After advancing to the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament for the first time since 2009, the Indiana State Softball showed their season-long mentality of “Tough Girls Wear Blue” as they won four games in three days for the team’s first ever Missouri Valley Conference Tournament Title.

The Sycamores entered the tournament as the eighth seed as the top eight teams in the league were separated by just three games. Fueled by strong pitching and timely hitting, over the final seven games of the season (MVC and NCAA Tournaments) the Sycamore pitching staff held their opponents to a 1.67 ERA.

“Our team got tough at the right time and everything started to click for us at the right time,” junior pitcher Taylor Lockwood said. “I am looking forward to going back next year and doing it all again.”

Senior Megan Stone who became Indiana State’s first ever outright Missouri Valley Conference Softball Player of the Year, got the Sycamores going as she added to her school home run record in the first game of the tournament against Southern Illinois before pitcher Taylor Lockwood wrapped up the game in the circle.

Playing in the second game of the day, senior pitcher Yvette Alvarez carried a one-hitter into the fifth inning against host Wichita State and sophomore Brooke Riemenschneider hit her second home run of the season as the Sycamores powered their way into the semi-finals.

In the semi-finals, the Sycamores met regular season league champion Drake. Lockwood once again threw an outstanding game in the circle, allowing just one hit through five innings as the Sycamores advanced to just their third ever conference tournament finals, and first under the Missouri Valley banner.

Despite playing for an NCAA Tournament berth, the Sycamores kept their loose mentality and jumped out an early lead against Missouri State. By the time a two-plus hour rain delay hit in the fifth inning, the Sycamores held a 9-0 advantage. In the circle, Lockwood again carried a one hitter into the sixth, and led the Sycamores to their first ever MVC Tournament Title.

“It’s been a process of instilling our positive culture and winning attitude which will create lifelong champions,” head coach Shane Bouman said. “I am sure proud of our girls and we all know it’s a great time to be a Sycamore.”

Lockwood earned MVC Tournament MVP honors, throwing 22 innings and allowing just five runs to earn three victories in the circle. Sophomores Rylee Holland and Riemenschneider along with Stone were also named to the All-Tournament team

while Riemenschneider was also the first softball player from Indiana State to win the Elite 18 award.

For the four seniors on the roster, winning the championship was something they have worked towards for four years.

“My favorite softball moment was in the MVC Championship game,” senior Ashley Dickerson said. “After we got the last out, I ran to find [senior] Megan



[Stone] and we hugged for what seemed like forever. It was a special moment for both of us, knowing how much heart we’ve invested over our four years here, and to finally be able to say we did it was amazing.”

The Sycamores didn’t end their record breaking season in Wichita, however. With the MVC Tournament title came the league’s automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament, a place no softball team at Indiana State had ever reached and the first current women’s program at ISU to do so as well.

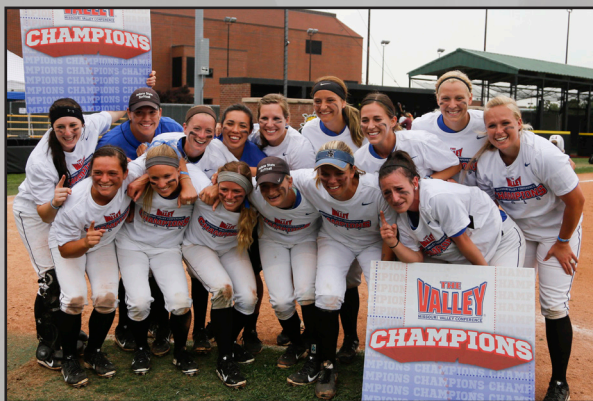
After falling in a tough battle with No. 13 and host Missouri in their first ever regional game, the Sycamores broke through another huge barrier as they defeated Louisville in extra innings for their first ever NCAA Tournament win and first post-season NCAA win by an Indiana State program since 2001 when the Men’s Basketball team defeated Oklahoma.

After a one out double by junior Mallory Schneid in the eighth inning and fielders choice by junior Alexa Cavin where the Cardinals did not record an out, sophomore Kassie Brown slapped a ball through the left side to give the Sycamores the lead, one they wouldn’t give up. Lockwood also kept the Cardinals at bay in the circle, not allowing a runner to reach third base until the eighth inning.

After the dust settled, the Sycamore softball team broke multiple records, setting seven team records along with the most MVC wins in school history and third most overall wins. Records and winning aren’t the only thing important to Sycamore softball but rather providing their athletes the tools to be a life long champion.

When asked about her experience with Sycamore softball in her historic four-year career, Stone simply said: “Sycamore softball not only means hustle and hard work, it means being a champion for the rest of your life.”

Despite graduating four seniors, the future has never looked brighter and the expectations never higher as the team prepares for the 2016 as defending Missouri Valley Conference Tournament Champions.

Sycamore Softball Ready To Build Off 2015 Success

The expectations have never been higher for the Indiana State softball team after having won the programs first ever conference tournament title under the Missouri Valley banner and advancing to the programs first ever NCAA Regional, in 2015.

The Sycamores used tough defense, dominating pitching and key hitting to lead them to their MVC crown a year ago and the recipe for success will be much of the same in 2016 as the team looks to defend it's title and head back to the NCAA Regional.

Once again the Sycamores will play a tough early season schedule, traveling to Auburn, who advanced to the semifinals of the Women's College World Series last season.

The goal remains the same for Indiana State, however, win the conference tournament and etch their names into the Indiana State history books by advancing further into the postseason than they did in 2015.

Returning this year is a group of five seniors and three players who were named to the All-Missouri Valley Conference Tournament team last season, including tournament MVP, senior pitcher Taylor Lockwood. In addition, to Lockwood, fellow seniors Alexa Cavin, Abbie Malchow, Kelsey Montgomery and Mallory Schneid look to repeat in their final season in the blue and white.

Junior's Brooke Riemenschneider and Rylee Holland are also returning members of the 2015 All-Tournament team from a year ago to lead a strong junior class which includes returners Kassie Brown, Erika Crissman and Mary Turitto. Abby Klopp is the lone sophomore returner to make up the 11 players who will be seeking their second straight title.

Joining the Sycamores in 2016 are junior Jackie Hernandez and sophomore Bailey Benefiel along with freshmen Bailey Martin, Jordan Michalski, Shaye Barton and Monique Castillo.

Together they will join together to make the 2016 edition of Sycamore Softball.

Head Coach Shane Bouman is in his fourth season as head softball coach at Indiana State after leading the Sycamores to their first ever NCAA Tournament appearance and win and first Conference Tournament title under the MVC banner in 2015.

In his first three seasons at the helm of the Sycamore program, Bouman has helped to change the culture of the program and set winning expectations, leading to the team's first ever appearance in

the NCAA Tournament in 2015.

The Sycamores broke seven school records as a team and recorded the most Missouri Valley Conference wins in program history. Bouman also led the team to their first Missouri Valley Conference Tournament since 2009 when the team won its first ever MVC Tournament title in program history. Following the MVC Championships, Bouman led the Sycamores to the program's first ever post season win with a 2-1 victory over Louisville.

In addition, Bouman also coached Megan Stone to Missouri Valley Conference Player of the year honors in 2015, the first Sycamore player to earn the outright honor. Stone also broke 16 school records. He also coached sophomore Taylor Lockwood and Aubrey Carpenter to 2nd Team All-MVC Honors. In the MVC Tournament, four players were also named to the All-Tournament Team in Rylee Holland, Brooke Riemenschneider and Megan Stone while Taylor Lockwood was Tournament MVP.

During the 2013-14 season, Bouman led the Sycamores to their first winning season in 22 years and the third most wins in school history. The skipper has also coached four players to All-MVC honors in Lindsey Beisser, Shelby Wilson, Morgan Allee and Erika Crissman.

Bouman's success at Iowa came early. In 2008, his first season as pitching coach, the Hawkeye pitchers garnered top-25 national rankings in four categories: seventh nationally in team earned run average (1.23) and Brittany Weil finished the season ranked 22nd in individual wins (28) and 23rd in earned run average (1.22). Weil was also a four-time Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honoree, first-team NFCA all-Mideast Region selection, and second team all-Big Ten pick. Current Indiana State assistant coach Amanda Züst finished the season ranked 14th in hits allowed per seven innings (3.87) and 24th in earned run average (1.24). In his second season at Iowa, Bouman once again guided the pitching staff to national recognition. Iowa's pitchers finished the 2009 season with a 1.38 ERA, which ranked seventh-nationally. Bouman also previously served as head coach at South Dakota State University for six seasons and is the winningest coach in SDSU school history.

Aside from coaching, Bouman is also an accomplished softball pitcher. He is a four-time Amateur Softball Association (ASA) All-American and a two-time North American Fastpitch Association (NAFA) All-American. Bouman led five teams to ASA National Championships and competed in nine International Softball Congress World Tournaments, placing third in 1995, and fifth in both 1996 and 1997.

Bouman is married to the former Amy Goodrich and has a daughter, Bradee (16), and a toddler son and daughter, Baylor and Berkely, respectively.

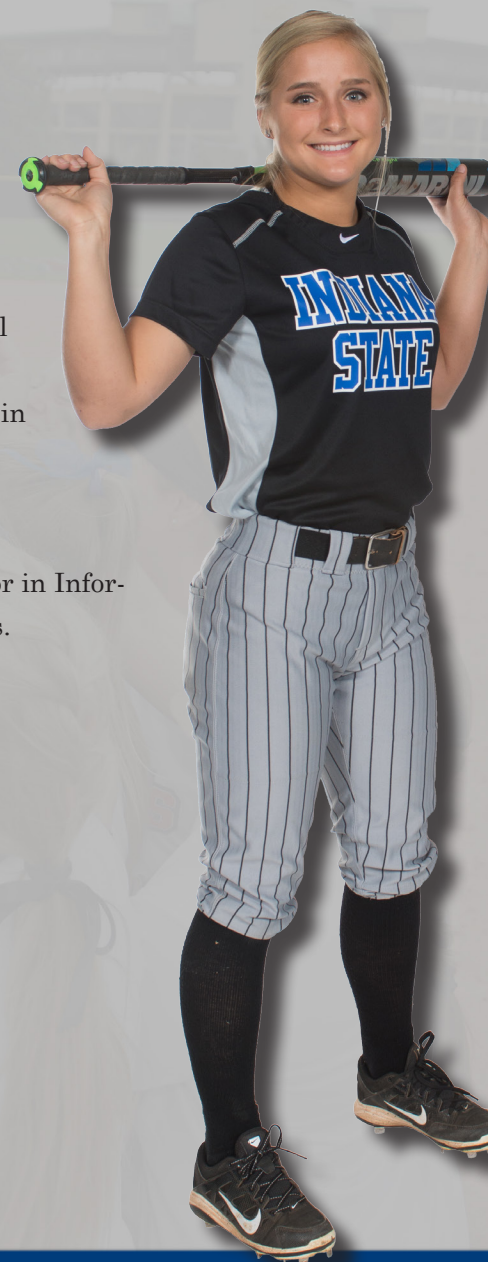
