## JOHNS HOPKINS VS. MARYLAND

#### The Game

- $^{\circ}$  Johns Hopkins (6-6, 2-2 B1G) closes the regular season as the Blue Jays travel to College Park to take on second-ranked Maryland (11-2, 3-1 B1G) in the 118th installment of the greatest rivalry in college lacrosse.
- « Johns Hopkins is coming off a 20-9 loss at top-ranked Penn State last Sunday.

#### The Facts

- « This is the 132nd season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883
- « Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 989-340-15.
- $^{\rm w}$  JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

#### **April Reign**

« JHU is 18-9 in its last 27 games in the month of April dating back to the 2014 season.

#### **Poll Position**

- $^{\prime\prime}$  Johns Hopkins is ranked 20th in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and is receiving votes in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. These are the two official in-season polls conducted throughout the regular season.
- « Maryland is the unanimous number-two team in the nation as the Terrapins are ranked second in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and second in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. Both complete polls can be found on page 12.

#### **Series History**

- $\,^{<}$  This week's game will be the 118th game in a series that dates to a 10-0 Johns Hopkins win in 1895.
- « JHU leads the all-time series 72-44-1 after the teams split a pair of games last season. Maryland claimed an 8-7 triple overtime win in the regular season, while the Blue Jays grabbed a 13-10 win in the rematch a week later in the B1G Championship game.
- $^{\rm w}$  In an odd twist, the visiting team has won six of the last eight regular season games dating back to 2011.

- « Johns Hopkins will wear two stickers on the back of its helmets in 2019.
- « The old Houston Oiler logo with "RSO" is for Ralph S. O'Connor, a 1951 Johns Hopkins graduate, who passed away on December 30, 2018. O'Connor was a long-time supporter of the Blue Jay lacrosse program. « The football with "JM" is for Jim Margraff, the Blue Jays' highly-successful football coach who passed
- away suddenly on January 2, 2019. Margraff guided his 2018 team to the NCAA Semifinals and was named Division III National Coach of the Year just two weeks before he died.



#### Things to Know - Maryland

- « Maryland welcomes JHU to Maryland Stadium having won three straight to improve to 11-2 overall and 3-1 in the B1G.
- « The Terps have scored at least 10 goals in all 13 games this season and 13+ in eight of the 13.
- « As always, UM is strong defensively as the Terps allow an average of just 9.8 goals per game and have held eight of 13 opponents to nine goals or less. The Terps rank 14th in the nation in scoring defense.
- Under the guidance of head coach John Tillman,
   UM continues to do all the little things well. The
   Terps clear at 88.1%, faceoff at 58.1%, are +69
   on ground balls and score on 34% of their shots.
   UM is +40 in scoring in the first half of its games,
   including +33 in the second quarter.
- « Maryland has won at least 10 games in a national-best 17 consecutive seasons. The next closest run of active consecutive 10-win seasons is 13 (Duke).

#### Terrapins to Watch

#### Jared Bernhardt (Jr. • A)

- « Two-time All-American and Maryland's leading scorer with 40 goals and 24 assists entering this week's game against JHU.
- « Recorded 100th career goal with the game-winner in overtime last week at Ohio State. 15th player in school history to score 100+ goals. Tallied 100th career point earlier this season in a win against Colgate.
- « MVP of the 2017 U-19 World Championships.

#### Austin Henningsen (Sr. • FO)

- $^{\rm w}$  Has won 138-of-222 (.622) faceoffs this season and counts a team-high 62 GBs to his credit.
- « Three-time Big Ten Specialist of the Week this season and became just the fourth Maryland player to win 500 faceoffs when he reached the mark on April 14 at Rutgers.

#### Logan Wisnauskas (So. • A)

- « Maryland's leading scorer with 37 goals and 28 assists for 65 points. Ranks 10th in the nation and third among sophomores in points per game (5.0).
- « Recorded 100th career point in a 16-12 win over Michigan on April 6. Reached 100-point mark quicker than any Maryland player in history (29 games).

#### **B1G Tournament - What We Know**

- « Entering this week's action, three teams have clinched berths in the upcoming B1G Tournament (Penn State, Maryland, Rutgers) with Johns Hopkins and Ohio State in contention for the fourth and final spot in the tournament.
- « **Penn State** has clinched the top seed in the tournament.
- « Maryland secures the #2 seed with a win against JHU. Maryland plays in the twothree game in every scenario that could play out this weekend..
- « **Rutgers** will play in the two-three game with a win coupled with a Maryland win against Johns Hopkins. In every other scenario, Rutgers will be the #4 seed and play Penn State in the semifinals.

This Week's Games Johns Hopkins @ Maryland (Apr. 27) Ohio State @ Michigan (Apr. 26)

Rutgers @ Penn State (Apr. 27)

- « **Johns Hopkins** clinches a spot with a win on Saturday or a loss by Ohio State or Rutgers. The only scenario where the Blue Jays don't make the tournament is with a loss coupled with wins by Ohio State and Rutgers. In short, a two-way tie for fourth place between JHU and OSU goes to the Buckeyes.
- « **Ohio State** can only make the tournament with a win coupled with wins by Maryland and Rutgers. There is no other scenario where the Buckeyes make the tournament.
- « Michigan has been eliminated from contention for a berth in the tournament.

#### On This Date

- « This week's game against Maryland will be Johns Hopkins' 12th game on April 27th since 1955 (dates for games prior to 1955 not all available). The Blue Jays are 9-2 in the previous 11 games played on this date.
- « Among the notable efforts on this date are a 24-10 win over Navy in 1985 (current volunteer assistant coach **Larry Quinn** was JHU's starting goalie that day).

#### **At Maryland Stadium**

« Johns Hopkins is 8-1 in its last nine games played at Maryland Stadium. The Blue Jays topped Maryland here in 2003, 2005, 2007, 2011, 2013 and 2015 and won a pair of games in the B1G Tournament in 2015. JHU fell to Maryland, 12-5, in its last trip to Maryland Stadium.

#### **Kuhn Wearing #19**

Senior **Robert Kuhn** will wear #19 this season after wearing #10 in 2017 and 2018. The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through last spring, when he would have been a senior and nobody else wore 19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, head coach Dave Pietramala met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, Kuhn was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber.

Visitors to Homewood Field are greeted by a statue commemorating former Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse coach and Director of Athletics Robert H. Scott. The statue, which was unveiled in October 2016, is positioned at the main campus entrance to the stadium.

Scott, who passed away on September 15, 2016, spent 20 years as the men's lacrosse coach at Johns Hopkins (1955-74) and guided the Blue Jays to seven national championships, including the program's first NCAA title in 1974. He continued to serve the University as the Director of Athletics until 1995.

Many Johns Hopkins teams wore patches on their uniforms in honor of Scott the year after he died; the men's lacrosse patches included seven stars to commemorate his seven national championships.

#### For What It's Worth

- « This week's game will be JHU's 13th game of the season. Not including their games against JHU, the Blue Jays' first 12 opponents are a combined 93-47 (.664) through games of April 23. That ranks as the second-best opponent winning percentage in the nation.
- « Johns Hopkins' 13 regular season opponents are currently a combined 104-49 (.680). That ranks as the highest opponent win percentage in the nation.

#### **Into Something B1G**

- « This week's game against Maryland is the fifth of five straight to close the regular season against Big Ten opponents for Johns Hopkins.

#### **Doing the Little Things**

« In the last nine games, JHU is 167-of-195 (.856) on clears and has won 158-of-269 (.587) faceoffs. This is a big improvement from the Blue Jays' first two games of the season, when they were 28-of-40 (.700) on clears and 25-of-61 (.417) on faceoffs in losses to Towson and Loyola.

#### **Lending a Hand**

- $^{\rm w}$  Through 12 games, 86 of Johns Hopkins' 140 goals have been assisted ... that's 61.4%. By comparison, JHU collected assists on 62.3% of its goals last season.
- « For the record, the last time Johns Hopkins assisted on better than 65% of its goals for an entire season was in 2003, when the Blue Jays totaled 151 assists on 224 goals (67.4%).

#### **Spreading it Around**

- « Johns Hopkins has 18 different goal-scorers and 23 different players have registered at least one point through 12 games.
- « By comparison, Maryland has 14 players who have scored at least one goal and 16 players have registered at least one point for the Terps.

#### 10+

« Johns Hopkins was held to nine goals in last week's loss at top-ranked Penn State. This snapped a streak of 10 straight games in which the Blue Jays had scored 10+ goals and a run of six consecutive games with 11+.

#### **Class Act**

- $^{\circ}$  Johns Hopkins has scored 140 goals and collected 86 assists for 226 points through 12 games with a strong balance in the scoring breakdown among the four classes.
- $^{\rm w}$  Blue Jay seniors lead the way with 43 goals and 65 points, while the team's juniors lead the way with 23 assists.
- $^{\circ}$  The balance in scoring has been remarkable as each class has totaled at least 24 goals and 45 points through 12 games. The freshman, junior and senior classes all have at least 57 points in 12 games.

#### **Non-Offensive Scoring**

- « With the addition of a shot clock this season, the pace of play has quickened and has resulted in more transition lacrosse. This has resulted in more scoring for Johns Hopkins' non-offensive players.
- « Through 12 games, non-offensive players (defensemen, long & short-stick defensive middies, faceoff specialists & goalies) have accumulated 11 goals and 19 assists (30 points) for the Blue Jays.
- « By comparison, in 17 games last season, the Blue Jays' non-offensive players totaled 10 goals and 7 assists (17 points).
- « JHU's non-offensive players have combined for 27 points (10g, 17a) in the last 10 games an average of nearly three points per game. They combined for three goals and three assists in the 11-10 win at North Carolina and two goals and three assists in the wins

over Princeton and Rutgers.

#### **Winningest Program in Lacrosse History**

- $^{\rm w}$  Johns Hopkins enters this week's game against Maryland with an all-time record of 989-340-15 to rank as the all-time winningest program in college lacrosse history.
- « JHU is one of just seven schools with 700+ victories, one of just four with 800+ wins and one of two that has won 900 or more games.

- « Johns Hopkins is 27-16 (.628) in overtime under the direction of head coach **Dave Pietramala**. JHU's last overtime game came in the first round of the 2018 NCAA Tournament, when the Blue Jays topped Georgetown, 10-9.
- « Johns Hopkins has won seven of its last 10 overtime games.

#### **One-Goal Wonders**

- « The Blue Jays were 4-1 in one-goal games in 2018 and are 6-2 in their last eight one-goal games.

#### Brett Baskin (So. | A)

- « Tied for sixth on the team in scoring with nine goals and three assists through 12 games.
- « Tallied one goal and one assist against second-ranked Loyola.
- « Scored what proved to be the game-winning goal in JHU's 11-10 win at 10th-ranked North Carolina.
- « Tallied first career hat trick to lift JHU past Princeton, 14-12. Two of the three goals came during a 5-0 JHU run that turned a 9-7 deficit into a 12-9 lead.
- « Added an assist at Syracuse and scored twice in the 11-4 win over Mount St. Mary's.
- « Pushed point-scoring streak to five games with a goal against Delaware and six games with an assist against Virginia before streak was snapped at Michigan.
- « Scored once against top-ranked Penn State.

The Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse team is partnered with the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation (FOJ). This is the third time the Blue Jays have partnered with FOJ.

The Blue Jays "adopted" **Connor Durgin** on October 7, 2015 and he has been a fixture at games and other team events since then. He took part in the pregame meeting with officials and team captains when the Blue Jays hosted Syracuse on March 19, 2016 and made the trip to Penn State a month later and made the Blue Jays' call on the coin toss (tails), which JHU won.

The Friends of Jaclyn Foundation's mission is to improve the quality of life for children battling pediatric brain tumors and other childhood cancers and to raise awareness through the Adopt-a-Child, Safe on the Sidelines and Guardian Angel Programs. FOJ does this by pairing the afflicted child and their siblings with local high school and college sports teams.


