• Johns Hopkins (5-5) heads north to Rutgers (9-1) for the first of two straight Big Ten games on the road. Faceoff at SHI Stadium is set for 7 pm with a live national television broadcast on BTN.

### Last Time Out

• Johns Hopkins bounced back from a pair of tight losses with a 15-12 win over Michigan at Homewood Field on Homecoming last Saturday (March 26).  
• Rutgers made it three straight in the win column as the Scarlet Knights raced past Ohio State, 18-7, at home on Sunday (March 27).

### The Facts

• This is the 135th season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.  
• Johns Hopkins enters this weekend's games with an all-time record of 1,002-360-15 (.733).  
• JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

### First to 1,000

• Johns Hopkins became the first men's lacrosse program in history to reach 1,000 all-time victories with an 11-10 win over Loyola (2-19-22).  
• With the win (and subsequent results), the Blue Jays are 1,002-360-15 all-time and sit 74 wins ahead of Syracuse on the all-time victories list among Division I men's lacrosse programs.

### Things to Know - Rutgers

- Rutgers (9-1) welcomes Johns Hopkins to SHI Stadium riding the crest of a three-game winning streak. The Scarlet Knights are currently ranked in the top five in both major polls this week.
- Head coach **Brian Brecht's** 'Knights enter this week's game fresh off an 18-7 demolition of then eighth-ranked Ohio State. This marked the third straight game RU has scored 18+.
- The Scarlet Knights feature one of the most potent offenses in the nation again this season as RU is averaging 16.7 goals per game and is shooting 32.4% on the year. Rutgers ranks second in the nation in scoring, scoring margin (+6.4) and points per game (25.9), fifth in assists per game (9.2) and 15th in shooting percentage.
- Not to be outdone, the Rutgers defense is also among the nation's best. RU has held the opposition to 10 goals or less seven times in 10 games and ranks 16th in scoring defense (10.3) and eighth in caused turnovers per game (10.0).
- The 'Knights must like whatever coach Brecht says in the locker room as RU has outscored the opposition 92-43 in the first and third quarters combined.
- Rutgers has turned SHI Stadium into one of the most difficult places in the nation for the opposition. RU is 35-8 at home since the start of the 2016 season.

### Scarlet Knights to Watch

#### Jaryd Jean-Felix (Sr. • D)

- Exceptional one-on-one defender who earned Honorable Mention USILA All-America honors in 2021. Has started all 29 games on defense since the start of the 2020 season. Has 36 career GBs and 25 CTs to his credit.

#### Colin Kirst (Sr. • G)

- Arguably the top goalie in the nation after grabbing Third Team USILA All-America honors last season.
- Sports a 9.73 goals against average and a .567 save percentage; ranks 11th in the nation in GAA and ninth in save %. Adept at jump-starting Rutgers' transition game.

#### Ross Scott (Jr. • A)

- One of the top attackmen in the nation as he enters this week's game against JHU with 30 goals and 19 assists for 49 points. Ranks 18th in the nation in points per game.
- Already has more goals, assists and points in 10 games this season than he did in 19 career games entering 2022.

### Oh Captain, My Captain

- Senior attackman **Joey Epstein** and graduate student defenseman **Jack Lyne** were selected in a vote of their teammates to serve as co-captains for the 2022 season.
- Epstein is in his third season as a captain and joins **Greg Raymond** '05 as the only players in program history to serve as a captain three times (dating back to 1950).
- Lyne is in his second season as a captain and is the 14th two-time captain in school history (dating back to 1950).

### On This Date

- This week's game against Rutgers will be the 12th all-time for Johns Hopkins on April 3. The Blue Jays are 9-2 all-time on this date.
- Among the notable wins on this date was a 12-11 overtime win at then fourth-ranked Virginia in 1982 and a 10-9 win against then fourth-ranked North Carolina in the Big City Classic at Met Life Stadium in 2011.

### Series History

- This week's game will be the 44th all-time between Johns Hopkins and Rutgers in a series that dates to a 13-0 Johns Hopkins victory in 1920.
- JHU leads the series 35-8 and the teams have met nine times since Johns Hopkins joined the Big Ten as a sport affiliate member in 2015.
- The Blue Jays hold a slender 5-4 advantage in the series since 2015 and picked up a stunning 12-10 win over then sixth-ranked Rutgers in the 2021 Big Ten Semifinals in the teams' last meeting.

### Johns Hopkins and the Big Ten

- The Blue Jays opened Big Ten play with last week's game against Michigan. Johns Hopkins joined the Big Ten as a sport affiliate member in 2015, the first year the league offered men's lacrosse as a championship sport.
- Since the league was formed, the Blue Jays are tied for the league-lead in all-time appearances in the Big Ten title game (5) and rank second in Big Ten Tournament titles (2). The seven games JHU has won in the Big Ten Tournament are tied for the most in league history.
- Johns Hopkins is 138-66-1 (.676) all-time against teams currently competing in the Big Ten.

- Rutgers is ranked in the top five in both the USILA Coaches Poll (4th) and the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll (5th) this week.

**Strength of Schedule**

- The strength of JHU's 2022 schedule has been well documented since head coach **Peter Milliman** announced the schedule last fall. The strength of the schedule has played out as expected with a quick look at the opposition's record to date bearing that out.
- To-date, the 10 opponents the Blue Jays have played have compiled a record of 53-25 ... that .679 opponent winning percentage ranks fourth in the nation.
- The Blue Jays' four remaining opponents currently have a combined record of 25-11 ... that .694 winning percentage of future opposition gives the Blue Jays the second-toughest remaining schedule in the nation.
- Overall, JHU's 14 regular season opponents are currently a combined 78-36 ... that .684 opponent winning percentage ranks as the second-highest in the nation.

### Lacrosse's All-Time Winningest Program

- Johns Hopkins enters this week's games with an all-time record of 1,002-360-15 to rank as the all-time winningest program in college lacrosse history.
- With the win against Loyola on February 19, Johns Hopkins became the first men's college lacrosse program to reach 1,000 all-time wins.
- JHU is one of just seven schools with 700+ victories, one of just five with 800+ wins and one of two that has won 900 or more games.

### Balance on Offense

- A quick look at the stat sheet reveals the Blue Jays feature a balanced scoring unit through the first 10 games of the season.
- Johns Hopkins has seven players with eight or more points, 10 players with at least three goals and four players with 10 or more assists.
- In all, 18 different players have already scored at least one goal and 20 players have at least one point to their credit through 10 games. The 18 players who have scored a goal this season in 10 games is already two more than scored a goal for the Blue Jays in 13 games last season.

### More Balance

- Breaking down the Blue Jay offense by quarters reveals the team has been relatively consistent in both goals scored and shooting percentage. JHU's best quarter to-date has been the fourth with 31 goals on 31% shooting. A look at the Blue Jays' offensive output broken down by quarter is listed below.

### In Case We Get To Overtime

- Johns Hopkins is 38-28 (.576) all-time in overtime. In their last overtime game, the Blue Jays topped Mount St. Mary's, 13-12, in what proved to be their last game of the 2020 season.
- Johns Hopkins has won eight of its last 12 overtime games.

### One-Goal Wonders

- Johns Hopkins is 133-87 (.605) all-time in one-goal games. The Blue Jays fell to Navy, 11-10, in their most recent one-goal game on March 18, 2022.
- The Blue Jays are 8-5 in their last 13 one-goal games.

### Phillips Wearing #19

The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through the 2018 season, when he would have been a senior, and nobody else wore #19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, the coaching staff met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, **Robert Kuhn** was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber. **Forry Smith** was then chosen by the 2019 seniors to wear #19 in 2020.

Head coach **Peter Milliman** and his staff worked closely with the Huber family and members of Jeremy's class to chart a course for the issuing of #19 moving forward. Those three groups determined that a freshman would be selected annually to wear the number; for the 2022 season, midfielder **Stuart Phillips** was selected and will join Kuhn and Smith on the list of individuals who have worn the #19 since Huber's passing.





### Defensive Notes of Interest

- The Blue Jay enjoyed one of their top defensive performances of the **Peter Milliman** era in the recent 10-7 win over Syracuse.
- Hopkins held the Orange more than nine goals below their season scoring average entering the game and the seven goals SU scored were its fewest since March 10, 2018. Ironically, JHU was also the last team to hold the Orange to seven as Hopkins scored an 18-7 win at the Carrier Dome in that game on March 10, 2018.
- Hopkins held the Orange to just one goal in the final 22 minutes of the game as SU went scoreless for more than 11 minutes at one point in the first half and more than 16 minutes at one point in the second half.
- While there are many factors that go into winning a game, scoring defense is a big key. Since Milliman took over in 2021 and appointed **Jamison Koesterer** as the defensive coordinator, JHU is 5-0 when holding the opposition to less than 10 goals.

### A Comparative Defensive Look

- The Blue Jay defense has held six opponents below its season scoring average while four opponents have slightly exceeded their season average against the Blue Jays.
- The Blue Jays have held four consecutive opponents below their current season scoring average.
- Below is a game-by-game breakdown of JHU's scoring defense compared to the opposition's current scoring average:

### Causing Trouble-Part I

- Johns Hopkins was credited with 11 caused turnovers in the 11-8 season-opening win against Jacksonville, added 10 against Navy, 11 at Delaware and nine against Michigan; in all, the Blue Jays have totaled 76 CTs through 10 games.
- The 11 caused turnovers at Delaware mark the 18th time in school history that JHU has had 10 or more caused turnovers in a game (CTs became an official stat in 2009).

### Causing Trouble-Part II

- In its last three games, Johns Hopkins has been credited with 10 (Navy), 11 (Delaware) and nine (Michigan) caused turnovers. This marks the first time since caused turnovers became an official statistic in 2009 that JHU has caused 9+ turnovers in three consecutive games.

### Extra-Extra

- JHU has converted on 11-of-27 (.407) extra-man chances through 10 games and currently ranks 30th in the nation in extra-man offense.
- Seven different players have an scored extra-man goal on the year - **Garrett Degnon, Joey Epstein, Brendan Grimes, Jack Keogh, Johnathan Peshko, Scott Smith** - and 10 of the 11 have been assisted.
- Johns Hopkins converted on 15-of-35 (.429) extra-man chances in 2021 to finish tied for 12th nationally in extra-man offense.
- Epstein is JHU's career active leader in EMO goals with 13, while Degnon has nine to his credit.
- The Blue Jays' 42.9% conversion percentage last season marked the eighth time since 2012 that Hopkins has finished the season at better than 40% on extra-man.

### Roster Breakdown

- The Blue Jays' 51-man roster includes nine graduate students, nine seniors, nine juniors, 13 sophomores and 11 freshmen.
- Johns Hopkins' 2022 roster includes players from 13 different states and five players from Canada.
- By state, the Blue Jays hail from New York (12), Maryland (11), Pennsylvania (4), Massachusetts (4), New Jersey (3), Virginia (3), Florida (2), Connecticut (2), Ohio (1), Georgia (1), Delaware (1), Utah (1), Texas (1).

- Has a career coaching record of 74-50 (.597), including a 28-10 mark at Cornell.
- Led Cornell to the 2018 Ivy League Tournament title and a trip to the NCAA Quarterfinals that year.

- In 2+ seasons as the head coach at Cornell, guided the Big Red to two wins against teams ranked number one in the nation at the time of the game and three against teams ranked in the top two.
