NEWS AND NOTES (through games of Sept. 1)

- San Diego State opens a three-game homestand, its longest since ending the 2014 campaign with three straight home contests and the longest regular-season homestand since 2012, with a Saturday night contest against Sacramento State.
- The home opener also serves as the KGB SkyShow. The largest fireworks show in southern California will start at the conclusion of the Aztecs-Hornets game. This is one of the most attended games annually and fans are encouraged to secure their tickets in advance of game day.
- This marks the first meeting between Sacramento State and San Diego State on the football field. Rocky Long owns a 1-0 record against the Hornets, recording a 58-0 victory while coaching New Mexico in Albuquerque, N.M., on Sept. 22, 2007.
- San Diego State has won its first home game of the campaign in each of the last four seasons.
- San Diego State is 15-3 in its last 18 home games dating back to Oct. 3, 2015. During that stretch, the Aztecs have outscored its opposition, 581-328 (average: 32.3-18.2), and has a remarkable 4,390-2,117 advantage in rushing yards (average: 243.9-117.6). Also, SDSU owns a +16 edge in turnover margin over that span.
- Last week, San Diego State's four-game winning streak in season-opening games came to an end with a 31-10 setback at No. 13/13 Stanford. The Aztec defense held Heisman Trophy candidate Bryce Love to 29 yards on 18 carries, his lowest output in a game with at least seven carries in his career.
- SDSU junior running back **Juwan Washington** produced the sixth highest rushing total for an SDSU running back in a season-opening game in the Division I era. He carried 24 times for a career-high 158 yards and one touchdown. It is the third 100-yard rushing game for the Maxwell Award candidate.
- Coupled with the loss in the 2017 bowl game, the Aztecs have dropped consecutive games. SDSU has gone 40 games without suffering a three-game losing streak.
- San Diego State is one of seven schools nationally to win at least 10 games each of the last three seasons. The other schools are Alabama, Clemson, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State and Wisconsin. (entire list with records can be found on page four on the left column).
- Thirteen different Aztec players received preseason accolades, with eight players (senior PK **John Baron II**, senior QB **Christian Chapman**, senior LB **Ronley Lakalaka**, junior TE **Kahale Warring**, junior RB/KR/PR **Juwan Washington**, sophomore WAR **Tariq Thompson**, sophomore RG **Keith Ismael** and sophomore LT **Tyler Roemer**) on watch lists for national honors or named first-team all-conference.
- Head coach **Rocky Long**, the all-time winningest coach in Mountain West history, has guided San Diego State to a bowl game in each of his first seven seasons as head coach. He is one of eight active coaches to lead their current team to a bowl game in each of the first seven seasons.

PRACTICE

ON THE LINE

- San Diego State has won four straight home openers by a combined score of 144-27.
- San Diego State is 15-3 in its last 18 home games dating back to Oct. 3, 2015.

WASHINGTON'S BIG OPENING NIGHT

Juwan Washington enjoyed a big opening night in his debut as the Aztec feature back. The junior recorded his third career 100-yard rushing game with a personal-best 158 yards rushing on 24 carries with a rushing touchdown.

One thing to keep in mind about Washington's numbers is that they came in basically three quarters of work. Stanford scored before the Aztecs touched the ball in the fourth quarter to advance the lead to 31-10. Because of that, Washington had just one fourth-quarter carry.

A few notes on Washington's season opener:

- The 158 yards rushing were the sixth-highest total by an SDSU back in a season opener (Division I era, since 1969) and the most ever in a road opener.
- His 158 yards are the eighth-highest total by an SDSU player in any game (not just season openers) against a nationally-ranked opponent.
- He averaged 6.6 yards per carry, which is the highest by any Aztec player with at least 15 carries against an AP Top 25 opponent since Ronnie Hillman (24 carries, 191 yards) averaged 8.0 yards per carry against No. 22 Air Force on Oct. 16, 2010. By comparison, recent SDSU running backs best against top 25 foes were Donnel Pumphrey's 5.9 average at No. 21 North Carolina on Sept. 6, 2014 and Rashaad Penny's 5.5 average against No. 19 Stanford on Sept. 16, 2017.
- After Saturday's games, Washington is seventh in the nation in rushing yards per game (158.0). That ranking is particularly impressive as the Aztecs opened the season on the road against the 13th-ranked Cardinal.
- As amazing as this may sound, in the last four seasons (since 2015), only once has a San Diego State running back opened the season with consecutive 100-yard rushing games (Rashaad Penny last season). Although he is the NCAA's all-time leading rusher, Donnel Pumphrey did not have consecutive 100-yard rushing games to open either his junior or senior campaigns.
- Washington carried 16 times on first down for 138 yards (an average of 8.6 yards per carry). In his career, the junior has averaged 6.7 yards per carry on first down.
- He had three rushes of 20 or more yards against Stanford and now has 16 rushes for at least 20 yards in his career.

THOU SHALL NOT RUN

San Diego State has spent the last several seasons among the nation's elite at stopping the run. Since the beginning of the 2013 season, the Aztecs rank seventh nationally in rushing yards allowed per game (125.4) and 10th in rushing yards per attempt (3.5).

That was once again on display last Friday evening when the Aztecs held 13th-ranked Stanford to 50 yards rushing on 28 carries for a 1.8 average and no rushing touchdowns.

Below are a few tidbits on the significance of that performance:

- Stanford's 50 yards rushing were its fewest in a game since being held to 29 yards at No. 10 Washington on Sept. 30, 2016.
- The 50 yards rushing were its fewest against an unranked team since rushing for -8 yards at Oregon State on Oct. 27, 2007.
- No team (ranked or unranked) had held the Cardinal to as few as 50 yards rushing in a Stanford home game since No. 23 Arizona State held them to -2 yards on Sept. 29, 2007.

- Also, as previously mentioned, Bryce Love was held in check by the Aztec defense, amassing just 29 yards on 18 carries (1.6 average). In his career, he has had 21 games with at least seven carries and his 29 yards rushing are 22 fewer than he had in any of those contests. In fact, entering the SDSU game, he had at least 100 yards rushing in 14 of the last 15 games he had seven or more carries. The 1.6 yard average is the lowest of his career for any game in which he had at least five carries.

WHAT HAPPENED?

As previously noted, San Diego State controlled both sides of the running game, but there were odd and dramatic statistical anomalies that led to Stanford's, 31-10 victory. Here is a look at some of the stranger events that occurred.

- **Average Starting Field Position:** Stanford's own 33 (started three possessions in SDSU territory), SDSU's own 18 (started three possessions inside its own 11). We track average starting field position back to 1999 and SDSU's 18-yard line is tied for the worst starting field position in the more than 270 games that stat has been kept. How hard is this to overcome? SDSU is 1-13 on the 14 occasions that its average starting yard line has been the 20-yard line or less. Also, the 15-yard discrepancy is significant as the Aztecs are 0-20-1 lifetime when owning a 15-yard disadvantage or worse in average starting field position. Now, if all of that is not enough, it gets even worse. SDSU intercepted a pass and returned it to the Stanford 48 yard line before losing possession in a turnover. Statistically, that counts as a possession even though SDSU did not snap the ball. If that possession is taken out, the Aztecs average starting field position was the 16.5-yard line. That easily would have been the worst recorded AFP in school history.
- **Penalties:** SDSU 11-125, Stanford 3-20. San Diego State's 125 penalty yards are its fifth most in the last 23 seasons and the 105-yard discrepancy between the teams is the widest negative margin in recorded history. The next closest recorded discrepancy was in 2006 when SDSU had 10 penalties for 110 yards, while Brigham Young was whistled five times for 17 yards.

STREAKS SNAPPED

Last Friday's loss snapped some rather impressive win streaks that were in play for San Diego State. Among the more impressive streaks that were snapped:

- San Diego State had won six consecutive road games. Of the 129 FBS schools entering the game, the Aztecs were tied for the third-longest active streak, trailing only Oklahoma (16) and Wisconsin (9).
- San Diego State had won four straight season openers by a combined score of 144-27. It was the longest win streak for the Aztecs in season opening games since the Red and Black won five straight openers from 1993-97.
- San Diego State had won eight consecutive September games. The Aztecs' last loss in the month came on Sept. 26, 2015, when SDSU dropped a 37-21 decision at Penn State.
- San Diego State had won five consecutive games in which it entered the contest as an underdog. That was the third-longest active streak in the nation, trailing only Houston (7) and Ohio State (6).
- San Diego State had won three straight games against Pac-12 teams. It was tied for the fifth-longest active streak nationally and was tied for the longest active win streak for the Aztecs during the Division I era. Prior to that stretch, the Aztecs were 1-23 in their previous 24 contests against teams that called the Pac-12 home at the time of the game.
- San Diego State had won a Division I era (since 1969) school-record three straight games against Power 5 conference teams. Prior to the current streak, the Aztecs had dropped eight straight and 31 of its previous 32 contests against P5 teams.
- SDSU had won 17 straight games when holding the opponent without a point in the first quarter.

SERIES NOTES

- Saturday's meeting marks the first time San Diego State and Sacramento State have played.
- The Aztecs own a 28-11 record against current members of the Big Sky Conference. Of the 39 all time meeting with the league, 25 have come against Cal Poly.
- Sacramento State is the only current member of the Big Sky Conference that San Diego State has never played.

- Sacramento State defensive coordinator/linebackers coach Samuel Lawson was a two-year starter at outside linebacker for San Diego State in 1995 and 1996, earning honorable mention all-WAC recognition following his junior season. Lawson graduated from SDSU in 1998.
- San Diego State safeties coach Richard Sanchez spent four years as an assistant at Sacramento State from 2005-08, where he served as special teams coordinator while coaching the running backs (2006) and tight ends (2007-08).
- Aztec on-campus recruiting coordinator Ron Caragher and Hornet co-offensive coordinator Luke Huard coached against one another in the 2015 AutoNation Cure Bowl. Caragher was head coach at San José State, leading the Spartans to a 27-16 victory over Georgia State, where Huard spent time as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2013-16.
- Sacramento State associate head coach Paul Wulff previously coached against SDSU in 2011, when he was the head coach at Washington State. The Aztecs defeated the Cougars 42-24 in the third non-conference game that season in San Diego. Current Hornet head coach Jody Sears was also on Wulff's staff at WSU, serving as cornerbacks coach. Wulff also patrolled the sidelines against SDSU in 2003 season opener, when he was head coach at Eastern Washington. The Scarlet and Black emerged victorious in that game as well, recording a 19-9 triumph over Wulff's Eagles in San Diego.
- Sacramento State has two players on its roster from San Diego County in wide receivers DJ Lacy (San Diego/Point Loma HS) and Isaiah Capoccia (Lakeside/El Capitan HS), while Aztec fullback Isaac Lessard (Sacramento/Jesuit HS) is the lone SDSU player to hail from the state capital.
- Aztec defensive lineman Anthony Luke and Hornet linebacker Malcolm Thomas were prep teammates at Woodcreek High in Roseville, Calif.
- SDSU tight end Kahale Warring and Sacramento State defensive lineman Killian Rosko were also teammates at Sonora (Calif.) High

School in 2014. Warring was a senior that season, while Rosko was a sophomore.

- Sacramento State football administrative assistant Ashley Sterk is the daughter of former San Diego State director of athletics Jim Sterk.

- San Diego State has won 12 of its last 16 games (12-4), and is 18-6 in its last 24 games and 31-7 of its last 38 contests.
- The Aztecs are 24-4 in their last 28 games against Mountain West opponents.
- SDSU has won 15 of its last 16 games against MW West Division opponents (dates back to Nov. 1, 2014), only falling to Fresno State on Oct. 21.
- San Diego State has won six of its last seven road games (6-1).

- SDSU is 26-4 the last 30 times it has committed one turnover or less.

THE PROGRAM

Below are a few tidbits on the San Diego State football program. The Aztecs are coming off three straight seasons with at least 10 wins.

- San Diego State is one of 17 teams nationally to play in a bowl game each of the last eight seasons (2010-17) and one of just two from the Group of 5 (also Boise State).
- With 10 victories last season, San Diego State has recorded its third straight campaign with double-digit wins. It marks the seventh time in the Division I era and the 10 time in school history that it has recorded a double-digit win season. Prior to 2015, San Diego State went 37 seasons without recording a 10-win campaign.
- San Diego State is one of seven teams to win at least 10 games each of the last three seasons (others: Alabama, Clemson, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Wisconsin). <<< See chart on page 4, left
- Since the beginning of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State has won 32 games. That is tied for the sixth-highest win total nationally during that span, trailing only Alabama (42), Clemson (41), Ohio State (36), Oklahoma (35) and Wisconsin (35).
- Among California's seven FBS schools, San Diego State owns the third-highest winning percentage this decade. The Aztecs' record of 73-34 trails only Stanford and USC among Golden State squads, and is ahead of UCLA, Fresno State, California and San José State. <<< See chart on page 3, right
- San Diego State has advanced to eight consecutive bowl games. The Aztecs join Stanford as the only football teams in California - FBS or NFL - to advance to the postseason in each of the past eight seasons.
- With bowl game appearances in a school-record eight straight seasons, the Aztecs have equaled their total number of bowls played in the 87 prior seasons (1921 through 2009).
- Aztec head coach Rocky Long is in his eighth season as head coach and 10th year on The Mesa. The Mountain West's all-time winningest coach, Long has guided SDSU to 64 victories.
- Between 2000-09, SDSU was 38-80 (.322) and owned the nation's 106th-best winning percentage. Since 2010, San Diego State is 73-34 (.682) and owns the nation's 19th-best winning percentage.
- With 73 wins in their last 107 games (73-34 since the beginning of the 2010 campaign), the Aztecs have equaled their win total from the previous 185 games (73-112).
- San Diego State won 32 games from 2015-17. That is the most prolific three-year period in school history. The previous mark was set when the Aztecs won 30 games from 1966-68 just prior to the Division I era.

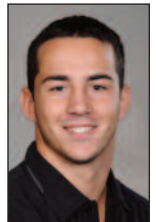
CHAPMAN IS WINNING GAMES, CLIMBING CHARTS

San Diego State junior quarterback Christian Chapman is scheduled to make his 30th consecutive start Friday when the Aztecs play Stanford. In addition to being the signal-caller over San Diego State's most successful period in program history, the Carlsbad native is in extremely rare company.

Below are a few of his accomplishments.

- Chapman is 23-7 as a starter. The 76.7 winning percentage is the highest in San Diego State's Division I era (min. 15 starts.).
- With 23 career victories, Chapman has tied Ryan Lindley (current SDSU defensive GA coach) for the most wins as a starter at quarterback in the Division I era for the Aztecs.
- The 76.7 winning percentage ranks sixth among active FBS quarterbacks with at least 15 career starts.
- Chapman has the longest active streak in FBS in games with fewer than two interceptions as a starting quarterback at 30, 12 more than No. 2 on the list (Alabama's Jalen Hurts, 18).
- His streak of 30 straight quarterback starts without more than one interception is the second-longest streak since 2012, only trailing Navy's Keenan Reynolds (45 games).
- Chapman will start his 31st consecutive game, the second-longest streak in the school's Division I history.
- Chapman has 4,416 career passing yards. That ranks 16th on the school's career list.
- San Diego State is 11-0 when he has a passer rating of 165.0 or higher.
- Chapman has nine career games with multiple touchdown passes and has never thrown more than one interception in a game (36 career games).

BULLET NOTES - OFFENSE

- San Diego State returns seven starters on offense this season - senior quarterback Christian Chapman, sophomore center Dominic Gudino, junior left guard Daishawn Dixon, sophomore right guard Keith Ismael, senior right tackle Ryan Pope, sophomore left tackle Tyler Roemer, senior wide receiver Fred Trevillion. Of those seven players, only three are seniors (also two juniors, three sophomores)
- Jeff Horton is in his eighth season at San Diego State and his fourth as SDSU's offensive coordinator (served the previous four seasons as an assistant head coach and running backs coach). Among his other experience, he served as the head coach at Nevada and UNLV and interim head coach at Minnesota. In addition to being the offensive coordinator, he is also an associate head coach.

OFFENSIVE NUMBERS

- SDSU has scored 27 or more points in 18 of the last 22 games and in 30 of the last 37 games.
- San Diego State has scored 30 or more points in 25 of their last 36 games (1,212 points total, 33.7 ppg).
- The Aztecs are 33-3 the last 36 times they have scored at least 30 points and 45-8 in the Rocky Long era when scoring 30-plus points.
- Since Oct. 3, 2015, San Diego State is 30-4 when scoring at least 20 points.
- Since the beginning of 2014, SDSU is 33-6 when committing one turnover or less and 6-10 when having two or more turnovers in the game. San Diego State has one turnover or less in 32 of the 42 games since the start of the 2015 campaign.
- San Diego State has one turnover or less in 11 of its last 13 games.
- SDSU is 26-2 in the last 28 games when owning an edge in time of possession.
- San Diego State is 62-15 in the Rocky Long era when scoring just 20 or more points.
- The Aztec offense had the second-fewest interceptions last season (4).
- Chapman has started 30 consecutive games, the longest streak on either side of the ball.
- Juwan Washington has 18 touchdowns (14 rushing, three kick return, one receiving) over the last 21 games.
- SDSU did not punt at San Jose State last season (Nov. 4) for the first time since 2010 and for just the third time since 1996.
- The Aztecs posted the best third-down conversion percentage in the country last season at San Jose State, going 11-for-13 (84.6 pct.)
- San Diego State outgained San Jose State, 648-200, last season. The 448-yard margin was the best in SDSU's Division I history (since 1969) (No. 2 was +403 vs. Eastern Illinois on Oct. 6, 2011).
- SDSU had 31 first downs at San Jose State last year, while allowing just eight. The margin of 23 was tied for the best mark in the Aztecs' DI history (also Oct. 31, 1970 vs. Fresno State).
- San Diego State's 31 first downs against SJSU were its most since also earning 32 vs. Wyoming on Nov. 3, 2007.
- The Aztecs had the ball for 43:19 at San Jose State in the game last year, their most in a game since at least 1982 and the fourth most in a FBS game this season.

RUSHING OFFENSE

- Since Jeff Horton took over as offensive coordinator prior to the 2015 campaign, San Diego State is 11th nationally in rushing yards per game (247.1), 14th in rushing touchdowns (100) and 13th in rushing yards per carry (5.4).
- San Diego State is 39-1 in its last 40 games when rushing for at least 200 yards (won 37 straight regular-season games).
- San Diego State has a 100-yard rusher in its one game this season and has at least one in 23 of its last 28 games since 2016 (30, 100-yard rushers total) and 32 of the 42 games since Jeff Horton took over as the offensive coordinator in 2015 (42, 100-yard rushers total). Since Horton arrived as the running back coach in 2011, SDSU has a 100-yard rusher in 68 of the 94 games and 82, 100-yard rushers overall.
- Juwan Washington has 16 career rushes for 20-plus yards.
- Washington ranks seventh in FBS in rushing yards per game (158.00, 1st in MW), 15th in all-purpose yards per game (158.00, 2nd in MW) and 36th in yards per carry (6.58, 4th in MW).
- On first down, Washington has rushed 16 times for 138 yards (8.6 avg.).
- Washington became the 16th Aztec to rush for 100-plus yards in a season opener (17th occasion overall) when he rushed for 158 yards at No. 13/13 Stanford.
- Washington's 158 yards rank as the sixth most in a season opener by SDSU in the Division I era (since 1969) and the eighth most against a nationally ranked opponent.
- Washington's 6.6 yards rush average was the highest by any Aztec player with at least 15 carries against an AP Top 25 opponent since Ronnie Hillman (24 carries, 191 yards) averaged 8.0 yards per carry vs. No. 22 Air Force on Oct. 16, 2010 |
- SDSU set a school record with 554 rushing yards at San Jose State last season (Nov. 4, 2017), bettering its 474 set Nov. 12, 2016 at Nevada.
- San Diego State's six rushing touchdowns at San Jose State last year were its most since also scoring six times at Hawai'i on Oct. 5, 1991.
- San Diego State had two 100-yard rushers in the San Jose State game for the 28th time in program history (the Aztecs are 27-1 in those occasions) and now have multiple 100-yard rushers seven times in the last 23 games.
- San Diego State owned a rushing advantage of 521 yards at San Jose State, the best rushing margin in its DI history (No. 2 was 384 at Nevada on Nov. 12, 2016).
- If you take away the five times Christian Chapman has been sacked this year (for 43 yards), he has rushed once for six yards (6.0 avg).

PASSING OFFENSE

- Since the start of the 2017 season, San Diego State has thrown four interceptions. That is tied with LSU for the second-fewest picks in the nation (Alabama, 3).
- The Aztecs had their fewest pass attempts (7) in their Division I era at San José State last season (Nov. 4, 2017), while recording their third-highest passing efficiency (245.66).
- Christian Chapman is 23-7 as a starting quarterback, winning both the 2015 and 2016 MW Championship game and the 2015 Hawai'i Bowl and 2016 Las Vegas Bowl.
- Among active FBS quarterbacks, Chapman ranks sixth in winning percentage (.767, min. 15 games started) and tied for fifth in victories (23).
- Chapman has the longest active streak in FBS in games with fewer than two interceptions as a starting quarterback at 30, 13 more than No. 2 on the list (Alabama's Jalen Hurts, 17).
- Chapman's streak of 30 straight quarterback starts without more than one interception is the second-longest streak since 2012, only trailing Navy's Keenan Reynolds (45 games).

- Chapman's all-time SDSU Division I era (since 1969) ranks (min. 15 starts): first in quarterback winning percentage (.767), tied for first in QB victories (23) and sixth in pass efficiency rating (143.8).
- Among the Mountain West leaders, Chapman ranks fifth in completion percentage (66.7, 44th in FBS), seventh in passing yards per completion (11.30), eighth in pass efficiency rating (129.95) and passing yards per attempt (7.53) and ninth in passing yards per game (113.00)

DEFENSIVE NUMBERS

- Since Nov. 14, 2015 (includes 33 SDSU games), San Diego State ranks seventh in total offense allowed per game (310.0) and 10th nationally in points allowed per game (19.4).
- Since the beginning of 2009, when Rocky Long took over as defensive coordinator, the Aztecs rank 15th nationally in yards per rush allowed (3.6), 18th in yards per touch (6.3), 18th in yards allowed per game (347.2), 22nd in turnovers forced (214) and 27th in points allowed per game (23.3).
- SDSU has returned six interceptions for touchdowns since the beginning of the 2016 season (tied for 5th nationally, three behind leader).
- The Aztec defense ranked second in the country in fourth down defense (.222) a year ago.
- SDSU has held an opponent scoreless on its opening drive 31 times over the last 39 games and 32 times since 2015 (42 games).
- San Diego State became the second team since 1999 to hold Hawai'i to under 200 yards of total offense (195) at Aloha Stadium in the game last year (Oct. 28).
- Noble Hall has the most starts among any player on the Aztec defense (27).
- Kyahva Tezino's numbers over his last six games (all starts) - 67 tackles and 6.5 tackles for loss; numbers over his first 17 games (no starts) - eight tackles and one tackle for loss.
- Tezino and Parker Baldwin rank in a tie for fifth in the league and 26th in FBS in tackles per game (11.00).
- Tezino has three straight games with double-digits in tackles (42 total).
- Tariq Thompson became the first Aztec true freshman to start on defense in the 2017 opener (Sept. 2) against UC Davis since Leon McFadden started at Colorado State on Oct. 24, 2009.
- Thompson was also the first SDSU true freshman to start on defense since McFadden started the 2009 opener at UCLA.

RUSHING DEFENSE

- Since the beginning of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State ranks third nationally in rushing yards allowed per game (114.7) and sixth in rushing yards per attempt (3.3).
- Twenty of San Diego State's last 39 opponents have failed to rush for more than 80 yards.
- During the last 38 games (since Sept. 26, 2015), opponents have rushed 1,312 times for 4,283 yards and 3.3 yards per carry. Over that span, SDSU's ranks third in yards per carry (3.3) and third nationally in rushing yards allowed per game (112.7).
- Since Rocky Long began his tenure as the team's defensive coordinator (prior to the 2009 campaign), San Diego State is 22-5 when holding the opposition to less than 75 yards rushing and 26-6 when the opposition averages less than 2.50 yards per carry.
- Kyahva Tezino leads the Aztecs with 10 tackles on rushing plays.
- San Diego State held UNLV to just 106 yards on the ground last season (Oct. 7, 2007), its fewest since only rushing for 80 against the Aztecs on Nov. 21, 2015. Three of UNLV's five-fewest rushing games since 2015 have come vs. SDSU.
- The Aztecs held New Mexico below 100 rushing yards last year (Nov. 24) for the first time since Sept. 15, 2012 at Texas Tech.

PASSING DEFENSE

- Under head coach Rocky Long, San Diego State is 39-6 in games in which the opponent has a passing efficiency rating of 116.50 or less.
- Since the beginning of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State's 64 interceptions are the most in the country (by a margin of eight), while its 10 interception returns for touchdowns are third in the country, trailing only Alabama (13) and Ohio State (11).
- Since 2010, the Aztecs are 48-10 when holding the opponent to 200 or fewer passing yards.
- Chibu Onyeukwu ranks in a tie for first in the Mountain West and 25th in FBS in sacks per game (1.00).
- Ron Smith leads the team with four stops on passing plays.
- Smith had 16 pass breakups a year ago, the second most in SDSU single-season history.
- Noble Hall ranks in a tie for first in the Mountain West and third in FBS in interceptions per game (1.00).
- Tariq Thompson's five interceptions last year tied for the most by a freshman in FBS play and he was one of only two true freshmen with five interceptions.
- Ta. Thompson had an 83-yard interception return for a touchdown vs. Northern Illinois, SDSU's longest since Leon McFadden had a 96-yard interception score at Fresno State on Sept. 29, 2012 and the fourth longest by an Aztec since at least 1996.

- ESPN Team Efficiencies ranked San Diego State's special teams unit as the 23rd best in the country in 2015, 13th in 2016 and 28th in 2017.
- Former SDSU captain Doug Deakin is in his eighth season with the program and his first as special teams coordinator. He also coaches the tight ends.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has 10 kickoff returns for touchdowns, the most in FBS play over that time and three more than No. 2 (Kansas State and Memphis are second with seven).
- The Aztecs and Kansas State were the only teams in FBS play last year with a kick return touchdown from two different players (Rashaad Penny and Juwan Washington).
- Among active FBS kickers, John Baron II ranks first in field goal percentage (.872) and 13th in field goals per game (1.21).
- Among all-time SDSU kickers, Baron ranks second in field goal percentage (.872), fourth in PATs (109) and PAT percentage (.982) and sixth in field goals (34).
- Among the 2018 FBS leaders, Baron ranks in a tie for first in field goal percentage (1.000, T-1st in MW) and PAT percentage (1.000, T-1st in MW), a tie for 23rd in touchback percentage (.750, 2nd in MW), a tie for 33rd in field goals per game (1.00, T-3rd in MW) and a tie for 37th in kickoff average (64.3, 4th in MW).
- Baron had made 25 straight field goals of 50 yards or less before missing one against Stanford on Sept. 16, 2017. The 25 straight makes of 50 yards or less is still a Mountain West record.

LAST TIME OUT: STANFORD

No. 13/13 Stanford 31, San Diego State 10
 Aug. 31, 2018 | Stanford Stadium

STANFORD, Calif. -- San Diego State kept Heisman Trophy candidate Bryce Love in check, but unable to stop the K.J. Costello-JJ Arcega-Whiteside connection in a 31-10 loss in the 2018 opener at Stanford Stadium.

Costello threw for 332 yards and four touchdowns, and Arcega-Whiteside caught six passes for 226 yards and three scores to give the Cardinal (1-0) its 20th consecutive non-conference home win.

The Aztecs (0-1), who last year defeated Stanford, 20-17, in San Diego, held Love to just 29 yards on 18 carries (1.6 avg.). Love, who entered the game with at least 100 rushing yards in 14 of the last 15 games, posted the lowest average of his career with a minimum of five carries.

Committed to stop the run, SDSU held the Cardinal to just 50 yards total on the ground on 28 attempts (1.8 avg.), its fewest in a home game since Sept. 29, 2007.

Costello, however, connected on touchdown passes of 38, 19 and 80 yards to Arcega-Whiteside, and later on a 19-yard strike to Colby Parkinson.

After a slow start, San Diego State used a methodical 8-play, 92-yard drive to get on the scoreboard late in the first quarter on a 4-yard run by Juwan Washington. Washington had 84 yards alone on the drive, including a 40-yarder which got the Aztecs into Stanford territory for the first time of the game.

After exchanging punts for the next few series, SDSU was forced to start at its own 1-yard line when Jack Bailey's 63-yard punt went out-of-bounds. Three plays later, quarterback Christian Chapman was sacked in the end zone for the safety.

Late in the second quarter, it appeared San Diego State would have a chance to add to its 7-2 lead when Andrew Aleki deflected a Costello pass into the hands of Noble Hall. Hall started running the other way, but Cardinal wide receiver Trenton Irwin raced back, forced a fumble and jumped on the loose ball, giving Stanford some life. The Cardinal took advantage in just three plays when Costello found Arcega-Whiteside in the end zone from 38 yards out, taking a 9-7 lead into halftime.

Costello stretched its lead to 16-7 on its first drive of the third quarter as Costello found a wide-open Arcega-Whiteside in the end zone with a 19-yard pass.

The Aztecs mounted a 10-play, 62-yard drive of their own, mainly through the air, culminating with a 30-yard field goal by John Baron II. Chapman was 5-for-7 on the scoring drive for 61 yards.

On Stanford's ensuing drive and facing a punt on 3rd and 15, Costello rolled out to his left and fired a deep pass to Arcega-Whiteside,

who caught it over a fallen Kyree Woods and raced 80 yards for the touchdown. Following a successful 2-point conversion, the Cardinal ran its lead to 24-10.

SDSU got back into Stanford territory, but was stopped on a 4th and 1 on the 32-yard line as the fourth quarter began.

The Cardinal put the game away on its next drive with Costello's fourth touchdown pass of the game found Parkinson from 19 yards out.

Costello finished the game 21 of 31 for 332 yard and four touchdowns.

Washington led San Diego State's rushing attack with 158 yards on 24 carries (6.6 avg.), the sixth-highest total by an Aztec back in a season opener and the eighth most against a nationally ranked opponent.

Parker Baldwin and Kyahva Tezino each had 11 tackles apiece to pace the SDSU defense.

THREE PLAYERS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-MOUNTAIN WEST

Three San Diego State football players were named to the 2018 Mountain West Preseason All-Conference Team, the league announced July 24 at the Mountain West Football Media Summit in Las Vegas. The three players - offensive linemen Keith Ismael and Tyler Roemer, and warrior (safety) Tariq Thompson - are all sophomores this season after earning second-team all-league accolades in 2017 as freshmen.

The all-conference team and preseason poll are voted on by media representatives who cover the conference.

Ismael and Roemer, who were the only freshmen offensive linemen on either the all-MW first or second team (the other eight players on the first or second team were seniors), blocked for a running back group than averaged 252.5 yards per game on the ground in 2017 and scored 33 touchdowns in 13 games (2.54 TD per game). Roemer was named a USA Today Freshman All-American last season and San Diego State's Offensive Lineman of the Year, while Ismael shared the Aztecs' Outstanding Freshman Award with Tariq Thompson.

Thompson, meanwhile, totaled 63 tackles (46 solo) with three tackles for loss in 2017 as a true freshman, while recording a team-high five interceptions for 83 yards and a touchdown, four pass breakups, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and three quarterback hurries. For his efforts, Thompson was named a FWA All-American and a USA Today Freshman All-American.

SDSU's three preseason all-conference selections were tied for the second most in the league. Boise State's Brett Rypien was chosen as the preseason offensive player of the year, while teammate Avery Williams was named the preseason special teams player of the

year. Wyoming's Andrew Wingard was chosen as the preseason defensive player of the year for the second straight season. This marks the first time since 2014 that an Aztec was not one of the preseason players of the year.

Additionally, San Diego State was picked to finish second in the West Division with 116 points and six first-place votes, just 10 points behind Fresno State's 126 (and 16 first-place votes). The Aztecs had been selected to win the West Division the previous three seasons (2015-17).

SDSU, which averaged a predicted finish of 6.5 from 2005-12, has ended up at or better than its predicted finish in eight of the last nine seasons and 11 times over the past 13 years. San Diego State has won two of the last three Mountain West titles (2015 and 2016) and three of the past six (also 2012).

Following Fresno State (126) and San Diego State (116) in the West Division was UNLV (78), Nevada (72), Hawai'i (45) and San José State (25).

The Aztecs finished 2017 with a 10-3 record, their school-record third consecutive season with at least 10 victories. SDSU is one of just seven active schools in the nation to win at least 10 games in three straight seasons (also Alabama, Clemson, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State and Wisconsin). San Diego State returns seven starters on offense and seven on defense, along with its kicker and punter.

Boise State has been picked to win the Mountain Division for the sixth consecutive season after making the MW championship game last year for the first time since 2014. The Broncos defeated Fresno State, 17-14, in the 2017 MW Championship game at Albertsons Stadium in Boise, Idaho. BS picked up all 22 first-place votes in the Mountain Division and 132 total, followed by Wyoming (95), Colorado State (82), Utah State (78), Air Force (52) and New Mexico (23).

Notes: SDSU has 63 of the 79 first-place votes in the West Division (79.7 pct.) over the last three seasons (since 2016) and 90 of the 109 votes (82.7 pct.) over the last four seasons (since 2015) . . . In the last five seasons (since 2014), SDSU has 105 first-place votes after picking up just seven first-place votes combined over the first 15 years in the league . . . San Diego State placed multiple players on the offensive all-conference team for a fourth consecutive season . . . SDSU has a defensive player on the preseason all-MW team for the seventh time in eight seasons.

SDSU LEASE AT SDCCU STADIUM EXTENDED TWO YEARS

San Diego State University extended its lease with the City of San Diego to allow the university to continue playing football at SDCCU Stadium through the 2020 season, SDSU announced on Aug. 6.

"I want to thank the mayor and members of the City Council for their time and support of our lease extension," said SDSU President Adela de la Torre. "Today's decision is about much more than sports. For San Diego State University, football and other community events serve as the front porch for the university. They allow us to recruit extraordinary students and scholar-athletes who will graduate to become global citizens, ethical innovators and compassionate leaders who impact the San Diego region and beyond."

As part of the lease terms, SDSU will pay \$1.1 million per season and all of the game-day operating costs associated with the university's use of the stadium, where it has been a tenant since 1967. Additionally, all net concessions and parking revenue generated during Aztec football games will go directly to the City to assist in covering the operating costs of the stadium year-round.

"During our negotiations, we always placed a high importance on assisting the City in reducing its financial investment in the stadium," said Tom McCarron, SDSU vice president for Business and Financial Affairs and chief financial officer. "The agreement approved today acknowledges our commitment to being a good partner with the City. We appreciate the City's continued support and investment in SDSU."

In addition to the annual rent and revenue obligations, SDSU will also assist the City in marketing the stadium and finding additional revenue-generating events.

The two-year lease extension provides SDSU with a short-term solution until the long-term future of the stadium site is determined.

"I appreciate all of the time City staff, the Mayor's office, City Council and university staff have dedicated to securing the lease extension for SDSU football to continue playing at SDCCU, their home field for the past 51 years," said SDSU Athletic Director John David Wicker. "We look forward to continuing to work with stadium personnel to bring exciting opportunities to the San Diego community through events at SDCCU."

Hundreds of thousands of fans attended SDSU football games last season when the Aztecs went 10-2 during the regular season and played in the Armed Forces Bowl.

"I want to thank everyone who worked diligently on the SDCCU Stadium lease extension," head football coach Rocky Long said. "I appreciate the hard work of the entire University staff, including athletic director John David Wicker, vice president Tom McCarron and assistant vice president Gina Jacobs, as well as the City Council. The whole city benefits from today's decision. I look forward to returning to campus and focusing on our first practice of the season tonight."

SDSU UNVEILS LOCKER ROOM RENOVATIONS

One of the cornerstones of the Fowler Athletics Center received an impressive facelift over the past six-and-a-half months, as the San Diego State athletic department unveiled a refurbished Don Coryell Locker Room to the Aztec football team on Aug. 6.

The renovations, which began earlier this year in mid-January, feature 115 custom ventilated wood lockers each equipped with a USB power station for student-athletes to charge their personal electronic devices.

A total of six 43-inch television screens were also installed, along with a custom surround sound audio package with Bluetooth for player control. In addition, the locker room now boasts a Mondo floor, as well as LED lighting with customizable zones and color packages. A center hung 20-foot Aztec Calendar medallion was another design element incorporated into the revamped space.

"This thing is sweet," said senior quarterback Christian Chapman. "It's been a long time in the waiting, but you know, I'm glad it's finally here and we got it in time for camp. It looks really nice."

The \$2 million project, funded completely through private donations, was designed by Gensler, while DPR Construction served as general contractor.

"They did a really great job," added senior defensive lineman Noble Hall. "I like the design of everything. It's awesome, it's a dream come true."

"Anyone who helped in any type of way, any sort of way, thank you so much," said senior placekicker John Baron II. "This means a lot to everyone on the team. Everyone who was involved, everyone who just came in as freshmen, they're so excited, especially people like me who have been here for five years now. This is huge. This is such a blessing and we are so excited to get in here, get started on the new season and hopefully meet our expectations for the season."

DEFENSE SHINES IN FAN FEST SCRIMMAGE

San Diego State's defense was sharp and held the offensive side of the ball off the scoreboard in its annual Fan Fest scrimmage at SDCCU Stadium on Aug. 18. The defense totaled nine sacks and two interceptions to wrap up its second week of fall camp.

The day started with the offense going three-and-out on its first two possessions. Returning starting quarterback Christian Chapman snapped the streak after he connected on a 15-yard pass play to Fred Trevillion, but the possession was stopped on the sixth play when Chibu Onyeukwu recorded a sack on third-and-7.

The defense continued to dominate the next time out, this time with Ryan Agnew at the controls. The junior handed the ball off only to have Luq Barcoo force a fumble with Caden McDonald recovering for the defense.

The offense showed flashes of excitement with three rushes of 25 yards or longer. Chance Bell was the first to find daylight, taking an Agnew handoff 32 yards on the final possession of the first quarter. Then on Chapman's possession, which was the first of the second period, Chase Jasmin rumbled for a 26-yard gain. The momentum, however, was stopped when Ronley Lakalaka picked off Chapman.

After the Lakalaka interception, the SDSU offense went three-and-out four consecutive times until Jordan Byrd rushed for 35 yards to help get the Aztecs within field-goal range. John Baron II's attempt from 53-yards, however, sailed just outside the left goalpost.

The aforementioned running backs rushed for a total of 144 yards on 28 carries. Jasmin posted 52 yards on 11 attempts, Byrd matched Jasmin's yardage on nine rushes, and Bell finished with 40 yards on eight totes.

As the evening wound down, the defense made play after play, but the freshman duo of quarterback Carson Baker and wide receiver JR Justice provided one last highlight-reel play when they connected for a 35-yard gain.

Not to be outdone, the defense answered two possessions later and closed the scrimmage with a Denaylan Fuimaono interception of Baker.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Was one of four NCAA players who visited U.S. servicemen in Vietnam in the summer of 1971, spending two weeks visiting different U.S. bases
- Bobby Knight paid Long a home visit and recruited the two-sport athlete to play basketball at Army
- Left New Mexico as the all-time leading rusher (2,071 yards) and threw just 23 interceptions in 30 career games

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Has the most all-time victories in the Mountain West with 126 (three of his previous 129 wins came in the WAC).
- Was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year in 2002, 2012 and 2015.
- In his 19th season as a head coaching experience and has spent 20-plus seasons as a defensive coordinator.

AT SAN DIEGO STATE

- Became San Diego State's 18th head football coach on Jan. 12, 2011.
- Was the defensive coordinator at SDSU from 2009-10.
- In 2012, led the Aztecs to a share of the Mountain West title at 7-1. It was San Diego State's first Mountain West championship and first league title since 1998. The Aztecs then won the MW title in 2015, defeating Air Force, 27-24, in the MW Championship game and again in 2016 in a 27-24 win at Wyoming.

COACHING PRIOR TO SAN DIEGO STATE

- Compiled a school-record 65 victories and led the Lobos to five bowl game appearances in his final seven seasons. His teams were bowl eligible in seven of his last eight campaigns.
- In his final nine seasons in Albuquerque, Long's defensive units ranked among the top 30 in fewest yards allowed six times and among the top 40 against the rush every year. In both 2001 and 2003, New Mexico's defense ranked fifth nationally in fewest rushing yards allowed per game.
- While at New Mexico, he coached 13 players selected in the NFL Draft, 10 players who earned All-America honors and had a MWC-high 34 first-team all-conference selections since 2003.
- Prior to accepting the head coaching position at New Mexico, Long served as defensive coordinator for 12 seasons at three different schools. He was the defensive coordinator for two years under Bob Toledo at UCLA in 1996-97, for five seasons at Oregon State from 1991-95, and for five campaigns at Wyoming from 1981-85.
- Also served as an assistant coach at TCU, with the CFL's British Columbia team and started his career at New Mexico as a graduate assistant coach in 1972.

PLAYING EXPERIENCE:

- Originally a defensive back, Long became a three-year starter at quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71. He earned team most valuable player honors and was the Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.
- Long played professionally in the CFL with British Columbia in 1972-73 and 1975-76. He also competed in the World Football League with the Detroit Wheels in 1974.
- Attended Alta Loma High School in Alta Loma, Calif.

PERSONAL:

- Both of Long's daughters are head coaches at the university level. Roxanne was hired in July of 2012 as the head women's basketball coach at Rogers State University (NAIA) in Claremore, Okla., after four years in the same position at Texas Lutheran (NCAA Division III). Hannah, meanwhile, is the head volleyball coach at Southwestern University, an NCAA Division III school in Georgetown, Texas. She is a four-time conference coach of the year, having compiled a 306-79 (.795) record in 10 years, including a pair of regional finals appearances in 2008 and 2009.

SDSU Winning Streaks Snapped

- Three-game winning streak against Power 5 schools.
- Six-game winning streak in road games.
- Five-game winning streak as an "underdog."
- Three-game winning streak against Pac-12 opponents.
- Eight-game winning streak in the month of September.
- Four-game winning streak in season openers. SDSU is now 50-41-5 all-time in season openers, including a 26-24-1 mark in the Division I era (since 1969).

Trends

- The Aztecs had scored in 21 consecutive quarters, the second-longest active streak in FBS (Louisville, 25), before being held scoreless in the second quarter.
- SDSU did not start with the ball for just the 13th time in the last 85 games.
- San Diego State lost the coin toss for just the 25th time over the last 54 games.
- The Aztecs have now gone 145 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU), which is the second-longest streak among current Mountain West schools (Boise State at 265).

- San Diego State dropped to 47-14 in the Rocky Long era when scoring first.
- The Aztecs dropped to 42-9 in the Rocky Long era when leading after the first quarter.

Aztecs Fall in Opener at No. 13/13 Stanford

STANFORD, Calif. -- San Diego State kept Heisman Trophy candidate Bryce Love in check, but unable to stop the K.J. Costello-JJ Arcega-Whiteside connection in a 31-10 loss in the 2018 opener at Stanford Stadium.

Costello threw for 332 yards and four touchdowns, and Arcega-Whiteside caught six passes for 226 yards and three scores to give the Cardinal (1-0) its 20th consecutive non-conference home win.

The Aztecs (0-1), who last year defeated Stanford, 20-17, in San Diego, held Love to just 29 yards on 18 carries (1.6 avg.). Love, who entered the game with at least 100 rushing yards in 14 of the last 15 games, posted the lowest average of his career with a minimum of five carries.

Committed to stop the run, SDSU held the Cardinal to just 50 yards total on the ground on 28 attempts (1.8 avg.), its fewest in a home game since Sept. 29, 2007.

Costello, however, connected on touchdown passes of 38, 19 and 80 yards to Arcega-Whiteside, and later on a 19-yard strike to Colby Parkinson.

After a slow start, San Diego State used a methodical 8-play, 92-yard drive to get on the scoreboard late in the first quarter on a 4-yard run by Juwan Washington. Washington had 84 yards alone on the drive, including a 40-yarder which got the Aztecs into Stanford territory for the first time of the game.

After exchanging punts for the next few series, SDSU was forced to start at its own 1-yard line when Jack Bailey's 63-yard punt went out-of-bounds. Three plays later, quarterback Christian Chapman was sacked in the end zone for the safety.

Late in the second quarter, it appeared San Diego State would have a chance to add to its 7-2 lead when Andrew Aleki deflected a Costello pass into the hands of Noble Hall. Hall started running the other way, but Cardinal wide receiver Trenton Irwin raced back, forced a fumble and jumped on the loose ball, giving Stanford some life. The Cardinal took advantage in just three plays when Costello found Arcega-Whiteside in the end zone from 38 yards out, taking a 9-7 lead into halftime.

Costello stretched its lead to 16-7 on its first drive of the third quarter as Costello found a wide-open Arcega-Whiteside in the end zone with a 19-yard pass.

The Aztecs mounted a 10-play, 62-yard drive of their own, mainly through the air, culminating with a 30-yard field goal by John Baron II. Chapman was 5-for-7 on the scoring drive for 61 yards.

On Stanford's ensuing drive and facing a punt on 3rd and 15, Costello rolled out to his left and fired a deep pass to Arcega-Whiteside, who caught it over a fallen Kyree Woods and raced 80 yards for the touchdown. Following a successful 2-point conversion, the Cardinal ran its lead to 24-10.

SDSU got back into Stanford territory, but was stopped on a 4th and 1 on the 32-yard line as the fourth quarter began.

The Cardinal put the game away on its next drive with Costello's fourth touchdown pass of the game found Parkinson from 19 yards out.

Costello finished the game 21 of 31 for 332 yard and four touchdowns.

Washington led San Diego State's rushing attack with 158 yards on 24 carries (6.6 avg.), the sixth-highest total by an Aztec back in a season opener and the eighth most against a nationally ranked opponent.

Parker Baldwin and Kyahva Tezino each had 11 tackles apiece to pace the SDSU defense.
