I extend my congratulations to our six honorees on their inductions to the Hofstra Athletics Hall of Fame. # KIMBERLY HILLIER

A women's lacrosse student-athlete from 2004 to 2007, Kimberly Hillier is one of only four two-time All-Americans in team history. She was an Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association Second Team All-American in 2006 and a third team selection in 2007 after leading the Pride to its second-ever NCAA Championship appearance.

Hillier was also a four-time all-region selection. In addition, she was the first Hofstra student-athlete in the Pride's CAA history to be named All-CAA First Team in all four years. Hillier was also the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year and a member of the CAA Silver Anniversary Team. In 2007 she was a recipient of the All-American Strength and Conditioning Athlete of the Year Award

She led Hofstra in scoring in three of her four seasons. Her best season came in 2006 when she scored 48 goals and added 25 assists for 73 points. She followed that with a 30-goal, 22-assist season as a senior and also recorded 100 draw controls over her final two seasons. Hillier currently ranks fourth all-time at Hofstra in points (215), tied for third in assists (82), fifth in goals (133), ninth in ground balls (120), and seventh in draw controls (143). During her tenure at Hofstra, she was a member of the U.S. National Team.



Following graduation, Hillier embarked on a coaching career with stops at LIU Brooklyn, Stony Brook, Boston University, and Drexel. She now serves as a private trainer, coach, and mentor through her company, Kim Hillier Lacrosse.


A native of Farmingdale, New York, Hillier was a two-time All-America selection at Farmingdale High School and helped her team to the Nassau County and Long Island championships and a spot in the New York state finals in 2002.

# ROBERT F. McKEON

Robert F. McKeon, a 1953 Hofstra graduate, is chairman emeritus of Kemark Financial Services Inc., a firm he co-founded in the early 1990s that is a recognized leader in the financial services industry. The company and its subsidiaries have developed an array of commercial insurance products and specialty services for this industry over these many years.

After attending Hofstra following military service in the United States Marine Corps, he began a career in the insurance industry with the international brokerage firm of Johnson & Higgins, where he served as vice president until 1974. Prior to organizing Kemark Financial Services Inc., he was senior vice president at Fred S. James & Company, a large multinational insurance brokerage firm.

McKeon was among the recipients of Hofstra University's 2002 Award for Alumni Achievement and was an honorary degree recipient in 2010. In 2005 he was a recipient of the the Joseph M. Margiotta Award, which is given by the Department of Athletics in recognition of extraordinary dedication, generosity, and service to the Hofstra Athletics Pride Club and Hofstra Athletics, and in 2012 he was the recipient of the Jack Lenz Memorial Lifetime Achievement Award.



McKeon and his wife, Cathy, both active philanthropists, have been ardent supporters of the Pride for decades and have been leaders in numerous capital campaigns. The couple, along with business partner Mark Wei, also established an endowed athletic scholarship in 2003 which is presented each year to a student-athlete selected on the basis of academic achievement and/or financial need.


McKeon has five children, 13 grandchildren, and five great grandchildren.

# MIKE MILLER

A baseball student-athlete from 1992 through 1995, Mike Miller batted in the heart of the order for some of Hofstra's best offensive teams. The Diamond Conference Most Valuable Player in 1994, Miller ranks first all-time at Hofstra in career home runs (38) and runs (167), second in career triples (9), and third in career RBIs (161). He recorded 180 career hits and ranks seventh all-time with a .369 career batting average.

During his senior campaign, Miller blasted a school-record 20 home runs and drove in 57 runs for the second consecutive season. He batted .411 that season, ranking 23rd in the nation, and finished second in slugging percentage (.911) and eighth in home runs. As a junior, Miller led the nation in RBIs and runs per game at 1.58. A two-time All-Diamond Conference and All-ECAC selection, Miller was an All-East Coast Conference performer in 1994, and an All-North Atlantic Conference pick in 1995. He was also a New York State All-Star.

Miller was selected by the Detroit Tigers in the 29th round of the 1995 Major League Baseball Draft and spent three seasons in the minor leagues. He led the New York Penn League in on-base percentage in 1995 at .431. In 1996 he finished second in the Northeast League in batting at .355 and was the runner-up in League Most Valuable Player voting. Following his professional career, Miller returned to Long Island to teach and coach at the scholastic level, and currently serves as an elementary school



physical education teacher in the Smithtown Central School District.

As a scholastic player, Miller was a four-sport athlete at Smithtown East High School, competing in baseball, football, basketball, and volleyball, and was the senior athlete of the year. He was an All-Suffolk County and all-league selection in baseball and football. He was a 2015 inductee into the Smithtown Hall of Fame.

Miller has one son, Bryce (8), and a brother, John.

# MICHAEL TODD

A men's soccer student-athlete from 2003 to 2006, Michael Todd helped lead Hofstra to three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances during his tenure. He was a United Soccer Coaches Second Team All-American as a senior and also earned CAA Player of the Year after tallying 13 goals and five assists for 31 points. He ranked 15th in the nation in points per game (1.72) and 14th in goals per game (0.72) in 2006. In 2010 Todd saw his #9 jersey retired.

Todd was a four-time All-CAA selection, a three-time all-region pick, and a two-time CAA Championship Most Outstanding Player Award recipient. He helped Hofstra to its first-ever NCAA Tournament win in 2004 with a goal in a 2-1 victory over Seton Hall. Named to the CAA Silver Anniversary Team, Todd ranks second in career points (101), third in goals (40), and fifth in assists (21) at Hofstra.

He also excelled in the classroom as a two-time College Sports Communicators Academic All-American, a National Soccer Coaches Association Academic All-Region selection, and the 2004 CAA Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Todd was selected with the third pick in the second round of the 2007 MLS Supplemental Draft by the Kansas City Wizards (now Sporting Kansas City), but did not sign a contract with the club. He would eventually sign for the Charleston Battery of the USL A-League and played in 15 games for the club. He then joined the Baltimore Blast of the Major Indoor Soccer League for the 2007-08 season, where he



scored six goals and eight assists and helped the Blast to a MISL championship.

Todd moved back to Long Island to play for the Long Island Rough Riders, where he played for three seasons before moving into the youth coaching circuit. After working as the Coaching Director for Locust Valley Soccer Club, Todd and several other area coaches formed Gold Coast FC in 2012. Today, Gold Coast FC operates numerous youth teams along the North Shore of Long Island.

Todd and his wife, Mary, have three children - Isabella, Tristan, and Everleigh.

# KELSIE WILLS

A volleyball student-athlete from 2011 to 2014, Kelsie Wills is one of two All-Americans in program history. She was named an AVCA All-American to cap off a tremendous senior season that also saw her claim CAA Player of the Year honors after leading the conference and ranking 25th in the nation with 506 kills. Wills helped Hofstra to a CAA championship and an NCAA Tournament appearance for the second time in her storied career that season, matching the Pride's 2012 accomplishments.

A three-time All-CAA First Team honoree and CAA All-Rookie selection in 2011, Wills ranks first all-time at Hofstra and third all-time in CAA history in kills with 1,942. She is the only player in program history to record three 500-kill seasons and also stands 14th all-time at Hofstra in digs with 1,226. Wills was the 2012 CAA Volleyball Championship Most Outstanding Player and was a member of the All-CAA Championship Team in 2014.

During her Hofstra tenure, Wills helped the Pride to 80 victories including 28 during her senior campaign. The 28 wins were the sixth-most in program history and the most since 1989.

Following graduation, Wills played professionally in Paris. She also represented her native New Zealand in beach volleyball, with partner Shaunna Polley,



at the 2018 Commonwealth Games. They were the nation's first women's beach volleyball team to compete at the Games. The pair also won a bronze medal at the Ulsan Open in South Korea on the 2017 FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour.

Wills left volleyball to play rugby in 2019 and has represented New Zealand in international competition and played professionally for the Chiefs Manawa squad.

Wills and her husband, Jeff Thwaites, have one daughter - Mckenzie (1).

# COLONEL E. DAVID WOYCIK, JR.

A 1977 graduate of Hofstra University and a 1980 Maurice A. Deane School of Law at Hofstra University graduate, Colonel E. David Woycik, Jr., has been a dedicated member of the Hofstra Athletics Pride Club and ardent supporter of Hofstra Athletics. He served many years on the Pride Club board of directors and was president from 2011 to 2016.

A former student-athlete, Woycik was a midfielder and face-off specialist on the Pride lacrosse team as an undergraduate. In 2020, he and his wife, Carolyn Sanchez, partnered with Hofstra athletics to form The Colonel E. David Woycik, Jr. (Ret.) Esq. Pride Leadership Academy, an initiative designed to cultivate an environment where student-athletes have the opportunity to evolve into leaders of impact.

A Colonel in the U.S. Army Reserves, Woycik was a Military Police Officer and a Judge Advocate General while serving in the Army. He served overseas in combat during Operation Desert Storm, as well as in the war against terrorism, and did seven tours in Panama. He was awarded the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star, three Meritorious Service Medals, and other commendations for his outstanding leadership and dedication to his country.

He was the 1998 Hofstra Alumnus of the Year, the 1999 Veteran of the Year, the Law School Distinguished Lawyer of the Year in 2005, and the 2009 Joseph M. Margiotta Distinguished Service Award recipient. In 2022, he was inducted into the inaugural Hofstra Law School Hall of Fame. He is an avid community philanthropist involved in many organizations including Vet Dogs of America, Canine Companions for



Independence, Warrior Ranch Foundation, as well as Hofstra University. He has served as the president of Hofstra's Veterans Alumni Chapter and the Trial Techniques Program at the Maurice A. Deane School of Law is named in his honor.

Woycik began his legal career as an Assistant District Attorney in Suffolk County. He was appointed as a special U.S. Attorney for New Jersey in 2003. Woycik is currently a partner in The Sanders Law Firm. He has been recognized by his peers as a "Super Lawyer" for the past 10 years. He has distinguished himself as a guest lecturer for the New York State Bar Association, Nassau County Bar Association, the American Trial Lawyers Association, and Court TV.


