Ruben Volta begins his second year as head coach at Sacramento State in 2009 after taking over for Debby Colberg, who retired after 32 years with the Hornets.

The upcoming season will mark the 10th year Volta has been a member of the Sacramento State coaching staff, including one year as the associate head coach (2007), five years as an assistant (2002-06), and two seasons as a volunteer assistant (2000-01).

During Volta's nine-year tenure with the program, Sacramento State has combined for a 208-86 overall record (.707 winning percentage), a 107-27 mark in the Big Sky Conference, seven Big Sky Tournament championships, five regular season conference titles and seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

Also during that nine-year span, Sacramento State players have combined for 41 all-academic selections, 35 all-conference awards (including 15 first team selections), three MVPs and three all-Pacific Region selections.

Last season, in Volta's first as head coach, he led the program to its 33rd consecutive season with double figures in victories and an 8-8 mark in conference despite losing both starting outside hitters, both starting middles and the starting libero from the previous year.

The 2008 squad featured two all-conference performers (Rose Burke and Desiree Hoyum), and set the program record for most Big Sky all-academic selections in a season with eight. In fact, eight members of this year's team currently have grade point averages of at least 3.25.

A graduate of Sacramento State in 1993 with a degree in physical education, Volta starred for the Hornet men's team that went undefeated and won the National Club Championship in 1995. That season, Volta earned All-America honors as a setter and was named all-tourney at the Big 10 Tournament.

In 1995, he opened the High Voltage volleyball facility in Sacramento, and began running a juniors club. During one point in 1997, the club operated 18 juniors teams of different age groups.

In the seven years of High Voltage's existence, the team qualified for the junior nationals (18-open division) five times, including an 11th-place finish in 1996. The junior nationals include the top 32 teams in the country.

Some of his former club players with High Voltage include past Hornets Tasman Dwyer, Brenda Moorlag, Korri Kuelper, Sharon Stutts, Kazmiera Imrie, Holly Olmsted, Sandra Bandimere, Jackie Coudert and Michelle Franz. In 2006, he coached the Gold Cal (18-under) Juniors club volleyball team to an 11th-place finish at the junior nationals. That team featured current Hornet middle hitter Anna Schoener and Cayti Crowton.

In the summer of 2008, he was the assistant coach for the 18-under Gold Cal Junior Club team that placed fifth in the American division at the Junior Olympics. That team featured current Hornet sophomores Kelsey Elston and Shannon Wilson.

He also spent the 2001 season coaching the 18-under Davis club team and spent time as an assistant coach at Rio Americano High School for one season (1999) where he helped guide the Raiders to the Sac-Joaquin Section championship. Prior to that, Volta spent two seasons as the varsity head coach at Country Day High School (1998-99) where the team finished third in the section championships. He started his coaching career at Grant High School in 1992, spending two years as the varsity head coach for the boys and girls teams.

Volta, who resides in Sacramento, also taught physical education at Sacramento's St. Philomenes School from 1999-2002.





SARAH CHLEBANA

Assistant Coach • Second Season • Sacramento State, '02

Sarah Chlebana, who starred for the Sacramento State volleyball team from 1997-00, enters her second season as an assistant coach with the Hornets. She serves as the team's recruiting coordinator and assists in all areas of on-floor coaching, scouting and team training.

Chlebana, who is one of 10 players in Sacramento State history to accumulate 1,000 career kills and 1,000 career digs, has a total of six years of coaching experience. That includes the 2007 season as an assistant at Div. I Long Island University, where she helped coach the team to the Northeast Conference regular season and tournament championships, and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to coaching at Long Island, Chlebana spent the 2006-07 season as an assistant coach for the Belgian semi-professional team Volleybalclub Oudegem. In two years as an assistant at Syracuse (2004, 2005), she helped lead the Orange to back-to-back Big East Conference Tournament appearances for the first time since 1999. In addition, Syracuse combined to post a 50-17 overall record during her tenure with the team. She also spent one season (2003) as an assistant at Div. I Belmont University in Nashville, Tenn.

Chlebana was a four-year starter for the Hornets, and helped lead the team to four consecutive Big Sky Conference championships and four straight NCAA Tournament appearances. A two-time second team all-Big Sky selection (1999-00) and 1998 Big Sky all-tournament choice, the Calgary, Alberta, native never missed a match during her career, and finished with 1,116 kills, 1,348 digs, 271 blocks and 85 aces.

Chlebana served as the team captain her senior year, and the Hornets combined to post a 92-40 overall record during her four seasons. She graduated from Sacramento State in 2002 with a bachelor's degree in computer engineering, and a minor in mathematics.



WEIDI ZHANG

Assistant Coach • 23rd Season • Shanghai Institute, '66

Weidi Zhang will enter his 23rd season with Sacramento State in 2009. A 15-year international coaching veteran with 15 years of playing experience, his varied coaching duties include stints as head coach of both the Shanghai women's professional team (1985-87) and the men's professional team (1980-83, 1985-87) as well as the Nigerian National Team (1979-80). Additionally, Zhang spent time as an assistant coach with the Chinese National Team (1983-85).

In 22 years as an assistant at Sacramento State (1987-pres.), the Hornets have combined for a 568-235 record (.707 winning percentage), 14 NCAA Tournament appearances and 11 Big Sky Conference championships.

He also coached the Sacramento State men's club team for 13 seasons (1989-2001). During that time, Zhang led the men's squad to numerous top 10 finishes and two NIRSA Div. I national titles (1995, 1997).

In 1983, Zhang helped coach the Chinese Men's Olympic Team to a second-place finish at the Asian Volleyball Championships, held in Japan. One year later, that same team placed sixth in the Japan Cup and second in the Christmas Tournament in Holland.

Zhang was the starting setter and captain of the Chinese National Team in 1975. He helped lead the squad to a third-place finish at the Asian Volleyball Championship that year. Prior to that, he played competitively with a local team from Shanghai (1966-74) which won the national championship on four occasions.

During the course of his playing career (1961-75), Zhang was the starting setter and team captain for all three teams in which he played (Shanghai Youth Volleyball Team, Shanghai Volleyball Team and the Chinese National Team).

Zhang earned a bachelor's degree from the Shanghai Institute of Physical Education in 1966. He has been teaching volleyball classes at Sacramento State for the past 23 years. Weidi and his wife, Xiaoping, have a 34-year old son, Yu Zhang.

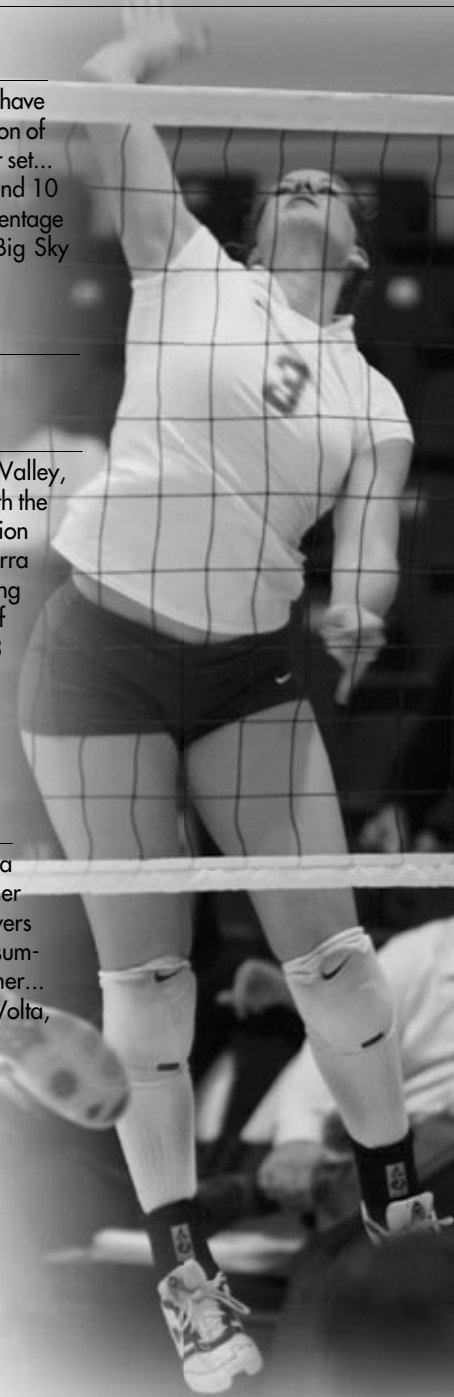

2008 Season

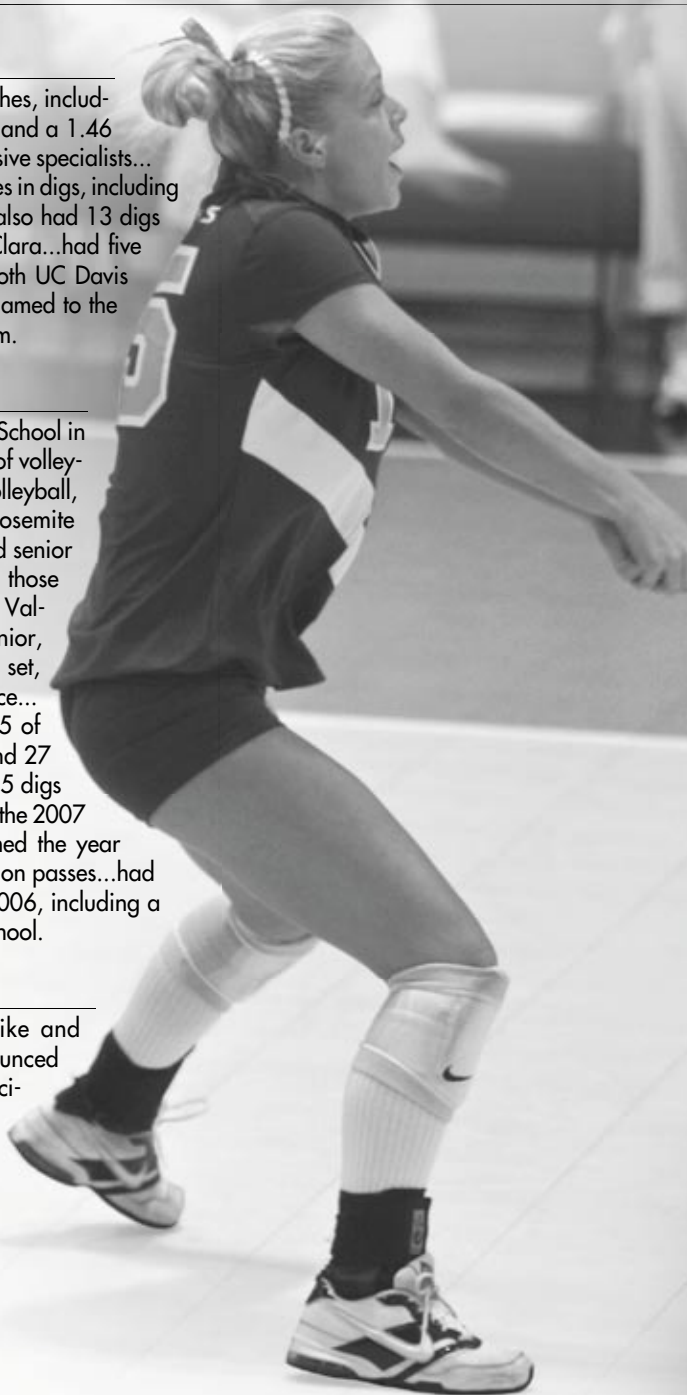

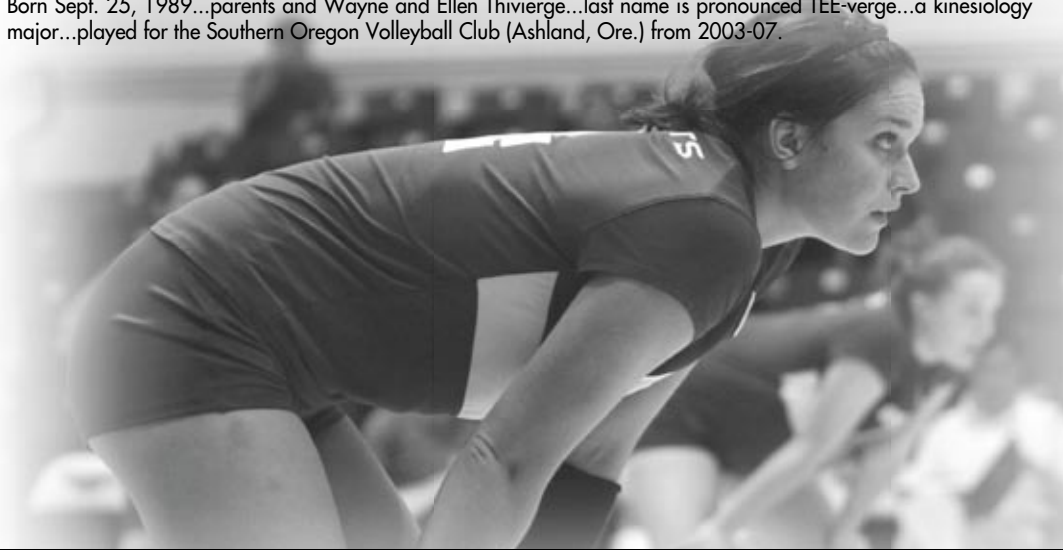

The Big Sky Conference begins its 47th year of athletic competition in 2009-10. The Big Sky is an NCAA Division I member in all sports, with member institutions classified in the Football Championship Subdivision (formally I-AA). The league has become one of the strongest Division I conferences in the West and is a national leader in the Football Championship Subdivision.

The Big Sky Conference was established in 1963 by six charter members – Idaho, Idaho State, Gonzaga, Montana, Montana State and Weber State. Those six schools formed the foundation of the Big Sky before the league expanded in 1970 by adding Boise State and Northern Arizona. Gonzaga left the Sky in 1979 and was replaced by Nevada, which gave the league eight members. The conference grew to nine schools in 1987 with the addition of Eastern Washington.

The 1990s saw change in the makeup of the league, beginning in 1992 when Nevada departed and put the Big Sky back at eight teams. In 1996, Boise State and Idaho left and at the same time, the conference added Portland State, Sacramento State and Cal State Northridge. The Big Sky maintained nine teams for five years before Cal State Northridge departed in the spring of 2001.

With the addition of Northern Colorado in 2006-07, the Big Sky spreads across eight states spanning from the Pacific Ocean to the Rocky Mountain Front. The Big Sky is represented along the entire west coast with schools in Washington, Oregon and California. League schools also range up and down the Rocky Mountains with institutions in Montana, Idaho, Utah, Arizona, and now Colorado.

Of the nine western-most states in the contiguous United States, only one, Nevada, is not represented in the Big Sky.

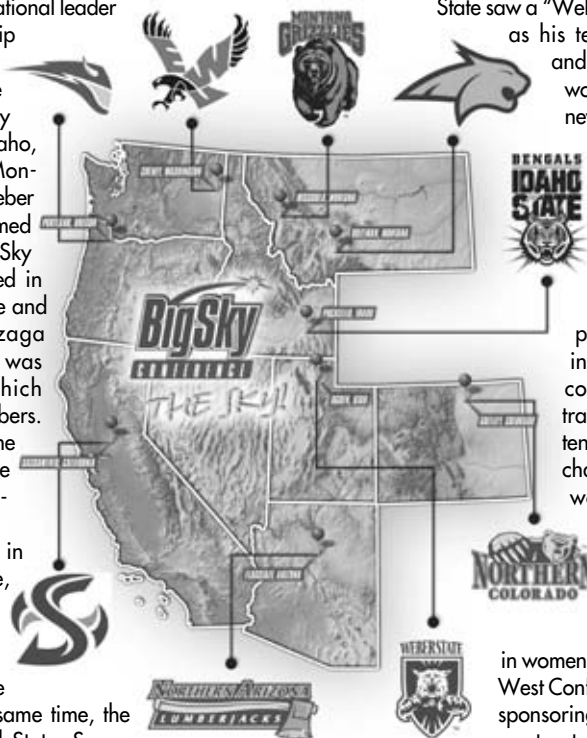
On Feb 25, 1963, the name Big Sky was adopted by the six presidents of the charter members as the name of the new conference. The name Big Sky originated in a novel written by the late A.B. (Bud) Guthrie of Great Falls, Mont., in 1947 entitled "The Big Sky." Jack Hollowell, a former Montana advertising director, promoted the Big Sky theme for the Treasure State. While on a track and field trip from Pocatello, Idaho, to Missoula, Mont., the legendary Dubby Holt of Idaho

State saw a "Welcome to Big Sky Country" sign as his team entered Montana. Holt, and his athletes thought "Big Sky" would be a perfect name for the new conference. Harry Missildine of the Spokane Spokesman-Review called for the newly formed league to be named the Big Sky Conference in his column dated Feb. 20, 1963.

The Big Sky sponsors championships in 14 sports, including men's and women's cross country, indoor and outdoor track and field, basketball and tennis. In addition, there are also championships in football, and women's volleyball, women's golf and soccer.

The 2009-10 season will mark the 22nd year that the Big Sky Conference will sponsor championships in women's sports. The former Mountain West Conference existed from 1982-88, sponsoring championships for women's sports at the same institutions the Big Sky had men's programs. The Big Sky merged with the Mountain West in 1988, forming one league for both men and women.

Doug Fullerton, the fifth commissioner of the Big Sky Conference, will enter his 15th year at the helm. Fullerton took over the Big Sky on July 1, 1995, replacing longtime commissioner Ron Stephenson. Stephenson served the league for 14 years. Steve Belko was the commissioner from 1977-81 while John Roning held the post from 1971-77. The first league commissioner was Jack Friel, who served from 1963-71.

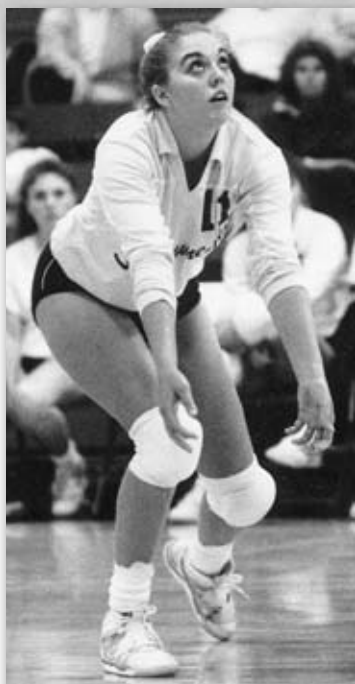

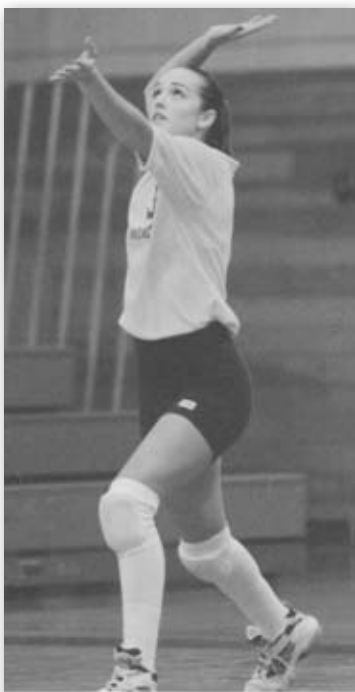

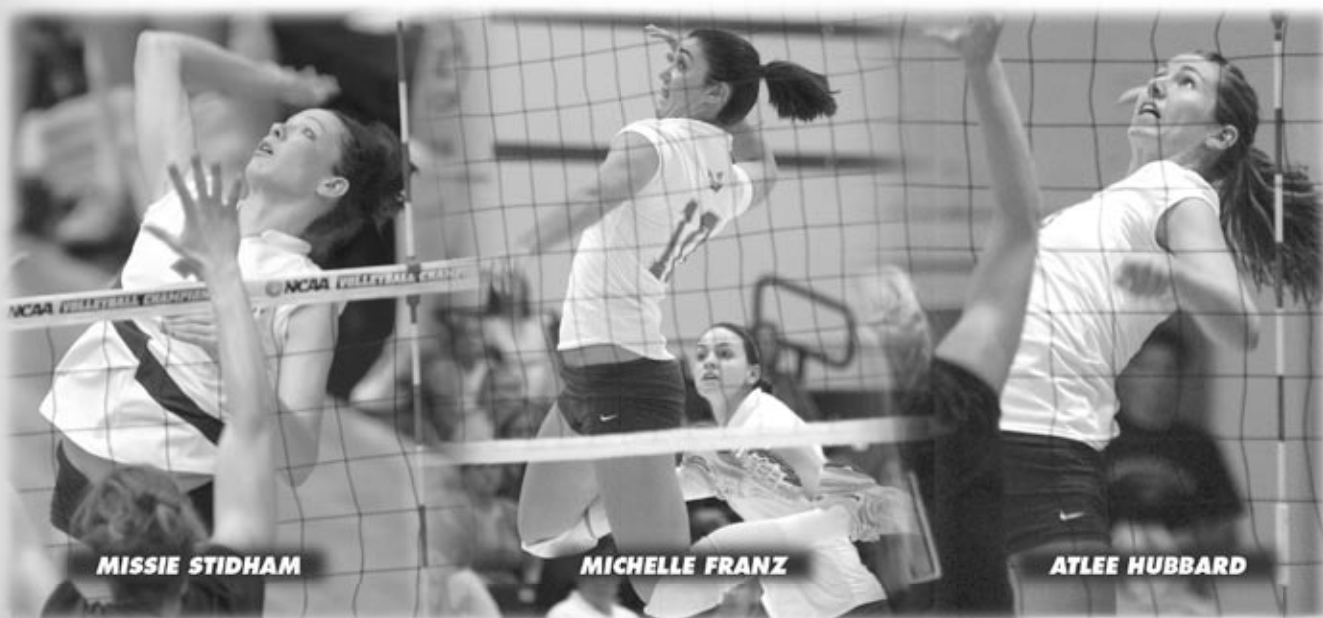

Sacramento State Head Coach (1976-2007) • 828-292 Record • .739 Winning Percentage

After 32 years at Sacramento State which included 828 victories, two national titles, 20 NCAA Tournament appearances, 18 conference championships and 17 coach of the year awards, head coach Debby Colberg announced her retirement at the conclusion of the 2007 season. A graduate of Sacramento State, Colberg coached just two losing squads during her tenure and her teams averaged 25.9 wins per season over that span.

For her efforts, Colberg was inducted into the American Volleyball Coaches Association Hall of Fame on Dec. 13, 2007. In addition, in honor of Colberg, the Sacramento State volleyball and basketball teams now play their home games on Colberg Court.

The coach with the best career winning percentage in any sport at Sacramento State, Colberg led the Hornets to winning seasons in 16 of the 17 Division I years, and compiled a 408-174 (.701) record over that span. That included six straight and 10 NCAA Tournament appearances in 11 years (1997-00, 2002-07). The Hornets also rattled off 13 consecutive 20-win seasons and 27 overall years with at least 20 victories.

The recipient of 17 coach of the year awards (one national, five regional and 11 conference), Colberg also had the added responsibility of serving as Sacramento State's Athletics Director, a position she held from February of 1999 until June of 2002.

Since the program joined the Big Sky Conference in 1996, Colberg led the Hornets to eight regular season titles (1997-01, 2005-07) and nine conference tournament crowns (1997-98, 2000, 2002-07).

No matter what division the Hornets have been a part of over the years, the team has consistently reached the NCAA Tournament. In fact, during the Div. II era (1981-90), the team had five top five finishes while reaching the Final Four on four occasions. That included a national championship in 1981 and a national runner-up finish in 1989. The 1981 championship was the second national crown in as many years for Sacramento State as the team won the AIAW Div. III national crown in 1980 (the NCAA did not sanction women's sports until 1981).

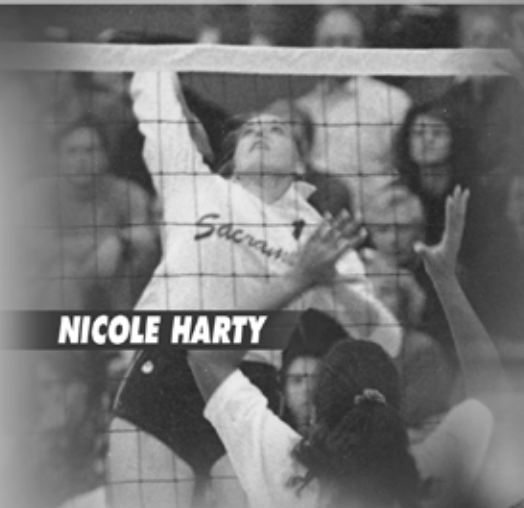

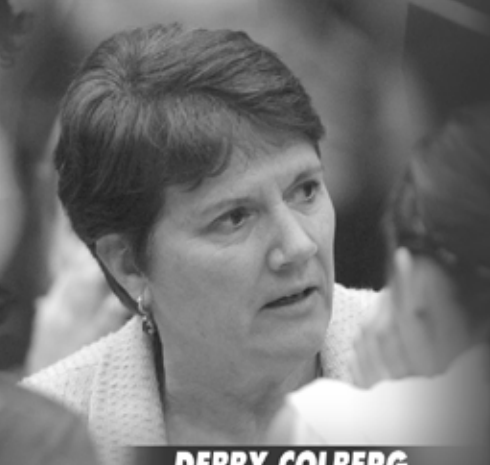

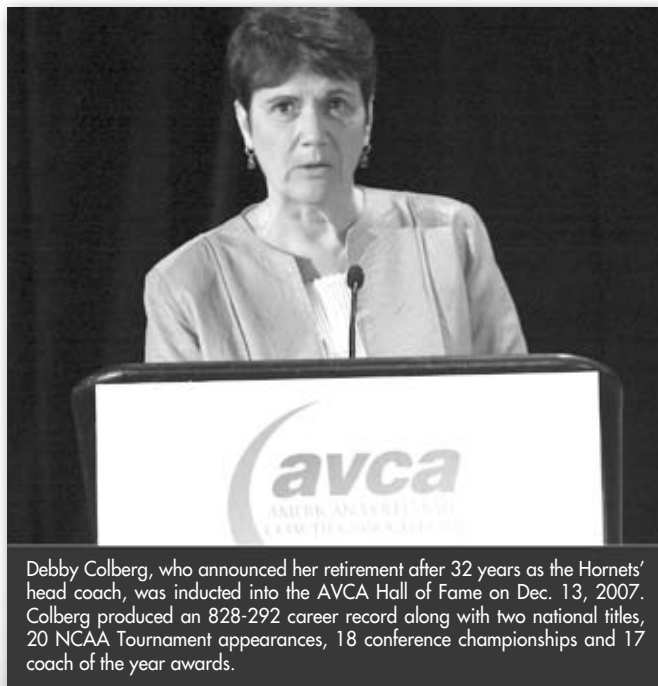

About The University

- Sacramento State is the seventh largest university in the 23-campus CSU system, enrolling a multicultural student body of more than 29,000. The 300-acre campus is sheltered by more than 3,000 trees and dotted with flower gardens, including 3 million square feet of building space. Miles of trails stretch along the nearby river parkway, linking the University and student housing with recreational areas such as Folsom Lake and Old Sacramento.
- Quality teaching is a top priority, and classes are small and personalized. More than 80 percent of recent graduates say their professors were enthusiastic and genuinely enjoyed teaching.
- Preparing students for a career is a vital part of the education here. Thousands of students from all majors earn academic credit working in internship and co-op positions, many of which are paid.
- Sacramento State, often called "Sac State," was founded as Sacramento State College in 1947 during a time of intense demand for higher education after World War II. We moved to our permanent location on the banks of the historic American River in 1953. In 1972, we were renamed California State University, Sacramento.
- The University is in the midst of an ambitious new master plan that will remake Sacramento State into a residential campus and add some 1.5 million square feet of building space. The plan, to guide campus growth in coming decades, includes additional housing, and a recreation and wellness center.
- Unlimited bus and light rail service throughout Sacramento is free for University students. Students may attend all home athletic events for free and attend other campus events for free or at a discount. More than half the students join one of the more than 200 student organizations, which include 35 fraternities and sororities.

- Sacramento State offers 60 undergraduate and 40 graduate degrees in eight Colleges. Teacher education is the largest academic program, followed by business, criminal justice, communication studies, psychology and computer science. The student-to-faculty ratio is 20 to 1; more than 70 percent of classes have fewer than 30 students.
- Attracting students from all over the world, the criminal justice program is one of the largest in the United States.
- One in 26 residents of the six-county Sacramento Region is a Sacramento State graduate. The University directly and indirectly contributes more than \$900 million to the region's economy annually.
- Almost 700 new school teachers graduate from Sacramento State each year.
- Seventy-eight percent of students say that Sacramento State was their first or only choice.
- Sacramento State was the site of the 2003, 2005, 2006 and 2007 NCAA Div. I Track & Field Championships, and the Sacramento State Aquatic Center was the site of the 1997, 1999, 2004, 2005 and 2008 NCAA Women's Rowing Championships. In addition, Sacramento State was host of the 2007 NCAA Div. I Women's Volleyball Final Four at Arco Arena.
- Sacramento State hosted the most successful U.S. Olympic Track and Field Trials ever in 2000, and hosted the event again in 2004.
- Famous Sacramento State alumni include actor Tom Hanks, Grammy award winner Bobby McFerrin, former co-host of *Good Morning America* Joan Lunden, former host of the *Early Show*, Rene Syler, stand-up comedian Brian Posehn, actor Carlos Alazraqui, film director Joe Carnahan, former Stockton mayor Edward Chavez, famous economist and author Richard J. Maybury, former *KTLA Morning News* Giselle Fernández and founding member of the Village People David Hodo.
- Famous Sacramento State athletics alumni include retired nine-year NFL offensive lineman and two-time Super Bowl winner John Gese, Seattle Seahawks offensive coordinator Greg Knapp, former 10-year NFL fullback Daimon Shelton, nine-year long snapper and three-time Super Bowl winner Lonie Paxton, former 12-year NFL defensive back Lorenzo Lynch, CFL Edmonton Eskimos quarterback Ricky Ray, former CFL three-time leading rusher Charles Roberts, Arena Football League record-setting quarterback Aaron Garcia and former San Francisco wide receiver Fred Otis Amey.



Partnering With Athletics For Excellence

When the Sacramento State student body overwhelmingly passed a referendum in the spring of 1995, it began a partnership between the Hornet Athletics Department and Associated Students, Inc. That vote by the students helps fund the athletics department and has been a key factor in the recent success.

ASI is a student-run, non-profit corporation that represents the student body in the governance of the University. One of ASI's goals is to facilitate student participation in a full range of campus life and learning outside the classroom. Guided by this goal, ASI supports intercollegiate, recreational, and intramural sports, which is not only an important part of campus life, but an arena in which leadership skills are developed.

ASI also operates the Green Sting student organization, the Sacramento State Aquatic Center (which is home to the Hornet rowing team), the Challenge Center, Peak Adventures and numerous other student organizations.

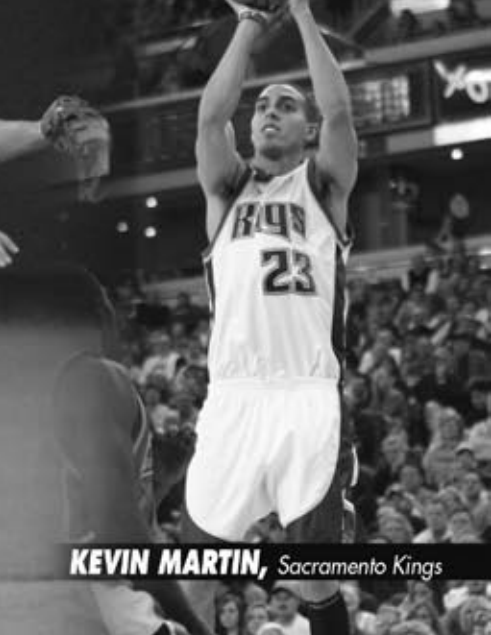
- The city of Sacramento (population 400,018) is the cultural, educational, business and governmental center of a four-county metropolitan region. As California's capitol city, Sacramento is center stage for governmental policy for the entire state. A dynamic business sector, an expanding public transportation system, affordable housing, and growing cultural, educational, and medical facilities serve the needs of 1.5 million people.
- One of the most affordable big cities in California, Sacramento is part of a Capital Region in the heart of Northern California, one of the country's most beautiful areas. Within easy driving distance are San Francisco, the Napa and Sonoma valleys, Yosemite Valley and the Lake Tahoe region's ski slopes.
- Founded in 1849, Sacramento was California's first charter city and is at the heart of California history – the gold rush, Pony Express and first continental railroad all began in Sacramento. The city's rich historical heritage, commitment to quality of life, and abundance of trees and parkland contributed to Newsweek magazine naming Sacramento one of the ten best cities in the United States.
- Sacramento is home to the NBA's Sacramento Kings, the Sacramento River Cats (Oakland A's Triple-A affiliate) and the WNBA's Sacramento Monarchs.
- Sacramento has also become a tourist center with attractions including the State Capitol building, North America's largest railroad museum, the Old Sacramento historic area, the California State History Museum and the Crocker Art Museum.

ALEXANDER GONZALEZ

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

Dr. Alexander Gonzalez has served more than three decades as a professor and education leader, including serving as president of California State University, Sacramento, since 2003.

As the first person in his family to graduate from college, Dr. Gonzalez has devoted his career to ensuring greater opportunities for students. He grew up in East Los Angeles with six siblings, graduating from high school at a time when students did not have the same options for higher education that they have today.

Dr. Gonzalez enlisted in the U.S. Air Force at age 17, served four years and then used the G.I. Bill to graduate from Pomona College in Claremont, Calif. He graduated with honors and was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He later earned a master's in psychology and doctorate from the University of California, Santa Cruz, before serving as a postdoctoral research fellow at Stanford University.

His experience includes six years as president of California State University, San Marcos, and 18 years at Fresno State, where he was a faculty member and chair of the Psychology Department before becoming the university's provost and vice president for academic affairs.

At Sacramento State, Dr. Gonzalez implemented his Destination 2010 initiative to transform the campus into a premier metropolitan university. The bold initiative seeks to make Sacramento State a campus of choice for students in the Sacramento region and beyond.

Following his belief that universities and communities must work together to improve lives and opportunities, Dr. Gonzalez serves on the Sutter Health Board of Directors and the Pomona College Board of Trustees.

He previously served on the President's Advisory Commission on Educational Excellence for Hispanic Americans and the Valley Vision Board of Directors. His service on several boards and commissions includes six years as a commissioner for the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, the accrediting agency for higher education institutions in the western United States. He also served as chair of the Governing Board of the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities.

His commitment to the California State University system includes serving on a work group that reviewed and recommended corrective action on remedial education, and, more recently, as a member of a committee of presidents considering policy on enrollment management, the CSU's Technology Steering Committee, and the Institute for Teaching and Learning.

Dr. Gonzalez is Sacramento State's 11th president. His wife, Gloria, is also a graduate of the CSU. They have two sons.



TERRY WANLESS

ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

Dr. Terry Wanless' seven-year tenure as Sacramento State's Director of Athletics has seen growth unparalleled in the school's 18-year Division I history. His vision of broad success in the department has come to fruition over the last three years where the Hornets have combined to win 21 conference championships. That includes an unprecedented eight conference titles during both the 2006-07 and 2007-08 academic years. In addition, the program has claimed back-to-back Big Sky Conference Women's All-Sports Trophies.

In fact, of the 330 Div. I athletics programs, SI.com ranked Sacramento State as the 36th best athletics program during the 2007-08 academic year.

The 2008-09 West Region Athletic Director of the Year for the Football Championship Subdivision, Wanless has overseen significant facility enhancement to the athletic facilities. The biggest change came during the spring of 2008 with the opening of the Broad Fieldhouse, which serves as the home to Hornet football and track and field, as well as athletic training and strength and conditioning.

The Eli and Edythe Broad Fieldhouse is the first step of an elaborate plan that began with the passing of a referendum by the Sacramento State student body. That vote will also lead to the creation of a recreation and wellness center which will benefit the entire student body and is expected to open in the fall of 2010.

Wanless has served on numerous NCAA committees, and just completed a term as a member of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision selection committee and the Div. I Football Issues Committee. Previously, he was a member of the NCAA Football rules committee and the NCAA Peer Review committee.

Wanless has been a visible member of the Sacramento State athletics family, constantly representing the University and department at public outings and speaking engagements. His commitment to the student-athlete has also been clear as both he and his wife, Joanne, attend the majority of Hornet home athletic events and support several teams on the road.

His leadership and academic support have been evident to the student-athletes in other ways as well. The department's Life Skills Program has seen rapid growth, significantly increasing the number of summer and fifth-year scholarships available to Hornet student-athletes. The Life Skills program has also launched the program's first computer lab and offers Hornet student-athletes tutoring as well as academic counseling.

Over the last seven years, Sacramento State student-athletes have posted nearly 2,000 term GPAs of 3.0 or above, and close to 500 Hornets have earned conference all-academic honors during that same time period.

His efforts in restoring the department's booster club structure as well as aggressively improving the University's collegiate licensing program, while not readily visible, are projects that will surely enhance the program's financial footing in years to come.

Athletically, the Hornets have also seen continued growth and success on the field of play. During his seven years at Sacramento State, 22 teams and 125 individuals have advanced to NCAA postseason competition.

Wanless' efforts to put the Hornets on the map have been instrumental in helping make Sacramento State the unofficial "home of NCAA Championships". During his seven years of leadership, Sacramento State has served as host to seven NCAA championships (four track, two rowing, one volleyball) as well as the 2004 U.S. Olympic Track and Field Trials.

Prior to Sacramento State, Wanless served as athletics director at the University of North Dakota from 1990-1999, guiding the program to one of its most successful decades in school history. During that time, North Dakota enjoyed strong competitive success, winning four NCAA national championships and 36 conference titles. Additionally, 25 other teams finished second in their respective conferences.

Before his position at North Dakota, Wanless was director of intercollegiate athletics at Western Carolina for four years and held a variety of positions, including director of intercollegiate athletics, at Towson University in Maryland.

Wanless earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Black Hills State, a master's degree in physical education from Northern Illinois and a doctorate in athletics administration from Temple. He and his wife, Joanne, are the parents of two children. Their daughter, Heather, and her husband, Chad Collins, reside in Lexington, Ky., with their daughter Hadley and son Jack. Their son Troy, and his wife, Jesi, live in Minneapolis with their daughter Elli.



ACADEMIC & COMPLIANCE

The Student-Athlete Resource Center

The Student-Athlete Resource Center offers academic advising, tutoring and mentoring, NCAA rules education and compliance, athletic financial services support, and life skills programming for all student-athletes of Sacramento State's Division I Intercollegiate Athletics program.

The S.A.R.C.'s services and programming are provided in an assortment of ways including individual advising, orientations, group and team meetings, coaches' compliance and rules education sessions, freshmen seminar classes, and a variety of student development and academic workshops. S.A.R.C. Director Paul Edwards, Academic Athletic Services Coordinator Laurie Dahlberg, Football Athletic Advisor Bob Shook and Life Skills and Student-Athlete Development Coordinator Mark McGushin serve as the primary advisors to the student-athletes.

Additionally, McGushin coordinates the mentoring program which addresses student-athletes experiencing academic difficulties. The Student-Athlete Academic & Life Skills Lab is available to student-athletes as a study area and to meet with tutors. The S.A.R.C. also provides additional services, guest speakers and

workshops related to finding information on campus, in the community and NCAA resources in a variety of areas related to student life, welfare and career opportunities.

Athletic Compliance and Financial Services Director Katherine Zedonis and Compliance Coordinator Tina Westerhold are responsible for the administration of NCAA eligibility rules education and compliance for all intercollegiate teams, including issues related to athletic financial aid of student-athletes. The Athletic Compliance Office is responsible for developing, monitoring and enforcing a compliance program that ensures the integrity of the institution within the guidelines of the NCAA, Big Sky Conference and the University.

Admission Counselor/NCAA Initial Eligibility Coordinator Josh Collins services Sacramento State student-athletes with admission processing responsibilities and monitoring of NCAA initial-eligibility requirements. Collins works closely with both new transfer and incoming freshmen student-athletes. He is the main contact at Sacramento State for student-athletes working with NCAA Eligibility Center procedures.

The goal of the athletic training staff is to provide all Sacramento State student-athletes with high quality health care. Headed by full-time certified athletic trainers Steve DeHart, Heather Farwig and Joe Ramos, the Hornets' athletic training facility provides state-of-the-art support and the services of highly trained sports medicine and health care professionals.

Should an injury occur, student-athletes are seen immediately by their sport's specific athletic trainer, and are referred, when necessary, to the appropriate medical provider or facility.

Sacramento State boasts three athletic training facilities (two located in the physical education complex and one at the Broad Fieldhouse). All athletic training facilities are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus.

A staff of three team physicians (Dr. Alan Hirahara, Dr. Ronald Sockolov, Dr. Harold Strauch) and a skillful and talented athletic training staff tend to the medical and rehabilitative needs of each and every student-athlete. Also assisting in the health of the student-athletes is a Kaiser physician, two dentists, a physical therapist and a chiropractor.

Sacramento State's athletic training staff consists of three full-time certified athletic trainers, three graduate assistants and more than 15 athletic training students preparing for a career in sports medicine.
