• Johns Hopkins returns home after playing two straight on the road as the Blue Jays welcome Penn State to Homewood Field. This is the first of three home games in a four-week span for Johns Hopkins.

Last Time Out

• The Blue Jays slipped to 1-2 on the year with an 18-10 loss at Maryland last Saturday.
• Penn State picked up its first win of the season last Saturday at home as the Nittany Lions topped Ohio State, 15-13.

The Facts

• This is the 134th season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
• Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 994-348-15.
• JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

• Johns Hopkins is listed as receiving votes in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and in the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll.
• Penn State solidified its spot in the top 20 with last week's win and is ranked 12th in both the USILA Coaches Poll and the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll.

Series History

• This week's game will be the 13th all-time between Johns Hopkins and Penn State.
• The Blue Jays lead the all-time series 9-3.
• The two teams have alternated winning streaks in the series as the Blue Jays won the first nine games against Penn State, while the Nittany Lions have grabbed the last three meetings between the two teams.

On This Date

• This week's game against Penn State will be the sixth all-time for Johns Hopkins on March 13.
• The Blue Jays are 4-1 all-time in games played on March 13. Included is a 13-6 win against UMBC in 2018 in the last game JHU played on this date.

Head Coach Peter Milliman Briefly

• The Blue Jays' season opener against Ohio State was the first game for Peter Milliman as the head coach at Johns Hopkins.
• Milliman spent three seasons as the head coach at Cornell from 2018-20 and compiled a record of 28-10 while guiding the Big Red.

Things to Know - Penn State

- Penn State comes to Homewood Field fresh off a 15-13 win against Ohio State last Saturday at home.
- The Nittany Lions used a 4-0 third-quarter run to turn a 7-7 tie into an 11-7 lead they never relinquished against the Buckeyes.
- Penn State's two losses have come against teams currently ranked in the top five in the nation in Rutgers (11-9) and Maryland (13-7).
- The Nittany Lions rank among the national leaders in ground balls per game (12th / 35.0) and clearing percentage (18th / .883).
- After scoring on just 16-of-76 (.211) shots in its first two games, the PSU offense found its groove against Ohio State as the 'Lions scored on 15-of-43 (.349) shots in the victory.
- Penn State sophomore midfielder **Grant Haus** is the son of former Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse coach **John Haus** (1999-2000).
- Nittany Lion head coach **Jeff Tambroni** enters this week's game against Johns Hopkins needing just one win to reach 200 for his career.

Nittany Lions to Watch

Gerard Arceri (Gr. • FO)

- Among the top faceoff specialists in the nation as he earned Third Team USILA All-America honors in 2018 and 2019.
- Has won 35-of-65 (.538) faceoffs with 23 ground balls through three games.
- Has won 813 faceoffs in his career and needs three more FO wins to move into eighth place in NCAA Division I history.

TJ Malone (Jr. • A)

- Coming off the finest game of his career after he fueled the win against Ohio State with career highs of five goals and seven points.
- Currently leads the team in scoring with nine goals and five assists in three games.
- Scored 30 goals and added six assists for 36 points as a freshman. Tallied an assist on the game-winning goal in overtime against Johns Hopkins in the Big Ten title game.

Mac O'Keefe (Gr. • A)

- Three-time USILA All-American, including a second team honoree in 2019 and 2020.
- One of the top pure shooters in recent college lacrosse history, he enters this week's game with 197 career goals and 42 assists for 239 points.
- Ranks fifth in Division I history with his 197 goals and needs just two to jump to third place.
- Scored the game-winning goal in overtime to beat Johns Hopkins in the 2019 Big Ten title game.

- Cornell was ranked number two in the nation when the 2020 season came to an end in mid-March.
- While the sample size is still small, Peter Milliman has never lost two consecutive games as a head coach at the Division I level.

Milliman's Assistants

- Johns Hopkins head coach **Peter Milliman** is joined on the sideline by offensive coordinator **John Grant, Jr.**, defensive coordinator **Jamison Koesterer** and volunteer assistant **Dan Annino**.
- Grant, Jr. came to JHU after spending the last two years at Air Force as an assistant coach, while Koesterer spent the last four years as an assistant coach at nearby UMBC.
- Annino was an assistant coach for three years at his alma mater, Amherst College, and was the 2019 IMLCA Division III Assistant Coach of the Year.

Roster Breakdown

- The Blue Jays' 56-man roster includes 21 newcomers, including 16 freshmen, three transfers and one senior who has played on the men's basketball team at JHU for three seasons.

Moving Things Around

- A number of Johns Hopkins players have shifted positions from where they played in 2020.
- Three of the starters in last week's game at Maryland are playing a different position than they did a year ago (**Connor DeSimone**, **Jared Reinson**, **Cole Williams**) and a number of other key contributors have as well.

Extra-Extra

- Johns Hopkins cashed in on all four of its extra-man chances at Michigan and is now 5-of-9 (.556) on the year.
- Through three games, Johns Hopkins leads the Big Ten and ranks seventh nationally in extra-man offense.
- The four extra-man goals against the Wolverines are the most for JHU since the Jays had six in the 2019 Big Ten Championship game against Penn State.
- The effort at Michigan marked the 18th time since 2003 that Johns Hopkins has scored four or more extra-man goals in a game.

Offense Developing

- After scoring a total of nine goals in the first five quarters of the season, the Blue Jay offense found its groove in the second and third quarters at Michigan.
- The Blue Jays scored five goals in the second period and six in the third against the Wolverines. That marked the first time JHU had scored 5+ goals in back-to-back quarters since the 2019 Big Ten Championship game against Penn State, when they scored six in the first quarter and five in the second.
- After scoring their first nine goals of the season on 34 shots (.265 shooting percentage), the Blue Jays scored 13 goals in the final three quarters at Michigan on 31 shots (.419).
- The Blue Jays then scored seven goals on 18 first-half shots (.389) at Maryland before the Terps limited JHU to just three second-half goals on 15 shots (.200).
- Through three games, Johns Hopkins has scored 32 goals on 98 shots (.327).
- JHU has not shot better than 32% for an entire season since 2015 (.331).

Sharing the Rock

- A key to head coach **Peter Milliman's** offense is sharing the ball. During his three seasons as the head coach at Cornell, the Big Red collected assists on 357-of-550 (.649) goals scored.
- Without any practice in the fall and limited time in preseason, the Blue Jays' grasp of the offense continues to evolve and that is best exemplified in the number of assisted goals the team has scored in the last two weeks.
- After collecting an assist on just 3-of-8 (.375) goals in the season opener against Ohio State, the Blue Jays collected 10 assists on 14 goals at Michigan (.714) and assisted on 7-of-10 (.700) at Maryland.
- This is the first time since early in the 2019 season that JHU has collected assists on 70% of its goals in back-to-back games (vs. Loyola (9-of-12), @ UNC (9-of-11)).
- The last time JHU assisted on 70% of its goals in three straight games was in the first three games of the 2019 season (@ Towson (6-of-8), vs. Loyola (9-of-12), @ UNC (9-of-11)).

- Scored a goal in the first two games of this season to extend goal-scoring streak to six games before being held scoreless at Maryland.
- Scored 25th career goal at Michigan.
- Has played in 36 games with four starts and has 25 goals and five assists for 30 points.

3 - Connor DeSimone _____ Attack

- Made the move to attack this season after starting all but two games at midfield from 2018-20.
- Leads the team in scoring with seven goals and five assists for 12 points. Tied for eighth in Big Ten in points per game (4.00).
- Prior to punching up 12 points in first three games this season, previous career high for points in a three-game span was seven.
- Opened season with three goals and one assist for a then career-high-tying four points against Ohio State.
- Punched up two goals and a personal-best four assists for a career-high six points in a 14-7 win at Michigan and came back with two goals at Maryland.
- Recorded the 50th point of his career at Michigan and now has 31 goals and 23 assists for 54 points.

8 - Josh Kirson _____ Goalie

- Has started first three games of the season in goal and has a 13.15 GAA and a .418 save percentage.
- Posted 13 saves in a 14-8 loss to Ohio State in first career start at JHU in season opener.
- Came back with six saves in a 14-7 win at Michigan to earn first career win as the starting goalie at Johns Hopkins and added nine saves in loss at third-ranked Maryland.
- Graduate transfer who played in 27 games with 25 starts at Ohio State before coming to Johns Hopkins.
- Posted a 15-10 record with a 9.95 GAA and a .523 save percentage at OSU.

9 - Brendan Grimes _____ Attack

- Has started first three games on attack. Only freshman in the Blue Jay starting lineup.
- Has one goal on the year after scoring first career goal in a 14-7 win at Michigan.
- Goal against the Wolverines was the first goal in a 12-2 run that turned a 3-1 deficit into a 13-5 lead.

- Ranked as the #4 freshman in the nation by *Inside Lacrosse*.

11 - Kyle DiPietro _____ SSDM

- Part of a regular rotation at SSDM. Played in season opener against Ohio State before missing last two games with an injury.
- Has played in 11 games in his career.

12 - Luke Shilling _____ Attack

- EMO specialist who has played in all three games this season.
- Has played in 37 games in his career and has six goals and five assists for 11 points.
- All six career goals have come on extra-man.

14 - Cole Williams _____ Midfield

- Co-captain.
- Made the move to midfield this season and has four goals and four assists in three games.

Feb. 20, 2021 • Homewood Field**

BALTIMORE, MD – Visiting Ohio State jumped out to a 9-2 lead midway through the second quarter and held off a second-half Johns Hopkins rally to secure a 14-8 Big Ten men's lacrosse victory over the Blue Jays at Homewood Field Saturday afternoon. The loss spoiled the Johns Hopkins coaching debut of Peter Milliman, whose team rallied to within four several times before a pair of late Buckeye goals accounted for the final scoring.

Ohio State used a 5-0 run that turned an early 1-1 tie into a 6-1 lead early in the second quarter. A Tre Leclair unassisted goal with 8:20 left in the first quarter ignited the spree for the Buckeyes, who got goals from five different players during the run. A Grant Mitchell goal, his second of the game, with 13:21 on the second-quarter clock capped the surge.

Johns Hopkins' Connor DeSimone, who was making his first career start on attack, halted the run with his second unassisted goal of the game just 45 seconds after Mitchell's goal, but Griffin Hughes answered five minutes later to start a three-goal run for OSU that took less than three minutes and gave the Buckeyes the seven-goal lead.

After trading goals that bookended half-time, the Blue Jays used a three-goal run of their own to slice a 10-3 deficit to 10-6 at the end of the third quarter. Junior Garrett Degnon's laser from the wing off a feed from Jacob Angelus made it 10-4 with more than nine minutes left in the third quarter. That score stood for nearly eight minutes before DeSimone and Jack Keogh added goals in the final 90 seconds to make it a four-goal game entering the fourth quarter.

The 10-6 deficit was the first of three times the Blue Jays pulled within four, but each time they did, the Buckeyes answered. Keogh's goal, which came from a tough angle with just four seconds remaining in the third quarter, was the first of six alternating goals the teams scored. A Cole Williams goal for the Blue Jays with 9:05 left in the fourth quarter made it 12-8, but Ohio State goalie Skylar Wahlund came up with a big save in-tight on Blue Jay attackman Brendan Grimes a short time later and Hughes'

third of the game at the 4:38 mark dashed any hopes of a Johns Hopkins comeback.

DeSimone led the Blue Jays with three goals and one assist, while Matt Narewski won 14-of-22 faceoffs and had nine ground balls. Josh Kirson, a graduate transfer who had played previously at Ohio State, posted 13 saves in goal in his Johns Hopkins debut.

Six different players had at least one goal for the Buckeyes with Leclair (4), Hughes (3) and Jack Myers (3) leading the way offensively. Wahlund posted 11 saves and added nine ground balls to secure the win in goal for Ohio State, which held advantages in shots (37-32) and ground balls (33-26).

Notes: The hat trick for DeSimone is the fourth of his career and his four points are a career high • Degnon's goal extended his goal-scoring streak to seven games • Williams' goal was the 80th of his career • Narewski's 14 faceoff wins mark the fourth time in his career that he has won 14 or more.

- Game 2 -**#20 Johns Hopkins-14, Michigan-7
Feb. 27, 2021 • UM Lacrosse Stadium**

ANN ARBOR, MI – The Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse team picked up the first win of the Peter Milliman era on Saturday as they used an 11-1 run that bridged the second and fourth quarters to fuel a 14-7 win at Michigan. The win improves the Blue Jays' record to 1-1 (1-1 B1G), while the Wolverines slip to 0-2 (0-2).

Johns Hopkins trailed by two on three different occasions in the first 19 minutes and was down 4-2 when junior Joey Epstein picked the top far corner from the wing with 11:05 to play in the second quarter while the Blue Jays were up a main. That ignited a 5-0 run in the period that eventually grew to the 11-1 surge that put the game away.

Epstein's EMO strike was the first of three straight he would score as he beat the shot clock with a flag down at the 7:43 mark and scored another from the wing less than a minute later to give the Blue Jays their first lead of the game at 5-4 with just under seven minutes left in the first half.

A Cole Williams goal at the 2:41 mark made it 6-4, but Avery Myers scored at buzzer before halftime to make it a one-goal game at 6-5 at intermission.

Johns Hopkins put the game away in a third period that saw them get goals from five different players and outscore the Wolverines 6-0 to go up 12-5 at the end of three periods. Senior Connor DeSimone scored both of his goals in the period and the Blue Jays also got goals from Jack Keogh, Brett Baskin, Garrett Degnon and Jacob Angelus in the game-turning 15-minutes. In addition to his goal, Keogh assisted on the Degnon and Angelus goals in the period.

Epstein would complete his six-goal afternoon with a pair of fourth-quarter extra-man strikes, both of which were assisted by DeSimone. Bryce Clay and Myers scored in the final quarter for Michigan, which was held to just three goals in the final 41 minutes after grabbing the 4-2 lead in the opening 18:14 of the game.

Epstein's six-goal effort led the way for Johns Hopkins, which got goals and points from eight different players in the victory. DeSimone matched Epstein's six points with a two-goal, four-assist effort, while Angelus (1g, 3a), Keogh (1g, 2a) and Williams (1g, 1a) added multi-point games of their own. In all, 10 of Johns Hopkins' 14 goals were assisted on the day.

Michael Boehm scored twice and added an assist and Myers scored the two goals to power Michigan. The Wolverines held slight advantages in shots (34-33), ground balls (31-28) and faceoffs (12-11), but UM turned the ball over 21 times, including 14 in the second and third quarters combined when Johns Hopkins outscored the hosts 11-2.

Notes: The six goals are one shy of Epstein's career-high of seven and his three EMO goals are one shy of the school record (a record he co-holds with Patrick Fraser and Terry Riordan) • The six points for DeSimone and three points for Keogh are career highs, while Angelus tied his career high with four points • Degnon has scored a goal in a team-best eight straight games • Williams' third-quarter assist was his 125th career point • Today's game was the first game Johns Hopkins has ever played on February 27 ... this was the only date between February 15 and May 31 that Johns Hopkins had never played on.

- Game 3 -**#3 Maryland-18, #20 Johns Hopkins-10
Mar. 6, 2021 • Maryland Stadium**

COLLEGE PARK, MD – The third-ranked Maryland men's lacrosse team used an 11-0 run that bridged the second and fourth quarters to turn a 7-5 deficit into a 16-7 lead and the Terrapins regained possession of The Rivalry Trophy with an 18-10 win over visiting Johns Hopkins at Maryland Stadium Saturday afternoon. The Terps improve to 3-0 overall with the win while the Blue Jays slip to 1-2 with the loss.

Johns Hopkins had used a 3-0 run of its own to turn a 5-4 deficit into the 7-5 lead late in the second quarter. A Connor DeSimone goal that beat the shot clock tied it at 5-5 and Jacob Angelus and Joey Epstein scored back-to-back goals just under 90 seconds apart a short-time later to give the Blue Jays the two-goal lead.

The Terps had it tied at 7-7 at the half as Logan Wisnauskas and Anthony DeMaio scored consecutive goals just 40 seconds apart in the final three minutes of the opening half to account for the deadlock at intermission.

The third quarter was all Maryland as the Terps outscored the Blue Jays 8-0 in the period to put the game away. A Jared Bernhardt unassisted goal while the teams were playing 5-on-5 broke the 7-7 tie at the 10:32 mark and Bubba Fairman dodged from behind the goal less than a minute later to give the Terps the lead for good.

Bernhardt scored three of his five goals during the third-quarter surge and Wisnauskas picked up three of his career-high seven assists to help fuel the spree.

Johns Hopkins had opened the game with a 3-1 spurt in the opening 10 minutes as Epstein scored twice and Cole Williams once for the Blue Jays, but Maryland answered with a three-goal run to grab a 4-3 lead late in the period.

The Blue Jays got a goal from senior LSM Conner Delaney with just two seconds left in the first quarter to pull even at 4-4 and used the DeSimone-sparked three-goal run to answer Bernhardt's first of the day to grab the 7-5 lead. Epstein's third goal of the half, which came with 3:31 left in the second quarter, was answered by the run-starting tallies by Wisnauskas and DeMaio that accounted for the halftime tie.

Williams (2g, 3a), Epstein (3g, 1a) and DeSimone (2g) paced the Blue Jays, who had

a three-game winning streak in the series snapped with the loss.

Wisnauskas (2g, 7a), Bernhardt (5g, 1a) and Daniel Maltz (3g, 3a) led the way for Maryland, which also got 14 saves from sophomore goalie Logan McNaney and a 17-of-29 performance on faceoffs from Justin Shockey.

Notes: Williams now has 14 goals and eight assists in six career games against Maryland, while Epstein has 10 goals and five assists in three games against the Terps. The 28 combined goals are the most in a Hopkins-Maryland games since 2000, when the Blue Jays topped the Terps, 20-11, at Homewood Field. Today's loss is just the second for Johns Hopkins at Maryland Stadium in its last 11 games there (including two games in the 2015 Big Ten Tournament).
