INDIANA STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE

Indiana State Teachers College was created on December 20, 1865, when an Act of the General Assembly provided for the founding of a teacher training institution. This institution has grown to an evaluation in excess of six million dollars in physical plant alone, and the enrollment has increased from the original twenty-three students to an average of more than three thousand different students served in a calendar year.

The chief function of Indiana State Teachers College is to prepare teachers and other employees for the public schools. To this end four major curricula are outlined: one for elementary teachers, one for secondary teachers, one for administrators and other school employees, and one for nurses.

In addition, pre-professional courses are given in medicine, law, dentistry, and engineering. Several short term curricula are offered in the commerce department to train secretaries, stenographers, and bookkeepers. Other combinations of courses to meet the needs of special students can also be selected.

The College occupies a campus of approximately seventeen acres in the heart of Terre Haute, a ten acre plot of ground at Allendale where the college lodge is located, and a thirty-seven acre physical education field on East Wabash, where a proposed field house and athletic plant is to be erected.

There are fifteen buildings on the compact campus including the Fine Arts and Commerce Building and the Student Union Building which cost approximately \$2,000,000, and the new Administration and Health Center Building and new Communications and Mathematics Building recently completed at a cost of approximately \$250,000,000. The old Main Building, constructed in 1888, has been razed to make way for the new campus improvement plan.

The college athletic teams in football, cross-country, basketball, tennis, golf, swimming, baseball, and track participate in varsity intercollegiate competition.

Last spring Indiana State joined the Indiana Collegiate Conference, a newly-organized six-team loop of Hoosier colleges. Members of the infant circuit include Butler, Ball State, St. Joseph's, Evansville, Valparaiso, and Indiana State. Full schedules in all sports except football are slated for the loop members throughout the 1950-51 school year. A complete slate in football will begin with the 1951 season.

SKETCHES OF INDIANA STATE'S FOOTBALL COACHESHEAD COACH GEORGE ASHWORTH (Indiana State '35)

Starting his second year as head grid chief at Indiana State, George Ashworth, a star tackle on the 1933-34 Sycamore eleven, is at the helm again this season. He took over the skipper's reins last season when Dr. Walter E. Marks retired. Marks had been in the head coaching position for 21 years. Ashworth, who played under Marks at Indiana State, captained the 1934 team.

Ashworth began his coaching of football at Mount Vernon, Ind. with a seven year stay, 1936-43. Moving to Illinois in the fall of 1943, he acted as head line coach of the Streater, Ill. high school football team for one year.

In 1944 he took over the head coaching chores at Washington of East Chicago, a member of the western division of the rugged Northern Indiana High School Conference. He posted a creditable 4 wins, 4 losses, and 1 tie for the single season.

Returning to Terre Haute, home of his alma mater, Indiana State, Ashworth assumed the head coaching spot at Wiley of Terre Haute in 1945. His four years' piloting of the local Red Streaks rocketed the team into the high school football limelight as they won 23 games while losing only 7 and tying 4. The last two seasons at Wiley saw the Ashworth-coached clubs lose only two tilts.

His Wiley eleven in 1947 won the Western Indiana Conference crown and the Terre Haute city title. His 1948 team not only copped these two honors, but for the first time in the history of the school they won the Wabash Valley title.

Ashworth features a diversified offensive attack that may run from single-wing or T-formation set-up. Last season he utilized a two platoon system when material for such play was available.

ASSISTANT COACH PAUL E. SELGE (Indiana State '43)

Paul Selge, rated as one of Indiana State's best centers, starts his fourth year as assistant coach of the Sycamores. He worked under former coach Marks for two seasons and will begin his second campaign under Ashworth. He is another Marks' tutored footballer and played for three years on the Indiana State team. In 1943, he was named on the All-State team.

Selge spent three years in the Navy during World War II before taking up his coaching duties here. He will continue to act as head line coach, a post he had held during his stay here.

FRESHMEN COACH MAX ANDRESS (Indiana State '50)

Resuming his position for the second season as pilot of the frosh aspirants, Max Andress, recent graduate of Indiana State, will also aid Ashworth in shaping the varsity eleven.

Andress attended Michigan State and Ball State Teachers College before entering Indiana State in 1949. He served as a physical education director at Elkhart, Indiana for three years prior to attending Indiana State.

OUTLOOK FOR THE 1950 SEASON

Twenty-four sophomore candidates will form the nucleus of the 1950 Indiana State football squad which is minus thirteen 1949 varsity letterwinners. The influx of underclassmen migrate from last season's fresh eleven rated "one of the finest ever at Indiana State."

Heaviest hit by the loss of the non-returnees was the Sycamore forward wall. Two starting ends, a tackle veteran, and three stalwarts from each the guard and center positions, leave vacancies in the line. Four backfield performers are missing from the ball carrying roles.

Coach George Ashworth will have thirteen lettermen returning along with seventeen fresh numeral men to mold this year's unit. These vets plus the newcoming sophomores are expected to take up the slack left in the squad.

Three tried hands, Leroy Howes (Brazil), Myron Lasher (Vincennes), and William Russell (Mount Vernon), are likely starting ends, but sophs Louis Scott (Knoxville, Tenn.), Rex Luxton (Linton), and Doyme Tague (Zionsville) will push the vets for the berths.

John Etling (Terre Haute) and Maynard Rich (Morocco), two mainstays in the 1949 line, will be back to try to hold down the first eleven spots with John Gainey, Joe Frisz, Tom Misamore, (all of Terre Haute), and Tom Krieger (Whiting) comprising the newcomers vying for the varsity roles.

Big problem for Ashworth will be the search for a pair of rugged guards. Only pint-sized, watch-charm special, Charles Nickles, a 155 pound letterman, returns this season. The open spots will be filled by aspirants William Anderson (Center Point), Dan Slocum (Michigan City), or first year varsity candidates, Dan Bell (Attica), Malcolm Huff (Evansville), James Hargis (Rockport), and Eugene Murdock (Linton).

Another sore spot in the Sycamore line is the center position with three of last year's eleven gone. Charles Bohmeyer (Evansville) and Bill Sakalares (Chicago Heights, Ill.) are the only prospects in line for the job. Sakalares, in his third year as a varsity performer, took over the center position in 1948, but was shifted to an end last year. This season's shuffle will find him back at the snapback role.

OUTLOOK FOR THE 1950 SEASON (Cont.)

In the backfield the Sycamores are well-supplied with young, speedy, veterans and fresh talent. George Graves, a pass tossing quarterback from Hammond, will return for his fourth season with the Blue and White gridgers. Injuries slowed him up the majority of last season. He will get aid at quarterbacking from another aerial artist, Dale Hudson (Vincennes). John Frew (Terre Haute), Jim Hartman (Rockville), Tom Davies (Jasonville), and Maurice Johnson (Terre Haute), back up signal calling crew.

Returning halfbacks Robert Roe (South Bond), Bill Harrison (Terre Haute), and Dewey Gourley (Princeton) will try for starting spurs along with R. D. Lucas (Terre Haute), John Parker (Princeton), Arvin Workman (Terre Haute), Jim Morefield (Westville, Ill.), Jack Brown (Evansville), and Herb Davidson (Boone, N. C.). Don Banas (Whiting), Lyman Black (N. Terre Haute), Bob Klepach (Whiting), and Bill Pruett and Charles Swift (both of Terre Haute) are battling for the fullback chores.

Paul Brill (Terre Haute), place kicking expert deluxe will resume his role as p.a.t. and field goal try man.

Unlike post war years, only eight members of the 1950 Indiana State football team have had military training or are veterans of World War II.

Head Coach George Ashworth doubles as a tennis coach in the spring at Indiana State while his assistant, Paul Selge, acts as swimming coach during the winter months.

Only Evansville, a member of the newly-formed Indiana Collegiate Conference, is missing from the 1950 Indiana State football card this season. Butler, Ball State, Valparaiso, and St. Joe, the other four members of the loop, will meet the Sycamores this season. In 1951 Indiana State will face all of the loop members on the gridiron.

Twenty-six members of the 1950 Indiana State football squad are majoring in physical education and plan to coach and teach in the future.

Biggest man on the 1950 Indiana State football squad is sophomore Tom Krieger, a six-foot, 280 pound tackle candidate from Whiting, Indiana. Smallest man is R.D. Lucas, a five foot five inch, 150 pound scatback from Terre Haute who is vicing for a halfback spot.

John Elting, Indiana State's veteran six foot two inch, 193 pound tackle, and Dewey Gourley, a veteran five foot nine inch junior quarterback, are art majors at the Sycamore college.

Twenty-five sophomores will form the backbone of Indiana State's young 1950 football team this season.

Nineteen members of the Indiana State Teachers College 1950 gridiron squad are from Terre Haute, Indiana.

Dr. Walter E. Marks, Big Ten football and basketball, retired from the head football coaching job at Indiana State last season after 21 years at the helm. He still coaches the Sycamore baseball team in the spring sports season and teaches physical education for the college year.
