Caird Center for Sports and Recreation

Completed during the summer of 2010, the Caird Center for Sports and Recreation unites several keystone elements of the Colleges' athletics campaign priorities, including Boswell Field, the Froelich Gatehouse and the Elliott Varsity House expansion. The project provides broad-reaching support that directly benefits all students who participate in intramural, club sports, outdoor recreation, and other wellness programs, in addition to nearly two-thirds of HWS varsity athletes, including the football, lacrosse, squash, and tennis teams. Named in honor of the remarkable dedication and generosity of Jim '56 and Cindy Caird, the renovation project included a state-of-the-art FieldTurf surface for Boswell Field, a new grandstand and press box, lights for night games, and expanded locker rooms and sports medicine facilities in Elliott Varsity House.



Eden Football Team Room

The Eden Hobart Football Team Room is the off-the-field home of the Statesmen. It features beautifully handcrafted wood lockers, a new heating and air conditioning system, new carpeting, and a high-tech video system for breaking down film.



Raleigh-Foley-Kraus Varsity Strength Training Center

The Raleigh-Foley-Kraus Varsity Strength Training Center, is a state-of-the-art weight room serving all of the Colleges' 400 student-athletes and enhancing the sports medicine staff's rehabilitation capacity. The RFK Center is located in Bristol Gym.



Bristol Field House

The 83,000-square-foot multipurpose floor in the Robert A. Bristol '31 Field House gives the Hobart football team an outstanding indoor practice space. The facility features enough space for five tennis or basketball courts as well as a 200-meter track. Ideally located, it adjoins the Elliott Varsity House.

HEAD COACH MIKE CRAGG

HOBART STATESMEN FOOTBALL



The program's all-time wins leader, Mike Cragg begins his 18th season as head coach of the Hobart football program with a career record of 100-51 (.646). He has guided the Statesmen to all seven of their post-season appearances, including six NCAA bids between 2000 and 2011. Cragg has led Hobart to the top of the Liberty League seven times in the past 13 seasons.

Over the course of his career, Cragg has mentored 231 all-conference selections, including 15 players of the year (offensive, defensive, or special teams) and seven rookies of the year. He has also coached dozens of All-Americans, including consensus All-Americans Dave Russell '98 and Alex Bell '05. Several Statesmen have gone on to play football professionally, including Bell, who signed with the New York Giants as a free agent.

Cragg's sustained success led the SAA Board of Directors to elect him to the Hobart Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2010.

Last season, the Statesmen put together a 7-1 regular season, shared the Liberty League title with a 5-1 mark, and returned to the NCAA Playoffs. Cragg took an injury-riddled line up to seventh-ranked Wesley and came up just shy of an upset, falling 35-28.

Cragg's 2011 squad paced the conference in 27 statistical categories, including scoring offense, scoring defense, turnover margin, rushing defense, total defense and sacks by. Predictably, Hobart collected 14 all-league awards along with Defensive Player of the Year (Devin Worthington '14), Rookie of the Year

(Tyre Coleman '15) and Coaching Staff of the Year. Four more players earned a spot on the D3football.com All-East teams while cornerback Drake Woodard '12 was a D3football.com honorable mention All-American.

Off the field, 10 Statesmen earned Liberty League All-Academic honors, Jarrid Blades '12 and Nick Zapp '13 were voted to the Capital One Academic All-District team and Blades and Brendan Hatlee '12 were elected to the National Football Foundation Hampshire Honor Society.

Last season marked Hobart's first playoff appearance since 2008 when Cragg's charges posted a 9-2 record. Hobart reached the NCAA Regional Semifinals with a 33-15 win over Lycoming before falling to eventual national champion Mount Union.

Cragg, who served as the team's defensive coordinator from 1991 to 2006, directed the 2000 Statesmen into the NCAA records book. The Hobart secondary, aided by a relentless pass rush, broke the NCAA Division III record for lowest pass completion percentage allowed. Hobart opponents were successful on just 31.3 percent of their pass attempts, eclipsing the old mark, 33.5, set by Plymouth State in 1987.

In addition to the team's on-field success, Cragg's Statesmen have received a great deal of recognition for their efforts in the classroom. During his tenure, five Hobart players have been named to the CoSIDA Academic All-America teams—including offensive lineman Brian Monaco who became the first two-time first team Academic All-American in Hobart history—while dozens of Statesmen have earned Liberty League All-Academic honors.

Named the 23rd head coach of the Hobart football program in January 1995, Cragg is one of the veteran members of the Statesmen family, joining the football staff in 1986. He also served as the head coach of the tennis team for three seasons, compiling an overall record of 36-10 and three conference championships.

Cragg came to Hobart after serving as the head coach of the varsity football program at Corry High School in Corry, Pa. He led the Beavers to a third-place finish in the Erie County League in his first year, a first-ever appearance in the District X Playoffs in 1986, and was named Coach of the Year.

A 1983 graduate of Slippery Rock University with a bachelor's degree in health and

physical education, Cragg was a two-year letter-winner for the Rock at free safety and linebacker. He still owns a share of the school's single game interception record (3 vs. Edinboro, 1980). His senior season was short-circuited by a knee injury, so he got an early jump on his coaching career, assisting the Slippery Rock staff with the defensive backs.

Cragg and his wife, Holley, live in Geneva with their two children, Michael and Kristen Alexandria '13.

ASSISTANT COACHES: OFFENSE

Kevin DeWall '00 **Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line & Tight Ends**

Now in his 13th season on the Hobart sideline, Kevin DeWall is entering his 10th season as the offensive coordinator. Traditionally a program that relied on its defense, he transformed Hobart into a consistent and formidable offensive threat.

Over the past nine seasons, DeWall has directed the Statesmen offense to new heights, surpassing numerous team and individual records. His balanced attack has produced several record-setting quarterbacks, running backs, and wide receivers, along with several all-star linemen, including All-American Alex Bell '05.

DeWall's tenure includes five of the top six scoring seasons in school history, seven of the top 10 seasons of total offense, and five of the top six seasons of passing yards. He has mentored the top two Statesmen in career passing yards, the top three in career pass efficiency, three of the top four in career receiving yards, and the top five in career receiving touchdowns.

A 2008 inductee into the Waterloo Athletic Hall of Fame, DeWall coached the defensive backs in his first three seasons on staff.

While earning a bachelor's degree in biology (pre-med) and education, DeWall played free safety and aided the program's ascent toward the pinnacle of Division III. Also an attackman on Hobart's Division I lacrosse team, he helped the Statesmen to two NCAA Tournament appearances and the 2000 Patriot League title. DeWall was the 2000 Patriot League Lacrosse Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was named to the GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-District Team.



Jon Drach **Quarterbacks Coach**

Jon Drach joined the Hobart coaching staff in April 2007. The former Western Michigan University starting quarterback mentors the Statesmen signal callers.

In 2010, Drach's quarterbacks led the Liberty League in passing yards, yards per completion, yards per attempt, passing efficiency, and passing touchdowns. In his first collegiate start, Nick Strang '14 threw for 405 yards and five touchdowns and rushed for 93 yards, including the game-winning touchdown. He broke the Hobart game records for total offense yards and total offense yards per play and tied the mark for TD passes. Last season, Strang again tied the game record with five TD passes at St. John Fisher on his way to All-Liberty League honorable mention. In 2008, Drach coached first-year starter Rich Doyle '09 to a spot on the All-Liberty League second team. Doyle threw for 1,874 yards and 16 touchdowns, while rushing for 102 yards and five TDs.

A native of St. Charles, Ill., Drach was a member of the 2000 Broncos squad that won the West Division of the Mid-American Conference. A three-year starter, he enjoyed his finest year as a senior, completing a single season record 67 percent of his passes for 1,499 yards and 13 TDs. A 2004 graduate of Western Michigan with a bachelor's degree in business finance and economics, Drach earned a spot on the Dean's List six times, was a two-time MAC All-Academic Team selection, and received the Broncos' 2003 John Gill Scholar-Athlete Award.

Following graduation, Drach spent three years as a trader in the financial industry. He broke into coaching in 2006 as the offensive coordinator at West Aurora (Ill.) High School. He lives in Geneva with his wife, Janelle.



John Manley **Running Backs Coach**

John Manley enters his 13th season as running backs coach. He joined the Statesmen after 14 seasons as the head football coach at Penn Yan Academy.

In 11 of the previous 12 seasons, Manley has overseen the development of an All-Liberty League running back, including 1,000-yard rushers Doug Blakowski '07 and Ty Godinho '04. Godinho's senior season saw him gain 1,077 yards and score 13 rushing touchdowns. In 2005, Blakowski became just the third Statesman to rush for more than 1,300 yards in a season (1,364). A year later, Blakowski ran for 1,084 yards and 14 touchdowns. Manley's apprentice ranked in the top 25 in the nation in scoring in each season. Last year, Manley saw three of his backs gain All-Liberty League accolades. Steven Webb '14 earned first team honors, Bobby Dougherty '13 scored second team praise, and Dominique Ellis '15 received honorable mention.

At Penn Yan Academy, Manley guided the Mustangs to 13 Section V tournament appearances, including back-to-back championship game appearances in 1994 and 1995. The retired physical education instructor has coached the Eddie Meath All-Star Football Game three times.

Accomplished and multifaceted, Manley has coached basketball, baseball, hockey, lacrosse, track, and softball.

Manley graduated from Brockport with a bachelor's degree in physical education. He lives with his wife, Rita, in Keuka Park. They have four children.



Drake Woodard '12 **Receivers Coach**

One of the top cornerbacks in Hobart football history, Drake Woodard begins his coaching career on the other side of the ball, coaching the Statesmen receivers.

Woodard was a four-time unanimous selection to the All-Liberty League first team. In 37 career games, he recorded 145 tackles, 8.0 tackles for a loss, 30 pass break ups, 12 interceptions, six fumble recoveries, four forced fumbles, and three blocked kicks. He is tied for second in Hobart history in career pass break ups and seventh in career interceptions.

The 2011 D3football.com All-American led the Liberty League in passes defended and interception return yards. The team captain produced 31 tackles, a career-high 10 pass break up, and a team-high four interceptions in eight games. Woodard's highly decorated collegiate athletic career culminated with the 2012 Francis L. "Babe" Kraus '24 Memorial Award, presented to Hobart's most outstanding

senior athlete.

A writing and rhetoric major and education minor, Woodard is also completing a student teacher assignment this semester to complete his bachelor's degree.



ASSISTANT COACHES: DEFENSE

HOBART STATESMEN FOOTBALL



Scott Yoder '01 **Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Backs**

Scott Yoder is back for his 12th season as an assistant coach and his sixth as defensive coordinator. The 2001 Hobart graduate previously coached the defensive backs and receivers.

Last season, Yoder's defense garnered five All-Liberty League nods, including four time unanimous first-team selection Drake Woodard '12, Defensive Player of the Year Devin Worthington '14, and Rookie of the Year Tyre Coleman. Hobart's defense led the Liberty League in nine key statistical categories, including scoring defense (17.1 ppg), rushing defense (112.6 yds/g), total defense (283.1 yds/g), sacks (27), and takeaways (28).

In 2008, Yoder's defense ranked fourth in the nation and led the Liberty League in pass efficiency defense (88.52) and paced the conference in total defense (293.9 yds/g) and pass defense (147.1 yds/g). D3football.com All-Americans Justin Hager '09 and Ryan Aruck '09 headlined the seven Statesmen defenders to earn all-league honors. A year earlier, Yoder also oversaw the development of D3football.com All-American James Alexander '08.

A former wide receiver, Yoder finished his Hobart career with 108 receptions for 1,361 yards. Following the 2000 season, he earned first-team accolades from the ECAC and the Liberty League. The economics major also played Division I lacrosse, helping guide the Statesmen to the 2000 Patriot League championship and the program's 23rd NCAA tournament bid.

Yoder lives in Geneva with his wife, Alyson '03, and their sons, William and Chase.



Aaron Backhaus '00 **Linebackers Coach**

Aaron Backhaus returns for his ninth season on the Hobart sidelines as the linebackers coach.

During his eight previous seasons, 22 of his Statesmen have earned All-Liberty League recognition, including Defensive Players of the Year Tony Clemente '06 (2005), Justin Hager '09 (2008), and Devin Worthington '14 (2011).

Last season, Backhaus oversaw the development of all-conference honorees Reggie Robinson '12 and Devin Worthington '14. The trio of Robinson, Worthington, and Andrew Klindera '13 finished the season as three of the team's top four tacklers, combining for 177 stops, 23.0 tackles for a loss, 7.5 sacks, and six forced fumbles.

In 2008, Backhaus mentored Justin Hager '09 to a record-setting season. Following a junior campaign that saw him finish with a league-high 114 tackles, Hager registered 134 stops, breaking Jesse Truley's 13-year-old season standard.

A former Statesman himself, Backhaus was a four-year starter at inside linebacker. The four-time All-Liberty League pick left the gridiron with 279 career tackles and six interceptions. After earning a bachelor's degree in psychology in 2000, Backhaus went on to complete a master's degree in education at Alfred University.

In addition to his coaching duties, Backhaus is a counselor at the Geneva Middle School and coaches track and field. He and his wife, Nicole, live in Geneva with their sons, Theodore and Miles.



Marc Tapscott **Defensive Line Coach**

Geneva native Marc Tapscott joined the Hobart coaching staff in 2010. After one season as an offensive assistant coach, he worked with the defensive ends in 2011 and will coach the entire defensive line this season.

Last season, Tapscott mentored Tyre Coleman, a D3football.com All-East second team pick and the Liberty League Rookie of the Year. Coleman terrorized opposing quarterbacks, finishing second in the nation in sacks (13.0) and eighth in tackles for a loss (19.0).

Tapscott has previous coaching experience with the Geneva High School varsity, junior varsity, and modified football teams. He was on the Geneva High coaching staff when the Panthers appeared in three straight state tournaments, winning the New York Class B title in 2006.

A four-year starter on the offensive line at St. Lawrence University, Tapscott graduated in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in sociology. He earned a master's degree in special education from St. John Fisher in 2010.

Tapscott is a fourth grade teacher at St. Francis-St. Stephen School in Geneva. He has previous classroom experience in the Geneva, Gorham, and Midlakes school systems teaching elementary and special education classes. Tapscott lives in Geneva with his wife, Jackie.



Kyle O'Laughlin '11 **Outside Linebackers Coach**

Before the start of the 2012 season, Kyle O'Laughlin returned to his alma mater to coach the outside linebackers.

As a student-athlete, O'Laughlin was a four-year letterman at linebacker. He was named to the All-Liberty League team three times during his career and also captained the team in his senior year. O'Laughlin finished his career with 215 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, six pass deflections, five forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, and four interceptions. He enjoyed his most productive season as a senior, logging a career-high 81 tackles and was tied for fourth in the Liberty League in tackles per game. O'Laughlin's gridiron performances earned him the 2007 Rookie Award for Football and the 2010 Bob Toner Defensive MVP Award.

A Dean's List student, O'Laughlin earned a bachelor's degree in media and society in 2011. He lives in Syracuse and is a management trainee representative for Enterprise Rent-A-Car.

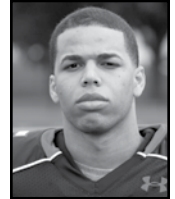

SEASON OUTLOOK

HOBART STATESMEN FOOTBALL

The 2011 season was another banner campaign for the Hobart football team. The Statesmen went 7-1 in the regular season and captured their seventh Liberty League championship.

Hobart led the conference in 15 statistical categories, including scoring offense (33.6 ppg) and scoring defense (17.1 ppg). The Statesmen cruised through their first six games, hanging 56 points on St. John Fisher, which entered the game having allowed a combined 10 points in its first two contests. The following week, Hobart pitched a 23-0 shutout of defending Liberty League champion St. Lawrence. The Statesmen defense completely dominated the Saints, limiting them to just 84 yards of total offense.

The Statesmen's lone regular season stumble came against league rival Rensselaer. The Engineers were able to climb out of a 28-7 first-half hole to slip away with a 29-28 win.

Hobart rebounded with a 24-10 win in the annual Centennial Cup game against Rochester, wrapping up a share of the conference title. The Statesmen earned their sixth NCAA Playoff berth by virtue of a 42-24 win over co-champion Union.

An injury-depleted Hobart was sent to seventh-ranked Wesley in the first round. While most pundits dismissed the Statesmen, the student-athletes showed their grit and determination, pushing the Wolverines to the brink before falling a single TD short, 35-28.

Here's a position-by-position look at the Statesmen, who enter the season ranked 22nd in the D3football.com poll:

QUARTERBACK

The Statesmen possess two proven senior quarterbacks. It's returning starter Nick Strang's job to lose, but, with Strang injured, Kelly Olney performed with the skill of a seasoned veteran in the NCAA Playoff at Wesley.

Strang completed 55.6 percent of his passes for 1,483 yards and 15 touchdowns in his first full season as the starter, earning All-Liberty League honorable mention. He tossed five TD passes at St. John Fisher, tying Hobart's single game record for the second time in his career. Strang is elusive in the pocket (sacked just eight times in '11) and was third on the team in rushing yards (334).

Olney's only career start was against the seventh-ranked Wolverines, but he made it

a memorable one. Olney threw for a Hobart postseason record 211 yards without an interception, leading the Statesmen to the brink of a major upset.

Sophomores Patrick Conlan and Kyle Bayly are waiting patiently in the wings should either falter.

RUNNING BACK

Hobart used a two-prong attack to average 196.1 rushing yards per game in 2011. Because it worked so well, senior Bobby Dougherty and junior Steven Webb will reprise their roles this year although the coaching staff is confident that either man could handle a larger role.

Webb ran to his second straight first team All-Liberty League selection after leading the team with 584 rushing yards (5.2 yds/rush) and seven touchdowns. Dougherty earned a spot on the conference second team with 458 rushing yards (4.7/rush) and seven TDs. The pair is also a threat in the passing game, combining for 22 receptions for 241 yards and a TD in 2011.

Sophomore Alex Delaney and first-years Conner Hartigan and Garrett Moon will give the Statesmen depth.

FULLBACK

Sophomore Dominique Ellis also played extensively in a platoon last season. As the only returnee from that platoon, expect him to shoulder more of the load this year. Ellis was Hobart's fourth leading rusher with 195 yards (5.2/rush) in 2011.

First-years Elliot Adler, Aaron Derby, and Christopher Holoman will compete for the second spot on the two-deep. Holoman has been the most impressive in the preseason with a strong blend of athleticism and blocking skill.

WIDE RECEIVER

The graduation of Garth Muratori (112 rec, 1,676 yds, 17 TD) will sting a bit, but the Statesmen have plenty of talented receivers waiting in the wings.

Senior Junior Woodard, who ranked in the top 10 in the league in receptions per game (8th, 3.38) and receiving yards per game (9th, 46.6), will lead the group. Senior Jay Cronze (career: 23 rec, 233 yds) and junior Yosh Karbowniczak (17 rec, 200 yds, TD) are the most experienced returnees looking to step into the open starting role.

Sophomore Elvin Souffrant (10 rec, 191 yds, TD), a potent deep threat, and classmate

Senior quarterback Nick Strang started every regular season game in 2011, completing 55.6 percent of his passes for 1,483 yards and 15 touchdowns. Troy Robinson (4 rec, 37 yds, TD) are also in the hunt for a starting role. Expect all five to be on the field in some of Hobart's spread sets.

Senior Paul Ashburn, sophomore Paul Fasano, and first-year Cooper Merrill are also competing for playing time.

TIGHT END

Hobart is very strong and deep at tight end, despite the graduation of last year's starter, Greg Clifford. Senior Brent Matazinsky and sophomore Mike Berkowitz are expected to battle for the starting nod. Matazinsky is the better run blocker while Berkowitz is the better receiver.

Senior Andrew Zdrojewski and first-years Ryan Bennett and Josh Britton will also compete for playing time.

OFFENSIVE LINE

The biggest—both literally and figuratively—question on the offensive side of the ball is who will start up front. Hobart graduated five of its top six offensive linemen from last season, including All-Liberty League honorees Kelvin Cruz, Anthony Coletta, Brendan Hatlee, and Kyle Sandy.

Senior guard Art Garvey (6-3, 270) is the

only returning starter from a unit that allowed a league-low nine sacks. He's pretty secure at left guard with his cousin, senior Tyler Garvey (6-2, 265), expected to back him up. Tyler is capable of earning a starting nod as well or he could fill a role like Jarrid Blades '11 did last season, rotating through at every position along the line.

Beyond left guard the questions begin.

Sophomore Ali Marpet (6-3, 280) has done his best to answer at least one of those questions. A strong spring coupled with an outstanding preseason have him penciled in at left tackle.

The rest of the starting o-line is still up in the air. Juniors Michael Green (6-1, 250) and Max Janoff (6-1, 300) are the leading contenders at center. Sophomore DeAndré Smith (6-3, 350) and first-year Brendan Casey (6-2, 275) are fighting for the nod at right guard and juniors Trevor Schutte (6-5, 285) and Alex Bush (6-3, 290) and first-year Emiliano Acosta (6-3, 270) have all shown promise at right tackle.

Additionally, sophomore Ben Dunham-Kapaldo (6-3, 290) and first-years Justin DiJulio (6-4, 245) and T.J. Scamurra (6-0, 280) have made a case for a spot on the two-deep.

How quickly this unit finds its starting five

and develops its chemistry will determine how much and how long the Statesmen will need to lean on their defense.

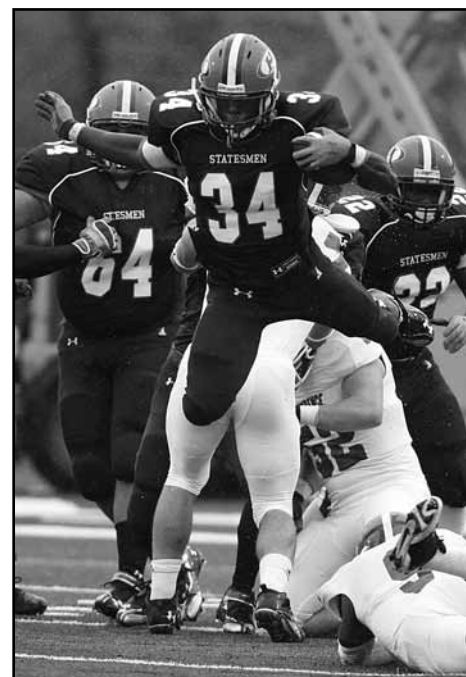
SECONDARY

Hobart's pass defense led the Liberty League during the regular season, allowing just 149.9 yards per game and only 11 passing TDs. The Statesmen limited five opponents to 120 yards passing or less, including a paltry 25 yards through the air by St. Lawrence.

The secondary will be without the services of four-time, unanimous first team All-Liberty League pick, Drake Woodard '12. A once in a generation player, Woodard was an exceptional lock down corner that made the entire Hobart pass defense better.

That said, the cupboard is hardly bare. Junior safety Jolyon Davis, junior corner Connor Garrett, junior corner Kevin Hearon, and sophomore corner Fajri Jackson give the Statesmen a quality nucleus that will be, if not as exceptional as last season, certainly strong.

Garrett made 18 tackles, two pass breakups and an interception in 2011, starting opposite Woodard. Davis played in every game, starting four, a year ago. He made 17 tackles and two pass breakups.

Jackson has the lead on the starting nod at the other corner. He posted 25 tackles and a pass breakup last season.

In eight games, including a start, Hearon recorded 21 tackles, two pass breakups, and a pair of interceptions at Rochester. He will rotate in on a regular basis and will be on the field in nickel packages.

Additional depth at the cornerback position will come from sophomore Jordan Smith, who made great strides in spring practice and arrived in preseason camp in peak condition, and first-year Justin Burke.

At safety, sophomore James Smith is a smart player with the inside track on the backup job, but first-year Leif Colberg has impressed the coaches with his athleticism and will push for playing time.

LINEBACKERS

The Statesmen are deepest at linebacker. The coaching staff feels confident that they not only have a strong starting four and quality backups for those four, but that they are strong three deep at each position.

That depth will ease the sting of losing All-Liberty League inside 'backer Reggie Robinson and his 204 career tackles.

Senior captains Andrew Klindera and Nick Zapp will lead the unit as the starting inside

linebackers. Now in his second season as a starter, Klindera is set to build on his breakthrough junior campaign that saw him finish second on the team with 51 tackles. As Robinson's backup, Zapp doesn't have as much experience, but his skill and teamwork have shown through in his work on special teams.

Junior Thomas Elder has displayed a nose for the ball in the preseason and could press Zapp for the starting job. Junior Cory Davis, sophomore Jacob Price, and first-year Treyvon Toney have all made a case for playing time and will challenge the coaches to get them on the field. Toney has been especially impressive, making his case largely on athleticism. As he gets more comfortable with Hobart's defensive scheme, he could challenge for a starting spot.

Junior outside linebacker Devin Worthington, the 2011 Liberty League Defensive Player of the Year, enjoyed another monster season, producing 45 tackles, 11.5 tackles for a loss, 6.5 sacks, four pass breakups, two forced fumbles, an interception, and league-wide heartburn for offensive coordinators. Despite his success, which includes 2011 second team All-East honors from D3football.com and preseason All-America praise from the website this year, he has remained committed to improving his game, a scary prospect for opponents.

Sophomore Nolan Toran is expected to

win the job at the other outside linebacker position. He started four of the six games he played in as a first-year but missed three games due to injury. If Toran can remain healthy, he has all-star potential.

Junior Austin DiMarco and first-year Jacob Stanley are battling for the right to back up Worthington. DiMarco had solid numbers last year, making 24 tackles and returning his first career interception 38 yards for a touchdown to seal the Statesmen's 23-0 win over St. Lawrence.

Junior Taylor Delperuto and sophomore Matt McGriff will challenge Toran for a spot in the starting lineup and will battle each other for a spot on the two deep. Delperuto had 19 tackles as a reserve last year while McGriff made three stops in limited playing time.

DEFENSIVE LINE

There's no denying Drake Woodard had the most impact on the opponent's passing game last year. A close second was Hobart's relentless pass rush.

Sophomore Tyre Coleman was nearly unblockable, posting 19 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks. Both numbers led the Liberty League, while his sack total was a record for a Hobart first-year and one off the Statesmen record for a season. Coleman ranked second in the na-

tion in sacks per game and eighth in tackles for a loss per game.

Junior Juan Breton is expected to start opposite Coleman. A converted linebacker, he's found a home at defensive end and is ready to make an impact.

Sophomore Jake Currie, first-year Charlie Ehlers, and first-year Mark Guarino-Hyde will fill out the two-deep.

At tackle, senior Nick Auriemma and sophomore Troy Johnson are the returning starters and two of the best tackles in the Liberty League. Auriemma (6-0, 275) does a great job of occupying multiple blockers, freeing up the linebackers to make the stop. Johnson (5-10, 260) enjoyed a solid rookie season and is poised for a breakthrough in 2012.

Junior Cory Einbeck and first-years Tucker Gumkowski and Lou Testani add depth to the middle of the line.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Due to injuries and fatigue, Hobart used three different punters last season, Karbowniczak (career 33.8 yds/p), Souffrant (33.3), and Webb (32.0). To keep their legs fresh, the Statesmen may return to that strategy. With a skill position player at punter rather than a pure kicker, the coaches enjoy the added flexibility to throw a fake punt at opponents.

Place kicking will be an adventure. Due to his academic load, Stephen Bruening (19-20 PAT, 3-8 FG) elected to forego his senior season leaving first-years Josh Neuss and James Hull to fight for the job. Hull has the lead coming out of camp.

Kick return duty will once again rest on the capable shoulders of Webb (career 30.1 yds/KOR) and Dougherty (20.0). Troy Robinson, Fasano, and Hartigan largely untested and are the likely backups.

Hobart has two experienced punt returners in Junior Woodard and Connor Garrett. Woodard average 9.9 yards per return in 2010, while Garrett averaged 8.8 last season. The job could also fall to Troy Robinson. The coaches are excited about his development and are looking for more ways to get him involved.

SCHEDULE

One of the biggest changes for Hobart this season is the schedule. In 2011, the Statesmen had just eight games on the slate and only three on Boswell Field at the Caird Center for Sports and Recreation.

This year, Hobart will play a full 10-game schedule and play six games on the Boz.

The Statesmen will play their first two contests at home, taking on Dickinson on Sept. 1 and Geneva College seven days later. The se-

ries with the Red Devils is even 10-10-1, while this will be the first meeting with the Golden Tornadoes.

Hobart will close out its non-conference schedule at Utica. The 7 p.m. kickoff is the Statesmen's only night game and the first meeting with the Pioneers.

Homecoming on Sept. 22 marks the start of Liberty League play. The Statesmen will welcome Merchant Marine to campus, looking to extend an eight-game winning streak against the Mariners.

Hobart heads to WPI on the final weekend of September with an unblemished 8-0 all-time mark against the Engineers.

The Statesmen will be home for its first meeting with the league's newest associate member, Springfield. The showdown with the Pride will be followed by a week off.

While every game is critical to a team's postseason hopes, Hobart's two-game stretch on Oct. 20 and Oct. 27 could be the most important in the Statesmen's quest for a seventh NCAA Playoff appearance. The Statesmen will visit Rensselaer looking to snap a two-game slide against the Engineers and then return home to face Union. The Dutchmen will have revenge on their mind after missing out on a trip to the NCAAs by virtue of a 41-24 loss to Hobart in Schenectady. RPI and Union are the only teams on this year's schedule with an all-time winning record against the Statesmen.

Hobart travels to St. Lawrence for its final road trip of the regular season. With a 23-0 whitewashing of the Saints a year ago, the Statesmen are 45-37-2 all-time against their North Country rivals.

The regular season concludes with the annual Centennial Cup game against Rochester. Hobart will enter the 105th showdown with the Yellowjackets with a 49-48-7 edge in the series.

Hobart 33, Dickinson 9

CARLISLE, Pa.—Hobart's offense produced 500 yards and the defense managed five takeaways and three stops in the red zone as the Statesmen rolled to a 33-9 season-opening victory at Dickinson.

Hobart rolling up 313 yards on the ground and 187 through the air. Defensively, 22 different Statesmen were credited with tackles led by LB Reggie Robinson and CB Kevin Hearon, who both finished with eight stops.

The season got off to an inauspicious start, when Hobart fumbled away the snap on the day's first play from scrimmage. The defense bailed out the offense with a goal line stand. Dane Wilcoxon and Troy Johnson stuffed Mike Shimkin on fourth and goal from the Hobart 1.

The Statesmen then proceeded to march 99 yards in 10 plays to produce the season's first points. Hobart got out of the shadow of the goal posts when QB Nick Strang hit WR Garth Muratori for 29 yards on the second play of the drive. The duo hooked up again for the 31-yard touchdown play.

After another bend-don't-break performance by the D that halted Dickinson on fourth and 1 from the Hobart 15, Strang hit Muratori on first down for a 26-yard gain and six plays later, Dougherty broke away for a 28 yard touchdown and a 14-0 first quarter advantage.

Early in the second quarter, CB Connor Garrett's interception set up Strang's 11-yard scoring run and a 21-0 lead that lasted until halftime.

LB Devin Worthington's pick ended the first drive of the second half and set the stage for another Hobart scoring drive. RB Steven Webb's 3-yard scamper capped a 10-play, 67-yard march.

It wasn't until early in the fourth quarter when Dickinson made its way across the goal line. The Statesmen kept the ball on the ground on its final scoring drive, rushing 11 times for 73 yards. RB Alex Furtado punched the ball into the end zone on a 1-yard plunge.

Hobart 56, St. John Fisher 20

PITTSFORD, N.Y.—The Statesmen showed no signs of rust after a two-week layoff, cruising to a 56-20 victory at St. John Fisher. Hobart scored on its first three possessions and eight of its 12 drives in the game. On the flip side, the defense forced punts on the Cardinals' first four drives.

RB Bobby Dougherty scored on a 3-yard run to cap a 13-play, 79-yard drive that opened the day's scoring. After Fisher punted away its second possession, the Statesmen needed just three plays to return to the end zone, this time on a 54-yard pass from QB Nick Strang to WR Garth Muratori for a 14-0 lead.

The Statesmen went up 21-0 early in the second quarter, when WR Junior Woodard got behind his defender on a 12-yard scoring pass from Strang.

After the team's traded punts, the Cardinals finally got on the board with a 35-yard pass from Ryan Kramer to Ryan Francis with 6:44 left in the first half.

Hobart countered with a 13-play, 59-yard march that Strang finished off with a 13-yard floater into the corner of the end zone for Muratori 39 seconds before the half.

The Statesmen kept their foot on the gas in the third quarter, stretching their lead to 42-7 on Strang TD passes to RB Steven Webb (14 yards) and Muratori (27 yards).

Ryan Schmidt's rushing touchdown closed out the third quarter scoring, but Hobart squashed any hope of a comeback with rushing TDs by FB Juan O'Farrill and RB Alex Furtado to build a 56-14 lead with 8:40 left in the game.

The Statesmen lead the all-time series with St. John Fisher 11-6, snapping a four-game losing streak with more points against the Cardinal defense than in the previous four meetings combined.

Hobart 23, St. Lawrence 0

GENEVA—Hobart remained unbeaten with a dominating defensive performance in a 23-0 Liberty League win over defending conference champion St. Lawrence. The Statesmen forced four turnovers and limited the Saints to just 84 yards of total offense.

DE Tyre Coleman led the charge with 2.5 sacks that wiped out 21 rushing yards. SCHENECTADY, N.Y.—Hobart registered a season-high eight sacks and rode a 20-point second quarter to a 41-24 Liberty League victory. LB Devin Worthington led the charge with 10 tackles, including 3.5 sacks.

The Wolverines countered with a 60-yard drive capped by McSweeney's fifth TD pass of the day. Wesley led 35-21 with 47 seconds left in the third quarter.

Hobart's finally scoring drive began when the Wolverines fumbled a punt return and the Statesmen recovered. Wesley was also hit with a roughing the kicker penalty that moved the ball half the distance to the goal line. Webb scored on a 1-yard run to make it 35-28 with eight seconds left in the third. Twice in the final quarter the Statesmen got inside the Wesley 10-yard line, but both times came up empty.

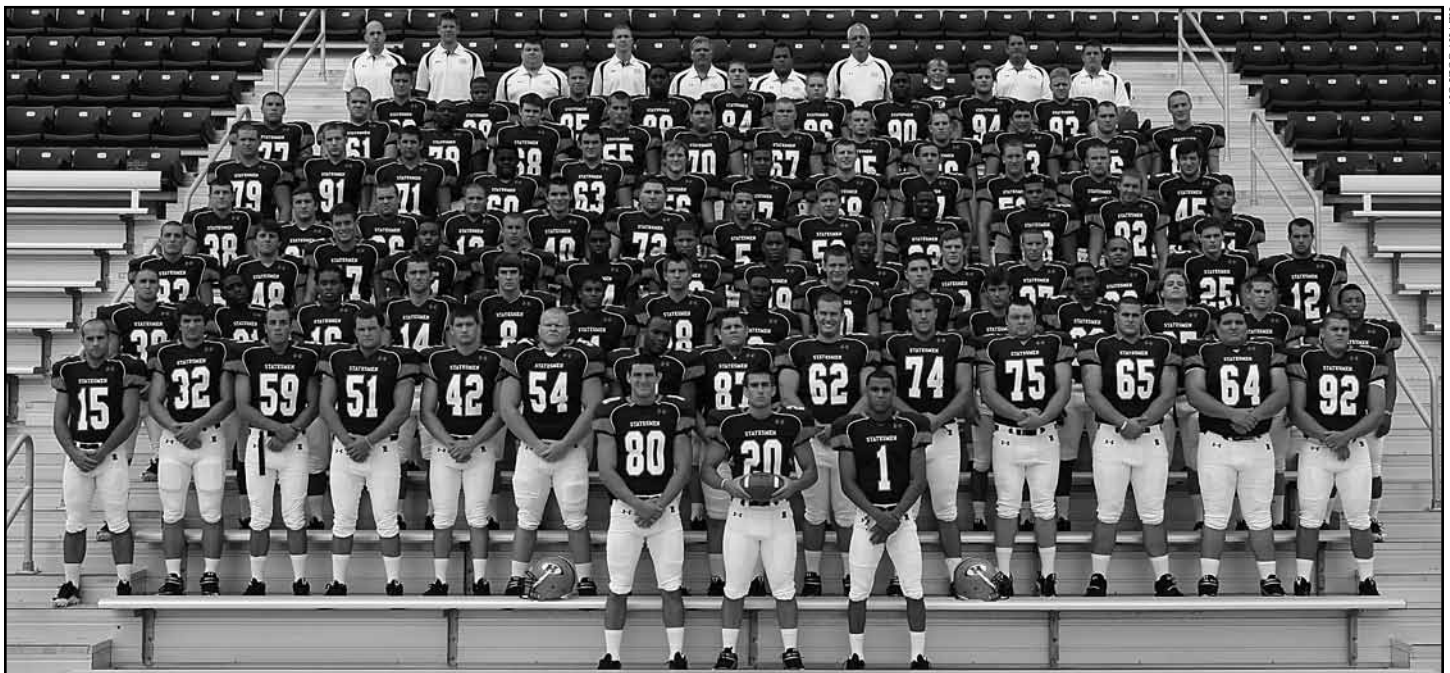

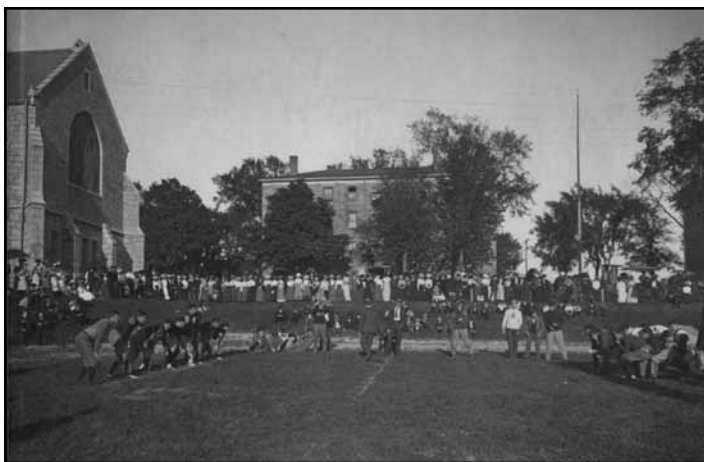

THE STATESMEN NICKNAME

Sports have been played at the College since the 1860s and for the first 70-plus years Hobart went without a moniker. Now Hobart College is blessed with an unusual and unique nickname, "The Statesmen."

The origin of Hobart's nickname came innocently enough. The football team was playing the opening game of the 1936 football season on Sept. 26, at Amherst College. The following day, *The New York Times* published a story describing the scoreless tie that occurred between the two teams. The article began:

"In the Pratt Field opener today, Hobart and Amherst battled to a scoreless tie before a crowd of 3,000. The defensive play of both teams was superb. Hobart recorded eight first downs to Amherst's nine."

"The statesmen from Geneva received a lucky break in the first period when Wanzo fumbled and Benjamin recovered on Amherst's 40-yard line."

The author of the story referred to Hobart as the statesmen one final time, concluding the story with:

"Snowball and Pagnotta stood out for Amherst, while Bowling and Wright excelled for the statesmen."

And with those two references, Hobart College had a nickname.

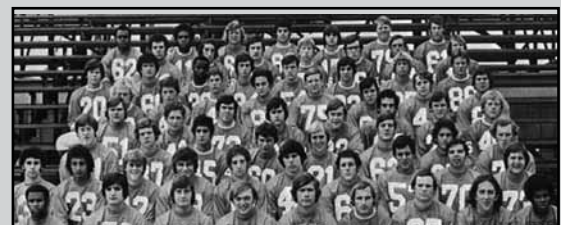

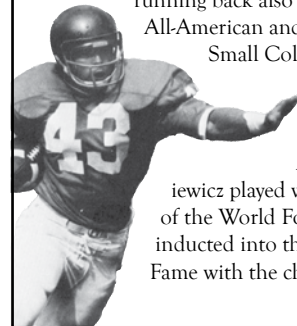

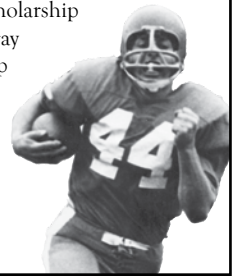

Rich Kowalski '76 was the second player in NCAA history to rush for 1,000 yards in four consecutive seasons. His career total of 4,632 yards, was an NCAA Division III record until 1985, and still stands as the Hobart standard, along with his career marks for points (308), carries (907), and total offense (4,760). The team MVP for three straight seasons, Kowalski won the Vincent Welch Trophy for scholarship and leadership in 1973, the Murray Bartlett Trophy for sportsmanship in 1975, and the Statesmen Trophy in 1976. He served as captain of the football team as a senior. Kowalski was inducted into the Hobart Athletic Hall of Fame in 1987.

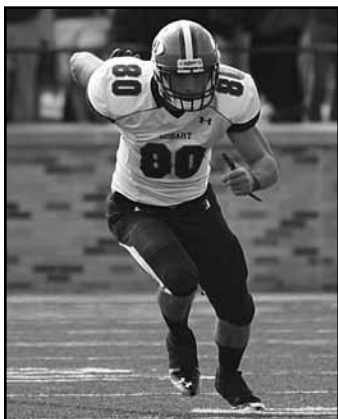

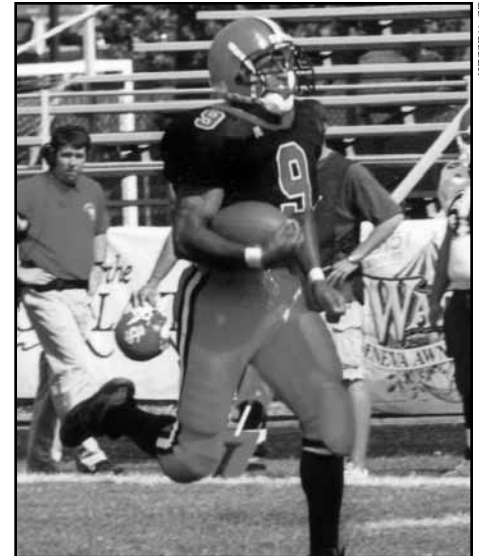

He has served as a board member of the National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities and The Partnership for Public Service. Locally, he serves on the board for Jobs for Geneva, and the advisory councils of the Happiness House Foundation, Ontario ARC, and the Geneva Community Center.

He holds a bachelor's degree from Harvard University and a law degree from Georgetown University, and is the recipient of 12 honorary degrees. President Gearan resides on campus with his wife, Mary Herlihy Gearan, and their two daughters, Madeleine and Kathleen.

Vice President of Student Affairs, Hobart and William Smith Colleges

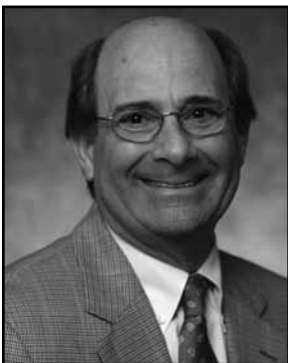
Robb Flowers joined Hobart and William Smith Colleges in 2004, and was promoted to vice president of student affairs in 2007. He had previously served as associate dean of students.

Director of Athletics, Hobart College

A 1968 graduate of Hobart, Mike Hanna became the College's athletics director in 1981. He has piloted the athletics program to new heights through unprecedented championships in lacrosse, to today's department-wide success.

In an effort to enhance Hobart student-athletes' leadership skills both on and off the field, Hanna started the Napier Leadership Seminar. Begun in 1996-97, participants meet throughout the year to discuss leadership issues and to learn from featured speakers such as University of Florida Director of Athletics Jeremy Foley '74 and New York Giants Vice President for Marketing Rusty Hawley '79.

During Hanna's tenure, he has overseen a wide range of facility enhancements, including the building or remodeling of the Bristol Field House, the Smith Squash Center, McCooley Field, Cozzens Field, the Hockey Varsity House, the RFK Varsity Strength Training Center, the Martin Athletic Director's Suite, and the Caird Center for Sports and Recreation, as well as remodeled team rooms for basketball, football, lacrosse, soccer, squash, and tennis.

An active member of the community, Hanna has served in a variety of civic positions. He continues to co-chair the Geneva Rotary Club's Student Loan Program and is on the Board of Lakeview Mental Health Services.

Hanna has been involved in college athletics, including stops at Johns Hopkins, Navy, and Princeton, since his discharge from the U.S. Army. He was a paratrooper and an officer in military intelligence, including a tour as an advisor in South Vietnam.

As a quarterback, Hanna broke all of Hobart's season and career passing records. He co-captained both the football and lacrosse teams and earned the Francis L. "Babe" Kraus Award as Hobart's Athlete of the Year during his senior year.

Hanna resides in Geneva with his wife, Mary Anne, who recently retired as second grade teacher at Geneva's West Street Elementary School.

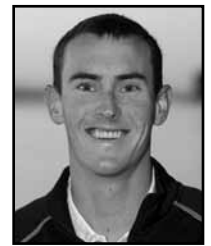
