, is beginning his 11th year as director of the Elite Wrestling Club on Long Island and his ninth year as head counselor at the Elite Wrestling Camp. Legendary coach Dan Gable and world champions Tom and Terry Brands have visited the Hofstra campus as guest speakers at clinics held by Ryan. He is also actively involved with the Ray Downey Memorial Scholarship Fund.

Ryan was a three-time All-Nassau County and All-New York State selection at Wantagh High School, where he was coached by Bernie Columbo and assistant Joe Peterson.

ASSISTANT COACH

Rob Anspach, a two-time NCAA Wrestling Championships participant, is his fifth season as a Pride assistant wrestling coach in 2005-06.

Anspach compiled a record of 69-51 and made two trips to the NCAA Tournament during his five-year career at Hofstra. In 2000-01 Anspach posted an 11-11 record and finished second at the ECWA Championship, earning a wild card selection to the 2001 NCAA Championships. That season he also won his weight class at the Bearcat Open, compiling a perfect 4-0 record.

In the 1999-00 season, Anspach had a 20-15 record on his way to an ECWA individual championship and an NCAA berth. Anspach also placed first at the Congressional Cup and was the runner-up at the New York State Championships in 1999-00

Anspach, a resident of Hicksville, New York, is a 2001 graduate of Hofstra University with a degree in American studies.

ASSISTANT COACH



DONNY PRITZLAFF

Donny Pritzlaff, a two-time NCAA Champion, is in his third season as an assistant wrestling coach at Hofstra University. A four-time All-American, Pritzlaff moved to the sidelines to assist Tom Ryan in all aspects of the

Hofstra Wrestling program in 2003 while also training for a berth on the United States Olympic Team.

Pritzlaff was an NCAA Champion at 165 pounds in 2000 and 2001, and was a three-time Big Ten Champion during his four-year career at the University of Wisconsin.

"Donny brings great wrestling experience and class to the program," said Ryan. "Being from the New Jersey area, he gives us recruiting credibility in the northeast, which we feel is the premiere wrestling region in the country. We couldn't be more happy to have Donny on our staff."

Pritzlaff was a junior world champion in 1998 and was a member of the United States National Team in 2002-03. Following his graduation in May 2002, Pritzlaff served as a volunteer assistant for the Badgers during the 2002-03 season.

During the summer of 2005, Pritzlaff placed third at the United States World Team Trials in Ames, Iowa

Pritzlaff, who has a degree in sociology, resides in Northport, New York. He is married to the former Robin Schraufnagel of Abbotsford, Wisconsin.

Ryan Martin is in his second year as Hofstra's strength and conditioning director. Martin, who came to Hofstra in September 2004, brought more than six years of coaching experience to Hofstra, including three years at Davidson College in Davidson, North Carolina.

At Davidson, Martin was responsible for the development and implementation of nutritional, flexibility, speed, strength and conditioning protocols for 22 varsity sports. He also performed periodic body composition and nutritional assessments of Davidson athletes, as well as developing rehabilitation programs for injured student-athletes in conjunction with Davidson's sports medicine team.

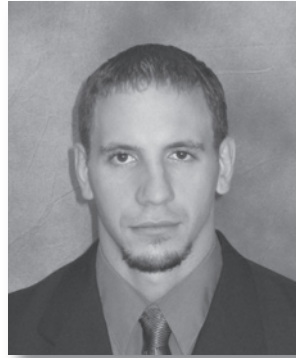
Martin, who was one of six finalists for the 2004 NSCA College Strength and Conditioning Professional Award, also designed Davidson's new 5,000 square foot weight training facility and was involved with the selection of equipment to outfit the facility.

Prior to working at Davidson, Martin did strength and conditioning internships with the Indianapolis Colts of the National Football League from March 2001 to September 2001 and at the University of Notre Dame from January 2001 to March 2001.

Martin also served as a graduate assistant strength and conditioning coach at Indiana State University in Terre Haute, Indiana, from August 1999 to January 2001 while he pursued his master's in exercise science and biomechanics. Martin also served as a strength and conditioning internship at Northwestern University from January 1999 to August 1999.

Martin is a NSCA certified strength and conditioning specialist, a USA Weightlifting Level I Club Coach and an ISSA certified specialist in performance nutrition.

Martin is a 1998 graduate of Anderson University in Anderson, Indiana, with a degree in physical education. He played offensive line on the football team. He was a USA III All-American and All-North Region selection as a senior in 1997, a two-time all-conference selection and a starter in the USA III Mardi Gras Holiday All-Star Classic.

Joe Makovec is in his first year as an assistant strength and conditioning coach at Hofstra University. Makovec will assist Ryan Martin in implementing the strength and conditioning program. Makovec brings experience as a coach at the NFL and high school level.

Makovec joins the Pride staff after serving as the strength and conditioning coach of the Hamburg Sea Devils of NFL Europe during the 2005 season. Prior to that he served as an intern coach with the Indianapolis Colts in 2003 and 2004.

He was the strength and conditioning coach at Riverdale High School in Muscoda, Wisconsin, working with the team primarily during the summer months of 2004 to get the players into shape for the upcoming season. He also assisted in the coaching of linebackers and running backs for Riverdale.

Makovec played linebacker for four seasons at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point between 1997-2002 and helped his school win the Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in 1998, 1999 and 2001. During his time at the school, Makovec also worked as a personal trainer in Stevens Point, Wisconsin.

Makovec holds a degree in health promotion and wellness from Wisconsin-Stevens Point.

2005-06 HOFSTRA WRESTLING OUTLOOK

Coming off their fifth consecutive conference championship and a school-best 17th place finish at the 2005 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships, Hofstra Pride Wrestling Coach Tom Ryan will be looking to move into the elite air this season with, quite possibly, the deepest roster in school history. Hofstra, which sent nine wrestlers to the NCAA Championships last year after capturing its fourth straight Colonial Athletic Association crown, return 12 letterwinners including seven starters, seven NCAA qualifiers and five conference champions.

Leading the Pride is two-time All-American Jon Masa. The senior from Long Beach, New York, captured his third CAA championship and placed third at the NCAA Championships at 149 pounds. Senior Mike Patrovich also returns after winning the CAA title at 165 pounds and just missing All-America honors at the NCAA Championships. Senior Ricky LaForge was a CAA finalist at 141 pounds and made his second NCAA Championship appearance last year.

The underclassmen are talented and experienced. Junior James Strouse won his first CAA title at 157 and made his second nationals appearance last season. Sophomores Charles Griffin, Joe Rovelli and Dave Tomasette are also coming off outstanding seasons. Griffin, the CAA Rookie of the Year, captured the conference title at 133 pounds and finished the year at 27-6. Rovelli, who challenged Griffin for top CAA newcomer honors, captured the conference title at 184 pounds and finished the year at 23-9. Tomasette was a conference finalist at 125 pounds and posted a 19-14 mark while making his first national championship appearance.

But a tough slate of matches will greet the Pride when they take the mat in November. The 2005-06 schedule may be the most challenging in school history with matches scheduled against the top four programs from last year's NCAA Championships. Five Top 40 teams from the 2005 nationals will visit Hofstra Arena including national runners-up Michigan, #18 West Virginia and #30 Pennsylvania. The Pride will battle defending national champions Oklahoma State, #3 Oklahoma, #4 Cornell and #8 Lehigh on the road plus several other Top 40 teams and wrestlers at the Las Vegas Invitational and the NWCA National Duals in Cedar Falls, Iowa.

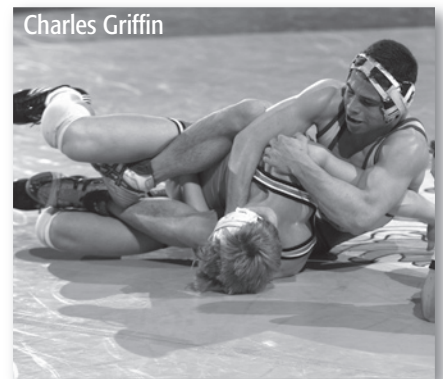
Sophomore **Dave Tomasette (Sewell, NJ)** returns to the starting role at 125 pounds after making his first NCAA Championship appearance in 2005. Tomasette, who finished second at the University of Nebraska at Omaha Open last November and the Colonial Athletic Association championships in Boston last March, posted a 19-14 overall record and was 5-1 in CAA regular season dual matches. He is ranked 16th by the *Amateur Wrestling News*, 17th by *The Wrestling Mall* and 18th by *W.I.N. Magazine* in their respective preseason polls. Freshman **Jon Fennell (Chester, NJ)** will back-up Tomasette this season. Fennell was an all-area and all-conference selection at West Morris Mendham High School.

133

The wrestlers in the 133-pound and the 141-pound weight classes give the Pride coaching staff many options for the 2005-06 season. Last year's starter at 133, Charles Griffin, could have the most options including the most likely of moving up to 141 pounds this season. Senior **Ricky LaForge (Pompton Lakes, NJ)**, who was granted a hardship year by the NCAA to wrestle this season, is the probable starter at 133, dropping down from 141 last year. He posted a 26-8 mark in 2004-05 and placed second at both the Cliff Keen/Las Vegas Invitational and the CAA Championships. LaForge also posted two victories by fall in the NCAA Championships and enters the 2005-06 season ranked 10th at 133 by *The Wrestling Mall*. Freshman **Robbie Deibert (Hegins, PA)**, a Pennsylvania state championship qualifier and a third-place finisher at the Middle Atlantic Nationals in 2004, posted a 100-46 in high school and will be waiting for his shot at this weight.

141

With the talent in this weight class, the starter may not shake out until January. Sophomore **Charles Griffin (Reading, PA)** looks to be the front-runner for the starting role at 141. If not, the 2005 CAA champion at 133 who posted a 27-6 mark and a perfect 6-0 record in conference dual matches could be red-shirted. Griffin, the CAA Rookie of the Year who posted championships at the Omaha Open and the CAA Championship, tallied 68 dual match team points last season – one point off the team lead. Junior **John Manarte (Farmingville, NY)**, a NCAA qualifier as the CAA runner-up in 2004, posted an 8-7 record last year after recording 24 wins in 2003.

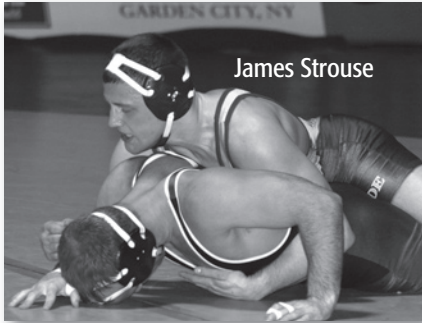
Two-time All-American senior **Jon Masa (Long Beach, NY)** leads a deep group at 149 pounds. Masa, who enters his final year ranked second in all the preseason polls, will compete with the Pride in January after the NCAA gave him a one semester Olympic waiver. Masa,

who captured his third conference championship last year to go along with second place finishes in the Omaha Open and the Las Vegas Invitational, tallied a 26-10 record including a 6-1 mark in the NCAA Championships to place third at 149 pounds. Masa will be backed up by a trio of freshmen. **Mitch Smith (Sandyville, WV)**, a three-time state champion and a six-time Junior National All-American, posted a 195-3 record in high school. **Chris**

Booth (Bayville, NY), a five-time state champion who posted a 136-18 record at Long Island Lutheran High School, earned Prep All-American honors as a senior. **Mike Martini (Cranston, RI)**, who was a three-time state finalist and won a Rhode Island championship at 145 pounds as a senior at Cranston West High School, rounds out the 149-pound group.

Junior **James Strouse (Levittown, NY)** returns to his starting role at 157 pounds in 2005-06. Strouse, a two-time NCAA qualifier, captured his first CAA title while posting a 22-13 mark last year. Strouse enters the 2005-06 season ranked 15th by both *Amateur Wrestling News* and *W.I.N. Magazine* and 17th by *USA Today/NWCA/Intermat* at 157

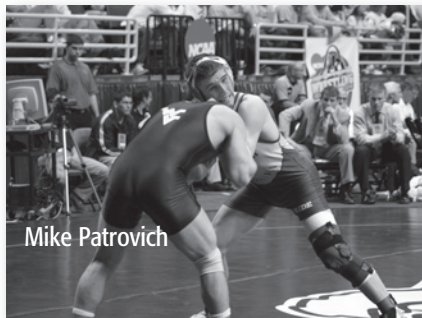
pounds. He will be backed up by freshman **Anthony Tortora (Chappaqua, NY)** and senior transfer **Mike Parziale (Woburn, MA)**. Tortora was a three-time all-section selection and an All-New York State pick at Horace Greeley High School. Parziale comes to Hofstra from Franklin and Marshall where he recorded an 83-26 record, including a 34-8 mark as a junior while placing fifth at the EIWA Championships.

There should be a good battle for the starting spot at 165 pounds as last year's starter Mike Patrovich is expected to move up to 174 pounds. Junior **Chris Vondruska (Bay Village, OH)**, who posted a 9-7 mark in a reserve role last year, should be the early season starter for the Pride. The strong and steady Vondruska is expected to face a December challenge from freshman **Alton Lucas (West Babylon, NY)**. Lucas, a member of the Hofstra Football team who will not join the wrestling team until after the gridiron season ends, was a high school All-American at West Babylon (NY) High School and the top-ranked senior wrestler in the country in his weight class last year.

174

With the graduation of Paul Siemon last spring, senior **Mike Patrovich (Bohemia, NY)** moves up a weight class to take over at 174 pounds. Patrovich is coming off his first CAA Championship title and his second NCAA Championship appearance in 2005. He posted a 16-5 overall record, including a 3-2 mark in the NCAA Championships, and just missed out on All-American honors last season. A tenacious competitor, Patrovich enters the 2005-

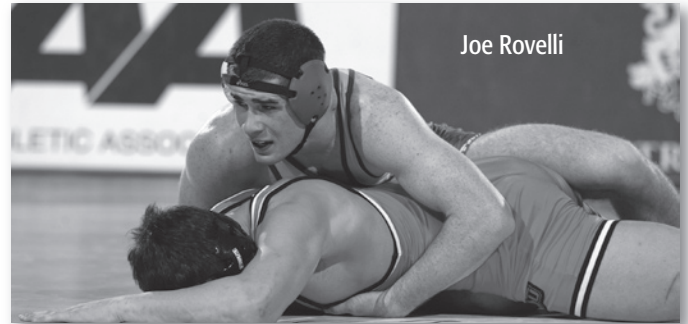

06 season as the sixth-ranked wrestler at 174 by *The Wrestling Mall* and the ninth-ranked wrestler by *USA Today/NWCA/Intermat*.

If teammate Charles Griffin had not received CAA Rookie of the Year honors last season, surely **Joe Rovelli (Wilkes-Barre, PA)** would have. He swept through his regular season CAA dual matches with a 5-0 record, led the team in major decision victories, captured the conference title at 184 pounds, made his first NCAA Championship appearance and finished the year with a 23-9 mark. His freshman accomplishments have not been forgotten as Rovelli enters the 2005-06 season as the top-ranked wrestler at 184 in the CAA preseason poll and is ranked 14th by both *The Wrestling Mall* and *USA Today/NWCA/Intermat* in their respective preseason polls. Freshman **Mike Pucillo (Strongsville, OH)**, an Ohio state champion, Senior Nationals champion and the nation's top-ranked wrestler at 189 pounds last year, backs up Rovelli. Pucillo posted a 49-1 record as a senior.

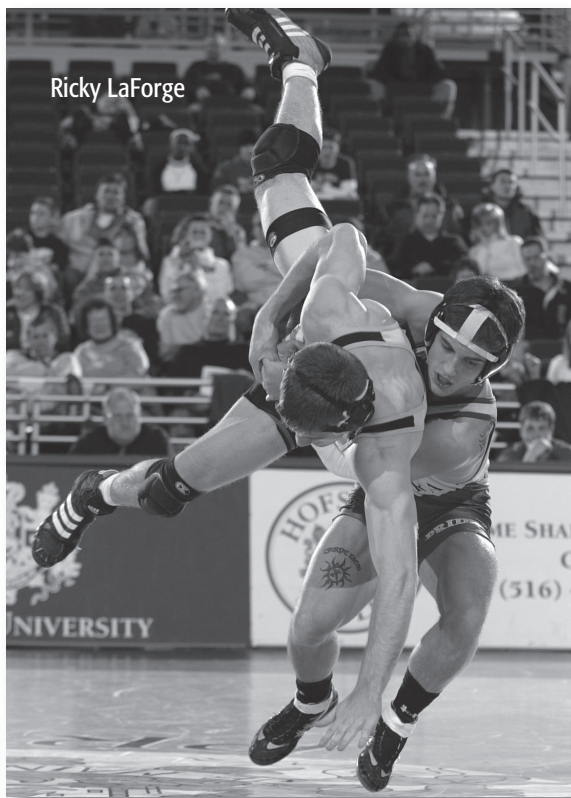

You can't make one forget the accomplishments of graduated, two-time All-American Chris Skretkovicz overnight, but junior **Chris Weidman (Baldwin, NY)** is going to do his best. The two-time junior college All-American at Nassau Community College, who red-shirted last year for the Pride, recorded an 8-2 mark and placed third at the Penn State Open last winter. As he flies under the radar for the first half of the 2005-06 season, Weidman will surprise many in the second half of the year.

Heavyweight

Without a true heavyweight on the team last season, the Pride was forced to give up a lot of team points. That is not expected to happen this year with the arrival of two-time junior college All-American **Jon Andriac (Montague, NJ)**. Placing third in 2004 and fourth in 2005 at the NJCAA Championships, Andriac helped lead the Lions of Nassau Community College to the national title in 2004 and a fourth-place finish last season. Freshman **Gus Del Vecchio (West Caldwell, NJ)** will push and challenge Andriac. A district and county champion as a senior, Del Vecchio helped lead Seton Hall Prep High School to district and county team championships, and a number 16 ranking in the state. In addition, 2003-04 starter, senior **Dan Garay (Rahway, NJ)** could return to the Pride team after his final season as a starter on the Hofstra Football team. Garay, who red-shirted last season, posted a 10-12 record in 2003-04.

HOFSTRA WRESTLING HISTORY: This is Hofstra's 58th season of intercollegiate wrestling. The pride has had nine coaches direct the wrestling program, beginning with Walter "Brick" Stone in 1947 and currently with Tom Ryan, who is in his 11th season. Ryan has rebuilt the Pride into a Top 20 caliber program. He is 98-74-1 at Hofstra, but has posted a 91-49-1 mark during the past seven seasons. He has received the conference Coach of the Year Award seven times, including six straight times dating back to 2000, and has won five consecutive conference championships.

HOFSTRA'S FIRST COACH INDUCTED INTO HALL OF FAME: Walter "Brick" Stone, the founding father of Hofstra Wrestling, received the Lifetime Service to Wrestling Award and was inducted into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in Stillwater, Oklahoma, last spring. The Lifetime Service to Wrestling Award is given in recognition of years of dedication to the development of leadership and citizenship in young people through the sport of wrestling. He is credited with helping grow the sport of wrestling on Long Island while serving as Hofstra coach from 1947 through 1958, and as an administrator until the late 1970's. Stone posted a 70-41-9 dual match record during his 11 years as coach at Hofstra.

HOFSTRA'S 2005-06 SCHEDULE: Hofstra's 2005-06 schedule may be one of the best in school history. The Pride will face the top four teams from last year's NCAA Championships, and will have five Top 40 teams visit Hofstra Arena including national runners-up Michigan, #18 West Virginia and #30 Pennsylvania. The Pride will also battle defending national champions Oklahoma State, #3 Oklahoma, #4 Cornell and #8

Lehigh on the road, and will face numerous other Top 40 teams at the 24th Annual Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational in early December, and at the NWCA Cliff Keen National Duals in Cedar Falls, Iowa, in mid-January.

A RECORD NUMBER OF HOFSTRA NCAA QUALIFIERS: Hofstra tied a school-record by sending nine wrestlers to the 2005 NCAA Championships in St. Louis last March. Two of the nine qualifiers graduated, but the Pride still has eight NCAA qualifiers on its 2005-06 roster – seven (Dave Tomasette, Charles Griffin, Ricky LaForge, Jon Masa, James Strouse, Mike Patrovich, and Joe Rovelli) from 2005 and one (John Manarte) from the 2004 Championships.

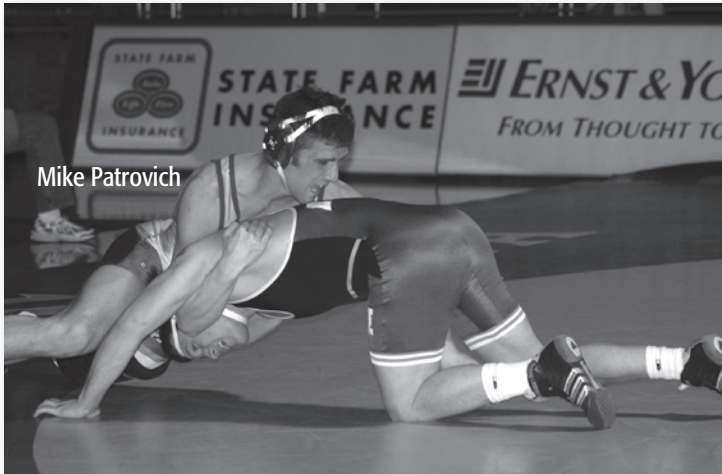
HOFSTRA'S DUAL MATCH UNDEFEATED STREAK NOW AT 41: Entering the 2005-06 season Hofstra is undefeated in 41 consecutive dual **conference** matches – posting a 40-0-1 record during that time. The last time Hofstra dropped a conference match was February 17, 1999 when the Broncs of Rider beat the Pride, 28-10, in an East Coast Wrestling Association (ECWA) match.

2005-06 PRESEASON CAA RANKINGS: The Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) announced its preseason rankings and its All-Freshmen wrestling team in October. Although some of the weight classes, as well as some of the personnel, could change when the season begins, Hofstra had six wrestlers listed on top of their weight class and another three named as the top freshmen in their respective weight classes. Sophomore Dave Tomasette (125), senior Ricky LaForge (133), senior Jon Masa (149), junior James Strouse (157), senior Mike Patrovich (165/174) and sophomore Joe Rovelli (184) are all preseason top-ranked wrestlers in the CAA. Juniors Chris Vondruska (174/165), John Manarte (141) and Jon Andriac (Hwt) are all ranked third in their respective weight classes, while junior Chris Weidman (197) is ranked fifth. Newcomers Mitch Smith (141), Alton Lucas (174/165) and Mike Pucillo (184) were named to the 2005-06 CAA All-Freshmen Team.

PRIDE RANKED 7TH IN HOME ATTENDANCE AVERAGE: The Hofstra Wrestling team continued its home attendance climb in 2004-05, moving up two places to seventh in the country in Division I. The Pride, who averaged a little over 1,300 fans per match and ranked ninth in 2003-04,

boosted the attendance number by more than 200 fans per match to 1,571 per contest last season. The Iowa Hawkeyes, who have helped 10 schools post their single match best attendance, continued to draw big crowds at home as well and led Division I with a 5,073 home attendance average.

STUART RABINOWITZ

President of Hofstra University

Stuart Rabinowitz was chosen by the Hofstra University Board of Trustees to serve as the eighth President of the University on December 20, 2000. Prior to his appointment, he served as Dean of Hofstra University School of Law from September 1989 through June 2001. He joined the faculty of the Law School in 1972. President Rabinowitz currently holds the Andrew M. Boas and Mark L. Cluster Distinguished Professorship in Civil Procedure.

President Rabinowitz holds positions with a number of important government and community organizations, including the Judicial Advisory Council of the State of New York Unified Court System - County of Nassau, the Nassau County Health and Welfare Council and the Holocaust Memorial & Educational Center of Nassau County. He serves on the Board of Directors for the Long Island Association, the Long Island Coalition for Fair Broadcasting, the Long Island Technology Network, Project GRAD of the Roosevelt Union Free School District as well as on the Board of Trustees of the Commission on Independent Colleges and Universities. President Rabinowitz is a former member of the Nassau County Blue Ribbon Financial Review Panel and former chair of the Nassau County Local Advisory Board. Additionally, President Rabinowitz served as a member of the Nassau County Commission on Government Revision, which was charged with drafting a new charter and a new form of government for the County. He is the recipient of the Martin Luther King Living the Dream Award, EOC; Distinguished Service in the Cause of Justice, Legal Aid Society; UJA Federation Leadership Award; and the Bar Association of Nassau County Proclamation for Outstanding Service to both the Legal Profession and the Community and the Community Service Award from the Conference of Jewish Organizations of Nassau County.

President Rabinowitz received a juris doctor, magna cum laude, from Columbia University School of Law, where he was a member of the board of editors of the *Columbia Law Review* and a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar. He graduated from City College of New York with honors, and is a member of Phi Beta Kappa and the American Law Institute.

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Jack Hayes begins his second year as director of athletics at Hofstra University in 2005-06. Hayes was appointed by Hofstra President Stuart Rabinowitz as the University's new director of athletics on October 4, 2004. Hayes came to Hofstra after serving as an associate director of athletics at the University of Connecticut for three years.

Hayes, the eighth director of athletics at Hofstra, oversees Hofstra's 18 Division I teams, an athletic administration of more than 70 professional staff, and 430 student-athletes.

Hayes' proven expertise in enhancing academic and athletic success of student-athletes, strategic planning, fundraising, marketing, university relations, facility enhancement, budgetary management, and NCAA compliance will complement Hofstra University's athletic department in its quest to further enhance its athletic program, and assist Hofstra's student-athletes both on and off the field.

In his first year as Hofstra's athletics director, the Pride captured three Colonial Athletic Association championships and advanced to postseason play in four sports – Men's Soccer, Wrestling and Softball took part in the NCAA Tournament, while Men's Basketball participated in the NIT.

Hayes placed a significant emphasis on fundraising during his first year. Pride Club membership reached all-time highs, both in terms of the number of contributors and funds raised. Resources generated through fundraising efforts have been used to enhance programs and facilities available to student-athletes. Recent initiatives include the renovation of the study lab in Margiotta Hall and a new academic study area in the Physical Fitness Center.

"It is important that we provide our student-athletes with the resources to be successful, in the classroom and on the fields of play," says Hayes. "Our primary mission is to ensure that the student-athletes of Hofstra have an outstanding academic and athletic experience."

Hayes came to Hofstra University with more than 14 years of athletic administration experience, including management positions at four Division I institutions. The three years prior to taking his current position were highlighted by leading the University of Connecticut Division of Athletics fund-raising efforts, where his responsibilities included managing the operations of the UConn Athletic Development Fund, implementing policies and procedures for the annual giving program, assisting with the cultivation and solicitation of major gift prospects, coordinating capital project campaigns, overseeing special events, and managing the athletic ticketing operation. While at UConn, he served as a senior staff member for a \$40 million program that supports 24 sports and 650 student-athletes.

From 1998 to 2001 Hayes served as director of athletic administration at Fordham University, where he was responsible for the comprehensive internal operations of the athletic department, including fiscal management, facilities management, staff training and development, ticket operations, and NCAA compliance initiatives.

Prior to his tenure at Fordham, Hayes served as assistant director of athletics at St. John's University, where he managed the fiscal operations of the athletic department and supervised the business office. Hayes began his professional career in college athletics at Fairfield University, where he served as assistant director of athletics. He oversaw the addition of four sports programs at Fairfield University – football, women's rowing, women's lacrosse and women's golf.

Hayes received a master's degree in education in 1992 with a concentration in sport management from the University of Connecticut. He holds a bachelor's degree (1989) from Providence College, where he was a member of Providence's lacrosse team. He was also awarded a certificate of completion in 2001 from the Sports Management Institute, Consortium of the Universities of Michigan and Texas.

A native of Providence, Rhode Island, Hayes graduated from the Providence Country Day School where he lettered in football, basketball and lacrosse. He was inducted into the Providence Country Day Athletic Hall of Fame in October 2004. He resides in East Northport, New York, with his wife Bridget, daughter Katie (3) and son Matthew, who was born this past July.

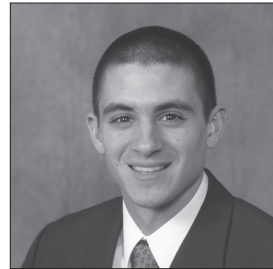

ACADEMIC SUPPORT



Area two is academic advising. In an effort to ease the demand on the Office of Advisement, the UTP academic counselor also advises first-year and undecided student-athletes.

Area three is academic monitoring. The UTP counselor monitors the academic progress of student-athletes to ensure compliance with Hofstra University, NCAA and conference regulations. The counselor's regular communication with the faculty and coaches provide an opportunity for early intervention should academic difficulties arise.

Area four is study halls. The University Tutorial Program provides all athletic study halls with tutors in various subjects and assesses the needs of individual student-athletes to provide the most effective study environment. The assessment tool administered by the UTP is also used to provide various enrichment seminars for the student-athletes such as time management, writing skills, campus resources, and surviving the college transition.

Hofstra University is committed to the pursuit of academic and athletic excellence. The University views participation in intercollegiate athletics as benefiting the student-athlete in an educationally enhancing experience beyond any other opportunity available. Hofstra also realizes the time commitment made by student-athletes and has committed the facilities and resources to support all students.

The University Tutorial Program (UTP) provides free tutoring in every subject area to any Hofstra student. In addition to this service, the UTP has an athletic component that addresses the academic needs of student-athletes. The UTP academic counselor administers this athletic component. The UTP emphasizes four areas in their efforts to ensure the academic success of Hofstra's student-athletes.

Area one is academic counseling. Services are provided in the areas of academic planning, career planning, personal counseling, and campus and community referrals. The counselor also meets with prospective student-athletes, at the coach's request, to share the many benefits of a Hofstra University education.

In the fall of 1999, the Pride Teaching and Learning Center opened on the second floor of Margiotta Hall. Funded in part by proceeds from the Joe Gardi Golf Open, the state-of-the-art computer lab and learning center features a projection system and 18 computer workstations, which are connected to the University network for easy research access to the Internet. The Pride Teaching and Learning Center was refurbished in 2005 with new furniture and computers. In addition to the Teaching and Learning Center, a new study area was created in the Physical Fitness Center.

SPORTS MEDICINE/ATHLETIC TRAINING

Through a comprehensive athletic training program, Hofstra University student-athletes are provided excellent health care during their attendance at the University. A coordinated effort between the University Health and Wellness Center, the Athletic Department and outside health care providers ensures every student-athlete the best medical attention possible.

University student-athletes have direct access to a myriad of health care services. Managing the coverage of every practice and competition event is Hofstra University's athletic training staff, which is led by third-year Head Athletic Trainer Evan Malings and features nine full-time athletic trainers and numerous student athletic trainers. The athletic trainers provide injury management, rehabilitation and treatment to the entire Athletic program. Utilizing three state-of-the-art athletic training rooms, these professionals work tirelessly to ensure the safe participation of Hofstra's student-athletes and to return injured athletes to play quickly and safely.

Supporting the athletic trainers is team physician Dr. Damion Martins. Dr. Martins, a physician with Pro Health Care, Inc. in Lake Success, New York, is in his fourth year on Hofstra's medical team. Martins experience in the sports medicine field includes serving as team physician for the University of Maryland, University of Maryland-Baltimore County and Coppin State athletic departments. He was also on the medical staff of the National Football League's Baltimore Ravens.

Hofstra University sponsors a fully accredited, highly competitive undergraduate degree program for athletic training majors, in which Hofstra student athletic trainers participate in all aspects of the health care system.

Hofstra University has both honored its traditions and heritage while embracing changing disciplines, using new technology and remaining relevant to scholarly pursuits and the demands of industry.

The Seal

The Hofstra seal was designed from the royal Dutch emblem by art instructor Constant Van de Wall. The seal is modeled on the coat of arms of the House of Orange-Nassau. The round seal includes the coat of arms, flanked by lions on either side. A lion also stands in the center of the coat of arms, holding a sword in its right paw and a bundle of seven arrows, which represent the seven provinces of Holland, in its left. The seal also carries the motto of the House of Orange-Nassau in Old French: "Je maintiendray" (I stand steadfast). In 1988 one of the two lions on the seal was officially replaced with a lioness. The Hofstra seal is still in use today, though not as a logo. The seal will be affixed to formal documents, and used for official purposes such as commencement, convocations, and official University functions.



The Pride

As of July 1, 2005, our athletic teams are officially known as the Pride, providing our teams with a strong, consistent image that resonates with the Hofstra community. The new Hofstra Athletics logo consists of a graphic mark of a male and female lion in powerful, synchronized motion with the word mark of the Hofstra Pride or the specific sports team. This logo will be the only one used by Hofstra Athletics.

The Hofstra Pride refers to a pack of lions, male and female, which work together towards a common goal and symbolize determination and strength. The Pride conveys both the teamwork and togetherness that is a trait of lions living in prides, who have a close bond and work together for the good of the entire group. The teamwork evident in prides are traits of Hofstra's student-athletes, who support each other in furtherance of a common goal, while working tirelessly to represent their teams and, in turn, the University. Lions also possess speed, tenacity, and agility, and are relentless in their pursuit of a goal, which are traits our student-athletes demonstrate both on and off the field.

The first consistent use of the word "Pride" relating to athletics was in 1989 when the University's athletic booster club was founded and called itself The Pride Club, which at the time simply referred to the pride that alumni and fans had for our teams. The Pride identity has progressed over the past decade in a more specific fashion than just the expression of a feeling. After one lion on the Hofstra seal was changed into a lioness to symbolize gender equity, the University mascots -- Kate and Willie Pride, a lioness and lion -- were introduced.

Hofstra's Dutch Heritage

Ties to Dutch heritage and the Netherlands began with William S. Hofstra, after whom the school is named and on whose property the University was started. William Hofstra died in 1932 and when his wife, Kate, died 16 months later, her will provided that their house, 15-acre estate, and bulk of her inheritance were to be used for a "public, charitable, benevolent, or scientific purpose" as a memorial to her husband.

The idea for a college came from Truesdel Peck Calkins, former Hempstead superintendent of schools, who was then with New York University. He suggested that NYU might offer extension courses on the Hofstra property. Hofstra opened in September 1935, as a two-year extension branch of NYU; its official name was "Nassau College - Hofstra Memorial of New York University at Hempstead, Long Island." When the doors opened, the sole building on campus was Hofstra's mansion, which he had affectionately named the Netherlands after his homeland, and all classes were held there. The mansion, which houses administrative offices, is now the center of Hofstra's 240-acre campus, and has been renamed Hofstra Hall.

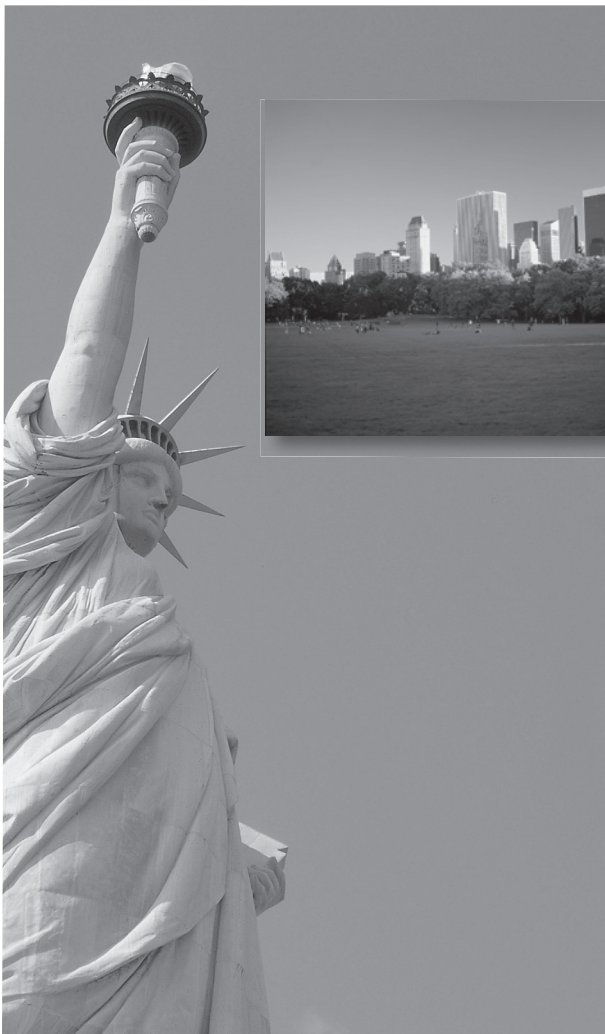

HOFSTRA UNIVERSITY WRESTLING FACILITIES

Hofstra Arena Home of Hofstra Wrestling

The Hofstra Wrestling team holds its meets in the 5,124 seat Hofstra Arena. Construction of the \$15 million, 93,000 square-foot facility began in the fall of 1998 and was completed in December 1999. The Arena also houses Hofstra's Men's and Women's Basketball teams. The Arena also hosts commencements, exhibitions, trade shows, concerts and other special events.

"Hofstra Arena is an exciting addition to the Hofstra University campus and to Nassau County, serving as a cornerstone to the evolving Nassau HUB. The arena provides the Hofstra community with a first class facility for intercollegiate sports and other activities. It also adds vitality to the offerings of the Nassau HUB, by providing this important business, culture and entertainment district with a centrally located, full-service facility for conventions, trade shows and special events," said Hofstra President Emeritus Dr. James M. Stuart at the time.

Hofstra Arena includes full chair back seating for spectators in an arena configuration. The air-conditioned facility is equipped with a state-of-the-art electronic scoreboard, men's and women's locker rooms, a training room, a large weight room, dressing rooms for stage events, four concession stands, five ticket windows, six luxury boxes, a Hofstra Pride Club lounge and offices for Hofstra's Men's and Women's Basketball Programs.

The Pride has hosted some of the biggest names in collegiate wrestling at Hofstra Arena, welcoming Oklahoma State, Michigan, Michigan State, Nebraska, Iowa and Iowa State in recent years.



Hofstra Wrestling Room

Located in the Physical Fitness Center, the Hofstra Wrestling Room provides the Pride with a year-round practice and training facility that is available to the wrestlers to work out on their own time, as well as scheduled practice times. The 40x80 room contains double floor mats and wall mats. The walls of the room are adorned with plaques commemorating Hofstra's Wrestling All-Americans and poster size photos of current members of the Pride.

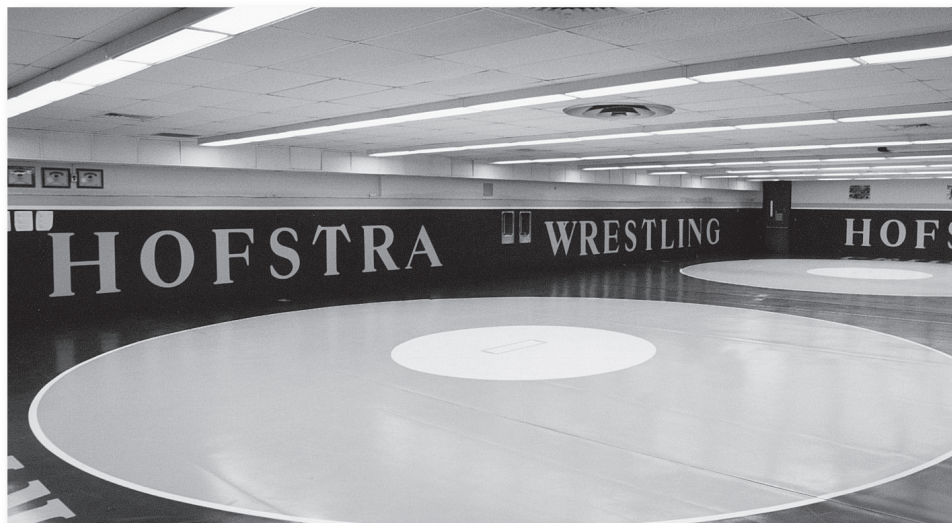

THE COLONIAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

Fresh off the celebration of its 20th Anniversary, the Colonial Athletic Association enters its third decade with two new members and an expanded geographic footprint that gives the conference a presence in five of the nation's nine largest metropolitan areas.

The addition of Georgia State University in Atlanta and Northeastern University in Boston brings the membership of the CAA to 12 and enhances the league's reputation as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences both athletically and academically. On the playing field, the CAA has produced 16 national team champions in five different sports, 33 individual national champions, 11 national coaches of the year, 11 national players of the year and 12 Honda Award winners. Even more impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 16 NCAA post-graduate scholars. In 2004-05, the CAA had seven CoSIDA Academic All-Americans and more than 1,500 student-athletes posted at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport and received the CAA Commissioner's Academic Award.

The landscape of the conference now stretches along the majority of the East Coast, and includes six of the nation's top 25 media markets – New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Boston (5), Washington, D.C. (8), Atlanta (9) and Baltimore (23). The number of television homes in the CAA market exceeds 19 million.

The CAA conducts championships in 21 sports. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and wrestling. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. The CAA will also begin sponsorship of a 12-team Division I-AA football league in the fall of 2007.

In men's basketball, the CAA has earned a reputation as a "giant killer" in the NCAA Tournament. Since 1981, CAA schools have

posted 12 wins over higher-seeded teams. In 2004-05, the conference had four teams earn post-season berths for the first time in league history and five teams were ranked among the top 100 in the RPI. In women's basketball, the CAA has had two teams earn post-season berths for five consecutive years. Perennial power Old Dominion, which has won the past 14 conference titles, has captured three national championships (1979, 1980, 1985) and reached the title game again in 1997.

The conference has also excelled in many other sports. CAA squads have won 10 field hockey national titles since the championship began in 1981, which is not only more than any other conference but represents nearly half of all titles won. In baseball, at least two CAA teams have



earned NCAA Tournament berths for seven of the past eight seasons. The CAA is annually ranked among the nation's top 10 conferences in men's and women's soccer, and has traditionally sent multiple teams to the NCAA Tournament. In 2004-05, 24 league teams earned NCAA Tournament berths in 15 sports, with the CAA having multiple representatives in men's and women's soccer, field hockey, men's and women's golf, men's lacrosse and men's tennis. There were 29 CAA student-athletes who earned All-America honors.

CAA member institutions are also committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a goal of expanding their partnership to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Among the programs already established are an undergraduate research conference, coordination of study abroad programs and granting visiting academic

status to student-athletes traveling to an away contest so that they have access to libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs.

In 2002, two faculty members from CAA institutions were awarded academia's most coveted distinction – the Nobel Prize. John B. Fenn, a research professor in the Department of Chemistry at Virginia Commonwealth University, received the Nobel Prize for chemistry, and Vernon Smith, a professor of economics and law at George Mason University, shared the Nobel Prize in economic sciences.

Commissioner Thomas E. Yeager has guided the CAA since its inception. Core members George Mason University, James Madison University, the University of North Carolina at Wilmington, Old Dominion University, Virginia Commonwealth University and the College of William & Mary were joined by the University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Georgia State University and Northeastern University became members of the conference on July 1, 2005.

The CAA traces its roots back to 1983 when three of its current members- George Mason, James Madison, and William and Mary - were aligned with East Carolina University, the United States Naval Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11 sports, acquired two new members (UNC Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new association. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985. By the fall of 1986, the league gained automatic bids to NCAA Championships in men's basketball, soccer, baseball and women's basketball and formed an officials' bureau. Old Dominion became a member of the CAA in 1991-92 and Virginia Commonwealth University joined the conference prior to the 1995-96 season.

From all-star athletes to Nobel Prize winning faculty, the CAA takes great pride in producing performers who stand out both on the playing field and in the classroom.

2004-05 YEAR IN REVIEW

HOFSTRA WINS FOURTH STRAIGHT CAA CHAMPIONSHIP

PLACE 17TH AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Led by its seven individual champions, Hofstra University won its fourth consecutive Colonial Athletic Association team wrestling title at Boston University's Case Gymnasium. Pride senior Chris Skretkowitz was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Wrestler. At the 197-pound weight class, Skretkowitz went 3-0 while scoring two major decisions.

The Pride finished the two-day competition with a school-record 136 points, while Rider placed second with 84.5 points. Drexel followed in third with 69.0 while host B.U. finished fourth with 53.0. Sacred Heart and Old Dominion were tied in fifth with 47.5, followed by George Mason (37.5), James Madison (10.5), Wagner (7.0), and Campbell (6.5).

The Pride, who placed nine wrestlers in the finals, sent a school-record nine wrestlers to the NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships at the Savvis Center in St. Louis, Missouri. The previous Pride record for wrestlers sent to the NCAA Championships in a single year was eight, set in 2003 and 2004. Hofstra's seven conference titles is also a new school best, topping the previous mark of six set in 2004.

Junior Jon Masa and senior Chris Skretkowitz each captured their third conference titles to become just the ninth and tenth wrestlers in school history to capture three conference crowns. Masa didn't break a sweat in the final as his opponent Rayes Gonzales from Boston University forfeited the title match. Skretkowitz defeated John DaCruz of Boston University 10-0 to win the 197-pound title.

Freshmen Charles Griffin and Joe Rovelli each made strong cases for the CAA Rookie of the Year award with conference championships. Griffin defeated Kyle McCarthy from Sacred Heart 12-3 while Rovelli recorded a 13-8 decision over Adam Wright from Old Dominion.

The big upset of the finals came at 157 pounds where Hofstra sophomore James Strouse captured his first CAA title with a 3-0 decision over defending league champion Dave Miller from Rider. Strouse advanced to his second straight NCAA Championship Tournament. Junior Mike Patrovich notched his first CAA title with a 17-6 major decision over Sacred Heart's Sherwood Fendryk. Patrovich was a CAA finalist in 2003. Senior Paul Siemon made his third trip to the NCAA Championships but this time as a CAA champion following his win by forfeit over Rider's Sean Jenkins of Rider.

Two other Hofstra wrestlers also made the trip to St. Louis as CAA finalists. Freshman Dave Tomasette dropped a 4-0 decision to Christian Staylor from Old Dominion in the 125 pound final while Ricky LaForge dropped the 141-pound title match by medical forfeit at 3:25 of the contest.

In addition to the two finalists at each weight class advancing to the National Championships, four wrestlers were selected to compete as "wild cards". The wild cards were Rider's Tim Harner (133) and TJ Morrison (184), Drexel's Mark Cartella (149), and Sacred Heart's Payam Zarrinpour (HWT).

Hofstra swept the 2005 Colonial Athletic Association postseason awards. Masa was named the CAA Wrestler of the Year, Griffin was named the CAA Rookie of the Year, and Tom Ryan was named the CAA Coach of the Year. In addition, Tomasette and Rovelli were named to the CAA All-Rookie Team. Siemon was named the CAA Wrestling Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Masa earned All-America honors at 149 pounds for the second time in his career, placing third at the NCAA National Championships by winning six of seven bouts. He finished the year with a 26-10 record and captured his third CAA Championship. He placed second at the Las Vegas Invitational and the

Nebraska-Omaha Open. Masa became Hofstra's third CAA Wrestler of the Year Award recipient following Chris Skretkowitz, who won the award in 2003 and 2004.

Griffin, who won his 133 pound weight class at the CAA Championships, posted a 27-6 record in 2004-05 and was ranked as high as 17th in the nation. He recorded a perfect 6-0 mark in CAA dual matches and was 16-2 overall in duals. He captured the individual title at the Nebraska-Omaha Open.

Ryan led Hofstra to its fourth CAA crown in as many seasons in the conference. The Pride was 6-0 in dual meets against CAA teams this season, were 13-5 overall, had seven conference champions and placed 17th at the NCAA Championships with nine NCAA qualifiers. He captured his fourth CAA Coach of the Year Award and his seventh of his 10-year tenure at Hofstra.

Tomasette posted a 23-15 record and was the CAA runner-up at 125 pounds in 2004-05. He tallied a 5-1 mark in CAA duals and placed second at the Nebraska-Omaha Open. Tomasette was 1-2 in his first appearance at the NCAA Championships in March.

Rovelli recorded a 23-9 record and captured the CAA championship at 184 pounds in 2004-05. He was 5-0 in CAA duals and placed second at the Nebraska-Omaha Open. Rovelli was also 1-2 in his first appearance at the NCAA Championships.

The CAA All-Rookie team consisted of 125 Dave Tomasette of Hofstra, Griffin at 133, 141 Ed Giosa of Drexel, 149 Mike Palma of Rider, 157 Ryan Hluschak of Drexel, 165 Billy Haydt of Drexel, 174 Randy Oates of George Mason, 184 Joe Rovelli of Hofstra, 197 Jeff Black of Rider and heavyweight Tyler Rees of Rider.

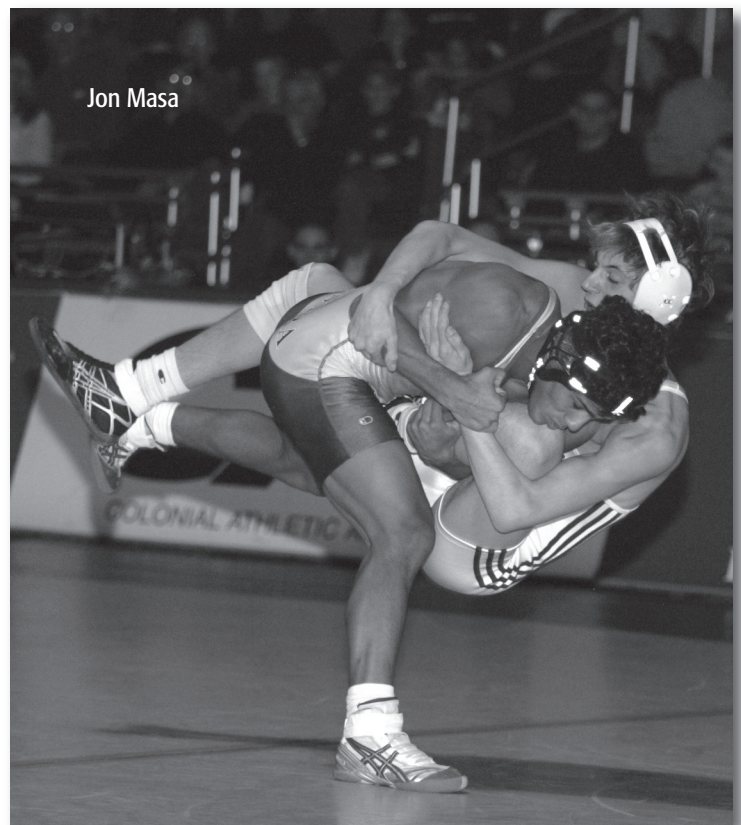

THE HISTORY OF HOFSTRA WRESTLING

The history of Hofstra Wrestling dates back 60 years. The program, which began as a club team in 1945, grew quickly and became nationally recognized within two decades.

The first season of Hofstra Wrestling saw Walter "Brick" Stone as the team's head coach. In its first season as a club team, Hofstra went undefeated in six matches. Home matches were held at Hempstead High School. Three members who helped initiate the first team were Dick Bemson, Frank Fusco and Jim Geiger.

Wrestling became a varsity sport during the 1947-48 season. That year Hofstra entered the NCAA Championships held at Lehigh University after compiling a 5-2-1 record.

Under Stone's direction, the wrestlers set a school record of 16 straight victories during the early '50s. The 1951-52 squad suffered only two losses en route to a 10-2 season. One of the early program's outstanding wrestlers was Art Strunk.

The next Hofstra wrestlers to enter the national spotlight were Dan Notine and Pete Damone. In 1956 Notine became the first Hofstra wrestler to capture a coveted Middle Atlantic Conference Championship. Damone replaced Stone as the team's coach in 1960.

The early tradition of success continued during Damone's six-year reign as head coach. Damone produced several fine wrestlers, including Don Hannon ('60), Tom Haseman ('61), Dick Snyder ('63) and Ken Robinson ('64). The 1965-66 squad won the Metropolitan Intercollegiate Championship and crowned its first Metro title winner, Art Rudolph.

In 1966 Bob Getchell became the program's third coach. Getchell's first squad produced two Metro Conference winners, Butch Jemmott and Ken Robinson. His second team won the Metro title with Jemmott, Dave Berman and Marty Willigan all taking individual titles, and wrestlers such as Steve Molello offering great contributions to the team. Willigan was named the 1968 Tournament's Outstanding Wrestler. He then went on to the NCAA Championships where he took fourth place, becoming Hofstra's first All-American.

In 1969 the team finished third in the Metropolitan and Middle Atlantic Conference Championships. Willigan captured second place in the NCAA Championships, losing in the final round to Iowa State's legendary Dan Gable, the top wrestler in the United States. Gable would later coach Hofstra's current head coach, Tom Ryan, while he attended Iowa.



The wrestling program continued to develop under Getchell's direction. Joel Kislin became Hofstra's second All-American when he placed third at the NCAA Championships in 1973. In 1972-73, Hofstra hosted the Middle Atlantic Conference Championships and placed second.

In the mid-1970s, standouts Nick Gallo, a 126-pounder, and Don Mayorga, a heavyweight, began to make their presence felt. They powered Hofstra to three East Coast Conference Championships. (The Middle Atlantic Conference formed the East Coast Conference during this time.) Gallo went on to



become an alternate for the United States team in the 1976 Olympic Games. In 1977 he captured the NCAA Championship at 126 pounds. He also earned the Tournament's Outstanding Wrestler Award.

Bob Getchell then left the coaching ranks to become Hofstra's Director of Athletics. Al Bevilacqua replaced him and continued the winning tradition. Hofstra won six straight ECC Championships from 1975 through 1980. After missing a year at the top in 1981, Hofstra captured two more titles in 1982 and 1983.

Hofstra standout Nick Gallo returned to his alma mater in 1979 to direct the program. In his four years at Hofstra, the team posted a 48-16 record and captured three ECC championships. As head coach, Gallo sent 11 wrestlers to the NCAA Championships. Among these 11, Ed Pidgeon, a 1981 All-American, finished fourth nationally while Peter Capone, a two-time All-American, finished seventh and second at the NAAs.

Joe Bavaro took over the reigns as head coach from 1983 through 1987, posting a 23-36 record, and leading the Dutchmen to another ECC Championship in 1983. Under Bavaro's leadership, Capone, a 167-pounder, was named the ECC Tournament's Outstanding Wrestler. Mike Arena, a 150-pounder and three-time conference champion, was also named the ECC Tournament's Outstanding Wrestler under Bavaro.

In 1987 former Hofstra wrestler and three-time conference champion Tony Arena replaced Joe Bavaro as head of the Hofstra Wrestling program. In his two years at Hofstra, Arena led the team to a 15-17-1 record.

Javier Armengau returned to his alma mater in 1989 to take over the Flying Dutchmen program.

Armengau wrestled under Gallo and Bavaro and was a three-time captain. As coach at Hofstra, Armengau guided wrestlers such as Ralph Tubello to outstanding careers. The 1992-93 season saw Tubello break 100 career wins and freshman Jason Wartinger become Hofstra's second first team freshman All-American. (The first was Mike Hogan in 1977.)

Tom Ryan, a Long Island native and a two-time All-American at Iowa, took over the reigns of the program in 1995. Ryan has brought in fine recruiting classes since his arrival and in 1997 was able to coach three wrestlers, Joe Catalanotto, Ryan Edmundson and Mike Quaglio, to NCAA Tournament berths. Catalanotto won an automatic berth by winning the 126-pound title at the ECWA Championships, while Quaglio and Edmundson were at-large selections. In 1998 the Dutchmen were again well represented at the NCAA Championships. Sophomore Eric Schmiesing and senior Russell Jones both received at-large bids, while junior James Hieronymous and senior Mike Quaglio received automatic bids as ECWA Champions. Hofstra finished the year ranked 24th in the NCAA dual meet rankings.

In 1999 Hofstra Wrestling reached new heights. Hofstra placed second at the ECWA Championships and crowned five individual champions who would represent the conference at the NCAA Championships. Roman Fleszar, Jason DeBruin, Eric Schmiesing and Zach Miller won four out of the first five weight classes, and a victory by Russell Jones gave the Flying Dutchmen their five champions. Roman Fleszar and Eric Schmiesing advanced to the quarterfinals at the NCAA Championships, lifting the Flying Dutchmen to a 26th-place finish out of the 79 competing institutions. Jason DeBruin was also named New York State Freshman of the Year after compiling a 43-8 record.

Hofstra met and surpassed its 1999 accomplishments in 2000. The Pride crowned four ECWA Champions, Fleszar, Schmiesing, DeBruin and Rob Anspach, and sent six wrestlers to the

NCAA Tournament. Fleszar and Schmiesing each placed at their respective weight classes, becoming Hofstra's first All-American wrestlers since 1985. As a team, Hofstra placed 21 out of 73 teams. The Pride also won the New York State Championship for the second time in three years.

2001 saw Hofstra win its ninth ECWA Championship and first since 1983, and sent a then school-record seven wrestlers (Tom Noto, Roman Fleszar, Eric Schmiesing, Dennis Papadatos, Jason DeBruin, Noel Thompson and Rob Anspach) to the NCAA Tournament. Fleszar and Schmiesing repeated as All-Americans and the team placed 22nd overall at the NCAA. On the year, Hofstra finished ranked 15th in the nation. Tom Ryan was named ECWA Coach of the Year for the second straight year. The 2000-01 season also marked the final season of the ECWA, as the league merged with the Colonial Athletic Association beginning with the 2001-02 season. The Pride won the Colonial Athletic Association title in 2002 and sent seven wrestlers (Tom Noto, Jon Masa, Jason DeBruin, Paul Siemon, John Garriques, Ralph Everett and Chris Skretkowicz) to the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. Noto, Masa and DeBruin each won individual championships at the CAA Tournament with DeBruin, the tournament's most outstanding wrestler, becoming Hofstra's first four-time conference champion. Skretkowicz was named the CAA Rookie of the Year, while Tom Ryan was the CAA Co-Coach of the Year.

The 2002-03 season once again saw Hofstra surpass the achievements of the last season as the team won the Colonial Athletic Association Championship for the second straight year, sent a school-record eight wrestlers (Pat Flynn, Ricky LaForge, Jon Masa, Mike Patrovich, Noel Thompson, Ralph Everett, Brad Christie and Chris Skretkowicz) to the NCAA Championships, and saw Masa and Skretkowicz come home All-Americans. In addition, LaForge was the CAA Championships co-Most Outstanding Wrestler and Tom Ryan won his fourth consecutive conference coach of the year award.

In 2003-04 the Pride continued their winning ways with a 15-5 record in duals, extended their conference match winning streak to 34 by posting an 8-0 conference dual record, captured their third consecutive CAA Championship and in the process had four champions and tied the school mark by sending eight wrestlers (Tom Noto, John Manarte, James Strouse, Paul Siemon, Ralph Everett, Noel Thompson, Brad Christie, and Chris Skretkowicz) to the NCAA Championships in St. Louis. Skretkowicz, who was the CAA Wrestler of the Year, placed fifth to capture his second All-American award as Hofstra finished 20th in the final NCAA Championship standings. Coach Tom Ryan added his fifth straight conference Coach of the Year award to his trophy case.

2004-05 saw the Pride repeat as CAA champions, tie the school-record with eight NCAA qualifiers (Charles Griffin, Ricky LaForge, Jon Masa, James Strouse, Mike Patrovich, Paul Siemon, Joe Rovelli, Chris Skretkowicz), place 17th at the NCAA's as a team and compile a 13-5 dual meet record. Masa, who was named the CAA Wrestler of the Year, placed third at the NCAA Championship to earn All-America honors for the second time in his career. Hofstra swept the CAA awards as in addition to Masa, Griffin was named the CAA Rookie of the Year and Coach Ryan took home his sixth straight (four CAA and two ECWA) conference Coach of the Year Award.

In 59 years of action, the Hofstra wrestling team has posted a 484-370-23 record.

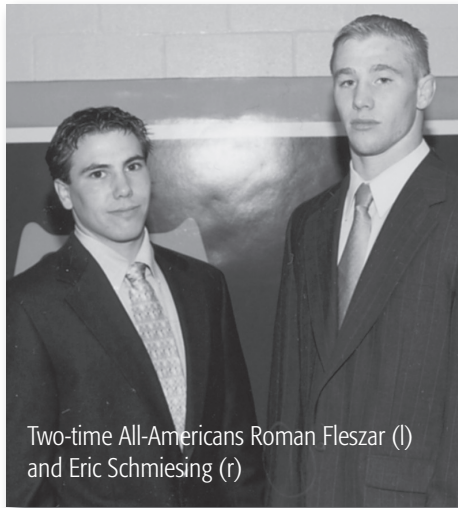

THE RAY DOWNEY SR. MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AND WRESTLING FUND

The Hofstra University wrestling program is proud to honor the memory of an American hero FDNY Deputy Chief Ray Downey with the Ray Downey Memorial Scholarship. Chief Downey, who served as Chief of Special Operations Command, lost his life heroically during the terrorist attacks at the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001.

Ray Downey was appointed to the FDNY on April 7, 1962. In August 2001, he was placed in charge of all SOC (Special Operations Command) operations - Rescue, Squad, Haz Mat and Marine - and promoted to Deputy Chief. Chief Downey's phenomenal 39-year career with the FDNY was built upon success after success and rescue after rescue. One of the most - if not *the* most decorated men in the Department, Chief Downey received five individual medals for valor and 16 unit citations.

A devoted family man who lived in Deer Park, New York, with his wife, Rosalie; father of five married children, Joseph, Marie, Chuck, Ray Jr. and Kathy; and adored grandfather of nine, Chief Downey was an avid fan of the sport of wrestling and supporter of the Hofstra wrestling program, where his sons Joe and Ray Jr. were outstanding athletes. Chief Downey loved wrestling, and he always attended their matches. He continued to support the Hofstra wrestling program long after his sons graduated.

After his passing, the Downey family, longtime supporters of Hofstra University and the Pride wrestling program, created a scholarship fund to honor Chief Downey's memory. Funds contributed are used to endow scholarships in Chief Downey's name and will provide financial assistance to the Hofstra University wrestling program. Chief Downey's sons, Joseph, Chuck and Ray Jr., were successful athletes at Deer Park High School, and earned bachelor's degrees from respected universities through athletic scholarship opportunities. Recipients of these funds will demonstrate the integrity, work ethic, discipline and courage that Deputy Chief Raymond Downey exemplified throughout his life. The 2005 recipients of the Ray Downey Scholarship Award were senior Paul Siemon, junior Mike Patrovich and strength and conditioning assistant Brad Christie.

The Ray Downey Sr. Memorial Scholarship Fund Day, which is scheduled for Monday, January 2, 2006 against the nationally-ranked Wolverines of the University of Michigan, is a unique opportunity to honor Chief Downey's memory as well as to support student-athletes. About Your Host: Jim Sheehan is in his 26th year in the sports public relations profession and in his 18th year in charge of Hofstra University's athletic publicity. In November 1999, he was promoted to associate director of athletics at the University. Sheehan came to Hofstra in 1988 after serving as assistant commissioner of the I-AA Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference in St. Louis, Missouri, from 1985 through 1988. Prior to his Gateway stint, he served as coordinator of media relations for the Houston Gamblers of the United States Football League in 1984-85. Sheehan has also served as director of sports information at the University of Tampa from 1982 through 1984; assistant to the commissioner/information director of the Sunshine State Conference from 1980 through 1984 and director of sports information at his alma mater, Biscayne College in 1981-82. Jim and his wife Maureen have a daughter, Jillian (13). The Sheehan family resides in Middle Village, New York.

Press Row: The Hofstra Arena press row, located on the south side of the Arena, is intended for working media. All press row guests must have a pass, issued by the Hofstra Office of Athletic Communications. Spouses, dates and non-workers are not permitted on press row.

Credentials: All members of the press should contact the Office of Athletic Communications at least 48 hours before each match for press row space and credentials. Press passes will be left at the Will Call window at the Hofstra Arena ticket office.

Photographers: Photographers who intend to shoot from matside should request a mat photo pass. Only accredited press and staff photographers will be allowed at matside.

Press Parking: Media parking passes should be requested at the same time press row/photo passes are requested. The Reserved-Media parking lot is located on the north side of Hofstra Arena in front of the main entrance. Parking is limited and on a first-come, first-serve basis in the Reserved-Media lot. Once that lot is filled, media will be directed to the general public parking areas around the Hofstra Arena.

Game Services: Match information and releases can be found in the media room which is located in the southeast corner of the Arena.

Telephones: Hofstra University provides numerous telephones for use by the media on press row. Please indicate your telephone need when you request your credentials.

Radio: The Hofstra Office of Athletic Communications will provide a touch-tone digital phone line for the opponent's commercial and student radio stations. Visiting teams will need to give the Athletic Communications Office two weeks notice of their intention to broadcast. An ISDN line is also available for a rental charge of \$200.00. All calls must be made collect or direct dial from the radio station to the Hofstra Arena.

Post-Match Interviews: Hofstra wrestlers will be available for post-match interviews, upon request, after a 10-minute cooling off period. Contact Jim Sheehan with your request.

Player Interviews: All requests for student-athlete interviews during the week should be made at least one day in advance with the Office of Athletic Communications. If you are requesting a phone interview, we will have the student-athlete return your call at a mutually convenient time. **Wrestler home phone numbers will not be distributed.** In-person interviews may be conducted in a number of locations in and around the Hofstra Physical Fitness Center. However, interviews may not be conducted in the locker room or the athletic training room.

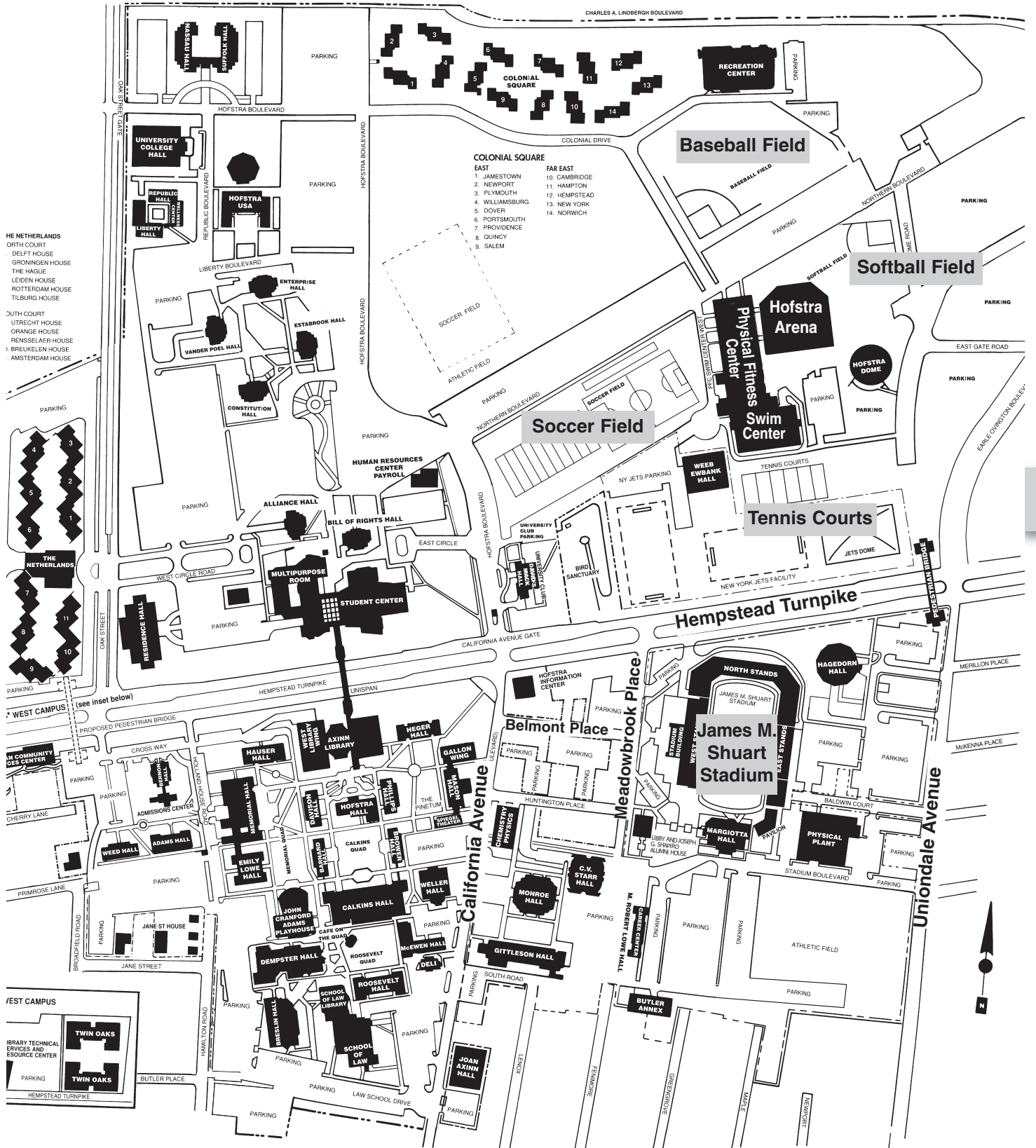

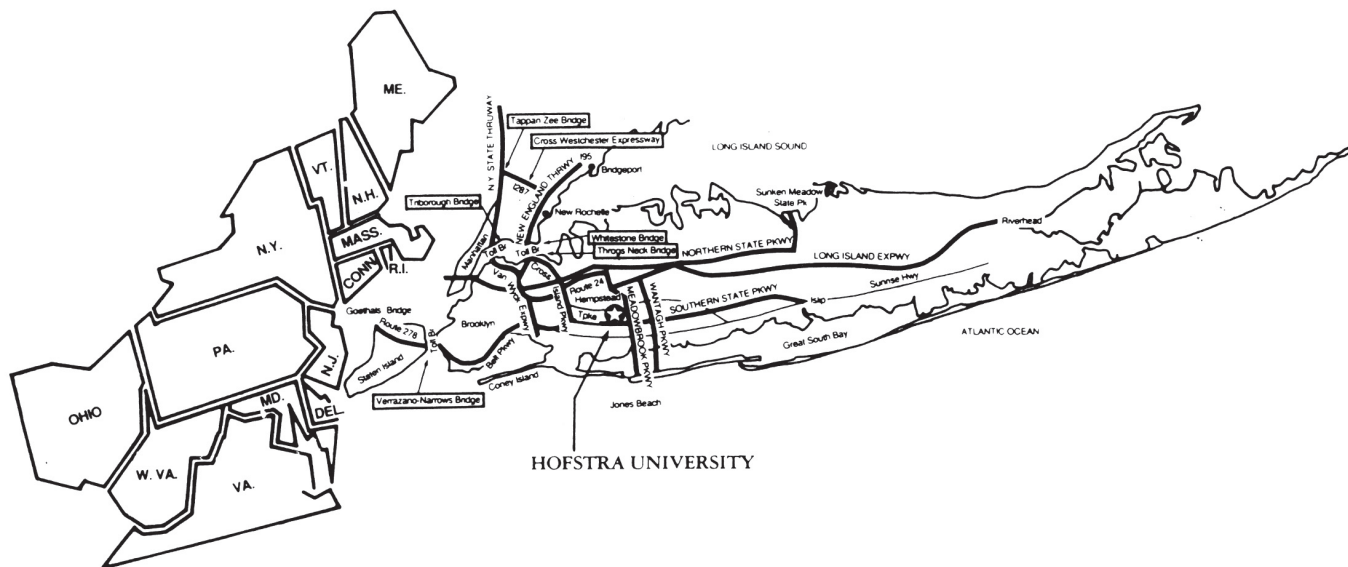

GETTING TO HOFSTRA

From Southern New Jersey, Southeastern Pennsylvania, Maryland, Washington, D.C. and Virginia:

Take the New Jersey Turnpike to Exit 13. Cross the Goethals Bridge and continue on Route 278 to the Verrazano-Narrows Bridge. Stay in the left lane of the Bridge and take the Belt Parkway-East. The Belt Parkway becomes the Southern State Parkway at the Nassau County line. Take the Southern State Parkway to the Meadowbrook Parkway North (Exit 22). Exit the Meadowbrook Parkway at Exit M4 (Hempstead Turnpike Route 24). Head west to Hofstra (approximately 1 mile).

From Northwestern New Jersey, Northern Pennsylvania and the Middle States:

Take Interstate 78, Interstate 80, U.S. Route 22, New Jersey Route 4 or New Jersey Route 17 to the George Washington Bridge. Proceed over the bridge to the Cross Bronx Expressway. Take the Cross Bronx Expressway to the Throgs Neck Bridge. Follow directions from the Throgs Neck Bridge from this point.

From Upstate New York:

Take New York Thruway over the Tappan Zee Bridge to Cross Westchester Expressway (Interstate 287). Stay on the Expressway to the New England Thruway (Interstate 95). Proceed south on the Thruway to the Throgs Neck Bridge. Follow directions from the Throgs Neck Bridge from this point.

From the Throgs Neck Bridge:

Follow signs for Eastern Long Island. Take the Cross Island Parkway to the Grand Central Parkway-East. The Grand Central becomes the Northern State Parkway at the Nassau County line. Take the Northern State Parkway-East to the Meadowbrook Parkway-South (exit 31A). Take

the Meadowbrook Parkway-South to Exit M4 West (Hempstead Turnpike Route 24). Follow Hempstead Turnpike West to Hofstra (approximately 1 mile).

For Team Travel Via Bus:

Commercial buses are not allowed on New York City (Belt, Grand Central or Cross Island) or Long Island (Southern State or Northern State) Parkways. Team buses should take the Brooklyn-Queens Expressway from the south, and the Clearview Expressway from the north, to get to the Long Island Expressway for the trip to Hofstra. Once on the Long Island Expressway (I-495), buses should proceed to Glen Cove Road-South (exit 39). Head south on Glen Cove Road for approximately eight miles to Hempstead Turnpike/Fulton Avenue and turn left (east). Hofstra University is approximately two miles east on Hempstead Turnpike.

Public Transportation from Airport:

If a visitor arrives at either La Guardia or Kennedy Airport, the most direct means of reaching the University is by one of three limousine companies that service both airports and the Hofstra University area. Larry's Taxi Service (516) 483-3333; Transport Limousine Service (800) 654-1164 (out of state) (800) 832-5466 (in New York state); Winston Limousine Service (800) 4-AIRPORT.

Railroads:

AMTRAK services Pennsylvania Station in Manhattan, approximately 30 miles from the Hofstra campus. To get to Hofstra from Penn Station, take the Long Island Rail Road to the Hempstead station. The Hofstra University Courtesy Bus and taxi services are available there. Hofstra is approximately 1.5 miles from the station.
