AT A GLANCE

Laker Outlook

The Lakers are 6-11-2 since Jan. 2. They recently beat No. 7 Canisius 5-2 in the first round of the AHA playoffs. The squad then began 2026 with a trip to No. 4 North Dakota where they lost 2-0 and 6-1. The Lakers then split with Army, featuring a 3-0 shutout. They then swept Niagara in a home-and-home series. They shut them out 3-0 at home and beat them 4-2 on the road. MU narrowly lost to Canisius, 4-3, before falling in game two. The team picked up another AHA point in a 2-2 tie with (RV) RIT. The Lakers came from behind to defeat Sacred Heart, 2-1, in game two of that series. The Lakers then secured two AHA points in a 3-3 tie at Air Force where they won the shootout, 3-2. Another heated affair with Niagara resulted in a series split for the two sides. The final series against RMU did not affect Mercyhurst as they were locked in at the 10 seed. Notably, Rick Gotkin was honored in his final home game with the Lakers after 38 years behind the bench. Dominik Bartecko (8G, 9A, 17 PTS), Will Schumacher (8G, 5A, 13 PTS), Jacob LeBlanc (14A, 14 PTS), and Caleb Price (4A, 52 BLKS) lead the team in goals, assists, blocks, and points.

Scouting No. 1 Bentley

The Falcons locked in the No. 1 seed and a first-round bye a few weeks before the regular season ended. They are 18-11-5 overall and 16-6-4 in conference play. The Falcons, with all the success they have had this season, actually started the season 0-3. They fell to Colorado, Denver, and UMass. When they began AHA play, they swept Canisius and Mercyhurst late in October. They then tied and beat Army and split with Alaska Anchorage. The Falcons then beat RIT and Army toward the end of November before getting blanked by New Hampshire. On Dec. 5, the Falcons lost their first AHA game to Niagara, 3-1. They began the year with an 8-3 rout of Holy Cross, swept Air Force, and lost and tied with Sacred Heart. Bentley played Princeton, beat them 4-1 in game one and then beat them 3-2 in a shootout in game two. They then split with RMU, Holy Cross, and beat Army 4-3 in OT. In mid-to-late February, the Falcons split with Sacred Heart, beat RIT 4-3, and got swept by Air Force. Bentley's powerplay percentage (.218) and goals allowed average (2.4) are the highest in the AHA. Jake Black (16G, 19A, 35 PTS), Stephen Castagna (11G, 17A, 28 PTS), Kellan Hjartarson (7G, 19A, 26 PTS), and Colton Cameron (3G, 3A, 6 PTS, 45 BLKS) lead the team in goals, assists, points, and blocks.

RYAN COUGHLIN (A)

is a senior forward from Charlotte, NC. He finished his juniors career in the NAHL with the N.J. Titans. He is a one time NAHL Robertson Cup Champion, and one time US 18U Nationals Tier I Champion.

DOMINIK BARTECKO

is a sophomore forward from Nashville, Tenn. He finished his juniors career in the NAHL with the N.J. Titans, where he set the single-season franchise record for points, goals, and assists. He received honors as an All-League and All-Division First Team Honoree and garnered votes as the league MVP. His father, Lunos, played professional hockey for 20 years, spending time in the NHL with the Atlanta Thrashers and the St. Louis Blues.

RILEY FITZGERALD

is a sophomore forward from Wilmington, Mass. He finished his juniors career in the NAHL with the N.J. Titans.

SEAN JAMES

is a junior forward from Almonte, Ont. He finished his juniors career with the Smith Falls Bears in the CCHL. He held CCHL most assist and most goal record, as well as was a two time most points holder, and CCHL MVP.

BRENDAN LAMB

is a sophomore forward from Battle Creek, Mich. He most recently played with the Madison Capitals of the USHL.

CONNOR PELC

is a junior forward from Hamburg, N.Y. He most recently played for the Sioux Falls Stampede of the (USHL).

Mercyhurst has an overall record of 29-25-8 vs. Bentley since 2003. The first matchup in in 2003-04 season took place on 1/9/04 when the Lakers swept 2-1 and 3-2. They went 4-0 against Bentley that season, knocking them out of the playoffs too. Bentley's first win was on 1/28/05 when the Falcons won 5-4. The Lakers then went on a nine-game unbeaten streak where they won seven in-a-row and then tied twice. The Falcons then won their second matchup in November of 2008, 5-2. The series was pretty even for the next 10 or so years. It was in November of 2020 where Bentley began to dominate the series. In the last 13 games, the Lakers are 1-11-1 since then. The only win in that stretch came in January of 2023 where they won 4-3 in Erie. In the postseason, Mercyhurst is 3-2 against Bentley in the AHA postseason, specifically 3-1 in quarterfinal contests. The stats back Mercyhurst, but this season has been tough for them and successful for Bentley.





ABOUT ATLANTIC HOCKEY

After 21 seasons, the Atlantic Hockey Association rebranded to Atlantic Hockey America. Atlantic Hockey has both a men's and women's league that features a total of 17 programs across 14 member institutions for the 2025-26 season.

Currently, Atlantic Hockey spans a total of six states, reaching from the Atlantic Ocean to the Rocky Mountains. The conference fields 10 men's programs (Bentley University, Canisius College, The College of Holy Cross, Mercyhurst University, Niagara University, Rochester Institute of Technology, Robert Morris University, Sacred Heart University, the United State Air Force Academy, and the United States Military Academy), and seven women's programs (Lindenwood University, Mercyhurst University, Penn State University, Rochester Institute of Technology, Robert Morris University, Delaware University and Syracuse University).

The conference is led by commissioner Michelle Morgan, who joined the AHA in April 2023. She is entering her third season at the helm of Atlantic Hockey America in 2025-26. In her first year, Morgan led the merger between the Atlantic Hockey Association and College Hockey America.

The conference's nine original members - AIC, Army, Bentley, Canisius, Connecticut, Holy Cross, Mercyhurst, Quinnipiac, and Sacred Heart - conceived the concept of a standalone ice hockey conference when it became apparent they needed an organization that represented specific hockey needs.

Together, the teams broke away from the Metro Atlantic Athletic Association (MAAC) and started anew, creating the Atlantic Hockey Association on June 30, 2003. They installed Robert M. DeGregorio, Jr., former Commissioner of Hockey East and Director of Athletics at Merrimack College, as commissioner of the new league.

In August of 2004, Quinnipiac announced that the 2004-05 season would be their last in Atlantic Hockey as they were leaving to join ECAC Hockey. Four months later, Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT) announced that their men's hockey program would be elevating to Division I status from Division III and would be joining Atlantic Hockey in 2006-07. Air Force also accepted an invitation to join Atlantic Hockey in 2006-07, bringing membership up to 10 institutions.

Membership again grew in 2010-11 to 12 schools, with Robert Morris and Niagara joining Atlantic Hockey. The AHA remained a 12-team league until the end of the 2013-14 season when UConn left for Hockey East, bringing Atlantic Hockey to 11 teams. The league would stay at 11 teams until Robert Morris University announced it was eliminating its program following the 2020-21 to set the AHA membership at 10 programs for the 2022-21 campaign.

THE GOTKIN FILES

Rick Gotkin enters his 38th season as head coach of the Mercyhurst University men's hockey team. Since coming to Erie in 1988, Gotkin has spent almost four decades instilling a winning tradition in the men's hockey program. He is the longest active tenured coach in NCAA hockey, spending his whole career with the Lakers. Gotkin, the only coach in NCAA history to take a team to the NCAA Tournament at all three levels, has guided the Lakers to nearly 600 wins, six NCAA tournament appearances and five league championships. His teams have averaged 18 wins a season and have made the postseason in 33 of the 36 years he has been at Mercyhurst.

On Feb. 6, 2026, Gotkin became just the sixth hockey coach in NCAA history to amass 1,300 games behind the bench.

He has won AHA Coach of the Year two times (2013-14 /2017-18), and was MAAC Coach of the Year in 2000-01.

In the 2022-23 season, Gotkin recorded his 1200th game behind the bench during a 7-3 win over Army on the road. This success also established Gotkin as the longest-tenured active coach in all of NCAA Hockey.

In August of 2017, Gotkin was appointed as a member of the NCAA Men's and Women's Ice Hockey Rules Committee. Where he served a four-year appointment which began on Sept. 1, 2017.

In June of 2015, Gotkin was inducted into the Erie Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame.

Gotkin coached the Lakers to the Atlantic Hockey regular-season championship in 2017-18. Mercyhurst finished the season with a 21-12-4 record and had non-conference wins over No. 17 Penn State and No. 9 Wisconsin.

In 2015-16, the Lakers had an overall record of 17-15-4 and a conference record of 15-9-4. They defeated non-conference Colgate and Ohio State in the process. The Lakers reached the AHA Quarterfinals, before falling to RIT. Gotkin recorded his 500th win during Atlantic Hockey play against Air Force on Saturday November 7. After the season end, three of Gotkin's players signed professional contracts, one being with the Washington Capitals of the NHL. In 2014-15, the Lakers won 19 games and defeated non-conference opponents Merrimack and Colgate in the process. Mercyhurst also played to a 2-2 overtime tie against Ohio State in early January at the Erie Insurance Arena. The Lakers reached the championship game of the Atlantic Hockey Conference playoffs before bowing to RIT. After the season, eight of Gotkin's players signed professional contracts while 18 were named to the Atlantic Hockey conference All-Academic Team.

During the 2012-13 season, Gotkin became the 26th coach in NCAA history, at any division, to record 450 career wins when the Lakers defeated Army in game two of the first round of the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA) playoffs. He guided the Lakers to a 19-17-5 overall record and helped Mercyhurst to the AHA title game for the first time since 2009.

During his tenure, Gotkin has produced seven All Americans, four ECAC Players of the Year, three ECAC Rookies of the Year, five MAAC First-Team selections, an AHA Player-of-the-Year, 24 AHA All-Conference selections, three AHA Rookies of the Year and one AHA Defenseman of the Year. In 2001, Gotkin was also a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award.

Gotkin has also been a featured speaker at many USA Hockey coaching clinics and symposiums. He has served on the Hobey Baker Award Committee and currently serves on four other national committees: the American Hockey Coaches Association Division I Committee, the US College Hockey Online.com National Poll Committee, the Division I East region advisory committee, and the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine College Hockey Poll.

In 1995, the varsity hockey team won the Sister Rita Panciera Award given annually to the Mercyhurst College group that "best exemplifies the values of mercy". In March of 1998, the team was honored again, this time by the Erie Achievement Center for its work with the disabled.

Gotkin is married to the former Diane Kaminski of Erie, Pa. They are the parents of two children: Lindsey Ann was born September 2, 1991, and Brandon Reed arrived April 1, 1995. Lindsey, a Mercyhurst alum and four-year member of the Laker golf team, earned her law degree at DePaul and is now an attorney in Washington, D.C., while Brandon, a former member of the Laker men's ice hockey team, is now coaching with the Youngstown Phantoms of the USHL.

HEAD COACH IN WAITING: TOM PEFFAL

Tom Peffal is in his fourth season with Lakers, and was appointed Head Coach in Waiting at the end of the 24-25 season.

Peffal served as an assistant coach at Stevenson University from 2018-2022. While serving as the assistant coach, he was also the Director of Recruiting. In this position he brought in the top recruiting class in Division III. In his four season, he helped lead the Mustangs to 58 wins.

Prior to starting with Stevenson, he was an assistant coach for the Philadelphia Rebels of the North American Hockey League. While on the Rebel Bench, he produced multiple Division I recruits. He Started his coaching career in 2015 with Neumann University.

A native of Ambler, Pennsylvania, Peffal brings a strong mix of playing and coaching experience to the role. He holds a bachelor's degree from Gwynedd Mercy University and a master's from Neumann University. On the ice, he played professionally as a right winger in the ECHL, SPHL, and FHL.

In his role as Head Coach in Waiting, he is working with Head Coach Rick Gotkin to bring the program into a new era, but continuing to instill the values and traditions Gotkin has instilled the past 38 years.

ASSISTANT COACH: KARLIS ZIRNIS


Karlis Zirnis comes to Mercyhurst from RPI where he has spent the last two seasons on staff. He brings experience on the international level to the Lakers staff, working as an assistant coach for the Latvian National Team since 2012. Zirnis was behind the bench at the 2014 Winter Olympic Games in Sochi, Russia, and most recently coached the U-20 team at the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championships.

Zirnis coached 18 AHCA Scholar All-Americans in his time at RPI and helped the team to an upset victory over Clarkson in the first round of the ECAC Tournament in 2024.

Zirnis coached 18 AHCA Scholar All-Americans in his time at RPI and helped the team to an upset victory over Clarkson in the first round of the ECAC Tournament in 2024. He got his start in coaching in 2009 with the Thunder AAA Tier 1 hockey club before moving on to coach the Nashville Junior Predators from 2014-16.

A 2003 graduate of Alabama Huntsville, Zirnis had a successful playing career with the Chargers, scoring 119 points from 1999-2003. His 46 goals and 73 assists are the second most in Charger program history in the modern Division I era. He returned to his alma mater to coach in the 2020-21 season before moving into a role as the Director of Player Development for the Amarillo Wranglers in the NAHL. Zirnis also spent time with the Latvian National Team as a player from 1995-2002 and earned a Canadian Hockey League Regular Season Championship with the Bossier Shreveport Mudbugs.

In his freetime he enjoys playing golf and being by the water.
