The Indiana State women's basketball team continues its three-game homestand on Sunday, Nov. 29, playing host to Central Michigan. Tipoff is scheduled for 2:05 p.m. (ET) at Hulman Center (10,200).

Live stats are available at GoSycamores.com, while the game will be broadcast on ESPN Radio 1130/1300 AM with Brent Holl calling the action. Live video is also available at GoSycamores.com.

ISU has opened the 2009-10 season with a 4-0 record, sparked by a 77-73 road victory at Kansas State on Nov. 14. The Sycamores then posted wins at Furman (62-47) and USC Upstate (80-72) on Nov. 19 and 21, respectively, and most recently made their home debut with a 72-28 win over Southeast Missouri State on Nov. 24.

Senior guard Kelsey Luna led the way against the Redhawks on Tuesday with 15 points, while sophomore center Shannon Thomas had 13 points and eight rebounds. Sophomore guard Brittany Schoen also made her way into double-digit scoring with 10 points.

Scouting the Competition: Central Michigan Chippewas

Central Michigan (0-4) was picked to finish fourth in the Mid-American Conference's 2009-10 preseason coaches' poll released last month after posting an overall record of 18-14 in 2008-09. CMU opened its season with an 86-76 loss at No. 17 DePaul in Chicago and most recently fell to Georgetown, 94-69 on Nov. 25.

CMU is led by junior guard Shonda Long, who averages 15.3 points per game and senior guard Britni Houghton with 14.8 points per contest. The Chippewas' leading rebounder is junior forward Kaihla Szunko, who has 11.8 boards per game this season.

Houghton was named to the 2009-10 Preseason All-MAC Team and is only the second Chippewa in program history to score 500-plus points in one season. She finished with 533 as a junior and also earned second-team all-conference accolades.

Head coach Sue Guevara is in her third season at the helm of the program and has a career record of 147-123. She previously served as head coach at Michigan from 1996 to 2003.

Luna Eclipses 1,000 Career Points Mark

Against Kansas State on Nov. 14, Kelsey Luna reached the coveted 1,000 career points mark in the first game of her senior year. She is the 22nd Sycamore in program to accomplish the feat, with the second-most recent ISU player to reach 1,000 being Laura Rudolphi in 2007-08.

On Tuesday, Luna contributed 15 points in the Sycamores' 72-27 win over Southeast Missouri State. Over the last three-plus seasons, she has totaled 1,084 career points.

Luna currently leads Indiana State in points (102), free throw percentage (.962, 25-26), assists (13) and steals (14).

Luna Earns Second Straight MVC Player of the Week Award

Kelsey Luna has been named MVC Player of the Week for the second straight week, the league office announced on Nov. 23. Luna's combined 50-point performance over two games at Furman and USC Upstate garnered her the weekly conference honor for the second time this season and third time in her career.

The senior was previously named player of the week on Nov. 15 after a career-best 37-point game at Kansas State.

Luna Leads the League

Kelsey Luna leads the Missouri Valley Conference for the third straight week in scoring average (25.5), just ahead of Missouri State's Casey Garrison (22.3). She also tops the charts in steals (3.5) and is second in 3-pointers made with 3.3 per game. Additionally, Luna is third in field goal percentage (.582) and free throw percentage (.962) with a near-perfect 25-for-26 performance at the charity stripe.

Mattox, Thomas Hit Career Highs in South Carolina

Sophomores Deja Mattox and Shannon Thomas both hit multiple career highs in ISU's two-game swing through South Carolina last week. Mattox had a career-best 14 points, highlighted by a three-trey performance, against Furman on Nov. 19.

Thomas, meanwhile, was solid at USC Upstate with her second double-double as a Sycamore. The center had 19 points and 13 rebounds, as well as six blocks -- and all three categories were career highs.

Wiedie Tops ISU Record for Career Coaching Wins

Head coach Jim Wiedie, who is in his 10th season at the helm of the Sycamore program, became Indiana State's winningest women's basketball coach in school history with the Sycamores' win at Furman on Nov. 19. After a victory against SEMO, the skipper boasts a record of 159-108 (.596) over the last nine years, which is just ahead of Edith Godleski's career record of 156-116 (.575), amassed from 1971-82.

Welcome to the Show

Three Indiana State newcomers -- freshmen Moriah Hodge and Taylor Whitley and sophomore Chelsea Buher -- made their Sycamore debuts against Kansas State on Nov. 14. Hodge finished with six rebounds, a block and a steal, while Whitley totaled three steals and six points, all from the free throw line. Over the first four games, Whitley has averaged nearly six points per game, and Hodge has three rebounds per contest.

Buher, who sat out the 2008-09 season after transferring from the University of Illinois, hit a free throw and dished out an assist against the Wildcats.

Freshman Krista Smith also saw action in the Furman game on Nov. 19, hitting one free throw in the 62-47 win. She added three points and a rebound in seven minutes against SEMO.

Thomas Leads ISU Defense

Sophomore Shannon Thomas finished her freshman campaign with 32 total blocks and an average of 5.4 rebounds per game. Thomas has been a key defensive cog for ISU over the last four contests, averaging 8.8 boards and 3.5 blocks, as well as 12.5 points per game in 113 total minutes of work.

Balanced Scoring Attack

Though Kelsey Luna had an outstanding 37-point performance to lead the Sycamores in their season opener, ISU shared scoring duties among six different players. Kelsie Cooley (12) and Deja Mattox (11) both reached double digits, while Shannon Thomas chipped in seven points of her own. In addition, ISU had 10 off the bench; Chelsea Buher added four, and Taylor Whitley had six points off free throws alone.

Against Furman, nine student-athletes put up points for ISU, led by Luna's 17, as well as 14 from Mattox and 11 from Thomas. The same trio all scored in double figures to lead the Sycamores at USC Upstate, with Luna finishing at 33, Thomas with 19 and Mattox with 12. Senior Laurence Rivest also had her first points of the season off a pair of free throws at Upstate.

In Indiana State's home debut, 11 of 13 Sycamores contributed offensively, led by three in double figures -- Luna (15), Thomas (13) and Schoen (10).

Pounding the Paint

Indiana State defeated Kansas State by a score of 77-73, thanks in part to a strong effort in the post by the Sycamores. ISU scored 32 of its 77 points in the paint against the Wildcats. In addition, ISU had 37 boards, with Shannon Thomas leading the way with seven.

The Nov. 21 game at USC Upstate was another battle, with the Sycamores outscoring the Spartans 32-28 in the paint. Chelsea McMillan was Upstate's main threat inside, finishing with 20 points, but ISU's Shannon Thomas and Kelsie Cooley put up an aggressive post effort with 13 and eight rebounds, respectively. Thomas also had six blocks to her credit.

Against SEMO, ISU outscored the Redhawks 28-6 in the paint.

Sycamore Schedule Features Six Postseason Teams

ISU's schedule for the 2009-10 season will serve as a challenge for the Sycamores in preparation for postseason competition in March. The slate includes games with six postseason-qualifying teams from last season -- Kansas State (NCAA), Evansville (NCAA), Creighton (NIT), Illinois State (NIT), Butler (NIT) and SMU (NIT).

KSU played in first- and second-round NCAA action before falling to Vanderbilt, 74-61. Evansville's NCAA run ended with a first-round loss to Texas A&M, 80-45.

Luna Selected to Preseason All-MVC Team

Kelsey Luna was named to the Preseason All-Missouri Valley Conference team, the league office announced in October. Luna was previously honored as first-team All-MVC in 2009 despite missing the eight of games of her junior season due to an ACL tear. She is joined on the preseason squad by Casey Garrison (Missouri State), Maggie Krick (Illinois State), Megan Neuvirth (Creighton) and Jordann Plummer (Drake).

ISU Picked Fifth in Preseason MVC Poll

Indiana State was selected to finish fifth in the MVC's 2009-10 preseason poll, the conference office announced prior to MVC Media Day in October. The Sycamores earned 250 points for fifth place, sitting behind preseason favorite Creighton (393), Illinois State (340), Drake (296) and Northern Iowa (253). Bradley (214) came in at sixth, followed by Missouri State (188), Evansville (108), Wichita State (97) and Southern Illinois (61). Preseason standings are chosen in a survey of league coaches, sports information directors and media members.

Luna Named Candidate for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award

Kelsey Luna is one of 60 men's and women's basketball student-athletes tabbed as candidates for the 2009-10 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, it was announced Nov. 4.

To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - classroom, character, community and competition.

Luna is one of four players in the 2009-10 candidate class who are CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans, as she was a second-team honoree as a junior. She is also one of just three student-athletes on the list with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average during her collegiate academic career.

An acronym for "Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School," the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

The two lists of 30 candidates will be narrowed to 10 finalists each midway through the regular season. Those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot, which will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans. One finalist will be selected, best exemplifying excellence in the four Cs of classroom, character, community and competition.

ISU Has Young, Experienced Sophomores in 2009-10

Despite having a roster with just three seniors and one junior, Indiana State returns considerable experience for the 2009-10 season. After suffering a setback with four ACL injuries last year -- including all-conference pick Kelsey Luna -- the Sycamores were forced to utilize all of their underclassmen in considerable playing roles. Three then-freshmen -- Brittany Schoen, Shannon Thomas and Deja Mattox -- all averaged over 20 minutes per game in their inaugural season and have since resumed a starting role for ISU in 2009-10.

Thomas totaled 161 rebounds (5.4 per game) as a freshman and ranks behind only senior Kelsey Luna (255) and junior Kelsie Cooley (187) among active career leaders in that category. In addition, Thomas is the Sycamores' active career leader in blocks with 32.

Schoen, who averaged nearly 25 minutes per game last season, capped her first-year campaign with a season-best performance against Bradley at the Missouri Valley Conference tournament. She put up 16 points against the Braves and finished the year with 20 steals, good for third-most on the team.

Mattox had an outstanding first half of the season before tearing her ACL on Jan. 22 against Southern Illinois. Before the injury, she averaged almost 27 minutes per game, as well as 8.4 points and 4.1 rebounds per contest.

Head coach Jim Wiedie announced on Nov. 11 that four student-athletes have signed National Letters of Intent for the 2010-10 season: Nikki Gunning, Anna Munn, Sadie Oyer, and Illyssa Vivo.

"We've addressed every position, and with their talent, athleticism and versatility as a class, they're going to complement the group we already have very well. With that outstanding combination, I believe that in the next few years, we can field one of the best teams we've ever had at Indiana State."

Head coach Jim Wiedie enters his 10th season at the helm of the Sycamore program and in the past decade has taken it to unprecedented success. With a career record of 159-108, Wiedie is the winningest coach in Indiana State women's basketball history.

The veteran skipper is just the second ISU coach to win at least 100 games, and is one of just two active Missouri Valley Conference coaches with at least 100 career coaching victories. In nine seasons, his squads have made three postseason Women's National Invitation Tournament appearances.

At ISU, Wiedie has also guided 14 student-athletes to a total of 21 All-MVC first- or second-team awards and honorable mention accolades.

In 2008-09, the Sycamores finished fifth in the league with a 10-8 mark and compiled an overall record of 14-16, despite the challenge of losing four players to injury. Kelsey Luna highlighted ISU's performance by being named to the All-MVC First Team.

Academic Excellence

Four of Wiedie's student-athletes -- Kourtney Mennen, Melanie Boeglin, Laura Rudolphi and Kelsey Luna -- have been named Prairie Farms MVC Scholar-Athlete of the Year. The trio of Boeglin, Rudolphi and Luna has also been honored as CoSIDA Academic All-Americans. Rudolphi was a third-team selection in 2007 and a first-teamer in 2008, while Boeglin was placed on the first team in 2006. Luna was the most recent player tabbed by CoSIDA with second-team recognition in 2009.

As a team, Indiana State has won the WBCA Academic Excellence Award three times in the past seven seasons,

including first-place finishes in 2003, 2005 and 2009.

Conference and National Prominence

The Sycamores have compiled a 135-88 overall record the past six seasons with a pair of MVC regular-season championships and three WNIT berths. During the MVC Championship season of 2002-03, the Sycamores posted an NCAA-leading average of 80 points per game.

Indiana State earned its first victory over a nationally-ranked opponent when it downed No. 17 Vanderbilt on Nov. 14, 2007 at Hulman Center by a score of 77-72 in overtime.

In addition, the Sycamores have reached the finals of the State Farm MVC Tournament three times in the last seven seasons. Indiana State made back-to-back finals appearances in 2004-05 and 2005-06, falling only to Illinois State, 72-70, and Missouri State, 64-55, respectively.

Wiedie earned his first MVC Coach of the Year honors in 2002-03 after leading the predicted seventh-place Sycamores to a first-place league finish by the season's end.

2006: A Season to Remember

The 2005-06 season was unquestionably the greatest team performance in ISU women's basketball history and the finest of Wiedie's career. Under his direction, the Sycamores recorded a school-record 27 victories and dominated the MVC scene with a 16-2 record for the program's first outright MVC crown. For his efforts, Wiedie was named the Rawlings MVC Coach of the Year for the second time in his career.

That season, Boeglin became the first Sycamore to win the Jackie Stiles MVC Most Valuable Player Award. She was also a first-team all-conference selection, along with teammate Stephanie Lisch, who earned second-team honors. Boeglin garnered four separate All-America nods, including a third-team selection by *Full Court Press* and honorable mention accolades by the Associated Press, Kodak/WBCA and The Sports Network.

Success at Hulman Center

Over Wiedie's career, Indiana State's Hulman Center has become a true home court advantage for the Sycamores against opposing teams. In the last nine seasons, ISU is 88-29 when playing on its home court. The Sycamores were 9-4 last season inside the friendly confines

of Hulman Center.

ISU has enjoyed a steady rise in season attendance average over the last four seasons, with 4,100 fans per game at Hulman Center in 2008-09 to rank 26th nationally. A sellout crowd of 10,200 came for the Sycamores' contest with Illinois State on Jan. 10—the second capacity crowd in program history. In 2007-08, Indiana State averaged 3,900 fans per game with victories over Vanderbilt and league co-champions Drake and Evansville, improving on the 2006-07 mark of 3,815.

ISU drew its original school record of 10,200 fans to its MVC clash against league co-champion Drake on Feb. 2, 2008, as the Sycamores were victorious, 54-46.

Wiedie's Prior Coaching Experience

Wiedie began at Indiana State as an assistant coach in 1997 and served in that capacity until 2000, when he took over as interim head coach six games into the season. Prior to coming to Terre Haute, Wiedie served as an assistant coach at Northern Kentucky for five seasons.

Before his stint at NKU, Wiedie spent one year at Walsh College (Ohio) as an assistant coach and was also an assistant at Akron Springfield High School for six seasons.

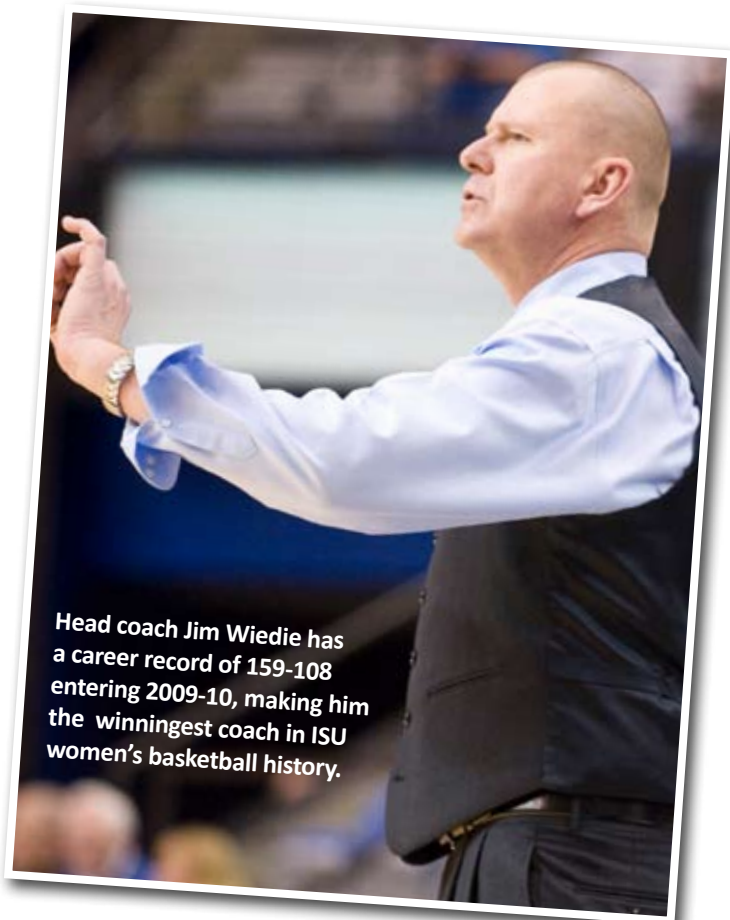
