### SCOUTING THE PRIDE

Hempstead, NY – The Hofstra Field Hockey team will head to New Jersey for the Labor Day weekend as the Pride hit the road for games at Rutgers

University at the Bauer Track and Field Complex on Friday, August 31 at 1 p.m. and at Monmouth University at So Sweet A Cat Field on Sunday, September 2 at 1 p.m.

Rutgers will provide live video via the <u>Big Ten Network (BTN)</u> Plus as well as live stats through <u>Sidearm</u>. Monmouth will only provide live stats which can be accessed through <u>HofstraStats.com</u>.

Hofstra is coming off a 1-1 weekend at the UMass Lowell River Hawk Classic last weekend. The Pride defeated VCU in the semifinals, 3-2 in a shootout after 70 minutes of regulation and two 10-minute overtime periods. Sophomore Hannah Zemaitis and freshman Cami Larsson scored the regulation goals for Hofstra-both in the second half-and Larsson tallied the deciding goal in the seventh round of the shootout. Freshman goalie Betty Bosma recorded 16 saves in the game and allowed only two goals in the seven rounds of the shootout.

In the tournament championship contest last Sunday, the host River Hawks topped the Pride, 6-0 for the title. Bosma stopped eight shots in the Hofstra goal.

Rutgers enters the Hofstra game with a 1-0 record following their 3-0 win over Richmond last Sunday. The Pride and the Scarlet Knights will be meeting for the 17<sup>th</sup> time on Friday with Rutgers holding a 14-2 series advantage. This is the first meeting between the two programs since 2003 when the Pride recorded a 2-0 win.

Monmouth is 1-1 on the season with a 5-1 loss at 18<sup>th</sup>-ranked Saint Joseph's last Friday and a 3-2 overtime victory over Ohio last Sunday. Hofstra and Monmouth will be meeting for the eighth time on Sunday with the Pride holding a 6-1 series lead. The two teams met last year on Long Island with the 25<sup>th</sup>-ranked Hawks posting a 3-0 victory.

### **SEASON NUMBER**

- The 2018 season marks the 78th season of field hockey at Hofstra University. The current all-time record <u>heading into</u> the 2018 season is 409-408-33.
- The field hockey program was founded in 1936.

### HOFSTRA HEAD FIELD HOCKEY COACH KATHY DE ANGELIS

- Is in her 21st season at Hofstra University.
- In her 20+ seasons at Hofstra, De Angelis has compiled a current mark of 196-197 coaching record including a stretch of six straight winning seasons (2001 through 2006) for the first time at the Division I level and just the second time since 1947 to 1952.
- She has directed the Pride to winning records in 11 of the past 17 seasons.
- During her tenure at Hofstra, De Angelis has coached four All-Americans (totaling six selections), 14 regional All-Americans (totaling 34 selections), 27 all-conference players (44 selections), 23 all-conference rookie team selections and 77 National Field Hockey Coaches Association National Academic Squad Athletes (202 selections).
- Was head coach at La Salle from 1992 to 1995 and Southwest Missouri State in 1996 and 1997
- Has been involved with the US National Field Hockey coaching staff since 1988.
- Is a 1992 graduate of Massachusetts where she was a three-time All-American
- UMass was 60-20-8 with four Atlantic 10 titles and four NCAA

Championship appearances, including a Final Four berth in 1987, while she was a student-athlete

- Was a finalist for the Honda Broderick Award as National Player of the Year as a senior
- Was a member of the US Field Hockey National U21 team in 1987 and 1988, the US National Reserve Team in 1988 and 1989 and the US National Elite Team in 1990 and 1991.

#### **HOFSTRA ASSISTANT COACHES**

- Hofstra Associate Head Coach Courtney Veinotte (Vee-No) is in her second season as associate head coach of the Hofstra Pride. She previously served as an assistant coach at the University of Maine from 2011 through 2016 including the last two as associate head coach. She was a four-year letterwinner at Maine from 2007 through 2011 and played in 70 games with 62 starts.
- Hofstra Assistant Coach Kara Velez joins the Pride staff in 2018 after serving as head coach at Siena College from 2012 through 2017. Prior to taking over at Siena, Velez served as an assistant coach at Fairfield University from July 2007 through May 2012. As a student-athlete, Velez was a four-year member of the University of Iowa Field Hockey program that won 46 games from 2003 through 2007. She served as the Hawkeyes' team captain in 2006 and was part of NCAA Tournament teams in 2004 and 2006, a Big Ten Tournament championship team in 2006 and a Big Ten regular season championship squad in 2004.

### 2018 PRESEASON ALL-CAA FIELD HOCKEY TEAM

Hofstra senior <u>Madison Sauve</u> was named to the 2018 Preseason All-Colonial Athletic Association Field Hockey Team.

Sauve, a forward from Boiling Springs, Pennsylvania, is a twoyear starter after earning starting roles in 2016 and 2017. Last year, she played in all 19 games and led the team with 10 goals and 24 points. Sauve scored twice in games against Quinnipiac, Siena and Towson and tallied the game-winning goal against Sacred Heart and Rider. She was a National Field Hockey Coaches Association National Academic Squad member and a CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll recipient.

### 2018 PRESEASON CAA COACHES POLL

The CAA also announced the 2018 CAA Field Hockey Preseason Poll, as voted upon by the league's seven head coaches. The five-time defending champion, Blue Hens of Delaware were the coaches' top pick to repeat in 2018. Delaware received 33 points including four first-place votes. The Dukes of James Madison were on the heels of UD with 31 points and two first-place

votes. The Tribe of William and Mary were on the heels of JMU in third-place with 29 points and one first-place vote.

The Huskies of Northeastern were selected to place fourth with 18 points with the Dragons of Drexel placing fifth with 17 points, the Pride of Hofstra sixth with 12 points and the Tigers of Towson with seven points rounding out the poll in seventh.
