Sycamores Take On Nationally-Ranked San Diego State In Diamond Head Classic Semifinals

SETTING THE STAGE

Indiana State continues year three of the Greg Lansing era on Sunday, December 23 when the Sycamores (6-3) advance to the semifinals of the 2012 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic against No. 15/18 San Diego State (10-1) inside the Stan Sheriff Center. Tip-off is set for 5:00 p.m. (ET). The game will be broadcast live nationally on ESPNU as well as on the WatchESPN app with Kanoa Leahey (pbp) and Sean Farnham (analyst) on the call. The game can also be heard on the radio via WIBQ 98.5 FM and along the Nelligan Sports Marketing Radio Network with Brian Fritz (pbp) and Matt Renn (analyst) on the call. GoSycamores.com will have an audio only production of the radio broadcast as well. The game will be streamed for free to eligible subscribers on WATCHESPN.com.

THE SAN DIEGO STATE SERIES

Indiana State is a perfect 3-0 against San Diego State with the last matchup coming in Terre Haute back in 1967. ISU played back-to-back games against the Aztecs in 1951.

QUICK HITS

- Indiana State is now 5-0 on the season when holding teams to 63 points or less and is to 31-1 when doing so under third-year head coach Greg Lansing.
- Indiana State has earned 39 close victories (five points or less) since 2005. Under Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 13-5 in close games.
- Manny Arop posted a career-high 27 points as part of the Sycamores' 87-85 overtime victory over Ole Miss in the opener of the 2012 Diamond Head Classic.
- Jake Odum now has 339 career assists which ranks him 10th on the Indiana State Career List. He is one of eight Sycamores to be in ISU Top 10 for both assists and steals in a career.
- Jake Odum is nationally-ranked in three different statistical categories (91st in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.13), 137th in assists per game (4.3) and 188th in points per game (15.5)).
- The Sycamores are averaging just 12.9 turnovers per game this season, which ranks 93rd nationally.
- Indiana State has now won each of its last two meetings against members of the Southeastern Conference (at Vanderbilt in 2011 & vs. Ole Miss in 2012).
- With the victory over Indiana State, Indiana State head coach Greg Lansing owns 44 for the Sycamores, and is tied with John Wooden for 12th all-time at the school.

The Indiana State Head Coach

Indiana State head coach Greg Lansing (South Dakota, 1990) is 44-32 (.579) overall in his third season as a head coach. He is 20-16 all-time in MVC games, including a 13-5 mark at home and a 7-11 record on the road. During his career, he is 24-8 in all home games, 12-19 on the road, 8-5 in neutral court contests and 13-5 in games decided by five points or less. Lansing is 0-0 all-time against San Diego State, and is 0-0 versus the Aztecs on a neutral court. With the Trees, Lansing is 3-3 in overtime games and 31-1 when holding teams to 63 points or less. Sunday's game will be Greg Lansing's 77th as Indiana State head coach. Lansing is the second head coach to lead the Sycamores to the NCAA Tournament in their rookie campaign in the history of the program, with the other being Bill Hodges leading ISU to a 33-1 record and a Final Four appearance in the 1979 NCAA Tournament. Lansing was just the 14th rookie head coach in the history of the MVC to lead his team to 20 victories during their debut season.

A Little History

Indiana State is currently in its 117th season of college basketball at the school. The Sycamores are 1,391-1,199 all-time on the hardwood. Indiana State's game at Oral Roberts in 2010 was the historic 2,500th game in the history of the program.

Sycamores Put All Five Starters In Double Figures To Down Ole Miss In Diamond Head Classic Opener

Paced by a career-high 27 points from Manny Arop, the Indiana State Sycamores placed all five of their starters in double figures scoring as they downed Ole Miss 87-85 in overtime in the opener of the 2012 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic on December 22. Justin Gant recorded his first career double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds while Dawon Cummings had 10 and RJ Mahurin scored 14. Jake Odum tallied 16 points to go with eight rebounds and eight assists to just miss his second career triple-double.

Indiana State Has Won Two In A Row Over The Southeastern Conference

The Indiana State Sycamores downed Ole Miss by the score of 87-85 in overtime in the opener of the 2012 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic. Indiana State has now won each of its last two meetings against the SEC, as they won on the road at No. 25 Vanderbilt in 2011. ISU also earned its first victory since 1986 in Hawaii with the victory over the Rebels. The Sycamores have now won their opener in both the 2011 Old Spice Classic as well as the 2012 Diamond Head Classic.

Manny Arop Ties For Team-High With 18 Points At IUPUI/Named MVC Newcomer Of The Week

Manny Arop tied for team-high scoring honors with Jake Odum as he posted 18 points in the Sycamores' 75-61 road victory over IUPUI. For his efforts, Arop picked up his first MVC Newcomer Of The Week honor from the league office. Arop just missed his third double-double of the season as he tallied nine rebounds. Arop hit 8-of-17 shots from the field, and was 2-of-3 from 3-point range. He added one assist and two steals in 32 minutes of action. Arop scored his first points of the game against the Jags with a jumper at the 16:25 mark of the first half and added a lay-up 20 seconds later to stake the Sycamores to a 10-5 lead. Arop then scored 4-of-6 points within the first two minutes of the second half to stretch a six-point halftime lead out to 12. He added back-to-back treys with 15 minutes remaining in the game to keep the lead at double digits.

Jake Odum Also Solid With 18 Points In Road Victory Over IUPUI

Indiana State junior guard Jake Odum posted 18 points and pulled down eight rebounds as the Sycamores earned a 75-61 road victory over IUPUI on December 15. Odum hit 7-of-10 shots from the field, and was a perfect 2-of-2 on 3-point attempts and also hit both of free throws. Odum also tied Greg

Thomas for 10th all-time on the Indiana State Career Assists Top 10 with three in the game and now has 331 for his career. Odum's eight rebounds tied a season-high. Odum hit a jumper two minutes into the game against the Jags which kickstarted an early 12-0 run which changed a 5-2 early deficit into a 15-5 advantage. Odum hit a 3-pointer and a lay-up to cap that early game changing run. Odum also scored four points as part of a 13-0 run late in the second half which netted the Sycamores their largest lead (18 points) of the game at 70-52 with 5:22 remaining on the clock.

Jake Odum Named To Bob Cousy Award Watchlist

Jake Odum has been named to the 2013 Bob Cousy Award Watch List. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced the watch list of candidates for the 2013 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award. The annual honor, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes the top point guards in men's college basketball. Over 80 candidates have been nominated for the 2013 Bob Cousy Award. This watch list of candidates will be narrowed down to a final 20 around January 1st, final 10 near February 1st, and final five by approximately March 1st. A premier Selection Committee has been appointed by the Hall of Fame to review the final five candidates in contention for the nation's top collegiate point guard award. These Hall of Fame committees are made up of top college basketball personnel including media members, head coaches, Sports Information Directors and Hall of Famers. The winner of the 2013 Bob Cousy Award will be presented at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Championship Monday in Atlanta as part of NCAA Final Four weekend.

Khristian Smith Leads Sycamores With Career-High 20 Points On The Road

Indiana State freshman Khristian Smith tallied a career-high 20 points to lead all scorers at Morehead State. Smith hit 6-of-9 shots from the field and was 8-of-11 at the free throw line. He made his first career collegiate start against the Eagles.

Newcomers Are No Problem For Indiana State

A pair of Sycamore newcomers finished 1-2 in scoring for the Sycamores at Morehead State. Making his first career start, freshman Khristian Smith led the team with 20 points, hitting 6-of-9 shots from the field and was 8-of-11 from the free throw line with an assist and a steal. Manny Arop continued his hot start to the season by scoring 19 points as well. Of the Sycamores' 63 points at Morehead State, a total of 45 (71.4 percent) was scored by newcomers. For the season, 263 points have come from newcomers, of a total of 632 scored (41.6 percent).

Jake Odum Now One Of Eight Players At ISU To Reach The Career Top 10 Lists For Assists & Steals

Indiana State junior guard Jake Odum has 134 career steals, which ranks him seventh all-time in the Sycamore basketball record book, needing 15 more to reach sixth place, currently held by Rick Fields (149 from 1981-85). Odum also now has 339 assists for his career which is good enough for 10th place. He needs 11 more to catch David Moss (350 from 2002 to 2006) for ninth all-time. Odum is the eighth Sycamore in the history of the program to rank in the Indiana State Top 10 for both assists and steals in a career.

Lucas Eitel In The School Record Books For 3-Point Shooting Performance And Honored For Strong Academics

Indiana State junior guard Lucas Eitel was named the Missouri Valley Conference Scholar-Athlete Of The Week and was the November Indiana State Scholar-Athlete Of The Month following his career-high 25-point performance against High Point on November 25. Eitel hit 11-of-12 shots from the field, including 9-of-10 from three-point range, as the Sycamores won on the road at Ball State (68-48 on November 20) and at home versus High Point (76-62 on November 25). Against High Point, he earned his first career start and scored 25 points on the strength of 9-of-9 shooting, including an Indiana State record of 7-of-7 from behind the three-point arc. Eitel made eight consecutive 3-pointers at Ball State and against High Point to tie Jay Tunnell's school record set in 2009.

63 Is The Magic Number

The Sycamores win by the score of 75-61 at IUPUI on December 15 was ISU's fifth this season in which they held an opponent to 63 points or less and earned the victory. ISU is currently 5-0 on the season when holding an opponent under that total. Under third-year head coach Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 31-1 when allowing less than 63 points to the opposition (including a 13-0 mark when holding teams to 53 or less).

Sycamore Success Inside Hulman Center Under Greg Lansing

The Sycamores are 24-8 (.750) inside Hulman Center under third-year head coach Greg Lansing. The Sycamores have won 15 of their last 20 home games. Additionally, the Sycamores have won 13 of their last 18 MVC games at home.

Sycamores Win At Ball State For The First Time Since 1986

Indiana State won 68-48 at Ball State on November 20 to end an 11-game road losing skid to the Cardinals. It was their first victory in Muncie since 1986 and their first at Worthen Arena (which opened in 1991) in nine tries. The Sycamores earned their largest margin of victory over Ball State since 1977 and their largest road win against the Cardinals since 1919.

Sycamores In Postseason Play For Third Consecutive Season

With Indiana State's appearance in the 2012 CollegInsider.com Postseason Tournament, the Sycamores have now made three consecutive trips to postseason play. ISU played in the 2010 College Basketball Invitational as well as the 2011 NCAA Tournament in addition to the CIT Tournament in 2012. The last time the Sycamores reached postseason play for three consecutive seasons came in 1977-79 when Indiana State played in the 1977 & 1978 NIT as well as the 1979 NCAA Tournament. The last time Indiana State hosted a postseason game came on March 10, 1978 when the Sycamores hosted Illinois State in the first round of the NIT.

Jake Odum Named To The Preseason All-Missouri Valley Team

Indiana State guard Jake Odum was one of five student-athletes named to the Preseason All-Missouri Valley Conference Team on October 29. Odum finished third in the Missouri Valley Conference with a 4.9 assists per game average. That mark was ranked 61st nationally. Odum recorded a career-high 12 assists against Fairfield as part of the Old Spice Classic, a number which ranked tied for fourth all-time at ISU in a single game. Odum is third in the MVC in steals per game with a 1.8 average, which ranks 81st nationally. Additionally, Odum's 4.5 assists per game average of his career is fifth-best in the history of the program while his 119 steals are ranked ninth-best in the Sycamore record books, while his 1.8 steals per game average ranks third.

Sycamores Picked To Finish 7th In Missouri Valley Conference Race

The Indiana State Sycamores were picked to finish seventh in the Missouri Valley Conference race according to a poll of league head coaches, sports information directors and a media panel. ISU finished eighth last season, with an 8-10 MVC record, just one game out of a large logjam for third place at 9-9.

Indiana State Posts Three Exhibition Victories In The Bahamas In August

Indiana State took advantage of the NCAA rule allowing teams to participate in a foreign tour of exhibition contests once every four years when they travelled to Nassau, Bahamas from August 12-14 and defeated the Giants 95-76, the Real Deal Shockers 116-75 and the PJ Stingers 76-55. Manny Arop scored 17 points to lead ISU against the Giants, while Dawon Cummings had 18 to pace the Sycamores against the Real Deal Shockers. The Sycamores were led in the final exhibition game of the tour by Lucas Eitel who scored 15 points versus the PJ Stingers.

Indiana State Reaches 17 Regular Season Victories For Third Consecutive Season; First Time Since Larry Bird Era

With its 59-46 victory over Missouri State on February 22, 2012, the Sycamores have now posted at least 17 regular season victories for the third consecutive season, which is the first time three Indiana State teams have reached that mark in succession since the 1976-77, 1977-78 & 1978-79 seasons. The Sycamores won 25 in 76-77, 19 in 77-78 and 26 in 78-79.

Triple-Double For Odum And Tournament Record To Boot

Jake Odum battled a foot injury while playing three games in four days at the 2011 Old Spice Classic. After two solid performances in the first two days of the event, Odum saved his best for last as he posted 10 points, 10 rebounds and 12 assists against Fairfield on November 27. That triple-double was the first by a Sycamore since Larry Bird posted one in 1979 versus Drake and the first by a member of the MVC in 14 seasons. Additionally, the 12 assists are an Old Spice Classic single-game record. His 12 assists is the first double digit assist total in his career and the first by a Sycamore since Michael Menser had 11 against Wichita State in 2001.

Indiana State returns to action on Tuesday, December 25 when compete in the final day of the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii. The game will tip-off at either 7:30 or 9:30 p.m. (ET) and will be televised nationally on ESPN2/Watch ESPN.

The Last Time Out ...

HONOLULU -- For the second consecutive season, the Indiana State Sycamores own a victory over the Southeastern Conference as they opened up the 2012 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic with a thrilling 87-85 overtime victory over Ole Miss.

Indiana State won their second consecutive game to improve to 6-3 on the season while Ole Miss fell to 8-2.

Manny Arop scored a career-high 27 points as he hit 9-of-15 shots from the field and was 4-of-5 from 3-point range. He added seven rebounds. Justin Gant recorded his first career double-double with a 12-point, 11-rebound performance. Jake Odum tallied 16 points for the Sycamores and nearly missed his second career triple-double as he added eight rebounds and eight assists.

Dawon Cummings hit a key late game 3-pointer to score 10 points with four assists while RJ Mahurin added 12 points as all five Sycamore starters reached double digit scoring.

The Sycamores hit 42.9 percent (30-of-70) shots from the field and were 9-of-22 from 3-point range (40.9 percent). The Sycamores hit 18-of-24 free throws in the game, while Ole Miss was just 7-of-13 from the charity stripe.

Ole Miss owned a slight 46-45 edge on the glass, including a 29-15 edge in second chance points.

With the victory, Indiana State head coach Greg Lansing earned his 44th career victory, which ties him with John Wooden for 12th all-time in the Sycamore Record Book. The Sycamores won in the state of Hawaii for the first time since 1986.

With the scored tied at 75, the Sycamores and Rebels entered overtime where Jarvis Summers converted a pair of free throws just 15 seconds in to give Ole Miss a 77-75 advantage. Justin Gant scored on back-to-back possessions to record his first double-double as he hit a jumper and then backed down his defender to give the Sycamores a 79-77 lead.

Arop continued his career-best performance with just under three minutes remaining in the overtime as he put back an Odum miss and stretched the Sycamore lead out to 81-77. After Ole Miss scored on their own offensive rebound, Jake Odum was fouled at the death of the shot clock and hit a pair of charity tosses with 2:01 left to give the Sycamores an 83-79 lead.

Odum would go on to hit a pair of free throws with 33 seconds remaining to stretch the lead out to 85-79. Ole Miss converted 1-of-2 charity tosses with 29 seconds left and then following a steal, Henderson converted a ranging 3-pointer with 18 seconds on the clock to cut the Sycamore lead down to 85-83.

With 11.1 seconds on the clock, Odum was fouled and he hit a pair of free throws to stretch the lead out to 87-83. Reginald Buckner drained a jumper with 1 second on the clock to cut the Sycamore lead down to 87-85 and had a last chance heave at the basket from mid court which was long to give the Sycamores the victory.

Indiana State's 11-point halftime lead (44-33) dipped into single digits on a Marshall Henderson 3-pointer but RJ Mahurin countered with a conventional 3-point play just 50 seconds into the second period to restore the cushion at 47-36.

Ole Miss would score the game's next four points, but Arop stopped the bleeding a turnaround field goal at the 16:25 mark which pushed the Sycamore lead back out to 51-42.

Jake Odum tallied a lay-up to give the Sycamores a 55-50 advantage with 13:36 on the clock, but Ole Miss scored the game's next five points to knot the game at 55 until Khristian Smith converted a second chance basket at the 12:07 mark to restore a 57-55 lead. Dawon Cummings then buried a wide-open 3-pointer on the next trip down to floor to get the lead back out to 60-55.

Arop continued his strong showing with another 3-pointer as the clock ticked under nine minutes to answer an Ole Miss field goal and the lead was extended out to 63-57.

The Sycamores got a 3-pointer from Mahurin and then a breakout dunk from Arop as the clock ticked under the six minute mark to shake the Sycamores to a 69-61 lead. Ole Miss countered with back-to-back 3-pointers which once again trimmed the Indiana State advantage down to 69-67. The run reached 8-0 on a dunk by the Rebels with leveled the score at 69 with 4:15 left.

Justin Gant stopped the bleeding with a bank shot jumper as the clock reached four minutes and the Sycamores took a 71-69 lead.

With Indiana State clinging to a 71-70 advantage, Dawon Cummings hit a deep 3-pointer with 2:14 remaining and Odum hit 1-of-2 free throws just seconds later to stretch the lead out to 75-70. Ole Miss responded once again with back-to-back field goals, including a 3-pointer by Nick Williams with 1:07 remaining which leveled the score again at 75.

The Sycamores got a coveted defensive stop and Mahurin had an open look in the waning seconds but it was off the mark. The long rebound came down to Ole Miss, but they were called for travelling with 0.3 seconds left in regulation and a long distance heave by Odum was just short to send the game into overtime, knotted at 75.

Both teams came out of the gate strong as the Sycamores hit four of their five shots from the field and Manny Arop drilled a 3-pointer four minutes into the game to even the contest at 10.

Manny Arop would convert a conventional 3-point play at the 10:11 mark and then drilled an open 3-pointer to inch the Sycamores within 24-20 at the 9:58 mark. The Rebels scored just two field goals the rest of the half, with the first being a Murphy Holloway jumper with 9:38 on the clock to stretch the Ole Miss cushion out to 26-20.

The Sycamores would go on a 15-0 run during the defensive shutdown of Ole Miss, capped by a pair of Odum free throws at the 2:46 mark and Indiana State owned a 37-27 lead. Justin Gant finished off the Sycamore scoring with a pair of free throws with 44 seconds left before the half for the 44-33 halftime lead.

Manny Arop led all scorers with 16 points at the break.

Ole Miss had three players in double figures scoring, led by 27 from Henderson Marshall.

Indiana State Head Basketball Coach Third Season

Greg Lansing is in his third season as the head basketball coach at Indiana State. He previously spent eight seasons with the program as an assistant coach, including the previous three as associate head coach.

Lansing burst onto the scene as a rookie head coach with the Sycamore basketball program in 2010-11 as he became just the second-ever Indiana State head coach to lead the team to the NCAA Tournament in his first season. He led the team to a 20-14 record, becoming just the 14th head coach in the history of the Missouri Valley Conference to lead a team to 20 or more victories in their first year at the helm.

In 2011-12, the Sycamores finished the year with an 18-15 record and advanced to the CollegelInsiders.com Postseason Tournament. It marked the third consecutive year the team has reached postseason play -- its longest such stretch since the 1977, 1978 and 1979 seasons when Larry Bird donned the Indiana State uniform.

Jake Odum was one of just four players nationally to average at least 10 points, five rebounds and 4.5 assists per game during his sophomore season and was a Second Team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection as well as Second Team All-District selection as announced by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

The Sycamores downed No. 25 nationally-ranked Vanderbilt on the road and finished third at the Old Spice Classic -- the best-ever finish by a MVC team in the event.

ISU reached the NCAA Tournament and took on Syracuse in Cleveland, Ohio based on the program's third-ever MVC Tournament Championship won at the Scottrade Center in St. Louis, Mo. ISU raced to the title with victories over No. 6 Evansville, No. 2 Wichita State and No. 1 Missouri State in the Championship Game as the Sycamores entered as the No. 3 seed in the tournament. Freshman Jake Odum was named to the MVC All-Tournament Team.

Odum was named a CollegelInsider.com Mid Major Freshman All-American and was named an All-MVC Honorable Mention selection as well as a member of the MVC All-Freshman, All-Newcomer and All-Defense Team. Carl Richard was also named to the All-MVC's Honorable Mention squad. ISU took two thrilling buzzer beating victories over league foes Missouri State and Creighton during the regular season at Hulman Center. The buzzer beater over Creighton by Richard was voted the No. 2 play of the weekend by ESPN's SportsCenter.

In 2009-10 the Sycamores overcame a ton of adversity to still put together its best season in nearly a decade under the professional leadership of the ISU coaching staff. Despite only having its full compliment of student-athletes for just 28 minutes of the rough and tumble Missouri Valley Conference slate, the Sycamores still recorded its first winning season since 2001 as they finished 17-15. ISU also finished the year with a 9-9 record in league play, bolstering the Sycamores out of the MVC Opening Round at the State Farm Missouri Valley Conference Tournament by securing the league's No. 6 seed after

finishing in a tie for fifth in the standings.

Starting guard Jake Kelly suffered a season ending knee injury with 12 minutes left in the conference opener at Southern Illinois and subsequently also lost Dwayne Lathan and Harry Marshall for extended periods over the course of the year.

Marshall, who was the heart and sole of the team, led the MVC in scoring in league contests with a 16.0 ppg average. Marshall was tabbed Second Team All-MVC and was named to the MVC's All-Defensive Team after turning in shutdown performances against most of the league's all-conference opposition. Running a well-rounded program, the Sycamores also two representatives on the MVC's Scholar Athlete Team as both Jordan Printy and Aaron Carter took those plaudits.

The payoff for the Sycamores continued as ISU reached postseason play for the first since 2001 when they accepted a bid to the 2010 College Basketball Invitational, appearing in a road contest at Saint Louis.

With a keen attention to details that most coaches think of as an afterthought, the Sycamores concentrated on extreme efficiency on the court, finishing the year as the nation's second leading free throw shooting team. ISU's 76.9 percent mark at the line finished just behind NCAA qualifier BYU on the NCAA Division I list for the best free throw shooting teams in the country.

Additionally, the Sycamores overcame a 24-point deficit in the second half at Missouri State before falling in overtime. The 24-point comeback in front of a national television audience was the largest in the history of the MVC by a team that at least forced overtime.

During his second stint with the Sycamore basketball program, Lansing has been a key recruiting for many talented student-athletes. Lansing has also been a major part of the several all-conference accolades for several players, including Harry Marshall and Jay Tunnell, who took All-MVC honors following the 2008-09 campaign. Last season, the Sycamores concluded the regular season by winning six of their final games, including a trio of road contests.

Lansing returned to Indiana State after a seven year stint with the Iowa Hawkeyes. During Lansing's seven years as assistant coach at Iowa, the Hawkeyes went 135-92, received three NCAA Tournament invitations, three NIT appearances and won a pair of Big Ten tournament titles, the first of which came on four wins in four games making Iowa the first team in the Big Ten to ac-

complish such a feat. In 2005-06, Iowa earned a 25-9 record, the second-most wins in school history, the first undefeated (17-0) home record in the school's history and a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Iowa earned seven All-Big Ten selections, 17 Academic All-Big Ten selections and four Academic All-Americans. Lansing coached four of the last five Big Ten rebounding champions, three straight conference leaders in blocked shots and, the league's 2005-06 defensive player of the year. Three of his student-athletes reached the NBA and two from the 2005-06 team were invited to NBA camps.

In Lansing's final two seasons of his first stint at Indiana State, the Sycamores posted back-to-back winning campaigns for the first time since 1979 and 1980. When the Sycamores posted a 16-11 record in 1998 it marked the first winning season for Indiana State since 1980. Indiana State advanced to the NCAA Tournament in both 2000 and 2001.

Prior to joining the staff at Indiana State, Lansing was the head basketball coach at Roosevelt High School in Des Moines, Iowa. Roosevelt had not had a winning season in 12 years before Lansing's initial season. The Roughriders went on to have back-to-back winning seasons under Greg's direction.

Lansing earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of South Dakota in 1990 and a master's degree in counseling from USD in 1992. As a member of the Coyote basketball team Lansing helped South Dakota reach the NCAA Division II Tournament during his junior and senior seasons, the first NCAA invitation for USD since 1954. He was twice named the South Dakota Defensive Player of the Year. Greg is currently ranked among the leaders in career assists at USD. Following his playing career, Lansing served as a graduate assistant coach at South Dakota for two seasons. In 1992-93 he was a full-time assistant.

Greg's father, Dave Lansing, coached high school basketball for 33 years in Iowa. Dave Lansing was inducted into the Iowa High School Athletic Association Coaches Hall of Fame during the 1999 Iowa boys state basketball tournament. Lansing's dad, his mother, Diane, his sister, Angela, and his nephew, Jordan, live in West Des Moines. His brother, Steve, is the head basketball coach at Faribault High School (Minn.), where he was named Regional Coach of the Year in 2004. Lansing is married to the former Angie Menser, who is an Indiana State graduate and a former track and cross country academic All-American for the Sycamores. She currently serves as ISU's senior women's administrator and athletics business manager.
