JOHNS HOPKINS VS. PRINCETON

The Game

« Johns Hopkins (1-2) hits the road for the third time on the year as the Blue Jays travel to New Jersey to take on Princeton (1-1).
« Johns Hopkins is coming off an 11-10 victory at then 10th-ranked North Carolina last Saturday in a game played in heavy rain on a muddy field at Kenan Stadium.

The Facts

« This is the 132nd season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
« Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 984-336-15.
« JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 35 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

Flipping The Calendar to March

« This year's 1-2 record at the end of February may have Blue Jay fans thinking back to last season. After starting the 2018 season 1-2, the Blue Jays proceeded to reel off five straight wins in the month of March to turn the 1-2 mark into a 6-2 record entering April.
« Johns Hopkins enters this week's game at Princeton having won seven consecutive games in the month of March dating back to 2017.
« JHU is 12-4 in its last 16 games in the month of March dating back to the 2015 season.

Poll Position

« Johns Hopkins is ranked 18th in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and 18th in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. These are the two official in-season polls conducted throughout the regular season.
« Princeton is receiving votes in both the USILA Coaches Poll and the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. Both complete polls can be found on page 9.

Series History

« This week's game will be the 89th between Johns Hopkins and Princeton. The series dates to a 3-2 Princeton win in 1890.
« JHU leads the all-time series 58-30 and won last season's meeting 16-9.
« In an odd dynamic, the last three games in the series have been decided by seven goals or more.

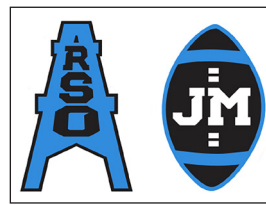

Helmet Stickers

« Johns Hopkins will wear two stickers on the back of its helmets in 2019.
« The old Houston Oiler logo with "RSO" is for Ralph S. O'Connor, a 1951 Johns Hopkins graduate, who passed away on December 30, 2018. O'Connor was a long-time supporter of the Blue Jay lacrosse program.
« The football with "JM" is for Jim Margraff, the Blue Jays' highly-successful football coach who passed away suddenly on January 2, 2019. Margraff guided his 2018 team to the NCAA Semifinals and was named Division III National Coach of the Year just two weeks before he died.



Things to Know - PRINCETON

« Princeton is off to a 1-1 start after topping Monmouth (23-7) and falling to Virginia (12-11 in overtime) in its first two games.

« The Tigers will play three straight road games after this week's game against JHU (@ Navy, @ Rutgers, @ Penn).

« Through two games, Princeton holds a decided advantage in possession as the Tigers have won 60 percent of their faceoffs (35-of-58) and they are also +24 on ground balls thus far.

« Opposing goalies will see lots of action against Princeton as the Tigers are averaging 57 shots per game after taking 59 against Monmouth and 55 against Virginia.

Tigers to Watch**Michael Sowers (Jr. • A)**

« Two-time All-American after earning third team honors as a freshman and second team last season. Leads the Tigers in assists (7) and points (13) through two games.

« Entering the 2019 season, had the highest points per game average of any player in Division I in the last 37 years and the fifth-best all-time (5.9).

« In two games against Johns Hopkins, has 10 points on five goals and five assists.

Jake Stevens (Fr. • M)

« Dynamic player making an instant impact for Princeton in unsettled situations. Counts a team-high 16 ground balls on the year and has been a boost on the wing of the Tiger faceoff unit, which is winning just over 60 percent on the year.

Emmet Cordrey (Sr. • A)

« Has a team-high seven goals and four assists to rank second on the team in scoring with 11 points. « Seven goals this season already matches his total from 2018, when he tallied seven goals and one assist in 13 games.

George Baughan (So. • D)

« Second Team All-Ivy defender as a freshman last season after leading the league in caused turnovers per game (1.6). Has started both games this season and has 11 GBs and two CTs.

Johns Hopkins and ESPNU

Johns Hopkins enjoys an exclusive national television agreement with ESPNU. All Johns Hopkins home games air on the ESPN family of networks with a majority of the games airing on ESPNU.

Johns Hopkins is the only lacrosse program in the nation - men or women - with its own exclusive national television agreement.

**Johns Hopkins-Princeton Ties**

« Johns Hopkins defenseman **Pat Foley** and Princeton attackman **Michael Sowers** played together on the 2016 United States U-19 team that won the 2016 FIL World Championship. Both earned All-World honors in helping the team to the gold medal.

On This Date

« This week's game at Princeton will be just the fifth all-time for Johns Hopkins on March 2. JHU is 2-2 in games played on this date.

« All four previous games the Blue Jays have played on March 2 have come against Princeton with the Tigers winning the first two (1991, 1996) and JHU taking the last two (2002, 2012).

For What It's Worth

« This week's game against Princeton will be JHU's fourth game of the season. JHU's first three opponents (Towson, Loyola, North Carolina) are a combined 10-2 (.833) entering this weekend's games.

Road Warriors

« Johns Hopkins will play four of its first five games on the road in 2019. The Blue Jays opened at Towson (Feb. 9), returned home to play Loyola (Feb. 16) and then play at North Carolina (Feb. 23), at Princeton (Mar. 2) and at Syracuse (Mar. 9) in succession.

« The three-game road trip is nothing new for Johns Hopkins. The Blue Jays also had three-game road swings in 2015, 2016 & 2017.

« When JHU plays at Syracuse on March 9, the Blue Jays will be playing their fourth road game of the season. By comparison, Johns Hopkins didn't play its fourth road game last season until April 1 (@ Rutgers), while its fourth road trips in 2017 (@ Ohio State - April 9) and 2016 (@ UMBC - March 30) also came at least three weeks later than it will in 2019.

Blue Jays Top BIG Preseason Poll

« Johns Hopkins was the preseason favorite to claim the 2019 Big Ten title in a poll of the league's head coaches.

« JHU won the 2019 Big Ten Tournament title with a 13-10 victory over top-seeded Maryland. The tournament title was the second for Johns Hopkins, which also won the inaugural league crown in 2015.

Kuhn Wearing #19

Senior **Robert Kuhn** will wear #19 this season after wearing #10 in 2017 and 2018. The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through last spring, when he would have been a senior and nobody else wore 19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, head coach **Dave Pietramala** met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, Kuhn was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber.

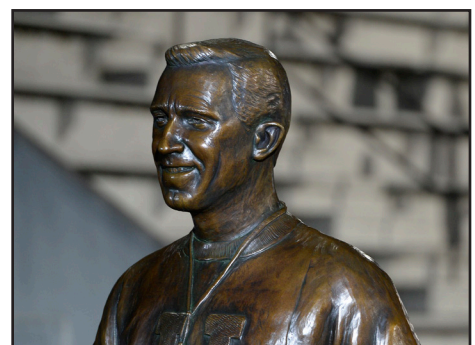

Visitors to Homewood Field are greeted by a statue commemorating former Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse coach and Director of Athletics Robert H. Scott. The statue, which was unveiled in October 2016, is positioned at the main campus entrance to the stadium.

Scott, who passed away on September 15, 2016, spent 20 years as the men's lacrosse coach at Johns Hopkins (1955-74) and guided the Blue Jays to seven national championships, including the program's first NCAA title in 1974. He continued to serve the University as the Director of Athletics until 1995.

Many Johns Hopkins teams wore patches on their uniforms in honor of Scott the year after he died; the men's lacrosse patches included seven stars to commemorate his seven national championships.

Lending a Hand

« Through three games, 24 of Johns Hopkins' 31 goals have been assisted ... that's 77.4%. By comparison, JHU collected assists on 62.3% of its goals last season.

« For the record, the last time Johns Hopkins assisted on better than 65% of its goals for an entire season was in 2003, when the Blue Jays totaled 151 assists on 224 goals (67.4%).

Class Act

« Johns Hopkins has scored 31 goals and collected 24 assists for 55 points through three games with a strong balance in the scoring breakdown among the four classes.

« Blue Jay seniors lead the way with 10 goals, while the team's freshmen lead the way with nine assists. Below is a breakdown of the team's scoring by class.

« Johns Hopkins is 27-16 (.628) in overtime under the direction of head coach **Dave Pietramala**. JHU's last overtime game came in the first round of the 2018 NCAA Tournament, when the Blue Jays topped Georgetown, 10-9.

« Johns Hopkins has won seven of its last 10 overtime games.

« Scored one goal and added one assist, two ground balls and one caused turnover in JHU's 11-10 win at 10th-ranked North Carolina.

« Has started all 20 games since the start of the 2018 season.

Alex Concannon (Sr. | M) #2

« Tallied one assist against second-ranked Loyola.

« Has played in 34 games with eight starts in his career and has 13 goals and 18 assists to his credit.

« Third among active players with 18 career assists.

Ryan Darby (So. | G) #15

« Made first career start in goal in the season opener at Towson. Totaled 15 saves and allowed 17 goals against the Tigers.

« 15 saves against Towson are most by a JHU goalie in first career start since Brian Carcatera had 16 at Princeton in 1997.

« Posted 11 saves against second-ranked Loyola and came back with seven saves in 11-10 win at 10th-ranked North Carolina to secure his first career victory.

Connor DeSimone (So. | M) #3

« Has started 18 of 20 career games.

« Totaled one goal and one assist in the opener at Towson. This marked the seventh multi-point game of his career.

« Chipped in one assist against second-ranked Loyola.

Kyle DiPietro (So. | SSDM) #11

« Saw most significant playing time of his career in season opener at Towson and also played against second-ranked Loyola.

Joey Epstein (Fr. | A) #32

« Started on attack in season opener at Towson.

« First freshman to start the season opener on attack at Johns Hopkins since Kyle Barrie and

Peter LeSueur both started the opener against defending national champion Princeton in 2002. The third starter on attack for the Blue Jays that day? Current JHU offensive coordinator Bobby Benson.

« Tallied one goal and one assist against Towson in the season opener.

- 10 of the last 19 games between the two teams have been decided by three goals or less, although the last the last three have been decided by at least seven goals.

- One of the two teams has been ranked number one in nine of the meetings since 1997.

- Johns Hopkins is 8-1 when entering the game against Princeton ranked number one.
