REDDIES PLAY HOST TO OLD GSC FOE DELTA STATE

Henderson State will welcome former Gulf South Conference opponent Delta State, Saturday at Carpenter-Haygood Stadium. The Statesmen enter the game ranked No. 6 in the latest AFCA Coaches Poll. DSU finished the 2010 season as NCAA Division II National Runner-up.

REDDIE REPORT

The Reddie offense has struggled in the first three games totaling just seven offensive touchdowns and averaging just 199 yards of total offense per game. There is no doubt that the Reddie defense has been the bright spot despite being on the field an average of 10 minutes more per game than the offense. Last week against Southwestern Oklahoma, redshirt-freshman quarterback **Kevin Rodgers** entered the game in the second half and completed 14-of-24 passes for 88 yards and two touchdown tosses in his collegiate debut. The Reddie receivers have had their troubles with several dropped passes. **Jazz Scott** leads the team with 8 receptions for 77 yards and two touchdowns, while **Ge'rell James** has 8 catches for 71 yards. **Nick Johnson** did not have a catch last week against SWOSU and has totaled seven catches for 50 yards.

Henderson turned to **Turell Williams** to handle the ground game last week. Williams was limited to just 13 yards against SWOSU.

Defensively, the Reddies were on the field 41:17 last week against the Bulldogs and yielded just 17 points. However nine defensive penalties in the first half proved costly.

Benny Anderson leads the Henderson defense with 26 stops including a 41-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown, while **Maxie Graham** has 23 tackles. **Antonio Leak** and **Robbie Aldridge** have spent a lot of time in the opponent's backfield as Leak has 6.0 tackles for lost yardage and Aldridge 4.5 tackles for losses including 2.5 sacks.

ABOUT THE DELTA STATE

Delta State continues to be one of the top teams in Division II ranking in to Top 10 in the latest AFCA Poll. Delta State scored 20 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to capture a 47-32 non-conference victory over Arkansas Tech last week.

The Delta State offense averages 490.0 yards per game, while the defense allows just 267.8 yards per game.

All-American and Harlan Hill candidate **Micah Davis** returns for his senior season. Davis, who has completed 92 of 166 passes for 1269 yards and 10 touchdowns this year, threw for 419 yards against Arkansas Tech. Davis became just the fourth DSU quarterback to surpass 5,000 career yards passing at DSU and has totaled 5,366 yards in two years.

Brandon Lucas leads the DSU rushing attack averaging 64.2 yards per game. Lucas rushed for 63 yards on 15 carries last week against Arkansas Tech.

Chance Dennis leads Delta State's receiving corps with 28 catches for 390 yards and five touchdowns. Last week against Arkansas Tech, Dennis totaled 12 receptions for 155 yards and three touchdowns.

Ixavier Triplett leads Delta State's defense having 25 tackles including a team-best 6.5 tackles for lost yardage. **Robbie Myers** follows with 21 tackles and 3.5 tackles for losses. The DSU defense has totaled 34 tackles for losses and 13 sacks.

The Statesmen are coached by **Ron Roberts** who is in his fifth season as head coach of DSU with a 39-14 record.

Stigger native totaled nine tackles in the win against Harding. His performance was highlighted by a 16-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown as time expired in the first half.

THE SERIES VS. DELTA STATE

Delta State and Henderson State meet for the 25th time in a series that dates back to 1936, with Delta State leading the series 19-4-1. Delta State has won 10 of the last 11 meetings with Henderson's lone win during that span being a 16-13 overtime victory in 2006 at Carpenter-Haygood Stadium.

LAST YEAR VS. DSU: DSU 41, HSU 37

Trevar Deeds' 3-yard touchdown with 6:07 to play in the game lifted Delta State to a 41-37 win over Henderson State. Deed carried the ball 25 times for 155 yards and three touchdowns. Delta State had the ball to begin the game and on the Statesmen's first play Micah Davis was picked off by Jeremy Rodenburg at the Henderson 31 to set up the Reddies first score. Georgio Hall gave the Reddies an early lead with a 2-yard run to make the score 7-0 with 11:48 to play in the first quarter. Delta then scored 19 straight points before Nick Hardesty orchestrated a 9 play, 71 yard drive to cut the deficit to 19-14 with 6:01 left in the half. On the ensuing kickoff, Maurice Moore muffed the kickoff and the ball sprang loose into the DSU end zone where Darius Davis recovered the loose ball for a Henderson score to give the Reddies a 21-19 lead. With HSU trailing 26-21, Hardesty put together another impressive drive which covered 77 yards on 7 plays in 1:06 as HSU took a 28-26 halftime lead. Hardesty hit Josh Sipho in the flat and he went 26 yards for the go ahead score just before the break. To begin the second half, the Reddie offense went 80 yards with Terrance Jackson rushing in from the 4-yardline to increase HSU's lead to 34-26. With the score tied at 34-34 Eric Torres put the Reddies on top with a 21-yard field goal by before DSU's winning touchdown. Hardesty ended the night completing 21-of-36 passes for 211 yards.

LAST TIME OUT: SWOSU 17, HSU 13

Henderson State could only muster 139 yards of total offense as the Reddies lost its home opener to Southwest Oklahoma State 17-13. The Reddies totaled just 53 offensive plays averaging 2.6 yards per play, while SWOSU compiled 422 yards of offense on 88 plays. SWOSU controlled the ball for 22 minutes in the first-half, but the Reddies found themselves down just 7-0 at the break. The SWOSU defense held the Reddies to 3-plays and out, on four of their five offensive possessions in the opening half, with Henderson managing just one first-down. The Bulldogs went up 14-0 to begin the second-half, driving 96-yards on 13 plays. D.C Walker plunged in from a yard out with 6:02 to play in the quarter to give the visitors a 14-0 advantage. Henderson's first score was set up by the defense as Chuck Obi intercepted a Stenta pass at the SWOSU 35 and returned it to the 23. Kevin Rodgers threw his first collegiate touchdown as he hit Jazz Scott for a 9-yard score with 28 seconds left in the third quarter to make the score 14-7. SWOSU was able to increase its lead to 17-7 with 9:47 left in the game. Nick Johnson set up the Reddies' next score with a 47-yard punt return down to the Bulldog 29 with a pair of personal foul penalties tacked on. Two plays later, Rodgers hit Labroderick Barnett for an 8-yard score. Senta had a career night for SWOSU, completing 37-of-52 passes for 330 yards. Rodgers completed 14-of-24 passes for 88 yards and two touchdowns, while Ge'rell James caught six passes for 40 yards. Keaton Stigger led the defense with 11 tackles, and a fumble recovery. SWOSU controlled the football eating up 41:17 off the clock. Both teams had their fair share of penalties as the Reddies committed 13 infractions for 149 yards, while SWOSU had 14 penalties for 139 yards.

ROOKIE MAKING MOST OF HIS OPPORTUNITY

Last week against Southwestern Oklahoma State, redshirt-freshman quarterback **Kevin Rodgers** made his collegiate debut in the second-half. The native of Rockwall, Texas completed 14-of-24 passes for 88 yards and two touchdowns. Rodgers was a second-team all-district selection and Academic All-State pick his senior year at Rockwall-Heath HS after throwing for 2600 yards and 20 touchdowns.

YOU CAN'T DO THAT

Last week against Southwestern Oklahoma State, the two teams combined for 27 penalties for 288 yards. Henderson was penalized nine times for 103 yards in the first quarter, with all nine penalties being against the Reddie defense. The Reddies are averaging 90.0 yards per game in penalties.

STUCK IN NEUTRAL

In 2010, Henderson State was known for its big offensive plays. In fact the Reddies had 69 plays go for 20 yards or more. This year the Reddies have managed only six plays for 20 yards or more. The longest play from scrimmage thus far was a 31-yard pass play from Nathan Nall to Dustin Holland against Harding. Henderson's longest play from scrimmage against Southwestern Oklahoma was a 17-yard pass from Kevin Rodgers to Robert Jordan.

HOME SWEET HOME

Since Coach Scott Maxfield's arrival, the Reddies have a 21-9 record at home including a 5-0 record in 2006 and 2010. HSU compiled three straight winning seasons at home from 2005 to 2007 before going 2-3 in 2008.

In fact the Reddies have not lost two straight home games in any one season since 2004. Henderson State, then coached by **Jesse Branch** was 0-5 that season in games played at Carpenter-Haygood Stadium.

ALL THAT "JAZZ"

Wide receiver **Jazz Scott** ranks among Henderson's all-time leaders in yards receiving and reception in a career. Scott has collected 951 career yards receiving ranking him 11th all-time. Scott needs 27 receiving yards to surpass Mark Pilcher and crack the top 10. The HSU record is currently held by **Garett Manning** who totaled 1,948 yards receiving from 2005 to 2008.

Scott ranks second in school history in career receptions with 97. Scott has 10 career touchdown receptions and needs just two more to surpass Dwayne Wilkins who had 11 touchdowns from 1980-81. The career record for touchdown receptions is 16 by Garett Manning from 2005-2008.

Obi picked up his second interception against Southwestern Oklahoma. Obi has totaled eight tackles this season.



GIVING THEM THE BOOT

Freshman punter **Christian Latoof** ranks among the top punters in the GAC. The DeKalb, Texas native has totaled 22 punts for 840 yards, and average of 38.2 yards per kick. Of his 22 kicks, two have been for touchbacks, three inside the 20, and he has recorded a long of 50 yards.

STREAKING

Henderson State has scored a passing touchdown in 33 straight games. The last time the Reddies failed to score a passing touchdown was on Sept. 13, 2008 when Henderson lost to North Alabama 45-20.

In over 100 years of Reddie football, there have been 15 head football coaches at Henderson. Coach **Scott Maxfield** ranks fifth all-time in winning percentage (.515) at HSU and is also fifth in total wins with 34.

THE GAC

Henderson State along with five former members of the Gulf South Conference and three institutions from the Lone Star Conference make up the newly-formed **GREAT AMERICAN CONFERENCE**. The GAC officially became the NCAA's 23rd Division II league on March 9, 2011. The league's nine charter members are Arkansas-Monticello, Arkansas Tech, East central Oklahoma, Harding, Henderson State, Ouachita Baptist, Southeastern Oklahoma State, Southern Arkansas, and Southwestern Oklahoma State. Southern Nazarene University and Northwestern Oklahoma State University accepted provisional membership invitations in May of 2011. SNU was accepted into the NCAA membership process on July 11, 2011. NWOSU awaits an invitation into Division II.

RUGGLES FIELD AT CARPENTER-HAYGOOD STADIUM

Henderson State's Carpenter-Haygood Stadium received an upgraded surface last spring. Installation of the state-of-the-art artificial surface was installed last April thanks to the marketing efforts of HSU Director of Athletics Kale Gober, donor gifts and a primary gift from Don and Mary Yancey Ruggles of Texarkana. Both attended Henderson State in the 1950's. Geo-Surfaces of Baton Rouge, La., installed the surface of replicated grass and a thick product which includes a no-flyout rubber base. The finished product includes a solid white end zone with REDDIES spelled out in red letters. The Henderson logo is displayed at mid-field along with additional logos on the field and sponsor logos along the sidelines.

Scott Maxfield has created and built one of the top offensive programs in the country since taking over as Henderson's head coach in 2005.

In 2010, Maxfield led the Reddies to their first conference championship in 25 years as Henderson State claimed a share of the Gulf South Conference title.

Henderson's explosive offense set 25 team and individual records in 2010, including total offense averaging 480.6 yards per game, and scoring offense averaging 35.3 points per contest.

Maxfield was tabbed GSC Co-Coach of the Year while quarterback Nick Hardesty earned Player of the Year honors.

Since Maxfield's arrival, 31 players earned All-GSC honors, 15 All-Region selections and 9 All-Americans.

The 2008 season showed a versatile Reddie team with one of the most prolific offenses in HSU history averaging 32.8 points per game while totaling 448.1 yards of offense including 330.1 yards passing. The Reddies finished 5-5 losing three games late in the fourth quarter which left Maxfield and the rest of Reddies wondering what could have been.

Despite the 5-5 season, it was the third straight non-losing year for the Reddies, the most since Henderson recorded seven straight non-losing seasons from 1973 to 1979 under legendary coach Sporty Carpenter.



In 2007, the Reddies finished with a 7-3 record and finished the season ranked 23rd in College Sports Report Top 25. Henderson State recorded its third straight winning season at home, completing back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1989 and 1990, and turned in an 18-0 shutout against in-town rival Ouachita Baptist.

The previous year, Maxfield took a team that finished 3-8 in his first season, to one of the best turnarounds in the nation finishing 8-3. Henderson State ranked in the top 25 in several polls throughout the season.

A proven winner, Maxfield led Blinn College to back-to-back playoff appearances prior to his arrival at Henderson State.

During his three years at the Brenham, Texas school, Maxfield compiled a 21-10 record and a pair of playoff appearances.

Blinn finished with a 9-2 record in 2004, finishing ranked No. 7 nationally, and advancing to the Southwest Junior College Conference semifinals before losing to Tyler Junior College.

The Buccaneers ranked second nationally in total offense averaging 469.9 yards per game, including 269 yards passing per game which ranked fifth in the nation.

Maxfield's offense also lit up the scoreboard at Blinn averaging 46.1 points per game.

After posting a 5-5 mark in his first year at Blinn, Maxfield kick-started the Bucs' offense in 2003 and carried the Buccaneers to the playoffs for the first time in three years. Blinn finished the 2003 season with an overall record of 7-3, but it was the Bucs' offense that caught the nation's attention.

Blinn fielded one of the most dangerous offensive attacks in junior college history, averaging 558 yards and 52 points a game. The Bucs had three All-Americans on offense and sent four offensive players on to the Division I level.

The former Offensive Coordinator of the Year spent one year as head football coach at Pearl River Community College in Mississippi, before taking the job at Blinn.

At Pearl River, Maxfield guided the Wildcats to a 7-2 finish, the first winning season for the school since 1995. The offense finished first in the National Junior College Athletic Association in total team offense, averaging 460.5 yards per game, and was also first in passing offense, averaging 315.8 yards per game.

His previous five seasons were spent with Northwest Mississippi Community College in Senatobia where he was the offensive coordinator.

Maxfield, who holds a bachelor's degree from Louisiana Tech and his master's from the United States Sports Academy, was named Offensive Coordinator of the Year for Community and Junior Colleges in 1999 by American Football Coach Magazine.

His 25 years of coaching experience includes five years as an assistant at Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, La.

Working under former HSU Athletic Director and then coach of the Demons Sam Goodwin, Maxfield was defensive line coach from 1991-94, before becoming Goodwin's defensive coordinator from 1994 to 1996.

Maxfield also spent a total of 10 years (1986-1990 and 1996-2001) at Northwest Mississippi Community College.

A graduate of John Tyler High School in Tyler, Texas, Maxfield was a four-year letterman at Louisiana Tech University where he played offensive guard and center. After his eligibility was finished, Maxfield served as a student assistant for the Bulldogs before becoming a graduate assistant at Ole Miss.

Maxfield and his wife Beth Ann, who holds a doctorate in English, have one daughter, Alexandra Hailey.

Mike Volarvich is in his second season as offensive coordinator and quarterback coach.

In 2010, Henderson State ranked as one of the top teams in the country offensively as the Reddies set school records for scoring, passing yards, and total offense.

Volarvich coached All-American Nick Hardesty who was a finalist for the Harlon Hill Award after throwing for 4,007 yards and 30 touchdowns.

Prior to his arrival to Henderson, Volarvich was the leader of a potent EMCC scoring offense which led the NJCAA in passing offense and finished second in the nation in total offense.

Coach Volarvich has almost a decade of coaching experience at the community college level, serving as an offensive coordinator at Southwest Mississippi CC and East Central CC before joining the staff at East Mississippi.

Under Volarvich's leadership at Southwest Mississippi CC, the offense finished ninth among the 2007 NJCAA ranks in team passing.

Volarvich established himself as one of the most innovative offensive minds on the community college level. During his three years at Blinn College in Texas, the Buccaneers ranked in the top ten in the NJCAA statistically in passing and total offense.

In 2003, Volarvich was part of Maxfield's staff and he led a Blinn offense which dominated the community college team statistical ranks, topping the nation in scoring offense (52.8 points per game), total offense (538 yards per game), and passing (328 yards per game).

In 2004, the Buccaneers finished the season ranked seventh nationally with a 9-2 record, led by an offense which finished second in the nation in both scoring offense and total offense.

Volarvich began his coaching career at Cabrillo College in Aptos, Calif., and has handled other responsibilities throughout his career, including recruiting, academic advising and financial aid consultation.

Volarvich, a two-time All-Conference selection at Kentucky State University, was invited to the San Francisco 49ers' tryout camp and to the Miami Dolphins' mini-camp in 1999, and played three seasons of professional football.

Volarvich received his bachelor's degree from Midwestern State University in Wichita Falls, Texas, and later earned his master's degree in physical education from the University of West Alabama.

Volarvich is married to the former Lauren Park of Houston, Texas, and they are the parents of two daughters, Mischa Elizabeth and Aubrey Lou.

Jason Smelser is in his first season at Henderson working as running backs coach.

Smelser came to Henderson State after serving a year as defensive coordinator at Concordia University in Ann Arbor, Mich.

Prior to his stint at Concordia, Smelser spent a short stint at West Texas A&M as the defensive line coach during the spring of 2010.

Smelser served as head coach at Iowa Wesleyan College from 2006 to 2009, after serving as Defensive Coordinator in 2005.

Smelser coached one of the best defensive teams in the nation in 2005, ranking among the NAIA national leaders in pass defense (11th, 156.5 yards per game) and total defense (28th, 310.5 yards per game).

In 2008, Smelser's defense ranked among the NAIA's leaders in several categories. His defense allowed 145.4 yards of passing offense per game to rank first in the Mid-States Football Association and sixth in the nation.

Smelser was a standout football player at the high school and college levels.

A 1995 graduate of Ouachita Christian High School in Monroe, La., Smelser earned All-State and All-Northeast Louisiana honors as a line-backer. He also was a three-time all-district selection and named district defensive MVP in 1994.

Smelser went on to play at Southern Arkansas University, where he was a four-year letter winner and three-year starter on the gridiron. He was part of the 1997 team that won the Gulf South Conference championship and qualified for the NCAA Division II playoffs. Smelser was named all-conference as a running back in 1998.

At Southern Arkansas, Smelser earned his Bachelor's of Science degree in 2000 and his Master's degree in education in 2001. He served on the Southern Arkansas football coaching staff from the spring of 1999 to the fall of 2004.

Smelser coached outside linebackers and running backs as a student and graduate assistant from 1999-2000. He then served as defensive line coach from 2001-2004 and helped lead Southern Arkansas to the Division II playoffs in 2003, a season during which his defensive line totaled 30 sacks.

Smelser traveled to Poland to help coach with the Kozly Poznan football team while serving as a missionary.

Jason and his wife, Wendy, have been married 12 years and have a 11-year old daughter, Madison, and a 7-year old son, Slade.

Baker came to Henderson State just prior to the 2010 season and assumed the duties as Defensive Coordinator just one week into the job.

Baker served as the defensive coordinator at the University of Charleston (West Virginia) since 2005.

Russell Kuhns is in his third season at Henderson State and will work with the Reddie linebackers and doubles as the Reddies' strength and conditioning coach.

Kuhns served coached at Western New Mexico University from 2007 to 2009. During that time, Kuhns served as offensive line coach, running game coordinator, head strength coach and special teams co-coordinator.

Prior to his stint at Western New Mexico, he served as a graduate assistant coach at Bowling Green State University from 2005-07.

Kuhns attended Findlay College and lettered in 1998 as a running back and special teams player. He was named Rookie of the Year for the Oilers after earning his first college football letter.

He then transferred and walked-on to the University of Wisconsin. Kuhns earned a scholarship for the 2000-02 seasons and went on to letter three years and was an All-Academic Big Ten selection in 2000.

Kuhns earned honorable mention All-Northern Ohio League defense as a sophomore. As a junior he was a member of the school's first-ever regional championship team. He was also named first team All-NOL defense, First Team All-District defense, and second team All-Ohio defense.

In wrestling, Kuhns was a two-time captain in 1997 and 1998. He participated on three straight NOL championship teams. During his sophomore season, he placed third in the NOL, was sectional champion, placed fifth at the regionals, and was a state qualifier. During his junior campaign, he was second in the NOL and finished 22-2 overall before injuring his knee. He still managed to take third place at the Ohio Duals that same season. Then, in his senior year, he was undefeated throughout the regular season and counted over 200 takedowns. He was NOL and sectional champ, regional runner-up, and placed fifth at the state meet.

Kuhns is a 2003 graduate from the University of Wisconsin earning his degree in psychology, and earned his master's degree from Bowling Green State University in 2007.
