### The Game

- Johns Hopkins hits the road for the first time during the 2021 season as the Blue Jays head to Ann Arbor to take on Michigan. All teams in the Big Ten opened the season last weekend.

### Last Time Out

- The Blue Jays dropped a 14-8 decision at Homewood Field last Saturday against then 10th-ranked Ohio State.
- Michigan opened its season on the road at Maryland and fell 20-9.

### The Facts

- This is the 134th season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
- Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 993-347-15.
- JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

### Poll Position

- Johns Hopkins is ranked 20th in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and is receiving votes in the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll.
- Michigan does not appear in this week's USILA Coaches Poll, but the Wolverines are receiving votes in the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll.

### Series History

- This week's game will be the eighth all-time meeting between Johns Hopkins and Michigan. The Blue Jays have won the previous seven meetings.
- The series dates to a 17-8 Blue Jay win in 2013 (Michigan's second season of varsity lacrosse). The first three games in the series took place at Homewood Field, while this week's game will be the fourth in the last five to take place in Michigan.
- Johns Hopkins has scored at least 14 goals against the Wolverines in six of the seven all-time meetings.

All Johns Hopkins home games air on the ESPN family of networks with a majority of the games airing on ESPNU. Johns Hopkins is the only lacrosse program in the nation - men or women - with its own exclusive national television agreement.



### Things to Know - Michigan

- Michigan welcomes Johns Hopkins to U-M Lacrosse Stadium looking for its first win of the season after dropping a 20-9 decision at Maryland last Saturday.
- The Wolverines are 2-1 in home openers under the direction of fourth-year coach **Kevin Conry**.
- This week's game against JHU is the only home game for the Wolverines in their first four games of the season. Michigan is the only team in the league that will play three of its first four away from home.
- In all, 11 players made their Wolverine debut last week at Maryland as nine freshmen, one sophomore and one graduate student all saw action in the Maize and Blue for the first time.
- Newcomers accounted for three goals, one assist and six ground balls in the setback against Maryland.
- The Wolverines scored six goals in the fourth quarter at Maryland last week. Dating back to last season, Michigan has scored six goals in a quarter in five of its last six games.
- Dating back to the start of the 2020 season, at least 24 combined goals have been scored in all but one of Michigan's eight games and four of the eight games have seen at least 26 goals punched up.
- Michigan is 5-1 in its last six home games dating back to the end of the 2019 season.

### Wolverines to Watch

#### Michael Boehm (Fr. •A)

- Enjoyed a strong first game as a Wolverine as he fired home two goals and added one assist.
- The two goals and three points both ranked second on the team and he had a hand in three of Michigan's six fourth-quarter goals.

#### Nick Rowlett (Jr. •FO)

- Coming off a strong season debut as he won 15-of-28 faceoffs and had eight ground balls against Maryland. All three totals are the second-highest marks of his career.
- Won 73-of-144 faceoffs last season and had a team-high 36 ground balls.

#### Josh Zawada (So. •A)

- Scored a team-high four goals and added one assist in last week's game at Maryland.
- Tallied 16 goals and 16 assists in just seven games in 2020 to lead the nation in points among all freshmen.
- Has scored at least two goals in every game of his career (8) and has four or more points in seven of the eight.

### An Opening Review

- The loss to Ohio State was just the fourth for Johns Hopkins in a season opener in the last 21 years.
- Despite the loss, Johns Hopkins has won 12 of its last 14 season openers.

### In February

- This week's game against Michigan will be the 46th all-time for Johns Hopkins in the month of February.
- JHU is 29-16 (.644) all-time in games played in the month of February.
- Johns Hopkins played its first game in the month of February in 1998, didn't play again in February until 2004 and has now played at least one game in the opening month of the season every year since 2006.

### Head Coach Peter Milliman Briefly

- Last week's game against Ohio State was the first for **Peter Milliman** as the head coach at Johns Hopkins.
- Milliman spent three seasons as the head coach at Cornell from 2018-20 and compiled a record of 28-10 while guiding the Big Red.
- Cornell was ranked number two in the nation when the 2020 season came to an end in mid-March.
- While the sample size is still small, Peter Milliman has never lost two consecutive games as a head coach at the Division I level.

### Milliman's Assistants

- Johns Hopkins head coach **Peter Milliman** is joined on the sideline by offensive coordinator **John Grant, Jr.**, defensive coordinator **Jamison Koesterer** and volunteer assistant **Dan Annino**.
- Grant, Jr. came to JHU after spending the last two years at Air Force as an assistant coach, while Koesterer spent the last four years as an assistant coach at nearby UMBC.
- Annino was an assistant coach for three years at his alma mater, Amherst College, and was the 2019 IMLCA Division III Assistant Coach of the Year.

### Roster Breakdown

- The Blue Jays' 57-man roster includes 21 newcomers, including 17 freshmen, three transfers and one senior who has played on the men's basketball team at JHU for three seasons.

### More Than 75% of Offense Returns

- In the COVID-shortened 2020 season, Johns Hopkins scored 65 goals and added 36 assists for 101 points in six games. The Blue Jays return 78.5% of their goals (51), 77.8% of their assists (28) and a total of 78.3% of their points (79) from a year ago.

### You Look Familiar

- Michigan head coach Kevin Conry is a 2004 Johns Hopkins graduate and was a four-year member of the Blue Jay lacrosse team.
- Conry helped the Blue Jays to a four-year record of 47-10, four trips to the NCAA Tournament and three appearances in the final four. Johns Hopkins advanced to the national championship game during his junior year in 2003 (lost to Virginia, 9-7, in title game).
- Conry was a teammate for one year with current Blue Jay defensive coordinator Jamison Koesterer, who was a freshman when Conry was a senior in 2004.

**Narewski Off to Quick Start at the X**

- Johns Hopkins returns one of the top faceoff tandems in the nation in senior **Kyle Prouty** and junior **Matt Narewski**, who have combined to take 631 of the team's 641 faceoffs since the start of the 2019 season (98.4%).
- Each has had the hot hand at different times and last week it was Narewski winning 14-of-22 (.636) with nine ground balls against Ohio State.
- After one game, Narewski leads the Big Ten and ranks ninth nationally in faceoff winning percentage.
- Prouty has won 229-of-421 (.544) career faceoffs (.549) with 104 ground balls. He finished 18th in the nation in faceoff winning percentage last season after winning 76-of-124 (.613). His .613 win percentage in 2020 was the highest by a JHU player since Mike Poppleton set a school record by winning 68.5% in 2013.
- Including last week's effort, Narewski is 143-of-274 (.522) in his career with 79 ground balls to his credit. He was 108-of-211 (.512) with 59 ground balls as a freshman in 2019.

**DeSimone Leads Offense in First Game on Attack**

- After playing in all 39 games with 37 starts at midfield in his first three seasons, senior **Connor DeSimone** made the move to attack this season. One game in and it looks like he's adjusted well.
- DeSimone tied his career high with three goals and added one assist for a personal-best four points to lead the Blue Jays offensively against Ohio State.
- The hat trick against the Buckeyes was the fourth of his career and boosted his career totals to 27 goals and 19 assists for 46 points.

**Williams, Lyne Using Extra Year**

- When the 2020 season was halted in mid-March due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the NCAA granted all spring athletes an extra year of eligibility. At Johns Hopkins, **Cole Williams** and **Jack Lyne** opted to return for an extra year (Lyne could have anyway due to injuries earlier in his career). The two, along with junior **Joey Epstein**, are serving as co-captains in 2021.
- Williams is Johns Hopkins' career active leader in goals (80), assists (43) and points (123) and paced the Blue Jays with 11 goals and six assists for 17 points in six games a year ago.
- Lyne appeared in just two games prior to 2020, but emerged as a starter on close defense a year ago and has started all seven games there since the start of the 2020 season.

**32 is Back ... and Healthy**

- Junior **Joey Epstein** is in his second year as a co-captain. He was limited by injuries a year ago, but managed five goals and five assists for 10 points in five games played (four starts).
- Epstein burst on the scene as a freshman with 48 goals and 25 assists for 73 points en route to earning Big Ten Freshman of the Year, First Team All-Big Ten and Third Team USILA All-America honors.
- When he scored his 50th career goal last season, Epstein became just the sixth player in Johns Hopkins history to reach the 50-goal mark in less than 20 games.

**Kirson Debuts in Goal**

- Graduate student **Josh Kirson** made his Blue Jay debut in goal last week against Ohio State.
- Kirson, who transferred to Johns Hopkins after graduating from Ohio State last May, posted 13 saves in his first appearance for the Blue Jays.
- After JHU fell behind 5-1 at the end of the first quarter, Kirson posted 11 of his 13 saves over the final 45 minutes.

**Noting Some of the Blue Jays**

- Sophomore **Jacob Angelus** picked up an assist against Ohio State to run his point and assist streaks to five games dating back to last season. His five-game assist streak is the longest active streak on the team. He totaled three goals and five assists for eight points

last season. All eight points came in the Blue Jays' final four games, including a four-point effort against Mount St. Mary's.

- After scoring one goal last week, senior **Brett Baskin** has at least one point in 10 of his last 12 games dating back to the 2019 season.
- Senior **Conner Delaney** was a First Team NABC All-American for the Blue Jay basketball team last season. He was a decorated lacrosse player in high school and had, at one point, committed to play Division I lacrosse before opting for basketball. He walked onto the JHU men's lacrosse team this year in late December and was the Blue Jays' top LSM in the season opener against Ohio State.
- Junior **Garrett Degnon** tied for the team-lead with 11 goals last season. He was the only Blue Jay to score at least one goal in every game and extended his goal-scoring streak to seven games with one tally against Ohio State.
- Senior **Jack Keogh** returned to the lineup last week against Ohio State after missing the entire 2020 season with an injury. He suffered the season-ending injury during a scrimmage in the fall of 2019 and had one goal against the Buckeyes in his return to the field.
- Junior **Owen McManus** has started all seven games on close defense since the start of the 2020 season after playing short stick middle as a freshman. He is majoring in economics and has a team-best 3.89 cumulative GPA.
- Sophomore **Beaudan Szuluk** transferred to JHU from Lafayette after starting all six games there on close defense as a freshman last year.

### Blue Jays Fifth B1G Preseason Poll

- Johns Hopkins was picked to finish fifth in the 2021 Big Ten Preseason Poll of the league's head coaches.
- Since the formation of the Big Ten in 2015, Johns Hopkins has won the Big Ten Tournament title twice (2015, 2018) and advanced to the title game one other time (2019).
- Johns Hopkins' two Big Ten titles and three appearances in the league championship game are both tied for the most in league history.

- JHU is one of just seven schools with 700+ victories, one of just five with 800+ wins and one of two that has won 900 or more games.

- Johns Hopkins is 38-28 (.576) all-time in overtime. The Blue Jays topped Mount St. Mary's, 13-12, in overtime in their last game of the 2020 season.
- Johns Hopkins has won eight of its last 12 overtime games.

### One-Goal Wonders

- Johns Hopkins is 132-85 (.608) all-time in one-goal games. The Blue Jays won their last one-goal game, 13-12 (OT) against Mount St. Mary's in what turned out to be the 2020 season finale.
- The Blue Jays are 7-3 in their last nine one-goal games.

- Named the 23rd head coach in Johns Hopkins history on April 27, 2020.
- Becomes the third active Big Ten head coach with previous head coaching experience in the Ivy League as he joins Penn State's Jeff Tambroni (Cornell) and Maryland's John Tillman (Harvard).
- In eighth season as a head coach at the collegiate level with four seasons at Pfeiffer (2009-12) and three seasons at Cornell (2018-20).
- Has a career coaching record of 65-37 (.637), including a 28-10 mark at Cornell.
- Led Cornell to the 2018 Ivy League Tournament title and a trip to the NCAA Quarterfinals that year.

- In 2+ seasons as the head coach at Cornell, guided the Big Red to two wins against teams ranked number one in the nation at the time of the game and three against teams ranked in the top two.
- Developed a Cornell offense that was among the most prolific in the nation over the last two years. Cornell finished fifth in the nation in scoring offense in 2019 (14.3 gpg) and the Big Red led the nation in scoring offense (18.4) when the 2020 season ended.
- Coached five games against Big Ten teams while serving as the head coach at Cornell. Posted a 3-2 record in those five games, including wins over Ohio State (17-16) and Penn State (18-17) during the COVID-shortened 2020 season.-0
- Played collegiately at Gettysburg College and finished his career at GC ranked second in school history in points (232), fifth in goals (138) and third in assists (94). Remains one of just three players in Bullet history with more than 125 goals and 90 assists.
- Wife, Megan, played college lacrosse at York (PA) and was recently named the head girl's lacrosse coach at the Friends School in Baltimore (Friends is located less than two miles from the Johns Hopkins campus on Charles Street).
