### JOHNS HOPKINS VS. VIRGINIA

### The Game

- « Johns Hopkins (4-3) closes out a three-game home-stand as the Blue Jays welcome ninth-ranked Virginia (5-2) to Homewood Field.
- « Johns Hopkins is coming off a 12-10 win over Delaware on Saturday, March 16 that pushed the Blue Jays over .500 for the first time this season.

### **The Facts**

- $^{\circ}$  This is the 132nd season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
- « Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 987-337-15.
- $^{\rm w}$  JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

### Flipping The Calendar to March

- « This year's 1-2 record at the end of February may have had Blue Jay fans thinking back to last season. After starting the 2018 season 1-2, the Blue Jays proceeded to reel off five straight wins in the month of March to turn the 1-2 mark into a 6-2 record entering April.
- « JHU is 15-5 in its last 20 games in the month of March dating back to the 2015 season.
- « Prior to the loss at Syracuse on March 9, Johns Hopkins had won eight consecutive games in the month of March dating back to 2017.

### **Poll Position**

- « Johns Hopkins is ranked 15th in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and 16th in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. These are the two official in-season polls conducted throughout the regular season.
- « Virginia is ranked ninth in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and ninth in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. Both complete polls can be found on page 11.

### **Helmet Stickers**

- « Johns Hopkins will wear two stickers on the back of its helmets in 2019.
- $^{\rm w}$  The old Houston Oiler logo with "RSO" is for Ralph S. O'Connor, a 1951 Johns Hopkins graduate, who passed away on December 30, 2018. O'Connor was a long-time supporter of the Blue Jay lacrosse program.
- « The football with "JM" is for Jim Margraff, the Blue Jays' highly-successful football coach who passed away suddenly on January 2, 2019. Margraff guided his 2018 team to the NCAA Semifinals and was named Division III National Coach of the Year just two weeks before he died.



### Things to Know - Virginia

- « Virginia comes to Homewood Field fresh off a thrilling 13-11 come-from behind win at home against Notre Dame. The Cavaliers are 5-2 overall and, more importantly, 2-0 in the ACC.
- « As the temperatures have slowly gotten warmer, so has the Virginia offense. After averaging 10.0 goals in their first two games, the Cavaliers have averaged 13.4 in their last five by scoring at least 11 in each of those outings.
- « As always, Virginia excels at putting the ball on the ground and coming up with loose ones. UVA ranks sixth in the nation in caused turnovers per game (11.79) and third in ground balls per outing (40.6).
- « Head coach Lars Tiffany's team has already been involved in a season's worth of close games. The Cavaliers have played six games decided by three goals or less and have won five of those six.

### Cavaliers to Watch

### Michael Kraus (Jr. • A)

- « One of the most feared attackmen in the nation, Kraus has 16 goals and 14 assists in seven games. He has been on a tear during UVA's current fourgame winning streak with 11 goals and nine assists for 20 points.
- « Will carry a 39-game point-scoring streak into this week's game against Johns Hopkins. The streak is the fourth longest in the nation.

### Ryan Conrad (Sr. • M)

- « Perhaps the most versatile player in the nation, Conrad has seven goals, seven assists and 35 ground balls to his credit. He has at least two points in six of seven games this season.
- « Conrad missed all but five games in 2018, but still has 37 goals, 24 assists, 132 ground balls and 20 caused turnovers in his career.

### Petey LaSalla (Fr. • FO)

- « Has quickly established himself as one of the top young faceoff specialists in the nation. Has won 69-of-126 (.548) faceoffs with 26 ground balls in seven games.
- « Ranks seventh in the nation in faceoff winning percentage among freshmen. With an average of 25 goals scored in every UVA game, there is no shortage of opportunities to shine for LaSalla.

### **On This Date**

- « This week's game against Virginia will be Johns Hopkins' 11th game on March 23 since 1960 (dates for games prior to 1960 not all available). The Blue Jays are 6-4 in those 10 games.
- « The Blue Jays are 6-1 in games played on March 23 since the formation of the NCAA Tournament in 1971.

### For What It's Worth

- « This week's game will be JHU's eighth game of the season. JHU's first seven opponents are a combined 32-19 (.627) through games of March 20.
- « Johns Hopkins' 13 regular season opponents are currently a combined 60-27 (.690). That ranks as the second-best opponent win percentage in the nation.

### **Road Warriors**

- « Johns Hopkins returned home last week after playing four of its first five games on the road in 2019. The Blue Jays opened at Towson (Feb. 9), returned home to play Loyola (Feb. 16) and then played at North Carolina (Feb. 23), at Princeton (Mar. 2) and at Syracuse (Mar. 9) in succession.
- $^{\circ}$  The three-game road trip is nothing new for Johns Hopkins. The Blue Jays also had three-game road swings in 2015, 2016 & 2017.

### **Doing the Little Things**

 $^{\prime\prime}$  In the last five games, JHU is 92-of-102 (.902) on clears and has won 72-of-123 (.602) faceoffs. Not surprisingly, the Blue Jays are 4-1 in their last five games.

### Lending a Hand

- « Through six games, 49 of Johns Hopkins' 78 goals have been assisted ... that's 62.8%. By comparison, JHU collected assists on 62.3% of its goals last season.
- « For the record, the last time Johns Hopkins assisted on better than 65% of its goals for an entire season was in 2003, when the Blue Jays totaled 151 assists on 224 goals (67.4%).

### **Kuhn Wearing #19**

Senior **Robert Kuhn** will wear #19 this season after wearing #10 in 2017 and 2018. The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through last spring, when he would have been a senior and nobody else wore 19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, head coach Dave Pietramala met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, Kuhn was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber.

Visitors to Homewood Field are greeted by a statue commemorating former Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse coach and Director of Athletics Robert H. Scott. The statue, which was unveiled in October 2016, is positioned at the main campus entrance to the stadium.

Scott, who passed away on September 15, 2016, spent 20 years as the men's lacrosse coach at Johns Hopkins (1955-74) and guided the Blue Jays to seven national championships, including the program's first NCAA title in 1974. He continued to serve the University as the Director of Athletics until 1995.

Many Johns Hopkins teams were patches on their uniforms in honor of Scott the year after he died; the men's lacrosse patches included seven stars to commemorate his seven national championships.

- « Through seven games Johns Hopkins has 17 different goal-scorers and 20 different players have registered at least one point.
- $^{\rm w}$  By comparison, in the same number of games, Virginia has had 13 different goal-scorers and 16 players have at least one point.

### **Class Act**

- $\,^{\vee}\,$  Johns Hopkins has scored 78 goals and collected 49 assists for 127 points through seven games with a strong balance in the scoring breakdown among the four classes.
- « Blue Jay seniors lead the way with 25 goals and 37 points, while the team's juniors lead the way with 15 assists. The contribution of the freshman (19g, 11a) and sophomore (16g, 11a) classes have also been strong.
- « The balance in scoring has been remarkable early in the season as each class has totaled at least 16 goals and 27 points through seven games.Below is a breakdown of the team's scoring by class thus far.

### **Non-Offensive Scoring**

- « With the addition of a shot clock this season, the pace of play has quickened and has resulted in more transition lacrosse. This has resulted in more scoring for Johns Hopkins' non-offensive players.
- « Through seven games, non-offensive players (defensemen, long & short-stick defensive middies and faceoff specialists) have accumulated eight goals and 11 assists (19 points) for the Blue Jays.
- « By comparison, in 17 games last season, the Blue Jays' non-offensive players totaled 10 goals and 7 assists (17 points).
- « JHU's non-offensive players have combined for 16 points (7g, 9a) in the last five games.

- The home team has won 13 of the last 21 meetings played at a campus site.
- JHU has won seven of the last 10 meetings.
- The last nine meetings at Johns Hopkins have been decided by a total of just 11 goals. Included are seven, one-goal games and a pair of two-goal games.
- Virginia has won 11 of last 16 games between the two teams in Charlottesville. Prior to the 11-10 win in overtime in 2012, JHU's last win at UVa came in 1998 ... Hopkins has since won three more times at UVA (2014 & 2015 NCAA, 2018).
- Virginia defeated Johns Hopkins, 9-8, in four overtimes in 2001. That game ranks as the longest in Johns Hopkins history.
- 12 of the last 26 games between the two teams have been decided by one goal. In all there have been 21 one-goal games between the Blue Jays and the Cavaliers.
- Johns Hopkins and Virginia have met 16 times in the NCAA Tournament with the Blue Jays winning 10 of the 16. Three of the meetings have come in the national championship game with UVA grabbing NCAA titles in 1972 and 2003 and JHU winning in 1980.
- The 16 games JHU and UVA have played in the NCAAs are the most any two teams have met in tournament history.
