The Games

• Johns Hopkins (4-5) welcomes Michigan to Homewood Field for Homecoming. This is the first on-campus Homecoming game at JHU since 2019, when the Blue Jays topped Rutgers, 15-13.

Last Time Out

• Johns Hopkins dropped a 12-10 decision at Delaware on Sunday, March 20. That was the second of two games in three days for the Blue Jays, who fell to Navy, 11-10, at home on Friday, March 18.

• Michigan dropped its second straight after a season-opening seven-game winning streak as the Wolverines lost to Notre Dame, 12-7, last Saturday on the road.

The Facts

• This is the 135th season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.

• Johns Hopkins enters this weekend's games with an all-time record of 1,001-360-15 (.733).

• JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

First to 1,000

• Johns Hopkins became the first men's lacrosse program in history to reach 1,000 all-time victories with an 11-10 win over Loyola (2-19-22).

• With the win (and subsequent results), the Blue Jays are 1,001-360-15 all-time and sit 74 wins ahead of Syracuse on the all-time victories list among Division I men's lacrosse programs.

Things to Know - Michigan

- Michigan (7-2) comes to Homewood Field looking to get back in the win column after falling to Harvard (14-9) and Notre Dame (12-7) in its last two games. The two-game skid comes on the heels of a seven-game winning streak.
- Michigan, which will tie the program record for wins in a season with one more victory, is coached by **Kevin Conry**, a 2004 Johns Hopkins graduate who was a member of the Blue Jays' national runner-up team in 2003. He was a senior on the team when current Blue Jay defensive coordinator **Jamison Koesterer** was a freshman.
- The Wolverines bring one of the most prolific offenses in the nation to Homewood as UM ranks fifth in the nation in goals per game (16.11) and second in points per game (26.33). The Wolverines scored 20 or more goals in each of their first four games this season.
- While the eye-popping numbers the UM offense has put up have grabbed the headlines, the Michigan defense is also among the best in the nation. Michigan ranks seventh in the nation in scoring defense (8.89) and has held four of its eight opponents to eight goals or less.
- Michigan has played seven of its nine games to-date at home, but will play three of five Big Ten games on the road.

Wolverines to Watch**Shane Carr (So. • G)**

- One of the top young goalies in the nation as he comes to Homewood with an 8.26 goals against average and a .609 save percentage.
- After seeing limited action in just two games as a freshman in 2021, currently ranks third in the nation in goals against average and fifth in save percentage.

Ryan Cohen (Fr. • A)

- One of the top freshmen in the nation as he has 17 goals and 18 assists for 35 points. Ranks second in the nation among freshmen in points per game (4.25).

Josh Zawada (Jr. • A)

- Enjoying the most prolific season in Michigan history as he leads the team in scoring with 31 goals and 24 assists for 55 points in just nine games.
- Ranks fourth in the nation in points per game (6.11), seventh in assists per game (2.67) and 10th in goals per game (3.44).
- Needs just 19 points to become UM's career scoring leader.

Oh Captain, My Captain

- Senior attackman **Joey Epstein** and graduate student defenseman **Jack Lyne** were selected in a vote of their teammates to serve as co-captains for the 2022 season.
- Epstein is in his third season as a captain and joins **Greg Raymond** '05 as the only players in program history to serve as a captain three times (dating back to 1950).
- Lyne is in his second season as a captain and is the 14th two-time captain in school history (dating back to 1950).

On This Date

- This week's game against Michigan will be the 12th all-time for Johns Hopkins on March 26. The Blue Jays are 8-3 all-time on this date and have won their last three games played on this day.
- Among the notable wins on this date was a 9-7 win over Virginia in 2005 before a crowd of better than 8,300 at Homewood Field in a matchup of the top two ranked teams in the nation (JHU-1, VA-2).

Series History

- This week's game will be the 10th all-time meeting between Johns Hopkins and Michigan. The Blue Jays lead the series 8-1.
- The series dates to a 17-8 Blue Jay win in 2013. The first three games in the series took place at Homewood Field, while four of the last six have taken place in Michigan.
- The Blue Jays won the first four meetings at Homewood Field by an average of 8.75 goals per game and averaged 16.5 goals per game in those four outings before UM picked up its first win series history with the 13-10 at Homewood last April.

Johns Hopkins and the Big Ten

- The Blue Jays open Big Ten play with this week’s game against Michigan. Johns Hopkins joined the Big Ten as a sport affiliate member in 2015, the first year the league offered men’s lacrosse as a championship sport.
- Since the league was formed, the Blue Jays are tied for the league-lead in all-time appearances in the Big Ten title game (5) and rank second in Big Ten Tournament titles (2). The seven games JHU has won in the Big Ten Tournament are tied for the most in league history.
- Johns Hopkins is 137-66-1 (.681) all-time against teams currently competing in the Big Ten.

- The strength of JHU’s 2022 schedule has been well documented since head coach **Peter Milliman** announced the schedule last fall. The strength of the schedule has played out as expected with a quick look at the opposition’s record to date bearing that out.
- To-date, the nine opponents the Blue Jays have played have compiled a record of 40-20 ... that .667 opponent winning percentage ranks fourth in the nation.
- The Blue Jays’ five remaining opponents currently have a combined record of 29-11

• Overall, JHU's 14 regular season opponents are currently a combined 69-31 ... that .690 opponent winning percentage ranks as the third-highest in the nation.

Lacrosse's All-Time Winningest Program

- Johns Hopkins enters this week's games with an all-time record of 1,001-360-15 to rank as the all-time winningest program in college lacrosse history.
- With the win against Loyola on February 19, Johns Hopkins became the first men's college lacrosse program to reach 1,000 all-time wins.
- JHU is one of just seven schools with 700+ victories, one of just five with 800+ wins and one of two that has won 900 or more games.

Balance on Offense

- A quick look at the stat sheet reveals the Blue Jays feature a balanced scoring unit through the first nine games of the season.
- Johns Hopkins has seven players with eight or more points, 10 players with at least three goals and four players with 10 or more assists.
- In all, 16 different players have already scored at least one goal and 19 players have at least one point to their credit through nine games. The 16 players who have scored a goal already this season in nine games already matches how many players scored a goal for the Blue Jays in 13 games last season.

More Balance

- Breaking down the Blue Jay offense by quarters reveals the team has been relatively consistent in both goals scored and shooting percentage. JHU's best quarter to-date has been the fourth with 26 goals on 28% shooting. A look at the Blue Jays' offensive output broken down by quarter is listed below.

In Case We Get To Overtime

- Johns Hopkins is 38-28 (.576) all-time in overtime. In their last overtime game, the Blue Jays topped Mount St. Mary's, 13-12, in what proved to be their last game of the 2020 season.
- Johns Hopkins has won eight of its last 12 overtime games.

One-Goal Wonders

- Johns Hopkins is 133-87 (.605) all-time in one-goal games. The Blue Jays fell to Navy, 11-10, in their most recent one-goal game on March 18, 2022.
- The Blue Jays are 8-5 in their last 13 one-goal games.

Phillips Wearing #19

The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through the 2018 season, when he would have been a senior, and nobody else wore #19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, the coaching staff met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, **Robert Kuhn** was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber. **Forry Smith** was then chosen by the 2019 seniors to wear #19 in 2020.

Head coach **Peter Milliman** and his staff worked closely with the Huber family and members of Jeremy's class to chart a course for the issuing of #19 moving forward. Those three groups determined that a freshman would be selected annually to wear the number; for the 2022 season, midfielder **Stuart Phillips** was selected and will join Kuhn and Smith on the list of individuals who have worn the #19 since Huber's passing.



Defensive Notes of Interest

- The Blue Jay enjoyed one of their top defensive performances of the **Peter Milliman** era in the recent 10-7 win over Syracuse.
- Hopkins held the Orange more than nine goals below their season scoring average entering the game and the seven goals SU scored were its fewest since March 10, 2018. Ironically, JHU was also the last team to hold the Orange to seven as Hopkins scored an 18-7 win at the Carrier Dome in that game on March 10, 2018.
- Hopkins held the Orange to just one goal in the final 22 minutes of the game as SU went scoreless for more than 11 minutes at one point in the first half and more than 16 minutes at one point in the second half.
- While there are many factors that go into winning a game, scoring defense is a big key. Since Milliman took over in 2021 and appointed **Jamison Koesterer** as the defensive coordinator, JHU is 5-0 when holding the opposition to less than 10 goals.

A Comparative Defensive Look

- The Blue Jay defense has held four opponents below its season scoring average and one to exactly its average while four opponents have slightly exceeded their season average against the Blue Jays.
- In the last three games, the Blue Jays have held the opposition at or below their current season scoring average.

Causing Trouble

- Johns Hopkins was credited with 11 caused turnovers in the 11-8 season-opening win against Jacksonville, added 10 against Navy and 11 at Delaware; in all, the Blue Jays have totaled 67 CTs through nine games.
- The 11 caused turnovers in JHU's last game at Delaware mark the 18th time in school history that JHU has had 10 or more caused turnovers in a game (CTs became an official stat in 2009).

Extra-Extra

- JHU has converted on 9-of-24 (.375) extra-man chances through nine games and currently ranks 34th in the nation in extra-man offense.
- Five different players have scored extra-man goals on the year - **Garrett Degnon, Joey Epstein, Brendan Grimes, Jack Keogh, Johnathan Peshko** - and four players have combined for nine assists with Keogh dishing out four of the nine.
- Johns Hopkins converted on 15-of-35 (.429) extra-man chances in 2021 to finish tied for 12th nationally in extra-man offense.
- Epstein is JHU's career active leader in EMO goals with 13, while Degnon has nine to his credit.
- The Blue Jays' 42.9% conversion percentage last season marked the eighth time since 2012 that Hopkins has finished the season at better than 40% on extra-man.

Roster Breakdown
