The Game

• Johns Hopkins (6-7, 2-2 B1G) welcomes Maryland (11-0, 2-2 B1G) to Homewood Field for the 2022 regular season finale. Faceoff is set for 6 pm (ESPN) on Saturday, April 23.

Last Time Out

- Johns Hopkins locked up a home game in the Big Ten Quarterfinals with a 13-10 win over Penn State last Saturday night at Homewood Field.
- Maryland ran its season-opening winning streak to 11 games as the Terps erased an early 7-3 deficit and cruised to a 19-12 win over Ohio State.

The Facts

- This is the 135th season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
- Johns Hopkins enters this weekend's games with an all-time record of 1,003-362-15 (.732).
- JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

First to 1,000

- Johns Hopkins became the first men's lacrosse program in history to reach 1,000 all-time victories with an 11-10 win over Loyola (2-19-22).
- With the win (and subsequent results), the Blue Jays are 1,003-362-15 all-time and sit 74 wins ahead of Syracuse on the all-time victories list among Division I men's lacrosse programs.

Things to Know - Maryland

- Maryland (11-0, 4-0 B1G) comes to Homewood Field as the undisputed top-ranked team in the nation after last week's 19-12 win over Ohio State.
- The win against the Buckeyes locked up the B1G regular season title for the Terrapins - Maryland has earned at least a share of the regular season title every year except one (2019) since the league added men's lacrosse in 2015.
- Head coach **John Tillman** brings the nation's top offense to Homewood as the Terps are averaging a national-best 18.36 goals per game, have scored at least 14 goals in all but one game and shoot at a 40.2% clip on the year.
- Making the Terrapins even more difficult to defend is the overwhelming possession advantage provided by junior **Luke Wierman**, who has won 189-of-286 (.661) faceoffs and has 94 ground balls on the year. Wierman ranks second in the nation in faceoff win percentage.
- While the offense grabs the headlines, the Terps also feature an exceptional defense as they are allowing just 9.8 goals per game and have held seven of 11 opponents to 10 goals or less.

Terrapins to Watch

Logan McNaney (Jr. • G)

- The most successful active goalie in the nation as he sports an 11-0 record on the year and a 28-1 mark in his career.
- Carries a 9.33 goals against average and a .536 save percentage on the year into this week's game against Johns Hopkins. Needs just six saves to reach 300 for his career.

Brett Makar (Sr. • D)

- One of the top defensive players in the nation after earning Second Team USILA All-America and First Team All-Big Ten honors in 2021.
- Counts one goal, two assists, 20 ground balls and eight caused turnovers to his credit this season. Made his 50th consecutive start last week against Ohio State and recently grabbed 100th ground ball of his career.

Logan Wisnauskas (Gr. • A)

- The leading candidate for the Tewaaraton Award as he paces the nation's best offense with 35 goals and 27 assists for 62 points. Shooting 46.1% on the year and slotted to start 69th consecutive game this week.
- Recently became Maryland's all-time leading scorer and enters this week's game just one point shy of 300 for his career (179g, 120a).

Oh Captain, My Captain

- Senior attackman **Joey Epstein** and graduate student defenseman **Jack Lyne** were selected in a vote of their teammates to serve as co-captains for the 2022 season.
- Epstein is in his third season as a captain and joins **Greg Raymond** '05 as the only players in program history to serve as a captain three times (dating back to 1950).
- Lyne is in his second season as a captain and is the 14th two-time captain in school history (dating back to 1950).

BIG Tourney Talk

- All six Big Ten teams will compete in the league tournament starting with the quarterfinals on Saturday, April 30.
- Johns Hopkins and Ohio State are assured of home games in the quarterfinals, while Maryland (#1 seed) and Rutgers (#2 seed) have earned byes into the semifinals.
- Below are the scenarios that can play out heading into the final weekend of regular season play:
- Johns Hopkins earns the #4 seed with a win over Maryland coupled with an Ohio State win over Michigan this weekend. In this scenario, the Blue Jays would host Penn State in the quarterfinals.

- Johns Hopkins earns the #4 seed with a loss to Maryland coupled with an Ohio State win over Michigan this weekend. In this scenario, the Blue Jays would host Penn State in the quarterfinals.

- Johns Hopkins earns the #3 seed with a win over Maryland coupled with an Ohio State loss to Michigan this weekend. In this scenario, the Blue Jays would host Michigan in the quarterfinals.

- Penn State is locked into the #5 seed and will play at the #4 seed in the Big Ten quarterfinals regardless of the result of this week's Penn State-Rutgers game.

- Michigan is locked into the #6 seed and will play at the #3 seed in the Big Ten quarterfinals regardless of the result of any of the three league games this weekend.

- The time of the Big Ten quarterfinal game at Homewood Field on April 30 will be announced no later than Sunday, April 25. The game will start no later than 2 pm with a live stream available on HopkinsSports.com.

On This Date

- Dating back to 1955, this week's game against Maryland will be the 13th for Johns Hopkins on April 23. The Blue Jays are 10-2 on this date in that time and have currently won five straight on April 23.
- While he didn't officially win the Tewaaron Trophy on this date, **Kyle Harrison '05** all but locked up the award with a five-goal masterpiece in a thrilling 9-8 win over fifth-ranked Navy at Homewood Field on April 23, 2005. After Navy took an 8-7 lead with less than a minute to play, Harrison forced overtime with an unassisted goal with 23 seconds remaining in regulation and then won it with his fifth of the game just 1:47 into OT.

Series History

- This week's game will be the 123rd all-time meeting between Johns Hopkins and Maryland. The Blue Jays lead the all-time series 74-47-1.
- Maryland won all three meetings in 2021 as the Big Ten played a league-only schedule. Included were a 14-13 win at Homewood Field in the regular-season finale and a 12-10 win in the Big Ten Championship game.

Johns Hopkins and the Big Ten

- Johns Hopkins joined the Big Ten as a sport affiliate member in 2015, the first year the league offered men's lacrosse as a championship sport.
- Since the league was formed, the Blue Jays are tied for the league-lead in all-time appearances in the Big Ten title game (5) and rank second in Big Ten Tournament titles (2). The seven games JHU has won in the Big Ten Tournament are tied for the most in league history.
- Including games played before the Big Ten was formed in 2015, Johns Hopkins is 139-68-1 (.671) all-time against teams currently competing in the Big Ten.

Poll Position

- Johns Hopkins is receiving votes this week in both the USILA Coaches Poll and the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll this week.
- Maryland is ranked number one unanimously in both the USILA Coaches Poll and the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll this week.

Strength of Schedule

- The strength of JHU's 2022 schedule has been well documented since head coach **Peter Milliman** announced the schedule last fall. The strength of the schedule has played out as expected with a quick look at the opposition's record to date bearing that out.
- To-date, the 13 opponents the Blue Jays have played have compiled a record of 89-56 ... that .614 opponent winning percentage ranks seventh in the nation.
- Overall, JHU's 14 regular season opponents are currently a combined 100-56 ... that .641 opponent winning percentage ranks as the fourth-highest in the nation.

Lacrosse's All-Time Winningest Program

- Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 1,003-362-15 to rank as the all-time winningest program in college lacrosse history.
- With the win against Loyola on February 19, Johns Hopkins became the first men's college lacrosse program to reach 1,000 all-time wins.
- JHU is one of just seven schools with 700+ victories, one of just five with 800+ wins and one of two that has won 900 or more games.

Lending a Hand

- Through 13 games, Johns Hopkins has collected an assist on 90-of-141 (.638) goals this season. The Blue Jays are one of just 24 teams in the nation assisting on 60% or more of their goals and rank ninth with an assist on 63.8% of their goals on the year.

More Lending

- The first 11 goals Johns Hopkins scored in its win over Penn State and 12 of its 13 on the night were assisted (.923). Taking it back to the game against Ohio State on April 9, 20 of the last 23 goals JHU has scored have been assisted (.870).

In Case We Get To Overtime

- Johns Hopkins is 38-28 (.576) all-time in overtime. In their last overtime game, the Blue Jays topped Mount St. Mary's, 13-12, in what proved to be their last game of the 2020 season.

- Johns Hopkins has won eight of its last 12 overtime games.

One-Goal Wonders

- Johns Hopkins is 133-87 (.605) all-time in one-goal games. The Blue Jays fell to Navy, 11-10, in their most recent one-goal game on March 18, 2022.

- The Blue Jays are 8-5 in their last 13 one-goal games.

Phillips Wearing #19

The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through the 2018 season, when he would have been a senior, and nobody else wore #19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, the coaching staff met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, **Robert Kuhn** was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber. **Forry Smith** was then chosen by the 2019 seniors to wear #19 in 2020.

Head coach **Peter Milliman** and his staff worked closely with the Huber family and members of Jeremy's class to chart a course for the issuing of #19 moving forward. Those three groups determined that a freshman would be selected annually to wear the number; for the 2022 season, midfielder **Stuart Phillips** was selected and will join Kuhn and Smith on the list of individuals who have worn the #19 since Huber's passing.



Balance on Offense

- A quick look at the stat sheet reveals the Blue Jays feature a balanced scoring unit through the first 13 games of the season.
- Johns Hopkins has eight players with nine or more points, eight players with at least six goals and four players with 13 or more assists.
- In all, 18 different players have already scored at least one goal and 22 players have at least one point to their credit through 13 games.

More Balance

- Breaking down the Blue Jay offense by quarters reveals the team has been relatively consistent in both goals scored and shooting percentage. JHU's best quarter to-date has been the second with 39 goals on 30.7% shooting. A look at the Blue Jays' offensive output broken down by quarter is listed below.

Defensive Notes of Interest

- While there are many factors that go into winning a game, scoring defense is a big key. Since **Peter Milliman** took over in 2021 and appointed **Jamison Koesterer** as the defensive coordinator, JHU is 5-0 when holding the opposition to less than 10 goals.
- Through 13 games, the Blue Jay defense has held the opposition scoreless for a stretch of 10 minutes or longer 12 times with eight of those stretches coming in the last seven games.

A Comparative Defensive Look

- Through 13 games, the Blue Jay defense has held eight opponents below its season scoring average while five opponents have slightly exceeded their season average against the Blue Jays.
- The Blue Jays have currently held five consecutive and six of their last seven opponents below their current season scoring average.

Causing Trouble-Part I

- JHU was credited with a season-high 12 caused turnovers in last week’s 13-10 win over Penn State. Johns Hopkins was also credited with 11 caused turnovers in the 11-8 season-opening win against Jacksonville, added 10 against Navy, 11 at Delaware, nine against Michigan and eight at Rutgers; in all, the Blue Jays have totaled 100 CTs through 13 games.
- The 7.69 caused turnovers per game this season is on pace to break the previous single-season record of 6.92 caused turnovers per game (2021). Prior to 2021, JHU had average more than 6.5 caused turnovers per game just once (6.73 / 2013) since CTs became an official stat in 2009.
- Johns Hopkins’ 100 caused turnovers this season mark the fourth time JHU has topped 100 CTs in a season and leave the ‘22 Jays just four shy of the single-season record of 104 (2015 - 18 games).

- In a recent four-game stretch, Johns Hopkins was credited with 10 (Navy), 11 (Delaware), nine (Michigan) and eight (Rutgers) caused turnovers. This marked the first time since caused turnovers became an official statistic in 2009 that JHU has caused 8+ turnovers in four consecutive games.
