The Game

· · Johns Hopkins opens the 2022 season by welcoming Jacksonville to Homewood Field for the first-ever meeting between the two programs. Faceoff is set for 12 pm on Saturday, February 5.

The Facts

- This is the 135th season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
- Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 997-355-15.
- JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

Oh Captain, My Captain

- · Senior attackman Joey Epstein and graduate student defenseman Jack Lyne were selected into a vote of their teammates to serve as co-captains for the 2022 season.
- Epstein is in his third season as a captain and joins Greg Raymond '05 as the only players in program history to serve as a captain three times (dating back to 1950).
- · Lyne is in his second season as a captain and is the 14th two-time captain in school history (dating back to 1950).

For Openers

- The Blue Jays are 17-4 in their last 21 season openers.
- · Johns Hopkins has won 12 of its last 14 season openers.

Things to Know - Jacksonville

- Jacksonville makes its first-ever trip to Homewood Field for the 2022 season opener against Johns Hopkins.
- The Dolphins posted a 7-7 record last season and fell to High Point, 11-9, in the Southern Conf. Semifinals.
- Head coach **John Galloway** will test his team early this season as the Dolphins will play five games away from home, including trips to Johns Hopkins, Duke and Denver, before the calendar flips to March.
- Galloway is no stranger to Homewood Field as he was a standout goalie at Syracuse from 2008-11 and led the Orange to back-to-back national championships in 2008 and 2009; the 2008 title came via a 13-10 win over Johns Hopkins in the championship game.
- The success of the Dolphins a year ago came in large part to strong play at the X and high-percentage shooting. JU finished 17th in the nation in faceoff percentage (.553) and 20th in shooting percentage (.302).
- The Dolphins return eight of their top 10 scorers from 2021, although the two losses former JHU midfielder **Matt Stagnitta** (23g, 20a) and **Evan Tyler** (21g, 7a) ranked second and third, respectively, on JU's scoring charts in 2021.

Dolphins to Watch

Jack Dolan (Gr. • M)

- Led Jacksonville in goals (29) and points (49) and tied for the team lead in assists (20) last season. Earned First Team All-SoCon honors for the second time in his career (2019, 2021).
- One of the nation's top career returning scorers among midfielders with 64 goals and 60 assists to his credit. Ranks third in JU history in points and second in assists.

Nathan Kapp (R-So. • FO)

- One of the top returning faceoff specialists in the nation after winning 187-of-323 (.579) last season. Ranked 19th in the nation in faceoff winning percentage and 16th in ground balls per game (6.64).
- Already ranks third in JU history in career faceoff wins (228) and third in career faceoff winning percentage (.548).

Jason Yoquinto (Gr. • G)

• Second Team All-SoCon selection last season in his first year as a starter. Logged nearly 600 minutes in goal and posted an 11.14 goals against average and a .505 save percentage. Posted 16 saves in a loss at Duke and had 10 or more saves in six games on the year.

In February

- This week's game against Jacksonville will be the 47th all-time for Johns Hopkins in the month of February.
- JHU is 30-16 (.652) all-time in games played in the month of February.
- Johns Hopkins played its first game in the month of February in 1998, didn't play again in February until 2004 and has now played at least one game in the opening month of the season every year since 2006.

On This Date

- This week's game against Jacksonville will be the first Johns Hopkins has ever played on February 5.
- The game against the Dolphins will be the earliest in school history. Previously, the earliest date the Blue Jays have ever played was on February 7 (2015, 2017).

When Last We Saw Them

- Johns Hopkins finished the 2021 season at 4-9 overall, including 2-8 in the regular season. All 10 regular season games came against Big Ten opponents as the league played only conference games as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The Blue Jays were seeded sixth in the 2021 Big Ten Tournament, but made a stunning run to the title game as they topped third-seeded Penn State (15-7) and second-seeded and sixthranked Rutgers (12-10) to reach the title game for the third consecutive season.
- In the title game, the Blue Jays fell to top-seeded and top-ranked Maryland, 12-10.

Series History

- This week's game will be the first ever game between Johns Hopkins and Jacksonville in men's lacrosse.
- The Blue Jays and Dolphins did not share any common opponents in 2021 and do not share any common opponents during the 2022 regular season. The Dolphins will play at Denver on February 26; the Blue Jays tuned up for the 2022 season with a scrimmage against the Pioneers in Denver on January 29.

Roster Breakdown

- The Blue Jays' 52-man roster includes nine graduate students, nine seniors, nine juniors, 14 sophomores and 11 freshmen.
- \bullet Johns Hopkins' 2022 roster includes players from 13 different states and five players from Canada.
- By state, the Blue Jays hail from New York (13), Maryland (11), Pennsylvania (4), Massachusetts (4), New Jersey (3), Virginia (3), Florida (2), Connecticut (2), Ohio (1), Georgia (1), Delaware (1), Utah (1), Texas (1).

Closing in on 1,000

- Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 997-355-15 to rank as the all-time winningest program in college lacrosse history.
- \bullet With three wins, Johns Hopkins will become the first men's college lacrosse program to reach 1,000 all-time wins.
- JHU is one of just seven schools with 700+ victories, one of just five with 800+ wins and one of two that has won 900 or more games.

More Than 75% of Offense Returns

- Paced by attackman Connor DeSimone, who led the team with 25 goals and 20 assists for 45 points last season, the Blue Jays return eight of their top 10 scorers from 2021; of the seven players who scored 10 or more points a year ago, six are back in 2022.
- \bullet In all, JHU returns players who accounted for 75.8% of its goals (110-of-125) and 76.3% of its assists (61-of-80) last season.
- Among JHU's top eight returning scorers from last season, only two (Connor DeSimone, Jack Keogh) are in their last year of eligibility and four of the eight (Jacob Angelus, Brendan Grimes, Casey McDermott, Johnathan Peshko) have three years of eligibility remaining.

Extra-Extra

- Johns Hopkins converted on 15-of-35 (.429) extra-man chances in 2021 to finish tied for 12th nationally in extra-man offense.
- Players who scored 13 of JHU's 15 EMO goals a year ago return in 2022 with **Joey Epstein** (5), **Garrett Degnon** (3), **Connor DeSimone** (2), **Johnathan Peshko** (2) and **Brendan Grimes** (1) all back this season.
- Epstein is JHU's career active leader in EMO goals with 12, while Degnon has six to his credit.
- The Blue Jays 42.9% conversion percentage last season marked the eighth time since 2012 that Hopkins has finished the season at better than 40% on extra-man.

Offensive Notes of Interest

- The Blue Jays' most productive quarters in 2021 were the second and third, as JHU scored 42 goals in each of those quarters and held an 84-68 scoring advantage over the course of the season in the middle two periods.
- After being held below 10 goals three times in their first six games, the Blue Jays bumped up their production in the second half of the season. Over the final seven games of the 2021 season, Johns Hopkins scored at least 10 goals in all seven and 12 or more in four of the seven.

Defensive Notes of Interest

- JHU allowed an average of 12.15 goals per game in 2021 to rank 41st nationally in scoring defense.
- While 41st was not where defensive coordinator **Jamison Koesterer** and his group wanted to finish, the unit helped spark the Blue Jays' run in the Big Ten Tournament.
- Entering the Big Ten Tournament allowing an average of 12.9 goals per game and ranked 52nd in the nation in scoring defense, the Blue Jays held their three tournament opponents to a total of just 29 goals (9.7 goals/game) to jump 11 spots nationally in scoring defense.

Phillips Wearing #19

The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through the 2018 season, when he would have been a senior, and nobody else wore #19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, the coaching staff met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, **Robert Kuhn** was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber. **Forry Smith** was then choosen by the 2019 seniors to wear #19 in 2020.

Head coach **Peter Milliman** and his staff worked closely with the Huber family and members of Jeremy's class to chart a course for the issuing of #19 moving forward. Those three groups determined that a freshman would be selected annually to wear the number; for the 2022 season, midfielder **Stuart Phillips** was selected and will join Kuhn and Smith on the list of individuals who have worn the #19 since Huber's passing.

First Seven vs. Last Six

• Johns Hopkins posted a 2-5 record in its first seven games of the 2021 season and 2-4 record in its last six. Still, a look inside the numbers shows a team that was trending in the right direction at season's end.

In Case We Get To Overtime

- Johns Hopkins is 38-28 (.576) all-time in overtime. The Blue Jays topped Mount St. Mary's, 13-12, in overtime in their last game of the 2020 season.
- Johns Hopkins has won eight of its last
 12 overtime games.

One-Goal Wonders

- Johns Hopkins is 132-86 (.606) all-time in one-goal games. The Blue Jays dropped their last one-goal game, 14-13, to topranked Maryland on April 24, 2021.
- The Blue Jays are 7-4 in their last 11 one-goal games.



Noting Head Coach Peter Milliman



- Named the 23rd head coach in Johns Hopkins history on April 27, 2020.
- After not meeting his full team in person until six weeks before the first game of the 2021 season, led the Blue Jays to a 4-9 record in his first year. Team showed great progress through the season and, as the number six seed, made a run to the Big Ten Tournament title game to become the first number six seed in Division I college lacrosse history to advance to a league championship game.
- One of three active Big Ten head coaches with previous head coaching experience in the Ivy League as he joins Penn State's Jeff Tambroni (Cornell) and Maryland's John Tillman (Harvard).
- In ninth season as a head coach at the collegiate level with four seasons at Pfeiffer (2009-12) and three seasons at Cornell (2018-20).
- Has a career coaching record of 69-45 (.605), including a 28-10 mark at Cornell.
- \bullet Led Cornell to the 2018 Ivy League Tournament title and a trip to the NCAA Quarterfinals that year.
- In 2+ seasons as the head coach at Cornell, guided the Big Red to two wins against teams ranked number one in the nation at the time of the game and three against teams ranked in the top two.
- Developed a Cornell offense that was among the most prolific in the nation over his last two years. Cornell finished fifth in the nation in scoring offense in 2019 (14.3 gpg) and the Big Red led the nation in scoring offense (18.4) when the 2020 season ended.
- Coached five games against Big Ten teams while serving as the head coach at Cornell. Posted a 3-2 record in those five games, including wins over Ohio State (17-16) and Penn State (18-17) during the COVID-shortened 2020 season.
- Played collegiately at Gettysburg College and finished his career at GC ranked second in school history in points (232), fifth in goals (138) and third in assists (94). Remains one of just three players in Bullet history with more than 125 goals and 90 assists.
- Wife, Megan, played college lacrosse at York (PA) and serves as the head girl's lacrosse coach at the Friends School in Baltimore (Friends is located less than two miles from the Johns Hopkins campus on Charles Street).
