#### JOHNS HOPKINS VS. LOYOLA MARYLAND

#### **The Game**

- · Johns Hopkins hits the road for the first time in 2020 as the Blue Jays (1-0) make the short trip to Loyola Maryland (0-1).
- · The Blue Jays opened the season with a 15-7 win over Towson last Saturday at Homewood Field. Also last Saturday, the Greyhounds dropped a tight 12-9 decision at defending national champion Virginia.

#### **The Facts**

- « This is the 133rd season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
- « Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 992-342-15.
- « JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

#### **For Openers**

- The Blue Jays improved to 17-3 in season openers under head coach Dave Pietramala with last week's win against Towson.
- « Johns Hopkins has scored at least 10 goals in its season opener in 12 of the last 13 years and at least 12 goals in seven of the last nine.

#### **In February**

- « This week's game against Loyola will be the 42nd all-time for Johns Hopkins in the month
- « JHU is 29-12 (.707) all-time in games played in the month of February.
- « Johns Hopkins played its first game in the month of February in 1998, didn't play again in February until 2004 and has now played at least one game in the opening month of the season every year since 2006.

#### **Poll Position**

« Johns Hopkins is ranked 10th in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and 11th in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. The Blue Jays made slight jumps from 11th (USILA) and 13th (Inside Lacrosse Media) in the preseason polls after last week's season-opening win. Loyola is ranked 16th in both polls this week.

- « This week's game will be the 57th between Johns Hopkins and Loyola. The series dates to a 20-1 Blue Jay victory in 1939.
- $^{\mbox{\tiny (4)}}$  JHU leads the all-time series 48-8, although Loyola has won two straight and five of the last six against Johns Hopkins.
- « The visiting team has won four of the last nine games in the series.

is the only lacrosse program in the nation - men or women - with its own exclusive national television agreement.



#### Things to Know-Loyola

- « Loyola welcomes Johns Hopkins to the Ridley Athletic Complex after dropping a hard-fought 12-9 decision at Virginia last Saturday.
- « The Greyhounds fell behind the Cavaliers 9-2 before staging a furious rally that fell just short.
- « Loyola outshot the Cavaliers 55-44, won 14-of-24 faceoffs and scored three extra-man goals in the loss.
- « The 'Hounds killed off the only UVA extra-man chance last week; a year ago, Loyola ranked fourth in the nation in man-down defense (.764).
- « Under head coach **Charley Toome**y, Loyola has scored 10 or more goals 134 timese and sports a 108-26 (.806) record in those 134 games.
- « Head coach **Charley Toomey** enters this week's game just four wins shy of 150 for his career.
- « Loyola was picked first in the Patriot League Preseason Poll of coaches for the seventh consecutive year.

#### Greyhounds to Watch

#### Kevin Lindley (Jr. • A)

- « Lindley scored two goals in the season opener against Virginia and enters this week's game against Johns Hopkins just one shy of 100 for his career.
- « With 99 career goals, Lindley is in line to become the 11th Loyola player to reach 100 and ranks second among all juniors nationally with his 99 career goals.

#### Ryan McNulty (Sr. • LSM)

- « Honorable Mention USILA All-American and First Team All-Patriot League selection last season after grabbing 65 ground balls and adding 25 caused turnovers.
- « A co-captain with two years of eligibility remaining after missing all but two games with an injury as a freshman, McNulty had one ground ball and two caused turnovers last week at Virginia. He helped lead a defensive effort that helped hold the high-scoring Cavaliers to just three goals in the second half.

#### Bailey Savio (Jr. • FO)

- « Savio has been a workhorse for the Greyhounds since arriving two years ago as he is 356-of-706 (.504) on faceoffs in his career.
- $^{\rm w}$  Savio set school records last season for faceoffs won (242) and attempted (471) and ground balls (141).
- $^{\rm w}$  Fueled the 'Hounds' effort last week at Virginia as he was 14-of-24 with eight ground balls.

#### **On This Date**

- « Johns Hopkins has played just one game on February 15 as the Blue Jays topped Towson, 15-8, on this date in 2014.
- « Of note that day against Towson Ryan Brown, Brandon Benn and John Crawley all scored four goals for the Blue Jays in the victory. That remains the last time Johns Hopkins has had three or more players score four or more goals in a game.

#### Johns Hopkins-Loyola Ties

- « Johns Hopkins associate head coach **Bill Dwan** is the older brother of Loyola assistant coach **Matt Dwan**.
- « Johns Hopkins head coach **Dave Pietramala** spent the 1993 and 1994 seasons as an assistant coach at Loyola under the direction of former Greyhound coach **Dave Cottle**.
- « This week's men's game is the second game of a doubleheader, which starts with the Blue Jay women taking on Loyola at 12 pm. The Johns Hopkins women's team is coached by **Janine Tucker**, who was a standout women's lacrosse player at Loyola from 1986-89.

#### **Williams Fuels Victory**

- « Senior attackman **Cole Williams** scored three goals and added four assists for seven points to fuel the 15-7 win over Towson in the season opener.
- « The four assists and seven points were both career highs for Williams, who added three ground balls in the win and was named to the USILA Team of the Week for his efforts.
- « Williams bumped his career totals to 71 goals and 41 assists for 112 points with his seven-point effort.
- $^{\prime\prime}$  The seven points are the most by a Johns Hopkins player in a season opener since **Ryan Brown** had seven in a 16-4 win over UMBC in the 2015 season opener.
- $^{\prime\prime}$  In his last 11 games dating back to last season, Williams has 24 goals and 17 assists for 41 points and has registered at least two points in all 11 of those game and three or more points in eight of the 11.

#### Smith Wearing #19

Senior **Forry Smith** is wearing #19 this season after wearing #20 as a freshman in 2017 and #4 in 2018 and 2019.

The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through the 2018 season, when he would have been a senior and nobody else wore #19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, head coach **Dave Pietramala** met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, **Robert Kuhn** was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber. Smith was then choosen by last year's seniors to wear #19 in 2020.

#### **First-Time Starters**

- « Johns Hopkins trotted out a lineup that included four first-time starters last Saturday against Towson.
- « Junior **Brett Baskin** played 27 games in his first two seasons, but got the first start of his career on attack. He scored one goal in the victory.
- « Sophomore midfielder **Evan Zinn** played in all 16 games last season and responded with two goals and one assist in his first career start last week against the Tigers.
- « Senior **Jack Lyne** and sophomore **Owen McManus** both earned starts on close defense in the opener against Towson. Lyne had played in two career games (both in 2018) as an LSM and McManus played in 11 games last season as freshman at SSDM. They helped hold the Tigers to just seven goals in the victory.

#### **Degnon, Murphy Net First Career Goals**

« Sophomore midfielder **Garrett Degnon** scored three goals in the win against the Tigers - the first three goals of his career. Freshman attackman **Owen Murphy** scored one goal and added one assist in the victory. His lone goal came on the first shot of his career.

#### **Holding Them Down**

- « The Johns Hopkins defense, with two new starters on close defense, a new regular at the #1 LSM spot and a freshman at the other and three of four SSDMs seeing the first extensive playing time of their career, turned in a strong effort against Towson.
- $^{\rm w}$  The Blue Jays held the Tigers scoreless for stretches of 17:42, 15:18 and 13:36 to fuel the victory.
- « Towson scored just once in the first 20:08 of the game, then scored five goals in a span of just over 11 minutes before being held to just one goal over the final 28:54.

#### **Returning Firepower**

- « Johns Hopkins scored 194 goals and added 117 assists for 311 points during the 2019 season.
- « The Blue Jays return players who scored 80.4% of their goals (156), amassed 82.1% of their assists (96) and accounted for 81.% of the team's points (256) in 2019.
- « Johns Hopkins is one of just 17 teams in the nation that returns players who accounted for 80% or more of its goals and assists from last season.

#### Prouty, Narewski Off to Quick Starts

- « Junior **Kyle Prouty** and sophomore **Matt Narewski** combined to win 20-of-26 faceoffs with 12 ground balls and one goal in the win against Towson. Prouty went 14-of-19 and had eight ground balls, while Narewski was 6-of-7 with four ground balls and one goal.
- $^{\circ}$  Did you know that Prouty (229) and Narewski (211) combined to take 440 of the 450 faceoffs Johns Hopkins attempted during the 2019 season? Johns Hopkins is one of just two teams in the nation that returns two players who attempted 200 or more faceoffs last season.
- $^{\circ}$  The only other team in the nation with two players returning who took 200+ faceoffs in 2019 is Brown (Matt McShea, Jason Simaan).

#### Extra-Extra

- « Johns Hopkins finished fifth in the nation in extra-man offense last season as the Blue Jays converted on 26-of-57 (.456) EMO chances and opened the 2020 season by converting on 1-of-2 against Towson.
- « Players who totaled 19 of those 26 extra-man goals return as **Joey Epstein** (6), **Alex Concannon** (6), **Forry Smith** (4) and **Luke Shilling** (3) were all part of the Blue Jay EMO unit in 2019.
- « Clicking at better than 40% on extra-man is nothing new for the Blue Jays as JHU has converted on 40% or better in seven of the last eight years and nine of 13 seasons under offensive coordinator **Bobby Benson**.

#### **Blue Jays Third BIG Preseason Poll**

- $^{\rm w}$  Johns Hopkins was picked to finish third in the 2020 Big Ten Preseason Poll of the league's head coaches.
- « Since the formation of the Big Ten in 2015, Johns Hopkins has won the Big Ten Tournament title twice (2015, 2018) and advanced to the title game one other time (2019).

#### **Strength of Schedule**

- $^{\circ}$  Johns Hopkins will play 13 regular season games against teams that compiled a combined record of 119-76 (.610) in 2019.
- « Six of the first seven teams on the Blue Jays' 2020 schedule posted winning records in 2019 and the seventh (Princeton), went 7-7 (.500). In all, 10 of JHU's 13 opponents this season finished with a record of .500 or better (nine were above .500).
- « JHU will not play a team that finished under .500 last season until visiting Navy (6-7) on March 14. Two of the three teams on JHU's 2020 schedule that finished under .500 last season were just one game under (Navy, Rutgers).

#### **Against the Patriot League**

- $\ll$  This week's game against Loyola will be the 253rd all-time for Johns Hopkins against a team currently in the Patriot League.
- $\scriptstyle\rm ($  Johns Hopkins is 192-59-1 (.764) all-time against current Patriot League members.
- « 215 of the 252 games the Blue Jays have played against Patriot League members have come against Army (69), Loyola (56) and Navy (90).

- Passed Bob Scott as the winningest coach in Johns Hopkins history with a 16-4 win over UMBC on February 7, 2015.
- · Has won two national championships as the head coach at Johns Hopkins (2005, 2007).
- Has guided the Blue Jays to the NCAA Tournament 18 times in his 19 full years as the head coach at Homewood. The Blue Jays have advanced to the Final Four seven times under his guidance.
- One of just two coaches to earn National Coach of the Year honors at two schools (Cornell-2000, Johns Hopkins-2002).
- Only person in the history of college lacrosse to earn NCAA Division I Player of the Year honors (1989) and Division I Coach of the Year honors (2000, 2002).
- Only person in the history of college lacrosse to win an NCAA Division I Championship as a player (1987) and a head coach (2005, 2007).
- Generally considered the greatest defensive player in the history of college lacrosse. He earned First Team All-America honors in 1987, 1988 and 1989 and won the Schmeisser Award as the nation's top defenseman in 1988 and 1989.
