## JOHNS HOPKINS VS. SYRACUSE

### The Game

« Johns Hopkins (1-3) returns to Homewood Field and welcomes top-ranked Syracuse (4-0) to open the month of March.  
« The Blue Jays dropped an 18-11 decision at now sixth-ranked Princeton last Saturday. The Orange improved to 4-0 with a 21-13 win against previously unbeaten Hobart last Friday night in the Carrier Dome.

### The Facts

« This is the 133rd season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.  
« Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 992-345-15.  
« JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

### Poll Position

« Johns Hopkins is not ranked this week in either the USILA Coaches Poll or the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. Syracuse is ranked number one in both polls.

### Against Number One

« Johns Hopkins will be playing the number-one ranked team in the nation for the 18th time under the direction of head coach **Dave Pietramala** (2001-Present).  
« The Blue Jays are 9-8 all-time against the top-ranked team in the nation under Pietramala, including 3-2 against a number-one-ranked Syracuse team (2001-W, 2002-W, 2011-L, 2015-L, 2015-W).  
« All five games the Blue Jays have played against Syracuse under Pietramala when the Orange have been ranked number one have been decided by three goals or less and four of the five have been one-goal affairs.

### Series History

« This week's game will be the 59th between Johns Hopkins and Syracuse. The series dates to a 4-4 tie in 1921.  
« JHU leads the all-time series 30-27-1 and the teams have split the last six games dating back to 2015.  
« The visiting team has won three of the last six.  
« Complete series history can be found on page 14.

### SU Returns to Homewood for First Time Since 2017

« Syracuse is making its first trip to Homewood Field since 2017 after JHU made back-to-back appearances at the Carrier Dome.  
« After hosting Syracuse in a regularly-scheduled game in 2016, Johns Hopkins also hosted the Orange in 2017 due to a conflict with the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Tournament at the Carrier Dome. The Blue Jays returned the favor and played at SU in 2018 and 2019.  
« To avoid future possible conflicts with basketball at the Carrier Dome, the Hopkins-Syracuse game was also moved up a week.

All Johns Hopkins home games air on the ESPN family of networks with a majority of the games airing on ESPN. Johns Hopkins is the only lacrosse program in the nation - men or women - with its own exclusive national television agreement.



**Things to Know - Syracuse**

« Top-ranked Syracuse comes to Homewood Field for the first time since 2017 fresh off a 21-13 win over Hobart that moved the Orange to 4-0.

« SU tops the USILA Coaches Poll for the first time since 2017 and the 98th time overall since the poll debuted in 1973. Only Johns Hopkins (103) has been ranked number one more times than Syracuse.

« The Orange will bring the nation's sixth-ranked scoring offense to Baltimore as SU is averaging 17.0 goals per game and has scored 21 goals twice on the year.

« While the offense grabs the attention, the SU defense is also among the nation's best. The Orange rank 15th nationally in scoring defense (9.5) and fourth in caused turnovers per game (10.75).

« Syracuse has outscored its four opponents 42-19 in the second half of its games this season.

« SU specializes in playing make-it-take-it. The Orange have won 82-of-121 (.678) faceoffs on the year to rank seventh in the nation in faceoff winning percentage.

**Orange to Watch****Jakob Phaup (Jr. • FO)**

« Phaup has won 44-of-63 (.698) faceoffs with 28 ground balls in four games; he ranks seventh in the nation in faceoff winning percentage.

« Led the ACC in faceoff winning percentage last season (.606) and was 8-of-14 in a win against Johns Hopkins.

**Drake Porter (Sr. • G)**

« Porter has started all four games in goal for the Orange this season and boasts a 9.81 goals against average and a .558 save percentage. He had 18 saves earlier this season against Army - the most by an SU goalie since 2010.

« Earned All-ACC honors last season when he ranked eight in the nation in save percentage (.562).

**Jamie Trimboli (Sr. • M)**

« A two-time Honorable Mention USILA All-American, Trimboli is tied for the team-lead in goals (13) and tied for second in points (15).

« Enters this week's game against Johns Hopkins with 71 goals and 23 assists for 94 points. Needs six points to become the third SU middle in the last decade to reach 100 career points.

**On This Date**

« This week's game against Syracuse will be the seventh game Johns Hopkins has played on March 7.

« The Blue Jays are 5-1 all-time in games played on March 7 and have currently won five straight.

« The first game JHU ever played on this date was in 1987, when the Blue Jays fell at .... Syracuse, 15-14. Making his first career start for the Blue Jays on defense that day was a sophomore named ... Dave Pietramala.

**A Tough Stretch**

« This week's game against Syracuse is the third of three straight for JHU against teams that are currently unbeaten. The Blue Jays played North Carolina (5-0) on February 22, traveled to Princeton (4-0) last week and return home to host Syracuse (4-0) third week.

« Including the game against Syracuse, Johns Hopkins' last four opponents (Loyola, North Carolina, Princeton, Syracuse) are currently a combined 17-1.

**Balanced Scoring**

« Through four games, Johns Hopkins has scored 43 goals with 23 of those being assisted. The scoring for the Blue Jays has been fairly balanced by class thus far with significant contributions from the sophomore and senior classes:

**Young Defense Growing**

« The Johns Hopkins defense features two new starters on close defense, a new regular at the #1 LSM spot and a freshman at the other and three of four SSDMs seeing the first extensive playing time of their career.

« Against the same four opponents as last season, and with the large turnover in personnel noted above, the Blue Jays are allowing more than one goal per game less than they were at the same time in 2019.

« The Johns Hopkins defense has held the opposition scoreless for long stretches. Against Towson, the Tigers went without scoring for stretches of 17:42, 13:36 and 15:18. Despite the losses,

**Smith Wearing #19**

Senior **Forry Smith** is wearing #19 this season after wearing #20 as a freshman in 2017 and #4 in 2018 and 2019.

The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through the 2018 season, when he would have been a senior and nobody else wore #19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, head coach **Dave Pietramala** met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, **Robert Kuhn** was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber. Smith was then chosen by last year's seniors to wear #19 in 2020.

the Blue Jays also held Loyola off the board for periods of 11:55 and 11:37 and UNC went 9:58 at one point without scoring.

**Williams Pacing Offense**

« Senior attackman **Cole Williams** scored three goals and added four assists for seven points to fuel the 15-7 win over Towson in the season opener and added three goals in the setback against North Carolina.

« The four assists and seven points against the Tigers were both career highs for Williams, who added three ground balls in the win and was named to the USILA Team of the Week for his efforts.

« Williams bumped his career totals to 74 goals and 42 assists for 116 points with his three-goal effort against the Tar Heels and one assist at Princeton.

« The seven points Williams punched up against Towson are the most by a Johns Hopkins player in a season opener since **Ryan Brown** had seven in a 16-4 win over UMBC in the 2015 season opener.

« Williams has 27 goals and 18 assists for 45 points in his last 14 games and has registered at least two points in 12 of those games and three or more points in nine of the 14.

**Zinn, Degnon Off to Quick Starts**

« A year ago, **Evan Zinn** had nine points in 16 games as a freshman and classmate **Garrett Degnon** didn't register a point in three games. Things have changed drastically in one year as the two have combined for 14 goals and four assists in four games this season.

« Degnon recorded the first hat trick of his career, which of course were the first three goals of his career - in the win against Towson and added two goals and one assist at Loyola, two more goals against North Carolina and one against Princeton.

« Zinn had two goals and one assist against Towson, flipped that with a goal and two helpers at Loyola and added one goal against North Carolina and two against Princeton.

**Smith Streaking**

« Senior **Forry Smith** counts six goals and three assists to his credit this season after a one-goal, two-assist showing against North Carolina and one goal against Princeton.

« With his goal against the Tigers, Smith extended his point and goal-scoring streaks to eight games dating back to last season.

« In his last eight games, Smith has 16 goals and six assists for 22 points and has posted at least two points in seven of those games and three or more points in five of the eight.

**Epstein Emerging**

« While still working his way back into form, sophomore attackman **Joey Epstein** took another step in last week's game against Princeton as he registered two goals and two assists for four points against the Tigers. He now has three goals and three assists on the year.

« Epstein boosted his career totals to 51 goals and 28 assists for 79 points with his effort against Princeton. He ranks second among active JHU players in goals, assists and points.

« Epstein's first goal against Princeton was the 50th of his career and came in his 19th career game. He is just the sixth JHU player to reach 50 career goals in less than 20 games.

**First-Time Starters**

« Johns Hopkins trotted out a lineup that included four first-time starters in the season opener against Towson.

« Junior **Brett Baskin** played 27 games in his first two seasons, but got the first start of his career on attack against Towson. He scored one goal in the victory.

« Sophomore midfielder **Evan Zinn** played in all 16 games last season and responded with two goals and one assist in his first career start against the Tigers.

« Senior **Jack Lyne** and sophomore **Owen McManus** both earned starts on close defense in the opener against Towson. Lyne had played in two career games (both in 2018) as an LSM and McManus played in 11 games last season as a freshman at SSDM. They helped hold the Tigers to just seven goals in the victory.

**Prouty, Narewski Strong at the X**

« Junior **Kyle Prouty** and sophomore **Matt Narewski** have combined to win 67-of-109 (.615) faceoffs on the year with 28 combined ground balls. Together, they are helping Johns Hopkins rank 12th in the nation in team faceoff winning percentage in the early season.

« The pair combined to win 20-of-26 faceoffs with 12 ground balls and one goal in the win against Towson. Prouty went 14-of-19 and had eight ground balls, while Narewski was 6-of-7 with four ground balls and one goal.

« Against North Carolina, Prouty went 15-of-26 and Narewski won 3-of-4, while they combined to win 21-of-33 against Princeton with Prouty going 14-of-22 and Narewski winning 7-of-11.

« Did you know that Prouty (229) and Narewski (211) combined to take 440 of the 450 faceoffs Johns Hopkins attempted during the 2019 season? Johns Hopkins is one of just two teams in the

nation that returns two players who attempted 200 or more faceoffs last season.

« The only other team in the nation with two players returning who took 200+ faceoffs in 2019 is Brown (Matt McShea, Jason Simaan).

**Extra-Extra**

« Johns Hopkins finished fifth in the nation in extra-man offense last season as the Blue Jays converted on 26-of-57 (.456) EMO chances and have opened the season by connecting on 6-of-12 (.500) chances, including 4-of-5 last week at Princeton. JHU is currently tied for 16th in the nation in extra-man offense.

« Clicking at better than 40% on extra-man is nothing new for the Blue Jays as JHU has converted on 40% or better in seven of the last eight years and nine of 13 seasons under offensive coordinator **Bobby Benson**.

**Against the ACC**

« This week's game against Syracuse will be the 228th all-time for Johns Hopkins against a team currently in the ACC.

« Johns Hopkins is 133-92-2 (.590) all-time against current ACC members.

« Johns Hopkins has played 52 all-time NCAA Tournament games against current ACC teams. The Blue Jays are 28-24 all-time in the NCAAAs against the five teams currently competing in the ACC.

« Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 992-345-15 to rank as the all-time winningest program in college lacrosse history.

« JHU is one of just seven schools with 700+ victories, one of just five with 800+ wins and one of two that has won 900 or more games.

**Pietramala Sixth in Wins Among Active Head Coaches**

### Noting Dave Pietramala

- Boasts a 206-91 (.694) record since taking over as the head coach at Johns Hopkins and an overall record of 229-108 (.680) in his 23 years as a college head coach.
- Passed Bob Scott as the winningest coach in Johns Hopkins history with a 16-4 win over UMBC on February 7, 2015.
- Has won two national championships as the head coach at Johns Hopkins (2005, 2007).
- Has guided the Blue Jays to the NCAA Tournament 18 times in his 19 full years as the head coach at Homewood. The Blue Jays have advanced to the Final Four seven times under his guidance.
- One of just two coaches to earn National Coach of the Year honors at two schools (Cornell-2000, Johns Hopkins-2002).
- Only person in the history of college lacrosse to earn NCAA Division I Player of the Year honors (1989) and Division I Coach of the Year honors (2000, 2002).
- Only person in the history of college lacrosse to win an NCAA Division I Championship as a player (1987) and a head coach (2005, 2007).
- Generally considered the greatest defensive player in the history of college lacrosse. He earned First Team All-America honors in 1987, 1988 and 1989 and won the Schmeisser Award as the nation's top defenseman in 1988 and 1989. - Johns Hopkins and Syracuse are meeting for the 59th time with Johns Hopkins holding a 30-27-1 advantage.
- One-goal games have been the norm in the series of late. 14 of the 31 meetings since 1995 have been decided by just one goal.
- Seven of the last 12 meetings at the Carrier Dome have been decided by one goal.
- 17 of the last 31 games between JHU and SU have been decided by two goals or less.
- The teams have met 13 times in the NCAA Tournament with Syracuse winning eight of the 13.
- One of the two teams has been ranked number one in the nation 21 times since the meeting in the 1983 NCAA title game (including this year).
- Johns Hopkins has beaten a top-ranked Syracuse team five times since 1994, including twice at the Carrier Dome (1995, 2001).
- Johns Hopkins is 5-2 all-time against Syracuse when entering the game as the top-ranked or top-seeded team in the nation. SU has never beaten JHU during the regular season with the Blue Jays ranked #1.
- Johns Hopkins and Syracuse met in the NCAA Tournament seven times between 1980 and 1992 with SU winning 4-of-7. The teams didn't meet again in the NAAs until 2000, but have met six times since 2000.
- Since 1980, there have been 20 instances where both teams entered the game ranked in the top five.
