The Game

- Johns Hopkins hits the road for the second consecutive week as the Blue Jays (1-1) head to College Park to take on Maryland (2-0) in the 120th renewal of the greatest rivalry in college lacrosse.

Last Time Out

- The Blue Jays picked up their first win of the season as they went on the road and topped Michigan, 14-7, last Saturday in Ann Arbor.
- Maryland improved to 2-0 on the year with a dominating 13-7 win at Penn State last Friday night.

The Facts

- This is the 134th season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
- Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 994-347-15.
- JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

Poll Position

- Johns Hopkins is ranked 20th in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and is receiving votes in the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll.
- Maryland is ranked third in both the USILA Coaches Poll and the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll.

Series History

- This week's game will be the 120th all-time between Johns Hopkins and Maryland.
- The Blue Jays lead the all-time series 74-44-1 and have won three consecutive games against the Terps dating back to the 2018 Big Ten Championship game.
- This week's game is the earliest Johns Hopkins and Maryland have ever met in a season. Previously, the earliest date on record for a Hopkins-Maryland game is April 11 (1998, 2009).
- This will be Johns Hopkins' third game against Maryland in its last 13 games dating back to late in the 2019 season and its fifth against the Terps in its last 30 games dating back to late in the 2018 season.
- A full series history, including all-time results, can be found on pages 10-11.

On This Date

- This week's game at Maryland will be the ninth game Johns Hopkins has played on March 6.
- The Blue Jays are 5-3 all-time in games played on March 6 with four of the previous eight being played against Princeton.

All Johns Hopkins home games air on the ESPN family of networks with a majority of the games airing on ESPN. Johns Hopkins is the only lacrosse program in the nation - men or women - with its own exclusive national television agreement.



Things to Know - Maryland

- Maryland welcomes Johns Hopkins to Maryland Stadium fresh off a 13-7 win at Penn State that improved the Terps to 2-0 on the young season.
- Maryland is averaging 16.5 goals per game through two games, a mark that is tied for first in the Big Ten and tied for eighth in the nation.
- Maryland, which ranked fifth nationally in scoring margin at +8.5, has put the opposition way quickly in the early season as UM has outscored its first two opponents 15-6 in the first half and 24-8 through three quarters. Eight of the 16 goals Maryland has allowed in the first two games have come in the fourth quarter - long after the result was in doubt.
- While the offense may grab the headlines, the Terrapin defense has been exceptional thus far. Maryland has allowed just 16 goals and Michigan and Penn State - UM's first two opponents - shot a combined 23.2%.
- In addition to the obvious strengths in scoring offense and defense, Maryland ranks second in the nation in caused turnovers per game (11.0), is clearing at 88% and owns a 76-65 advantage in ground balls. Looking for a weakness? There hasn't been one thus far.
- Maryland head coach John Tillman needs just one win for 150 in his career.
- Maryland has won at least 10 games in an NCAA-best 17 consecutive seasons.

Terrapins to Watch

Jared Bernhardt (Sr. • A)

- Leading candidate for the Tewaaraton Award and Big Ten Player of the Year.
- Leads the Terps in scoring with five goals and six assists in two games.
- Recorded the 200th point of his career in the win at Penn State and now has 136 goals and 66 assists for 202 points. Ranks fifth in UM history in goals and sixth in points.

Daniel Maltz (So. • A)

- Leads the team in goals (9) and ranks second in points (10) through two games.
- Has scored his nine goals on just 11 shots (.818) with a perfect 4-for-4 showing in the win at Penn State.
- Currently ranks fourth in the nation in shooting percentage - first among players who have played more than one game.

Logan McNaney (So. • G)

- Took over as the Terps' starting goalie for final two games in 2020 and has locked down the position early this year.
- Sports an 8.21 GAA and a .579 save percentage through two games.
- Registered career-high 16 saves and allowed just seven goals in last week's 13-7 win at Penn State.

At Maryland Stadium

- Johns Hopkins is 9-1 in its last 10 games played at Maryland Stadium. The Blue Jays topped Maryland here in 2003, 2005, 2007, 2011, 2013, 2015 and 2019 and won a pair of games in the B1G Tournament in 2015. JHU fell to Maryland, 12-5, in 2017 at Maryland Stadium.

Odd, But True

- This week's game will mark just the second time since 1999 that Johns Hopkins and Maryland play a regular season day game at Maryland Stadium.
- Starting in 1999, the Blue Jays and Terps played under the lights in College Park in 1999, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2007, 2011, 2015, 2017 and 2019.
- In the only Hopkins-Maryland day game in College Park during that time, the 15th-ranked Blue Jays beat then top-ranked Maryland, 7-4, in 2013.

Head Coach Peter Milliman Briefly

- The Blue Jays' season opener against Ohio State was the first game for **Peter Milliman** as the head coach at Johns Hopkins.
- Milliman spent three seasons as the head coach at Cornell from 2018-20 and compiled a record of 28-10 while guiding the Big Red.
- Cornell was ranked number two in the nation when the 2020 season came to an end in mid-March.
- While the sample size is still small, Peter Milliman has never lost two consecutive games as a head coach at the Division I level.

The Rivalry Trophy

How do you ratchet up the intensity in a rivalry that is already more than 100 games old and features two of the most prominent programs in the sport? How about both teams join the same conference in the same year and debut a trophy to be awarded to the winner of the regular season game between the two?

That's exactly what happened in 2015 as Johns Hopkins (sport affiliate member) and Maryland (full member) both joined the Big Ten and the schools collaborated on the development of The Rivalry Trophy that year.

Unranked Johns Hopkins upset third-ranked Maryland, 15-12, to win the regular season game and claim The Rivalry Trophy in the first year of its existence, while the Terps responded with wins in 2016 (11-8), 2017 (12-5) and 2018 (8-7/3OT). Johns Hopkins won the last regular season meeting, 16-11, and the trophy has resided in the Cordish Lacrosse Center since.

- Johns Hopkins head coach **Peter Milliman** is joined on the sideline by offensive coordinator **John Grant, Jr.**, defensive coordinator **Jamison Koesterer** and volunteer assistant **Dan Annino**.
- Grant, Jr. came to JHU after spending the last two years at Air Force as an assistant coach, while Koesterer spent the last four years as an assistant coach at nearby UMBC.
- Annino was an assistant coach for three years at his alma mater, Amherst College, and was the 2019 IMLCA Division III Assistant Coach of the Year.

You Look Familiar

- Maryland offensive coordinator **Bobby Benson** is a 2003 Johns Hopkins graduate and was a four-year member of the Blue Jay lacrosse team.
- Benson spent 14 seasons as the Blue Jay offensive coordinator (2007-20) and helped lead Johns Hopkins to the NCAA title in his first season. In his first season as an assistant at JHU, he helped coach current Blue Jay defensive coordinator Jamison Koesterer, who was a senior on the '07 team.
- Benson helped the Blue Jays to the final four in 2000, 2002 and 2003 and a national runner-up finish in 2003. He concluded his career ranked sixth in JHU history in goals (124) and 14th in points (167).

Offense Clicks at Michigan

- After scoring a total of nine goals in the first five quarters of the season, the Blue Jay offense found its groove in the second and third quarters at Michigan.
- The Blue Jays scored five goals in the second period and six in the third against the Wolverines. That marked the first time JHU had scored 5+ goals in back-to-back quarters since the 2019 Big Ten Championship game against Penn State, when they scored six in the first quarter and five in the second.
- After scoring their first nine goals of the season on 34 shots (.265 shooting percentage), the Blue Jays scored 13 goals in the final three quarters at Michigan on 31 shots (.419).

Extra-Extra

- Johns Hopkins cashed in on all four of its extra-man chances at Michigan and his now 4-of-5 (.800) on the year.
- The four extra-man goals are the most for JHU since the Jays had six in the 2019 Big Ten Championship game against Penn State.
- The effort at Michigan marked the 18th time since 2003 that Johns Hopkins has scored four or more extra-man goals in a game.

Blue Jays Fifth B1G Preseason Poll

- Johns Hopkins was picked to finish fifth in the 2021 Big Ten Preseason Poll of the league's head coaches.
- Since the formation of the Big Ten in 2015, Johns Hopkins has won the Big Ten Tournament title twice (2015, 2018) and advanced to the title game one other time (2019).
- Johns Hopkins' two Big Ten titles and three appearances in the league championship game are both tied for the most in league history.

- Game 1 -

#10 Ohio State-14, #20 Johns Hopkins-8 Feb. 20, 2021 • Homewood Field

BALTIMORE, MD – Visiting Ohio State jumped out to a 9-2 lead midway through the second quarter and held off a second-half Johns Hopkins rally to secure a 14-8 Big Ten men's lacrosse victory over the Blue Jays at Homewood Field Saturday afternoon. The loss spoiled the Johns Hopkins coaching debut of Peter Milliman, whose team rallied to within four several times before a pair of late Buckeye goals accounted for the final scoring.

Ohio State used a 5-0 run that turned an early 1-1 tie into a 6-1 lead early in the second quarter. A Tre Leclair unassisted goal with 8:20 left in the first quarter ignited the spree for the Buckeyes, who got goals from five different players during the run. A Grant Mitchell goal, his second of the game, with 13:21 on the second-quarter clock capped the surge.

Johns Hopkins' Connor DeSimone, who was making his first career start on attack, halted the run with his second unassisted goal of the game just 45 seconds after Mitchell's goal, but Griffin Hughes answered five minutes later to start a three-goal run for OSU that took less than three minutes and gave the Buckeyes the seven-goal lead.

After trading goals that bookended half-time, the Blue Jays used a three-goal run of their own to slice a 10-3 deficit to 10-6 at the end of the third quarter. Junior Garrett Degnon's laser from the wing off a feed from Jacob Angelus made it 10-4 with more than nine minutes left in the third quarter. That score stood for nearly eight minutes before DeSimone and Jack Keogh added goals in the final 90 seconds to make it a four-goal game entering the fourth quarter.

The 10-6 deficit was the first of three times the Blue Jays pulled within four, but each time they did, the Buckeyes answered. Keogh's goal, which came from a tough angle with just four seconds remaining in the third quarter, was the first of six alternating goals the teams scored. A Cole Williams goal for the Blue Jays with 9:05 left in the fourth quarter made it 12-8, but Ohio State goalie Skylar Wahlund came up with a big save in-tight on Blue Jay attackman Brendan Grimes a short time later and Hughes'

third of the game at the 4:38 mark dashed any hopes of a Johns Hopkins comeback.

DeSimone led the Blue Jays with three goals and one assist, while Matt Narewski won 14-of-22 faceoffs and had nine ground balls. Josh Kirson, a graduate transfer who had played previously at Ohio State, posted 13 saves in goal in his Johns Hopkins debut.

Six different players had at least one goal for the Buckeyes with Leclair (4), Hughes (3) and Jack Myers (3) leading the way offensively. Wahlund posted 11 saves and added nine ground balls to secure the win in goal for Ohio State, which held advantages in shots (37-32) and ground balls (33-26).

Notes: The hat trick for DeSimone is the fourth of his career and his four points are a career high • Degnon's goal extended his goal-scoring streak to seven games • Williams' goal was the 80th of his career • Narewski's 14 faceoff wins mark the fourth time in his career that he has won 14 or more.

- Game 2 -

#20 Johns Hopkins-14, Michigan-7 Feb. 27, 2021 • UM Lacrosse Stadium

ANN ARBOR, MI – The Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse team picked up the first win of the Peter Milliman era on Saturday as they used an 11-1 run that bridged the second and fourth quarters to fuel a 14-7 win at Michigan. The win improves the Blue Jays' record to 1-1 (1-1 B1G), while the Wolverines slip to 0-2 (0-2).

Johns Hopkins trailed by two on three different occasions in the first 19 minutes and was down 4-2 when junior Joey Epstein picked the top far corner from the wing with 11:05 to play in the second quarter while the Blue Jays were up a main. That ignited a 5-0 run in the period that eventually grew to the 11-1 surge that put the game away.

Epstein's EMO strike was the first of three straight he would score as he beat the shot clock with a flag down at the 7:43 mark and scored another from the wing less than a minute later to give the Blue Jays their first lead of the game at 5-4 with just under seven minutes left in the first half.

A Cole Williams goal at the 2:41 mark made it 6-4, but Avery Myers scored at buzzer before halftime to make it a one-goal game at 6-5 at intermission.

Johns Hopkins put the game away in a third period that saw them get goals from five different players and outscore the Wolverines 6-0 to go up 12-5 at the end of three periods. Senior Connor DeSimone scored both of his goals in the period and the Blue Jays also got goals from Jack Keogh, Brett Baskin, Garrett Degnon and Jacob Angelus in the game-turning 15-minutes. In addition to his goal, Keogh assisted on the Degnon and Angelus goals in the period.

Epstein would complete his six-goal afternoon with a pair of fourth-quarter extra-man strikes, both of which were assisted by DeSimone. Bryce Clay and Myers scored in the final quarter for Michigan, which was held to just three goals in the final 41 minutes after grabbing the 4-2 lead in the opening 18:14 of the game.

Epstein's six-goal effort led the way for Johns Hopkins, which got goals and points from eight different players in the victory. DeSimone matched Epstein's six points with a two-goal, four-assist effort, while Angelus (1g, 3a), Keogh (1g, 2a) and Williams (1g, 1a) added multi-point games of their own. In all, 10 of Johns Hopkins' 14 goals were assisted on the day.

Michael Boehm scored twice and added an assist and Myers scored the two goals to power Michigan. The Wolverines held slight advantages in shots (34-33), ground balls (31-28) and faceoffs (12-11), but UM turned the ball over 21 times, including 14 in the second and third quarters combined when Johns Hopkins outscored the hosts 11-2.

Notes: The six goals are one shy of Epstein's career-high of seven and his three EMO goals are one shy of the school record (a record he co-holds with Patrick Fraser and Terry Riordan) • The six points for DeSimone and three points for Keogh are career highs, while Angelus tied his career high with four points • Degnon has scored a goal in a team-best eight straight games • Williams' third-quarter assist was his 125th career point • Today's game was the first game Johns Hopkins has ever played on February 27 ... this was the only date between February 15 and May 31 that Johns Hopkins had never played on.
