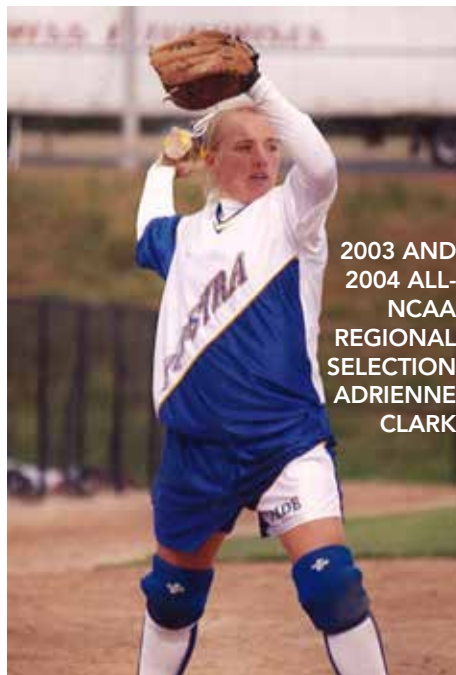

# HEAD COACH LARISSA ANDERSON



Larissa Anderson is entering her third season as the Hofstra Softball Head Coach in 2017.

Anderson led Hofstra to the Colonial Athletic Association championship and a NCAA Tournament berth in her first season as the program's head coach in 2015, guiding Hofstra to a 38-14-1 record and a spot in the NCAA Gainesville Regional. Anderson and her assistants were named the NFCA Northeast Region's Coaching Staff of the Year after Hofstra posted a collective 2.05 ERA, smashed 56 home runs and out-scored opponents, 277-129. Morgan Lashley and Caryn Bailey were recognized as first-team NFCA all-region members under her tutelage.

In 2016 Anderson and the Pride posted another winning record, going 24-22. Six members of the team earned CAA postseason honors, with Brielle Pietrafesa and Chloe Fitzgerald getting first-team All-CAA nods and Madison Ambush earning a spot on the All-Rookie Team. Pietrafesa and Nikki Michalowski were also named Third-Team NFCA All-Northeast Region selections.

Anderson has been part of eight NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year award-winners, including seven as an assistant or associate head coach and one as the head



coach. Since Anderson arrived on campus, Hofstra is 542-230-2, which is good for a .700 winning percentage.

Before taking over as the head coach, Anderson spent the previous 13 seasons on the Hofstra staff as an assistant, including the last 10 as the associate head coach. She is just the sixth head coach in program history since 1980 and took over for Hall-of-Fame coach Bill Edwards, who helmed the program from 1990 through 2014.

Anderson led Hofstra to 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and 10 Colonial Athletic Association championships as an assistant before racking up another title and NCAA regional appearance as the head coach in 2015.

As associate head coach, she helped Hofstra win 24 NCAA Tournament games and make six appearances in the regional finals.

Under Anderson's guidance, Hofstra hurlers won nine CAA Pitcher of the Year awards in 10 seasons, including four consecutive wins by Olivia Galati from 2010-13 and three from Kayleigh Lotti from 2007-09. Galati was twice named an All-American by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) and was the program's first-ever first-team pick in 2012 after leading Division I with a 0.95 ERA and a 34-7 record. Anderson helped guide Galati to a NCAA-best 40 wins and 22 shutouts in 2013.

One of the hallmarks of the Hofstra Softball program during Anderson's tenure has been the Pride's stellar defense. From 2008-13, Hofstra regularly ranked among the nation's elite in fielding percentage as the Pride was among the top 20 in the nation in five of those seasons. The Pride reached the pinnacle in that category in 2011 as Hofstra ranked first in all of Division I in fielding percentage. Hofstra was also fourth in 2008 and 2010, and 16th in 2012 and 2013.

Anderson is also a frequent speaker at camps and clinics around the country. At the 2011 National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Convention, Anderson and Edwards were featured speakers and presented on the topic: "Defensive Strategy: Is Your Team Really As Prepared As You Think?" The national convention included more than



1,300 participants (mostly coaches) from youth levels, high school, travel teams and NCAA Division I, II, III and NAIA institutions. Anderson also spoke at the 2013 NFCA Convention, focusing on the defensive team system.

Anderson is very active with the NFCA serves as the fourth vice president on the NFCA Executive Board. She is also chair

of the NFCA Awards Committee and is a member of the NFCA Top 25 committee and the Hall of Fame Committee. Anderson is also the NFCA Head Coaches Committee representative for the CAA. She previously served as the chair of the NFCA Ethics Committee from 2009-13 was a member of the NFCA Recruiting Committee.

Prior to coming to Hofstra, Anderson served as an assistant coach for two seasons at LIU Post, where she helped the Pioneers to a combined 75-33 record, including a school record 42 wins during the 2000 season. She assisted in all facets of the program at LIU Post and was in charge of coaching the pitchers and catchers. Her efforts helped the Pioneers to the 13th best team earned run average in Division II (1.11) in 2001. She was also part of a C.W. Post staff that received the Northeast Region Division II Coaching Staff of the Year award from the NFCA in 2000.

Anderson also served one season as an assistant coach at Gannon University in 1998, after being named a regional All-American outfielder in 1997. She graduated from Gannon in 1997 with a bachelor's of science degree in therapeutic recreation.

Anderson is married to former Hofstra Baseball Coach Patrick Anderson, who manages in the Washington Nationals organization.



# ASSISTANT COACH JULIE MEYER



Julie Meyer is entering her third season as an assistant coach at Hofstra in 2017. She previously served in a similar capacity at the University of Mississippi for three seasons.

Meyer was part of Head Coach Larissa Anderson's staff in 2015 that was recognized by the NFCA with the Northeast Region's Coaching Staff of the Year award. Hofstra won the Colonial Athletic Association title after going 38-14-1 and earned a berth in the NCAA Gainesville Regional. Pitcher Morgan Lashley and outfielder Caryn Bailey earned NFCA all-region first-team honors working under a staff that Meyer heavily influenced.

In 2016 the team finished 24-22, and six members of the Pride were honored with CAA postseason awards. In addition, Brielle Pietrafesa and Nikki Michalowski were named to the NFCA All-Northeast Region Third Team.

Meyer came to Hofstra after serving as the first base and infield/catchers coach with the Mississippi program. During her time in Oxford, Meyer was responsible for player development while serving as a liaison with the school's academic support staff. On the field, she focused on defensive skills and developing the program's slap hitters. She also was responsible for coordinating team travel and organizing the Ole Miss softball camps while playing a key role in recruiting.

Meyer's impact on the Rebels was seen on the defensive side, as the 2013 squad set a program record with a .979 fielding percentage, which was the fifth best nationally despite freshmen starting at both middle infield positions.

Before arriving at Mississippi, Meyer was an assistant at Memphis in 2011, where she coached an infield that recorded 10 or fewer errors at every position and set a school record for the most runners caught stealing. At Memphis, she also was responsible for



the program's travel arrangements and was in charge of recruiting in Texas, the west coast and in the northeast.

Meyer started her coaching career as a volunteer assistant coach at the University of California, where she played as a first baseman and catcher from 2004 to 2008.

At the time of her graduation, she ranked fourth all-time in the program's history with 25 home runs. She slammed a walk-off ninth inning single in the 2008 NCAA Regional Championship game, which sent Cal to the Super Regional. In 2005 Cal advanced to the College World Series with Meyer starting every game at first base. She played in three NCAA Regional qualifiers in total.

Meyer graduated from California in 2010 with a degree in sociology. She has worked at various California softball clinics and

has volunteered with Special Olympics as an instructor. She was elected captain in 2007-08 and served as the softball representative to the Student Athlete Advisory Committee. She was awarded the Donna Terry Scholarship for her outstanding team leadership in 2007.



# ASSISTANT COACHES



## SARA MICHALOWSKI

ASSISTANT COACH

Hofstra softball standout Sara Michalowski joined the Hofstra coaching staff in September 2016.

Michalowski, a 2011 graduate and four-year member of the Pride softball team, returned to Hofstra after spending two years as the head softball coach at Joel Barlow High School in Connecticut, taking the team to the conference finals and winning a Connecticut State Tournament game for the first time in school history.

She has also served as the head coach and program coordinator of The Wicked Softball since 2011. With The Wicked Softball, she has been responsible for all instruction, in-game coaching, recruiting and administrative duties, and helped 100 percent of her players receive scholarships to the institution of their choosing. In 2014 her Under-14 team finished third at USSSA National Championships.

The 2011 Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Year, Michalowski had a successful collegiate career at Hofstra. She was named to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-Northeast Region Second Team in each of her final years, adding to her First-Team All-CAA and All-Rookie Team selections as a freshman. She finished her career in the program's all-time top 10 lists for career RBIs and home runs and holds top-10 single-season marks in the same categories. Michalowski helped the Pride to CAA Championships and appearances in the NCAA Regionals in 2008 and 2010.



## DIEGO IBARRA

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH

Diego Ibarra, who joined the Hofstra softball staff in the fall of 2016, has experience in both baseball and softball, most recently serving as the junior varsity baseball coach at St. Joseph Regional High School in Montvale, New Jersey. Previously, Ibarra had spent nearly four years as the head junior varsity softball coach at Immaculate Heart Academy in Washington Township, New Jersey, while also working as the director of player development and head softball coach with the 18U travel team at Akadema Elite Softball.

With Akadema Elite Softball, Ibarra was responsible for developing players and coaches, while also spearheading the team's social media campaigns.

In addition, Ibarra owns D1 MGMT, a design and marketing company in Emerson, New Jersey. The company offers assistance to small businesses, non-profits and educational institutions. Ibarra graduated from Fairfield in 2008 with a bachelor's degree in marketing and management.



# ASSISTANT STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING COACH ASHLEY CHRISTY

Ashley Christy came to Hofstra in October 2016 after serving as a graduate assistant strength and conditioning coach at Appalachian State, designing training programs for men's and women's tennis and golf. She also assisted with the school's women's basketball, softball, volleyball, men and women's soccer, men and women's track and field and cheerleading teams.

Previously, she worked as a strength and conditioning intern at University of Texas at Austin, implementing training programs for men's cheerleading and assisting with athletes that competed in the 2016 Rio Olympics, and as an intern at Georgia State.

Christy is also a decorated athlete herself, playing four years of softball at Georgia State and earning National Fastpitch Coaches Association South All-Region Third-Team and First-Team All-Sun Belt honors in 2015. She was also a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-District pick and a four-time NFCA All-American Scholar Athlete.

Christy received her bachelor's degree in exercise science from Georgia State in 2015.

# ASSISTANT ATHLETIC TRAINER BOB TIRADO

Bob Tirado joined the Hofstra University Athletic Training staff in September 2016 after nearly 10 years as an assistant athletic trainer at LIU Post in Brookville, New York. During his tenure with the Pioneers, Tirado worked with the football, men's basketball and softball programs.

Prior to working at LIU Post, Tirado was an assistant trainer for the San Jose Sabercats of the Arena Football League during the 2005-06 season. He served in the same role at Nassau Community College in 2003-04.

Tirado earned his undergraduate degree in physical education from West Virginia University in 1998 and his master's degree in athletic training from LIU Brooklyn in 2001. While pursuing his master's degree, Tirado served as a graduate assistant athletic trainer at the LIU Post campus.

A member of the National Athletic Trainer's Association, Tirado also holds New York State and athletic trainer clinical instructor certification. He also is an American Red Cross Professional Rescuer.

Tirado resides in East Meadow, New York.

Peel-MacAndrew supervises and directs the student-athlete advisement program, helping to develop a

comprehensive advisement center for all student-athletes while ensuring compliance with the NCAA. She also coordinates registration efforts and develops graduation plans.

She serves as a liaison to the Office of the Provost to resolve academic questions and monitors the academic progress of student-athletes while paying special attention to at-risk students. In her role, she submits NCAA academic performance data, including APR and graduation success rates, to the compliance office.

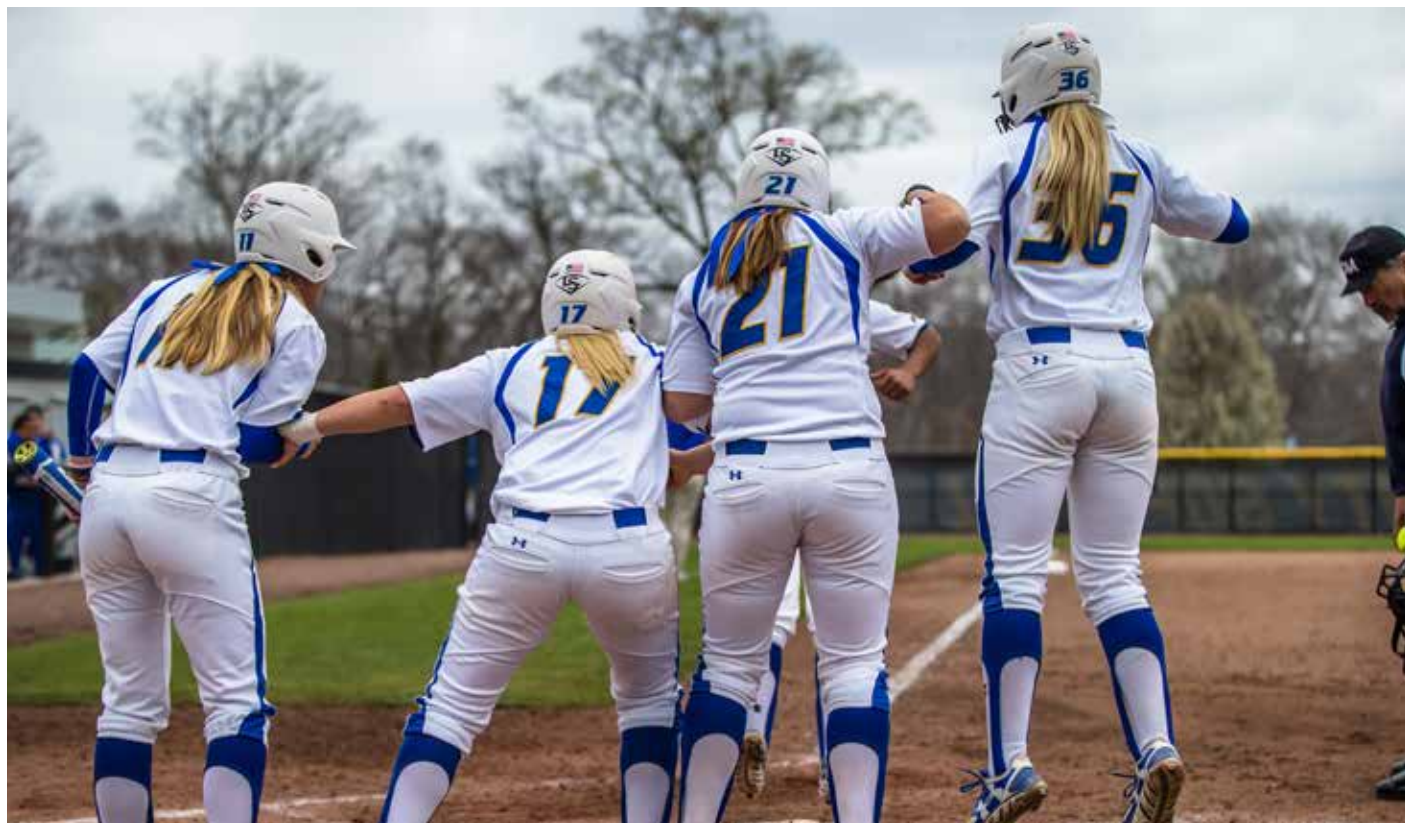
Peel-MacAndrew was appointed to the NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship

Region 1 Selection Committee in October 2015. In her role on the five-member committee, Peel-MacAndrew will take part in selecting regional finalists and forwarding their applications to the NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship Committee for its review.

Before coming to Hofstra, Peel-MacAndrew was an associate vice president for Credit Suisse First Boston Corp from 1999 to 2003. In that role, which featured time in New York City and Melbourne, Australia, she managed a team that was responsible for all equity and debt. Her staff traded and stabilized companies listed on the New York Stock Exchange and NASDAQ.

Peel-MacAndrew started her full-time financial career as an analyst for Salomon Smith Barney in London, working in equity capital markets from 1995 to 1999. She coordinated internal and external agency systems and worked on multi-departmental initiatives that encompassed the operations, financial and technology departments.

Peel-MacAndrew earned her undergraduate degree in social policy and economics from Leeds University in Yorkshire, England, graduating with honors in 1993. She also holds two master's degrees from Hofstra, earning one in physical education in 2005 and another in educational leadership and policy studies in 2012.

# 2017 OUTLOOK

With eight talented newcomers joining ranks with an experienced corps of veterans, Hofstra Softball is ready to face 2017 head-on.

Picked to finish third in the Colonial Athletic Association according to the preseason coaches' poll, the Pride has made key additions to the lineup and bolstered its depth at a number of positions as Hofstra prepares to make a run for the CAA title.

"The biggest thing with this team is our depth," said third-year Head Coach Larissa Anderson. "We have unbelievable depth. It could be so versatile and it could change based on our opponents. We really have 17 players, and it's fun and it's competitive."

The Pride finished 24-22 overall last season, marking the 27th straight season with a winning percentage over .500. The team finished 8-10 in Colonial Athletic Association play, placing seventh.

## INFIELD

Hofstra is increasingly talent-laden in the infield this season, as junior first-team All-CAA selection Nikki Michalowski and senior second-team pick Lacey Clark return. Michalowski was last season's starting first baseman, finishing with a .992 fielding percentage and just two errors. Clark was the team's go-to second baseman, posting a .952 fielding percentage. Junior Megan Patierno also returns to the infield, and will likely factor in at third base.

"We are confident with the experience and leadership we have returning in those three positions," said Anderson, who also noted that the returners have continued to impress her at the plate as well. "All three have proven that their consistency at the plate will boost our offensive power."

Michalowski finished second on the team last season with 33 runs batted in, and tied for second with eight home runs, while posting a .305 batting average.

The Pride will also get a boost in the infield from a slew of talented newcomers. Junior Sarah Edwards, a transfer from Buffalo, could slot in at first base after posting a .981 fielding percentage with the Bulls last season.

Freshman Kristin Hallam is also poised to make an immediate impact, likely stepping in at shortstop. "She's playing right now as a veteran player," said Anderson, who notes how rare it is for a freshman to be contending to be the team's starting shortstop. "Her leadership skills and her knowledge of the game are blowing me away." A product of Nottingham High School in New Jersey, Hallam was a four-time all-area selection.

Classmate Sam Tomasetti, who was named All-Delco Player of the Year at Garnet Valley High School in Pennsylvania in 2016, will also help bolster the infield with the potential to play any position. Anderson notes that versatile players like Tomasetti, and sophomore Courtney Scarpato who could also factor into the infield after spending last

season on the team's pitching staff, are some of the most valuable to a team because of their ability to play a number of different roles. Senior Michaela Transue, who suffered an injury last April, may return to her role at shortstop later in the season.

## OUTFIELD

The Pride's outfield will have a bit of a new look this season, as junior Brielle Pietrafesa is the only returner from last year's squad. A first-team All-CAA selection in right field last season, Pietrafesa will likely slide over to center field this season.

"It's great that she has two years of starting experience and being mentored by [Caryn] Bailey and [Chloe] Fitzgerald," said Anderson. "So there's your leadership out there, which will help with mentoring everyone else."

Joining her will be junior transfer Kirsten Kelley, who has two years of Division I experience at Saint Peter's. Freshman Alexis Goeke will also be competing for a spot, while Scarpatto, Edwards and Tomasetti may also see time in the outfield.

## PITCHERS

The Pride welcomes two highly touted recruits to the pitching staff in freshmen Alyssa Irons and Sarah Cornell, as they join the incumbent starter, senior Jessica Peslak.

Anderson is excited to see Cornell and Irons blossom throughout

their first season. "They're both fierce competitors with a tremendous amount of upside potential," she said. "They're both power pitchers but have the ability to move the ball."

Irons, who stands at a towering 6-foot-1, was a three-time Ashtabula County Player of the Year and a 2016 All-Ohio First-Team selection at Jefferson Area High School. In her senior campaign, she struck out 204 batters, posting a 19-1 record and 1.08 ERA, helping her team to its third straight Division II Akron regional final. She was also a member of the ASA/USA National Team pool as a senior.

Cornell, a local product of Clarke High School in Westbury, New York, comes to Hofstra with a long list of accolades, including 2016 Gatorade New York State Player of the Year, Long Island Player of the Year and National Fastpitch Coaches Association High School All-American. In her final high school season, she posted an 18-4 record with a 0.58 ERA. She added 266 strikeouts for a career total of 1,345, a Long Island record.

Anderson notes that Peslak's experience as the team's starter last season has helped her game and her confidence improve, which has allowed Peslak to become a mentor to the pair of freshmen. Peslak finished last season with a 17-10 record, a 4.48 ERA and 88 strikeouts.

## CATCHERS

Hofstra also brings three experienced catchers into 2017. Junior Brittany Allocca, who was last season's starter, will compete for the

top spot with junior transfer Kaitlyne Musa, who joins the Pride from Florida International. Anderson noted that chemistry with the freshmen pitchers and Allocca's ability to also play either of the corner infield positions will factor into the decision. Allocca's batting has impressed Anderson in the offseason, while Musa has also proven to be a strong hitter. Allocca's .336 batting average was good for second on the team last season, and she led the squad with nine home runs.

Senior Christie Sinacori also adds to the team's depth at catcher, but could also look to crack the lineup as a designated player.

## SCHEDULE

The Pride will play a challenging non-conference schedule that features five teams that advanced to NCAA Regionals last season, including two teams that were seeded. In the USA Today/NFCA Preseason Top 25 Rankings, three Hofstra opponents (Oregon, No. 9; James Madison, No. 14; South Florida, No. 25) were ranked.

The Pride opens the season on Feb. 17 at the Michele Smith National Pediatric Cancer Foundation Tournament in Clearwater, Florida, hosted by South Florida. Hofstra will take on Oklahoma State, Saint Joseph's, Binghamton, Wisconsin and the host Bulls during the three-day tournament.

"It's very nicely laid out, opening up in Clearwater," said Anderson of this season's schedule. "It's a good balance of teams."

The Pride opens March with a weekend series at Longwood on March 4 and 5 before travelling to Eugene, Oregon, for the Oregon Duck Invitational, where Hofstra will play Pacific, Oregon and Idaho State from March 10-12.

"The highlight [of the schedule] is the trip to Oregon," said Anderson. "It's really the place to play in terms of their facility and their fan experience. So it will be very special for the players to go out there,

especially with the level of play. They're a top-10 team. It will set us up well for conference play."

Hofstra's next tournament will be closer to home, as the Pride will take part in the St. John's Invitational from March 17-19 with games against local opponents Fairleigh Dickinson, St. John's, Stony Brook and Manhattan.

The Pride's home opener is slated for March 21, when Fordham makes the short trip to Bill Edwards Stadium. Hofstra hits the road the following day, heading to Binghamton for a doubleheader.

Conference play opens on March 25 and 26, when the Pride hosts defending CAA champion James Madison for a weekend series. Hofstra then stays at home for a midweek matchup with Rutgers on March 29 before hosting Towson on April 1 and 2.

The Pride then takes a non-league weekday trip to Connecticut on April 5 before returning to Hempstead for three games against conference opponent Delaware on April 8 and 9.

Hofstra will face two non-conference opponents, travelling to Seton Hall on April 11 before hosting LIU Brooklyn on April 12, before jumping back into league play with a trip to UNCW on April 15 and 16.

The Pride hosts local rival Stony Brook on April 19 and conference foe Elon on April 22 and 23. Hofstra will then play the remainder of its schedule on the road, heading to Charleston on April 29 and 30 and non-league opponent Lehigh on May 3, and closing with a final conference series at Drexel on May 5 and 6.

The CAA Championships will be held at James Madison in Harrisonburg, Virginia, from May 10-12.

# HOFSTRA UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT STUART RABINOWITZ



Stuart Rabinowitz was chosen by the Hofstra University Board of Trustees to serve as the eighth president of the University on December 20, 2000. Prior to his appointment, he served as dean of Hofstra University School of Law from September 1989 through June 2001. He joined the faculty of the Law

School in 1972. President Rabinowitz currently holds the Andrew M. Boas and Mark L. Claster Distinguished Professor of Law.

President Rabinowitz has held positions with a number of important government and community organizations, including the Judicial Advisory Council of the State of New York Unified Court System, County of Nassau. He currently serves as a member of the board of directors for the Long Island Association, and as co-vice chair of the Long Island Regional Economic Development Committee. He has also served as a trustee of the Commission on Independent Colleges and Universities and on the board of directors the Long Island Technology

Network. President Rabinowitz is a former member of the Nassau County Blue Ribbon Financial Review Panel and a former chair of the Nassau County Local Advisory Board. Additionally, President Rabinowitz served as a member of the Nassau County Commission on Government Revision, which was charged with drafting a new charter and a new form of government for the County. He is the recipient of the Martin Luther King Living the Dream Award, EOC; Distinguished Service in the Cause of Justice, Legal Aid Society; UJA Federation Leadership Award; the Bar Association of Nassau County Proclamation for Outstanding Service to both the legal profession and the community; the Community Service Award from the Conference of Jewish Organizations of Nassau County; and the Alumni Association of the City College of New York 2005 Townsend Harris Medal. President Rabinowitz has also been honored by the Long Island Software and Technology Network (LISTnet) and was the recipient of Networking magazine's David Award. In 2009, he received the Chief Executive Leadership Award from the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE), District II. Claflin University presented President Rabinowitz with the degree of Doctor of Laws, honoris causa in November 2009.

President Rabinowitz received a juris doctor, magna cum laude, from Columbia University School of Law, where he was a member of the board of editors of the Columbia Law Review and a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar. He graduated from the City College of New York with honors, and is a member of Phi Beta Kappa and the American Law Institute.

# VICE PRESIDENT & DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

## JEFFREY A. HATHAWAY



Jeffrey A. Hathaway enters his fifth year as Vice President and Director of Athletics at Hofstra University in 2016-17. The former director of athletics at the University of Connecticut and chairman of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee was introduced by Hofstra President Stuart Rabinowitz on May 15, 2012. The ninth Director of Athletics at Hofstra, Hathaway also serves on the inaugural NCAA Council as the Colonial

Athletic Association representative and is the vice chair of the NCAA Men's Basketball Oversight Committee. Hathaway is a three-time Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year Award recipient, earning the honor in 2006-07, 2009-10 and 2014-15.

In his first year at Hofstra, Hathaway oversaw a department that produced four Colonial Athletic Association championship and NCAA Tournament teams, as well as two other teams that reached the conference championship game. In addition, Hofstra Athletics saw three student-athletes earn Academic All-America accolades and five garner CAA Scholar-Athlete of the Year (the CAA's highest academic recognition) honors. One of those Academic All-Americans, Joe Burg, also was a finalist for a Rhodes Scholarship in 2012, becoming just the second Hofstra student to ever earn the distinction. In 2013-14 Hofstra had two NCAA Tournament appearances (wrestling and softball), a regular season men's lacrosse championship, two Academic All-District selections, two CAA Players of the Year and two CAA Defensive Players of the Year. The 2014-15 year saw the volleyball, wrestling and softball programs make appearances in the NCAA Tournament, with both volleyball and softball capturing CAA titles. In addition, men's soccer and women's lacrosse were both regular season CAA champions. Five Hofstra student-athletes earned CAA Player of the Year honors and three were named CAA Scholar-Athletes in their respective sports. Hofstra once again achieved athletic and academic success in 2015-16 with four CAA regular season championships and postseason appearances from both soccer programs (NCAA Second Round), both basketball programs (NIT/WNIT) and the wrestling program (NCAA). Four student-athletes earned All-America honors, while five were named CAA Scholar-Athletes of the Year in their respective sports including Stella Schoen of the field hockey program who earned Academic All-America accolades as well.

In Hathaway's four years as vice president and director of athletics, there have been 11 teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament, seven CAA titles, seven regular season CAA titles and four other postseason appearances (College Basketball Invitational, National Invitation Tournament and Women's National Invitation Tournament). Nine new head coaches have joined the Pride staff during Hathaway's tenure including Head Men's Basketball Coach Joe Mihalich who took a team that finished in last place four years ago to the CAA regular season title, the CAA title game and an NIT appearance in 2015-16.

During Hathaway's four years more than 900 student-athletes have earned 3.0 grade point averages or better and more than 70 have posted a perfect 4.0 GPA. Hofstra has also had a tremendous amount of success in the NCAA Division I Academic Performance Program as a school-record 13 Hofstra teams had perfect 1,000 single year scores (out of the 17 teams that the University sponsors) in the latest NCAA Academic Progress Rates (APR). In the multi-year APR, which covers the 2011-12 through 2014-15 academic years, Hofstra had four programs that achieved perfect 1,000 scores.

The Hofstra Athletics Pride Club has increased fundraising during each year of his tenure. Hathaway has also overseen areas of capital improvement with the completion of the Hofstra Basketball Practice Facility in July 2014 as well as the replacement of artificial turf surfaces at James M. Shuart Stadium, the Hofstra Soccer Stadium and University Field (baseball). Hofstra student-athletes have increased their community

service efforts during Hathaway's tenure, earning a pair of awards from Hofstra's Office of Student Leadership and Activities in 2013-14 and another in 2015-16. In 2014 the athletic department unveiled an updated GoHofstra.com. In addition, Hofstra introduced a brand-new online ticketing system (HofstraTickets.com), along with an on-line donor management system to better manage donor accounts.

Hathaway was named to the NCAA Division I Leadership Council, continuing his tradition of service on the national level. He had served a five-year term as a member of the prestigious NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee, representing the Big East Conference, and was chair of the committee in 2011-12. Hathaway also served on NACDA's Executive Committee, was a board member of the Division I-A Athletic Directors Association and a member of the NCAA Division I Championships/Competition Cabinet. He served the Big East Conference in a wide range of leadership roles including as chair of the athletic directors.

Hathaway guided the Connecticut Division of Athletics through an unprecedented period of academic and athletic achievement during his eight years as director of athletics from 2003 to 2011 and as the executive associate director of athletics from 1990 to 2001. At the same time, he became an influential leader for college athletics on both the national and conference level. The Huskies would capture nine national titles during his tenures. He played a key role in the transition of the football program from Division I-AA to FBS status. Highlights of this transition included membership in The Big East Football Conference, twice winning the conference championship, the construction of a new off-campus football stadium and on-campus football complex/indoor practice facility and participation in five bowl games, including the 2011 Fiesta Bowl.

During Hathaway's career, he has always made the academic success of student-athletes a top priority. Connecticut consistently maintained a 99 percent academic retention rate among its student-athletes. The National Consortium for Academics and Sports (NCAS) saluted Connecticut three times under Hathaway's watch for its community service efforts. UConn was also honored by the NCAS in 2006 and 2007 for its efforts to assist former student-athletes in earning their college degree. At the time Hathaway left Connecticut, the athletic department had raised over \$71 million towards the University's capital campaign—more than any other single unit at the University.

Hathaway was also responsible for negotiating several key revenue and partnership agreements with IMG (over \$80 million) and NIKE (over \$46 million) while also securing major fundraising gifts.

During Hathaway's tenure at Colorado State (2001-03) he was an extremely successful fundraiser. The school drew national attention for a \$15.2 million gift for football stadium renovations and expansion. The football team won the Mountain West championship and advanced to two bowl games, while men's basketball won the conference tournament going to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 13 years, along with championships and NCAA Tournament appearances in other sports. Hathaway worked in the University of Maryland athletic department between 1982 and 1990 in a variety of administrative roles.

Hathaway earned his degree in athletic administration from Maryland in 1981. He later received a master's degree in general administration from Maryland and has completed additional graduate school courses in Connecticut's Department of Educational Leadership. He has completed executive education programs at Harvard University's Management Development Program in the Graduate School of Education and The Sports Management Institute, which is a consortium of Notre Dame, Southern California and UNC.

A graduate of DeMatha Catholic High School in Hyattsville, Maryland, Hathaway was recognized in October 2015 with the school's Distinguished Alumnus Award as well as an induction into the DeMatha Catholic Hall of Fame.

Hathaway and his wife, Paula, have two adult children – Meghan and Michael.

# ACADEMIC SUPPORT



Hofstra University is committed to the pursuit of academic and athletic excellence. The University views participation in intercollegiate athletics as benefiting the student-athlete in an educationally enhancing experience beyond any other opportunity available. Hofstra also realizes the time commitment made by student-athletes and has committed the facilities and resources to support all students.

The University Tutorial Program (UTP) provides free tutoring in every subject area to any Hofstra student. Students are able to obtain up to 1 1/2 hours of individual tutorial assistance per week for up to three courses. They are also able to utilize the various help labs on campus, which specialize in providing assistance in writing, business and QM, and biology and chemistry. In addition to this service, student-athletes are assigned an academic advisor, through the Center for University Advisement, who helps address the various needs of student-athletes. The academic advisor emphasizes four areas in their efforts to ensure the academic success of Hofstra's student-athletes.

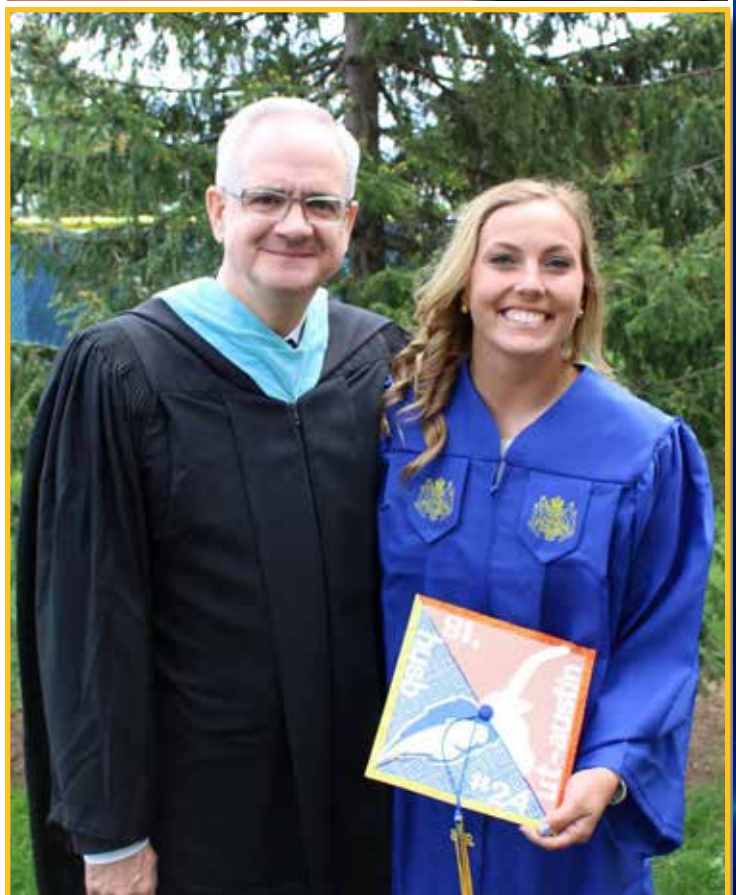
Area one is academic counseling. Services are provided in the areas of academic planning, career planning, personal counseling, and campus and community referrals. The advisor also meets with prospective student-athletes, at the coach's request, to share the many benefits of a Hofstra University education.

Area two is academic advising. The academic advisor serves as the primary advisor for first-year and undecided student-athletes, and also assists upperclassmen who have declared a major.

Area three is academic monitoring. The advisor monitors the academic progress of student-athletes to ensure compliance with Hofstra University, NCAA and conference regulations. The advisor's regular communication with the faculty and coaches provide opportunities for early intervention should academic difficulties arise.

Area four is study halls. The University Tutorial Program supports athletic study halls by providing tutors in various subjects as necessary. The academic advisors also assess the needs of individual student-athletes to provide the most effective study environment. The assessment tool administered by the Center for University Advisement is also used to provide various enrichment seminars for the student-athletes such as time management, writing skills, campus resources, and surviving the college transition.

In 2010 The Fried Family Student-Athlete Development Center was opened on the second level of James C. Metzger Hall. The center houses the offices of the academic advisors as well as the student-athlete services staff. A large computer lab with printer access for use by Hofstra student-athletes, a quiet study area with wireless internet access and two group study/tutor rooms with power point access and white boards are also available.



# ATHLETIC TRAINING



Through a comprehensive athletic training program, Hofstra University student-athletes are provided excellent health care during their time at the University. A coordinated effort between the University Health and Wellness Center, the Athletic Department and outside health care providers ensures every student-athlete the best medical attention possible.

University student-athletes have direct access to a myriad of health care services. Managing the coverage of every practice and competition event is Hofstra University's Athletic Training staff, which is led by Head Athletic Trainer Evan Malings and features six full-time athletic trainers and numerous student athletic trainers. The athletic trainers provide injury management, rehabilitation and treatment to the entire Athletic program. Utilizing three state-of-the-art athletic training rooms, these professionals work tirelessly to ensure the safe participation of Hofstra's student-athletes and to return injured athletes to play quickly and safely.

Supporting the athletic trainers is team physician Dr. Brian Daniels and team orthopedist Dr. Michael Schwartz and their team at Pro Health Care, Inc. Physical therapists Roger Gerland and Brian Krebs of STARS of North Shore-LIJ Health System also aid in Hofstra's student-athlete care.

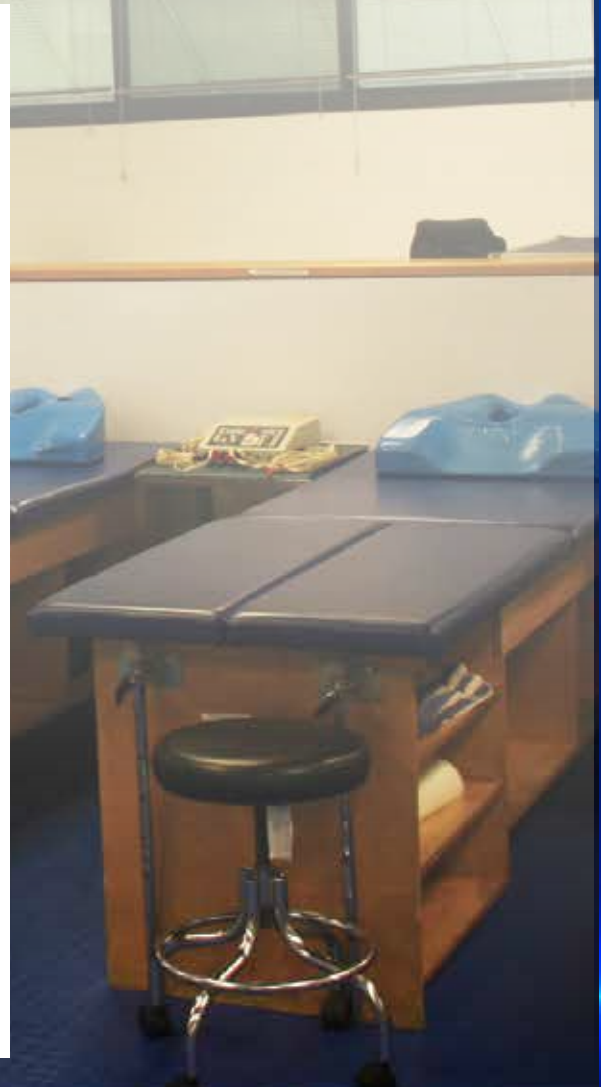

## ***BILL EDWARDS STADIUM***

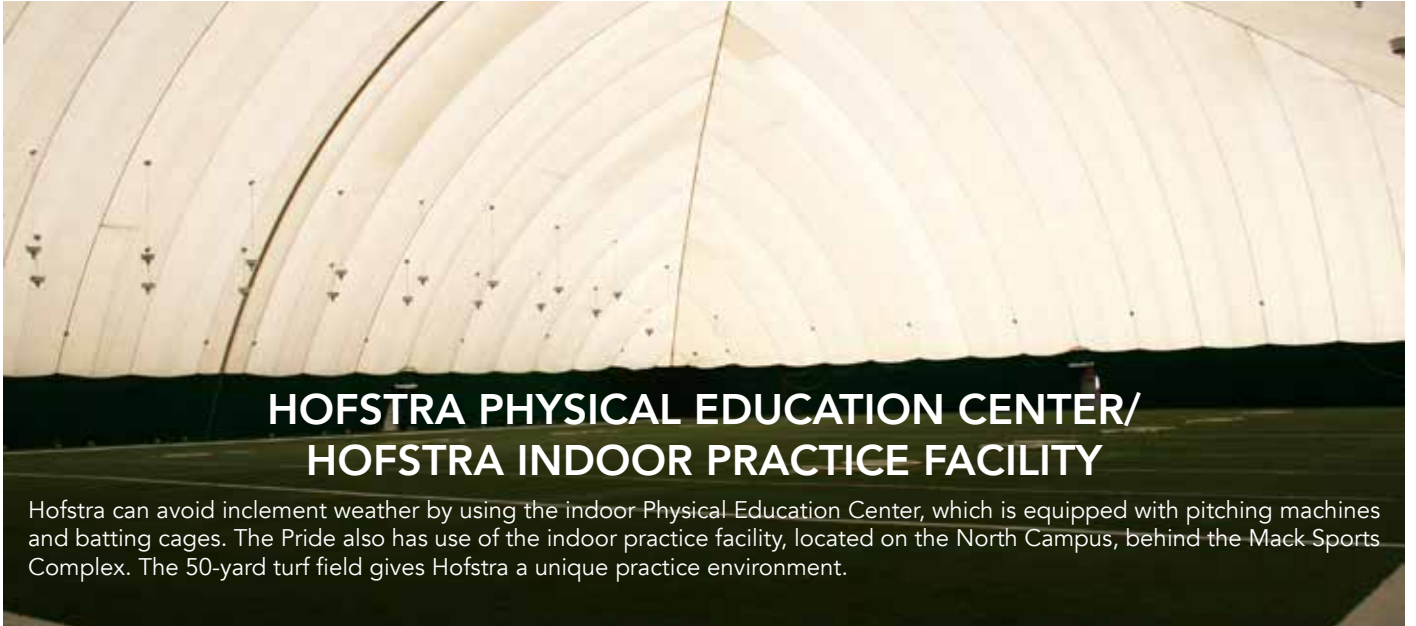
The Hofstra University Pride plays and practices at Bill Edwards Stadium, located on the North Campus of Hofstra University. Renamed for Hall of Fame Coach Bill Edwards in 2015, the stadium is located next to the David S. Mack Sports and Exhibition Complex and across from the Hofstra Fitness Center. Since the Stadium opened, the Pride has a 331-64 record at home, including 140-18 against CAA opponents.

The Stadium, constructed in 2000, provides a fine setting for collegiate softball action. Construction included sunken dugouts, outfield sod, a press box on top of the bleachers behind home plate, batting cages next to the dugouts with a bullpen area. Bleacher seating behind home plate, from dugout to dugout, accommodates nearly 1,000 spectators. Field dimensions are 190 feet down the lines and 220 feet to centerfield. Banners commemorating Hofstra's team achievements are displayed on the outfield fences, while plaques mounted to the facade of the Stadium showcase individual awards won by Hofstra Softball players.

In 2011 lights were installed in the Stadium, which will allow for NCAA Regionals to return to campus and provide greater flexibility in scheduling during the regular season.

Bill Edwards Stadium has hosted 11 Colonial Athletic Association Championships, as well as NCAA Regionals in 2006, 2007 and 2008. It is also the site of the Catholic League High School Softball Championship and other high school events. One of the finest softball facilities in the metropolitan area, Hofstra's Bill Edwards Stadium was also home to the New York Juggernaut of the National Pro Fastpitch League in the summer of 2005.

# SOFTBALL FACILITIES



## HOFSTRA PHYSICAL EDUCATION CENTER/ HOFSTRA INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY

Hofstra can avoid inclement weather by using the indoor Physical Education Center, which is equipped with pitching machines and batting cages. The Pride also has use of the indoor practice facility, located on the North Campus, behind the Mack Sports Complex. The 50-yard turf field gives Hofstra a unique practice environment.

## MACK SPORTS COMPLEX WEIGHT ROOM

The team also has the use of a state-of-the-art weight training facility. Located in the Mack Sports Complex, the weight room is outfitted with the most advanced strength training and cardiovascular equipment available.

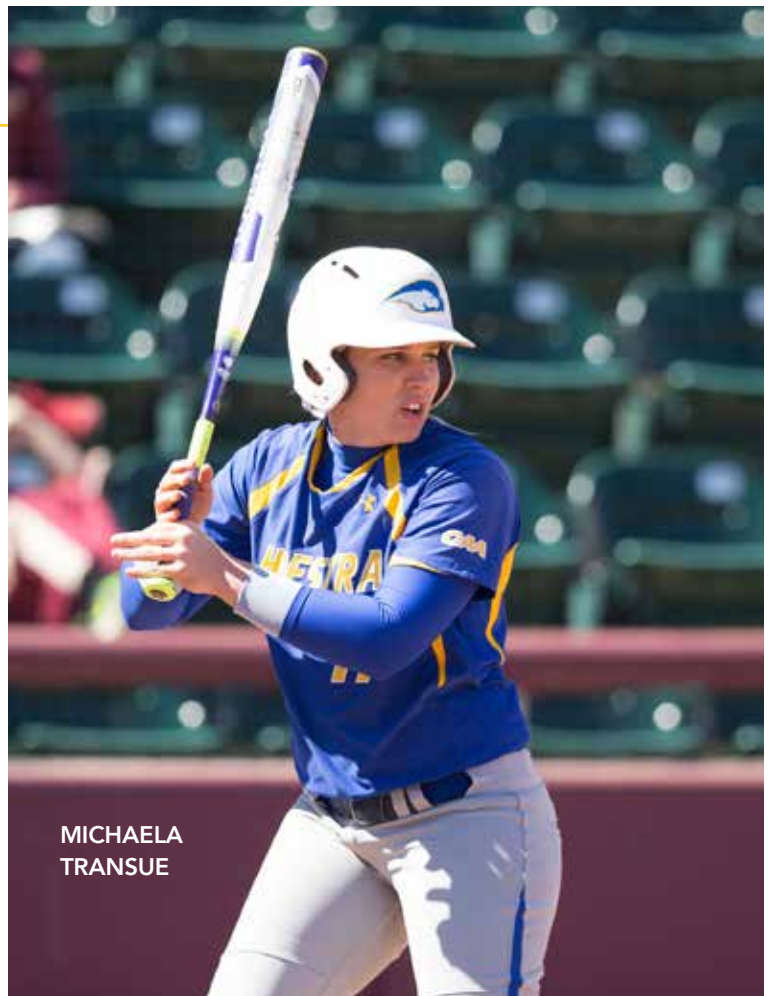

# THE COLONIAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

The Colonial Athletic Association has established itself as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences both athletically and academically for more than 30 years.

The CAA encompasses many of the nation's largest metropolitan areas with a geographic footprint that stretches from Boston to Charleston, S.C. The conference has produced 15 national team champions in four different sports, 33 individual national champions, 13 national players of the year, 12 national coaches of the year and 13 Honda Award winners. Just as impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 24 NCAA post-graduate scholars. In 2015-16, more than 2,000 of the league's 4,000 student-athletes received the Commissioner's Academic Award after posting at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport. The conference had 37 teams in 20 different sports receive NCAA Public Recognition Awards based on the latest Academic Progress Report released in 2016.

The landscape of the conference stretches along the majority of the East Coast, and includes several of the nation's top media markets – New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Boston (7), Washington, D.C. (8) and Baltimore (27). The number of television homes in the CAA market exceeds 19 million.

The CAA conducts championships in 22 sports. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis and track & field. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. In 2015-16, 25 teams earned NCAA Tournament berths and 40 student-athletes received All-America honors in 12 different sports.

The conference has made its presence known nationally in men's basketball with two teams – George Mason (2006) and VCU (2011) – advancing to the NCAA Final Four over the past 11 years. CAA teams have combined to win 43 games in postseason play since 2006, including 14 victories in the NCAA Tournament. The CAA has posted at least one NCAA Tournament win in six of the past 11 years. The conference has had five or more teams compete in postseason play in five of the last eight seasons.

In women's basketball, CAA champion James Madison made its fifth trip to the NCAA Tournament in the last seven years and recorded its 11th consecutive postseason appearance. In 2013, Delaware became the 12th CAA team to reach the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament

and Drexel captured the WNIT championship with a 46-43 victory over Utah. CAA teams have recorded 26 victories in postseason play over the past five years.

The conference also excels in many other sports. Four CAA women's soccer teams received NCAA berths for the first time in league history last season and three of them advanced to the second round. The CAA sent multiple teams to the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship for the sixth straight year and each current member of the conference has reached the NCAA Tournament since 2006. James Madison received a #7 national seed in the 2016 NCAA Softball Championship and became the second team in conference history to advance to the Super Regionals, joining Hofstra in 2012. In baseball, UNCW and William & Mary received NCAA berths last season and both advanced to the finals of their respective NCAA Regionals, with the Tribe knocking off defending national champion Virginia. College of Charleston's baseball team reached the NCAA Super Regionals in 2014. William & Mary sophomore Regan Rome earned All-America accolades in cross country and track and field a year ago. Delaware and Towson have each reached the Final Four of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship and the Tigers advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals in 2016 after upsetting defending national champion Denver. For the first time in conference history, two CAA men's golfers – CofC's Will Rainey and JMU's Ryan Cole – advanced to the NCAA Men's Golf Championship. Two CAA teams competed in the NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championship for the first time since 2010 as Towson and James Madison received berths. CAA squads have combined to win 10 field hockey national titles since the championship began in 1981. The conference has had at least 11 players selected in 12 of the last 14 Major League Baseball drafts.

CAA member institutions are committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a goal of expanding their partnership to all aspects of university education and life outside of intercollegiate athletics. The Alliance has enabled hundreds of students to showcase their research in the annual Undergraduate Research Conference and Journal, facilitated leadership exchanges to promote professional development, developed an academic resource sharing program to support student athletes, and created opportunities for institutions to partner on a wide range of initiatives that enhance student success.

CAA schools are also very active in community service projects. The CAA Blood Challenge,

which is held each fall, has raised more than 43,000 units of blood over the past 14 years. The CAA Food Drive Challenge, which is held each spring, has resulted in over 22,000 pounds of donated food and \$11,000 in cash contributions in only three years.

On July 1, 2016, Joseph D'Antonio began his tenure as only the second Commissioner in the history of the CAA. He replaced Thomas E. Yeager, who guided the CAA since its inception in 1985.

The conference traces its roots back to 1983 when two of its current members - James Madison University and the College of William and Mary - were aligned with East Carolina University, George Mason University, the United States Naval Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11 sports, acquired two new members (the University of North Carolina at Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new conference. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985.

Old Dominion University joined the CAA in 1991 and was followed by Virginia Commonwealth University in 1995. The conference added the University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Georgia State University and Northeastern University became members of the conference in 2005. College of Charleston began its first year as a CAA member in 2013 and Elon University joined the conference on July 1, 2014.

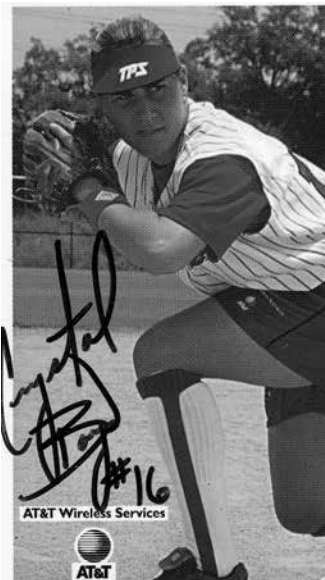
# HOFSTRA PROFESSIONAL AND OLYMPIC TEAM PLAYERS

# HOFSTRA IN THE COMMUNITY



The Hofstra Softball program is extremely active in the Long Island community, lending itself to a variety of charitable and educational causes.

The team has raised money for and participated in the American Cancer Society's Walk for a Cure at Jones Beach. Hofstra also hosts a Think Pink Day and wears pink jerseys in support of breast cancer research.

The team also supports the HEADstrong Foundation, which was founded by former Pride lacrosse player Nick Colleluori. Nick was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma and created the foundation to help raise awareness before he passed away.

During the Holiday season the team participates in Operation Christmas Child, a program that provides gifts to needy children and families. The team is also involved with the Big Brother/Big Sister program and the Long Island Special Olympics. The team holds clinics to teach the game and to spend time with each group.

The team and coaching staff are frequent volunteers at the Glen Cove (NY) Child Daycare Center, spending time with the children and assisting the staff. The softball team takes part in a project that puts together care packages full of toys, Holiday presents, clothing and a variety of other items, which were all donated to the Center.

The Pride also takes part in numerous reading day activities at local elementary schools. Several times each year, Pride players and coaches speak at schools and softball clinics as well.

The team has worked with the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation in the past and also assisted 2013 graduate Olivia Galati in hosting a charity softball game for Carissa Crossan, a 13-year old Long Island softball player who was diagnosed with Ewing's Sarcoma. The sold-out game was held at Hofstra and raised more than \$7,600 to help with Carissa's medical expenses.

Working with various youth softball leagues on Long Island, the team hosts many groups throughout the season. Teams are invited onto the field during introductions and join the team for the National Anthem.

The Pride takes part in the Shake-A-Rake Program, going out into the local community to rake leaves for elderly and disabled people. The program also participates in numerous projects organized by Hofstra's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).
