JOHNS HOPKINS VS. MICHIGAN

The Game

« Johns Hopkins (4-4) opens Big Ten play as the Blue Jays travel to Michigan (3-5) to take on the Wolverines.
« Johns Hopkins is coming off a 16-11 loss to then ninth-ranked Virginia at home on Saturday, March 23.

The Facts

« This is the 132nd season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
« Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 987-338-15.
« JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

Flipping The Calendar to March

« JHU is 15-6 in its last 21 games in the month of March dating back to the 2015 season.
« Prior to the loss at Syracuse on March 9, Johns Hopkins had won eight consecutive games in the month of March dating back to 2017.

Poll Position

« Johns Hopkins is ranked 18th in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and 20th in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. These are the two official in-season polls conducted throughout the regular season.
« Michigan is not ranked or listed as receiving votes this week in either of the national polls. Both complete polls can be found on page 11.

Series History

« This week's game will be the seventh game in a series that dates to a 17-8 Johns Hopkins win in 2013.
« JHU leads the all-time series 6-0 and won last season's meeting, 10-9, at Michigan.
« The Blue Jays have scored at least 10 goals in each of the series' six meetings and have topped 14 in five of the six.

Familiar Face

« Michigan is coached by **Kevin Conry**, who played for current Johns Hopkins head coach **Dave Pietramala** for four years at Homewood (2001-04).

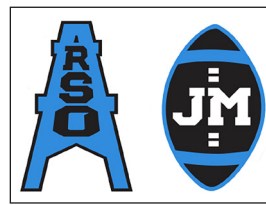

Helmet Stickers

« Johns Hopkins will wear two stickers on the back of its helmets in 2019.
« The old Houston Oiler logo with "RSO" is for Ralph S. O'Connor, a 1951 Johns Hopkins graduate, who passed away on December 30, 2018. O'Connor was a long-time supporter of the Blue Jay lacrosse program.
« The football with "JM" is for Jim Margraff, the Blue Jays' highly-successful football coach who passed away suddenly on January 2, 2019. Margraff guided his 2018 team to the NCAA Semifinals and was named Division III National Coach of the Year just two weeks before he died.



Things to Know - Michigan

« Michigan welcomes Johns Hopkins to UM-Lacrosse Stadium looking to snap a four-game losing streak. The Wolverines won three of their first four games this season, but have since dropped four straight.

« The Wolverines are one of the sharpest shooting teams in the nation as UM ranks seventh nationally in shooting percentage (.330) entering this week's game. UM's top two goal-scorers (**Alex Buckanavage** & **Bryce Clay**) have combined for 36 goals on 81 shots (.444).

« The Michigan man-down defense is among the best in the nation as UM has allowed just five extra-man goals on 24 attempts (.792) to rank eighth nationally.

« One area of concern for the Wolverines is on faceoffs, where eight different players have combined to win just 91-of-231 (.394) faceoffs on the year.

Wolverines to Watch**Alex Buckanavage (So. • A)**

« Leads the team in scoring with 20 goals, 14 assists and 34 points. Sharp-shooter has scored on 20 of 48 shots (.417).

« Has registered at least one point in 20 of 21 career games and has totaled at least three points in all eight games this season and two or more goals in seven of eight.

Nick DeCaprio (Sr. • D)

« Team co-captain and disruptive leader of the Wolverine defense. Counts two goals, two assists and a team-high 15 caused turnovers to his credit.

« Also ranks second on the team this season with 22 ground balls and enters this week's game against JHU with 137 career GBs and 52 career CTs.

Kevin Mack (So. • A)

« One half of UM's dynamic sophomore attack duo (along with Alex Buckanavage).

« Counts 14 goals and 13 assists to his credit this season and has at least two points in seven of eight games on the year.

« Recorded the second 20-goal, 20-assist season in UM history last year as he totaled 21 goals and 21 assists as a rookie.

Johns Hopkins and ESPN

Johns Hopkins enjoys an exclusive national television agreement with ESPN. All Johns Hopkins home games air on the ESPN family of networks with a majority of the games airing on ESPN.

Johns Hopkins is the only lacrosse program in the nation - men or women - with its own exclusive national television agreement.



« Conry was a member of the Blue Jays' national runner-up team in 2003, and the 2002 and 2004 teams that advanced to the NCAA Semifinals.

« Overall, the Blue Jays posted a 47-10 record, including a 41-6 mark in the regular season, during Conry's career at JHU.

On This Date

« This week's game against Michigan will be Johns Hopkins' 11th game on March 30 since 1955 (dates for games prior to 1955 not all available). The Blue Jays are 8-2 in the previous 10 games played on this date.

« The Blue Jays have scored in double figures in nine of their previous 10 games played on March 30 and have held the opposition to eight goals or less eight times.

For What It's Worth

« This week's game will be JHU's ninth game of the season. Not including their games against JHU, the Blue Jays' first eight opponents are a combined 39-20 (.661) through games of March 26 - for games already played, that ranks as the fourth-best opponent winning percentage in the nation.

« Johns Hopkins' 13 regular season opponents are currently a combined 69-31 (.690). That ranks as the second-best opponent win percentage in the nation.

« JHU's five remaining opponents are a combined 30-11 (.732) - that ranks as the second-toughest remaining schedule in the nation (based on future opponent win percentage).

The Start of Something BIG

« This week's game at Michigan is the first of five straight to close the regular season against Big Ten opponents for Johns Hopkins.

« The Blue Jays are 13-7 (.650) in B1G regular season games since the league was formed in 2015.

Kuhn Wearing #19

Senior **Robert Kuhn** will wear #19 this season after wearing #10 in 2017 and 2018. The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through last spring, when he would have been a senior and nobody else wore 19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, head coach **Dave Pietramala** met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, Kuhn was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber.

Visitors to Homewood Field are greeted by a statue commemorating former Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse coach and Director of Athletics Robert H. Scott. The statue, which was unveiled in October 2016, is positioned at the main campus entrance to the stadium.

Scott, who passed away on September 15, 2016, spent 20 years as the men's lacrosse coach at Johns Hopkins (1955-74) and guided the Blue Jays to seven national championships, including the program's first NCAA title in 1974. He continued to serve the University as the Director of Athletics until 1995.

Many Johns Hopkins teams wore patches on their uniforms in honor of Scott the year after he died; the men's lacrosse patches included seven stars to commemorate his seven national championships.

A BIG Flashback

« Johns Hopkins returns to the scene of its 2018 Big Ten Championship as the Blue Jays claimed their second tournament title with wins over Ohio State (6-5) and Maryland (13-10) at Michigan last May.

« The Blue Jays' 2018 Big Ten title was its second as JHU also claimed the inaugural championship in 2015. JHU (2015, 2018) and Maryland (2016, 2017) have won all four Big Ten Tournament titles since the league was formed in 2015.

Doing the Little Things

« In the last six games, JHU is 103-of-118 (.878) on clears and has won 89-of-153 (.587) faceoffs. This is a big improvement from the Blue Jays' first two games of the season, when they were 28-of-40 (.700) on clears and 25-of-61 (.417) on faceoffs in losses to Towson and Loyola.

Lending a Hand

« Through eight games, 54 of Johns Hopkins' 89 goals have been assisted ... that's 60.7%. By comparison, JHU collected assists on 62.3% of its goals last season.

« For the record, the last time Johns Hopkins assisted on better than 65% of its goals for an entire season was in 2003, when the Blue Jays totaled 151 assists on 224 goals (67.4%).

Spreading it Around

« Johns Hopkins has 17 different goal-scorers and 20 different players have registered at least one point through eight games.

« By comparison, in the same number of games, Michigan has had 11 different goal-scorers and 14 players have at least one point.

Class Act

« Johns Hopkins has scored 89 goals and collected 54 assists for 143 points through eight games with a strong balance in the scoring breakdown among the four classes.

« Blue Jay seniors lead the way with 27 goals and 39 points, while the team's juniors lead the way with 18 assists. The contribution of the freshman (26g, 11a) and sophomore (18g, 13a) classes have also been strong.

« The balance in scoring has been remarkable as each class has totaled at least 18 goals and 31 points through eight games.

« Below is a breakdown of the team's scoring by class thus far.

Non-Offensive Scoring

« With the addition of a shot clock this season, the pace of play has quickened and has resulted in more transition lacrosse. This has resulted in more scoring for Johns Hopkins' non-offensive players.

« Through eight games, non-offensive players (defensemen, long & short-stick defensive middies and faceoff specialists) have accumulated eight goals and 13 assists (21 points) for the Blue Jays.

« By comparison, in 17 games last season, the Blue Jays' non-offensive players totaled 10 goals and 7 assists (17 points).

« JHU's non-offensive players have combined for 18 points (7g, 11a) in the last six games.

They combined for three goals and three assists in the 11-10 win at North Carolina and the group came back with two goals and three assists in the 14-12 win at Princeton.

Winningest Program in College Lacrosse History

« Johns Hopkins enters this week's game against Michigan with an all-time record of 987-338-15 to rank as the all-time winningest program in college lacrosse history.

« JHU is one of just seven schools with 700+ victories, one of just four with 800+ wins and one of two that has won 900 or more games.

« Including his time at Cornell, Pietramala sports a career record of 224-102 (.687). His mark at Johns Hopkins currently stands at 201-85 (.703).

In Case We Get There

« Johns Hopkins is 27-16 (.628) in overtime under the direction of head coach **Dave Pietramala**. JHU's last overtime game came in the first round of the 2018 NCAA Tournament, when the Blue Jays topped Georgetown, 10-9.

« Johns Hopkins has won seven of its last 10 overtime games.

One-Goal Wonders

« Including the 11-10 win at North Carolina, Johns Hopkins is 56-26 (.683) in one-goal games under head coach **Dave Pietramala**.

« The Blue Jays were 4-1 in one-goal games in 2018 and are 6-1 in their last seven one-goal games.

Blue Jays Top B1G Preseason Poll

« Johns Hopkins was the preseason favorite to claim the 2019 Big Ten title in a poll of the league's head coaches.

« JHU won the 2019 Big Ten Tournament title with a 13-10 victory over top-seeded Maryland. The tournament title was the second for Johns Hopkins, which also won the inaugural league crown in 2015.
