JOHNS HOPKINS VS. SYRACUSE

The Game

« Johns Hopkins (2-2) hits the road for the third straight game and the fourth time in five games as the Blue Jays head to Syracuse (2-2) to take on the Orange.
« Johns Hopkins is coming off a 14-12 win at Princeton that evened the Blue Jays' record at 2-2 on the year.

The Facts

« This is the 132nd season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
« Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 985-336-15.
« JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 35 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

Flipping The Calendar to March

« This year's 1-2 record at the end of February may have had Blue Jay fans thinking back to last season. After starting the 2018 season 1-2, the Blue Jays proceeded to reel off five straight wins in the month of March to turn the 1-2 mark into a 6-2 record entering April.
« Johns Hopkins enters this week's game at Syracuse having won eight consecutive games in the month of March dating back to 2017.
« JHU is 13-4 in its last 17 games in the month of March dating back to the 2015 season.

Poll Position

« Johns Hopkins is ranked 17th in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and 18th in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. These are the two official in-season polls conducted throughout the regular season.
« Syracuse is ranked 15th in the USILA Coaches Poll and 14th in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. Both complete polls can be found on page 10.

Series History

« This week's game will be the 57th between Johns Hopkins and Syracuse. The series dates to a 4-4 tie in 1921.
« JHU leads the all-time series 30-26-1 and won last season's meeting 18-7 at Carrier Dome.

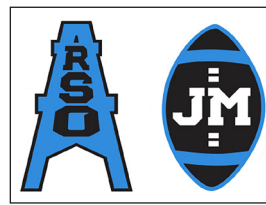

Helmet Stickers

« Johns Hopkins will wear two stickers on the back of its helmets in 2019.
« The old Houston Oiler logo with "RSO" is for Ralph S. O'Connor, a 1951 Johns Hopkins graduate, who passed away on December 30, 2018. O'Connor was a long-time supporter of the Blue Jay lacrosse program.
« The football with "JM" is for Jim Margraff, the Blue Jays' highly-successful football coach who passed away suddenly on January 2, 2019. Margraff guided his 2018 team to the NCAA Semifinals and was named Division III National Coach of the Year just two weeks before he died.



Things to Know - SYRACUSE

« Syracuse enters this week's game against Johns Hopkins at 2-2 after a tough 15-14 overtime loss to Virginia at home last Saturday.

« This week's game against Johns Hopkins is the fifth of seven straight home games to open the season for the Orange. The Carrier Dome has provided quite the home field advantage for the Orange since it opened in 1981 as SU is 241-40 (.856) all-time in the Dome. Johns Hopkins' six all-time wins in the Dome are the most of any visiting team.

« SU has developed the perfect formula for success this season as they lead the nation in fewest turnovers per game (12.25), rank 19th in faceoff winning percentage (.557) and 19th in scoring defense (10.0). In short, the Orange possess the ball, don't turn it over and are solid on defense.

Orange to Watch

Drake Porter (Jr. • G)

« Has made an immediate impact as a first-year starter in goal for the Orange. Boasts a 9.90 goals against average and a .592 save percentage.

« Posted a career-high 16 saves in a 10-8 win over Army and enters this week's game against JHU ranked in the top 10 in the nation in save percentage and saves per game and in the top 20 in goals against average.

Jakob Phaup (So. • FO)

« Emerging player on faceoffs for the Orange as he has won 39-of-60 (.650) with a team-high 25 ground balls through four games.

« Won a career-high 15-of-18 with 11 ground balls against Army and was 12-of-23 against Virginia.

« Currently ranks eighth in the nation in faceoff winning percentage and 27th in ground balls per game (6.5).

Nate Solomon (Sr. • A)

« Will carry a 21-game point-scoring streak into this week's game after punching up one goal and one assist against Virginia.

« Third on the team in scoring with seven goals and one assist this season and has 65 goals and 29 assists in his career.

Johns Hopkins is the only lacrosse program in the nation - men or women - with its own exclusive national television agreement.

**On This Date**

« This week's game at Syracuse will be eighth all-time for Johns Hopkins on March 9. JHU is 7-0 all-time in games played on this date.

« Included in the Blue Jays' 7-0 record on March 9 is an 8-6 win against Syracuse in 1985. At the time, that was the first regular season game between the two teams since 1968 - the teams have played in the regular season every year since.

For What It's Worth

« This week's game against Syracuse will be JHU's fifth game of the season. JHU's first four opponents (Towson, Loyola, North Carolina) are a combined 13-5 (.722) entering this weekend's games.

Road Warriors

« Johns Hopkins will play four of its first five games on the road in 2019. The Blue Jays opened at Towson (Feb. 9), returned home to play Loyola (Feb. 16) and then play at North Carolina (Feb. 23), at Princeton (Mar. 2) and at Syracuse (Mar. 9) in succession.

« The three-game road trip is nothing new for Johns Hopkins. The Blue Jays also had three-game road swings in 2015, 2016 & 2017.

« When JHU plays at Syracuse on March 9, the Blue Jays will be playing their fourth road game of the season. By comparison, Johns Hopkins didn't play its fourth road game last season until April 1 (@ Rutgers), while its fourth road trips in 2017 (@ Ohio State - April 9) and 2016 (@ UMBC - March 30) also came at least three weeks later than it will in 2019.

JHU & SU - The Measuring Sticks

One of the great rivalries in college lacrosse renews itself for the 58th time as Johns Hopkins heads north to Syracuse this weekend.

No matter how you look at it, Johns Hopkins and Syracuse are the benchmarks by which all other college lacrosse programs are measured.

Kuhn Wearing #19

Senior **Robert Kuhn** will wear #19 this season after wearing #10 in 2017 and 2018. The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through last spring, when he would have been a senior and nobody else wore 19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, head coach **Dave Pietramala** met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, Kuhn was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber.

Visitors to Homewood Field are greeted by a statue commemorating former Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse coach and Director of Athletics Robert H. Scott. The statue, which was unveiled in October 2016, is positioned at the main campus entrance to the stadium.

Scott, who passed away on September 15, 2016, spent 20 years as the men's lacrosse coach at Johns Hopkins (1955-74) and guided the Blue Jays to seven national championships, including the program's first NCAA title in 1974. He continued to serve the University as the Director of Athletics until 1995.

Many Johns Hopkins teams wore patches on their uniforms in honor of Scott the year after he died; the men's lacrosse patches included seven stars to commemorate his seven national championships.

Lending a Hand

« Through four games, 31 of Johns Hopkins' 45 goals have been assisted ... that's 68.9%. By comparison, JHU collected assists on 62.3% of its goals last season.

« For the record, the last time Johns Hopkins assisted on better than 65% of its goals for an entire season was in 2003, when the Blue Jays totaled 151 assists on 224 goals (67.4%).

Class Act

« Johns Hopkins has scored 45 goals and collected 31 assists for 76 points through four games with a strong balance in the scoring breakdown among the four classes.

« Blue Jay seniors lead the way with 14 goals, while the team's juniors lead the way with 11 assists. The contribution of the freshman class has been strong as well with 12 goals and 10 assists in four games. Below is a breakdown of the team's scoring by class thus far.

Non-Offensive Scoring

« With the addition of a shot clock this season, the pace of play has quickened and has resulted in more transition lacrosse. This has resulted in more scoring for Johns Hopkins' non-offensive players.

« Through four games, non-offensive players (defensemen, long & short-stick defensive middies and faceoff specialists) have accumulated six goals and eight assists for the Blue Jays.

« JHU's non-offensive players have combined for 11 points (5g, 6a) in the last two games. They combined for three goals and three assists in the 11-10 win at North Carolina and the group came back with two goals and three assists in the 14-12 win at Princeton.

« Johns Hopkins is 27-16 (.628) in overtime under the direction of head coach **Dave Pietramala**. JHU's last overtime game came in the first round of the 2018 NCAA Tournament, when the Blue Jays topped Georgetown, 10-9.

« Johns Hopkins has won seven of its last 10 overtime games.

One-Goal Wonders

« Including the 11-10 win at North Carolina, Johns Hopkins is 56-26 (.683) in one-goal games under head coach **Dave Pietramala**.

« The Blue Jays were 4-1 in one-goal games in 2018 and are 6-1 in their last seven one-goal games.

Blue Jays Top B1G Preseason Poll

« Johns Hopkins was the preseason favorite to claim the 2019 Big Ten title in a poll of the league's head coaches.

« JHU won the 2019 Big Ten Tournament title with a 13-10 victory over top-seeded Maryland. The tournament title was the second for Johns Hopkins, which also won the inaugural league crown in 2015.

« Ranks fourth on the team in scoring with five goals and one assist through four games.

« Tallied one goal and one assist against second-ranked Loyola.

« Scored what proved to be the game-winning goal in JHU's 11-10 win at 10th-ranked North Carolina.

« Tallied first career hat trick to lift JHU past Princeton, 14-12. Two of the three goals came during a 5-0 JHU run that turned a 9-7 deficit into a 12-9 lead.

« Scored four goals as a reserve attackman last season.

Taite Cattoni (Fr. | M) #89

« Has played on JHU's second midfield in the first four games of the season.

« Scored first career goal early in the third quarter against the Towson. One of three freshmen to record a point against Towson.

« Tallied once against second-ranked Loyola and came back with one goal and one assist at 10th-ranked North Carolina.

« Younger brother of former Blue Jay midfielder Holden Cattoni.

Owen Colwell (Jr. | D) #16

« Second-year starter on close defense. Had one GB and one CT at Towson in season opener and added a GB against second-ranked Loyola.

« Scored one goal and added one assist, two ground balls and one caused turnover in JHU's 11-10 win at 10th-ranked North Carolina.

- Johns Hopkins and Syracuse are meeting for the 58th time with Johns Hopkins holding a 30-26-1 advantage.
- One-goal games have been the norm in the series of late. 14 of the 30 meetings since 1995 have been decided by just one goal.
- Seven of the last 11 meetings at the Carrier Dome have been decided by one goal.
- 17 of the last 30 games between JHU and SU have been decided by two goals or less.
- The teams have met 13 times in the NCAA Tournament with Syracuse winning eight of the 13.
- One of the two teams has been ranked number one in the nation 20 times since the meeting in the 1983 NCAA title game.
- Johns Hopkins has beaten a top-ranked Syracuse team five times since 1994, including twice at the Carrier Dome (1995, 2001).
- Johns Hopkins is 5-2 all-time against Syracuse when entering the game as the top-ranked or top-seeded team in the nation. SU has never beaten JHU during the regular season with the Blue Jays ranked #1.
- Johns Hopkins and Syracuse met in the NCAA Tournament seven times between 1980 and 1992 with SU winning 4-of-7. The teams didn't meet again in the NCAAs until 2000, but have met six times since 2000 and five times since 2003 in the NCAA Tournament.
- Since 1980, there have been 20 instances where both teams entered the game ranked in the top five.
