Obtaining Credentials

Press credentials are issued to accredited members of the working media only. Requests for credentials should be made via phone, mail, e-mail or fax to Ernie Larossa in the Sports Information Office. Please be sure to follow up your request with a phone call to ensure it has been received.

Space in the Homewood Field press box is limited, so requests should be made no later than 48 hours prior to game time. Should space become a problem, preference will be given to the primary media outlets of each school, and then to media who made their requests earlier in the week.

Photographers must show their credentials in order to gain access to the playing field area. All photographers are limited to the areas along the sidelines of the lacrosse field but may not enter the team bench areas at any time.

Local television stations shooting the game for highlight footage may do so from the sideline (except in team areas) or from the area outside the press box to the right (when looking at the press box from the field). When games are not being televised, local television stations may get highlights from the top of the press box. During games being televised, this area is off limits.

Credentials may be picked up at either Will Call entrance -- located in the Schelle Pavilion on the University Parkway entrance to Homewood Field or the "Hill" entrance, which is located behind the scoreboard along San Martin Drive. Credentials will be available for pick up on game days beginning 90 minutes before game time.

Radio Lines

Broadcast positions for up to two visiting radio stations are available in the Homewood Field press box. Phone lines may be rented from the Sports Information Office at a cost of \$100 per line per game. A trade-off option to waive the phone line fee is welcome if the opposing team also broadcasts its games. Stations wishing to broadcast a game from Homewood Field should contact Ernie Larossa at least two weeks prior to game day and must sign a Broadcast Line Agreement.

Credential requests for radio staff should be submitted along with the request for phone lines.

Media Parking

Parking around the stadium is limited on gameday. Media parking is available in the lot behind Homewood Field off of San Martin Drive. Requests for access to this lot should be made at the time of credential requests. If you do not make arrangements for parking in advance, you will not be able to gain access to this parking lot.

In-Game Media Services

Game notes, flip cards and game programs will be distributed in the press box before each game. Box scores and scoring summaries will be provided at halftime and at the end of the game. There are a limited number of phone lines in the press box for use during the game. Wireless service and ethernet jacks are available in the press box at no charge. Food and beverages will be provided in the press box at halftime for all credentialed media.

Postgame Press Conference

Approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game, a postgame press conference will be held in a designated area of the Johns Hopkins Athletic Center. Sports Information assistants will help guide members of the media to the interview area. The head coach and selected players of the visiting team will be available for questions first, followed by coaches and players from Johns Hopkins. This will be the order of interviews regardless of the outcome of the game.

Interviews after evening games may take place on the field. In this case, a member of the Hopkins Sports Information staff will assist in gathering individuals needed.

Requests for specific players should be made to Ernie Larossa during the fourth quarter. Following the press conference, both teams' locker rooms will be open to the media for further interviews. Interviews with opposing players should be coordinated through the visiting SID.

In-Season Interview Policy

All requests for in-season interviews with players and coaches must be made through Ernie Larossa in the Sports Information Office. Media members should not contact players directly. Interview times convenient for both the player and the media member will be arranged by the Sports Information staff. Players will not miss class or practice to conduct an interview.

Media representatives are welcome to speak with players and coaches after practice sessions, but should call in advance to confirm practice times.

When Hopkins is on the Road

Local members of the media who wish to cover an away men's lacrosse game should contact the Sports Information Director of that school to obtain credentials.

Budnitz Family Scholarship for Men's Lacrosse

Few individuals have contributed as much to the game of lacrosse in the role of player, coach and administrator as Buzzy Budnitz who graduated from the Krieger School of Arts and Science in 1953. After being honored as a First Team All-Maryland attackman in 1949, Buzzy matriculated to Hopkins and later became a member of the All-Time Johns Hopkins University Lacrosse Team. His first varsity year at Hopkins he was named to the honorable mention All-American Team and quickly ascended to First Team All-American when he was recognized in 1952 and '53. Also in '53, Buzzy received the prestigious Turnbull Award as the nation's outstanding attackman. Since his graduation, Buzzy has been inducted into the respective Halls of Fame for US Lacrosse (1976), State of Maryland (1989) and Johns Hopkins University (1995). He also served his alma mater as an assistant lacrosse coach from 1966-74 and as the President of the Alumni Association.

Cordish Endowment for Men's Lacrosse

David S. Cordish is a 1960 graduate of the Krieger School of Arts and Sciences. David played on the '58-'60 lacrosse teams. As a midfielder, David helped lead the Blue Jays to the 1959 national championship. The Blue Jays lost just two games against collegiate competition during David's three years as a member of the varsity team. This scholarship reflects David's ongoing enthusiasm for Hopkins Lacrosse.

Cowan Family Endowment for Men's Lacrosse

Joseph Cowan is a 1969 graduate of the Krieger School of Arts and Sciences. Joe played on three consecutive championship lacrosse teams at Hopkins from 1967-69, earning All-American honors each of those years. In 1968 and 1969, Joe received the prestigious Turnbull Award as the nation's outstanding attackman. After graduation, Joe continued to serve Johns Hopkins for 14 years as an assistant coach. Joe and his wife Ozzie created this scholarship in 2004.

Sardella Scholarship Fund for Men's Lacrosse

Louis "Lou" M. Sardella is a 1969 graduate from the Whiting School of Engineering. Lou played varsity soccer while at Hopkins, but since that time has grown to become an avid lacrosse fan. This fund was established by Lou in honor of all of those that have worn the Hopkins uniform and have represented his alma mater.

Steven Charles Mitchell Scholarship

Steve Mitchell graduated from the Krieger School of Arts and Sciences in 1987. During his time as a student at Hopkins, Steve played football, basketball and lacrosse. He was inducted into the Johns Hopkins Hall of Fame in 2004. Steve was an outstanding defenseman and a First-Team All-American in 1987 when he helped lead Hopkins to the National Championship.

Larry Becker was captain of the 1960 lacrosse and basketball teams at JHU. His interest in athletics led to a successful career in orthopedic surgery. He has dedicated the scholarship fund in memory of Gwen and Gail Becker, both athletes in their own right. His gift will alternate in support of the men's and women's teams each year.

Henry A. Ciccarone, Sr. Memorial Scholarship Fund

Established by family and friends in memory of Johns Hopkins coaching legend Henry A. Ciccarone, Sr., this fund honors his extraordinary success as a Blue Jay player and coach. In his nine seasons, Coach Ciccarone compiled a

Daniel and Conor Denihan Scholarship Fund

In 1999, Dan and Conor Denihan were both named All-America, the first brothers to do so at Hopkins since 1981. The Denihans also made their mark on the Blue Jay record book, combining for nearly 300 points from 1996 to 2001. The Denihan family established this scholarship in gratitude for the terrific experience provided by Johns Hopkins lacrosse.

Edwin C. Duncan Scholarship Fund

Former varsity lacrosse player Robert R. Duncan '71 was fortunate to play on two national championship teams coached by Bob Scott. He has established this fund in honor of his father, Edwin Duncan, a lifelong sportsman and long-time supporter of Hopkins lacrosse. The fund will provide scholarships for a member of the men's team who has demonstrated academic and athletic integrity.

Endowed Scholarship Fund for Women's Lacrosse

A fund was created by an anonymous donor and their family in support of Women's Lacrosse.

Katherine Herring Phares Scholarship Fund

Katharine Herring Phares graduated from the Krieger School of Arts and Sciences in 1991. Katharine had a successful playing career as a member of the field hockey and lacrosse teams for four years. As a stand-out athlete she was a two-sport All-American and captain in her senior year. Her scholarship fund represents the first fund created by an alumna from the women's lacrosse program. Her leadership is significant when it comes to supporting young women that wear the colors for the Blue Jays.

Kumin Family Scholarship Fund

Solomon Kumin played for the Blue Jays from 1996-1999. A recipient of the team's W. Taylor Cook award for Outstanding Character & Attitude, Sol graduated from the Krieger School of Arts and Sciences in 1999. Sol and his wife, Elizabeth, are establishing this scholarship in recognition of those that are a part of the Hopkins Lacrosse family.

Paleologos Family Scholarship Fund

John Paleologos overcame reconstructive knee surgery to become a two-year starter at close defense for the Blue Jays. The Paleologos family, including John '98, Matt, and their parents, Nick and Suellen, have chosen to establish this fund in recognition of the outstanding tradition of Hopkins lacrosse and to support its future success.

Guy Railey Scholarship Fund

Guy T. Railey, Jr. graduated from the Krieger School of Arts and Sciences in 1958. During his years at Johns Hopkins, Guy played lacrosse and football. He was a beloved teacher and coach who died in 2003. To celebrate his enthusiasm for Johns Hopkins athletics, Guy's friends and family members established this scholarship for lacrosse to create a lasting legacy to Guy.

Dylan Schlott Scholarship Fund

Dylan Schlott '99 was the leading goal scorer in the nation his junior year and finished his career as one of the top 15 goal scorers in JHU history. His family established this fund in recognition of Dylan's achievements as a result of his positive attitude and tremendous work ethic.

Jerome D. Schnydmann Scholarship Fund

Jerome D. "Jerry" Schnydmann has led a long and distinguished career at the Johns Hopkins University. Jerry is a 1967 graduate of the Krieger School of Arts and Sciences who played varsity lacrosse at Hopkins from 1964 to 1967. A three-time All-American midfielder, he was the captain of the 1967 national championship team. Jerry continued to support the lacrosse program as a long-time assistant coach after his graduation and came to Hopkins full-time in 1978 as director of undergraduate admissions for the schools of Arts and Sciences and Engineering. He then served as the executive director of the Office of Alumni Relations and today, Jerry is the executive assistant to the President and secretary to the Board of Trustees. In 1998, Jerry was inducted into the Johns Hopkins Athletic Hall of Fame, and in 2003 he was inducted into the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame.

Scott and Margaret Starks Scholarship Fund

Scott and Margaret Starks established a scholarship for women's lacrosse in recognition of the team's move to competition at the Division I level. A 1974 graduate of Johns Hopkins, Scott has cheered for all the Blue Jay teams since he served as the University's Sports Information Director during his junior and senior years.

The Matt "Stoff" Stoffel Scholarship Fund

Stoff played in 18 games as a reserve defenseman for the Blue Jays from 2001-2004. He was a member of three teams that advanced to the Final Four (2002, 2003 and 2004) and one team that played in the NCAA Championship game (2003). A graduate of nearby Mt. St. Joseph High School, Stoff earned a degree from the Zanvyl Krieger School of Arts & Sciences in Economics in 2004. In December 2005, Matt Stoffel lost his life in a one-car accident, the fund was created to help maintain Matt's legacy.

General Scholarship Fund

Throughout these years, there have been some tremendous accomplishments. Most would cite our undefeated National Championship in 2005 and our second in 2007 as the most notable achievements in recent years. However, at Johns Hopkins University our pursuit of excellence has always carried much further than the lacrosse field.
