## INDIANA STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE

Indiana State Teachers College was created on December 20, 1865, when an Act of the General Assembly provided for the founding of a teacher training institution. This institution has grown to an evaluation in excess of six million dollars in physical plant alone, and the enrollment has increased from the original twenty-three students to an average of more than three thousand different students served in a calendar year.

The chief function of Indiana State Teachers College is to prepare teachers and other employees for the public schools. To this end four major curricula are outlined: one for elementary teachers, one for secondary teachers, one for administrators and other school employees, and one for nurses.

In addition, pre-professional courses are given in medicine, law, dentistry, and engineering. Several short term curricula are offered in the commerce department to train secretaries, stenographers, and bookkeepers. Other combinations of courses to meet the needs of special students can also be selected.

The College occupies a campus of approximately seventeen acres in the heart of Terre Haute, a ten acre plot of ground at Allendale where the college lodge is located, and a thirty-seven acre physical education field on East Wabash, where a proposed field house and athletic plant is to be erected.

There are fifteen buildings on the compact campus including the Fine Arts and Commerce Building and the Student Union Building which cost approximately \$2,000,000, and the new Administration and Health Center Building and new Communications and Mathematics Building recently completed at a cost of approximately \$2,500,000. The old Main Building, constructed in 1888, has been razed to make way for the new campus improvement plan.

This year the College will open a new addition to Parsons Hall, dormitory for men, which will have 91 new and modern rooms and a new Power and Storage Plant, a short distance off the campus. Both of these buildings are well under construction and should be completed in the near future.

The College athletic teams in football, cross-country, basketball, tennis, golf, swimming, baseball, and track participate in varsity intercollegiate competition.

Indiana State joined the Indiana Collegiate Conference in 1950, a newly-organized six-team loop of Hoosier colleges. Members of the one-year old circuit include Butler, Ball State, St. Joseph's, Evansville, Valparaiso, and Indiana State. Full schedules in all sports except football were slated for the loop members throughout the 1950-51 school. A complete slate in football will begin the 1951 season.

Last season, Indiana State won the first I C C basketball crown.

### COACHING STAFF SKETCHES

MARK E. DEAN--Head Football Coach (Northern Illinois '38)

Starting his first year as head football coach of the Indiana State eleven, Mark Dean, former Wisconsin State Teachers College, Superior Wisc., succeeds George Ashworth. Ashworth resigned to accept a position as head coach at Streator, Ill., high school.

A '38 graduate of Northern Illinois State Teachers College at DeKalb, Ill., Dean has 13 years of successful coaching experience. He spent three years at Superior State before taking the post at Indiana State.

The young coach began his gridiron coaching career as a physical education instructor and coach in the West Des Moines, Iowa, school system. Moving to Roodhouse, Ill. high school in 1942, he won eight consecutive games and a championship in a single year's stay. The next year at Jacksonville, Ill., Dean molded another championship squad as his squad won six and lost two.

A U. S. Navy veteran, Dean spent the next two years in the service and immediately after being discharged he took the head post at Austin Junior College in Austin, Minn. His teams at Austin compiled a phenomenal 13 wins, one tie, two losses record for two seasons and walked off with a championship.

In '48, Dean was appointed head of football coaching staff at Superior State. In three seasons at the Wisconsin college, his elevens won 11, tied two, and lost 13 games.

The new mentor's overall record lists 66 victories, 26 losses, and three ties. His football teams have grabbed four championships, the last being at Austin Junior College in 1947.

Promising a diversified offensive attack, Dean favors the T and split-T formations, but also utilizes a single-wing attack. He will conform his attack to suit his material at Indiana State, he said.

DR. WALTER E. MARKS---Assistant Football Coach (Backfield)-Chicago '27

Although Dr. Walter E. Marks resigned the head coaching job here just two years ago, he will return to the football scene at Indiana State by serving as backfield coach under Dean. He retired after a 24-year reign as the head Sycamore football coach and concentrates on the teaching of physical education and coaching the Sycamore baseball team.

Marks, now a Big Ten basketball and football official, was one of Amos Alonzo Stagg's greatest athletes at Chicago University. During Dr. Marks' sophomore year the Chicago Maroons walked off with their last Big Ten gridiron championship. "Wally" also starred on the hardwood and baseball diamond at Chicago.

He came to Indiana State immediately following his graduation in 1927 and compiled an impressive record in coaching all sports here.

ROBERT L. HOLLAR---Assistant Football Coach (Line Coach) - Manchester '41

Another newcomer to the Indiana State football coaching staff, Robert L. Hollar started here in 1950 as an instructor in physical education in the Indiana State Teachers College Laboratory School. This season he has been moved up to help Dean shape the 1951 squad and will work as a line coach.

A '41 Manchester graduate, Hollar has served as a coach in various Indiana high schools before accepting the post here. He was a coach at Van Buren, 1941-42; Hanover instructor and coach in 1947; and New Paris coach, 1948 to 1950.

## OUTLOOK FOR THE 1951 SEASON

Just as in other college pre-season dope sheets this year, the Sycamore outlook for the '51 grid season is a big question mark. Uncle Sam has taken a great toll in footballers at Indiana State, so the nucleus of this year's squad will be formed around eight returning letter winners of last year.

Out of the 28 letter winners on last year's squad, six were graduated from the college, nine were taken for duty in the country's different branches of the service, five didn't report for duty on the gridiron this fall, and the remaining eight are in the Sycamore's uniforms.

Twenty-two numeral sweaters were won last year by freshmen at State, but only 12 of these award winners have reported for practice thus far this season.

The eight returning letter winners are Jack Brown, halfback; John Gainey, tackle; Dewey Gourley, halfback; Malcolm Huff, guard; Eddie Robertson, halfback and fullback; Bob Roe, fullback; Ray Swift, fullback, and Louis Scott, end. Brown, Gainey, Robertson, Roe, Swift, and Scott are all tried hands and will help out a lot in the Sycamore cause this year. Last season Huff and Gourley were both injured in early season games and saw only limited action during the rest of the year.

Add to OUTLOOK

Last year's Sycamore frosh eleven was strong, and if the majority of those men would have returned this year, Indiana State would have had some manpower from which to build a club. The way it stands, Mark Dean, new head mentor, has been working with only 34 candidates this fall. With the opening of school, it is hoped that more footballers will report at practice sessions, but with the army situation standing as it is, there is no way of knowing just who will or who won't be reporting back to school and for football.

Under the good graces of fate, Indiana State should have a fairly well rounded first eleven on the field this fall, but should injuries start to plague the Sycamore ball club, that will be all. With only 34 men in uniform, it can be taken for granted that there is no depth whatsoever in the Indiana State squad.
