The Game

- Johns Hopkins opens the season against Ohio State as the Big Ten kicks off its conference-only 2021 schedule this weekend.

The Facts

- This is the 134th season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
- Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 993-346-15.
- JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

Poll Position

- Johns Hopkins is ranked 20th in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and 19th in the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll.
- Ohio State is ranked in the top 10 in both the USILA Coaches Poll (10th) and the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll (8th).

Series History

- This week's game will be the 14th all-time meeting between Johns Hopkins and Ohio State.
- The series dates to a 17-8 Johns Hopkins victory in 1999 and JHU has won 9-of-13 against the Buckeyes.
- Complete series history can be found on page 11.

On This Date

- This week's game against Ohio State will be just the third all-time on February 20 for the Blue Jays.
- Johns Hopkins is 1-1 all-time in games played on February 20 as the Blue Jays topped Siena 11-3, on this date in 2009 and dropped a 9-8 decision at Loyola in 2016.

For Openers

- The Blue Jays are 17-3 in their last 20 season openers.
- Johns Hopkins has won 12 of its last 13 season openers, including a 15-7 win against Towson in 2020.
- Johns Hopkins has scored at least 10 goals in its season opener in 12 of the last 13 years and at least 12 goals in seven of the last nine.

In February

- This week's game against Ohio State will be the 45th all-time for Johns Hopkins in the month of February.
- JHU is 29-15 (.659) all-time in games played in the month of February.
- Johns Hopkins played its first game in the month of February in 1998, didn't play again in February until 2004 and has now played at least one game in the opening month of the season every year since 2006.

Things to Know - Ohio State

« Ohio State comes to Homewood Field for the 2021 season opener after posting a 5-2 record in the shortened 2020 season.

« This is actually the second time OSU has opened a season at Johns Hopkins as the Blue Jays and Buckeyes met in the first game of the 2014 season.

« The Buckeyes were just three goals away from being 7-0 when the 2020 season ended as the only blemishes on their record were a 9-7 loss to UMass and a 17-16 setback to Cornell.

« Head coach **Nick Myers'** team returns its top nine scorers from an offense that was averaging just under 14 goals per game (13.86) last season. Included are every player who scored four or more goals and all but one that had two or more assists.

« Ohio State ranked among the national leaders in a number of statistical categories a year ago, including shooting percentage (.357), clearing percentage (.889) and opponent clearing percentage (.787); the Buckeyes ranked in the top 15 in each of those areas.

« Ohio State's top four returning scorers - **Tre Leclair, Jack Myers, Jackson Reid and Griffin Hughes** - combined for 67 goals and 40 assists and scored on an amazing 41.6% of their 161 combined shots.

« Ohio State is 10-2 under head coach **Nick Myers** in season openers and the Buckeyes have currently won five consecutive openers.

Buckeyes to Watch

Tre Leclair (Gr. • A)

« Returns for his final season as one of the most feared shooters in college lacrosse. Rang up 26 goals and eight assists for 34 points in just seven games in 2020.

« A three-time All-American and two-time All-Big Ten selection, he counts 135 career goals and 38 assists to his credit. He ranks second in program history in goals and sixth in points.

Justin Inacio (Sr. • FO)

« Latest in a long line of outstanding faceoff specialists at OSU. Led the Big Ten in faceoff winning percentage last season (.655) as he won 72-of-110 in just four games.

« The 2018 Big Ten Freshman of the Year and 2019 Co-Big Ten Specialist of the Year has won 383-of-606 (.632) career faceoffs with 196 ground balls.

Ryan Terefenko (Gr. • M)

« The top returning short stick defensive middle in the nation has earned USILA All-America honors three times (HM/3rd Team/2nd Team).

« Counts 15 goals, 19 assists and 139 career ground balls to his credit, is a two-time All-Big Ten selection and a two-time Tewaaraton nominee.

Milliman's Debut

• **Peter Milliman** will make his Johns Hopkins coaching debut when the Blue Jays host Ohio State on Saturday.

• Milliman spent three seasons as the head coach at Cornell from 2018-20 and compiled a record of 28-10 while guiding the Big Red.

• Cornell was ranked number two in the nation when the 2020 season came to an end in mid-March.

First Time out

• Dating back to 1955 when **Bob Scott** took over as the head coach at Johns Hopkins, **Peter Milliman** is the seventh person to serve as the head coach at JHU.

• The previous six head coaches at JHU posted a 4-2 record in their coaching debuts at Hopkins.

Milliman's Assistants

• Johns Hopkins head coach **Peter Milliman** is joined on the sideline by offensive coordinator **John Grant, Jr.**, defensive coordinator **Jamison Koesterer** and volunteer assistant **Dan Annino**.

• Grant, Jr. comes to JHU after spending the last two years at Air Force as an assistant coach, while Koesterer spent the last four years as an assistant coach at nearby UMBC.

• Annino was an assistant coach for three years at his alma mater, Amherst College, and was the 2019 IMLCA Division III Assistant Coach of the Year.

Roster Breakdown

• The Blue Jays' 57-man roster includes 21 newcomers, including 17 freshmen, three transfers and one senior who has played on the men's basketball team at JHU for three seasons.

More Than 75% of Offense Returns

• In the COVID-shortened 2020 season, Johns Hopkins scored 65 goals and added 36 assists for 101 points in six games. The Blue Jays return 78.5% of their goals (51), 77.8% of their assists (28) and a total of 78.3% of their points (79) from a year ago.

You Look Familiar - Part I

• Johns Hopkins defensive coordinator **Jamison Koesterer** spent four seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio State from 2013-16.

• While at OSU, Koesterer helped the Buckeyes to a pair of trips to the NCAA Quarterfinals (2013, 2015).

You Look Familiar - Part II

• One of the three transfers on the 2021 Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse team is goalie **Josh Kirson**, who is a graduate student at the Carey Business School at JHU.

• Kirson transferred to Johns Hopkins from ... Ohio State, where he started 25 games between 2018-20 and posted a 9.95 goals against average and a .523 save percentage.

Prouty, Narewski Strong at the X

• Johns Hopkins returns one of the top faceoff tandems in the nation in senior **Kyle Prouty** and junior **Matt Narewski**, who have combined to take 605 of the team's 615 faceoffs since the start of the 2019 season (98.4%).

• Prouty has won 229-of-417 career faceoffs (.549) with 104 ground balls. He finished 18th in the nation in faceoff winning percentage last season after winning 76-of-124 (.613). His .613 win percentage in 2020 was the highest by a JHU player since Mike Poppleton set a school record by winning 68.5% in 2013.

• Narewski is 129-of-252 (.512) in his career with 70 ground balls to his credit. He was 108-of-211 (.512) with 59 ground balls as a freshman in 2019.

Williams, Lyne Using Extra Year

• When the 2020 season was halted in mid-March due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the NCAA granted all spring athletes an extra year of eligibility. At Johns Hopkins, **Cole Williams** and **Jack Lyne** opted to return for an extra year (Lyne could have anyway due to injuries earlier in his career). The two, along with junior **Joey Epstein**, are serving as co-captains in 2021.

• Williams is Johns Hopkins' career active leader in goals (79), assists (43) and points (122) and paced the Blue Jays with 11 goals and six assists for 17 points in six games a year ago.

• Lyne appeared in just two games prior to 2020, but emerged as a starter on close defense a year ago as he started all six games there.

32 is Back ... and Healthy

• Junior **Joey Epstein** is in his second year as a co-captain. He was limited by injuries a year ago, but managed five goals and five assists for 10 points in five games played (four starts).

• Epstein burst on the scene as a freshman with 48 goals and 25 assists for 73 points en route to earning Big Ten Freshman of the Year, First Team All-Big Ten and Third Team USILA All-America honors.

• When he scored his 50th career goal last season, Epstein became just the sixth player in Johns Hopkins history to reach the 50-goal mark in less than 20 games.

Noting Some of the Blue Jays

• Sophomore **Jacob Angelus** totaled three goals and five assists for eight points last season. All eight points came in the Blue Jays' final four games, including a four-point effort against Mount St. Mary's.

• Senior **Brett Baskin** has at least one point in nine of his last 11 games dating back to the 2019 season.

• Senior **Ryan Darby** has started 21 of the last 22 games in goal for Johns Hopkins.

• Senior **Conner Delaney** was a First Team NABC All-American for the Blue Jay basketball team last season. He was a decorated lacrosse player in high school and had, at one point, committed to play Division I lacrosse before opting for basketball. He walked onto the JHU men's lacrosse team this year in late December.

• Junior **Garrett Degnon** tied for the team-lead with 11 goals last season. He was the only Blue Jay to score at least one goal in every game.

• Senior **Connor DeSimone** is making the move from midfield to attack this season. He started 37 games at midfield in his first three years, including all 22 in the last two years.

• Senior **Jack Keogh** is expected to return to the lineup this week against Ohio State after missing the entire 2020 season with an injury. He suffered the season-ending injury during a scrimmage in the fall of 2019.

• Junior **Owen McManus** started all six games on close defense last season after playing short stick middle as a freshman. He is majoring in economics and has a team-best 3.89 cumulative GPA.

• Sophomore **Beaudan Szuluk** transferred to JHU from Lafayette after starting all six games there on close defense as a freshman last year.

Noting Head Coach Peter Milliman



- Named the 23rd head coach in Johns Hopkins history on April 27, 2020.
- Becomes the third active Big Ten head coach with previous head coaching experience in the Ivy League as he joins Penn State's Jeff Tambroni (Cornell) and Maryland's John Tillman (Harvard).
- In eighth season as a head coach at the collegiate level with four seasons at Pfeiffer (2009-12) and three seasons at Cornell (2018-20).
- Has a career coaching record of 65-36 (.644), including a 28-10 mark at Cornell.
- Led Cornell to the 2018 Ivy League Tournament title and a trip to the NCAA Quarterfinals that year.

• In 2+ seasons as the head coach at Cornell, guided the Big Red to two wins against teams ranked number one in the nation at the time of the game and three against teams ranked in the top two.

• Developed a Cornell offense that was among the most prolific in the nation over the last two years. Cornell finished fifth in the nation in scoring offense in 2019 (14.3 gpg) and the Big Red led the nation in scoring offense (18.4) when the 2020 season ended.

• Coached five games against Big Ten teams while serving as the head coach at Cornell. Posted a 3-2 record in those five games, including wins over Ohio State (17-16) and Penn State (18-17) during the COVID-shortened 2020 season.

• Played collegiately at Gettysburg College and finished his career at GC ranked second in school history in points (232), fifth in goals (138) and third in assists (94). Remains one of just three players in Bullet history with more than 125 goals and 90 assists.

• Wife, Megan, played college lacrosse at York (PA) and was recently named the head girl's lacrosse coach at the Friends School in Baltimore (Friends is located less than two miles from the Johns Hopkins campus on Charles Street).

- Johns Hopkins swept OSU in 2018 with a 13-10 win at JHU and a 6-5 win in the B1G Semifinals on an **Alex Concannon** goal with 11 seconds remaining in regulation.
- Ohio State swept the Blue Jays in 2017 with a 13-9 win in the regular season and a 15-13 win in the Big Ten Semifinals. Both of those games took place in Columbus.
- The teams split two meetings in 2015 with Ohio State winning, 15-12, in Columbus and Johns Hopkins winning, 13-6, in the Big Ten championship game at Maryland.
- Johns Hopkins has scored at least 12 goals in 10 of the 13 previous meetings and at least nine in 12 of 13 meetings.
- The triple-overtime game between Johns Hopkins and Ohio State in the 2014 season opener ranks as the second longest game in JHU history.
