#### **The Game**

· Johns Hopkins welcomes Rutgers to Homewood Field for the second game of a two-game homestand for the Blue Jays. The game will air live on WatchESPN/ESPN3 with a tape-delay broadcast on ESPNU (March 21 / 8 am).

#### **Last Time Out**

- The Blue Jays evened their record at 2-2 on the year with a 13-6 win over then 12th-ranked Penn State at Homewood Field last Saturday.
- Rutgers had a season-opening three-game winning streak snapped as the Scarlet Knights fell to Maryland, 19-12, in a game much closer than the final score would indicate.

#### **The Facts**

- This is the 134th season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
- Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 995-348-15.
- · JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

#### **Poll Position**

- Johns Hopkins is ranked 14th in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and 15th in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll.
- Rutgers is a consensus top10 team as the Scarlet Knights are ranked seventh in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and sixth in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll.

#### **Series History**

- This week's game will be the 41st all-time between Johns Hopkins and Rutgers.
- The Blue Jays lead the all-time series 34-6.
- The teams first met in 1920 with Johns Hopkins claiming a 13-0 victory. Prior to the start of Big Ten play in 2015, Johns Hopkins and Rutgers had not met since 1998.

#### **On This Date**

- · This week's game against Rutgers will be the eighth all-time for Johns Hopkins on March 20.
- The Blue Jays are 6-1 all-time in games played on March 20. Included is a 15-10 win over Rutgers on this date in 1993. In that game, Johns Hopkins' all-time leading scorer, Terry Riordan, had four goals and two assists to power the Blue Jays past the Scarlet Knights.
- Every year that Johns Hopkins has won a game played on March 20 (1976, 1982, 1984, 1993, 1999, 2004), the Blue Jays have advanced to at least the NCAA Semifinals.

#### Things to Know - Rutgers

- · Rutgers comes to Homewood Field ranked seventh in the USILA Coaches Poll and sixth in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll.
- The Scarlet Knights are 3-1 on the year after suffering a 19-12 setback at Maryland last Saturday. Don't be deceived by the score; the game was tied at the half and it was a onegoal game entering the fourth quarter before an 8-2 Terrapin spurt put the game way.
- Rutgers brings one of the nation's most explosive offensive units to Baltimore as RU is averaging 16.75 goals per game with more than 10 of those (10.25) being assisted. The 'Knights have hit 22 twice already in identical 22-12 wins over Ohio State and Michigan.
- · It's not just about offense for 10th-year coach Brian Brecht, his team does many of the little things well. Rutgers is seventh in the nation in turnovers per game (11.75), clears the ball at better than 90% (.907) and has converted on 62.5% of its extra-man chances thus far.
- · Defensively, Rutgers was allowing just 11 goals per game before last week's game at Maryland and the Scarlet Knights have harassed the opposition into more than 14 turnovers per outing.
- After this week's game against Johns Hopkins, the 'Knights will play three of their next four at home, where they are 28-7 since the start of the 2016 season.

#### Scarlet Knights to Watch

Adam Charalambides (Gr. • A)

- Enters this week's game with a team-high 16 goals and seven assists for 23 points. Leads the Big Ten in goals per game (4.00) and ranks second in points per game (5.75).
- · Needs just four goals to reach 125 for his career as he has 121 to go along with 42 assists for 163 points. Ranks seventh in school history in goals and needs 15 points to jump into RU's top 10.

#### Connor Kirst (Gr. • M)

- · Transfer from Villanova has made an immediate impact at Rutgers with 11 goals and seven assists.
- Inside Lacrosse First Team All-American in 2020 at 'Nova after ringing up 17 goals and seven assists for 24 points in just seven games.

#### Kieran Mullins (R-Sr. • A)

- · One of the most versatile attackmen in the nation. Leads the team in assists (11) and ranks second in points (19) and fifth in goals (8).
- Counts 107 career goals and 91 assists for 198 points to his credit. Bidding to become just the second player in program history to reach 100 career goals and 100 career assists.

#### **Head Coach Peter Milliman Briefly**

- The State w the hea
- · Milliman spent three seasons as the head coach at Cornell from 2018-20 and compiled a record of 28-10 while guiding the Big Red.
- · Cornell was ranked number two in the nation when the 2020 season came to an end in mid-March.
- · While the sample size is still small, Peter Milliman has never lost two consecutive games as a head coach at the Division I level.

#### **Milliman's Assistants**

- · Johns Hopkins head coach Peter Milliman is joined on the sideline by offensive coordinator John Grant, Jr., defensive coordinator Jamison Koesterer and volunteer assistant Dan Annino.
- Grant, Jr. came to JHU after spending the last two years at Air Force as an assistant coach, while Koesterer spent the last four years as an assistant coach at nearby UMBC.
- Annino was an assistant coach for three years at his alma mater, Amherst College, and was the 2019 IMLCA Division III Assistant Coach of the Year.

#### Offense Developing

- Johns Hopkins enters this week's game against Rutgers averaging 11.25 goals per game on 31.2% shooting.
- Over the last three games, the Blue Jays are averaging 12.3 goals per game and are shooting 33.0% during that time.
- After scoring a total of nine goals in the first five quarters of the season, the Blue Jay offense found its groove in the second and third quarters at Michigan.
- The Blue Jays scored five goals in the second period and six in the third against the Wolverines. That marked the first time JHU had scored 5+ goals in back-to-back quarters since the 2019 Big Ten Championship game against Penn State, when they scored six in the first quarter and five in the second.

 $\bullet$  In 16 quarters this season, the Blue Jays have scored two or more goals in 12 quarters, three or more in eight quarters and four or more in five quarters.

#### **Sharing the Rock**

- A key to head coach **Peter Milliman's** offense is sharing the ball. During his three seasons as the head coach at Cornell, the Big Red collected assists on 357-of-550 (.649) goals scored.
- Without any practice in the fall and limited time in preseason, the Blue Jays' grasp of the offense continues to evolve and that is best exemplified in the number of assisted goals the team has scored.
- After collecting an assist on just 3-of-8 (.375) goals in the season opener against Ohio State, the Blue Jays collected 10 assists on 14 goals at Michigan (.714) and assisted on 7-of-10 (.700) at Maryland.
- This is the first time since early in the 2019 season that JHU has collected assists on 70% of its goals in back-to-back games (vs. Loyola (9-of-12), @ UNC (9-of-11)).
- Through four games, the Blue Jays have collected assists on 26-of-45 (.578) of their goals.

#### No Shots for You

- Johns Hopkins held Penn State shotless during the third quarter of last week's 13-6 win over the Nittany Lions.
- The shotless quarter for Penn State marked the first time since 2012 that JHU has held a team shotless for a full quarter. Prior to last week, the last time JHU turned that trick was in 2012 against Princeton, when JHU held the Tigers shotless in the second quarter.

#### **Game-By-Game Recaps**

#### - Game 1 -#10 Ohio State-14, #20 Johns Hopkins-8 Feb. 20, 2021 • Homewood Field

BALTIMORE, MD – Visiting Ohio State jumped out to a 9-2 lead midway through the second quarter and held off a second-half Johns Hopkins rally to secure a 14-8 Big Ten men's lacrosse victory over the Blue Jays at Homewood Field Saturday afternoon. The loss spoiled the Johns Hopkins coaching debut of Peter Milliman, whose team rallied to within four several times before a pair of late Buckeye goals accounted for the final scoring.

Ohio State used a 5-0 run that turned an early 1-1 tie into a 6-1 lead early in the second quarter. A Tre Leclair unassisted goal with 8:20 left in the first quarter ignited the spree for the Buckeyes, who got goals from five different players during the run. A Grant Mitchell goal, his second of the game, with 13:21 on the second-quarter clock capped the surge.

Johns Hopkins' Connor DeSimone, who was making his first career start on attack, halted the run with his second unassisted goal of the game just 45 seconds after Mitchell's goal, but Griffin Hughes answered five minutes later to start a three-goal run for OSU that took less than three minutes and gave the Buckeyes the seven-goal lead.

After trading goals that bookended halftime, the Blue Jays used a three-goal run of their own to slice a 10-3 deficit to 10-6 at the end of the third quarter. Junior Garrett Degnon's laser from the wing off a feed from Jacob Angelus made it 10-4 with more than nine minutes left in the third quarter. That score stood for nearly eight minutes before DeSimone and Jack Keogh added goals in the final 90 seconds to make it a four-goal game entering the fourth quarter.

The 10-6 deficit was the first of three times the Blue Jays pulled within four, but each time they did, the Buckeyes answered. Keogh's goal, which came from a tough angle with just four seconds remaining in the third quarter, was the first of six alternating goals the teams scored. A Cole Williams goal for the Blue Jays with 9:05 left in the fourth quarter made it 12-8, but Ohio State goalie Skylar Wahlund came up with a big save in-tight on Blue Jay attackman Brendan Grimes a short time later and Hughes'

third of the game at the 4:38 mark dashed any hopes of a Johns Hopkins comeback.

DeSimone led the Blue Jays with three goals and one assist, while Matt Narewski won 14-of-22 faceoffs and had nine ground balls. Josh Kirson, a graduate transfer who had played previously at Ohio State, posted 13 saves in goal in his Johns Hopkins debut.

Six different players had at least one goal for the Buckeyes with Leclaire (4), Hughes (3) and Jack Myers (3) leading the way offensively. Wahlund posted 11 saves and added nine ground balls to secure the win in goal for Ohio State, which held advantages in shots (37-32) and ground balls (33-26).

Notes: The hat trick for DeSimone is the fourth of his career and his four points are a career high • Degnon's goal extended his goal-scoring streak to seven games • Williams' goal was the 80th of his career • Narewski's 14 faceoff wins mark the fourth time in his career that he has won 14 or more.

#### - Game 2 -#20 Johns Hopkins-14, Michigan-7 Feb. 27, 2021 • UM Lacrosse Stadium

ANN ARBOR, MI – The Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse team picked up the first win of the Peter Milliman era on Saturday as they used an 11-1 run that bridged the second and fourth quarters to fuel a 14-7 win at Michigan. The win improves the Blue Jays' record to 1-1 (1-1 B1G), while the Wolverines slip to 0-2 (0-2).

Johns Hopkins trailed by two on three different occasions in the first 19 minutes and was down 4-2 when junior Joey Epstein picked the top far corner from the wing with 11:05 to play in the second quarter while the Blue Jays were up a main. That ignited a 5-0 run in the period that eventually grew to the 11-1 surge that put the game away.

Epstein's EMO strike was the first of three straight he would score as he beat the shot clock with a flag down at the 7:43 mark and scored another from the wing less than a minute later to give the Blue Jays their first lead of the game at 5-4 with just under seven minutes left in the first half.

A Cole Williams goal at the 2:41 mark made it 6-4, but Avery Myers scored at buzzer before halftime to make it a one-goal game at 6-5 at intermission.

Johns Hopkins put the game away in a third period that saw them get goals from five different players and outscore the Wolverines 6-0 to go up 12-5 at the end of three periods. Senior Connor DeSimone scored both of his goals in the period and the Blue Jays also got goals from Jack Keogh, Brett Baskin, Garrett Degnon and Jacob Angelus in the game-turning 15-minutes. In addition to his goal, Keogh assisted on the Degnon and Angelus goals in the period.

Epstein would complete his six-goal afternoon with a pair of fourth-quarter extra-man strikes, both of which were assisted by DeSimone. Bryce Clay and Myers scored in the final quarter for Michigan, which was held to just three goals in the final 41 minutes after grabbing the 4-2 lead in the opening 18:14 of the game.

Epstein's six-goal effort led the way for Johns Hopkins, which got goals and points from eight different players in the victory. DeSimone matched Epstein's six points with a two-goal, four-assist effort, while Angelus (1g, 3a), Keogh (1g, 2a) and Williams (1g, 1a) added multi-point games of their own. In all, 10 of Johns Hopkins' 14 goals were assisted on the day.

Michael Boehm scored twice and added an assist and Myers scored the two goals to power Michigan. The Wolverines held slight advantages in shots (34-33), ground balls (31-28) and faceoffs (12-11), but UM turned the ball over 21 times, including 14 in the second and third quarters combined when Johns Hopkins outscored the hosts 11-2.

Notes: The six goals are one shy of Epstein's career-high of seven and his three EMO goals are one shy of the school record (a record he co-holds with Patrick Fraser and Terry Riordan) • The six points for DeSimone and three points for Keogh are career highs, while Angelus tied his career high with four points • Degnon has scored a goal in a team-best eight straight games • Williams' third-quarter assist was his 125th career point • Today's game was the first game Johns Hopkins has ever played on February 27 ... this was the only date between February 15 and May 31 that Johns Hopkins had never played on.

#### - Game 3 -

#### #3 Maryland-18, #20 Johns Hopkins-10 Mar. 6, 2021 • Maryland Stadium

COLLEGE PARK, MD – The third-ranked Maryland men's lacrosse team used an 11-0 run that bridged the second and fourth quarters to turn a 7-5 deficit into a 16-7 lead and the Terrapins regained possession of The Rivalry Trophy with an 18-10 win over visiting Johns Hopkins at Maryland Stadium Saturday afternoon. The Terps improve to 3-0 overall with the win while the Blue Jays slip to 1-2 with the loss.

Johns Hopkins had used a 3-0 run of its own to turn a 5-4 deficit into the 7-5 lead late in the second quarter. A Connor DeSimone goal that beat the shot clock tied it at 5-5 and Jacob Angelus and Joey Esptein scored back-to-back goals just under 90 seconds apart a short-time later to give the Blue Jays the two-goal lead.

The Terps had it tied at 7-7 at the half as Logan Wisnauskas and Anthony DeMaio scored consecutive goals just 40 seconds apart in the final three minutes of the opening half to account for the deadlock at intermission.

The third quarter was all Maryland as the Terps outscored the Blue Jays 8-0 in the period to put the game away. A Jared Bernhardt unassisted goal while the teams were playing 5-on-5 broke the 7-7 tie at the 10:32 mark and Bubba Fairman dodged from behind the goal less than a minute later to give the Terps the lead for good.

Bernhardt scored three of his five goals during the third-quarter surge and Wisnauskas picked up three of his career-high seven assists to help fuel the spree.

Johns Hopkins had opened the game with a 3-1 spurt in the opening 10 minutes as Epstein scored twice and Cole Williams once for the Blue Jays, but Maryland answered with a three-goal run to grab a 4-3 lead late in the period.

The Blue Jays got a goal from senior LSM Conner Delaney with just two seconds left in the first quarter to pull even at 4-4 and used the DeSimone-sparked three-goal run to answer Bernhardt's first of the day to grab the 7-5 lead. Epstein's third goal of the half, which came with 3:31 left in the second quarter, was answered by the run-starting tallies by Wisnauskas and DeMaio that accounted for the halftime tie.

Williams (2g, 3a), Epstein (3g, 1a) and DeSimone (2g) paced the Blue Jays, who had

a three-game winning streak in the series snapped with the loss.

Wisnauskas (2g, 7a), Bernhardt (5g, 1a) and Daniel Maltz (3g, 3a) led the way for Maryland, which also got 14 saves from sophomore goalie Logan McNaney and a 17-of-29 performance on faceoffs from Justin Shockey.

Notes: Williams now has 14 goals and eight assists in six career games against Maryland, while Epstein has 10 goals and five assists in three games against the Terps. The 28 combined goals are the most in a Hopkins-Maryland games since 2000, when the Blue Jays topped the Terps, 20-11, at Homewood Field. Today's loss is just the second for Johns Hopkins at Maryland Stadium in its last 11 games there (including two games in the 2015 Big Ten Tournament).

# - Game 4 -

#### Johns Hopkins-13, #12 Penn State-6 Mar. 13, 2021 • Homewood Field

BALTIMORE, MD – The 12th-ranked Penn State men's lacrosse team needed less than four minutes to score twice and jump to a 2-0 lead against Johns Hopkins Saturday afternoon at Homewood Field. The Nittany Lions would need more than 42 minutes to add two more as the host Blue Jays used a 13-1 run that bridged the first and third quarters to fuel a 13-6 victory that improved their record to 2-2 overall and 2-2 in the Big Ten. Penn State slips to 1-3 overall and in the Big Ten.

The Nittany Lions' early two-goal lead was gone by the end of the first quarter as a Cole Williams unassisted goal at the 9:04 mark ignited a quarter-ending four-goal run that also included strikes from Jack Keogh, Joey Epstein and Connor DeSimone.

Penn State halted the run just under two minutes into the second quarter when Jack Kelly scored off a feed from TJ Malone after Malone grabbed the rebound off a Josh Kirson save and found Kelly on the crease for quick-stick goal from close range.

From there, it was all Johns Hopkins for the next 28 minutes as the Blue Jays answered the Kelly goal with a nine-goal run that pushed the 4-3 lead to 13-3 at the end of the third quarter.

Back-to-back DeSimone goals on quick dodges from behind the goal came 10 minutes apart in the second quarter to give the Blue Jays a 6-3 lead at the half and set the stage for what proved to be the game-deciding quarter.

A Jacob Angelus goal for Johns Hopkins just 38 seconds in the third period ignited a quarter that saw the Blue Jays outscore the Nittany Lions 7-0, win 6-of-7 faceoffs and hold a commanding 18-0 advantage in shots.

Six different players scored for Johns Hopkins in the third quarter with the Angelus goal jump-starting the period and DeSimone's fourth of the day ending it with 88 seconds on the clock. In between, the Blue Jays got two goals from Garrett Degnon and single goals from Williams, Epstein and Alexander Mabbett. Five of the seven goals in the quarter were assisted with Epstein and long stick midfielder Connor Delaney picking up a pair of helpers in the quarter.

Penn State scored the final three goals of the game as Malone, Jackson Reynolds and Mac O'Keefe all tallied in the fourth quarter for the Nittany Lions.

After losing the first four faceoffs the game, the Blue Jays won 12 of the next 14, including 10-of-11 in the second and third quarters combined to maintain a decided possession advantage. Junior Matt Narewski did most of the damage at the X for Johns Hopkins as he won 12-of-21 faceoffs and had five ground balls in the win.

DeSimone paced the Blue Jays offensively as he scored a career-high four goals and added one assist. Epstein (2g, 2a), Williams (2g), Degnon (2g), Keogh (1g, 1a) and Delaney (2a) added multi-point games for Johns Hopkins, which also got six saves from Kirson and held advantages in shots (46-22), ground balls (28-25) and faceoffs (13-9).

Malone had a hand in four of Penn State's six goals on the day as he had two goals and two assists, while O'Keefe had two goals on the day. Senior goalie Colby Kneese had 13 saves for the Nittany Lions.

Notes: The last time Johns Hopkins held a team shotless for an entire quarter was on March 2, 2012, when the Blue Jays held Princeton without a shot in the second quarter of a 10-8 victory • Degnon extended his team-best goal-scoring streak to 10 games • Epstein is now just two points shy of 100 for his career (65g, 33a) • The Blue Jays are now 10-3 all-time against Penn State and 5-1 all-time in games played on March 13 • The win was the first for head coach Peter Milliman at Homewood Field • The six goals Penn State scored were its fewest since falling 8-6 to Maryland in the 2017 Big Ten Semifinals.
