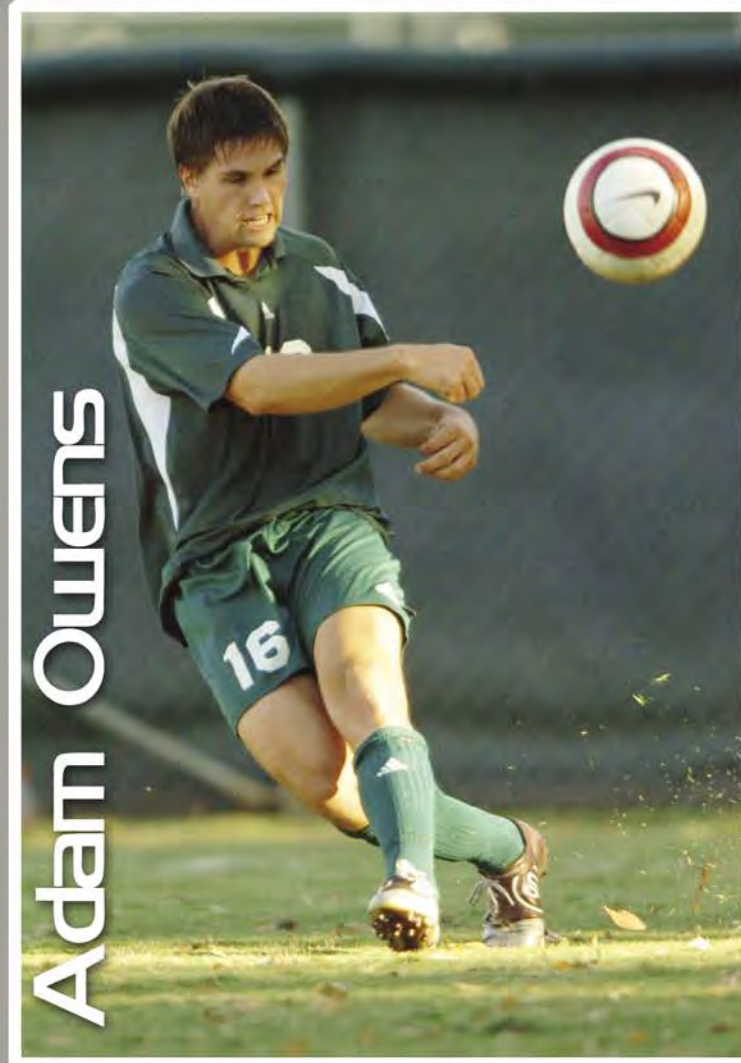

# 2007 SEASON OUTLOOK

The 2007 Sacramento State men's soccer team will have a new look this season when it takes to Hornet Soccer Field.

Last year's squad, which boasted 17 returners from the previous season, finished with a 7-10-2 record and a 4-4-2 mark in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation. The Hornets put a school record 42 goals in the back of the net, while allowing 23.

This year's team is in stark contrast to the experienced bunch that took the field at the start of last season. Fifteen newcomers have been brought in to compose a roster that is one of the youngest in the MPSF. Along with the new blood, the Hornets return seven letterwinners from last year's club, and two returning players who redshirted the previous season.

In their quest to dethrone New Mexico from the top spot in the MPSF, the Hornets will play a tough non-conference slate to prepare themselves for the conference grind. The schedule begins with a trip to the Midwest to take on Dayton and Butler, and includes road matches against UC Riverside and UC Irvine, who hail from the conference with the defending men's soccer national champion, UC Santa Barbara.

Five home games round out the non-conference schedule, highlighted by matches against Oregon State, Portland, Saint Mary's and Causeway rival UC Davis.

## GOALKEEPERS

The Hornets return two goalies with experience and both are expected to see plenty of action on the pitch.

"We are lucky to have two good goalkeepers," head coach Michael Linenberger said. "We're comfortable with either of them in goal."

Sophomore Ryan Kenny (Fresno, Calif.) posted a 4-5-2 record a season ago, while recording a team-best goals against average of 1.00. He paced the Hornets with over 991 minutes of action, while collecting 58 saves and an .841 save percentage.

"Ryan is playing really well right now," Linenberger said. "He closed out last year well for us and he had a great summer with the Fresno Fuego in the PDL."

Also in the mix is junior Nick Gargiulo (Sacramento, Calif.), who posted a 1-1-0 mark a season ago. Gargiulo had a 1.60 goals against average while collecting 12 saves in limited action.

"Nick actually won the starting job in the spring, but dislocated his shoulder just prior to fall training," Linenberger said.

## DEFENSE

The Hornet defense will mix experience with young talent in hopes of remaining one of the top back lines in the MPSF.

"We think we'll be good defensively this year," Linenberger said. "We are going to be real solid in the back and in the air with this group."

The cornerstone of the defense is junior Adam Owens (Carmichael, Calif.), who was a first team all-MPSF pick a season ago. He was the only player to start all 19 matches for the Hornets last season.

Returning to the defensive backfield after a year's absence is sophomore Jeff Buddenbohn (Sierra Madre, Calif.), who was the MPSF's co-newcomer of the year in 2005.

Another returner expected to find the starting lineup is sophomore Emmanuel Ochoa (Fresno, Calif.). Ochoa, who saw action in eight games last season, contributing two goals in set-piece situations last year.

A newcomer that is looking to crack the starting lineup is junior Omar Martinez (Half Moon Bay, Calif.), a transfer from Cañada JC. Martinez was the Coast Conference defender of the year in 2006, while also being named all-Far West region.

"Owens and Buddenbohn will make up the center of our defense, with Martinez on the right side and Ochoa on the left side," Linenberger said.

The Hornets will also have a good deal of depth on the defensive line. Sophomore David von Stockhausen (San Jose, Calif.) returns from a one year absence at center back.

A trio of freshmen, Chris Cosby (Loomis, Calif.), Alex DeTorres (Elk Grove, Calif.), and Cody Shields (Bonita, Calif.) will all have their chances to contribute defensively, as will sophomore Kyle Beasley (Concord, Calif.) who walked on in the spring from Contra Costa JC.

## MIDFIELDERS

The most experienced bunch on this Hornet team make up the midfield, as Sacramento State will begin the season with three experienced starters.

Seniors Eli Millan (Santa Ana, Calif.) and Brandon Baggett (Santa Rosa, Calif.), along with junior Josh Zimbrich (Loomis, Calif.) combined to play in 50 matches a season ago, including 18 starts.

Millan, who scored three goals and added six assists a season ago, will move from striker to the center midfield spot this season.

"Eli has a lot of experience," Linenberger said. "We've dropped him back to the midfield so that he can run the show and be a playmaker for us."

Baggett, who scored one goal and added an assist a season ago, and Zimbrich, who scored three goals and added four assists, will man the right and left side respectively, of the Hornet midfield.

"They are both good passers with really good feet," Linenberger said of the duo. "Zimbrich is naturally a left footed player."

A trio of newcomers will compete for playing time behind the starting line. The list includes junior transfers Brady Nunes (Wailuku, Hawaii) and Patrick Egloria (Mililani, Hawaii), and freshman Fernando Cabadas (Sacramento, Calif.).

The most interesting story of the bunch is Cabadas, who impressed the coaches enough in open tryouts to earn a roster spot.

"He is getting used to playing organized soccer," Linenberger said of Cabadas. "He is a great passer, and we're seeing how quick he can adapt to the physical part of the game that comes at the Division I level."

Freshmen cousins Adam and Chris Betencourt (Hilmar, Calif.) will likely redshirt the 2007 season.

## FORWARDS

The biggest question mark on the 2007 edition of the Hornets can be found in the striking line, as Sacramento State has no returners from a season ago. What they do have is a youthful battle for playing time.

One of the players expected to see a good chunk of time at the start of the season is freshman Ernesto Carranza (Oakdale, Calif.). Carranza led the Valley Oak League with 30 assists last season, while also adding 15 goals.

"He might be our most clever player," Linenberger said of Carranza. "He has great dribble moves and is very creative with the ball, but we have to see how quickly he'll adapt to the physicality of this level."

Junior transfer Blake Nunes (Wailuku, Hawaii) will also see early time. He scored 15 goals and added 10 assists in a two-year playing career at Santa Rosa JC.

Freshman Jose Cortez (San Jose, Calif.) is another player who will factor into the playing time discussion at forward, as he posted 15 goals and 21 assists last season at William C. Overfelt HS. He is the younger brother of Hornet assistant Juan Carlos Cortez.

Another player found at open tryouts, junior transfer Travis Britt (Santa Rosa, Calif.) has impressed coaches with his motor and work ethic, and will be in the mix as well.

## MICHAEL LINENBERGER HEAD COACH 19TH SEASON DUKE, '87 113-188-29

Michael Linenberger begins his 19th season at the helm of the Sacramento State men's soccer program. He began his coaching career with the Hornets as an assistant in 1988 and co-head coach from 1989 to 1991, before taking sole control of the head coaching duties in 1992.

He has led the team through each year as a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation, beginning in 1992 and returns to the field in 2007 with hopes of capturing the MPSF's automatic bid into the NCAA College Cup.

The Hornets finished the 2006 campaign with a record of 7-10-2, including a 4-4-2 mark in the MPSF. The team finished on a high note, going unbeaten in the final four games of the season for a 2-0-2 record, which included a scoreless tie with then-No. 9 ranked New Mexico.

Sacramento State had six student-athletes earn All-MPSF honors following the 2006 season, including two first team selections. The Hornets also had three players named to the conference all-academic team, including defender Jesse Manton, who in addition was named a NSCAA scholar-athlete for the second straight season.

For the second straight season, the Hornets had a player drafted in the Major Indoor Soccer League as senior midfielder Pedro Lupercio, who earned third team all-conference honors, was selected in the first round by the California Cougars.

In 2003, Linenberger led the Hornet squad to its third-consecutive MPSF postseason appearance. It marked the first time Sacramento State had reached postseason play three consecutive years.

During the 2001 season, Linenberger guided the Hornets to their first regular-season conference championship in the Div. I era (1991-present). Sacramento State's 4-1-2 MPSF record also gave the Hornets their most conference wins in program history at the time. Due to his efforts, Linenberger was named 2001 MPSF Men's Soccer Coach of the Year.

Off the field, he served five years as a member of the NCAA Div. I national selection committee. Linenberger was named to the NCAA Div. I Men's Soccer Committee in the fall of 1997. As chair of the Far West Region, he travelled to Indianapolis, and served as the region representative during the process of selecting the 48 teams that compete annually in the NCAA tournament.

As a member of the NCAA soccer committee, Linenberger's duties included overseeing site selection in the Far West Region for all rounds leading up to the Men's College Cup, updating selection criteria and standards for the championships, rating conferences and serving at the College Cup as a member of the NCAA contingent which oversees the event.

In addition, Linenberger was named as a scout by the U.S. Soccer Federation for Project 2010, an initiative designed to make the men's national team fully competitive by the 2010 World Cup. His primary duties included the scouting of 13-14 year olds in Northern California that have future national team potential but are not in the ODP system.

Linenberger received a bachelor of arts degree in psychology from Duke University in 1987. He was a four-year letterwinner as a member of the Blue Devils' soccer team and a team captain. He was captain of the 1986 squad which won the NCAA Div. I national title.

Linenberger played professional soccer with the Sacramento Senators and for FC St. Pauli and SC Norderstedt in Germany's second and third divisions.

In addition, 30 of his former Sacramento State student-athletes have gone on to professional careers. That includes Joe Enochs, who was named to the 2001 U.S. National team.

A holder of a United States Soccer Federation A license in coaching, Linenberger played with the under-20 United States National Youth Team and in the U.S. Olympic Festival.

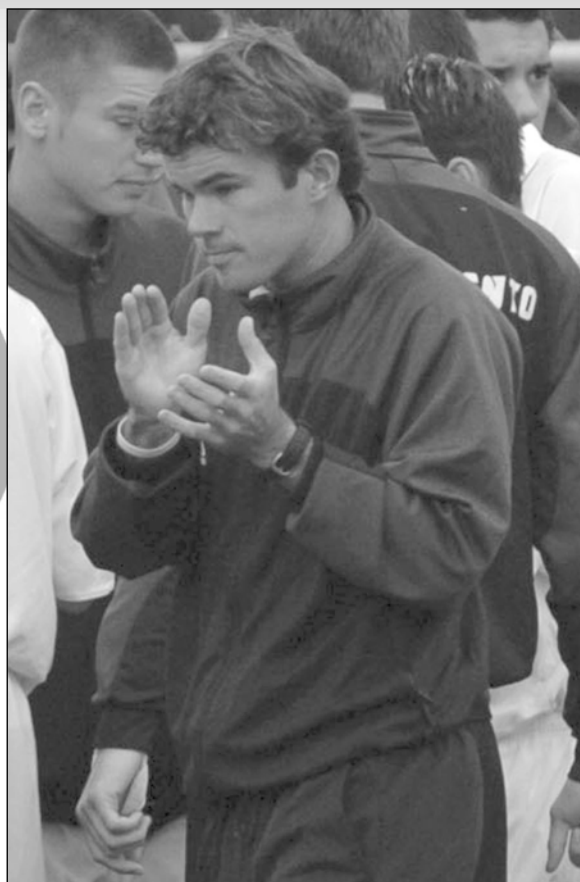

**2007 MPSF Format**  
The MPSF will use a round-robin regular season schedule in which each member of the conference will play each other twice to determine the conference champion. The format will give an automatic bid to the regular season winner.

The Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) was established during the 1992-1993 academic year to serve the competitive needs of member institutions from the Big West, Pacific-10, Mountain West, Western Athletic and West Coast Conferences and other selected universities in the western United States, and to provide championship competition for Division I intercollegiate Olympic sports in a conference setting. The MPSF was originally formed to provide enhanced competition and championship opportunities for sports without conference affiliation; to contain the costs of competition; and to ensure the survival of sports impacted by Title IX and other fiscal pressures. The Federation has served as an incubator for emerging women's sports and as a safe harbor for sports impacted by conference realignments. In 2006-2007, the Federation celebrated its 15th year of competition and is affirmed that is more relevant today than at any other time since its inception. As a testament to its viability, the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation continues to successfully manage the ever-changing face of member institutions and conferences.

In 2007-2008, the MPSF will again sponsor nine Olympic intercollegiate sports while serving over 1,500 student-athletes and approximately 75 head coaches from 31 universities in 12 western states. All MPSF teams compete at the NCAA Division I level in men's soccer, men's and women's water polo, men's and women's indoor track and field, men's and women's gymnastics, women's lacrosse and men's volleyball. All MPSF champions are eligible to compete in NCAA Championships with MPSF men's soccer, men's and women's water polo, and men's volleyball champions earning automatic qualification into NCAA championship events. The MPSF portfolio of teams for 2007-2008 season will remain the same with the Federation serving 31 institutions sponsoring 74 Division I teams in nine sports. The 2007-2008 academic year will be a water-shed season as the Federation looks to do a makeover, redesigning its logo and graphic presentation, and launching a new website during the Fall of 2007. The MPSF will also look to more technological advances as it upgrades its level of conference services to participating member institutions.

Al Beard has been the Federation's only executive director, taking the reigns after being selected by the MPSF Administrative Committee in 1998. Beard's position was established as a result of the Federation's successful growth and well established tradition of NCAA and national championship caliber play. The former Director of Youth and Community Programs for UC Davis Athletics, Beard oversees the administration of all Federation sports, while working closely with head coaches and administrators from over 30 universities competing in Division I athletics. Beard oversees all aspects of MPSF competition, including scheduling, officiating, championships, media relations, broadcasting, NCAA relations, and sponsorships, while also facilitating conference legislation, annual coaches' business meetings and Federation Administrative and Executive Committee meetings. In 2004, Beard completed a four-year term, including three years as chair of the NCAA Men's Water Polo Championships and Rules Committee and also currently serves as liaison to the USOC and national governing bodies for amateur athletics in the United States.

## About The University

- Sacramento State is the seventh largest university in the 23-campus CSU system, enrolling a multicultural student body of 28,529. The 300-acre campus is sheltered by more than 3,000 trees and dotted with flower gardens, including 3 million square feet of building space. Miles of trails stretch along the nearby river parkway, linking the University and student housing with recreational areas such as Folsom Lake and Old Sacramento.
- Quality teaching is a top priority, and classes are small and personalized. More than 80 percent of recent graduates say their professors were enthusiastic and genuinely enjoyed teaching.
- Preparing students for a career is a vital part of the education here. Thousands of students from all majors earn academic credit working internship and co-op positions, many of which are paid.
- Sacramento State, often called "Sac State," was founded as Sacramento State College in 1947 during a time of intense demand for higher education after World War II. We moved to our permanent location on the banks of the historic American River in 1953. In 1972, we were renamed California State University, Sacramento.
- The University is in the midst of an ambitious new master plan that will remake Sacramento State into a residential campus and add some 1.5 million square feet of building space. The plan, to guide campus growth in coming decades, includes housing for as many as 5,000 students and an arena and wellness center. It also envisions a performing arts center, new classroom buildings as high as eight stories, a space science center, parking structures and a green mall down the center of campus.
- Unlimited bus and light rail service throughout Sacramento is free for University students. Students may attend all home athletic events for free and attend other campus events for free or at a discount. More than half the students join one of the more than 200 student organizations, which include 35 fraternities and sororities.

- Sacramento State offers 60 undergraduate and 40 graduate degrees in eight Colleges. Teacher education is the largest academic program, followed by business, criminal justice, communication studies, psychology and computer science. The student-to-faculty ratio is 20 to 1; more than 70 percent of classes have fewer than 30 students.
- Attracting students from all over the world, the criminal justice program is one of the largest in the United States.
- One in 26 residents of the six-county Sacramento Region is a Sacramento State graduate. The University directly and indirectly contributes more than \$900 million to the region's economy annually.
- Almost 700 new school teachers graduate from Sacramento State each year.
- Seventy-eight percent of students say that Sacramento State was their first or only choice.
- Sacramento State was the site of the 2003, 2005, 2006 and 2007 NCAA Div. I Track & Field Championships, and the Sacramento State Aquatic Center was the site of the 1997, 1999, 2004 and 2005 NCAA Women's Rowing Championships. This year, Sacramento State will host the NCAA Div. I Women's Volleyball Final Four on Dec. 13-15 at Arco Arena.
- Sacramento State hosted the most successful U.S. Olympic Track and Field Trials ever in 2000, and hosted the event again in 2004.
- Famous Sacramento State alumni include actor Tom Hanks, Grammy award winner Bobby McFerrin, former co-host of *Good Morning America* Joan Lunden, former host of the *Early Show* Rene Syler, stand-up comedian Brian Posehn, actor Carlos Alazraqui, film director Joe Carnahan, Stockton mayor Edward Chavez, famous economist and author Richard J. Maybury, former *KTLA Morning News* Giselle Fernández and founding member of the Village People David Hodo.
- Famous Sacramento State athletics alumni include retired nine-year NFL offensive lineman and two-time Super Bowl winner John Gesek, Oakland Raiders offensive coordinator Greg Knapp, 10-year NFL fullback Daimon Shelton, seven-year New England Patriots long snapper and three-time Super Bowl winner Lonie Paxton, former 12-year NFL defensive back Lorenzo Lynch, New York Jets offensive lineman Marko Cavka, CFL Edmonton Eskimos quarterback Ricky Ray, CFL Winnipeg Blue Bombers running back Charles Roberts, and longtime Arena Football League quarterback Aaron Garcia.

# CITY OF SACRAMENTO

- Sacramento is part of a Capital Region with nearly 2 million people in the heart of Northern California, one of the country's most beautiful areas. Within easy driving distance are San Francisco, the Napa and Sonoma valleys, the historic gold country and the Lake Tahoe region's ski slopes.
- Sacramento is notably diverse racially, ethnically, and by household income, and has a notable lack of inter-racial disharmony. In 2002, *Time* magazine and the Civil Rights Project of Harvard University identified Sacramento as the most racially/ethnically integrated major city in America.
- Sacramento is one of the most affordable big cities in California.
- Sacramento is home to the NBA's Sacramento Kings, Sacramento River Cats (the Oakland A's Triple-A affiliate) and the WNBA's Sacramento Monarchs.
- Sacramento hosts the world's largest traditional jazz festival each Memorial Day weekend. It has also become a tourist center with attractions including the State Capitol building, North America's largest railroad museum, the Old Sacramento historic area, the California State History Museum and the Crocker Art Museum.
- Founded in 1849, Sacramento is the cultural, education, business and governmental center of a four-county metropolitan region.

# ALEXANDER GONZALEZ

## UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

Dr. Alexander Gonzalez is the 11th president of California State University, Sacramento – the capital city's only comprehensive university and one of the largest campuses in the California State University system.

Dr. Gonzalez was appointed President of Sacramento State in 2003, bringing new energy and a focused vision to the University. He is overseeing an initiative known as Destination 2010, which is designed to make Sacramento State a premier metropolitan university and a destination campus for the West. Among the priorities are enhancing academic programs and student services; new academic buildings; new on- and near-campus student housing; a faculty and staff village near campus; and a new Recreation and Wellness Center.

Before coming to Sacramento, Dr. Gonzalez served from 1997 to 2003 as President of Cal State San Marcos. At San Marcos, he oversaw a period of rapid growth as well as many successful fundraising campaigns. He also spent 18 years at Fresno State, starting as a faculty member in the Psychology Department, which he later chaired. From 1991 to 1997, he served as the university's Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Dr. Gonzalez is a member of the Board of Trustees at Pomona College. He also serves on the Sutter Health Board of Directors and the Board of Directors for Valley Vision.

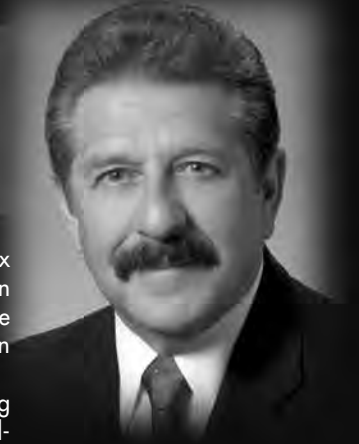
Dr. Gonzalez previously served on President Bush's Advisory Commission on Educational Excellence for Hispanic Americans. His service on a number of

other boards and commissions includes six years as a Commissioner for the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, the agency that accredits higher education institutions in the western United States.

He also served as Chair of the Governing Board of the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities. His service to the CSU system includes serving on a work group that reviewed and recommended action on remedial education, and, more recently, as a member of a committee of presidents considering policy on enrollment management, the CSU's Technology Steering Committee, and the Institute for Teaching and Learning.

Dr. Gonzalez holds a doctorate and master's degree in Psychology from UC Santa Cruz. He received his bachelor's degree in history from Pomona College, where he graduated with honors and was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He spent a year at Stanford University as a postdoctoral fellow of the Ford Foundation and the National Research Council conducting research on the psychology of time. He also attended Harvard Law School.

Dr. Gonzalez and his wife Gloria have been married for more than 35 years. They are the parents of two adult sons.



# TERRY WANLESS

## ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

Dr. Terry Wanless' five-year tenure as Sacramento State's Director of Athletics has seen growth unparalleled in the school's 16-year Division I history. His vision of broad success in the department came to fruition in the 2006-07 academic year where the Hornets claimed an unprecedented eight conference championships. That total included an amazing four titles which came in a four-hour span on May 29.

Wanless has also overseen significant facility enhancement to the athletic facilities. The biggest change will come in early 2008 with the opening of the Broad Athletic Facility. The building will serve as the home to the Hornet football and track and field programs as well as athletic training and strength and conditioning.

The Broad Athletic Facility is the first step of an elaborate plan that began with the passing of a referendum by the Sacramento State student body. That vote will also lead to the creation of a recreation and wellness center which will benefit the entire student body.

Wanless, who is entering his sixth year with the Hornets, has been a visible member of the Sacramento State athletics family, constantly representing the University and department at public outings and speaking engagements. His commitment to the student-athlete has also been clear as both he and his wife, Joanne, attend the majority of Hornet home athletic events and support several teams on the road.

His leadership and academic support have been evident to the student-athletes in other ways as well. The department's Life Skills Program has seen rapid growth, significantly increasing the number of summer and fifth-year scholarships available to Hornet student-athletes. The Life Skills program has also launched the program's first computer lab and offers Hornet student-athletes tutoring as well as academic counseling.

Additionally, Wanless instituted a number of new programs, including the Athletics Director's Academic Achievement Award – presented to each student-athlete that achieves a term GPA of 3.0 or higher. Those academic efforts have paid early dividends. Over the last five years, Sacramento State student-athletes have posted over 1,300 term GPAs of 3.0 or above. Additionally, over 300 Hornets have earned conference all-academic honors during that same time period.

His efforts in restoring the department's booster club structure as well as aggressively improving the University's collegiate licensing program, while not readily

visible, are projects that will surely enhance the program's financial footing in years to come.

Athletically, the Hornets have also seen continued growth and success on the field of play. During his five years at Sacramento State, 21 teams and 43 individuals have advanced to conference and NCAA postseason competition. In addition, the 2006-07 season saw eight sports (volleyball, gymnastics, men's indoor track and field, women's tennis, men's tennis, women's golf, men's golf and rowing) win their conference title.

Wanless' efforts to put the Hornets on the map have been instrumental in helping make Sacramento State the unofficial "home of NCAA Championships". The Hornets have been tabbed to serve as the host institution for 2007 Div. I Volleyball Championships as well as the 2008 Div. I Women's Golf West Regional.

Additionally, Sacramento State has served as host to six NCAA championships (four track, two rowing) as well as the 2004 U.S. Olympic Trials for Track and Field during Wanless' first five years of leadership.

Prior to Sacramento State, Wanless served as athletics director at the University of North Dakota from 1990-1999, guiding the program to one of its most successful decades in school history. During that time, North Dakota enjoyed strong competitive success, winning four NCAA national championships and 36 conference titles. Additionally, 25 other teams finished second in their respective conference standings.

Before his position at North Dakota, Wanless was director of intercollegiate athletics at Western Carolina for four years and held a variety of positions, including director of intercollegiate athletics, at Towson University in Maryland.

Wanless earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Black Hills State, a master's degree in physical education from Northern Illinois and a doctorate in athletics administration from Temple. He and his wife, Joanne, are the parents of two children. Their daughter, Heather, and her husband, Chad Collins, reside in Lexington, Ky., with their daughter Hadley. Their son Troy, and his wife, Jesi, live in Minneapolis.
