### Last Time Out

- Johns Hopkins knocked off Jacksonville, 11-8, at Homewood Field last Saturday (Feb. 5) in its season opener.
- In an odd twist, the Blue Jays' games at Towson and Georgetown will be the season opener for both the Tigers and Hoyas.

### In Case You Were Wondering

- This weekend's schedule of two games in three days will mark the first time since 2014 that Johns Hopkins will play two regular season games in a three-day span since 2014.
- In 2014, JHU topped Maryland, 11-6, on April 12 and went on the road and beat Mount St. Mary's, 17-2, on April 14.

- This is the 135th season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
- Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 998-355-15.

**Things to Know - Towson**

- Towson welcomes Johns Hopkins to Unitas Stadium for its 2022 season opener. The Tigers are 7-1 in their last eight home openers.
- The Tigers are coached by former Johns Hopkins All-American defenseman **Shawn Nadelen** '01. Nadelen is entering his 11th season as the head coach at TU and sports an 89-64 record with five trips to the NCAA Tournament to his credit.
- Another familiar face at Towson this season is **Luke Shilling**, who played at Johns Hopkins from 2018-21 and had seven goals and six assists as a reserve attackman/EMO specialist.
- This week's game against the Blue Jays is the first of seven games the Tigers will play against teams that appear in this week's USILA top 20. Included are non-conference games against Virginia, Duke, Loyola, Denver and Johns Hopkins.
- The Tigers are led defenseman **Koby Smith**, one of the top defenders and most dynamic players in the nation. He has 11 goals, eight assists and 101 ground balls to his credit ... watching him play is worth the price of admission.
- Towson has won the last three games against Johns Hopkins at Unitas Stadium and the home team has won seven straight in the series.

**Things to Know - Georgetown**

- The Hoyas welcome Johns Hopkins to Cooper Field for their 2022 home opener.
- Georgetown is led by Kevin Warne, the 2021 USILA National Coach of the Year. He guided GU to a 13-3 record and the program's first trip to the NCAA Quarterfinals since 2007.
- Georgetown features the best defense in the nation as the Hoyas led the nation in scoring defense (8.31) and man-down defense (.829) last season. GU held seven of its 16 opponents to eight goals or less last season and held four teams to five or less.
- The Hoyas placed a national-best six players on the 2022 USILA Preseason All-America Team, including five who play on the defensive end of the field. Graduate student **Owen McElroy** is the headliner among this impressive group as he was a First Team USILA All-American and the Kelly Award winner as the nation's top goalie in 2021.
- Sophomore **TJ Haley** and junior **Graham Bundy, Jr.** form one of the top returning offensive tandems in the nation. All Haley did as a freshman in 2021 was dish out an NCAA-best 3.60 assists per game (49 in 15 games), while Bundy found the net 36 times from his spot at midfield.

**Oh Captain, My Captain**

- Senior attackman **Joey Epstein** and graduate student defenseman **Jack Lyne** were selected into a vote of their teammates to serve as co-captains for the 2022 season.
- Epstein is in his third season as a captain and joins **Greg Raymond** '05 as the only players in program history to serve as a captain three times (dating back to 1950).
- Lyne is in his second season as a captain and is the 14th two-time captain in school history (dating back to 1950).

**For Openers**

- The Blue Jays improved to 18-4 in their last 22 season openers with the win over Jacksonville.
- Johns Hopkins has now won 13 of its last 15 season openers.
- Johns Hopkins has scored at least 10 goals in its season opener in 13 of the last 15 years and at least 12 goals in seven of the last 11.

**In February**

- Last week's game against Jacksonville was the 47th all-time for Johns Hopkins in the month of February.
- JHU is now 31-16 (.660) all-time in games played in the month of February.
- Johns Hopkins played its first game in the month of February in 1998, didn't play again in February until 2004 and has now played at least one game in the opening month of the season every year since 2006.

**On These Dates**

- This week's game against Towson will be just the second Johns Hopkins has played on February 11. The Blue Jays topped UMBC, 15-5, in their only previous game on this date in 2017.
- This week's game at Georgetown will be the first Johns Hopkins has ever played on February 13.

**Series History - Towson**

- Johns Hopkins and Towson will be meeting for the 49th time in a series that dates to a 15-8 Blue Jay victory in 1976.
- JHU leads the all-time series 42-6.

**Series History - Georgetown**

- Johns Hopkins and Georgetown will be meeting for the fourth time in a series that dates to a 15-10 Blue Jay victory in 1993.
- JHU has won all three previous meetings, including a 14-6 win in the 2007 NCAA Quarterfinals and a 10-9 overtime win in the first round of the 2018 NCAA Tournament.

**Poll Position**

- Johns Hopkins is ranked 16th in this week's USILA Preseason Coaches Poll and 19th in the *Inside Lacrosse* Preseason Media Poll (a new media poll was not issued this week).
- Towson is among the teams receiving votes in the USILA Coaches Poll and the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll.
- After a run to the NCAA Quarterfinals last season, Georgetown is a consensus top five team in 2022 as the Hoyas check in at number four in both the USILA Coaches Poll and the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll.

**Blue Jays Third B1G Preseason Poll**

- Johns Hopkins was picked to finish third in the 2022 Big Ten Preseason Poll of the league's head coaches.
- Since the formation of the Big Ten in 2015, Johns Hopkins has won the Big Ten Tournament title twice (2015, 2018) and advanced to the title game two other times (2019, 2021).
- Johns Hopkins' two Big Ten titles rank second in league history and the four appearances in the league championship game are tied for the most in league history.

### Four See First Action at JHU

- Four players made their Johns Hopkins debut in the 2022 season opener against Jacksonville.
- Sophomore attackman Cam Chauvette made his first career appearance and start as he got the nod on attack, while Emmett Jennings (LSM), Cody Ince (SSDM) and Logan Callahan (FO) also made their first career appearance as a Blue Jay.

### Closing in on 1,000

- Johns Hopkins enters this week's games with an all-time record of 998-355-15 to rank as the all-time winningest program in college lacrosse history.
- With two wins, Johns Hopkins will become the first men's college lacrosse program to reach 1,000 all-time wins.
- JHU is one of just seven schools with 700+ victories, one of just five with 800+ wins and one of two that has won 900 or more games.

### More Than 75% of Offense Returns

- Paced by attackman **Connor DeSimone**, who led the team with 25 goals and 20 assists for 45 points last season, the Blue Jays return eight of their top 10 scorers from 2021; of the seven players who scored 10 or more points a year ago, six are back in 2022.
- In all, JHU returns players who accounted for 75.8% of its goals (110-of-125) and 76.3% of its assists (61-of-80) last season.
- Among JHU's top eight returning scorers from last season, only two (**Connor DeSimone**, **Jack Keogh**) are in their last year of eligibility and four of the eight (**Jacob Angelus**, **Brendan Grimes**, **Casey McDermott**, **Johnathan Peshko**) have three years of eligibility remaining.

### Balanced Offense In Season Opener

- Eight different players scored goals in the 11-8 season-opening win against Jacksonville as the Blue Jays featured a balanced scoresheet in the victory.
- Graduate midfielder **Jack Keogh** paced the Blue Jays with two goals and three assists for a career-best five points, while graduate attackman **Connor DeSimone** had a team-high three goals and one assist for four points.
- Seven of JHU's 11 goals and four of five assists came from midfielders. Every member of the Blue Jays' first and second midfielders registered at least one point in the victory.

### In Case We Get To Overtime

- Johns Hopkins is 38-28 (.576) all-time in overtime. The Blue Jays topped Mount St. Mary's, 13-12, in overtime in their last game of the 2020 season.
- Johns Hopkins has won eight of its last 12 overtime games.

### One-Goal Wonders

- Johns Hopkins is 132-86 (.606) all-time in one-goal games. The Blue Jays dropped their last one-goal game, 14-13, to top-ranked Maryland on April 24, 2021.
- The Blue Jays are 7-4 in their last 11 one-goal games.

### Phillips Wearing #19

The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through the 2018 season, when he would have been a senior, and nobody else wore #19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, the coaching staff met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, **Robert Kuhn** was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber. **Forry Smith** was then chosen by the 2019 seniors to wear #19 in 2020.

Head coach **Peter Milliman** and his staff worked closely with the Huber family and members of Jeremy's class to chart a course for the issuing of #19 moving forward. Those three groups determined that a freshman would be selected annually to wear the number; for the 2022 season, midfielder **Stuart Phillips** was selected and will join Kuhn and Smith on the list of individuals who have worn the #19 since Huber's passing.





### Extra-Extra

- JHU converted on 2-of-4 extra man chances in the season-opening win against Jacksonville. The Blue Jays got extra-man strikes from **Jack Keogh** and **Johnathan Peshko** with Keogh and **Connor DeSimone** picking up assists.
- Johns Hopkins converted on 15-of-35 (.429) extra-man chances in 2021 to finish tied for 12th nationally in extra-man offense.
- Players who scored 13 of JHU's 15 EMO goals a year ago return in 2022 with **Joey Epstein** (5), **Garrett Degnon** (3), **Connor DeSimone** (2), **Johnathan Peshko** (2) and **Brendan Grimes** (1) all back this season.
- Epstein is JHU's career active leader in EMO goals with 12, while Degnon has six to his credit.
- The Blue Jays 42.9% conversion percentage last season marked the eighth time since 2012 that Hopkins has finished the season at better than 40% on extra-man.

### Defensive Notes of Interest

- The Blue Jay defense held Jacksonville to eight goals in the season-opening win. A year ago, the Blue Jays held the opposition to less than 10 goals just three times in 13 games.
- The performance against the Dolphins continued a trend dating back to last season. Entering the Big Ten Tournament, JHU was allowing an average of 12.9 goals per game and ranked 52nd in the nation in scoring defense. The Blue Jays then held their three tournament opponents to a total of just 29 goals (9.7 goals/game) to jump 11 spots nationally in scoring defense.
- In the last four games dating back to last season, JHU has allowed a total of 37 goals (9.25 goals/game).

### Blue Jay Defense Disruptive in Opener

- Johns Hopkins was credited with 11 caused turnovers in the 11-8 season-opening win against Jacksonville. Among the 28 teams that opened the 2022 season the weekend of February 4-6, the Blue Jays' 11 caused turnovers ranked sixth in the nation.
- The 11 caused turnovers for the Blue Jays mark the 16th time in school history that JHU has had 10 or more caused turnovers in a game (CTs became an official stat in 2009).
- The 11 caused turnovers were three shy of the JHU single-game record of 14 set against Loyola in 2014.

### First Seven vs. Last Seven

- Johns Hopkins posted a 2-5 record in its first seven games of the 2021 season under head coach **Peter Milliman** and a 3-4 record in its last seven under Milliman. After having no fall (2020) practice due to COVID in his first year and a limited preseason, the early results may not have been surprising as the team worked to improve under a new staff. A look inside the numbers shows a team that turned the corner after the seventh game in 2021:

## Noting Head Coach Peter Milliman



- Named the 23rd head coach in Johns Hopkins history on April 27, 2020.

- After not meeting his full team in person until six weeks before the first game of the 2021 season, led the Blue Jays to a 4-9 record in his first year. Team showed great progress through the season and, as the number six seed, made a run to the Big Ten Tournament title game to become the first number six seed in Division I college lacrosse history to advance to a league championship game.

- One of three active Big Ten head coaches with previous head coaching experience in the Ivy League as he joins Penn State's Jeff Tambroni (Cornell) and Maryland's John Tillman (Harvard).

- In ninth season as a head coach at the collegiate level with four seasons at Pfeiffer (2009-12) and three seasons at Cornell (2018-20).

- Has a career coaching record of 70-45 (.609), including a 28-10 mark at Cornell.

- Led Cornell to the 2018 Ivy League Tournament title and a trip to the NCAA Quarterfinals that year.

- In 2+ seasons as the head coach at Cornell, guided the Big Red to two wins against teams ranked number one in the nation at the time of the game and three against teams ranked in the top two.

- Developed a Cornell offense that was among the most prolific in the nation over his last two years. Cornell finished fifth in the nation in scoring offense in 2019 (14.3 gpg) and the Big Red led the nation in scoring offense (18.4) when the 2020 season ended.

- Coached five games against Big Ten teams while serving as the head coach at Cornell. Posted a 3-2 record in those five games, including wins over Ohio State (17-16) and Penn State (18-17) during the COVID-shortened 2020 season.

- Played collegiately at Gettysburg College and finished his career at GC ranked second in school history in points (232), fifth in goals (138) and third in assists (94). Remains one of just three players in Bullet history with more than 125 goals and 90 assists.

- Wife, Megan, played college lacrosse at York (PA) and serves as the head girl's lacrosse coach at the Friends School in Baltimore (Friends is located less than two miles from the Johns Hopkins campus on Charles Street).
