AT A GLANCE

No. 12/12 Mercyhurst Stat Lines

The Lakers just beat Lindenwood in the AHA Semifinals 2-1 in game one and 3-2 in double overtime in game two. They are 23-10-3 overall and 17-5-2 in regular-season AHA play. They're also 20-4-2 since the start of November and 12-1-1 since Jan 1. They secured their 21st 20-win season and their 25th season with a winning record in their 27-year history. Mike Sisti has been behind the bench the whole time, securing his 600th career win in November in a 6-1 win vs. Stonehill. Statistically, the Lakers are among the best. Here are their national rankings in the top categories: .295 powerplay percentage (4th nation, 1st AHA), 33 powerplay goals (4th), 115 goals (8th), .876 penalty kill percentage (5th nation, 1st AHA), 320 team points (6th). Mercyhurst has spread the wealth in terms of offensive contributions. They have had five or more goalscorers in eight-different games. 13 players have two-figure point tallies and the 14 new players have 156 out of the 320 total points. Julia Perjus (17G, 21A, 38 PTS) currently is sixth in the nation among all freshman in points and she leads the team. Sofia Nuutinen (10G, 23A, 33 PTS), Julia Schalin (9G, 21A, 30 PTS), Payten Evans (8G, 12A, 20 PTS, 61 BLKS) and Abby Poitras (5G, 11A, 16 PTS, 65 BLKS) are among the Laker's top contributors. Schalin also recorded an assist against Czechia in the Olympics.

A Look at No. 3/3 Penn State

The Nittany Lions started this season undefeated for their first 16 games. Overall, they are 31-5-0 on the year and locked in the No. 1 seed in the AHA long before the regular season ended. They swept No. 9 St Lawrence, Vermont, Delaware, Mercyhurst, Lindenwood, Robert Morris, Syracuse, and RIT in that time. Their first loss of the season came on the road in a series split at No. 7 Northeastern. They lost 3-2 in the first game and won 4-1 in the second. They closed 2025 with a home victory vs. No. 10 Cornell. To start 2026, the Nittany Lions were swept 5-1 and 4-1 at No. 2 Ohio State. They beat the Lakers 3-0 and then lost their AHA contest in game two at MU, 4-3 in OT. They then swept Syracuse and then topped No. 12 Cornell, 5-1. They swept Delaware, RMU, and Lindenwood before losing only their second conference game, 3-2 in overtime vs. RIT. They beat them 4-2 in game two, but this result and the Laker's 4-3 OT win showed that in some cases, these Nittany Lions are beatable. In the AHA semifinals, Tessa Janecke came back from the Olympics with a gold medal and scored a hat trick in PSU's 7-0 rout of Syracuse. They only beat them 2-1 in game two, but the series sweep was another statement. Grace Outwater (24G, 16A, 40 PTS), Tessa Janecke (23G, 21A, 44 PTS), Kendall Butze (5G, 27A, 32 PTS) are three of their stat leaders.



MATCHUP INSIGHTS

Mercyhurst is 27-25-9 all time versus Penn State. In the postseason, they are 2-3. The Lakers first exhibition game in the 1999-2000 season was against the Nittany Lions. However, Penn State was a club team at the time which is why the Lakers won 17-0. The first official matchup between the two was in 2012 when Penn State officially added its DI hockey programs. The Lakers won every series in the Nittany Lion's first three seasons, outscoring them 44-5. In the 2014-15 season, the rivalry was truly born. Penn State hosted Mercyhurst at the Pegula, which had only been a season old at the time. The Nittany Lions swept the Lakers 2-1 and 5-3. Since then, there have only been seven series sweeps in the last 16 series. In the 2021-22 season, the Lakers knocked the Nittany Lions out of the CHA tournament in the semifinals. Since then, the final two CHA championships in 2022-23 and 2023-24 as well as the first-ever women's AHA championship in 2024-25 have featured an MU vs. PSU matchup. The Nittany Lions have won the past three. This season, PSU won 3-0 and 6-1 in October at home. In Erie, they beat MU 3-0 and then the Lakers beat them 4-3 in OT in game two. This is the fourth consecutive AHA Championship meeting between the two. Mercyhurst is hoping to turn the tide in their favor.



New Faces to Erie

The Lakers welcomed in a new recruiting class that features 10 freshmen, Kate Donegan (Ashburn, Ont), Nayeon Kim (Seoul, South Korea), Maja Alenius (Gavle, Sweden) Madison Nelson (Burlington, Ont), Berlin Lolacher (Regina, Sask), Avery Bryk (Whitby, Ont), Lexi Stanat (St. Thomas, Ont), Holly VanNetten (Simcoe, Ont), Emma Leibrecht (Wildwood, MO), and Tara Bach (Oakville, Ont and Germany). The Lakers also brought in four transfers during the offseason, Jess Giarrocchi (Penn State/Brown), Payten Evans (Merrimack), Sophie McKinley (Merrimack), and Abby Poitras (Merrimack).

Returning to the Mercyhurst Ice Center

AHA Rookie of the Year Julia Schalin returns to the Mercyhurst Ice Center for her sophomore season. Schalin (14G, 18A, 32PTS) was second on the team in points and assists and third in goals. Sofia Nuutinen (74 GP, 22G, 37A, 59 PTS) is another returner who has been lighting up the league each year. Nuutinen was also named Rookie of the Year two seasons ago. Both Nuutinen and Schalin have played with the Finland National Team. Makayla Javier (111 GP, 12G, 22A, 34 PTS) and Sofia Ljung (76 GP, 4G, 20A, 24 PTS) are two upperclassmen blue liners with double digit figures as well. Magdalena Luggin (16 GP, 1.97GA, .926 SV) returns after being named to the AHA All-Rookie team.

Captains of the Ship

Javier will garner the "C" for Head Coach Mike Sisti, while Sofia Nuutinen, Jade Maisonneuve, and Payten Evans will all garner the "A" this season.

Plenty of Experience

This team has plenty of playing experience under their belts as four Lakers on this team have played 100+ games in their career, whether at MU or other schools. Makayla Javier (111 GP), Jess Giarrocchi (112 GP), Payten Evans (107 GP), and Sophia McKinley (106 GP). This team has a healthy mix of experience and inexperience, so this group that has been here and played at a high level will look to guide the younger players throughout the season.

A Look at the Coaching Staff

Head Coach Mike Sisti will begin his 27th season with the program as he nears the 600 win mark. With him on the bench are assistants Trey Fleisch, Scott Spencer, and Natasha Hawkins. Fleisch enters his fourth season as an assistant under Sisti. Spencer had a stint as assistant coach in the 2021-2022 season before joining the Chinese Women's National team. Among other accolades, he was the head coach at conference rival Lindenwood for several season. Hawkins is in her first season with the Lakers

Preseason Poll and Recognition

The AHA released their preseason coaches' poll and the Lakers are picked to finish second in the conference. Penn State was picked to finish first, receiving six first place votes, while the Lakers received one first place vote. Rounding out the poll was RIT in third, Robert Morris in fourth, Syracuse in fifth, Lindenwood in sixth, and Delaware in seventh. Sophomore Julia Schalin was picked to the preseason All-AHA Team. The defending AHA Rookie of the Year received the most votes (6) alongside Penn State's Tessa Janecke. Makayla Javier (captain) also received votes.

THE AHA AND MERCYHURST

Atlantic Hockey America embarks on its second season in 2025-26. After a merger between the Atlantic Hockey Association and College Hockey America following the 2023-24 season, Atlantic Hockey America enters the 2025-26 season with 17 programs across 14 member institutions.

Atlantic Hockey spans a total of seven states, reaching from the Atlantic Ocean to the Rocky Mountains. The conference fields 10 men's programs (Bentley University, Canisius University, The College of Holy Cross, Mercyhurst University, Niagara University, Rochester Institute of Technology, Robert Morris University, Sacred Heart University, the United States Air Force Academy, and the United States Military Academy), and seven women's programs (University of Delaware, Lindenwood University, Mercyhurst University, Penn State University, Rochester Institute of Technology, Robert Morris University, and Syracuse University).

Atlantic Hockey America is led by commissioner Michelle Morgan, who enters her third season in 2025-26. In her first year, Morgan led the merger between the Atlantic Hockey Association and College Hockey America.

Mercyhurst has been the CHA's top regular season program, winning 14 regular season outright titles and one shared regular season crown (Wayne State, 2007-08) from 2002-03 through 2015-16 and adding a 15th crown in 2019-20. Robert Morris won three consecutive titles from 2016-17 through 2018-19. Penn State has won four of the last five titles in 2020-21, 2022-23, 2023-24, and 2024-25. Syracuse captured its first CHA regular season crown in 2021-22.

The Lakers has also won 13-of-23 post-season tournaments (2003-2011, 2016, 2018, 2020). While Robert Morris captured three tournament titles during its time in the league (2012, 2017, 2021). Other postseason winners include RIT (2014, 2015), Syracuse (2019, 2021) and Penn State (2023, 2024, 2025).

Mercyhurst earned the league's first NCAA tournament bid in 2005, the first of 10-consecutive bids for the Lakers (2005-2014). MU reached four Frozen Fours in that span (2009, 2010, 2013, 2014) and played for the national championship in 2009. The 10-straight appearances marked the first time a team reached the women's tournament in 10 consecutive seasons.

The Lakers appeared in the 2016 and 2018 NCAA tournaments and earned the league's automatic berth in 2020 before that tournament was cancelled due to the COVID-19 shutdown. Robert Morris (2017, 2021), Syracuse (2019, 2022) and Penn State (2023, 2024, 2025) have also represented the CHA/AHA in the NCAA Tournament.

27TH SEASON WITH COACH SISTI



Mike Sisti is in his 27th season as head coach for the 2025-26 season. Sisti is still the only head coach the program has ever known. On Nov. 28, 2025 Coach Sisti secured his 600th win with a 6-1 victory over Stonehill at the NCAA Smahville Showcase. He joins Mark Johnson of Wisconsin as the only Division-I women's hockey coaches to reach 600 wins. The Lakers recently secured their 21st 20-win season and their 25th winning season.

Sisti claimed his 550th win in the CHA Semifinal game against Syracuse in the 2023-2024 season.

On December 11th, 2020 Sisti became the second Division I Women's Hockey Head Coach to reach 500 career wins and just the third women's hockey coach to reach this mark. The Lakers defeated the RIT Tigers 5-1 with Liliane Perreault scoring twice while Sarah Nelles, Megan Korzack, and Emily Pinto scored once.

Sisti has turned a small-college women's hockey program into one of Division I's premier powers. The Lakers have won 550 games, have captured 17 regular season conference titles, 16 conference championship titles, 13 NCAA tournament appearances, including 10 consecutive trips to the national tournament - an NCAA record - before the streak was halted in the 2014 season. Among other notables, Sisti recruited and coached Meghan Agosta, who became a four-time All-American while at Mercyhurst, the leading scorer in Division I women's hockey history, a three-time Olympic gold medalist for Team Canada, and hockey MVP of the 2010 Vancouver Olympic Games. Forward Vicki Bendus garnered the team's first Patty Kazmaier Award in 2010 while Agosta was a four-time finalist for the sport's highest honor.

After three years as an assistant men's coach at Canisius College in Buffalo, Sisti came to Mercyhurst in 1993 and spent his first six years as men's varsity assistant coach and then associate head coach. He was named head coach of the new women's program in March of 1999.

His efforts with the women's program have earned him numerous honors. Sisti was named Division I Coach of the Year in 2005 and USCHO.com Coach of the Year in 2007. He has been recognized as a finalist for Division I Coach of the Year on six occasions. Conference coaches have also named him coach of the year six times - five times in the CHA.

Off the ice, Sisti has developed his players into outstanding student-athletes. For 17 consecutive years, the team's cumulative grade point average has been above a 3.0. The Lakers have also been very active in the community. The team annually donates over 200 hours on various community service projects, and spends time at several local schools instructing students on life skills.

Prior to coaching, Sisti played four years of collegiate hockey at Canisius College. A four-year letterwinner, Sisti ranks among Canisius's best in several categories, including career points (163) and goals (74). He also shares the school record for most goals in a game with four and holds the single-season record for hat tricks with six. Sisti helped the Griffs to a 21-11-0 record with 13 goals and 19 assists as a freshman. He was named the team's top forward for his 33-goal, 57-point effort in 1988-89, and served as team captain for his senior season in 1989-90. A 1990 graduate of Canisius, Sisti was inducted into the Canisius Athletic Hall of Fame in 2002.

A native of Buffalo, N.Y., Sisti and wife, Nicole, reside in Erie.


