SKETCHES OF FOOTBALL COACHES

HEAD COACH GEORGE ASHWORTH (Indiana State '35)

Returning to his alma mater after a highly successful high school coaching career, George Ashworth, a star tackle on the 1933-34 Sycamore elevens, begins his initial season as head grid chief at Indiana State. Ashworth, captain of the 1934 team, takes over from Walter E. Marks who has held down the head coaching position for 21 years.

After playing under Marks in '33-'34, Ashworth took over the coaching reins at Mount Vernon, Ind. from 1936 to 1943. In the fall of 1943 the former Sycamore lineman moved to Streator, Ill. high school for a single season stay as line coach.

In 1944 Ashworth returned to Indiana high school coaching circles by assuming the head coach duties at Washington of East Chicago, Ind. In his only season at Washington, Ashworth posted a record of 4 wins, 4 losses, and 1 tie.

Moving to Wiley high of Terre Haute, Ind. in 1945, Ashworth piloted the local high school for four seasons. In his four years at the helm, Wiley won 23, lost 7, and tied 4 games. In the last two years at Wiley, Ashworth's team dropped only two tilts. In 1947 his Wiley team copped the Western Indiana Conference, and the Terre Haute city title, while in 1948 in addition to the two titles mentioned the Ashworth coached club snared the Wabash Valley title for the first time in Wiley's football history.

Ashworth accepted the Indiana State head coaching post late last spring after his former coach, Walter E. Marks, asked to be relieved of the gridiron duties.

ASSISTANT COACH PAUL E. SELGE (Indiana State '43)

Acting as assistant for the third season, Paul Selge, one of Indiana State's greatest centers, will work with new coach George Ashworth in shaping the 1949 Sycamore gridiron machine. Selge, like Ashworth, learned his gridiron tactics under Marks as a lineman. He played for three years on the Sycamore eleven and was chosen on the All-State team in 1943.

After three years in the Navy Selge returned to Indiana State and for the past two seasons has worked as an assistant to Marks. Selge will spend the majority of his time with the linemen.

FORWARD GLANCE AT '49 SEASON

Working with a nucleus of 21 returning lettermen, new grid boss George Ashworth will shape the 1949 edition of the Fighting Sycamores. Ashworth's appointment to the new position as head coach came rather late in the spring which necessitated an abbreviated spring drill. Most of his molding had to be held over to the fall pre-season practice sessions.

Lost by graduation were the touchdown twins, Max Woolsey and Bob Chester, Mike Baran, a hard-running halfback, and blocking back John Garrard. The line will be missing such performers as Ike Cohen, Bill Clarkson, Robert Carpenter, and Robert Chenhall.

At the end positions there are five returning letter winners in Del Vecchio, Brady, Howes, Kunkel, and Lambert. This will be the deepest position that Ashworth will have. Up from the freshman team will be Lasher, Ottinger, Blanchard, and Evers.

The two regular tackles Edds and Roberts will return to the fold with tried big John Petrila. Maurovic, Etling, Meyer, Rich, O'Rourke, and Gough are expected to move up to fill any missing gaps at the tackle spot.

Four members of last year's line will be on hand to work the guard posts. Gordon, Gilman, Budreau, and Bruno will handle the majority of the heavy duty with able assistance from Lear, Mercer, and Nickles.

The center post is two deep with Sakalares and Woodard returning from last year's squad. Two sophomores Ketner and Harrison will be pushing the lettermen for the starting role.

The quarterback spot will be taken over by two reconverted veterans. Harrison, a fullback last season, and Proctor, an erstwhile guard. Both fit into Ashworth's single-wing plans.

Halfbacks will be bolstered by three returnees, O'Neill, Reed, and Render. A host of newcomers headed by Roe and Cabell looked promising in early practice sessions.

Two letter winners, Graves, a former quarterback, and Beatty, will handle the fullback spot with newcomer Dale Hudson on hand ready to go into action.
