## HEAD COACH ADRIENNE CLARK



Adrienne Clark was named the head coach of the Hofstra Softball program in July 2021.

Clark has extensive coaching experience having coached at five different NCAA Division I institutions during her 16-year coaching career.

Most recently, Clark was an assistant coach at Purdue

University for the last two seasons. Clark helped the Boilermakers to 33 wins while on staff in West Lafayette, Indiana. She oversaw and directed the team's defensive strategies and helped facilitate all operations of the program.

Prior to that, Clark spent five seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Connecticut. With Clark on staff with the Huskies, UConn increased its win total from the previous year in four of her five seasons and had nine different honorees on postseason American Athletic Conference teams. Clark served as Connecticut's head pitching and catching coach during her tenure in Storrs.

Clark previously spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Hofstra from 2012 to 2014. During that time, the Pride advanced to the NCAA Tournament in all three seasons, including as Colonial Athletic Association Champions in 2012 and 2013. The 2012 team is most remembered for its remarkable run to the NCAA Super Regionals, winning 42 games and capturing the NCAA Los Angeles Regional along the way.

Clark got her coaching career started at the University of Delaware, where she spent four seasons (2006 to 2009). She oversaw all pitching development and helped guide three players to All-CAA honors and the staff to the lowest earned run average in the league in 2006. She then made the move to Columbia University in New York, New York, where she spent two seasons. Nine players under her tutelage garnered All-Ivy League accolades and she also served as an associate professor of physical education.

An exceptional two-way player during her playing career, Clark's name is littered throughout the Hofstra record books as she is seventh in pitching appearances (97), eighth in earned run average (1.77), eighth in innings pitched (407.2), ninth in wins (39), and ninth in strikeouts (260). Clark also totaled 71 hits during her stellar career, including a 2004 campaign in which she ranked second on the team with a .305 batting average.



The 2003 Hofstra softball team captured a pair of wins in the NCAA Tournament, marking the first time that the Pride had ever picked up two wins in NCAA Tournament play. The exceptional 2004 season would see Hofstra win four games in NCAA Tournament play and fall one win shy of advancing to the WCWS. The Pride won games against #12 Auburn and #7 Stanford at the NCAA Regional, with the win over Stanford marking the second-highest ranked opponent the program had ever defeated to that point.

Clark also trained with the United States Bobsled & Skeleton Federation for three years (2011-14) as she attempted to qualify for the Olympic Games as a skeleton athlete.

Clark earned her Bachelor of Business Administration degree, majoring in marketing, from Hofstra in 2005. She received her Master of Science in sports management from Columbia.



## ASSISTANT COACH KRYSTYN SANDBERG



Kristyn Sandberg joined the Hofstra softball staff as an assistant coach in September 2021.

Sandberg brings a wealth of experience across several levels of softball to Hofstra, having coached at the high school and college level, while also playing professionally in the National Pro Fastpitch league. Selected

fifth overall in the 2012 NPF Draft by the USSSA Pride, Sandberg played for the Pride from 2012-14, Pennsylvania Rebellion from 2015-16, Texas Charge in 2017, and Chicago Bandits from 2018-19.

A two-time NPF Champion, Sandberg appeared in over 300 games in the NPF and was a consistent threat throughout her career as she recorded over 45 home runs and tallied 150 RBI. For her efforts, Sandberg collected several awards from the league including NPF/Miken Rookie of the Year accolades in 2012, All-NPF honors in 2015 and 2018, was a Rawlings Gold Glove Finalist in 2017, and most recently, earned an NPF All-Decade Team distinction.

Sandberg, a local native of Island Park, New York, spent her undergraduate career at the University of Georgia and was named a second-team NFCA All-American after garnering first-team All-Region honors. She played a key role in leading the Bulldogs to the Women's College World Series in 2009 and 2010 while earning SEC All-Freshmen Team honors in 2009 and First Team All-SEC recognition in 2012. Sandberg completed her collegiate playing career ranked in the top-10 in several offensive categories, including home runs (fourth), slugging percentage (sixth) and walks (fifth).

Having spent time at Louisiana State University as a graduate assistant and Syracuse University as an assistant coach, she brings several years of collegiate coaching experience to Hempstead. Sandberg spent three seasons on the LSU staff, including the Tigers 2015 run to the Women's College World Series. At Syracuse, Sandberg worked specifically with catchers and outfielders, was the assistant hitting coach, and helped the Orange achieve several single-season program records including fielding percentage, batting average, hits, and on-base percentage. Under her tutelage, six players garnered NFCA All-Region honors, while in 2017, Sandberg mentored an NFCA third team All-American and USA Player of the Year Top-10 finalist in Sydney O'Hara.



Sandberg most recently made a stop as the head varsity softball coach at nearby Sacred Heart Academy in Hempstead. Ranked #17 in New York State, Sandberg guided seven All-Catholic League selections, two All-State honorees, two All-Long Island Selections, while six players were featured on Newsday's Top-100 players from Long Island.

A standout student and member of the community, Sandberg was a four-time SEC Academic Honor Roll member and was named to the 2012 SEC Community Service Team. She received CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Second team honors and was a member of the National Society of Collegiate Scholars. Sandberg earned her undergraduate degree in health and physical education in December 2012 and her master's degree in kinesiology from LSU in 2015.

## ASSISTANT COACH ASHLEY WEINGARTZ



Ashley Weingartz joined the Hofstra softball staff as an assistant coach in September 2021.

Weingartz arrived at Hofstra following a stint as the graduate assistant manager at the University of South Carolina, where she assisted in all aspects of the top-25 Gamecock program.

While at South Carolina, Weingartz served as the assistant to the pitching coach during bullpen sessions and developed scouting reports for opposing teams through video and statistical analysis.

Weingartz, a North Carolina native, played a successful four-year softball career at East Carolina University where she was coached by four-time NCAA regional participating and Hofstra alumna, Courtney Oliver '08.

Primarily an outfielder at East Carolina, Weingartz appeared in 134 games and tallied 73 hits, 30 RBI, 29 runs scored, and 37 walks. In addition, she served as the softball representative for the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and was the founder of the Student-Athlete Pen Pal program (SAPP) which provided more than 50 fifth graders student-athlete pen pals throughout the year.

Outside of the collegiate realm, Weingartz served as head coach for the Irmo Bombers 12U team, was the lead catching instructor for the Trenholm Little League Pitching and Catching Camp, and was an instructor as the Jen Schroeder Catching Retreat and Next Level Training Center.

Weingartz is heavily involved with Little League as well, as she serves as a host committee member, social media, and intern coordinator for the Little League Softball series. She planned and implemented a year-round social media strategy for Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram for the Little League Softball World Series and managed the entire recruitment and hiring process for a team of as many as five interns.

Her work with the Little League organization did not stop there, however, as Weingartz spent the summer of 2017 in Williamsport, Pa. as a Marketing Intern for Little League International, working full-time in the sponsorship, marketing, and licensing departments.

Weingartz graduated summa cum laude from East Carolina in May 2019 with a Bachelor's Degree in Sports Studies. She earned her Master's Degree in Sport and Entertainment Management from the University of South Carolina in May 2021.

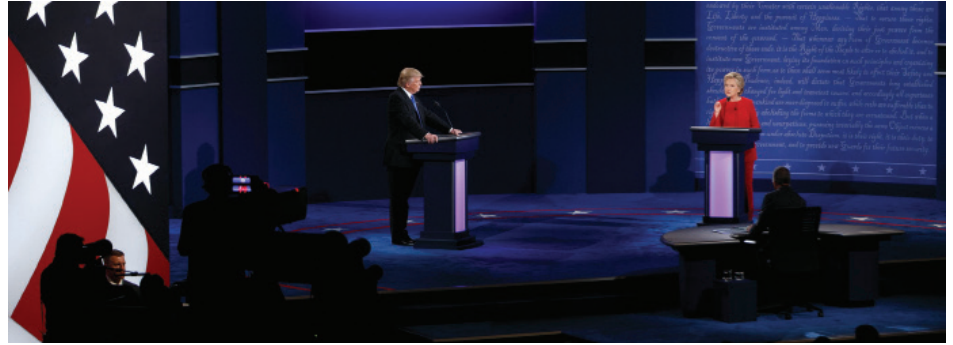

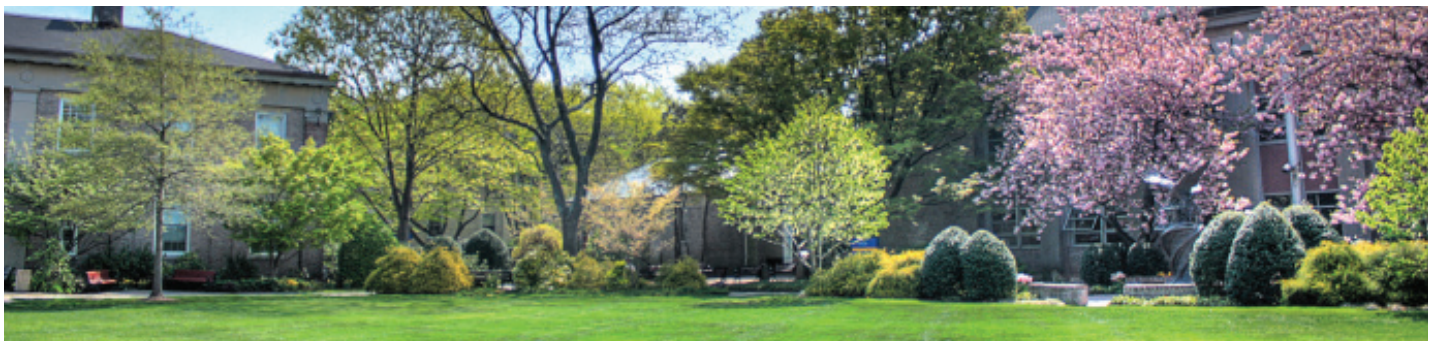

## SOFTBALL FACILITIES



### **BILL EDWARDS STADIUM**

The Hofstra University Pride plays and practices at Bill Edwards Stadium, located on the North Campus of Hofstra University. Renamed for Hall of Fame Coach Bill Edwards in 2015, the stadium is located next to the David S. Mack Sports and Exhibition Complex and across from the Hofstra Fitness Center. Since the Stadium opened, the Pride has a 363-85 record at home, including 156-35 against CAA opponents.

The Stadium, constructed in 2000, provides a fine setting for collegiate softball action. Construction included sunken dugouts, outfield sod, a press box on top of the bleachers behind home plate, and a bullpen area. Bleacher seating behind home plate, from dugout to dugout, accommodates nearly 1,000 spectators. Field dimensions are 190 feet down the lines and 220 feet to centerfield. Banners commemorating Hofstra's team achievements are displayed on the outfield fences, while plaques mounted to the facade of the Stadium showcase individual awards won by Hofstra Softball players.

In 2011 lights were installed in the Stadium, which will allow for NCAA Regionals to return to campus and provide greater flexibility in scheduling during the regular season. In 2018 new batting cages were installed, adjacent to the field behind home plate.

Bill Edwards Stadium has hosted 11 Colonial Athletic Association Championships, as well as NCAA Regionals in 2006, 2007 and 2008. It is also the site of the Catholic League High School Softball Championship and other high school events. One of the finest softball facilities in the metropolitan area, Hofstra's Bill Edwards Stadium was also home to the New York Juggernaut of the National Pro Fastpitch League in the summer of 2005.

## MACK SPORTS COMPLEX WEIGHT ROOM

The team also has the use of a state-of-the-art weight training facility. Located in the Mack Sports Complex, the weight room is outfitted with the most advanced strength training and cardiovascular equipment available.



## HOFSTRA PHYSICAL EDUCATION CENTER/ HOFSTRA INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY

Hofstra can avoid inclement weather by using the indoor Physical Education Center, which is equipped with pitching machines and batting cages. The Pride also has use of the indoor practice facility, located on the North Campus, behind the Mack Sports Complex. The 50-yard turf field gives Hofstra a unique practice environment.

# HOFSTRA'S PRO AND OLYMPIC PLAYERS

The Pride has produced several players that went on to pursue careers in professional softball or with their national team. Former All-American Crystal Boyd was the first Hofstra player to play pro ball in the United States as a member of the WPSL's Georgia Pride from 1997 to 1999. Standout pitchers Stacy Jackson and Erin Phillips fulfilled their professional aspirations overseas, as

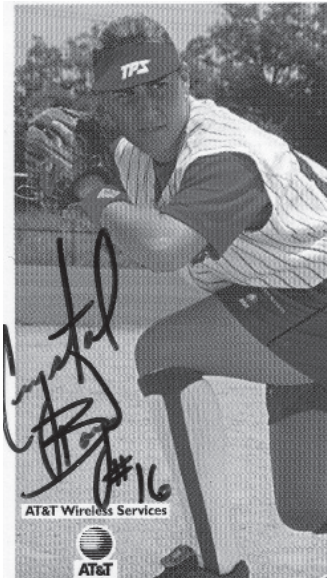
Jackson played in Italy and Phillips in Holland.

All-American Alicia Smith and all-star Jen Smith were draft selections in the National Pro Fastpitch league and played for the New York/New Jersey Juggernaut franchise.

Danielle Stewart returned to her native Australia following graduation

and was a member of the Australian National Team that won the bronze medal at the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing, China.

All-American Olivia Galati has played for the New York/New Jersey Comets and the USSSA Pride. She was the second overall pick in the 2013 NPF Draft and won a championship with the Pride in 2014.

## HOFSTRA IN THE COMMUNITY

The Hofstra Softball program is extremely active in the Long Island community, lending itself to a variety of charitable and educational causes.

The past two years, the team has played a wheelchair softball game with the Wheelchair Sports Federation. The team also competed in a beep softball game against the Long Island Bombers, a visually impaired team. The



opportunities helped the Pride learn more about adaptive sports as well as supporting the ongoing mission of helping people with disabilities realize they can lead a better life through sports.
