## Sycamores Host Nationally Ranked New Mexico In MVC/MWC Challenge Series

### SETTING THE STAGE

Indiana State continues year three of the Greg Lansing era on Saturday, December 1 when the Sycamores (4-1) host No. 23/25 New Mexico (7-0) inside Hulman Center as part of the Missouri Valley/Mountain West Conference Challenge. Tip-off is set for 2:05 p.m. (ET). The game will be broadcast live locally on WTWO-TV with Jason Pensky (pbp) and Jim Waugh (color) on the call. The game can also be heard on the radio via WIBQ 98.5 FM and along the Nelligan Sports Marketing Radio Network with Brian Fritz (pbp) and Matt Renn (analyst) on the call. There will also be a video webcast available on Sycamore Vision on a pay-per-view basis as well as a free audio broadcast online at GoSycamores.com. Details on how to access the Sycamore Vision broadcast can be found on page 2 of this release.

### THE NEW MEXICO SERIES

Indiana State is taking on New Mexico for the first time in the history of the two programs. This game is part of the Missouri Valley/Mountain West Conference Challenge Series, in which the Sycamores are 1-2 all-time. ISU defeated Colorado State at home in 2009, lost at Wyoming and 2010 and fell to Boise State on the road in 2011.

### BOB KING CONNECTION

New Mexico was led from 1962-1972 by head coach Bob King and the Lobo's home court is named in his honor. King was also the head coach at Indiana State from 1975 to 1978 and was the head coach who recruited Larry Bird into the Sycamore basketball program. King was forced to step down prior to the 1978-79 campaign, which ended with the Sycamores playing Michigan State in the NCAA Championship Game, due to health concerns. King was the Director of Athletics at Indiana State from 1974-80.

### THE STEVE ALFORD AND GREG LANSING CONNECTION

New Mexico head coach Steve Alford was at the helm of the Missouri State basketball program from 1995-96 until 1998-99, where he owned a 78-48 record, including a 7-2 mark against Indiana State. Alford was the head coach of Iowa from 1999-00 until 2006-07 and Greg Lansing was an assistant under Alford with the Hawkeyes from 1999-2006. While Saturday's game will be the first between the two as head coaches, Lansing was on the Indiana State staff during each of Alford's four years at Missouri State and they faced each other nine times in Missouri Valley Conference play.

### QUICK HITS

- Lucas Eitel is 14-of-19 from 3-point range this season (73.7 percent), which leads not only the Missouri Valley Conference, but also the nation. Eitel set a school record with his 7-of-7 performance from 3-point range on November 25 against High Point. He tied a school record by hitting seven consecutive triples, and enters the New Mexico contest tied with Jay Tunnell for most consecutive treys made in succession (8) over multiple contests.
- Indiana State is now 4-0 on the season when holding teams to 63 points or less and improved to 30-1 when doing so under third-year head coach Greg Lansing.
- Indiana State has earned 38 close victories (five points or less) since 2005. Under Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 12-5 in close games.

### The Indiana State Head Coach

Indiana State head coach Greg Lansing (South Dakota, 1990) is 42-30 (.583) overall in his third season as a head coach. He is 20-16 all-time in MVC games, including a 13-5 mark at home and a 7-11 record on the road. During his career, he is 24-7 in all home games, 11-18 on the road, 7-5 in neutral court contests and 12-5 in games decided by five points or less. Lansing is 0-0 all-time against New Mexico, and is 0-0 versus the Lobos inside Hulman Center. With the Trees, Lansing is 2-2 in overtime games and 30-1 when holding teams to 63 points or less. Saturday's game will be Greg Lansing's 73rd as Indiana State head coach. Lansing is the second head coach to lead the Sycamores to the NCAA Tournament in their rookie campaign in the history of the program, with the other being Bill Hodges leading ISU to a 33-1 record and a Final Four appearance in the 1979 NCAA Tournament. Lansing was just the 14th rookie head coach in the history of the MVC to lead his team to 20 victories during their debut season.

### Television Particulars

Indiana State's game against New Mexico will be televised locally on WTWO-TV throughout the Wabash Valley. The contest will also be shown live on Sycamore Vision, which is a pay-per-view web stream service provided by GoSycamores.com. ### A Little History

Indiana State is currently in its 117th season of college basketball at the school. The Sycamores are 1,389-1,197 all-time on the hardwood. Indiana State's game at Oral Roberts in 2010 was the historic 2,500th game in the history of the program.

### Lucas Eitel Named Missouri Valley Conference Scholar-Athlete Of The Week

Indiana State junior guard Lucas Eitel was named the Missouri Valley Conference Scholar-Athlete Of The Week following his career-high 25-point performance against High Point. Eitel hit 11-of-12 shots from the field, including 9-of-10 from three-point range, as the Sycamores won on the road at Ball State (68-48 on November 20) and at home versus High Point (76-62 on November 25). Eitel, who has a 3.62 cumulative grade-point average in education, averaged 15.5 points and 2.0 rebounds per game. Against High Point, he earned his first career start and scored a career-best 25 points on the strength of 9-of-9 shooting, including an Indiana State record of 7-of-7 from behind the three-point arc. He is currently the nation's leading 3-point shooter through three weeks of action as he has connected on 14-of-19 attempts from long range (73.7 percent).

### Sycamores In The Missouri Valley/Mountain West Challenge

The Sycamores will look to even their record in the MVC/Mountain West Challenge Series when they host New Mexico on Saturday, December 1. ISU won in 2009 at home against Colorado State, but lost on the road to Wyoming in 2010 and again in 2011 at Boise State to drop to 1-2. The two conferences split their eight contests in the challenge last season.

### Sycamore Against Nationally-Ranked Programs

Indiana State last downed a nationally-ranked program when they won at No. 25 Vanderbilt last season on December 17, 2011. The Sycamores have since fallen to each of the last three nationally-ranked programs they have faced at No. 18 Creighton on January 21, 2012, vs. No. 14 Wichita State in the MVC Tournament on March 2, 2012 and at No. 13 UCLA on November 9, 2012. The last time the Sycamores downed a nationally-ranked opponent inside Hulman Center came in December of 2006 when they beat No. 14 Butler, which is also the last time a non-conference Top 25 team visited Indiana State. The last time the Sycamores hosted any nationally-ranked team came on January 24, 2010 when ISU fell to No. 20 Northern Iowa 67-58.

### Jake Odum In Top 10 At Indiana State For Steals, Moving Close In Assists

Indiana State junior Jake Odum has 129 career steals, which ranks him eighth all-time in the Sycamore basketball program, needing only four more to reach seventh place, currently held by David Moss (133

from 2002-06). The Sycamore career record is shared by Nate Green and Larry Bird with 240. Odum currently has 322 career assists, which currently ranks 11th all-time and needs nine more to catch Greg Thomas (331 from 1989-93) to move into the Top 10.

### Good Starter On The Battery

Indiana State improved to 4-0 this season when the Sycamore starters outscore their opponents with the 76-62 victory over High Point. Under third-year head coach Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 28-7 when the ISU starting five scores more than their opponent's counterparts.

### 63 Is The Magic Number

The Sycamores win by the score of 76-62 vs. High Point on November 20 was ISU's fourth this season in which they held an opponent to 63 points or less and earned the victory. ISU is currently 4-0 on the season when holding an opponent under that total. Under third-year head coach Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 30-1 when allowing less than 63 points to the opposition (including a 13-0 mark when holding teams to 53 or less).

### Sycamore Success Inside Hulman Center Under Greg Lansing

The Sycamores are 24-7 (.774) inside Hulman Center under third-year head coach Greg Lansing. The Sycamores have won 15 of their last 19 home games. Additionally, the Sycamores have won 13 of their last 18 MVC games at home.

### Jake Odum First 20 Point Scorer Of The Season

Jake Odum led the team and was one of three double digit scorers for the Sycamores as they earned a 68-48 road victory over Ball State on November 20. Odum became the first Sycamore to reach 20 points this season as he tallied 21 points (hitting 7-of-13 shots from the field, including a 3-pointer and was 6-of-8 from the free throw line) against the Cardinals. Manny Arop posted his first career double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds while RJ Mahurin reached double figures scoring for the third time this season with 13 points as he hit a trio of 3-pointers at Ball State.

### Sycamores Win At Ball State For The First Time Since 1986

Indiana State won 68-48 at Ball State on November 20 to end an 11-game road losing skid to the Cardinals. It was their first victory in Muncie since 1986 and their first at Worthen Arena (which opened in 1991) in nine tries. The Sycamores earned their largest margin of victory over Ball State since 1977 and their largest road win against the Cardinals since 1919.

### Sycamores Improve To 3-0 In Home Openers Under Greg Lansing; Perfect At Home In November

With the 66-55 home court victory over Winthrop on Tuesday, November 13, Indiana State improved to 3-0 in home opening games under third-year head coach Greg Lansing and following the victory over High Point on November 25 are a perfect 6-0 in November home games in the last three seasons.

### Jake Odum Averages 16.0 ppg Over Two Game Homestand

Indiana State was led in scoring by Jake Odum in both of the home games last week against Winthrop and Truman State. He averaged 16.0 ppg, while hitting 8-of-11 (72.7 percent) from the field, including one 3-pointer while making 15-of-16 (93.8 percent) attempts from the charity stripe. He added 2.5 rebounds per game with eight assists and four steals. Odum scored 15 points with five assists, two steals and a blocked shot in 29 minutes of action against Winthrop and then added a season-best 17 points on the strength of a 5-of-6 showing from the field and a 6-of-6 mark from the free throw line with four rebounds, three assists and two steals in 30 minutes of action against Truman State.

### Sycamores Shoot Over 50 Percent Against Winthrop With Four Players In Double Figures Scoring

Indiana State hit 12-of-19 shots (63.2 percent) and finished the Winthrop game with a 21-of-37 mark from the field (56.8 percent) as they handed the Eagles their first loss of the season on November 13 at Hulman Center. Jake Odum was one of four players to reach double figures scoring as he posted 15 points on the strength of a 9-of-10 performance at the free throw line. Justin Gant reached double

### Sycamores Help UCLA Open New Pauley Pavilion While Gant Scores First Points In Building

It was a historic night for the Indiana State basketball program on November 9 as the Sycamores were the road team in the opening of New Pauley Pavilion against No. 13 UCLA. Legendary head coach John Wooden spent the 1946-47 and 1947-48 seasons as the head basketball coach at Indiana State before his 27-year run at the helm of the Bruin program. While both of coach Wooden's teams battled it out on the hardwood at New Pauley Pavilion, Sycamore sophomore Justin Gant scored the first points in the new building with a 3-pointer at the 17:11 mark of the first half.

The Sycamores game against UCLA marked the debut of six new Indiana State players on the roster for the 2012-13 campaign. Indiana State is returning just one starter from last season in junior guard Jake Odum. Freshman Khristian Smith led the newcomers with 11 points off the bench while starting forward Manny Arop tallied 10 points. Two Sycamores, Arop and Dawon Cummings made their Sycamore debuts in the starting lineup against UCLA while Devonte Brown, Rhett Smith, Brandon Burnett and Smith came off the bench in their first games in the Blue & White.

### Sycamores In Postseason Play For Third Consecutive Season

With Indiana State's appearance in the 2012 CollegInsider.com Postseason Tournament, the Sycamores have now made three consecutive trips to postseason play. ISU played in the 2010 College Basketball Invitational as well as the 2011 NCAA Tournament in addition to the CIT Tournament in 2012. The last time the Sycamores reached postseason play for three consecutive seasons came in 1977-79 when Indiana State played in the 1977 & 1978 NIT as well as the 1979 NCAA Tournament. The last time Indiana State hosted a postseason game came on March 10, 1978 when the Sycamores hosted Illinois State in the first round of the NIT.

### Jake Odum Named To The Preseason All-Missouri Valley Team

Indiana State guard Jake Odum was one of five student-athletes named to the Preseason All-Missouri Valley Conference Team on October 29. Odum finished third in the Missouri Valley Conference with a 4.9 assists per game average. That mark was ranked 61st nationally. Odum recorded a career-high 12 assists against Fairfield as part of the Old Spice Classic, a number which ranked tied for fourth all-time at ISU in a single game. Odum is third in the MVC in steals per game with a 1.8 average, which ranks 81st nationally. Additionally, Odum's 4.5 assists per game average of his career is fifth-best in the history of the program while his 119 steals are ranked ninth-best in the Sycamore record books, while his 1.8 steals per game average ranks third.

### Sycamores Picked To Finish 7th In Missouri Valley Conference Race

The Indiana State Sycamores were picked to finish seventh in the Missouri Valley Conference race according to a poll of league head coaches, sports information directors and a media panel. ISU finished eighth last season, with an 8-10 MVC record, just one game out of a large logjam for third place at 9-9.

### Indiana State Posts Three Exhibition Victories In The Bahamas In August

Indiana State took advantage of the NCAA rule allowing teams to participate in a foreign tour of exhibition contests once every four years when they travelled to Nassau, Bahamas from August 12-14 and defeated the Giants 95-76, the Real Deal Shockers 116-75 and the PJ Stingers 76-55. Manny Arop scored 17 points to lead ISU against the Giants, while Dawon Cummings had 18 to pace the Sycamores against the Real Deal Shockers. The Sycamores were led in the final exhibition game of the tour by Lucas Eitel who scored 15 points versus the PJ Stingers.

### Indiana State Reaches 17 Regular Season Victories For Third Consecutive Season; First Time Since Larry Bird Era

With its 59-46 victory over Missouri State on February 22, 2012, the Sycamores have now posted at least 17 regular season victories for the third consecutive season, which is the first time three Indiana State teams have reached that mark in succession since the 1976-77, 1977-78 & 1978-79 seasons. The Sycamores won 25 in 76-77, 19 in 77-78 and 26 in 78-79.

### Triple-Double For Odum And Tournament Record To Boot

Jake Odum battled a foot injury while playing three games in four days at the 2011 Old Spice Classic. After two solid performances in the first two days of the event, Odum saved his best for last as he posted 10 points, 10 rebounds and 12 assists against Fairfield on November 27. That triple-double was the first by a Sycamore since Larry Bird posted one in 1979 versus Drake and the first by a member of the MVC in 14 seasons. Additionally, the 12 assists are an Old Spice Classic single-game record. His 12 assists is the first double digit assist total in his career and the first by a Sycamore since Michael Menser had 11 against Wichita State in 2001.

### Up Next

Indiana State returns to action on Saturday, December 8 when the Sycamores travel to Morehead State in a return game from the 2011 Bracketbusters Series. The game will tip-off at 2:00 p.m. (ET).

The Last Time Out ...

**TERRE HAUTE, Ind.** -- Lucas Eitel scored a career-high 25 points as he tied an Indiana State single-game record for most 3-pointers hit in a row as well as eight in a row over the last two contests and finished with a perfect 7-of-7 mark from 3-point range, and a 9-of-9 mark from the field as the Sycamores earned a 76-62 victory in front of 4,855 fans inside Hulman Center.

Eitel went 9-of-9 from the field and hit all seven of his 3-point attempts in setting a new career-high with 25 points as he made his first career start. He became the first Sycamore to be perfect from 3-point range in a game with at least seven attempts and tied Jay Tunnell for the most 3-pointers hit in a row (7) as well as in a row over two games (8). Jordan Printy was 6-for-6 last year against Southern Illinois and Tunnell hit seven in a row at Illinois State (8-of-9 for the game) at Illinois State in 2009 as well as eight in a row against the Redbirds and Drake that same season.

Khristian Smith added 18 points and Mahurin tallied 10. Smith hit 7-of-11 shots from the field as he posted five rebounds as well and Mahurin hit a pair of 3-pointers to reach double figures scoring for the fourth time this season.

Jake Odum was solid all-around as he scored seven points to go with eight rebounds and six assists in 30 minutes of action.

For the season, Eitel has connected on 14-of-19 3-point attempts (73.7 percent).

The Sycamores held a 35-27 edge in the rebounding battle, holding a 12-2 advantage on second chance points while forced 10 Panther turnovers and converting them into 15 points.

Indiana State hit 24-of-46 shots from the field (52.2 percent) and drained 10-of-15 shots from 3-point range (66.7 percent) in the contest while High Point tallied 25-of-54 shots made (46.3 percent), but were just 4-of-11 from 3-point range (36.4 percent). The Sycamores hit 18 free throws while the Panthers made just eight.

High Point sandwiched a 6-0 run around the half to take a 34-30 lead, but Manny Arop recorded a second-chance bucket to cut the Panther lead down to two points and Lucas Eitel drained his fifth 3-pointer for a 35-34 advantage and then hit another one to answer a Panther basket for a 38-36 lead.

Eitel made it a perfect 7-of-7 from 3-point range to push him over 20 points in a game for the first time in his career and gave the Sycamores a 41-36 advantage as the clock ticked down towards 16 minutes to go in the contest. He is the first Sycamore in the history of the program to hit each of his first seven 3-pointers in a game. Jordan Printy was 6-of-6 last year against Southern Illinois as part of ISU's historic 12-of-12 3-point shooting performance against the Salukis.

The Sycamore lead reached 45-38 when RJ Mahurin tallied a putback basket with 15 minutes left and then Khristian Smith grabbed his own offensive rebound and hit the jumper with 14:25 remaining in the contest for a 47-38 cushion. Mahurin hit his first triple of the contest off a cross court feed to stretch the lead out to 52-40 and Smith added a jumper in the paint as it was extended to 52-40 with just over 12 minutes remaining.

Eitel remained perfect from the field by hitting his ninth shot of the game in as many attempts to reach 25 points for the contest and gave the Sycamores a 54-42 lead as his foot was on the 3-point arc with just under 11 minutes to go in the game.

Mahurin stayed hot in the second half as he beat the shot clock with six minutes remaining to stretch the Sycamore advantage out to 64-49 and he pushed into double figures scoring with 10 for the contest.

The Sycamores raced out to a quick 6-0 on the strength of a pair of Lucas Eitel 3-pointers in the first two minutes of action. Eitel hit the two treys as he made the first start of his career. High Point would go on to score seven of the game's next eight points as the Panthers tied the contest up at seven with 16 minutes remaining. The Sycamore drought would end thirty seconds later on a running jumper by Khristian Smith as ISU retook a 9-7 advantage.

Smith would go on to hit 1-of-2 free throws and then drilled a driving lay-up with just over 13 minutes on the clock to run the lead out to 12-9. Dejaun McNaughy came right back with a 3-pointer as the score was tied for third time in the early going at 12-12.

High Point gained its first lead of the game at 14-12 at the 12:08 mark of the first half on a pair of free throws by Allan Chaney. Eitel tied a career-high with a trio of 3-pointers as he regained the lead for the Sycamores at 15-14 with 11:08 remaining before the break. After a Cummings steal, Odum found a streaking Eitel at the rim for a fast-break lay-up which extended the Sycamore lead out to 19-16. High Point then tied the game at 19 with a 3-pointer by Lorenzo Cugini.

Jake Kittchell ended a 6-0 Panther run with seven minutes remaining which cut the High Point advantage down to 22-21. After the Panthers hit a lay-up for a 24-21 cushion, Eitel made it a perfect 4-for-4 from 3-point range in the opening stanza and eclipsed his previous career high (12 points vs. Evansville Jan. 10, 2012) with 14 and tied the contest at 24. Odum followed his own miss for a 26-24 lead, but once again High Point was able to knot the contest yet again.

In addition to his early scoring, Eitel also got a key assist as he found Smith open in the lane for a turnaround jump shot to push the Sycamores ahead 28-26. Mahurin hit 1-of-2 free throws with just over three minutes left to take a 29-28 lead and then after he grabbed a defensive rebound, Mahurin was fouled and hit another charity toss for a 30-28 advantage. High Point scored the final four points of the first half to take a 32-30 lead into the locker room.

High Point had three scorers in double figures, led by Adam Weary's 12 off the bench.

# Greg Lansing

## Indiana State Head Basketball Coach Third Season

Greg Lansing is in his third season as the head basketball coach at Indiana State. He previously spent eight seasons with the program as an assistant coach, including the previous three as associate head coach.

Lansing burst onto the scene as a rookie head coach with the Sycamore basketball program in 2010-11 as he became just the second-ever Indiana State head coach to lead the team to the NCAA Tournament in his first season. He led the team to a 20-14 record, becoming just the 14th head coach in the history of the Missouri Valley Conference to lead a team to 20 or more victories in their first year at the helm.

In 2011-12, the Sycamores finished the year with an 18-15 record and advanced to the CollegelInsiders.com Postseason Tournament. It marked the third consecutive year the team has reached postseason play -- its longest such stretch since the 1977, 1978 and 1979 seasons when Larry Bird donned the Indiana State uniform.

Jake Odum was one of just four players nationally to average at least 10 points, five rebounds and 4.5 assists per game during his sophomore season and was a Second Team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection as well as Second Team All-District selection as announced by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

The Sycamores downed No. 25 nationally-ranked Vanderbilt on the road and finished third at the Old Spice Classic -- the best-ever finish by a MVC team in the event.

ISU reached the NCAA Tournament and took on Syracuse in Cleveland, Ohio based on the program's third-ever MVC Tournament Championship won at the Scottrade Center in St. Louis, Mo. ISU raced to the title with victories over No. 6 Evansville, No. 2 Wichita State and No. 1 Missouri State in the Championship Game as the Sycamores entered as the No. 3 seed in the tournament. Freshman Jake Odum was named to the MVC All-Tournament Team.

Odum was named a CollegelInsider.com Mid Major Freshman All-American and was named an All-MVC Honorable Mention selection as well as a member of the MVC All-Freshman, All-Newcomer and All-Defense Team. Carl Richard was also named to the All-MVC's Honorable Mention squad. ISU took two thrilling buzzer beating victories over league foes Missouri State and Creighton during the regular season at Hulman Center. The buzzer beater over Creighton by Richard was voted the No. 2 play of the weekend by ESPN's SportsCenter.

In 2009-10 the Sycamores overcame a ton of adversity to still put together its best season in nearly a decade under the professional leadership of the ISU coaching staff. Despite only having its full compliment of student-athletes for just 28 minutes of the rough and tumble Missouri Valley Conference slate, the Sycamores still recorded its first winning season since 2001 as they finished 17-15. ISU also finished the year with a 9-9 record in league play, bolstering the Sycamores out of the MVC Opening Round at the State Farm Missouri Valley Conference Tournament by securing the league's No. 6 seed after

finishing in a tie for fifth in the standings.

Starting guard Jake Kelly suffered a season ending knee injury with 12 minutes left in the conference opener at Southern Illinois and subsequently also lost Dwayne Lathan and Harry Marshall for extended periods over the course of the year.

Marshall, who was the heart and sole of the team, led the MVC in scoring in league contests with a 16.0 ppg average. Marshall was tabbed Second Team All-MVC and was named to the MVC's All-Defensive Team after turning in shutdown performances against most of the league's all-conference opposition. Running a well-rounded program, the Sycamores also two representatives on the MVC's Scholar Athlete Team as both Jordan Printy and Aaron Carter took those plaudits.

The payoff for the Sycamores continued as ISU reached postseason play for the first since 2001 when they accepted a bid to the 2010 College Basketball Invitational, appearing in a road contest at Saint Louis.

With a keen attention to details that most coaches think of as an afterthought, the Sycamores concentrated on extreme efficiency on the court, finishing the year as the nation's second leading free throw shooting team. ISU's 76.9 percent mark at the line finished just behind NCAA qualifier BYU on the NCAA Division I list for the best free throw shooting teams in the country.

Additionally, the Sycamores overcame a 24-point deficit in the second half at Missouri State before falling in overtime. The 24-point comeback in front of a national television audience was the largest in the history of the MVC by a team that at least forced overtime.

During his second stint with the Sycamore basketball program, Lansing has been a key recruiting for many talented student-athletes. Lansing has also been a major part of the several all-conference accolades for several players, including Harry Marshall and Jay Tunnell, who took All-MVC honors following the 2008-09 campaign. Last season, the Sycamores concluded the regular season by winning six of their final games, including a trio of road contests.

Lansing returned to Indiana State after a seven year stint with the Iowa Hawkeyes. During Lansing's seven years as assistant coach at Iowa, the Hawkeyes went 135-92, received three NCAA Tournament invitations, three NIT appearances and won a pair of Big Ten tournament titles, the first of which came on four wins in four games making Iowa the first team in the Big Ten to ac-

complish such a feat. In 2005-06, Iowa earned a 25-9 record, the second-most wins in school history, the first undefeated (17-0) home record in the school's history and a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Iowa earned seven All-Big Ten selections, 17 Academic All-Big Ten selections and four Academic All-Americans. Lansing coached four of the last five Big Ten rebounding champions, three straight conference leaders in blocked shots and, the league's 2005-06 defensive player of the year. Three of his student-athletes reached the NBA and two from the 2005-06 team were invited to NBA camps.

In Lansing's final two seasons of his first stint at Indiana State, the Sycamores posted back-to-back winning campaigns for the first time since 1979 and 1980. When the Sycamores posted a 16-11 record in 1998 it marked the first winning season for Indiana State since 1980. Indiana State advanced to the NCAA Tournament in both 2000 and 2001.

Prior to joining the staff at Indiana State, Lansing was the head basketball coach at Roosevelt High School in Des Moines, Iowa. Roosevelt had not had a winning season in 12 years before Lansing's initial season. The Roughriders went on to have back-to-back winning seasons under Greg's direction.

Lansing earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of South Dakota in 1990 and a master's degree in counseling from USD in 1992. As a member of the Coyote basketball team Lansing helped South Dakota reach the NCAA Division II Tournament during his junior and senior seasons, the first NCAA invitation for USD since 1954. He was twice named the South Dakota Defensive Player of the Year. Greg is currently ranked among the leaders in career assists at USD. Following his playing career, Lansing served as a graduate assistant coach at South Dakota for two seasons. In 1992-93 he was a full-time assistant.

Greg's father, Dave Lansing, coached high school basketball for 33 years in Iowa. Dave Lansing was inducted into the Iowa High School Athletic Association Coaches Hall of Fame during the 1999 Iowa boys state basketball tournament. Lansing's dad, his mother, Diane, his sister, Angela, and his nephew, Jordan, live in West Des Moines. His brother, Steve, is the head basketball coach at Faribault High School (Minn.), where he was named Regional Coach of the Year in 2004. Lansing is married to the former Angie Menser, who is an Indiana State graduate and a former track and cross country academic All-American for the Sycamores. She currently serves as ISU's senior women's administrator and athletics business manager.

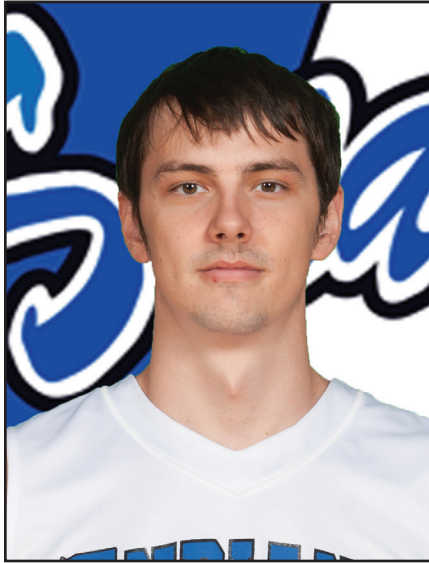
