2018 FB

Scored a decisive first-round win over the 2014 women's lacrosse team with 71.1% of the vote

Posted a 12-2 record. 12 wins are the most in school history

Advanced to the NCAA Semifinals for the first time in program history. Fell to perennial power Mount Union, 28-20, on the road in the NCAA Semifinals

Won 10th consecutive Centennial Conference title

Won 11 consecutive games after dropping second game of the season

Team averaged school-records of 45.8 points and 550.9 yards per game and finished the season ranked a program-best 5th in the nation

Produced two All-Americans and two Academic All-Americans

Easily knocked off the 2017 women's fencing team with 76.9% of the vote in the first round

Advanced to the NCAA Semifinals for the first time in school history by knocking off Farmingdale St, SUNY Geneseo, Carnegie Mellon and Thomas More in the NAAs
Three of four losses on the year were one-goal setbacks to teams ranked in the top 10, including a 2-1 overtime loss to eventual national champion Lynchburg
Ended season ranked third in the nation - the highest season-ending ranking in program history
Produced two All-Americans and one Academic All-American

2014 WSwim

More than doubled up the 2012 men's tennis team in the first round (68.8% - 31.2%)

Recorded a 6-2 dual-meet record with both losses coming to Division I teams
Blue Jays won all five relays at the NCAA Championships to become first team to do that since Kenyon in 2014

2019 VB

Cruised past the 2015 water polo team in the first round by taking nearly 75% of the vote (74.7%)
Won the program's first national championship
Posted a perfect 35-0 record to become the first unbeaten Division III Volleyball National Champion since 1999 and just the third overall
Went 10-0 in the Centennial Conference and won both matches in the conference tournament without dropping a set
Won an amazing 40 consecutive sets over a span of 14 matches
Produced a program-record four All-Americans, including first team selections in Natalie Aston and Simone Bliss

2016 FB

Edged the 2019 men's cross country team in the first round by nabbing 54.1% of ballots cast
Posted an 11-1 record, including a 10-0 mark in the regular season (fourth straight 10-0 regular season)
Won eighth straight Centennial Conference title and outscored the opposition 497-234 in 12 games
Team was ranked as high as sixth in the nation and ended year ranked ninth (3rd-highest season-ending ranking in program history)
Only loss of the season was a 28-21 setback to perennial power Mount Union in second round of the NCAA Playoffs
Team produced two All-Americans and three Academic All-Americans

Beat top-ranked and previously unbeaten Swarthmore on the road on a buzzer-beater in the Centennial title game
Qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the second time in three years and fourth time since 2014

Easily moved past 2012 women's basketball in first round with 71.9% of the vote

Posted a 44-7 record. 44 wins are a school record and team led the nation in winning percentage (.863)

Won 30 consecutive games from March 18 through May 21 ... 2nd-longest winning streak in school history

Won Centennial Conference and NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional Titles

Placed 5th at the Division III World Series

Ranked #1 in the nation for five consecutive weeks late in second half of the season after starting year ranked #25

Led the nation in several statistical categories, including home runs (80), hits (696), runs scored (554) and total bases (1,096)

2011 MLax

Posted a 13-3 record with by far the youngest team in the nation

13 wins are the most by JHU in the last 15 years

Ranked outside the top 10 in the nation as late as March 20, but won eight straight games to jump to as high as #2 in the nation

Beat Hofstra in the first round of the NCAA Tournament before falling to Denver in the NCAA Quarterfinals

Finished in the top 10 in the nation in seven different statistical categories, including scoring offense (11.25), scoring defense (7.25), scoring margin (+4.0) and faceoff winning percentage (.649)

Produced six All-Americans, including two first team selections and two second team picks - only 2 of the 6 were seniors and 3 of the 6 were sophomores

Earned two individual national titles (along with the five relays) to earn a program-record seven national championships

Team accumulated 19 All-America finishes at the NCAAs, including 14 individuals to go along with the five relays

2012 MTen

Posted a 19-5 record. The 19 wins are tied for the fourth-most in school history.

Won sixth consecutive Centennial Conference title. Went 9-0 in CC in regular season and won CC Semifinal and Final by identical 5-1 scores

Advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals for the first time in school history with wins over Etown (5-0) and 12th-ranked Middlebury (5-2) round of 32 and Sweet 16, respectively

Dropped a 5-4 heart-breaker to second-ranked and eventual national champion Emory in the NCAA Quarterfinals. Emory finished 25-0 and had just two matches end 5-4 all season

Finished the season ranked eighth in the nation - at the time, that was the highest season-ending ranking in school history (still ranks second best)

Fifth-place finish at the NCAAs is the highest in program history

Junior Jared Pangallozzi placed fourth at the the NCAAs - the highest individual finish in school history

Team was ranked in the top 10 throughout the season and as high as fifth (once during regular season and final ranking)

2016 Football

Posted an 11-1 record, including a 10-0 mark in the regular season (fourth straight 10-0 regular season)

Won eighth straight Centennial Conference title and outscored the opposition 497-234 in 12 games

Team was ranked as high as sixth in the nation and ended year ranked ninth (3rd-highest season-ending ranking in program history)

Only loss of the season was a 28-21 setback to perennial power Mount Union in second round of the NCAA Playoffs

Won an amazing 40 consecutive sets over a span of 14 matches

Produced a program-record four All-Americans, including first team selections in Natalie Aston and Simone Bliss

2015 Water Polo

Posted a 21-10 record

Won the program's 16th CWPA Division III Eastern Championship

Advanced to the CWPA Southern Division Championship match before falling to Princeton, 16-12
Fell one goal shy of reaching the NCAA Final Four as the Blue Jays lost to Princeton, 7-6, in the CWPA Eastern Championship game
21 wins are tied for third-best in school history and one of just four 20-win seasons in program history

2012 Women's Basketball (28.1%) vs. 2014 Women's Cross Country (71.9%)

2012 WBB

Posted a 24-5 record, including a 17-3 Centennial Conference mark
24 wins were one shy of school record and most in the last 15 years
Advanced to the Centennial title game
Advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament
Spent four weeks ranked in the top 25 in the nation - ranked as high as 22nd

2014 WXC

NCAA Division III Champions (3rd straight title)
NCAA Mid-east Regional & Centennial Conference Champions
87 points at NCAAs is the second-lowest score by JHU in its six national championship seasons
Had four runners earn All-America honors with top 35 finishes at the NCAAs
All five of JHU's scoring runners at the NCAAs placed in the top 40 - only time in program history

2019 FH

Tied school record for wins in a season (19) and went a perfect 10-0 in Centennial Conference regular season play
Won second consecutive Centennial Conference title

Beat 11th-ranked Messiah (Sweet 16) and 4th-ranked Tufts (Quarterfinals) in first two rounds of the NCAAs
Finished season ranked 5th in the nation and posted six wins against teams ranked in the top 15

2020 MBB

Posted a 24-4 record, including a 16-2 mark in the Centennial Conference
Won second Centennial title in three seasons and fifth overall
Beat top-ranked and previously unbeaten Swarthmore on the road on a buzzer-beater in the Centennial title game

Won the ITA Team National Indoor Championship

Claimed eighth straight Centennial Conference title - dropped just three sets in 10 regular season and two CC Tournament matches

Advanced to the NCAA Semifinals for the first time in program history

All three losses to teams ranked in top three in the nation

Ended season ranked fourth in the nation

2012 Wrest

Won program's first Centennial Conference title - first conference title in wrestling for JHU since 1954

Produced five Centennial Conference Champions - the most in school history

Had a program-best five wrestlers qualify for the NCAA Championships

Two individuals - freshman Paul Bewak and junior Reid Mosquera - earned All-America honors with 7th and 8th place finishes, respectively, at the NCAAs

Placed 27th as a team at the NCAA Championships

Game 5 (June 12)

2017 Men's Swimming (39.5%) vs. 2011 Women's Soccer (60.5%)

2017 MSwim

Placed 4th at the NCAA Championships

Posted an 8-5 record ... three of five losses came to Division I opponents

Had one individual national champion (Evan Holder – 200 Free)

Had 20 All-America finishes at the NCAA Championships, including 12 first team (placed 1st – 8th) and eight honorable mention (9-16)

Produced 10 top-five finishes at the NCAAs, including five individual (2nd, 2nd, 1st, 3rd, 2nd) and all five relays (5th, 2nd, 3rd, 2nd, 5th)

2011 WSoc

Posted a 21-1 record – first 20-win season in school history

Advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 before suffering first loss of the season to end magical run

21 straight wins to start the year is the longest winning streak in program history

Went 10-0 in Centennial regular season and won conference tournament for 7th straight year

Outscored opposition 92-11 on the year – 92 goals scored is a school record

Ranked in top 10 all season and in top five for final six weeks of regular season

2018 Field Hockey (75.3%) vs. 2017 Men's Soccer (24.7%)

2018 FH

Set program-record for wins in a season, finishing the year 19-3

Advanced to program's first NCAA National Semifinal

Defeated Franklin & Marshall to win program's third Centennial Conference Tournament title, and first since 2003

Finished the year ranked 9th in NFCHA final poll, the highest finishing ranking to that point in school history

Defeated a program-record six ranked opponents throughout course of season

2017 MSoc

Posted a school-record 15 shutouts on the year, including back-to-back blank sheets in the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament

Won the regular season Centennial Conference title for the fifth time in school history and first since 2011

Opened season with 11 consecutive victories en route to a 16-1-4 overall record.

Boasted the Centennial Conference Rookie of the Year (RJ Moore), Coach of the Year (Craig Appleby) and Scholar Athlete of the Year (Cole Rosenberger)

Placed nine members on the All-Centennial Conference team, and five on the United Soccer Coaches All-Mid-Atlantic team (both school records).

2015 MLax

Posted an 11-7 record and advanced to the Final Four, where the Blue Jays lost by a goal

After suffering through the tragic death of a teammate just before the start of the season, team started 4-6 before winning seven straight games to advance to Final Four

Won the inaugural Big Ten Tournament with wins against Penn State (14-9) and Ohio State (13-6). Win against OSU avenged a regular season loss

Avenged regular season losses to Virginia (16-15) and Syracuse (13-10) with wins against the Cavaliers (19-7) and Orange (16-15) in the NCAAs

Team produced four All-Americans

2013 WSoc

Posted a 21-2-1 record - 21 wins tied the school record

Advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals before losing on the road on a goal with 17 seconds remaining in regulation

Won the Centennial Conference Championship

Beat top-ranked defending national champion Messiah, 2-1, on the road early in the season

Ranked sixth in the nation at the end of the season and outscored the opposition 85-15 on the year

2019 Baseball (74.2%) vs. 2013 Men's Swimming (25.8%)

2019 Base

Placed 3rd at the Division III World Series

Won Centennial Conference, NCAA Regional and NCAA Super Regional titles

Posted a 37-13 record, including a 25-3 mark at home and a 9-2 mark in the post-season

Led the nation with 83 home runs on the year

Finished in the top 10 in the nation in 10 different team statistical categories and six different individual statistical categories

2013 MSwim

Placed 4th at the NCAA Championships

Posted an 8-1 record with the only loss a one-point defeat to Division I Navy

Produced one individual national champion (Dylan Davis - 100 back) and one relay national champion (800 free relay)

Had 21 All-America finishes at the NCAA Championships, including 15 first team (placed 1st - 8th) and six honorable mention (9-16)
