All 10 MVFC head coaches are available on the league's weekly coaches' teleconference on Tuesday's during the regular season. The call begins at 11:00 a.m., which begins with Coach Sanford at the top of the program. Media members may call 877-393-4731 to join the teleconference.

Postgame Policies

Ace Hunt will coordinate all postgame interviews for the Sycamores, as the locker room is closed to media. On the road, Coach Sanford and selected players will be made available after a brief cooling off period in an area outside the locker room or a space designated by the host school.

QUICK HITS

- One week after squaring off against the four-time national champions North Dakota State, No. 21/23 Indiana State will hit the road to take on 2014 national runners-up, No. 3 Illinois State, this Saturday at Hancock Stadium. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. ET, and fans will be able to watch live online on ESPN3 and on TV on Comcast SportsNet Chicago.
- Indiana State is ranked in the top-25 for a school-record 19th straight week. The Sycamores rank No. 21 in the STATS FCS Top-25 and No. 23 in the FCS Coaches Poll. ISU is one of seven Valley teams ranked this week, and one of six that have been ranked each week this season.
- The remainder of ISU's schedule are currently ranked in the top-25: No. 3 Illinois State (Oct. 31), No. 18/21 Northern Iowa (Nov. 7), No. 23 Western Illinois (Nov. 14) and No. 24/25 Youngstown State (Nov. 21).
- The Sycamores are 58-139 (.294) all-time in MVFC play (dating back to ISU's first Valley season in 1986).
- Indiana State is 15-84 all-time against top-25 schools, which includes an 11-64 mark against ranked MVFC teams. However, ISU is coming off a season in which it went 5-4 against ranked schools in 2014.
- Indiana State nearly upset Illinois State in Terre Haute last year, falling 20-18 in a tight match that included the first career start of QB **Matt Adam**, then a freshman, who was on in relief of the injured **Mike Perish**.
- The Sycamores recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass against North Dakota State on Oct. 24, marking the fifth game out of seven that ISU has recorded multiple turnovers. The ISU defense has only gone one game this year without a turnover (at South Dakota State, Oct. 10).
- NDSU QB Easton Stick is only the second 100-yard rusher the Indiana State defense has allowed all year.
- ISU's two offensive touchdowns against NDSU on Oct. 24 was only the second time the Sycamores have ever scored twice on the Bison -- the first since the 2011 season.
- ISU has had three tacklers in double-digits in each of the last two games vs. Southern Illinois and NDSU.
- ISU's win vs. Southern Illinois on Oct. 17 marks the first time the Sycamores have beat the Salukis in consecutive seasons since 2001 (W, 20-14) and 2002 (W, 21-14).
- ISU set a season-high for total offense (561) and rushing offense (329) against the Salukis on Oct. 17.
- With the 56 points scored at MSU and the 52 scored against Butler on Sept. 5, Indiana State has now scored 50+ in two games in the same season for the first time since 2010.
- ISU's eight touchdowns against the Bears on Oct. 3 are the most by any Sycamore team since 2010.
- Six of 10 schools in the MVFC hold a top-50 scoring offense nationally: Southern Illinois (41.1 PPG, 9th), Illinois State (36.1, 17th), North Dakota State (31.1, 35th), Indiana State (30.1, 40th), South Dakota State (29.4, 43rd) and Youngstown State (29.3, 45th).
- Seven of 10 schools in the MVFC also hold a top-50 rushing offense: Southern Illinois (222.7 YPG, 17th), Illinois State (205.7, 23rd), Indiana State (196.3, 26th), North Dakota State (194.3, 27th), South Dakota (190.4, 30th), Youngstown State (187.3, 32nd), and Northern Iowa (184.4, 37th).
- **Matt Adam** ranks in the national top-50 in: passing touchdowns (18th, 14), points responsible for (20th, 104), points responsible for per game (22nd, 15.1/game), total offense (35th, 245.1 YPG), passing efficiency (42nd, 129.7), completions per game (47th, 16.43) and passing yards (49th, 1,349).
- **Matt Adam** has not thrown an interception since Oct. 10, and has thrown a TD pass in all eight career starts.
- Senior WR **Gary Owens** caught three TD passes against Southern Illinois, tying the single-game school record, as well as the single-season record with eight total TD catches in 2015. Owens is also on pace to break ISU's all-time career record of 15; Owens has 13 TD catches and 1,288 yards in less than two seasons at Indiana State.
- Junior WR **Robert Tonyan Jr.** broke the career 1,000-yard mark vs. NDSU on Oct. 24, joining Gary Owens as the second active Sycamore to break 1,000 this season.
- This marks the 111th season of football at Indiana State, dating back to 1896. The University did not field teams from 1899 to 1900, 1908 or from 1910 to 1919. ISU owns an all-time record of 379-507-23 and is competing for the 30th consecutive season as a member of the Missouri Valley Football Conference.

SCOUTING THE REDBIRDS

No. 3 Illinois State currently stands at 6-1 overall and undefeated in the MVFC at 4-0, with its only loss coming at current FBS No. 10 Iowa in the season opener. The Redbirds are coming off a magical season in 2014 that ended with a thrilling but heartbreaking last-second loss to conference rival North Dakota State in the national championship game.

The Redbirds return two extremely important figures from that team in QB Tre Roberson and RB Marshaun Coprich. The duo combined for a preposterous 6,524 yards and 68 touchdowns in 2014, and both are currently having great seasons again this year. Entering this week, they combine for 2,516 yards of total offense and 27 total touchdowns

INDIANA STATE NOTES

#21/23 INDIANA STATE

For a school-record 19th-straight week, Indiana State is ranked in the national top-25 -- No. 21 in the STATS FCS Top-25 and No. 23 in the FCS Coaches Poll. The Sycamores are one of seven Missouri Valley Football Conference schools ranked in both top-25 polls, coming off a season that saw all five Valley playoff teams win in the first round and saw No. 6/7 North Dakota State and No. 3 Illinois State meet up in the national title game.

HEAD COACH MIKE SANFORD

Indiana State head coach **Mike Sanford** (Southern California, 1978) is 29-63 (.315) overall in his eighth season as a head coach and is 13-20 (.394) in his third season with Indiana State. He is 6-14 all-time in MVFC games, including a 3-7 mark at home and an 3-7 mark on the road. During his career, he is 21-25 in all home games, 8-38 on the road and 9-8 in games decided by three points or less. With the Trees, Sanford is 1-0 in overtime games and 0-1 in shutouts. Saturday's game is Sanford's 34th as the Indiana State head coach and his 94th as a collegiate head coach.

 - ISU's two offensive touchdowns against NDSU on Oct. 24 was only the second time the Sycamores have ever scored twice on the Bison defense -- the first time since the 2011 season.

 - Against North Dakota State, **Matt Adam** recorded the longest run of his career thus far: an 81-yard TD in the third quarter to tie the game -- the longest offensive play for ISU this season.
 - QB **Matt Adam** has thrown at least one touchdown pass in all eight career starts -- seven starts this season, one start vs. Illinois State in 2014.
 - Senior WR **Gary Owens** caught three TD passes against Southern Illinois, tying the single-game school record, as well as the single-season record with eight total TD catches in 2015. Owens is also on pace to break ISU's all-time career record of 15; Owens has 13 TD catches and 1,288 yards in less than two seasons at Indiana State.
 - **Gary Owens'** 128-yard, 3 TD performance against the Salukis is his fifth-career 100-yard game -- his second this season.
 - **Gary Owens** has 10 total TDs this season: eight receiving, one rushing and one passing. He ranks 39th nationally in scoring, seventh nationally in receiving touchdowns.
 - **Gary Owens** did not have a reception against NDSU on Oct. 24 -- the first time that has happened since Nov. 22, 2014 (at Western Illinois).
 - Junior WR **Robert Tonyan Jr.** broke the career 1,000-yard mark vs. NDSU on Oct. 24, joining Gary Owens as the second active Sycamore to break 1,000 this season.
 - ISU set a season-high for total offense (561) and rushing offense (329) against the Salukis on Oct. 17.
 - The Sycamores had nine plays of at least 20 yards against the Salukis, which ties a season-high recorded at Missouri State on Oct. 3. Of those plays, six were for 30 yards or more and four were for 40 yards or more.
 - RB **LeMonte Booker** recorded his third-career 100-yard rushing game against the Salukis with 113 yards on 25 carries -- his second this season (137, vs. Butler).
 - **Matt Adam** and **LeMonte Booker's** 100-yard games against SIU makes them the first ISU duo to rush for 100 yards in the same game since 2010 (**Shakir Bell** and **Darrius Gates**, vs. Quincy).
 - WR **Robert Tonyan Jr.** threw a 42-yard pass to Gary Owens against the Salukis. Tonyan is a former Sycamore QB before transitioning to WR in 2014.
 - **Robert Tonyan Jr.** owns Matt Adam's longest pass of the year, a 57-yard reception against Southeast Missouri.



ADAM TAKING CHARGE

Sophomore QB **Matt Adam** had his lowest career passing outing against a stiff NDSU pass defense on Oct. 24, only throwing for 86 yards against the Bison. However, Adam did continue his streak of games played with a touchdown pass (8 games), and was also ISU's leading rusher on the day thanks to the most exciting play of the game for either team. On ISU's second play of the second half, Adam broke free for an 81-yard rushing touchdown off a read-option to tie the game – a season-long for the Sycamore offense. Adam is now Indiana State's leading rusher this season at 367 yards and three touchdowns, but has lost nearly 200 yards from his season gain total of 559. Adam ranks 35th nationally and third in the conference in total offense at 245.1 yards per game (192.7 passing, 52.4 rushing).

SECOND-HALF HERO

Sophomore starting quarterback **Matt Adam** has had a strong start to his first season as the main man under center for the Sycamores, and much of that has to do with his ability to regain composure and play in the second half. On the year, Adam is 115-of-204 for 1,349 yards, 14 TDs and 5 INTs. Of that, Adam is 59-of-105 for 768 yards, 9 TDs and 3 INTs in the second half.

TWO ACTIVE 1,000-YARD RECEIVERS

Junior WR **Robert Tonyan Jr.** was ISU's leading receiver against the Bison on Oct. 24 with four catches for 40 yards, pushing him over the career 1,000-yard mark. Tonyan is a former quarterback who made the transition to WR just last year. He is also one of two active 1,000-yard receivers on ISU's roster, as senior **Gary Owens** also passed the plateau this year.

OWENS' LEGACY

It's been an incredible season for senior WR **Gary Owens** thus far at the halfway point of the season. The second-year transfer from Trinity Valley CC has eight touchdown receptions this season, which ties the single-season school record set all the way back in 1968 by **Steve Schmid**. Owens got to that point by hauling in three TDs against the Salukis on Oct. 17, which tied ISU's single-game record – making him the fifth Sycamore to ever do so in one game. In less than two seasons in Terre Haute, Owens has 1,288 yards and 13 TDs – the latter of which is only two shy of ISU's all-time career receiving TD record. Nationally, Owens' eight TDs ranks tied for seventh in the FCS, and his 10 total touchdowns (eight receiving, one rushing, one passing) ranks him 39th in scoring.

BACK IN THE FOLD

After missing the two-plus games with a knee injury, Preseason All-MVFC Honorable Mention running back **LeMonte Booker** returned as Indiana State's starter at No. 8/9 South Dakota State on Oct. 10. Booker was ISU's leading rusher on the day with 67 yards on 15 carries against a stiff SDSU defense that only yielded 284 total yards of offense to the Sycamores. Booker followed that with his third-career 100-yard game against the Salukis, putting up 113 of ISU's season-high 329 rushing yards against SIU. Booker put up an amazing 137-yard, three touchdown day on the ground in the season opener against Butler (in which he also had a 24-yard TD reception). Booker had the makings of a strong game early on at Purdue on Sept. 12, but left in the second quarter after spraining his MCL.

DEEP BACKFIELD

The Sycamores have a good problem in the backfield this year, as they have too many solid ball rushers on the two-deep this season. ISU ranks third in the MVFC and 26th nationally in rushing offense at 196.3 yards per game. Starting running back **LeMonte Booker** started the year off with a superb 137-yard, three touchdown performance against Butler, but missed the next two games due to an injury at Purdue on Sept. 12. On the year, though, Booker is ISU's second-leading rusher at 361 yards.

QB **Matt Adam** is currently ISU's leading rusher by a small margin over Booker at 367 yards, but Adam has lost nearly 200 yards this season through sacks. Adam has proved to be the most explosive of the bunch with three runs 40 yards or longer -- including an 81-yard TD run against NDSU on Oct. 24 that is currently the longest offensive play for the Sycamores.

Also chipping in are: **Roland Genesy** (354 yards), **Marlon Fleming** (125), **Taeler Porter** (62) and **Kelvin Cook** (37) for a combined 578 rushing yards as Booker and Adam's supporting cast.

GETTING TRICKY

Indiana State has maintained its recent reputation as a master of unique trick plays early on this season, following a year in which the Sycamores unveiled the "Circle of Death" kick return that was featured on SportsCenter's Top-10. Against Southeast Missouri on Sept. 19, ISU ran an double-option option reverse end-around to WR **Gary Owens**, who ran it in nine yards for his first career rushing touchdown. Then at Missouri State on Oct. 3, Owens got in on the fun again with a 22-yard touchdown pass to TE **Jamar Brown** on a lateral screen from **Matt Adam**. ISU also has another special teams TD to its credit thanks to a punt return fakeout that allowed sophomore WR **Tyler Denton** to run 42 yards to the endzone at Missouri State. ISU dug back into its bag of tricks again vs. Southern Illinois with a 42-yard WR pass from **Robert Tonyan Jr.** to **Gary Owens**.

 - Passing defense: 218.4 (7th MVFC, 66th FCS)
- The Sycamores recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass against North Dakota State on Oct. 24, marking the fifth game out of seven that ISU has recorded multiple turnovers. The ISU defense has only gone one game this year without a turnover (at South Dakota State, Oct. 10).
 - NDSU QB Easton Stick is only the second 100-yard rusher the Indiana State defense has allowed all year.
 - ISU has had three tacklers in double-digits in each of the last two games vs. Southern Illinois and NDSU.
 - Although ISU gave up 554 yards of total offense, the Sycamores held SIU's ninth-ranked rushing offense to just 127 yards on the ground -- stifling two of the top rushers in the conference in Daquan Isom (45 yards) and Mark Iannotti (44 yards).
 - ISU has only given up 300 yards passing to only one team: Southern Illinois (427).
 - The ISU defense has also only allowed two 100-yard receivers this season: SIU's Darrell James (114) and SEMO's Paul McRoberts (100).
 - Only two opposing players have scored multiple touchdowns against the Sycamores: Missouri State RB Calan Crowder (two rushing) and NDSU QB Easton Stick (two rushing).
 - ISU freshman **Adrian Butler** blocked two punts against Southern Illinois on Oct. 17.
 - Sophomore WR **Tyler Denton** is one of 36 players in the FCS to return a punt for a touchdown in 2015. Denton took one back 42 yards on a trick play at Missouri State on Oct. 3, ISU's first punt return touchdown since 1996.
 - Senior DB **Travis Starks** owns the longest INT return in the FCS this season at 100 yards. Starks did so against Southeast Missouri on Sept. 19 to help spark a Sycamore comeback.
 - Safety **Tsali Lough** is ISU's leading tackler with 51 stops (29 solo). Lough is one of four Sycamores with a forced fumble this season, his coming at Purdue on Sept. 12. Lough recorded an ISU season-high 16 total tackles against Southern Illinois on Oct. 17.
 - After missing two games due to a concussion, senior LB **Kendall Walker** led ISU in tackles in each of his next two games at Missouri State (13 total, six solo, 10 in the first quarter) and at South Dakota State (15 total, 10 solo) -- both of which were individual season highs for ISU in 2015. Despite missing two games, Walker is third on ISU's roster with 49 total tackles (23 solo).
 - Since filling in for the injured **Mark Sewall**, **Marcus Gray** has become ISU's third-best tackler (49 total, 29 solo) and has had his hand in four Sycamore turnovers since Sewall's injury at Purdue.
 - LB **Jameer Thurman**, safety **Marcus Gray** and DB **Travis Starks** each have two interceptions on the season and have returned those INTs for a combined 147 yards.
 - Nickel defensive back **Lonnell Brown Jr.** leads ISU in tackles for loss with 5.5 TFL. Brown had 3.0 alone vs. Butler in the season opener. **Marcus Gray** also has 5.0 TFL right behind Brown.
 - **Lonnell Brown Jr.** suffered a neck injury at South Dakota State on Oct. 10, and needed to be carted off the field. Fortunately, Brown had movement in all his extremities and no damage to his neck or spinal cord.
 - **Jameer Thurman** recorded his 200th career tackle at South Dakota State on Oct. 10. He currently has 223 (111 solo), and is one of four active Sycamores with 200 or more career tackles: **Kendall Walker** (240), **Connor Underwood** (238) and **Mark Sewall** (235).
 - **Connor Underwood**, who is currently nursing a hamstring injury, is ISU's all-time sack leader with 30.5 career sacks. Earlier this year he also broke the all-time Indiana State record for TFL, currently at 57.0 career TFL. In four games played this season, Underwood has 20 total tackles (14 solo), 4.5 TFL for 14 yards and 2.0 sacks for eight yards.
 - LB **Antonio Broadus** is ISU's current leader in sacks with 2.5 on the year for a loss of 10 yards.



BALL HAWKS

The Sycamore defense forced and recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass against the four-time defending national champions North Dakota State at home on Oct. 24, marking the fifth game out of seven this season that ISU has forced multiple turnovers in. Nationally, ISU ranks tied for 13th (2nd MVFC) in turnover margin at +6 – helped greatly by the most turnovers in the Valley this season (13) and the 12th-fewest turnovers on offense nationally (7). Of those 13 turnovers, the Sycamores have been able to turn a 35-point profit against the 14 points opponents have made off of ISU's seven offensive miscues.

SUPER SAFTIES

ISU may be missing All-MVFC safety Mark Sewall, but the Sycamores have not been lacking at the safety position with **Tsali Lough** and **Marcus Gray**. Lough has started every game this season and currently leads ISU in tackles with 51 stops (29 solo), as well as a big forced fumble at Purdue on Sept. 12. Gray, meanwhile, has filled in for Sewall and done splendidly, recording 49 total tackles (29 solo), 5.0 TFL for a loss of 15 yards, two interceptions returned for 24 yards and two fumble recoveries.

SUPER UNDERCLASSMEN

Sophomore linebacker **Antonio Broadus** has seen more playing time in the face of several key injuries to the Sycamore defense, and he has not wasted his opportunity to produce. Broadus leads all Sycamores with 2.5 sacks for a loss of 10 yards. Broadus also ranks sixth on ISU's roster right now with 31 total tackles, 16 of which are solo.

Likewise, redshirt freshman linebacker **Katrell Moss** received a start last Saturday vs. North Dakota State and did not disappoint, recording 11 total tackles (seven solo) while forcing and recovering a fumble on the same play on a big 4th-and-1 stop of the Bison.

STIFF RUN DEFENSE

The Salukis entered Terre Haute on Oct. 17 ranked ninth nationally in rushing offense at 251.4 rushing yards per game. The Sycamore defense was not phased, though, as they stifled the explosive Salukis to just 127 yards on the ground – a season-low for ISU opponents and an SIU season-low by 48 yards. Indiana State shut down two of the top rushers in the MVFC in Daquan Isom (45 yards) and Mark Iannotti (44 yards).

TACKLING MACHINE

Senior linebacker **Kendall Walker** has had an impressive return from injury. Walker suffered a concussion against Butler on Sept. 5 and missed ISU's games at Purdue and against Southeast Missouri. Since, Walker has lit up opposing offenses for 47 total tackles (22 solo) – posting ISU season highs in both games at Missouri State (13 total, six solo) and at South Dakota State (15 total, 10 solo). Walker was ISU's leading tackler in 2014 with 123 total tackles (50 solo).

NEXT MAN UP

Due to some key injuries to starters **Connor Underwood**, **Conrrad Nicholls**, **Alec Lyons**, **Jordan Jackson** and **Alex Stowers**, the Sycamore defense has had to dig deep into its reserves -- and hasn't come up empty-handed. ISU had four first-time starters on defense at Missouri State -- DL **Kenyota Rollins**, LBs **Antonio Broadus** and **Katrell Moss**, and safety **Haki Woods** -- with all performing admirably and with Rollins coming up with an INT on a tipped pass. Not to mention the solid play of **Marcus Gray** and **Tyshon Waller**, who were in their second and third career starts at Missouri State, respectively.

TO THE HOUSE

Senior defensive back **Travis Starks** provided the most exciting and important play of the day for the Sycamores in their exciting 29-28 win over Southeast Missouri. After being held scoreless in the first half since Nov. 16, 2013, Starks turned the tide of the game with a 100-yard interception return for a touchdown, which sparked a Sycamore revival in the third quarter that saw 21 ISU points to zero from the Redhawks. Southeast was putting together another solid drive and about to enter the redzone when Starks read SEMO QB Tay Bender perfectly and picked off his out-route two yards deep into the endzone. Starks then burst forward and found a seam on the right sideline, leaving Southeast's offensive pursuers in the dust at the 30-yard line before strolling the final 70 yards into the endzone. The pick-six is the third of Starks' career at ISU. Starks also tallied three total tackles that game and had the job of trying to shut down pro-talent caliber wide receiver Paul McRoberts.

LEAVING A LEGACY

Senior **Connor Underwood** cemented himself yet again as one of the greatest Sycamore defenders in Indiana State history at Purdue on Sept. 12, this time by breaking yet another school record. Entering at 54.0 career tackles for loss, Underwood was .5 TFL shy of **Kyle Mitchell's** all-time record of 54.5. On the first play of the fourth quarter, Underwood bust into the backfield from the weak side to track down Purdue RB D.J. Knox for a two-yard loss and the all-time record. Underwood ended with five total tackles.

Sanford is considered one of the nation's top offensive minds and comes to Indiana State from Utah State, where he spent the 2012 season as the assistant head coach, running backs and tight ends coach on Gary Andersen's staff.

"I am extremely excited and passionate about becoming the new head coach of the Sycamore football program," Sanford said. "I look forward to continuing and building upon what this team accomplished over the past three seasons. I especially want to thank Indiana State University President Dan Bradley and Director of Athletics Ron Prettyman for this opportunity."

The Aggies were ranked No. 18 in the Associated Press Poll, No. 20 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll and finished No. 22 in the Bowl Championship Series standings in 2012. The Aggies defeated Toledo in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl played in Boise, Idaho on Sat., Dec. 15 by the score of 45-13.

Utah State had one of its best overall seasons in school history in 2012 with an 11-2 record, setting a single-season school record for victories, including a school-record six at home. USU also won six league games for just the second time in the history of the program and posted the school's first-ever perfect 6-0 conference record en route to the Western Athletic Conference Championship. The Aggies captured their first-ever road victory over a nationally-ranked team when they downed No. 19 Louisiana Tech by the score of 48-41 in overtime. Utah State appeared in the Associated Press Poll for three consecutive weeks for the first time in school history as well as the ESPN/USA Coaches Poll' and BCS standings for the first time ever.

Under Sanford's tutelage, Utah State senior running back Kerwynn Williams led the team with 1,277 rushing yards on 200 carries (106.4 YPG) with 12 touchdowns and also led the team with 43 catches for 663 yards and five TDs. Williams led the team with 24 big plays of over 20 yards (17-rushing and 7 receiving), including receptions of 74, 76, and 86 yards. The Aggie offense averaged 44.8 points and 502 yards of total offense per game over the final six contests of the year, highlighted by senior tight end Kellen Bartlett, who had 18 receptions for 111 yards and four touchdowns.

Williams was one of 17 Utah State players to take home All-Western Athletic Conference honors, as he was named to the first team. Bartlett took home Honorable Mention All-WAC honors as well. Of Williams' seven career 100-yard rushing performances, six came in 2012 under Sanford's tutelage. The Aggies were second in the WAC and 26th nationally in total offense (460.5 YPG) as well as second in the WAC and 37th nationally in rushing offense, totaling 192.5 YPG in 2012.

"I'm really happy for Mike. He wants to be a head football coach again and it's hard to get those jobs," said former USU and current Oregon State head coach Gary Andersen. "I know it's hard for

him to leave Utah State University, but he feels like this is a great opportunity and he has made a decision that he thinks betters himself and his family. I'm very supportive of it and I wish him and his family all the best.

Sanford came to Utah State after two seasons at Louisville, where, as offensive coordinator and tight ends coach, he helped improve the Cardinals' offensive passing, from nine touchdown passes in 2009 to 20 in 2010. Louisville scored 23 or more points in nine games, including 56 in a win against Memphis. Sanford also mentored Louisville tight end Cameron Graham, who earned First-Team All-Big East Conference accolades after catching 40 passes for 470 yards and five touchdowns.

Prior to Louisville, Sanford was head coach at UNLV from 2005-09, where he took over a program that was coming off four consecutive losing seasons. His five seasons at UNLV tied for the third-longest coaching stint in Rebel football history. The Sanford-led Rebels made national headlines in 2008 with an upset win at No. 13 Arizona State. Under Sanford, UNLV's offense set several school records in 2008, highlighted by tying for the top red zone scoring offense percentage (.950) in the nation, matching Ohio State. UNLV's offense was also 15th in the nation in sacks allowed (1.2/game).

During his time at UNLV, Sanford coached 29 All-Mountain West Conference honorees, including 2007 MWC Defensive Player of the Year Beau Bell, and 2006 MWC Freshman of the Year Ryan Wolfe, who went on to earn three first-team selections. In Sanford's offense, Casey Flair set a school record and tied a MWC record with 47 consecutive games with a reception.

At UNLV, Sanford replaced his college head coach, John Robinson, who retired after a legendary career that included six seasons with the Rebels.

"Mike Sanford is an outstanding football coach," said Mike Hamrick, the Director of Athletics at Marshall (and Athletic Director at UNLV at the time of his hiring in Las Vegas). "He is a man of integrity and will run a football program that the entire Indiana State University family will be proud of. His teams at UNLV were very competitive and had many big wins over teams such as Utah, Arizona State, Iowa State, Air Force and many others. His reputation as having a brilliant offensive mind is well documented. He will give everything he has to continue the success of Indiana State football."

Sanford spent the 2003 and 2004 seasons at Utah as offensive coordinator under head coach Urban Meyer and was part of the Utes' 21-2 overall and 13-1 Mountain West two-year stretch, including a 12-0 overall and 7-0 league mark and victory in the 2005 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl over Pittsburgh (35-7).

After the Utes finished last in the Mountain West in scoring offense the season before his arrival, Sanford led Utah to the No. 3 ranking in the nation at 43.3 points per game, third in total offense (499.8 YPG), third in passing efficiency (173.41)

and boasted Heisman Trophy finalist Alex Smith, who went on to become the top pick in the 2005 NFL Draft by the San Francisco 49ers. Smith was second in the NCAA in passing efficiency (176.52) and fifth in total offense (298.6 YPG).

During that same season, Utah boasted one of the nation's most balanced offensive attacks, averaging 236.06 yards per game on the ground and 263.67 yards through the air.

"Mike is a fine football coach who I got to know well while we coached together at Utah," Ohio State head coach Urban Meyer said. "I wish him all the best as he takes over the Indiana State program."

Sanford was offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Stanford in 2002, returning to the college ranks after three seasons in the NFL as wide receivers coach with the San Diego Chargers from 1999-2001.

"Mike Sanford is a tremendous football coach, but just as important he is great with young people," said current Nebraska head coach Mike Riley. "He will be a great leader of the program and an excellent teacher for the young men of the Indiana State team. This is a terrific hire for the University."

Sanford's NCAA Division I coaching experience includes stints at Notre Dame, USC, Purdue, Long Beach State, Virginia Military Institute and Army.

As an assistant coach, Sanford has participated in 12 bowl games with five different programs. As the wide receivers coach at USC from 1989-96, Sanford assisted in two Pac-10 championships and two Rose Bowl victories (vs. Michigan in 1990 and Northwestern in 1996). Three of his Trojan receivers were selected in the first round of the NFL Draft: Curtis Conway in 1992, Johnnie Morton in 1993 and Keyshawn Johnson, the No. 1 overall pick in the 1996 draft and a consensus All-American in 1995.

Sanford began his coaching career in 1977 as a graduate assistant at Southern California before earning his bachelor's degree from USC in 1978. Later that year, Sanford started his first full-time coaching position as the defensive coordinator at San Diego City College.

As a player, Sanford was a reserve quarterback for USC's 1973 and 1974 Rose Bowl teams (the 1974 team beat Ohio State for the national championship). He played free safety in 1976 when USC beat Michigan in the Rose Bowl and finished second in the nation.

Sanford, born April 20, 1955, and his wife Melinda have two grown children: a daughter, Lindsay, and a son, Mike, Jr., who is currently the offensive coordinator at Notre Dame. Sanford, Jr., was a Boise State quarterback from 2001-04. Mike and Melinda Sanford also have five grandchildren.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. – Lightning may have been striking all around Memorial Stadium, but it was also striking on the field for the Sycamore offense as Indiana State exploded to a 52-17 victory over the Butler Bulldogs to open the 2015 season on Saturday afternoon.

Several lightning delays close to two hours in total turned today's contest into one of the more peculiar football games in the country on Saturday, but ISU (1-0) didn't miss a beat and was able to carve up the Butler (0-1) defense for 496 yards of total offense.

"We're excited to open up the season with a win, especially at home," ISU head coach Mike Sanford said.

Most of those 496 yards came from huge plays out of junior running back LeMonte Booker and senior wide receiver Gary Owens. The duo combined for 294 yards and five touchdowns on Saturday, four of which came from Booker.

The Preseason All-MVFC Honorable Mention exploded for a career-high 137 yards and three touchdowns on the ground on 11 touches (12.5 YPC), while adding in a 24-yard screen pass scamper to the endzone early in the first quarter. Booker also added TD runs of 25 yards and a monster 76 yard dash through a semi-sized hole carved out for him by the Sycamore offensive line.

"Obviously LeMonte Booker was very good, very effective and very explosive," Sanford said. "We said we needed to run the ball on offense and I thought we ran the ball well."

As for Owens, the senior recorded his fourth-career 100-yard game with 133 yards and one touchdown on five catches – two of which were 47 yards or longer. The senior hauled in a 53-yard TD bomb early in the third quarter on a beautiful play-action rollout in which he left his defender in the dust on a sharp stop-and-go route.

"Gary had a really good offseason, he's prepared well," Sanford said. "He picked up right where he left off last year, and I expect to see even more from him going forward."

As for the man getting the ball to Booker and Owens, that was newly-appointed starting quarterback Matt Adam, who was announced as the winner of the training camp competition shortly before kickoff. Adam, who caught the imagination of Sycamore fans last season after nearly pulling off a comeback upset over Illinois State following an injury to Mike Perish, had a solid start to 2015 on Saturday, going 9-of-16 for 164 yards, two touchdowns and one interception on a freak tipped pass at the line of scrimmage.

Adam was also more than effective running on his own on Saturday, rushing for 46 yards and one touchdown on a 37-yard scamper to the endzone. In fact, on ISU's first touchdown drive in the first quarter, Adam nearly caught the pylon on a surprising Superman dive following a 28-yard dash.

"Obviously we named a starter, and it was Matt Adam," Sanford said. "He played in one game last year against Illinois State and he played effectively and efficiently. I thought today he made some big plays, which was good."

The most consistent performers of the day, though, were from the Sycamore defense – which forced Butler to a three-and-out on half of its drives on Saturday. Junior Lonnell Brown, Jr. led all Sycamore defenders with nine total tackles (four solo), including three TFL for five yards. Linebacker Jameer Thurman also had himself a day, as he picked off passes on consecutive drives and returned them for a total of 23 yards.

In total, the ISU defense recorded three sacks and 11 tackles for loss for a total of 32 yards.

"I can't say enough about our defense," Sanford said. "We were able to stop them and force them into passing situations and were able to put some pressure on the quarterback."

"One of the things we said going into the game was that our defensive line needed to control the line of scrimmage, and I felt that they did that, especially early," Sanford continued.

What is most impressive about today's win was the fact that ISU was able to stay consistent through some very unusual delays. Following Booker's 76-yard touchdown run with 6:18 in the second quarter, officials instituted a delay due to lightning within close proximity to Memorial Stadium at approximately 4:10 local time.

At around 4:40, play resumed with the PAT following Booker's touchdown. At 5:00 exactly, a massive lightning bolt struck very close to the stadium forcing another delay that would last until 6:37. Because of the delays, halftime was reduced to three minutes.

"I've been coaching a long time and I've never had a game where we didn't have halftime," Sanford said.

"I thought our team handled the distractions well," he continued. "It's a hard balance; when you're waiting you want to make sure you're serious and focusing but you can't focus all that time. You have to make it loose."

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. – The Boilermakers got out to an early 14-0 lead following two long passing touchdowns and never looked back, as Indiana State fell to in-state Big Ten rival Purdue, 38-14, on Saturday afternoon at Ross-Ade Stadium.

The Sycamores (1-1) showed flashes of potential at times – particularly on defense – but some costly injuries and a lethal aerial assault by Purdue (1-1) became too much to overcome in the end.

"I look at it very simple: we did not play well enough, first of all to win that game, but we didn't play anything like our expectation is and what our plan to win is," said head coach Mike Sanford. "Our plan to win is great defense, but we gave up too many big plays. On offense, we were very inconsistent, especially early in the game."

While the ISU defense did have quick glimpses of brilliance with several key three-and-outs, some timely tackles for loss and two forced fumbles that ended up as turnovers, Purdue was able to produce three scoring plays of 50 yards or more within the first half alone en route to 540 yards of total offense in contrast to ISU's 362.



"We just didn't make the plays we were supposed to make," said junior starting safety Tsali Lough. "When everybody did their job, we had a three-and-out, we had turnovers, we made big plays. When they made big plays we had a missed assignment, a miscommunication, and that is just not how we play."

Purdue opened the game with a 57-yard touchdown pass from Austin Appleby (20-of-34, 289 yards, four touchdowns) to Cameron Posey, but rather than sulk, the Sycamore defense showed resiliency. Osborn Umeh pinned Purdue to their own 12 – thanks to a great hustle tackle from gunner and wide receiver Tyler Denton. The ensuing offensive possession for the Boilermakers ended in the first of three Purdue three-and-outs on the day, which then led to a near-miss by Eric Heidorn on what would have been an ISU record 55-yard field goal.

The Sycamore defense remained tough through the remainder of the first quarter until 26 seconds remained, when Appleby found another big hole in the ISU defense, hitting DeAngelo Yancey in stride for a 50-yard touchdown strike.

Midway through the second quarter, Umeh pinned the Boilermakers within the 20 again, which directly helped lead to ISU's first touchdown. Purdue punter Joe Schopper shanked one out-of-bounds at Purdue's 33, allowing Sycamore quarterback Matt Adam to find a wide-open Gary Owens at the left-front pylon for a 17-yard touchdown and cut Purdue's lead to 14-7 at 9:34.

The Sycamores looked to take a stranglehold on momentum on the ensuing kickoff when redshirt freshman Katrell Moss forced a fumble from Purdue running back D.J. Knox, which was recovered by senior safety Marcus Gray at the Purdue 35 yard line. However, the Sycamores could only make it to the 17 before settling for a field goal from 35 yards out, which was promptly blocked by Purdue's Ryan Watson.

Again, ISU proved resilient, fighting the Boilermakers back-and-forth for the remainder of the quarter, only yielding a 19-yard field goal along the way to make the score 17-7 in Purdue's advantage. That is, until the final play of the second half.

Purdue received the ball with 30 seconds left in the half, and appeared ready to run out the clock. However, the Boilermakers got a first down at their own 49, and decided to spike the ball and set up a try for the Hall Mary. As time expired, Appleby rolled left, flung one to the right side of the endzone, and somehow found Dan Monteroso behind ISU defensive back Alex Stowers in the back of the endzone for a momentum-draining score to end the half up 24-7.

"That play wasn't executed very well, and we need to execute better," Sanford said. "That was a heartbreaker, to give up that kind of play at the end of the half."

The second half didn't feature nearly as many fireworks, with Purdue only out-scoring the Sycamores 14-7. But, it did offer an opportunity for starting quarterback Matt Adam a chance to lead ISU on a couple solid drives – including a 27-yard touchdown pass up the seam to junior Robert Tonyan Jr.

Adam, in just his third career start, struggled at times against a big and fast Boilermaker defense that sacked him four times and picked him off twice.

"(Purdue) got me on the edge a little bit, and sometimes when I didn't have pressure I would run, when I did have pressure sometimes I would stay," Adam said. "I have to be more comfortable in there and stay in. The offensive line did well, I thought I could have made a couple more plays to help them out."

But, Adam also fought back impressively through both the air and on the ground. Adam was Indiana State's best rusher on the day at 88 yards on 19 rushes. Adam's gain on the day was actually 119 yards when his sacks aren't included in his total. Through the air, Adam was 18-of-37 for 194 yards and two touchdowns. In the second half alone, Adam tallied 78 rushing yards and 150 passing yards.

"I definitely learned how to stay in and throw while taking a hit, and I just want to keep building off it," Adam said.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. – It came down to two-point conversions three different times over the last two minutes of the game, but Indiana State was able to prevail in the end in a wild 29-28 victory over the Southeast Missouri State Redhawks on Saturday afternoon at Memorial Stadium.

There appeared to be several cruxes to the game over the last several minutes of play in the fourth quarter, but the game literally came down to a 26-yard Southeast (1-2, 0-0 OVC) touchdown to pro-talent caliber wide receiver Paul McRoberts as time expired, and then a failed two-point conversion directed his way to ensure victory for Indiana State (2-1, 0-0 MVFC).

"First of all, I'm really proud of our team," said ISU head coach Mike Sanford. "I thought there was a lot of maturing that happened today, which I'm excited about. This was a great team win. We struggled in the first half, which was very obvious. It wasn't pretty, but it was a great win."

It was a tough, defensive battle for much of the game between the Sycamores and Redhawks, but the final two minutes were a preposterously fun ride with three touchdowns and a pair of two-point conversions before the final attempt fell out of McRoberts' reach in the right corner of the endzone.

After falling down 7-0 on a blazing 80-yard touchdown run by SEMO quarterback Tay Bender and trailing at the half for the first time since 2013 (Nov. 16, vs. Western Illinois), Indiana State exploded for 21 points in the third quarter to take a 21-7 advantage heading into the final frame.

What got it started for the Sycamores was an improbable 100-yard interception return for a touchdown by Travis Starks at the 11:15 mark in the third quarter to tie the game 7-7. Starks picked off Bender in the left corner of the endzone and proceeded to burst out and find his way to the corner, leaving Southeast's offensive pursuers in the dust around the 30-yard-line on his way to the house.

"That was the difference-maker play of the game," Sanford said. "It gave us a whole bunch of juice. That was big. What a great interception and what a great run. One of the things we do on defense is we practice scoring; we actually have guys blocking. We did an excellent job of executing that and he made a huge play."

The energy that play brought was palpable both in the stands and on the sideline. Freshman Marlon Fleming got in on the fun at the 5:34 mark on a 13-yard touchdown run – his second in two games at Memorial Stadium – and as time expired in the third quarter Indiana State offensive coordinator Brian Sheppard dug into his bag of tricks.

Nine yards out and with the momentum of a solid drive behind them, Sheppard drew up a fake double-quick option to the right with quarterback Matt Adam and running back Roland Genesy, but senior wide receiver Gary Owens pulled back from blocking to catch the pitch on a reverse end-around for the nine-yard score – the first rushing touchdown of his career.

And then, the real fun began. With starting running back and No. 4 rusher in the FCS DeMichael Jackson out with an injury, SEMO turned to Tremaine McCullough to lead the way – and that he did. McCullough led all rushers on Saturday with 114 yards on 18 touches, starting with an 18-yard touchdown run with 9:29 to play to regain some momentum for Southeast.

The Redhawks got the ball back and put together another impressive drive, nickel-and-diming the Sycamore defense down to the one-yard-line, where SEMO fullback Lewis Washington plowed ahead for the score to make the game 21-20 in favor of the Sycamores. SEMO head coach Tom Matukewicz then made the gutsy call to go for two – and, at that point, presumably the win – and it paid off. Quarterback Dante Vandeven – playing in place of the benched Bender following the 100-yard interception return – hit wide receiver Darius Darden-Box for the two-point conversion to go up 22-21 with 2:24 left to play.

The Sycamores, rather than panic at being down so late in the game on such a call, responded in resolute fashion with a spectacular drive of their own.

On the first play of the drive, Adam hit Roland Genesy on a swing pass for 10 yards and a new set of downs. Adam and the Sycamores weren't wasting any time, though, as Adam hit Gary Owens on the right sideline for a 25-yard pickup to the SEMO 40 yard line. The Redhawk defense fought back, forcing Coach Sanford into a tough decision on 4th and 3 on the SEMO 33-yard-line: attempt a 50-yard field goal, or go for it and risk the game.

Sanford went ahead with a gutsy call of his own and sent his offense back on the field. What followed was purely Matt Adam. All looked lost at the beginning of the play, as Southeast forced Adam out of the pocket almost immediately. Adam never lost composure, though, and found Owens without a safety over the top of him (like there had been all game) for a 33-yard touchdown up the right sideline for the score with 41 seconds left to play.

"That was actually a bootleg call," Sanford said. "It could have been just a completion for the first down, but they squatted on Gary's comeback (route) and he just went and Matt made a beautiful throw."

"The defense had been carrying me all game, so I had to go make a play for them," Adam said.

Up 27-22, ISU then needed to go for the two-point conversion to be able to keep SEMO at bay. Adam found sophomore transfer wide receiver Kelvin Cook in the right flat for the score to make it a seven-point game again at 29-22.

But the game wasn't over, as Southeast used every last one of those 41 seconds to their advantage. Following a penalty to Owens for unsportsmanlike conduct that both pushed the kickoff back 15 yards and forced Owens out of the game with his second-such penalty, Southeast was able to start their drive on their own 43.

SEMO then opened its drive with a 19-yard first down to McRoberts to the ISU 38. The Sycamore defense held strong until 4th and 9, when Vandeven found Darden-Box just beyond the chains for an 11-yard pickup to the ISU 26 with two seconds remaining.

Southeast used all three of its timeouts in succession to prepare for the final play, and it appears all that preparation was worth it. Vandeven hit McRoberts across the middle five yards shy of the endzone, but McRoberts easily slipped in as time expired to make it a 29-28 game.

Rather than play for overtime, though, Matukewicz yet again kept his offense on the field and went for the win. The play was a fade to McRoberts in the right corner, but the pass sailed out of the endzone and the Indiana State bench stormed the field.

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. – Indiana State struggled in the first quarter, but collected its breath and absolutely exploded for 49 points over the last three frames in a 56-28 rout at Missouri State on Saturday to begin the grueling Missouri Valley Football Conference schedule at 1-0.

The Sycamores (3-1, 1-0 MVFC) put up only 28 total yards in the first quarter and even fell down 14-7 in the opening seconds of the second quarter. From that point on, though, ISU's offense went off for 516 more yards of total offense (544 total) in a showcase of deep talent on the Sycamore roster despite a bevy of injuries that have befallen ISU as of late.

With the win, ISU improves to 3-1 for the second straight season – the first time that has happened in consecutive years since 1994-95. Indiana State has also now won consecutive Valley openers since 1996 (at Western Illinois) and 1997 (vs. Southern Illinois).

"To be able to win on the road in the Missouri Valley Football Conference, that's a challenge and I'm glad we were able to get a win," said ISU head coach Mike Sanford.



However, the start of the game was not indicative of how well the Sycamores played during the remainder. Aside from only putting up 28 total yards in the first quarter, the ISU defense gave up 159 yards to the Bears, who only totaled 349 all game.

What got ISU in the game, though, was a big special teams play from freshman WR Tyler Denton in the first quarter. Coach Sanford had actually designed a fake return for Denton anyway, who was a gunner on the play opposite returner Robert Tonyan Jr. But MSU punter Chris Sullens shanked the punt short enough for Denton to haul in anyway, which he ran in for a 42-yard touchdown – ISU's first on a punt return since 1996 (Larry Scally, 86 yards, vs. St. Joseph's).

"That was a designed play," Sanford said. "It's happened in pro football; the Rams did it last year and the Seahawks did it this year. You have your returner fake like he's getting the ball and have another returner going to the other side. It worked out good. We didn't expect them to shank it. That made it even better; they kind of played into our hands."

After MSU took a 14-7 lead with 14:57 to play in the second quarter, the Sycamores woke up with a vengeance. ISU scored the next four touchdowns in the game, all beginning with a powerful nine-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 19-yard touchdown run by junior transfer Roland Genesy (17 rushes, career-high 98 yards) – the first score of his ISU career.

ISU's next score came with 2:20 left in the half, this time courtesy of Gary Owens (six catches, 47 yards). The senior WR took advantage of a broken play and signaled to QB Matt Adam that he was open in the back of the endzone for a six-yard score (his shortest of the season).

With four touchdowns in four games this season and nine total in his two seasons at ISU, Owens is currently on pace to shatter both the single-season (eight) and career (15) receiving touchdowns records.

ISU came out of halftime with a 21-14 lead and the ball, and the ensuing drive became the beginning of the end for the Bears. ISU, led by Adam, Genesy and freshman WR Kelvin Cook, put together a demoralizing 11-play, 70-yard drive that ended with a five-yard strike to TE Andrew Main in the right corner of the endzone – his first catch of the season.

"That drive was big at the beginning of the second half, it was huge," Sanford said. "I just think the way we played in the third quarter was excellent and I'm just proud of our guys."

Following the big drive to open the quarter, ISU had a 15-yard TD pass to Sampson Levingston (six catches, 55 yards, 1 TD), who shook off four defenders in an impressive romp to the endzone. In the opening minutes of the fourth quarter, ISU dug into its bag of tricks for a 22-yard passing TD to Jamar Brown (four catches, 44 yards) from none other than Gary Owens on a trick play. This was Owens' first career TD pass, one game off his first career rushing TD against Southeast Missouri.

The final two scores of the game for ISU were a 17-yard reception by Tonyan (three catches, 49 yards) and a two-yard run by freshman Taeler Porter. In his first series on the field as a Sycamore, the freshman Florida native exploded for 62 yards on five carries – which includes a 42-yard run on his second career carry.

Matt Adam had a career day under center, posting career highs in completions, yards and touchdowns as he went 27-of-38 for 265 yards and four touchdowns. Adam's four touchdowns are the most since Mike Perish threw four at Southern Illinois in 2014.

But the offensive catalyst of the day was the freshman Kelvin Cook. Whether he was lined up at receiver or as a QB in the Wildcat, the Miami transfer was privy to several key first downs as ISU's all-purpose leader with 114 total yards (70 receiving, 44 rushing).

BROOKINGS, S.D. – Both teams were evenly matched for much of the contest, but the high-flying offense of the No. 8/9 South Dakota State Jackrabbits were able to separate from a beleaguered Sycamore defense for a 24-7 win over No. 19/21 Indiana State at Coughlin-Alumni Stadium on Saturday.

The Sycamores (3-2, 1-1 MVFC) never seemed to be completely out of the game, but they were also never able to hold the momentum away from SDSU (4-1, 1-1 MVFC) for very long.

"We needed to play our best game and we did not play our best game," said ISU head coach Mike Sanford. "In some ways, we played our worst game. We made too many mistakes. We didn't do the things you need to do to win."

"We had a difficult time of, when we were close, of making the move that we needed to make," Sanford continued. "In the games we've won this year we've made that move, and we did not make that move today."



The first quarter was an absolute blur, as it only took about 30 minutes and it featured a slew of offensive action; however, neither team had anything to show for it on the scoreboard. Both defenses made huge stops, with the Sycamores coming up big on the goal line following an efficient first-career drive for true freshman SDSU quarterback Taryn Christian (15-of-24, 221 yards, 1 TD; 16 carries, 99 yards, 1 TD) – starting in place of the injured Zach Lujan, the 12th-best QB in the FCS this season.

From the one yard-line, defensive linemen Conrad Nicholls and Norvell McGlaun made a huge stop to give the Sycamores the ball. ISU escaped from the depths of its own territory, but still got stopped as it entered SDSU's area.

The two teams traded possessions in quick succession until the early minutes of the second quarter, when the game came to a standstill following a terrifying injury to leading-tackler Lonnell Brown Jr. Brown was immediately immobile and had to be carted off the field. It was later reported that Brown has movement in all his extremities and he even returned to the sideline by the fourth quarter. Brown received a rousing round of applause from the fans in Brookings and a touching tribute by the entire Sycamore bench, who came together as the cart passed by to wish him well.

Later that same drive, though, Christian showed his speed and scampered 10 yards into the endzone for the first score of the game at the 12:05 mark. Christian also showed off his arm with 2:08 left, hitting FCS No. 2-ranked wide receiver Jake Wieneke for a perfect 34-yard toss on play-action.

However, the Sycamores were never quite out of it. A modicum of momentum still remained in ISU's possession following some missed field goals and a questionable call by SDSU to run the ball with 12 seconds left in the half and no timeouts from only six yards out.

The game got real interesting at the 6:09 mark of the third quarter, when ISU had its play of the day. Quarterback Matt Adam (17-of-30, 198 yards, 1 TD, 1 INT) escaped chaos in the backfield, picked up an incredible (but legal) crack-back block from center James Officer, and found a wide-open Gary Owens (three catches, 61 yards, 1 TD) 43 yards downfield for the score after Owens wisely decided to keep following Adam's movements.

The game was within reach heading into the fourth quarter, but ISU could never capitalize and the Jackrabbits took advantage of an exhausted Sycamore defense that had fought gallantly against one of the nation's top offenses.

Senior linebacker Kendall Walker once again led ISU in tackles, this time for a team season-high 15 stops (10 solo). Sophomore Antonio Broadus was also in double-digits with a career-high 10 tackles.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. – The Salukis made it interesting late, but Indiana State held on for an exciting 39-36 Homecoming victory over Southern Illinois at Memorial Stadium on Saturday.

The Sycamores (4-2, 2-1 MVFC) were up by as many as 12 points in the fourth quarter following an impressive offensive showing and a defiant defensive output against a lethal SIU (2-4, 1-2 MVFC) offense. However, the Salukis marched back and were within three late after a Mark Iannotti rushing touchdown and Matt DeSommer two-point conversion made the game 39-36 with 1:28 to play.

ISU's offense, however, did what it had all game: run the ball. Leading rusher Matt Adam (nine carries, 123 yards, 1 TD) plowed ahead for 10 yards on 3rd and 10 to move the chains and run out the clock for the win.

"(It was) just a great win," said ISU head coach Mike Sanford. "I thought our team kept fighting and kept believing in spite of a lot of adversity. We had a lot of difficult things happen."

The adversity Coach Sanford alludes to is not glaringly obvious at first glance at this game, as the Sycamore offense was – for the most part – able to move the ball at will on the Salukis, raking up a season-high total offensive output of 561 yards.



The Salukis started out hot, though, with a 10-play, 77-yard scoring drive on the game's first possession. ISU responded in kind, though, with the first of three touchdown passes from Matt Adam (14-of-29, 190 yards, 3 TD) to Gary Owens (five catches, 128 yards, 3 TD) for 30 yards over double-coverage.

Owens' day was a historic one for Indiana State, as he tied the all-time single-season receiving touchdown record (8, set in 1968 by Steve Schmid), as well becoming the fifth Sycamore to ever catch three touchdowns in the same game – the first since Sampson Livingston in 2013. Most remarkable was the fact that Owens spectacularly had his hands on at least three more touchdown passes that were knocked away or fell out of his grasp.

"Gary Owens was awesome today," Sanford said. "He had three touchdown receptions but he could have had even more."

Owens even caught a 42-yard pass from fellow wide receiver and former ISU QB Robert Tonyan Jr. later on in the first quarter, who found Owens wide-open down the right sideline on a trick double-pass play.

"We were very aggressive," Sanford said. "And we're going to continue to be very aggressive."

That aggressiveness payed off so well thanks to a superb rushing offense that accumulated a season-high total of 329 yards – 320 of which came from just three people. The Sycamores decided to beat the high-flying Salukis at their own game (SIU entered ranked ninth nationally in rushing offense) by riding the performances of Adam (123 yards, 1 TD), LeMonte Booker (113 yards) and Roland Genesy (85 yards) to victory. Adam and Booker are actually the first 100-yard duo for ISU all season.

Speaking of Adam, the sophomore quarterback wasn't just getting a few yards here and there – he was exploding from the line of scrimmage. Adam set a new career-long rush twice today, once on a 43-yard touchdown run on a perfect read-option in the first quarter and then on a long 44-yard first down in the third.

"Matt did a great job," Sanford said. "With Matt having the mobility that he has is tremendous, and I think that had a lot to do with it."

Adam's mobility also helped in the passing game as well. Adam's ability to escape pressure and look downfield kept the Saluki defense honest and eventually allowed for the three touchdown passes to Owens.

"I thought Matt kept his composure well," Sanford said. "I think Matt showed some maturity today. He made some good decisions and learned from some things that happened last week."

And even though they gave up 554 total yards of offense, the Sycamore defense completely stymied an incredible SIU rushing offense, holding the Salukis to just 127 yards on the ground – a season-low for ISU opponents. Indiana State has still not allowed a 100-yard rusher this season.

Safety Tsali Lough was a huge part of that, tallying up an ISU season-high 16 total tackles. Kendall Walker also posted his third-straight double-digit game with 13 total, as did Jameer Thurman with 10. Jordan Wallace provided a crucial forced fumble on an SIU kick return that was recovered by safety Marcus Gray – his second of the year. And cornerback Travis Starks had yet another timely interception to stall out a promising SIU drive.

"I think our defense made plays when they needed to and when we needed them to make a play," Sanford said.

Not to be left out of the fun, though, were the special teams. Indiana State blocked two Saluki punts, both by true freshman Adrian Butler.

ISU also corrected its recent penalty mishaps with a highly-disciplined game against SIU. Following a rough game at South Dakota State last week, ISU only had two penalties for 20 yards on Saturday.

"That was a big focus going into this game, was discipline and doing things right and doing the things you need to do to win, which I felt like we did tonight," Sanford said.

Today's win pushes ISU to 3-0 at home for the first time since 2011, and it also marks the first consecutive wins over Southern Illinois since 2001 (20-14) and 2002 (21-14).

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. – The Sycamores had them on the ropes, but the four-time defending national champions of North Dakota State proved why they've had such great success recently in a hard-fought 28-14 loss to the Bison at Memorial Stadium on Saturday.

Indiana State (4-3, 2-2 MVFC) gave NDSU (5-2, 3-1 MVFC) everything it had, but the highly disciplined and consistent Bison held onto the ball for an absurd 39 minutes and 31 seconds (23:06 of which came in the second half) and were able to stymie an explosive Sycamore offense to just 201 yards – the fewest by an ISU squad since the second round of the FCS Playoffs last season (178, vs. Chattanooga).

"Disappointing loss for the Sycamores today," said ISU head coach Mike Sanford. "I felt like we played hard, I thought we competed hard. We had an opportunity knocking on the door right there after we scored on Matt Adam's long touchdown in the third quarter."

That play – an 81-yard scamper by Adam early in the third quarter – did indeed seem to give the Sycamores a jolt of momentum. The Bison jumped out to a 14-0 lead behind new starting quarterback Easton Stick (9-of-20, 126 yards, 1 TD, 1 INT; 17 rushes, 124 yards, 2 TD), who was subbing in place of injured NFL-caliber QB Carson Wentz. But, the Sycamore defense held tough long enough for Adam (10-of-25, 86 yards, 1 TD; 8 rushes, 75 yards, 1 TD) to find tight end Andrew Main in the endzone with 10 seconds left to play in the first half to cut NDSU's lead to 14-7.

The Sycamore defense – which allowed a season-low 126 passing yards – held tough yet again on NDSU's first drive of the second half, which led into the exhilarating 81-yard run by Adam on ISU's second play of the ensuing drive to tie the game 14-14. The play is the longest offensively for the Sycamores this season, and trails only Travis Starks' 100-yard interception return against Southeast Missouri as the longest overall this season.

"We were right there and I thought we were going to go after this game and attack this thing and put it away, and we weren't able to stop them," Sanford said.

What followed was what NDSU does best: chew the clock. The final two Bison touchdowns of the game came in the third quarter and on a combined scoring drive of 19 plays, 134 yards and nine minutes – which was helped by some timely Sycamore penalties down the stretch that kept several drives alive.

"Those were unnecessary penalties that came back to haunt us today," Sanford said. "We did a good job with that last week, we were bad at it two weeks ago and it reared its ugly head again today. We've got to improve in that area."

Aside from Adam's big run, the Sycamore offense was uncharacteristically quiet against NDSU this afternoon – much of which can be attributed to going up against the 20th-ranked defense in the FCS.

"They're a good defense, but I think we're better than what we played today," Sanford said. "I have to give them credit, but we're a better football team than we played today."

Conversely, the Bison offense wasn't overtly impressive behind the new signal caller Stick, but they were efficient and racked up 243 rushing yards on a Sycamore defense that stuffed the ninth-best rushing offense in Southern Illinois last week to only 127 yards. In fact, Stick is only the second 100-yard rusher ISU has allowed all season after he collected 124 on the ground today – an individual season-high for ISU opponents.

There were several bright spots for the Sycamores, though. Punter Osborn Umeh had a career day and was instrumental in keeping the Sycamores in the game up until the end. Umeh booted a season-high 11 punts for 509 yards – an average of 46.3, nearly eight yards longer than his season average entering today. Umeh also had a long of 56, two pins inside the 20 and a season-high three punts 50 yards or longer.

Umeh's performance is even more impressive when compared to NDSU punter Ben LeCompte, an NFL-caliber punter who averaged 47.7 per punt today and had a long of 60.

"I thought Ozzie Umeh played his best game," Sanford said. "I think you saw two big-time punters out there today. It was a field position battle. He kept us alive in a lot of situations."

On defense, ISU had three in double-digit tackles for the second consecutive week. Junior linebacker Jameer Thurman set a season-high with 12 total stops (seven solo); sophomore linebacker Katrell Moss had a huge day with 11 total tackles (seven solo) and a forced fumble and fumble recovery on the same play; junior safety Marcus Gray again proved his worth as the injured Mark Sewall's replacement, notching 11 total tackles (five solo); and junior nickel defensive back Lonnell Brown Jr. hauled in his first interception of the season, making it five of seven games this season that the Sycamore defense has forced multiple turnovers.
