## QUICK HITS

- Indiana State will honor its senior class when it plays host to the Northern Iowa Panthers for Senior Day this Saturday. Kickoff is scheduled for 1 p.m. ET at Memorial Stadium with the Senior Day ceremony taking place approximately 20 minutes prior to kickoff.
- Saturday's game will be broadcast live on ESPN3. On the call will be Indiana State students Rob Lafary (play-by-play) and Ramonte Baker (color).
- Sycamore fans can also listen locally on WDKE 95.9 FM "The Duke" to Brian Fritz (PBP) and Tom James (color).
- This marks the 112th season of football at Indiana State, dating back to 1896. The University did not field teams from 1899 to 1900, 1908 or from 1910 to 1919. ISU owns an all-time record of 384-515-23 (.416) and is competing for the 31st consecutive season as a member of the Missouri Valley Football Conference.
- Seniors being honored this Saturday are: **LS Joshua Appel, OL Zach Borens, DB Lonnell Brown Jr., DL Conlan Cassidy, OL Preston Collier, OL Nick Dachota, LB Cedric Doxy, TE Lafaele Fautanu, RB Roland Genesy, DB Marcus Gray, WR Sampson Levingston, DB Tsali Lough, OL Patrick McCown, LB Jameer Thurman, WR Robert Tonyan Jr., OL Dakota Vermillion, DL Tyshon Waller and DB Phil Wilson.**
- All-time, the Sycamores are 61-146 in MVFC play. Indiana State was 3-5 in conference play in 2015.
- Northern Iowa holds a commanding 25-5 lead in the all-time series against Indiana State that dates back to 1983. The Sycamores are 4-11 against the Panthers in Terre Haute, which is where all of ISU's last three wins vs. UNI have come. ISU has not won in Cedar Falls since 1988, going 1-14 at UNI in the series. The Sycamores opened the series with a 26-0 win in Terre Haute during ISU's 1983 playoff season.
- One week after facing one of the top defenses in the nation in Youngstown State, the Sycamores face an equally tough test against the Panthers. UNI ranks in the national top-15 in passes intercepted (2nd, 15 INTs), defensive touchdowns (4th, four TDs), turnover margin (10th, +9), turnovers gained (10th, 19) and total defense (15th, 307.0 YPG).
- Indiana State led for the first 50 minutes and 21 seconds of play at No. 14 Youngstown State last week, but a 79-yard punt return TD by YSU's Darien Townsend with 9:19 to play permanently turned the tide for the Penguins for the 13-10 victory. YSU's fearsome defense became the first of the season to truly shut down QB Isaac Harker and, by extension, the ISU offense, sacking Harker seven times for a loss of 65 yards.
- At Youngstown State, senior **WR Robert Tonyan Jr.** hauled in five passes for 40 yards and one TD, in the process becoming just the third Sycamore receiver to ever eclipse 2,000 career yards receiving. At 2,026 career yards, Tonyan sits just 22 yards shy of second all-time (**Terry Bell**, 1982-85, 2,048) and 359 off ISU record holder **Sam Logan** (2002-06, 2,385). Tonyan also ranks second all-time in career receptions with 146 catches, exactly 50 shy of Sam Logan's record of 196.
- The previous week at Southern Illinois (W, 22-14), Tonyan tied and then broke the single-season receiving TD mark of eight set by **Steve Schmid** (1968) and **Gary Owens** (2015). Tonyan extended that record to 10 TDs this season with a nine-yard TD at Youngstown State, which also extends his career record to 20. The previous record was 15, set by Joe Downing (1982-85), which Tonyan broke at No. 13 Western Illinois on Oct. 8.
- ISU's win at Southern marked the first time in school history that two Indiana State receivers passed the 100-yard plateau: **Miles Thompson** (147 yards, 1 TD) and **Robert Tonyan Jr.** (131 yards, 2 TD).
- The previous week against South Dakota, the Sycamores recorded their first game with a 300-yard passer, 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver since Oct. 25, 2014, at Southern Illinois: **QB Isaac Harker** threw for 325 yards, **RB Roland Genesy** rushed for 106 yards and **WR Miles Thompson** hauled in 152 yards receiving.
- **Miles Thompson's** 152-yard day vs. South Dakota and 147-yard day at SIU are the first back-to-back 100-yard games by a Sycamore receiver since **Gary Owens** did so in 2014 (199 vs. Tenn. Tech; 107 at Ball State). Thompson's performances are also the first back-to-back 100-yard games by any combination of ISU receivers since Owens (102) and Tonyan (172) did so at Youngstown State and Western Illinois in 2014.
- Against South Dakota, senior **LB Jameer Thurman** became the 16th Sycamore to ever join the 300-tackle club. At 322 career stops, Thurman sits 13th all-time in total tackles, one shy of tying Tony Albrinck (1998-2001) for 12th at 323. The list is led by current LB coach **Aaron Archie's** 428 career tackles.
- Thurman is ISU's active career leader in: tackles (322), solo tackles (161), assisted tackles (161), tackles for loss (28.0), forced fumbles (7), fumble recoveries (5) and interceptions (5).



**SYCAMORES IN THE NATIONAL POLLS/V.S. RANKED TEAMS**

- Indiana State briefly jumped into the national top-25 following an upset over No. 9 Illinois State at home on Sept. 24. The Sycamores fell out the previous week after a 45-24 loss to Missouri State.
- ISU is 1-2 against ranked opponents this year with a win vs. No. 9 Illinois State (34-31, Sept. 24) and losses at No. 13 Western Illinois (36-35, Oct. 8) and No. 14 Youngstown State (13-10, Oct. 29).
- Indiana State has ranked in any variation of the national polls 52 times since joining the Valley in 1986.
- Since joining the Valley, the Sycamores have reached a high ranking of No. 14 three times: 1989 (Preseason), 1995 (Nov. 6) and 2012 (Oct. 29).
- Prior to joining the MVFC, the Sycamores reached an all-time high ranking of No. 1 in the nation during the 1984 Playoff season.
- The Sycamores have faced the No. 1 team in the nation 10 times since joining the Valley, going 1-9 in such games. ISU's one victory came at No. 1 North Dakota State on Oct. 13, 2012, winning 17-14 in the Fargodome.
- The Sycamores own a 16-88 all-time record against Top-25 teams, which includes a 12-68 mark against ranked MVFC schools.
- Since joining the Valley, Indiana State is 20-25 as a ranked team.
- While ranked, Indiana State is 3-10 all-time vs. other ranked MVFC schools, all wins coming in 2014 vs. No. 10 Northern Iowa on Oct. 4 (20-19), at No. 19 Southern Illinois on Oct. 25 (41-26) and at No. 15 Youngstown State on Nov. 15 (27-24, OT).

**INDIANA STATE HEAD COACH MIKE SANFORD**

**HEAD COACH MIKE SANFORD**

Indiana State head coach **Mike Sanford** (Southern California, 1978) is 34-71 (.324) overall in his ninth season as a head coach and is 18-28 (.391) in his fourth season with Indiana State. He is 9-21 all-time in MVFC games, including a 5-10 mark at home and an 4-11 mark on the road. During his career, he is 24-28 in all home games, 10-43 on the road and 12-12 in games decided by three points or less. With the Sycamores, Sanford is 1-2 in overtime games and 0-1 in shutouts. Saturday's game is Sanford's 47th as the Indiana State head coach and his 106th as a collegiate head coach.

Thompson's performances are also the first back-to-back 100-yard games by any combination of ISU receivers since Owens (102) and Tonyan (172) did so at Youngstown State and Western Illinois in 2014.

• **QB Isaac Harker** threw just his second multi-interception game of his career at Youngstown State on Oct. 29, also being held to a career-low 148 yards passing after being sacked a career-high seven times.

• Harker threw for 336 yards and three touchdowns at Southern Illinois, his second consecutive 300-yard performance. After not having a single 300-yard passer in 2015, Harker has led ISU to four 300-yard games in nine chances this season.

• Harker's 336-yard day at SIU and 325-yard day vs. South Dakota are the first back-to-back 300-yard games since **Mike Perish** had two separate streaks of three games in 2014.

• At 2,485 yards this season, Harker ranks second the MVFC in passing yards and ranks sixth in the FCS. Harker also ranks in the national top-15 in passing yards (6th, 2,485), passing touchdowns (6th, 19 TDs), passing yards per game (11th, 276.1 YPG) and completions per game (13th, 22.67/game).

• On the season, Harker stands 204-of-348 (58.6%) for 2,485 yards, 19 TD and 7 INT. Currently, Harker is on pace for a 3,037-yard, 23 TD season. The ISU single season record for TD passes is 21, set by **Mike Perish** in 2014.

• Harker did not throw an interception in his first 146 career pass attempts (142 coming this season), his first coming late against No. 9 Illinois State on Sept. 24.

• Harker opened the game vs. Missouri State with a 38-yard TD strike to **WR Miles Thompson** on the first offensive play of the game. This was the second time in three weeks Harker led the Sycamores to a score on the first play of the game after a 75-yard play-action wheel-route TD to **RB Dimitri Taylor** at SEMO.

• Harker has 35 passing plays of 20 yards or longer this season, including 14 that are 30 yards or longer and five plays of 50 yards or longer -- a 56-yard TD to **WR Bob Pugh** vs. Butler, a 58-yard gain on a tipped pass to **WR Clayton Smith** at Minnesota, a 75-yard wheel-route TD to **RB Dimitri Taylor** at SEMO, a 65-yard TD pass to **WR Robert Tonyan Jr.** on a tipped pass (which broke the all-time receiving TD record at ISU for Tonyan) and an 85-yard TD pass to **WR Miles Thompson** at SIU. In 2015, the Sycamore offense only had two passing plays of 50 yards or longer, neither for a TD.

• That 85-yard pass from Harker to Thompson is the longest offensive play by the Sycamores since Nov. 1, 2014, when **LeMonte Booker** broke off a run of 87 yards vs. Missouri State.

• Thompson's 85-yard reception at SIU is the second-longest in school history (88: Nov. 16, 1974, **Greg Washington** to **Rick Carr**, at WIU; Oct. 4, 1975, **Greg Washington** to **Dennis Wilkerson**, vs. Ball State), and just the fifth 80-yard pass play since ISU joined the MVFC in 1986. Other 80-yard passes since include plays of 84 (Sept. 14, 2002, at Ball State, **Julian Reese** to **Jake Shields**), 80 (Oct. 15, 2011, vs. WIU, **Ronnie Fouch** to **Alex Jones**), 80 (Oct. 24, 1998, at SIU, **Sheraton Fox** to **Matt Nelson**) and 80 (Oct. 18, 1986, vs. Illinois State, **Kyle Frondorf** to **Chris Johnson**).

**2,000-YARD CLUB**

Senior **WR Robert Tonyan Jr.** can't stop making history, as his incredible final season at Indiana State saw another milestone added to the list. With 40 yards and one touchdown on five catches at No. 14 Youngstown State, Tonyan became just the second Sycamore receiver to ever eclipse the 2,000-yard mark over a career. At 2,026 career yards, Tonyan also stands within reason of the all-time record, sitting just 22 yards off **Terry Bell's** second place mark of 2,048 and 359 yards off **Sam Logan's** record of 2,385. This latest milestone adds to others from this season, such as breaking the all-time career receiving TD record of 15 at Western Illinois (currently at 20 career scores) and tying and breaking the single-season receiving TD record of eight at Southern Illinois (currently at 10 this season).

**ALL-TIME LEADER (AND STILL CLIMBING)**

Senior **WR Robert Tonyan Jr.** became Indiana State's all-time leader in receiving touchdowns at No. 13 Western Illinois on Oct. 8, and did so in truly entertaining fashion. Following a Western score to briefly take back the lead early in the second quarter, Tonyan was in the right place at the right time to haul in an errant Isaac Harker pass intended for **WR Clayton Smith**, which hit off two different people before Tonyan snagged it out of the air behind the secondary with 65 yards of daylight for his 16th career score. With the touchdown, Tonyan broke Joe Downing's all-time record of 15 set in 1985. Since, Tonyan has extended the career record to 20 TDs.

**THRICE AS NICE, PART DEUX**

Most receivers would be lucky to receive three touchdowns in one game during their career, but most receivers aren't **Robert Tonyan Jr.** The 6-5, 230-pound senior tore up yet another Big Ten secondary for a monster eight-catch, 90-yard day and three touchdowns at Minnesota on Sept. 12. This came on the heels of a very impressive three touchdown performance at No. 3 Illinois State in the rain in 2015, which included a superb one-handed snare that ended up as the No. 4 play of the day on SportsCenter's Top-10. Tonyan is the only Sycamore to ever have two separate three touchdown games. In his career as a WR, Tonyan has 16 receptions for 211 yards and four TDs against three Big Ten teams (Indiana in 2014, Purdue in 2015 and Minnesota in 2016), and he has 19 catches for 243 yards and four scores against all FBS schools when ISU's upset at Ball State in 2014 is included.

**HISTORY AT SALUKI STADIUM**

The final score only ended up 22-14 in Indiana State's third-straight road win over Southern Illinois on SIU's Homecoming, but the Sycamores did something in Carbondale on Saturday they had never done in 112 years of football. Wide receivers **Miles Thompson** and **Robert Tonyan Jr.** both recorded 100-yard games receiving, marking the first time in Indiana State history that multiple receivers had ever eclipsed the century mark. Thompson, who had been on a tear with two consecutive 100-yard games, tallied 147 yards receiving – 85 of which coming on a long TD pass. Tonyan, meanwhile, recorded 131 yards and two touchdowns on eight catches. Combined this season the duo have caught 85 passes for 1,256 yards and 16 TDs and rank fourth (Tonyan, 75.3 YPG) and sixth (Thompson, 72.2 YPG) in the Valley in receiving.

**MILES AHEAD**

Redshirt junior **WR Miles Thompson** has been on a torrid pace lately, quickly becoming **QB Isaac Harker's** favorite checkdown option and deep field threat opposite **Robert Tonyan Jr.** After missing the season opener, Thompson has gone on to put forth a 578-yard season with six scores, ranking sixth in the Valley at 72.2 YPG. Thompson's consecutive games vs. South Dakota and at Southern Illinois were especially explosive for Thompson, who became the first Sycamore receiver to record consecutive 100-yard games since **Gary Owens** did so in 2014. Against South Dakota, Thompson exploded for 152 yards and two touchdowns in ISU's double OT loss to the Coyotes – the biggest receiver output since Tonyan recorded 172 vs. Western Illinois in 2014. At Southern Illinois, Thompson had a similar day with 147 yards and an 85-yard touchdown reception – the longest play from scrimmage by the Sycamores since **LeMonte Booker's** 87-yard run vs. Missouri State in 2014 and the longest pass reception since ISU joined the MVFC in 1986.

**FIRST TO 2,000**

Sophomore **QB Isaac Harker** has had a stellar year as ISU's starting QB, becoming the first Valley signal caller to cross the 2,000-yard mark passing this season after another 300-yard game vs. South Dakota on Oct. 15. Harker threw for 300 yet again at Southern Illinois, throwing for 336 yards and three scores in ISU's 22-14 victory over the Salukis – marking the first consecutive 300-yard games by a Sycamore QB since current WR coach **Mike Perish** threw for 300 or more in three straight games twice during the 2014 playoff season. On the season, Harker stands at 2,485 yards passing – sixth-most in the FCS. Harker's 19 passing touchdowns also rank sixth in the FCS, and he sits just two shy of tying Perish's single-season record of 21 set in 2014.

**300-100-100**

Although the Sycamores lost in double overtime to South Dakota, the ISU offense did something it hadn't done since the 2014 FCS Playoff season. **QB Isaac Harker** threw for 325 yards and three touchdowns, **RB Roland Genesy** rumbled for 106 yards rushing, and **WR Miles Thompson** had a career day with 152 yards and three touchdowns – the first 300-100-100 game for the Sycamores since Oct. 25, 2014, at Southern Illinois. That game, the Sycamore offense led the way to a 41-26 victory on SIU's Homecoming that featured 353 passing yards and four touchdowns from current WR coach **Mike Perish**, 142 yards and one touchdown rushing by **RB Buck Logan**, and 129 yards and two touchdowns receiving by **WR Kyani Harris**.

## INDIANA STATE DEFENSIVE/SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

• Against South Dakota, senior **LB Jameer Thurman** became the 16th Sycamore to ever join the 300-tackle club. At 322 career stops, Thurman sits 13th all-time in total tackles, one shy of tying Tony Albrinck (1998-2001) for 12th at 323. The list is led by current LB coach **Aaron Archie's** 428 career tackles.

• Thurman is ISU's active career leader in: tackles (322), solo tackles (161), assisted tackles (161), tackles for loss (28.0), forced fumbles (7), fumble recoveries (5) and interceptions (5).

• Thurman is coming off a game at No. 14 Youngstown State that saw a 15-yard interception return and a forced fumble. Thurman has five career interceptions that he has returned for 70 total yards.

• The previous week Thurman had a 13-tackle game at Southern Illinois on Oct. 22, his fourth double-digit tackle game this season.

• Thurman ranks in the top-10 in the Valley in: forced fumbles (1st, 4), fumble recoveries (4th, 2), tackles for loss (4th, 9.0 (1.0/game) and total tackles (8th, 74, 8.2/game). Thurman's four forced fumbles ranks seventh nationally this season.

• Thurman was the catalyst for the Sycamores at Western Illinois, recovering a muffed punt that sparked a 21-0 run and returning his fourth-career interception for his first-career score during said run.

• Thurman had a monster day vs. Missouri State on Oct. 1 with 14 tackles (seven solo), 4.0 TFL for a loss of 12 yards, and a forced fumble on a sack of MSU QB Brodie Lambert that briefly turned the tide for the Sycamores in the second quarter.

• JUCO transfer **LB Justin Hornsby** has two career days in the previous two games at Southern Illinois and No. 14 Youngstown State. Against the Salukis, Hornsby recorded 4.0 TFL for a loss of 22 yards and 2.5 sacks for a loss of 18, accounting for half of ISU's 8.0 TFL vs. SIU, with his 4.0 tying for the 13th-highest single-game total in the FCS this season.

• At Youngstown State, Hornsby became the first Sycamore to block a field goal since Johnny Towalid did so at Indiana in 2012.

• Indiana State has recorded at least 5.0 TFL in seven of nine games this season with 8.0 or more in four of ISU's last six games.

• Five different Sycamores currently sit with 5.0 TFL or more on the season: **LB Jameer Thurman** (9.0, 27 yards), **DL Kenyota Rollins** (7.5, 23 yards), **LB Cedric Doxy** (6.5, 19 yards), **DL Conlan Cassidy** (6.0, 23 yards) and **LB Justin Hornsby** (5.5, 25 yards). Combined, these five own 34.5 of ISU's 55.0 TFL for 117 yards lost.

• Nine different Sycamores have had their hands in a turnover this season, as ISU has forced 11 fumbles (and recovered nine) while also picking off five passes. ISU has also scored two TDs on defense: a 100-yard fumble return TD by **DB Tsali Lough** and a 32-yard INT return TD by **LB Jameer Thurman**.

• Senior **DL Conlan Cassidy** had a career game against South Dakota, leading ISU in tackles with 11, 3.0 TFL for a loss of 10 yards, one sack for a loss of eight yards and a fumble recovery returned six yards. Cassidy leads Indiana State with 3.5 sacks, and is now ISU's active career leader in sacks with 7.5.

• Senior safety **Tsali Lough** returned a fumble 100 yards for a TD in the season opener vs. Butler, the fourth 100-yard play in Indiana State history, but the first fumble return. The other three were interception returns: **Marty Murray** (Sept. 17, 1977, vs. Southern Illinois), **Vencie Glenn** (Sept. 1, 1984, vs. Wayne State) and **Travis Starks** (Sept. 19, 2015, vs. Southeast Missouri).

• ISU held Youngstown State to 291 yards of total offense, a season-low for ISU opponents and the lowest since holding YSU to 226 in the 2015 season finale.

• The Sycamores also held YSU to just 101 yards passing last week, the lowest opponent total against ISU since holding YSU to just 74 in the 2015 season finale.

• Indiana State held Southern Illinois to just 90 yards rushing, the lowest output by an opposing offense since holding Southern Illinois to 27 yards rushing at SIU on Oct. 25, 2014.

• Under head coach **Mike Sanford** and defensive coordinator **Brian Cabral**, the Sycamore defense has held opponents to under 400 yards of total offense in 30 of 46 games played. (nine each in 2013 and 2014, six in 2015, six in 2016). In those games, Indiana State is 16-14.



**300 TACKLE CLUB**

Senior **LB Jameer Thurman** recorded eight total tackles in ISU's 33-30 loss to South Dakota in 2OT three weeks ago, pushing him over the career 300-tackle milestone. Thurman is the 16th Sycamore to ever pass the threshold, currently sitting 13th all-time with 322 career stops. At his current pace, Thurman would end his career as the 11th-best tackler in school history with 338 stops.

**JAMEER THURMAN: #20 IN YOUR PROGRAMS...**

...but No. 1 as the active leader in several statistical categories among Sycamore defenders. Thurman has been a consistent force for the Sycamores during the last four years, and he ranks as the active leader in: total tackles (322), solo tackles (161), assisted tackles (161), tackles for loss (28.0), forced fumbles (7), fumble recoveries (5) and interceptions (5).

**ALL-MVFC RESUME**

Senior **LB Jameer Thurman** has had a superb final season with the Sycamores as the leader of the ISU defense, and should factor into a handful of postseason awards. Thurman has an incredible line of 74 tackles, 9.0 TFL, 1.0 sacks, two interceptions for 47 yards and one touchdown, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Thurman ranks eighth in the Valley in total tackles (8.2/game), fourth in TFL and leads the conference in forced fumbles – the latter also ranking seventh in the FCS. Thurman has also had double-digit tackles in four of nine games this season, a year in which he became the 16th member of ISU's 300-tackle club.

**MESS WITH THE BULL...**

...and get the Hornsby. JUCO transfer **LB Justin Hornsby** has been a surprise catalyst for the Sycamore defense the past two weeks, sparking ISU with a handful of spectacular plays. At Southern Illinois on Oct. 22, Hornsby had a monster day with 4.0 TFL and 2.5 sacks, and this past week Hornsby came up with a huge blocked field goal – the first blocked field goal by a Sycamore since 2012 when Johnny Towalid did so at Indiana.

**DEFENSE WINS**

The Sycamore defense has given up a handful of large offensive outputs under head coach **Mike Sanford** and defensive coordinator **Brian Cabral**, but a closer look at the numbers reveals that the Sycamores have been fairly consistent at keeping their own offense in the game. In 46 games coached at Indiana State, the duo have kept opponents to under 400 yards of total offense 30 times, going 16-14 in such games. In the last four years under their leadership, the Sycamores have only given up 500 yards or more eight times -- only four such occurrences coming from fellow FCS schools, the other four coming from FBS Big Ten Opponents Minnesota (593; Sept. 10, 2016), Purdue (540; Sept. 12, 2015) and Indiana (566, Aug. 30, 2014; 632, Aug. 29, 2013).

**CHAOS IS A LADDER...**

...and the Sycamores have climbed it to their advantage in the backfield this season. A key component to defensive coordinator **Brian Cabral's** shifting scheme, the Sycamores have tallied up 56.0 TFL for a loss of 201 yards. The Sycamores have recorded 14.0 sacks for a loss of 96 yards this season as well. In nine games, the Sycamore defense has recorded at least 5.0 TFL in seven contests -- averaging 27.7 yards lost in those contests. A total of 20 different Sycamores have had their hands in the TFL fun, with seven recording 3.0 or more and five with 5.5 or more.

**JOSHUA APPEL: ALL-AMERICAN**

Sycamore fans may not want to see the punter in action, but they had best pay close attention to who is snapping him the ball, as Indiana State may have the best long snapper in college football in 2016. Senior **Joshua Appel** continues to dazzle at camps around the country, and this past summer he was rewarded with a spot on the First-Team on the STATS FCS Preseason All-American team.

Appel was also a Preseason honoree in 2015 as a Second-Team member, and was named a First-Team All-American at the end of the season. Appel, a senior finance major from Normal, Ill., is a two-time winner of the well-known long snapping camp hosted by Chris Rubio. This summer, Appel bested 37 of the best long-snappers in the United States to take the overall title at the Rubio camp.

"It is with great anticipation that I welcome our new head football coach, Mr. Mike Sanford to the Sycamore Athletics Family," ISU A.D. Ron Prettyman said. "He is a tremendous football coach and an even better person to lead our young men in our football program. His experience, his work ethic, his commitment to education, family and faith are all qualities that will help to shape the future of our program for years to come. Please join me in welcoming Coach Sanford to Indiana State University and Terre Haute."

Sanford is considered one of the nation's top offensive minds and comes to Indiana State from Utah State, where he spent the 2012 season as the assistant head coach, running backs and tight ends coach on Gary Andersen's staff.

"I am extremely excited and passionate about becoming the new head coach of the Sycamore football program," Sanford said. "I look forward to continuing and building upon what this team accomplished over the past three seasons. I especially want to thank Indiana State University President Dan Bradley and Director of Athletics Ron Prettyman for this opportunity."

The Aggies were ranked No. 18 in the Associated Press Poll, No. 20 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll and finished No. 22 in the Bowl Championship Series standings in 2012. The Aggies defeated Toledo in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl played in Boise, Idaho on Sat., Dec. 15 by the score of 45-13.

Utah State had one of its best overall seasons in school history in 2012 with an 11-2 record, setting a single-season school record for victories, including a school-record six at home. USU also won six league games for just the second time in the history of the program and posted the school's first-ever perfect 6-0 conference record en route to the Western Athletic Conference Championship. The Aggies captured their first-ever road victory over a nationally-ranked team when they downed No. 19 Louisiana Tech by the score of 48-41 in overtime. Utah State appeared in the Associated Press Poll for three consecutive weeks for the first time in school history as well as the ESPN/USA Coaches Poll' and BCS standings for the first time ever.

Under Sanford's tutelage, Utah State senior running back Kerwynn Williams led the team with 1,277 rushing yards on 200 carries (106.4 YPG) with 12 touchdowns and also led the team with 43 catches for 663 yards and five TDs. Williams led the team with 24 big plays of over 20 yards (17-rushing and 7 receiving), including receptions of 74, 76, and 86 yards. The Aggie offense averaged 44.8 points and 502 yards of total offense per game over the final six contests of the year, highlighted by senior tight end Kellen Bartlett, who had 18 receptions for 111 yards and four touchdowns.

Williams was one of 17 Utah State players to take home All-Western Athletic Conference honors, as he was named to the first team. Bartlett took home Honorable Mention All-WAC honors as well. Of Williams' seven career 100-yard rushing performances, six came in 2012 under Sanford's tutelage. The Aggies were second in the WAC and 26th nationally in total offense (460.5 YPG) as well as second in the WAC

and 37th nationally in rushing offense, totaling 192.5 YPG in 2012.

"I'm really happy for Mike. He wants to be a head football coach again and it's hard to get those jobs," said former USU and current Oregon State head coach Gary Andersen. "I know it's hard for him to leave Utah State University, but he feels like this is a great opportunity and he has made a decision that he thinks betters himself and his family. I'm very supportive of it and I wish him and his family all the best.

Sanford came to Utah State after two seasons at Louisville, where, as offensive coordinator and tight ends coach, he helped improve the Cardinals' offensive passing, from nine touchdown passes in 2009 to 20 in 2010. Louisville scored 23 or more points in nine games, including 56 in a win against Memphis. Sanford also mentored Louisville tight end Cameron Graham, who earned First-Team All-Big East Conference accolades after catching 40 passes for 470 yards and five touchdowns.

Prior to Louisville, Sanford was head coach at UNLV from 2005-09, where he took over a program that was coming off four consecutive losing seasons. His five seasons at UNLV tied for the third-longest coaching stint in Rebel football history. The Sanford-led Rebels made national headlines in 2008 with an upset win at No. 13 Arizona State. Under Sanford, UNLV's offense set several school records in 2008, highlighted by tying for the top red zone scoring offense percentage (.950) in the nation, matching Ohio State. UNLV's offense was also 15th in the nation in sacks allowed (1.2/game).

During his time at UNLV, Sanford coached 29 All-Mountain West Conference honorees, including 2007 MWC Defensive Player of the Year Beau Bell, and 2006 MWC Freshman of the Year Ryan Wolfe, who went on to earn three first-team selections. In Sanford's offense, Casey Flair set a school record and tied a MWC record with 47 consecutive games with a reception.

At UNLV, Sanford replaced his college head coach, John Robinson, who retired after a legendary career that included six seasons with the Rebels.

"Mike Sanford is an outstanding football coach," said Mike Hamrick, the Director of Athletics at Marshall (and Athletic Director at UNLV at the time of his hiring in Las Vegas). "He is a man of integrity and will run a football program that the entire Indiana State University family will be proud of. His teams at UNLV were very competitive and had many big wins over teams such as Utah, Arizona State, Iowa State, Air Force and many others. His reputation as having a brilliant offensive mind is well documented. He will give everything he has to continue the success of Indiana State football."

Sanford spent the 2003 and 2004 seasons at Utah as offensive coordinator under head coach Urban Meyer and was part of the Utes' 21-2 overall and 13-1 Mountain West two-year stretch, including a 12-0 overall and 7-0 league mark and victory in the 2005 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl over Pittsburgh (35-7).

After the Utes finished last in the Mountain West in scoring offense the season before his arrival, Sanford led Utah to the No. 3 ranking in the nation at 43.3 points per game, third in total offense (499.8 YPG), third in passing efficiency (173.41) and boasted Heisman Trophy finalist Alex Smith, who went on to become the top pick in the 2005 NFL Draft by the San Francisco 49ers. Smith was second in the NCAA in passing efficiency (176.52) and fifth in total offense (298.6 YPG).

During that same season, Utah boasted one of the nation's most balanced offensive attacks, averaging 236.06 yards per game on the ground and 263.67 yards through the air.

"Mike is a fine football coach who I got to know well while we coached together at Utah," Ohio State head coach Urban Meyer said. "I wish him all the best as he takes over the Indiana State program."

Sanford was offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Stanford in 2002, returning to the college ranks after three seasons in the NFL as wide receivers coach with the San Diego Chargers from 1999-2001.

"Mike Sanford is a tremendous football coach, but just as important he is great with young people," said current Nebraska head coach Mike Riley. "He will be a great leader of the program and an excellent teacher for the young men of the Indiana State team. This is a terrific hire for the University."

Sanford's NCAA Division I coaching experience includes stints at Notre Dame, USC, Purdue, Long Beach State, Virginia Military Institute and Army.

As an assistant coach, Sanford has participated in 12 bowl games with five different programs. As the wide receivers coach at USC from 1989-96, Sanford assisted in two Pac-10 championships and two Rose Bowl victories (vs. Michigan in 1990 and Northwestern in 1996). Three of his Trojan receivers were selected in the first round of the NFL Draft: Curtis Conway in 1992, Johnnie Morton in 1993 and Keyshawn Johnson, the No. 1 overall pick in the 1996 draft and a consensus All-American in 1995.

Sanford began his coaching career in 1977 as a graduate assistant at Southern California before earning his bachelor's degree from USC in 1978. Later that year, Sanford started his first full-time coaching position as the defensive coordinator at San Diego City College.

As a player, Sanford was a reserve quarterback for USC's 1973 and 1974 Rose Bowl teams (the 1974 team beat Ohio State for the national championship). He played free safety in 1976 when USC beat Michigan in the Rose Bowl and finished second in the nation.

Sanford, born April 20, 1955, and his wife Melinda have two grown children: a daughter, Lindsay, and a son, Mike, Jr., who is currently the offensive coordinator at Notre Dame. Sanford, Jr., was a Boise State quarterback from 2001-04. Mike and Melinda Sanford also have five grandchildren.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. – Senior Terre Haute native Tsali Lough single-handedly sparked the Sycamores to a 41-25 win over Butler to open the 2016 season at home on Saturday.



The mood inside Memorial Stadium was festive to start, but the Bulldogs (0-1) set a demonstrative tone early with a strong three-and-out and then a long drive to the Indiana State (1-0) one-yard line. And then, the Sycamores awoke.

On second-and-goal from the one, Butler QB Malcolm Weaver appeared to have crossed the plane on a QB sneak, but to the surprise to everyone (including the Bulldogs), Tsali Lough started streaking down the right sideline with the ball under his arm and evaded a tackler near the 20-yard line for a 100-yard touchdown on the fumble recovery.

With the play never being called dead, senior defensive lineman Tyshon Waller appeared to have forced the ball out of Weaver's hands and got it into Lough's, who then sprinted off from the endzone for the score.

The play is the fourth 100-yard play in Indiana State history, but the first for a fumble return (the other three being interception returns). In fact, this is the second-consecutive season with a 100-yard defensive touchdown for the Sycamores, as Travis Starks took an interception 100 yards to swing the momentum against Southeast Missouri on Sept. 19, 2015.

That was just the beginning for Lough and the defense. On the very next offensive play after the kickoff, Lough struck again with an interception of a Weaver pass to the right sideline. Lough's play setup a strong ISU offensive drive that culminated with sophomore QB Isaac Harker – named the starter at gametime – to run a one-yard QB sneak for the first Sycamore score of the season.

Harker, a native of Lebanon, Ind., had a tremendous day to begin his Sycamore career as a starter. His final line read 21-of-35 for 315 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions, in effect becoming the first 300-yard passer since Mike Perish in 2014.

Part of that was due to the incredible receiving corps surrounding Harker – led by senior NFL prospect Robert Tonyan Jr. Tonyan hauled in seven passes for 92 yards to lead the crew, and new tight end Jacquet McClendon had four for 65 yards and JUCO transfer Bob Pugh excited with three catches for 94 yards and a touchdown – including a 56-yard bomb down the right seam from Harker in the third quarter. Pugh followed that up with a 90-plus yard kick return that was eventually called back.

Despite a tremendous start for the Sycamore offense, the story of the day was the clutch play of the defense. Butler out-gained ISU in rushing yards (145-124) and wasn't far off in total offense (439-390 ISU), but the difference of the game came from the three lost fumbles and one interception thrown on Saturday.

Joining Lough in the fun in the turnover department was senior leader Jameer Thurman, who began his final season as a Sycamore with six tackles, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

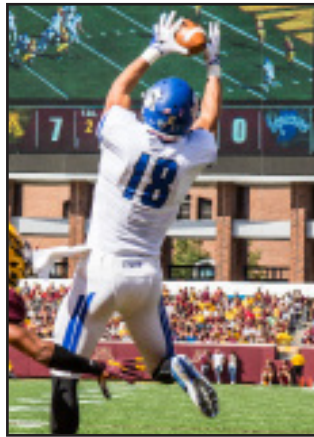

**MINNEAPOLIS** – Despite a handful of strong offensive performances, Indiana State couldn't keep up with a strong Minnesota Golden Gopher squad, falling 58-28 at TCF Bank Stadium on Saturday afternoon.



The Sycamores (1-1) put up 28 points (21 coming in the second half off the play of Isaac Harker and Robert Tonyan Jr.), but Minnesota (2-0) racked up 593 yards of total offense and strung together a 34-0 run in the process to put Indiana State away.

"We need to play better," said ISU head coach Mike Sanford. "The one thing when I look at our team is that I think we had a little bit of a false sense of security after last week's win, and there are a bunch of things we need to learn on and improve on as a result of today's game."

Early on, though, it seemed the time was right for a Sycamore upset. Minnesota struggled with drops on its first drive of the game, but was able to eventually score on a 10-play, 60-yard drive. The Sycamores responded in kind with a very strong 11-play, 85-yard drive that featured a surreal 58-yard reception by Clayton Smith on a tipped ball by Bob Pugh and a beautiful seven-yard lob to the back corner of the endzone from Harker to Tonyan – the first of three TD connections between them on Saturday.

And then all that momentum drained away quickly. Minnesota scored rapidly after what appeared to be a botched onside kick (in his postgame press conference Coach Sanford admitted there was a communication error), and rode that momentum swing to a 34-0 run that the Sycamores couldn't recover from.

What stood out for the Sycamores on Saturday, though, were a handful of stellar offensive performances against a Big Ten defense. Sophomore quarterback Isaac Harker – in just his second-career start – was superb yet again, throwing 20-of-36 for 237 yards three touchdowns and zero interceptions. Harker even caught a TD pass from Bob Pugh on a reverse WR pass from Bob Pugh to break the 34-0 run.

"I have a lot more respect for the receivers now, because when you're that wide-open it's like 'I gotta catch it!' It's a lot different than just throwing the ball around. When you're that wide-open you think about the catch more."

Senior WR Robert Tonyan Jr. once again proved why he is one of the best in the MVFC with an eight catch, 90-yard performance that included three impressive touchdown receptions – making him the first Sycamore to ever catch three touchdowns in two separate games after his three-score performance at No. 3 Illinois State in 2015.

Tonyan also isn't far off from the all-time career touchdown record of 15 set by Steve Schmid in 1968, as he currently sits at 13 career scores.

And speaking of Pugh, the JUCO transfer was the next leading receiver with three catches for 59 yards. He also recorded the passing touchdown to Harker and had 78 yards on two long kick returns.

CAPE GIRARDEAU, Mo. – Indiana State gave its fans an intense feeling of déjà vu at Houck Stadium on Saturday night, as the Sycamores once again prevailed in an absurd final quarter of play to defeat Southeast Missouri, 27-24.

The 2015 edition saw three different two-point conversion tries and a last second touchdown as time expired in its final two minutes, and the final five minutes of the 2016 edition gave its predecessor a run for its money in terms of excitement.



"It was a great team win," said ISU head coach Mike Sanford. "Our guys found a way to win on the road, and it's not easy to win on the road. I've got to give (SEMO) a lot of credit, they played well. They're a good team, and they're going to be very competitive in the Ohio Valley."

Down 24-13 with only 5:19 left to play, the Sycamores (2-1) seemed likely to lose to the Redhawks (0-3) for the first time since the 2007 season. But Indiana State never quit, and put together two superb drives that the Sycamore offense isn't sure to forget anytime soon.

With 5:19 to play, the Sycamores drove 68 yards on seven plays as the ISU offense once again found its rhythm that propelled it to a 75-yard passing touchdown to RB Dimitri Taylor on the first play of the game. QB Isaac Harker (22-of-36, 302 yards, 3 TD, 0 INT) found RB Jaquan Keys (nine rushes, 53 yards; 2 receptions, 24 yards) for a big first down to start the drive, followed by a 15-yard unsportsmanlike conduct penalty against SEMO, a 19-yard pass to WR Robert Tonyan Jr. (seven receptions, 90 yards, 1 TD) to get into the redzone and a five-yard TD strike to cut the deficit to 24-19 after a failed two-point conversion.

The Sycamore defense followed that up with a clutch three-and-out, capped by a big pass breakup by Rondell Green on 3rd-and-12 to get the Sycamores the ball back with 1:33 left to play.

"All game our coaches were telling us to put the game on us," Green said. "We just came out and played hard and we did what we had to do to get off the field."

What followed was a drive to even rival the one Isaac Harker led in the 2015 season finale against Youngstown State.

Harker was 5-of-9 for 52 yards and converted a fourth down and a third down as the seconds ticked off, capped by a beautiful 15-yard lob to WR Miles Thompson on a short fade route into the endzone – a play that Thompson says was improvised at the line by Harker.

"(What happened) actually wasn't the play at all," Thompson said. "When we broke from the huddle, Harker yelled my name and looked at me and said, 'Run a fade, get open.' I had one thing on my mind: beating the press. When we came off, he threw his outside arm, I knocked it down, I looked up and the ball was coming. Just pitch and catch after that."

Harker once again leaves the game as the hero for the Sycamores, putting up yet another 300 yard game and leading yet another game-winning drive for Indiana State.

**TERRE HAUTE, Ind.** – The Redbirds made it interesting late, but Indiana State held on for a very impressive 34-31 upset of No. 9 Illinois State at an unseasonably warm September day at Memorial Stadium, snapping a five-game skid dating back to 2010.



The Sycamores (3-1, 1-0 MVFC) jumped out to a strong 24-7 lead by the 7:15 mark of the third quarter, but the Redbirds (2-2, 0-1 MVFC) clawed their way back behind starting QB Jake Kolbe, who threw for 258 yards and three touchdowns after not taking a snap in the first half.

Illinois State went on a 24-10 run with Kolbe under center and was replaying history in front of the eyes of Sycamore fans who have watched the Redbirds claw back for close wins in 2014 and 2015. But then, with the Redbirds driving and the Sycamores clinging to a 34-31 lead with less than two minutes to play, the Indiana State defense came through in the clutch.

On second-and-three from the Sycamore 36-yard line, redshirt freshman linebacker Jonas Griffith sacked Kolbe and jarred the ball loose, and junior defensive end Kenyota Rollins was waiting for the recovery. Rollins scooped the ball up and returned it 18 yards to seal victory for the Sycamores and get Indiana State off on the right foot in the grueling MVFC season.

"I knew we needed a stop, and I was just counting on my other teammates on the field to do their job," Rollins said. "I did my job, I was in the right place at the right time and made the play that we needed."

"That was a great win for us," said Indiana State head coach Mike Sanford. "I'm proud of our team and the way we played. One of the things that we preached in our plan to win was that we wanted to win the close games and win the fourth quarter, and that was something we did today. It wasn't pretty, it was a struggle. We didn't make it easy, we didn't make it simple, but we kept fighting, we kept going and we kept finding a way to make plays."

Today's win was even more impressive when you factor in the history. The Sycamores held leads against the highly-ranked Redbirds in both 2014 (20-18) and 2015 (27-24), but lost on late comebacks. That is where the timely play of the Sycamore defense comes into focus, as they made several key stops, racking up a whopping 10.0 tackles for loss for a negative total of 48 yards on the day – including 3.0 sacks for 19 yards, the last being the game-ending forced fumble by Griffith.

"I have to give a lot of credit to our defense," Sanford said. "They made the plays at the critical times at the end of the game. I think it was really good timing by Coach Cabral and our defensive staff to call the right blitz at the right time. We found a way to make plays when we needed to."

The Sycamore offense was rolling early with 216 of its 445 yards of total offense in the first half. That success continued into the third quarter, where sophomore QB Isaac Harker orchestrated a beautiful 13-play, 93-yard scoring drive that ended with a two-yard TD run by senior RB Roland Genesy with 7:15 to play in the third.

Although Harker had another fine day at 24-of-42 for 237 yards and two touchdowns (and his first-career interception), the story of the day on offense was the play of the Indiana State running backs. Genesy recorded his first-career 100-yard game with 112 yards and two scores on 16 carries – including a clutch 15-yard run right after the Rollins fumble recovery late in the game to all but seal victory for the Sycamores with a first down in Redbird territory.

Dimitri Taylor added 70 yards on the ground as well to give Indiana State 208 total rushing yards

Also having strong days were seniors Tsali Lough (11 tackles) and Jameer Thurman (10 tackles, 1.5 TFL, one forced fumble) who led a formidable front against what turned into a potent Redbird offensive attack in the back half.

"Three years ago, they beat the crap out of us," senior safety Tsali Lough said. "Two years ago, we were up and they came back and beat us. Last year, they came back and won. When we talk about having chips on our shoulders, those are what we talk about. We were talking about it all week."

Today's win marks the first top-25 victory for the Sycamores since Nov. 15, 2014, when they topped No. 15 Youngstown State, 27-24, at YSU in overtime. This also marks the first top-10 win for Indiana State since beating No. 10 Northern Iowa 20-19 earlier that season on Oct. 4.

"We stayed together in the midst of a lot of adversity where you could drift apart and start blaming each other and start getting frustrated, and they just kept fighting back," Sanford said. "It was just a belief that we were finally going to find a way to win."

**TERRE HAUTE, Ind.** — The first half saw 566 total yards of offense and a 24-24 tie, but No. 24 Indiana State was held scoreless in the second half as Missouri State pulled away for a 45-24 victory in front 6,871 for Homecoming at Memorial Stadium on Saturday.



The Sycamores (3-2, 1-1 MVFC) were looking for their first 2-0 conference start since the 2011 season, but the Bears (3-1, 1-0 MVFC) had other thoughts. MSU racked up 473 yards of total offense and, even though the Sycamores put up a season-high 344 passing yards, the Bears were able to stifle ISU to just 38 yards rushing overall and 116 total yards in the second half in the midst of a 21-0 MSU run to close the game.

"Very disappointing game," said ISU head coach Mike Sanford. "I've got to give credit to Missouri State. They're a good football team, and I knew they were coming in. Everybody in our league is good. There is nobody in our league that's not good, and there is nobody in our league that can't beat somebody else on any given weekend."

However, the opening minutes of the game held the exact opposite outlook for the Sycamores. Senior DB Lonnell Brown Jr. took the opening kickoff back 59 yards, and on the first offensive play of the game sophomore QB Isaac Harker (35-of-52, 344 yards, one TD, two INTs) found WR Miles Thompson (five receptions, 83 yards, one TD) on a beautiful seam fade for a 38-yard score by the 14:42 mark of the first quarter.

MSU then went on two superb scoring drives that totaled 23 plays and 152 yards to take a 10-7 lead. ISU senior RB Roland Genesy (13 carries, 54 yards, two TDs) countered with a four-yard TD run in the closing seconds of the first quarter to regain the lead at 14-10. However, that would be the last lead of the day for the Sycamores.

The MSU trio of QB Brodie Lambert (24-of-35, 279 yards, three TDs), WR Malik Earl (11 receptions, 161 yards, two TDs) and RB Calan Crowder (nine carries, 131 yards, three TDs) proved unstoppable for the Sycamore defense, and it all began with an offensive explosion in the second quarter to drain away what remained of Indiana State's first-quarter momentum.

"(Earl) is a good player," Sanford said. "And their quarterback played well. For all the talk about what happened with the other quarterback (suspended QB Breck Ruddick), (Lambert) played really well. I've got to give them credit, and we have got to play better. We didn't play like we can play."

Crowder started things off on the second play of the second quarter at the 14:42 mark with a 64-yard scamper, the first of his three touchdowns on the day. MSU then tacked on with a massive 69-yard connection between Lambert and Earl at 13:05 after a fourth-down stop of the Sycamore offense.

ISU was able to respond with another Genesy rushing touchdown following a forced fumble by senior LB Jameer Thurman and recovery by LB Antonio Broadus. And despite the first of two interceptions by Isaac Harker coming on the next ISU drive, the Sycamores were able to tie the game 24-24 heading into halftime courtesy of a 39-yard field goal from freshman kicker Jerry Nunez, who remains perfect in 2016 at 7-for-7.

However, that would be the final Sycamore score, as MSU went on a 21-0 run to close out the game in the second half. In addition to only putting up 116 yards of total offense in the second half, the Sycamores recorded four of their five turnovers in the fourth quarter alone.

"We didn't play well enough," Sanford said. "They played well enough. They made the plays when they needed to make them and we didn't. We turned the ball over, we didn't run the football well enough, we gave up too many big plays on defense."

The injury bug also finally hit the Sycamores, with several key players leaving the game to never return on Saturday. Those included Lonnell Brown Jr., starting offensive linemen Matt Byrne, James Lang and Dakota Vermillion, and WR Clayton Smith.

"We've been protected from the injury bug pretty well up until this game," Sanford said. "And then boom-boom-boom, we lost three offensive linemen in James Lang, Matt Byrne and Dakota Vermillion in the second quarter."

Despite all that, the Sycamore defense received a stellar performance out of Thurman, who was a one-man wrecking crew on his final Homecoming in the attempt of keeping ISU in the game. Thurman had a season-high 14 tackles (seven solo), 4.0 TFL (12 yards), 1.0 sacks (seven yards) and one forced fumble that briefly turned the tide back in the Sycamores' direction in the second quarter.

**MACOMB, Ill.** – In a game filled with incredible luck and spectacular plays, the Sycamores fell one lucky break short of an upset of No. 13 Western Illinois, falling 36-35 in a heartbreaker at Hanson Field on Saturday afternoon.



Indiana State (3-3, 1-2 MVFC) and Western (4-1, 1-1 MVFC) slugged it out in a back-and-forth duel of amazing football, but it all came down to 4th-and-1 on the Western 29-yard line with less than a minute to play.

Down 36-35 and on the outskirts of field goal range, the Sycamores lined up on fourth down for what appeared to be a QB sneak. However, as ISU head coach Mike Sanford revealed postgame, the play was designed to draw the Leatherneck defense offsidess to give ISU a little more time to devise a way to score in the final seconds of the game.

It appeared to have worked, too, as WIU linebacker Brett Taylor appeared to have entered the neutral zone, forcing center Matt Byrne to snap the ball. The whistle never blew, though, and the Sycamores' luck ran out as QB Isaac Harker was dropped in the backfield for a two-yard loss to seal victory for Western.

"I think our guys played extremely hard," Sanford said. "I think they played with a lot of character. I think they played with intensity, with will, with desire. I'm proud of them for that. I've got to give credit to Western Illinois, they won the game. They found a way to win the game."

At first, the game looked nothing like its exciting finish. Both teams traded three-and-outs until RB Dimitri Taylor opened up a Pandora's Box of explosive plays for both teams with a long 63-yard run late in the first quarter to set up his own one-yard TD run at the 3:13 mark.

Western responded early in the second quarter on an 11-yard TD scramble by WIU QB Sean McGuire, and then the fun began with two scores coming in the next 29 seconds of gametime.

On the ensuing drive, senior WR Robert Tonyan Jr. became Indiana State's all-time career leader in receiving touchdowns in truly entertaining fashion. On an errant pass from Harker intended for WR Clayton Smith that bounced off two different people, Tonyan was in the right place at the right time to snag the ball out of midair behind the secondary and run 65 yards to the house for the longest TD of his career.

With that career-long reception, Tonyan broke Joe Downing's all-time record of 15 touchdowns set in 1985.

Just 16 seconds later, though, Western responded in kind with a massive 68-yard touchdown strike from McGuire (25-of-43, 363 yards, 3 TD, 2 INT) to Lance Lenoir, who had a monster day against the Sycamore defense with 204 yards and two touchdowns on 11 receptions. The last opposing receiver to break the 200-yard plateau against the Sycamore defense was future NFL Draft pick Laurent Robinson of Illinois State, who hauled in 14 catches for 292 yards and three touchdowns against the Sycamores on Nov. 12, 2005.

That score began a 20-0 run by the Leathernecks, but the Sycamores quickly turned that around with an exhilarating 21-0 run of their own in the third quarter that featured a 10-yard TD run by Jaquan Keys, a 30-yard interception return for a TD by LB Jameer Thurman and a blocked punt by John McDonald-Horner that setup a 10-yard TD run by Roland Genesy.

However, that final score by Genesy at the 3:51 mark in the third would be it for the Sycamore offense, as Western closed out on a 9-0 run in the fourth quarter and came up with the big fourth-down stop with 30 seconds to play.

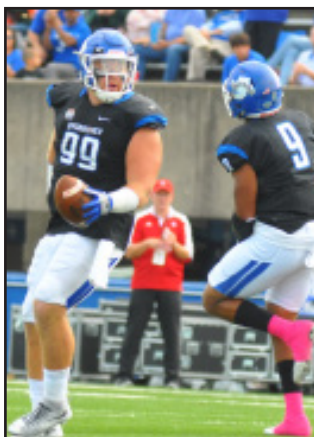

**TERRE HAUTE, Ind.** – Indiana State fought back from an early 17-3 deficit and battled South Dakota to double overtime, but came up short in the second extra period as the Coyotes prevailed, 33-30, at Memorial Stadium on Saturday.



The Sycamores (3-4, 1-3 MVFC) outgained South Dakota (3-3, 2-1 MVFC) 466-341 and had several tremendous performances on the day, but ISU's fate was sealed on 3rd-and-2 in the second overtime.

Down three, ISU pulled out a trick play to go for the win, but WR Kelvin Cook's reverse WR pass came up short and was intercepted by USD's Jacob Warner for the win.

In the beginning stages of the game, though, it appeared that South Dakota wouldn't need to go to double overtime – which, it had done two previous times this season in consecutive weeks vs. Weber State (W, 52-49, 2OT) and at North Dakota (L, 47-44, 2OT). The Coyotes jumped out to a 17-3 lead in the early stages of the first quarter, a run that started thanks to a 69-yard TD pass from Chris Streveler to Alonge Brooks. That play ties for the longest the Sycamores have given up this season (69 yards, Malik Earl TD reception, vs. Missouri State).

But, WR Miles Thompson had other thoughts. The redshirt junior Kentucky transfer had a monster career day with 152 yards and two touchdowns on eight catches, all kick-started by a 46-yard TD strike from QB Isaac Harker (24-of-40, 325 yards, 3 TD, 1 INT) with one minute to play in the first.

Both offenses grew stagnant in the second quarter, but Harker brought things back to life with a 48-yard TD pass to WR Robert Tonyan Jr. (three catches, 59 yards, 1 TD). The Coyotes went on another 10-0 run in the third and held strong until late in the fourth quarter, but Miles Thompson breathed life back into the Sycamores with a 23-yard TD reception with 1:59 left to play to come within three at 27-24.

The game then turned into a war of field goals. Freshman kicker Jerry Nunez, who recorded his first-career miss earlier in the game, nailed a 42-yard score to tie the game 27-27 to force OT. In the first OT period, Nunez hit a career-long 46-yard FG – the same distance he missed on from earlier. USD responded with a 41-yard FG from Miles Bergner, and Bergner hit another 41-yarder in the second overtime for what ended up being the game-winner.

Defensively, the Sycamores were paced by the superb play of defensive lineman Conlan Cassidy. The senior led ISU in tackles with 11 total stops and 3.0 TFL, as well as an acrobatic fumble recovery he returned nine yards to swing the momentum toward the Sycamores.

Also worth mentioning is senior LB Jameer Thurman, who recorded eight tackles and, in the process, became just the 16th Sycamore to ever join the 300-tackle club.

**CARBONDALE, Ill.** – Indiana State rode an impressive aerial performance to a close 22-14 victory over Southern Illinois at Saluki Stadium on Saturday afternoon, marking the third time in as many trips to Carbondale that the Sycamores have spoiled Homecoming for the Salukis.

Indiana State (4-4, 2-3 MVFC) lit up Southern (2-5, 0-4 MVFC) for 438 yards of total offense – 336 of which came through the air thanks to another spectacular day out of QB Isaac Harker (23-of-39, 336 yards, 3 TD) and two extraordinary outputs from receivers Miles Thompson (five catches, 147 yards, 1 TD) and Robert Tonyan Jr. (eight catches, 131 yards, 2 TD).



"It's great to get a win," said ISU head coach Mike Sanford. "During the course of the year we've had two games early that were close games and we found a way to win them, and then we've had two close games the last two weeks that we didn't find a way to win for whatever reason. It's great to get over the hump and find a way to get it done. It wasn't perfect; we had to overcome a lot of adversity, but I'm very proud of our team that we found a way to win today."

Things started out disastrously for the Sycamores, though, as Harker lost a bad snap deep in the ISU red zone barely three minutes into the game. Southern ended up scoring on the drive, but the Sycamore defense helped right the ship from that moment onward, allowing only one more Saluki score the remainder of the game.

Coupled with that was a 22-0 run by the Sycamore offense that found holes in the Saluki defense at the most opportune times.

Senior WR Robert Tonyan Jr. proved invaluable downfield with big catch after big catch, ending his day with 131 yards on eight receptions and two touchdowns. Today, Tonyan broke the all-time single-season receiving touchdown record of eight set by Steve Schmid in 1968 and tied by Gary Owens in 2015, hauling in his eighth and ninth touchdowns of the season.

Today proved a historic one for Indiana State's all-time leader in career receiving touchdowns, as he also moved up to third all-time in career receiving yards (1,986) and second all-time in career receptions (141). Tonyan has a way to go to break Sam Logan's all-time record of 196 career receptions, but he isn't far off from Logan (2,385) and Terry Bell (2,048) on the yards list.

Tonyan also helped make more history with fellow WR Miles Thompson. Combined the duo recorded 13 catches for 278 and three touchdowns, and in the process became the first duo of 100-yard receivers in the entirety of Indiana State Football history.

Much of Thompson's 147 yards came off a monstrous 85-yard TD pass from Harker with 12:34 left to play, the longest play from scrimmage for the Sycamores since LeMonte Booker's 87-yard run vs. Missouri State in 2014. This is Thompson's second consecutive game with 100-yards receiving or more, the first time a Sycamore has done that since Gary Owens in 2014.

Behind all this was sophomore QB Isaac Harker, who posted yet another 300-yard game with 336 yards and three touchdowns. Harker has thrown for 300 yards or more in four of eight games this season, following a season in which no Sycamore threw for 300 yards.

Offense wasn't the only name of the game, though, as two Sycamore linebackers caused plenty of problems for the Salukis on the defensive side of the ball. JUCO transfer Justin Hornsby had an insanely productive day, with 4.0 TFL for a loss of 22 yards and 2.5 sacks for a loss of 18 – on only five total tackles. Senior Jameer Thurman was again ISU's leading tackler with 13 total stops.

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio – Indiana State went toe-to-toe with the dynamic defense of No. 14 Youngstown State, but a 79-yard punt return TD by YSU's Darien Townsend ended up being the difference in ISU's 13-10 loss to the Penguins at Stambaugh Stadium on Saturday night.



The Sycamores (4-5, 2-4 MVFC) led for the first 50 minutes and 21 seconds of play after jumping out to a 10-0 lead in the first quarter, but YSU (6-2, 4-1 MVFC) chipped away with two field goals before the game-winning punt return TD with 9:19 to play.

"I was very proud of the way our team played," said ISU head coach Mike Sanford. "I think we played very hard, I think we played with great focus and great effort. I think our defense was tremendous. There were some situations where I had to decide whether to go for it on fourth down at midfield and I just believed that our defense was going to stop them. I didn't think they'd score. I thought we would cover punts, and unfortunately they are the number one punt return team in the conference and it showed up on that play."

The return came on the finest punt of the evening by ISU punter Thomas Bouldin, who booted it down to the YSU 21 from the ISU 17, but Townsend made a tremendous set of moves to escape a checkmate on the sideline and had a wall of blockers as he cut across to the left sideline for the score.

"It was a great punt, and I don't want to say anything negative about Thomas because that was a great punt," Sanford said. "We just have to cover better. We had our chances to get him down there. We had him trapped down there on the sideline and we let him out. He's a dynamic player and he made a great play."

The Sycamore defense had a very strong defense, forcing the Penguins to five punts, two interceptions and two missed field goals, with the only blight on their resume tonight being 151 rushing yards to former MVFC Freshman of the Year Martin Ruiz. Redshirt freshman Jonas Griffith led the Sycamores with nine tackles and had a leaping interception in the first quarter immediately after a Sycamore score while everything was working in ISU's favor.

The first of those interceptions came from senior LB Jameer Thurman, who returned it 15 yards to setup the lone touchdown on the day from either team, a nine-yard pass from QB Isaac Harker to WR Robert Tonyan Jr.

All cylinders were clicking early for the offense, but the ferocious defensive front of the Penguins eventually got to Harker, sacking him an extraordinary seven times for a massive loss of 65 yards. The secondary of YSU did just as well, picking off Harker twice for only his second multiple interception game of his young career.

"Offensively I thought our plan was good," Sanford said. "I thought we ran the ball against a very good rushing defense. We had some critical situations at the end where we shot ourselves in the foot. We had two false starts in some critical situations in the fourth quarter that put us in long-yardage situations that we weren't able to convert. We've got to perform better on offense at the end in that situation."

The lone bright spot statistically for the Sycamore offense, though, were Tonyan and RB Roland Genesy. Tonyan hauled in five passes for 40 yards and one touchdown, in the process becoming just the third Sycamore to ever pass the 2,000-yard plateau in career receiving yards.

Genesy, along with RB Dimitri Taylor, found holes in the Penguin defense to keep the ball moving for the Sycamores. Genesy ended with 88 yards and zero yards lost after a light week at Southern Illinois following an ankle injury vs. South Dakota. Taylor added in 42 yards rushing.
